The Shouse Family

TWO SHOUSE brothers came to America from Germany and settled in Pennsylvania. One of them, (1) Henry Shouse, moved to Woodford County, Kentucky, about 1750. He resided on the same farm until his death in 1835. He was married twice. The name of his first wife was unknown. He had several children by his first wife. (2) Henry, Jr., is the only one there is any record of. His second wife was Elizabeth Jones of Bath County, Kentucky. Henry Shouse and his second wife, Elizabeth, had the following children:

(3) Daniel, born in Woodford County, Kentucky, in 1786. Died November 20, 1866. Married Mary Lee October 11, 1807.

(4) Thomas, born in Woodford County, Kentucky. Married Mary McQuiddy. Mary died and he married Mrs. Susan Edwards.

(5) William, married first Miss Smith of Anderson County, Kentucky, and by his first wife had six children. His first wife died and he married the second time and had two children by his second wife.

(6) Samuel, married Catherine Perry and settled on the farm in Woodford County, where

Henry Shouse lived and died. Samuel, born April 3, 1784.

(7) Permelia Shouse, born in Woodford County, Kentucky. Married Samuel Jesse of Shelby County, Kentucky.

(8) Mary Shouse, born in Woodford County, Kentucky, September 20, 1793. Married Nicholas Mosby of Woodford County.

(9) Elizabeth Shouse, born in Woodford County, Kentucky. Married Mr. Dale of Woodford County.

(10) Rebecca Shouse, born in Woodford County, Kentucky. Married Wade Mosbey of Woodford County.

(11) Nancy Shouse, born in Woodford County, Kentucky. Married Mr. Carpenter of Woodford County.

(12) Rachel Shouse, born in Woodford County, Kentucky. Married Mr. Martin of Woodford County.

(13) Diannah Shouse, born in Woodford County, Kentucky, February 17, 1795. Married Benjamin McQuiddy of Woodford County.

(14) Melinda Shouse, born in Woodford County, Kentucky. Married Mr. Roper of Woodford County.

(15) John Shouse, born in Woodford County, No further record.

(1) Henry Shouse, a record of descendants by the first wife.

(2) Henry Shouse, Jr., born in Woodford County, Kentucky, about 1773. He married Elizabeth Watts of Woodford County about 1794. Henry and his wife, Elizabeth, had the following children, John, Thomas, Henry and Willis.

(3) John, born in Woodford County, Kentucky, September 17, 1796. Married Sarah E. Slaughter of Woodford County.

(4) Thomas, born in Woodford County, Kentucky. Married Jane Searcy. Moved to Anderson County, Kentucky.

(5) Henry, born in Woodford County, Kentucky. No further record.

(6) Willis, born in Woodford County, Kentucky. No further record.

(3) John Shouse, born in Woodford County, Kentucky, September 17, 1796. Married Sarah E. Slaughter of Woodford County, a daughter of Charles Slaughter, a brother of Gabriel Slaughter, Governor of Kentucky from 1816 to 1820, and at the Battle of New Orleans was colonel of a Kentucky regiment. His regiment and a Tennessee regiment bore the brunt of the battle and he received the thanks of the legislature of his state for his bravery. John moved to Franklin County, Kentucky, and from there to Missouri in 1827 and

settled on a farm in Clay County, near Missouri City, where he died June 24, 1862. John and his wife, Sarah, had the following children:

(14) Matilda, born in Franklin County, Kentucky. Came to Missouri in 1827. Married David Piburn of Clay County, Missouri.

(15) George, born in Franklin County, Kentucky, February 10, 1820. Died September 7, 1853. The name of his wife is not known. Came to Missouri in 1827.

(16) Willis, born in Franklin County, Kentucky, October 15, 1822. Married Miss Mary Carol of Clay County, Missouri, October 15, 1841. Died January 15, 1844. They had no children.

(17) John W., born in Franklin County, Kentucky, April 12, 1825. Came to Missouri in 1827. Married Elizabeth R. Writesman of Clay County, Missouri, in 1848. Died September 7, 1919.

