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PREFACE

Specific interest in compiling the Schnorf descendants came while trying to trace the ancestry of Narcissus Schnorf, wife of Richard Corbin, settlers in Coles County, Illinois. Since so little has ever been written of the Schnorf family, it is hoped that this "beginning" may in the future stir someone on to a more-complete history.

Time and lack of funds prevents me from making an elaborate publication...but, I thought, why deny the interested ones from knowing what I might share with them? So, here it is, as best I have it. It might be added that although this is far from complete, the data herein has been carefully used, and is factual, not traditional, with every pain exercised to assure it's validity.

This has been a family project; no personal gain intended. I ask nothing in return. Mrs. Grace Myers Schnorf furnished the postage for mailing; I thank her for this kindness. The hours spent in compiling I can not nor do not want to count. It was fun, and I hope it may bring you pleasure.

I would like to dedicate this to a great-granddaughter of Eliza Schnorf Kinder, the eldest daughter of Jacob Schnorf, Jr. She is Mrs. Laura G. THE SCHNORF FAMILY

This seldom read-about family, according to tradition, was Dutch in origin, and it is said that the immigrant was a farmer on the "River Rhine". There is evidence of a Schnorf family in Switzerland, but relationship has not been proven... Some of the common known spellings of the name are: Snuff, Schnorff, Snorf, Schnuff, Schnuff, Schnuff and Schnorf. The original spelling of the name is not known by this writer.

Possible immigrants of this family have been narrowed to three persons: Johann Casper Schnorr, who arrived from Rotterdam, 24 September 1755, on the "Meggum", Johannes and Johannes Jacob Schnorss, 1 November 1782, on the ship "Chance", Charles Smith, Captain, from Rotterdam & Coes, Holland, to Philadelphia, 97 persons on ship. On 25 August 1781, a Philip Kinder arrived from Rotterdam on the ship "Anderson", with 224 passengers. His daughter, Mary, born 1754, evidently in the U.S., married Jacob Schnorf, our earliest known ancestor and subject.

It is estimated that Jacob Schnorf was born around 1750. It has never been established whether he was born in America or was foreign-born. We find Jacob Schnorf owning 400 acres on the Monongahela River, including his original settlement. Some of this now lies, it is said, in West Virginia. Estimates say the land was near Vestaburg and Fredericktown, near a creek called "Fish Pot Run". Another description was "two and one-half miles south of Beallsville, just south of U. S. 40".

Although no one has successfully proven Revolutionary Service for Jacob Schnorf, recent research indicates he served under Captain Robert Sweeney's Company, 5th Battalion, Washington County, Penna., beginning date 25 April 1782.

Further assumption leads us to think that Jacob Schnorf and Mary Kinder were married in Washington County, Pennsylvania, about 1770 or 1772. Their family record is as follows:

10. George married 4 November 1817, Keziah Corwin

The Winterrowd's were brother and sister, children of John Peter & Anna Maria (Michael) Winterrowd. Other spellings are Wintrow, Wintroe, and Winterrowds. The Corwins, brother and sister, were children of Joseph Corwin.

Dear Mr. Conrad:

Since I do not find the name Schnorff or its variations in any of our indexes, nor in the standard books on German and Swiss names, I incline to believe it may be "Holland-Dutch", or "New York Dutch". In this case your man, as did many of the settlers of the Allegheny-Monongahela Valley, might have come down from Western New York. The name Schnorr-Schnurr is common enough, meaning, of course, "snore", and oddly also, "night watchman". One of the dictionary writers suggest this might have been because his business was with the snorers. To derive Schnorff from this, however, is, I believe, almost impossible, as the trend was always to drop letters rather than to add them. Snuff is, of course, a perfectly logical anglicism. English-speaking assessors always wrote foreign names as the nearest English equivalent to what they heard.

Beside the Schnorrs whom you found on the ship-lists, there is also the Rev. Caspar Ludwig Schnorr, who came in 1745 on a "luxury liner" from England, while he sent his wife and two children on one of the terrible immigrant ships, on which only one of the children survived. He was minister for a year in Lancaster, and left under very unsavory circumstances. I don't think you would want to be related to him.

The Philip Kinder who came on the Anderson and the Filleb Ginder who came on the Neptune in 1746 are both suggested to be the Philip Ginder who discovered anthracite coal at Summit Hill in 1791. A Philip Kinder was taxed "over the Mountain" in 1784, Parks Co. Tax Lists, p. 795, and a Philip Ginder (Gulnier, sometimes Culcora) appears in the Weiser papers as the subject of one of the Indian outrages of 1756-7 in which most of his family were wiped out. The entire first chapter of Black Rock by George Korson, 1960, is devoted to this Philip Ginder, but does not list a daughter Mary. She could be an unmentioned survivor in the massacre. He had, however, a son Philip, and a grand-son Philip. A copy of this book may be obtained for \$7.50, from the Pennsylvania-German Society, whose offices are also in this building.

I regret not to be more helpful, and suggest the Historical Society of Western Pennsylvania, 4338 Bigelow Boulevard, Pittsburgh 13, Pennsylvania.

Abraham Schnorf, 2nd son, had children, names not known. In the 1820 Census of Warren Co., Ohio: A. Snuff. 1 male under 10, 3 females under 10 years, plus Abraham and wife, "Polly" Branch.

Jacob Schnorf, Jr., 3rd son, served in the War of 1812 from 27 April 1812 on, in Cap't. Robert Hays' Co. of Butler Co., Ohio. Name spelled "Snuff". To further relate this unproven service, the History of Parke, Fountain and Montgomery Counties, Indiana, Fountain County Section, under the biography of Benjamin F. Crane, states..."his grandfather, Jonathan Crane, served throughout the Revolution, and his grandfather Jacob Schnorf, was a soldier in the later years of that struggle." Jacob and Rachel are buried in the Oak Hill Cemetery, Crawfordville, Ind. Their record..most children married in Butler Co., Ohio:
