

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PREFACE

I have been unable to find a Saxton Genealogy that showed any connection with our family, so I have had to work for all I have here, and while it does not seem to be very much, after it is put in book form, yet it took hundreds of letters and about ten years to get it together and in classified shape. Many would not answer my inquiries and I would get their report through some of their relatives. Most of the reports were incomplete when first sent in and required many letters to make them complete.

From Number 1 JAMES SAXTON down to 1923, this genealogy is very near complete and as nearly so as it seems possible to make it. In the James Saxton family I failed to get the most of the first family of Number 5 Benjamin R. Saxton and I got very little of Number 11 Rhoda Ann Saxton's family.

I am sending a copy of this book to every family that I have record of, free of charge and also wish to thank all who so kindly helped me and hope that everyone will appreciate my efforts in procuring what I have of our family records and that every one will keep their family records from now on so that when someone takes a notion to get up a genealogy of our family it will take much less time and trouble.

INTRODUCTION

The plan of this genealogy will be readily understood without much explanation.

After giving the short historical sketch that has been handed down, JAMES SAXTON is given No. 1 and every descendant whose name was received in time to be marshalled in the regular line and has a number, when further notice of any individual is continued it is indicated by the letter M for married and S for single.

Indexes are given as follows:

Alphabetical index of all names in the book.

State classification by cities and towns alphabetically arranged with complete addresses of all living at time of going to press in 1923.

If you will take this book with you on your travels and when entering a state or city, turn to this state index, you can see at a glance what relatives are in, not only the state but also the city or town with complete local address of each.

About the year 1730, two brothers came from England as young married men. One settled near Newport, R. I. and the other went to Hartford, Conn. The families did not communicate with the relatives in England and in time the brothers' families ceased to communicate and lost track of one another.

The one who settled in Newport, R. I. is the one that we have record of. He had two wives, each having eleven children and was disappointed in a large per cent of them being girls He often related with pleasure, that after they were all married, he had twenty-one of them with their families at the old homestead one Thanksgiving Day. His descendants drifted into New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Illinois and Wisconsin, and all were lost track of but the nearest kin. He had one physical peculiarity, he had two teeth only, one upper and one lower, each extending around the jaw and were sound when he died between eighty and ninety. He was so agile at eighty, that he would climb a large walnut tree near the house with as much dexterity as a youth, often amusing his grandchildren that way. He was a musician by birth and education, musical talent being a marked characteristic of many of his descendants. It is reported that he had children who could sing when two years old. The children of his grandson, James Saxton, were musical. One Ray Saxton had an extended list of tunes that he sang at two years old, often accompanying his brothers, Frederick and Benjamin as they played the violin or flute. He played a number of instruments later. Frederick S. Saxton had a son, Andrew A. Saxton, who sang at two years and played a French accordeon at seven. He was called a musical prodigy, died when only thirteen years old.

The Saxtons are described as tall and slender with dignified and graceful bearing. Light complexion, dark blue eyes and dark brown or wavy, curly hair, were of the mental motive temperament. Lovers and students of nature, especially human nature. Inventive and good mathematicians. The men were systematic in work and painstaking. The women were good housekeepers and economical.

We have record of one only, of the English ancestor's large family, he being the father of James Saxton. He married and died young, leaving a widow and several children as follows: Jehiel, Isaac, Rhoda, James and a girl (name not learned).

Jehiel Saxton married and had several children. He lived in New York and was quite wealthy. He was an avowed universalist and then it required some courage to advocate it—about the time of John Murray. Many are the deeds to help the needy and encourage the discouraged, generosity to what he considered worthy causes recounted of him by those who knew him well. He was an exemplary character, but had the defect of occasional intemperance, which he tried to overcome and in a fit of discouragement, took poison. He was respected and loved by associates in life and sincerely mourned at his death. Several of his children moved to Pennsylvania and Ohio, and some remained in New York.