(18) Thomas J., born in Clay County, Missouri, June 4, 1832. Married Angeletta Cook of Andrew County, Missouri, February 5, 1852. Died September 3, 1913.

(19) Elizabeth, born in Clay County, Missouri, May 6, 1836. Married John McQuiddy of Clay County, Missouri, February 26, 1852.

(14) Matilda Shouse, born in Franklin County, Kentucky, April 3, 1815. Came to Clay

County, Missouri, in 1827. Married David Piburn of Clay County, Missouri. Matilda and her husband, David, had the following children:

(20) John H., born in Clay County, Missouri, October 10, 1841. Married Cordelia Rice of Clay County, Missouri. They have four children, Charles, Lester, Gertrude and Ernest.

(21) Sarah A., born in Clay County, Missouri, December 23, 1842. Married Jackson Writesman of Clay County, Missouri, September 27, 1865. They have three children, Alfred, Charles and Lucy.

(22) George D., born in Clay County, Missouri, June 3, 1844. Married Lieu Callerman of Clay County, Missouri. They had two children, Ettie and Luther.

(23) William R., born in Clay County, Missouri, June 6, 1846. Married Miss Lucy Tate. They had no children.

(24) Christina J., born in Clay County, Missouri, October 2, 1848. Married William Samuel of Kentucky. They had three children, Robert, Lizzie and John.

(25) Thomas, born in Clay County, Missouri. Not married.

(26) Lusanna, born in Clay County, Missouri, January 30, 1851. Married John Wilkerson of Clay County, Missouri. They had no children.

(15) George H. Shouse, born in Franklin County, Kentucky, February 10, 1820. Came to Clay County, Missouri, in 1827. Died September 7, 1853. The name of his wife is not known. He and his wife had the following children:

(27) Mary J., born in Clay County, Missouri, December 20, 1844. Married Frank Janette. No further record.

(28) Sarah E., born in Clay County, Missouri, January 15, 1848. Married Willis Kearns of Clay County, Missouri. Moved to Pueblo, Colo. They had no children.

(29) George, born in Clay County, Missouri. Married Miss Fannie King of Clay County, Missouri. Moved to Pueblo, Colo. They have two children, Jewel and Roy.

(30) Ann, born in Clay County, Missouri. Married Richard Bohanian. Moved to Kansas. No further record.

(17) John Watts Shouse was born in Franklin County, Kentucky, April 12, 1825. Came to Clay County, Missouri, with his father in 1827, who settled in Clay County, near Missouri City. In the spring of 1846 he enlisted in the first regiment of Missouri volunteers Company C, commanded by Col. Doniphan. Was in the battles of Brazito and Sacramento. Was with Doniphan during the entire campaign, marching a distance of five thousand miles. Came home by the way of

New Orleans. Arrived in the fall of 1847. June 1, 1848, he married Elizabeth Writesman of Clay County, Missouri. In 1850 he made an overland trip to California. He came back by way of the Isthmus of Panama. In the fall of 1861 he enlisted in the state service of Missouri and was elected captain of Company C from Clay County, under Col. Lewis. In a short time he was mustered into the regular Confederate service, in Col. John T. Hughes' regiment, General Black's brigade, and afterward Green's brigade. He fought in the battles of Pea Ridge and Corinth and saw much service in Missouri, Arkansas and Mississippi. In 1863 he was taken prisoner and held a prisoner in Springfield Mo., four months, until he managed to make his escape. He died September 7, 1919, in Clay County, on the farm on which he had resided sixty-seven years. John W. and his wife, Elizabeth, had ten children, all living at the present writing.

(31) Thomas R., born in Clay County, Missouri, April 20, 1849. Married Flora B. Lynn of Clay County, Missouri, December 10, 1874.

Has been justice of the peace of Washington Township for many years and is now treasurer of the Farmers Mutual Insurance Company of Clay County, Missouri, and has been the last twenty years. Amount of insurance in force \$3,963,550.

