Method of the Genealogical Order

Each descendant of the Schreiner lineage is given an Arabic number, 1, 2, 3 etc., which identifies the person. The number is placed before the name, for example:

1. Nikolaus Schreiner. Each descendent is also given a number following the name for example: 1. Nikolaus Schreiner¹, which identifies the first known generation. Subsequent names and the generations to which they belong are given numbers in their proper order.

The descendent or child of any person is given in the order of his or her birth and so identified by a Roman numeral, lower case, i, ii, iii, iv, etc., before the hame, for example:

*2.i, Johann Adam Schreiner². (1.Nikolaus¹)

2. Johann Adam Schreiner² is the first child of l. Nikolaus¹. The asterisk or star (*) appearing before a number and name indicates that a further entry follows in the record which contains some vital statistics as well as personal comments. The absence of the star (*) usually indicates that no further reference to the person is made.

An attempt will be made to complete the records, now available, of each generation before recording the one that follows. Note that there is only one name in the first generation, l.Nikolaus Schreiner¹, and only one name in the second generation, 2.Johann Adam Schreiner².

A sincere note of thanks is extended to those who have faithfully contributed aid and information concerning this attempt to describe the Schreiner heritage.

The First Generation of the Schreiner Family

1. Nikolaus Schreiner of Uedersdorf, Germany, birth day unknown, died Nov. 31, 1822, was married to Elizabeth Thome, birth day unknown, who died Nov. 11, 1822 in Germany.

The authority for the above and other information is shown on the photo copy of the page following. This was secured in 1952 by William Gilson and Clara Gilson from Dr. Lang, Pastor of St. Bartholomew Apostle Church which was newly built in 1866. The town of Uedersdorf, Kreis Daun, Germany is about 30 miles West of Coblenz. The photo copy is dated April 1, 1927 by Gerhard Blum, Pastor. Foot notes on the copy were made by 46. John Baptist Schreiner during his visit in 1927. 62. Marjorie Sarah E. Boyd stated that these records may also be at the church in Grub, aus Uedersdorf.

Names of others are not known due to lack of or disappearance of records during World Wars I and II.

- 2.1, Johann Adam Schreiner², (1.Nikolaus¹) Ackerer or Farmer, born in 1790, died Mar. 31, 1882 in Wisconsin at the age of 92, the son of 1.Nikolaus Schreiner¹ and the late Elizabeth Thome. On Mar. 17, 1816, Johann Adam married Antonia Semmers, who was born in 1796, daughter of the late Johann Wilhelm Semmers and Magdalena Thelen from Mehren a. Eifel (on the Eifel River), Near Uedersberg. The ceremony was performed in the Catholic Parish Church of Uedersdorf, Germany by Pastor Walscheid. Witnesses were Peter hoffmann and Mathias Reicharts from Uedersdorf.
- Of this marriage, eleven children were born. The mother Antonia died in Uedersdorf Dec. 3, 1835, in her 39th. year. Four of the children died in Germany. The father and seven children came to America.
- 82. Genevieve M. Puerling⁵ stated that 2. Johann Adam Schreiner² came to America with four sons and two daughters in 1846 and later lived with 8. Jacob Schreiner³ until his death at age 92 in Wisconsin. His last seven years were spent in blindness.

2. Johann Adam² was in military service in Germany, when a horse bit him. He hit the horse in reprisal and the horse died later. He was then jailed and fed on bread and water for killing the Kaiser's horse. He escaped to Holand, and came to America. Because of his great strength he was called "Big John". The new 100 story obelisk shaped John Hancock Building in Chicago is also called "Big John".

Catherine was born Mar. 29, 1835 in Alsace Loraine, died Mar. 19, 1873 at the early age of 38 and was buried at Lake Church Wis. where the family lived until Jacob remarried.

11.ix, Hubert Schreiner³, farmer, born May 19, 1831 in' Uedersdorf, Germany, died May 2, 1913 in Random Lake, Wis. He was buried in St. Nicholas Cemetery at Dacada, Wis, Hubert came to America in 1846 at the age of 15 with his father 2. Johann Adam Schreiner and settled in Ozaukee County, Wis. 11. Hubert Schreiner's retired in 1900, after after 40 years of successful farming and settled in Random Lake, Wis., married Anna Katharina Koenig (King) in 1860 at St. Nicholas Church in Dacada, Wis. Anna Koenig was born Aug. 12, 1839 in Flebour, Luxembourg. She died Sep. 14, 1927 in Chicago at the age of 88 and was buried in Dacada, Wis. Her father was Francois (Franz) Koenig who was born in Michelau, Luxembourg May 12, 1805, died Dec. 29, 1891 at the age of 86 in Wisconsin Her mother was Gertrude Petesch, born Oct. 25, 1803 in Bourscheid or Michelau, Canton Diekirch, Luxembourg. Gertrude died May 18, 1896 at the age of 88, most likely in Wisconsin.

Anna Catherine Koenig came to America at the age of 8 years with her parents. They left Luxembourg Mar. 20, 1847 for Antwerp, Belgium and emigrated to America via: River Scheldt, English Channel, Atlantic Ocean, New York Harbor, Hudson River, Erie Canal, the Great Lakes arriving at Port Washington Wis. in August 1847 with her brothers Nicholas and John and her sister Catherine. The trip required four and a half months, beset with the dangers of travel at that time.

William Gilson has a further delineation of the Koenig family with information supplied by 46. John Baptist Schreiner and Mrs. Victoria Busse, daughter of James King, brother of Anna Catherine Koenig.