Isaac Saxton lived in New York and was wealthy. He had two wives and a large family of children, but more girls than boys, which seems to be a characteristic of the Saxton families.

RHODA SAXTON married a Wilmot, who died young, leaving her

with two children, a girl and boy. The daughter married and died young. They lived in New York. Rhoda did not marry again and died past middle life.

James Saxton had a family of eleven children and lived in New York until they were grown and several had moved to Chio. Then he moved to Ohio and died there in 1848. He commenced his business career as a school teacher and after his marriage he worked as an architct, contractor, builder and brick mason. In religion he was what we would call now, an Evolutionist.

New York State, near Paris. He first located in Madison County, New York and was a mason by trade. In July, 1837, he moved overland by team with his wife and three children to Pickaway County, Ohio. Here he followed his trade until September 28, 1852, when he moved with his family of seven children by team to Northampton, Peoria County, Illinois. He was married the second time on February 24, 1855, to Sarah Bixler and died in Northamp-

ton, Illinois at the age of 73. His first wife Eliza, was born in New York State and died in Sciota Township, Pickaway County, Ohio.

Their three first children were born in Madison County, N. Y. and the other four of the first family in Sciota Township, Pickaway County, Ohio.

Nancy Elizabeth Saxton's birthplace was Madison County, Brookfield Township, New York State and she died on the old homestead five and one-half miles south of Utica, in Seward County, Nebraska, at the age of 44 years 8 months and 19 days. George F. Hurlburt's birthplace was Harpersville, Broom County, New York State and he died in the village of Utica, Nebraska, at the age of 85 years, 7 months and 7 days. Nancy was the oldest of a family of seven children and when only 14 years old her mother died, leaving her to help her father take care of the family. They moved to Northampton, Peoria County, Illinois, on September 28, 1852. Here she married as above recorded and they bought a small farm near Northampton and paid \$1500.00 on it, which was all the money that Mr. Hurlburt had accumulated teaching school. Times were very hard during the years 1858 and 1859 (1858 there was frost every month in the year) and they gave up the farm for what they owed on it. Their two oldest children were born at Northampton and in the winter of 1860 they moved by team with their little belongings to Coal Hollow (now Bartonville), about three miles west of Peoria, Illinois. Here they started from the bottom,

Mr. Hurlburt digging coal by the bushel for a year then took charge of a coal office for several years. During the years 1870 and 1871 he farmed about forty acres on the Kickapoo bottoms in addition to his office work by making use of his two oldest boys. In the spring of 1872 Mr. Hurlburt took the three oldest children and moved overland by teams to Nebraska, locating on a homestead in Seward County, about five and one-half miles south of where Utica is located now. Mrs. Hurlburt with the two youngest children, stayed in Illinois and visited with her brothers and sisters in Livingston County, until Mr. Hurlburt had part of a house built, then she came out on the train to Lincoln, Nebraska, and father met her there and brought her and the two children out to the homestead. Their first crop of wheat was hauled to Lincoln, Nebraska. Mrs. Hurlburt died when Nancy was one month and two days old. Mother's two sisters Emily and Eliza came out from Illinois and stayed with the family for about a year.

Mother was a real mother and an excellent cook and housekeeper. She was fond of her children and would do all she could for their comfort and pleasure.

I recall the old English corn meal pudding we were all so very fond of and how often she would make one for us, notwithstanding it took two hours to cook it in a hot oven and the first half hour it must be stirred every few minutes.

She did not undertake to have the control over us that father did but when he was around we minded her just as well as we did him. We would sometimes take advantage of her tender-heartedness and not be as good to mind when father was away.

She would tell us with tears in her eyes of those she had known that used liquor to excess and how terrible the habit was and would say in such an earnest, pleasant way that went straight to the heart, that she hoped her boys would never drink liquor. They are every one carrying out her wish. She was not well during the last years of her life, but managed to be around enough to see that things were well done.

