### THE SARVIS-ICKES GENEALOGY

This compilation has been made, like many of its kind, because it seemed a good thing to do. The work was well on its way when inquiries from others on a like quest added to the interest; and these have freely given of their information. This first issue is necessarily limited and is distributed without cost; but contributions of thirty-five cents will be welcomed. Copies will be sent to the larger reference libraries having genealogical files, especially the library of Congress at Weshington.

Under the present outlook, use will be made of further written information that may be offered by anyone, and supplementary sheets will be issued as warranted. The primary question remains: Were the earliest American members of the family emigrants from England, or did they come from the continent of Europe?

The record following names 1-26 is found in the family bible of Johnson Sarvis at Highmore. The origin of the memoranda for this record is unknown, but should be credited to Johnson Sarvis himself. The Ickes genealogy of course is a parallel source. We are indebted especially to the following:

The Inquiries—The name Sarvis is found in a few city commercial directories. Inquiries were addressed to about fifteen of these names, but the replies did not establish any connection with the family of Johnson Sarvis. Some of these inquiries, as at Sudbury, Pa., and Cincinnati have not been terminated. Persons of the name living in Canada came from England about 1850. It has been suggested that the names Surface, Zervas, and Zirbes may be related.

Who named the "Sarvis berry?" — From June burn, or service berry.

All information herein given is believed authentic, and verifications have been made wherever possible. No comparison with civil records has been attempted.

# THE SARVIS-ICKES GENEALOGY Historical

The SARVIS family stock is said to have been "Pennsylvania Dutch," the German ancestors having the name "Zirte" or "Zirtes." There is no known written evidence on this point. It can only be assumed that the progenitors were included in the migration of the many Europeans to the domain of William Penn, or that Moses Sarvis, perhaps was of the family of a Hessian soldier remaining in America after the Revolution. Johnson Sarvis operated a foundry at East Waterford, Pa., a few miles west of Ickesburg, home village of Nicholas Ickes and founded by the latter in 1819.

On his twentieth birthday Johnson Servis married Sarah Ickes, not yet seventeen. After eighteen years the family moved by ox-team (and doubtless "Conestoga wagon" to Illinois. They lived first in Stephenson Co. and then moved to Grundy county. There were many hardships, even hunger. In the war period, or by late 1866 they moved to Broughton township in Livingston county, Illinois, presumably to the land left by George, described as the Sh of the Sh of section 31-29-8. The other heirs-at-law made deeds in 1866 and later, releasing any interest to Sarah or Johnson Sarvis. This land had been given to George by a "swamp deed" the day a after he was mustered into the service of the army, following a court order providing for war bounty.

A few months after Thomas Sarvis was discharged from the army he married Annie Clover at Dwight, Ill., a town fifteen miles from the Sarvis home and a center for better shopping. In muddy weather the trip to Dwight might take two days, with a "mud-cart"—a box on the rear wheels of a wagon and perhaps four horses. A drainage ditch toward the east traversed the Sarvis land. In the 80's underground drains

were placed in most of the farms, incurring mortgages.

Thomas died in 1872 and was burted at Broughten cemetery. It is believed that injuries sustained in the war were a contributing cause of his death. The widow Annie Clover according to accounts was almost penniless and she placed her three children in the Soldier's Home at Bloomington, Ill. Relatives enabled her to move to Jasper Co., Ia. where she married W. A. Penquite. Of the six Penquite children, Carrie (Mrs. E. E. Banyard of Perry,

Ia, deserves great credit as the main source of the information on this branch, which, with spouses, includes about 45 names.

The death of Melvin Sarvis (30) at the age of 12-a play-time grain-bin tragedy--extinguished the family name. Something of tragedy has marked the lives
of some othes of this group. The Berry family was some
years in California, and the Holmes family lived at
Jamaica, Ia.

In 1868 the trustees of the Illinois and Michigan canal sold either to Johnson Sarvis or David Sarvis the 59 acres in the tract, Et of SW 4 of section 31-29-8. The price was 56 per acre. The 40-acre farm of William adjoined, as did the Sarah Sarvis home. The total of the three farms was 179 acres. The wide stretches of the western homesteads were inviting. In the period 1883-1889 Johnson Sarvis and six children moved westward; William in 1883 to Dakota Ter., followed by Anna on March 4, 1887, John on March 8 and Johnson on March 16. David came March 14, 1889, with his three sons. Mary took her children to Kansas in 1885, and Eugene went to Nebraska in 1886. John Harding and Jacob Rhinesmith also filed on land in Dakota in this period.