ETTA NORA LIGGETT, Born July 22, 1868, Died February 28, 1892. They were married at Utica. Nebraska, Wednesday, September 21, 1887. Etta was born in Henry County, Illinois, and she died and was buried at Utica, Nebraska, at the age of 23 years, 7 months and 4 days.

Clifford was born in Northampton, Peoria County, Illinois, and his address in 1922 is 932 Seventh Street, San Diego, California. He is the compiler of this genealogy and is sending a copy free of charge to each family of Saxton descendants mentioned in the book that is now living and desires that all keep up their family records from now on.

I look back upon my boyhood days in old Coal Hollow, Illinois, where we lived until I was thirteen years old and think what a carefree time we boys had. Father and mother were in very moderate circumstances; father was an excellent father and a good provider and mother was a real mother and a most excellent cook. Then in 1872 we moved overland by teams to Nebraska and settled on the old homestead, where we stayed for ten years. The country was new and a wonderful place for boys. We worked hard, but played just as hard. We lived near where Beaver creek and Blue river came together and fishing, hunting and swimming was where we got busy when work was done. Father was a good general with his boys and never told them but once how to do a thing, but was very careful to not give them more than they could do if they applied themselves as they should. To my knowledge I never disappointed him in making good on what he gave me to accomplish. I will here relate an instant that showed what he expected and how miserable I would have been if I had disappointed him. In the year 1882 I went into business with him and Mr. Liggett. I handled a general store for a year and three months. Then father and I with three others formed a co-partnership to conduct a bank, mercantile and grain business. When the little store was invoiced it was found that it had netted \$4000.00. My record was considered exceptionally good, I not having had any previous experience or education in the mercantile business. I bought and sold the goods, kept the store in shape and locked up to go to my meals.

In the co-partnership the five of us formed, I was selected to take charge of the bank. We knew nothing about a bank or banking, not even to keeping a checking account with a bank. Father stated to the members of the co-partnership that I could go to Lincoln, Nebraska, and stay in a bank two weeks and learn the business. The three partners thought he was expecting far too much, but he heeded them not and when the time came to go to Lincoln, not only father and the partners went with me, but a Mr. O. C. Ragan went along to see how father was goingto start me out.

We went to the Lincoln National Bank and father introduced the bunch to the cashier, J. J. Kelly and proceeded to tell him that we were about to start a bank and that I was to stay there two weeks to learn the business.

The old banker did not say it could not be done in so short a time, but proceeded to show us some of the things to be learned and accomplished to run a bank, thinking by this method to change father's mind about what I could do.

After the banker got through showing the different books and the system he was using, Mr. Ragan said to me, "What do you think about learning all of that in two weeks?" Father did not seem to pay any attention to what the others said but told the cashier the boy would stay with him two weeks and learn how to run a bank. So off they went and left it up to the cashier The cashier without telling me, seemed to give up the idea of and me. teaching me the business in two weeks and gave me one of the books of the bank to keep; which I did, but toward the last of the first week began to wonder what I was learning about the business, just taking care of the one book, and Saturday evening began to be very uneasy about it, wondering what father would say if I went home without knowing how to start the Saturday evening I walked up and down the street in front of the hank. hotel and after going to bed rolled and tumbled trying to think of some way to make good and not disappoint father. All day Sunday I walked around by myself and Sunday night went to bed very much troubled. I could not sleep, and the problem kept coming up until finally it came to me that if I just had a copy of everything they did in the bank I might use it as a reference. Then the idea of why not a blank book of the right size and shape to rule pages of the different books used in the bank and make entries under each heading and take copies of other things that I knew nothing By morning I was all wrought up about it and went straight to about. the cashier and told him that I had been there a week and it looked like I might stay another week and know practically nothing about the business. "You can expect to learn but very little about the banking He said: business in two weeks." This was very discouraging. Now we will see how the young man's earnest dsire comes out in a battle with knowledge and experience. I braced up and told him how bad I would feel if I had to disappoint father and went right on and laid my ideas before him as they had come to me Sunday night, and by the time I got through he was all attention and very much interested and said: "Capital idea, young man; capital idea." Then I said, "Will you come with me and help select a book to make the copies in?" and he said, "Sure."

Needless to say we soon had a copy of pages with entries made of every book that we needed to start a bank, we also did a day's business, striking a balance all in said book. Then the cashier said: "Now you make credits and debits and do a day's business and balance it up." So I did and got a balance the first time. Then we took checks, drafts, pass books, certificates of deposit and everything they used and filled them out for me to take along.

At the end of two weeks I told the cashier that I believed I could go home and start the bank. He placed his hand on my shoulder and said: "Young man, I believe you can," and I did, but many's the time I got out the old book and copies to help me out. As soon as we got started up I received a wonderful letter from the old banker that I have in my files yet. Father and I prospered and bought out our partners one at a time until father and I were the sole owners and we stayed in business together as long as he lived.

In November, 1916, after settling up father's estate and selling the bank that I had so successfully conducted for thirty-three years, I moved with my son Ralph E. Hurlburt and family to San Diego, California, where I am investing in securities and enjoying this splendid southern country.

Lewis, second in the family, enjoyed his boyhood days in Illinois and later on the old homestead in Nebraska. He early attained a reputation of being a good boy to work. In harvest before he was fourteen years old he shocked wheat after a Buckeye dropper and five binders, thus bringing together and shocking five swaths that was scattered over the ground in one of the heaviest fields of spring wheat the crew harvested that season. It was demonstrated afterwards that this was more than a man's work. There was a big, husky fellow by the name of Thurman that said he could shock as much wheat as any thirteen-year-old boy, so they let him try it and in less than two hours he gave it up. He could not keep up the shack trot that was necessary to cover so much ground.

At the age of 19 Lewis left home to try it alone. During the time he was gone he went to school one year and was on the Pinkerton force in Chicago. He came home and took charge of an elevator at Hazard, Nebraska, and later moved to the old homestead which he afterwards traded for Colorado land. He now owns and handles eight hundred acres of land near Akron, Colorado.

at Utica, Nebraska, January 4, 1893. Minnie Hamilton was born December 8, 1866. Minnie was born at New Burg, Preston County, West Virginia. Arthur's birthplace was just west of the corporate limits of the City of Peoria, Peoria County, Illinois.

Arthur, like his older brothers, spent his youth in Illinois and on the old homestead in Nebraska. He was only nine years old when he came west overland by team with his father and two older brothers, landing on our homestead in February, 1872. The day we landed was a pleasant day and Arthur and brother Lewis started out to see what they could find and soon came back telling about seeing a prairie dog in a trap and as soon as they came near enough we knew by the smell that they had found something. Among the early duties of Arthur and his younger brother Ernest was that of herding cattle on the prairie in the spring and summer and in corn stalks and around straw stacks in the winter. Great times they had swimming, fishing and breaking two-year-old cattle to ride, the two older boys were often with them. After mother's death we batched for several years, then moved to Utica, where Arthur attended school. later working in the Liggett & Hurlburt elevator, then went to Denver, Colorado and was stationary engineer in one of the big hotels there. Came home and married Minnie Hamilton in 1893 and they lived in Denver for a time, Arthur carrying on an advertising business. Then they moved to Aurora, Nebraska, where Arthur built brick business buildings by contract. In 1916 they moved to San Diego, California, and at this time Arthur is looking after 680 acres of Imperial Valley land that he and Ralph E. Hurlburt have together.

Arthur and wife are both very active in Christian work, always in demand wherever they may be to take leading parts.

Later he moved to Utica, Nebraska and attended school for a time. He had a team and hauled ear corn from father's farms and then when shelling time came he handled it from the cribs to the elevator, later he moved to Exeter, Nebraska, where he did draying and farming, then came back to Utica and

worked in the elevator. In father's will Ernest was given the elevator and at this writing is living in Utica, Nebraska, and he and his son Charles, are doing a grain and coal business.