Farm life in Dakota had adventure and hardship; but there was the charm of the open prairies. Sod houses and sod stables were common at first. Wells often were inadecuate, the knolls strewn with glaciated boulders, the crops scanty. The summer winds raced back and forth, seeming to mark the commotion of nature over her failure to deliver rain. Through their livestock, people lived mainly off the range, and non-resident owners paid a large share of the taxes. The young folks scattered. In twenty years conditions improved.

William Sarvis (21) is remembered for his animated discussions of the political issues of the day, entertaining grocery store groups at length, excelling in a family endowment of vocal energy.

Laura Thatcher Sarvis (69) was a woman of native ability and was locally noted for a prophetic poem written for an Old Settlers' picnic at Highmore.

Henry Sarvis (70) is a leading citizen and business man of Ortonville, Minn. Ada Sarvis Jolley (71) was prominent in the affairs of the Oregon W.C.T.U. as secretary, delegate and president. Her death occurred on a trip in this work. William Jolley was well-known in educational circles. Johnson T. Sarvis (72) is noted in the records of the U.S. De-t. of Agriculture for original work done on native grasses at the U.S. Field Station at Mandan, N. Dak. He has retired, and lives at Highmore, S. Dak.

The wedding of the elder Sarvis daughter, Mary Ellen (21) occurred while the home was still in Grundy county. The Hardings (77-83) lived at Emington, Ill., for some time prior to 1885, where they operated a boarding house for railroad employes. The arrangement proved undesirable, and John Harding went to Dakota and filed on his homestead. Mrs. Harding took her family to northern Kansas, where she married McBride, and served her homesteading neighbors as a capable nurse and midwife. She suffered a paralytic stroke and was taken in 1891 to the home of her son Vanlou at Amo, Colo. Later she sought the home of her daughter Izetta at Canon City, and made the 25mile trip to the railroad station on a bed in a wagon. Her burial place is Goodland, Kansas. John Harding (77) was a painter by trade and also a good carpenter. He was considered "easy-going"—the opposite of his sometimes assertive wife. In Dakota he made his winter home with Johnson Sarvis, telling the young folks tales of Boston, and perhaps of the sea. He spent his declining years with his son Melnot, and is buried at Crandwell, Sherman Co., Kansas.

William Harding (78) was in the service of the reilroad when killed. It was the first death in the family group. Harry Harding (79) is buried at Goodland, Kansas, beside his mother and son. Uenna (85) has been a well-known school teacher, and her husband is a structural engineer. The family home of Melnot Harding (91-105) has been continuously at Goodland, Kansas. Of the thirteen living children, two are at home or in college.

Vanlou Harding (110-117) came with his mother to Amo, Colo., in 1891. The family residence has been in El Paso county, centering in recent years in Colorado Springs. Several members of the family were in the group of six

who attended the Nicholas Ickes celebration at Ickesburg, Pa., Aug. 13, 1938.

Izetta belle Chisman (113,184) is prominent in local fraternal and civic interests in Colorado Springs, as well as in business circles. Hazel Jessie Weil Duntsch (107, 165) represents the family in Wyoming; where her husband publishes the Riverton Review.

David Sarvis (22) made progress as an Illinois farmer. His wife, Alice Rathbun, (212) was an evangelist and held meetings in the Broughton neighborhood. After the marriage she continued the work at times, and was greatly beloved by her co-workers in the temperance and religious crusades. After her death the Illinois home was sold. The new home established in Dakota came to be a center of social and musical life by which Isabel Rathbun Sarvis (212) is remembered by scores of her music pupils. The dairy and livestock farming, together with school teaching, enabled the three sons to complete college courses.

Roscoe Johnson Sarvis (213) after several years in public school work, engaged in telephone engineering, retiring in 1941. His leading interest at present perhaps is laymen s work in the church, as well as education. At the age of 66 he has resumed war-time emergency teaching in the public schools. Helen F. Sarvis and Portia Irene Sarvis are professional musicians in New York City.

Guy Walter Sarvis (214) journeyed to India in 1902 in the service of the Y.M.C.A., and on the return trip in 1903 crossed Africa in company with William Edgar Geil. Completing his university work, he took post on the faculty of Manking, China, University. Since the return to America in 1925, he has been in college work and is now at the University in Delaware, O. In 1931 he was the member of the Laymen's Mission Inquiry for travel in west China.