Died March 4, 1889. Myrtle as a little girl on the old homestead had only boys as playmates and companions. She learned to walk after we came to Nebraska and as long as mother lived was as well fed, taken care of and loved as any little girl ever was. Mother left her when she was only six years old and from that time on she had a very different existence. Mother's two sisters, Emily and Lisle, were with us about a year and Myrtle fared fine, then they went to Seward, Nebraska and Myrtle went with them, but in a short time on account of the aunt's health, Myrtle was placed with Mrs. Reynolds (Mrs. Reynolds was a teacher before she was married and lived with us). Here she got along splendidly until they had to let her go, then she was brought home to live with her father and brothers who were batching at this time. Later she was taken to Utica and stayed with Vanauckins

for a very short period. At this time father's sister, Mrs. Bedient and family came out from New York State to keep house for us. This was very fine for Myrtle. Nancy was brought home and we really had everything in good shape for some time. Then aunt went to Omaha to be with her son, D. O. Freeman, as he was going into business there.

Mrs. Frost kept house for us for some time and finally Myrtle took charge, which made it fine for us; but all too soon was brought to a sudden end by Myrtle passing away.

Myrtle was a member of the Utica Ladies' Cornet Band and also carried off the prizes for ladies at the Utica skating rink. Myrtle was a very good looking girl, well liked and like a real mother to her little sister Nancy.

Myrtle's death cast a gloom not only over the Hurlburt family but the entire village as well.

at Utica, Nebraska, Monday, April 7, 1903. Claude C. Nelson was born July 29, 1880. Claude was born in Utica, Nebraska. Nancy was born on the old homestead five and one-half miles south of Utica, Nebraska.

Nancy was only one month old when mother died. We lived on the old homestead and father had a time taking care of Nancy until able to find someone to keep her for him that he was satisfied with. One time he bundled her up in the night, when something seemed wrong with her and carried her to the Wilder home a mile and a half away to get Mrs. Wilder to fix her up. Then he got a Mrs. Nickerson to take her and everything went fine until Mrs. Nickerson was taken sick and Nancy was moved to another neighbor's. Father went to see her one day and found her lariated to a tree in the yard and no one at home. She was crying and father gathered her up and carried her back to Nickerson's, where she stayed until five years old. Then father's sister, Aunt Bedient, came out from New York State to Utica, Nebraska, with her children to keep house for us and Nancy was brought home. At this time she was like a wild deer, not knowing what she ought to do. She was soon moulded to meet requirements and was a very good little girl.

She was taught to call her brother to supper and was so timid that she would run all the way to the store and open the door and say, "Tiffy tum to tupper," and then run back home.

The birthplace of Mr. Saxton was Madison County, Brookfield Township, New York State. At the age of four months his parents, with their little family of three children, left New York for the west, coming to Pickaway County, Ohio, where they remained until he reached the age of 16 years. when they decided to come farther west, this time coming to Peoria County, Illinois, where he remained until August, 1862, when he enlisted at Peoria for a period of three years in the 86th Regiment of Volunteers. He was with Sherman on his famous march to the sea. He was also in the Grand Review at Washington, D. C., at the close of the war. Coming home he again took up his trade, that of a mason, and worked at it for a number of years. Mr. Saxton chose the occupation of his father and grandfather. and other ancestors who were masons before him. He began carrying off brick on his father's brickyard at the age of 8 years and kept up the work on the yard until old enough to take up his trade. At the age of 10 years his mother passed away, leaving a family of seven small children, and from that time on the family endured many hardships. She finished her school days in Ripon, Wisconsin, after which she taught school for a year. She passed away sitting in her chair, where she had fallen asleep. Gas fumes from her stove asphyxiated her. Thus the often expressed wish to go alone and without suffering, was fulfilled.