Pearl Maude Taylor Sarvis (219) is the author of many magazine articles on religious and social subjects.

David L. Sarvis, Yale graduate, left teaching in the University of New Mexico for the intelligence service of the army. Mary Alice Sarvis (221) graduated in medicine at Yale in 1942. Elizabeth Sarvis Luse (222) at home in Florida, is now stationed with ner husband at Fullerton, Calif., in war industry. Alva Taylor Sarvis

Hubert C. Sarvis (215, 224) homesteaded in Montana and Wyoming, and went in 1919 to Japan as a teacher of English in a mission school. Later he taught simultaneously in a number of government schools with distinguished success. After his death in 1931, his wife, Amy Jean Robison Sarvis (224) carried on his work for a time, and was the only woman who had ever filled the position of teacher of English conversation in the Osaka University of Commerce. By vacation study while in public school work at Oskaloosa, Ia., she has just completed an additional university degree.

Maticla A. Hendricks (adopted, 23, 1-A) can only be thought of as a member of the family. Of a deeply friendly and sympathetic nature, she was much sought in times of sickness. The substantial farm home of the Rhinesmiths west of Kempton, was a favorite gathering place. A feature of the locality was the bi-weekly church service in the schoolhouse. A Rhinesmith "family group" of nine, taken below the large portrait of Jacob Rhinesmith, is preserved. The scattered members include Edwin (4-A) of Fair Oaks, Calif., Pearle M. Rich of Chicago and Florence Rhinesmith Kimball of Washington, D. C.; while well-known in music are Elaine Rich Hill (32-A, 57-A) of Urbana, Ill. and husband.

Rebecca Ann Robinson (24) is remembered as the friend of young people, indispensable in social gatherings, and, with her family, active in the local church. The farm home east of Highmore continues in the family (234) where her son Harry and step-son Charles operate the large and modern farm. The drouth of 1934, when even hay was not raised and dust storms were a national sensation was a part of their experience.

Lora Robinson Wooley (232) with her husband operated a hotel at Highmore. Alma Wooley Goth (236) and Herold Wooley are at Ree Heights, and Howard Wooley is in the U.S. Army.

Edith Robinson White (233) is at Lead, S. Dak., where her husband has long been an engineer of the Homestake Mining Co. Leroy White is employed at Milwaukee.

John Arthur Sarvis' (25) "favorite of the uncles", took a homestead north of Highmore, finally solved the water problem with an artesian well, and retired from farming at the crest of "the boom" in 1921. With his wife, he spent a year at Amarillo, Tex., then returned to Highmore. Ida Sarvis- Sharpe (Ida Johnson, 256) who has preserved much of the earlier record, lives at Highmore. The eldest son of Bennie (Mark) Sarvis is in the Army. The two sons of Myrtle (Johnson) Sarvis Ellis of Huron, S. Dak., are in Army and aviation service.

Eugene L. Sarvis (26) pioneered in southwestern Nebraska before removing to Highmore in 1891. After a second sojourn in Mebraska he moved to Burley, Ida., in 1909, and the next year to the outskirts of Boise. The experience of the family in the west and northwest has been well varied. Charles (258) musician and highway engineer, lives at Orange, Calif. Max is salesmanborn, and has entered the Navy recruiting service. Howard is in army supply service. Jennie marrison Sarvis, always carrying on with success, is perhaps responsible for the preservation, of the Sarvis chronicles.

George Sarvis (18) according to tradition, was killed by a stray bullet while reading his German testament to some sodiers; and this account is probably correct, as his prother of the same company survived him. There has been no other intimation that any of the generation were accuainted with the German tongue. The tintype identification photograph of the two and the wood booket case in which it was carried are preserved. A ticket attached bears, the numbers 2283 and 2744, and the pencilled inscription reads, "Taken at Louisville, Ky., Oct. 15, 1862. The adjutant-general's record shows that George R. Sarvis, farmer, born in Perry Co., Pa., was mustered into service as a private Sept. 8, 1862 in Co. C, 129th Illinois infantry, and was killed in action at Peach Tree Cr., Ga., July 20, 1864, and that he is . buried at Marietta Mational Cemetery, grave 6-6704. The record shows that Thomas Sarvis (19) farmer, born in Juniata Co., Pa., was in the same company, mustered at Fontiac, Ill., and served until honor-ably discharged Aug. 11, 1865.