(37) Elizabeth, born in Clay County, Missouri, May 20, 1867. Married Lucian Rice of Clay County, Missouri.

(38) Margaret, born in Clay County, Missouri, May 20, 1867. Married Jinks Onan of Kearney, Mo.

(39) Richard, born in Clay County, Missouri November 11, 1869. Married Elizabeth W. Holloway of Clay County, Missouri, in 1894.

(40) Edna B., born in Clay County, Missouri, December 29, 1875. Married Marshall Maughmer of Kearney, Mo., May 12, 1896.

(31) Thomas R. Shouse, born in Clay County, Missouri, April 20, 1849. Married Flora B. Lynn of Clay County, December 10, 1874, a daughter of

John H. and Isabel Anderson Lynn, formerly of Mason County, Kentucky. In early life he taught school. He was elected Judge of the Clay County Court in 1894. He served as county judge four years. He resided on his farm most of his life. Moved to Liberty in 1922. Thomas and his wife, Flora, have three children, Ora L., Lynn W. and Frank O.

(41) Ora L., born in Clay County, Missouri, March 1, 1878. Was educated at the Liberty Female College. Married Richard H. Smith of Clay County January 1, 1902. They moved to Merced, Texas, in 1920. They had three children. One died in infancy. Richard, Jr., born in Clay County, Missouri, December 19, 1903. Irvin Lee, born in Clay County, Missouri, July 22, 1913.

(42) Lynn W. Shouse, born in Clay County, Missouri, February 6, 1880. Received his education at William Jewell College. Married Mary E. Minter of Clay County Missouri, April 28, 1915. He has been engaged in farming since attending school. They have two children, Thomas J., born September 10, 1916, and Ella May, born April 1, 1918.

**A Record of the Descendants of (1) Henry
Shouse, Sr., by His Second Wife,
Elizabeth Jones.**

(3) Daniel, born in 1786, married Mary Lea, who was born in 1787, and who was of Welsh descent. Francis Wainwright Lea, of Bryant Station, and his wife, Mary, were her ancestors, and came from Virginia to Kentucky.

Daniel Shouse and his wife, Mary, had the following children:

(12) Francis Henry, married May Conn of Upper Jefferson County, Kentucky. Moved to Union County about 1844. Had eight children, namely: Daniel, Susan, John, Alice, Caroline, Martha, Jephtha, Benjamin. A grandson, Quinn Shouse, was a minister of the Christian church.

(13) Jephtha married Jane Dale, daughter of Elder John Dale, a Baptist minister. Jane died in 1857, and later Jephtha married Hallie England.

(14) William O. married Harriet Bryant, daughter of Joseph Bryant of Shelby County, Kentucky. They moved to Kansas City, Mo., in 1836.

(15) Newton married Mary Dehorney, a cousin, and lived in Jefferson County, Kentucky, until the Civil War. After the war they moved to Shreveport, La., where Newton died. Newton and wife, Mary, had a daughter, Inez, who died at

the age of 7 years, and a son, Crittendon, who married and died young, leaving a daughter.

(16) Benjamin H., married Mrs. Menowine, who died in 1855. In 1856 or 1857 he married Mrs. Vassie Dale. They continued to reside in Shelby County, Kentucky, where Benjamin died about 1907, and his wife, Vassie, died about 1911. They had no children.

(17) Daniel Lewis, born April 5, 1827. Named for Merriweather Lewis of the Lewis and Clarke Expedition, who was a cousin of his mother, Mary Lea.

**THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF
HENRY SHOUSE
OF WOODFORD COUNTY, KENTUCKY
(Copy)**

In the name of God, Amen. I, Henry Shouse, being weak in body but of sound mind and memory, do make, constitute and ordain this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made.

Firstly, it is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid out of my estate.

Secondly, I leave to my beloved wife, Elizabeth Shouse, the whole of my estate, both real and personal, during her natural life; and at the death of my said wife it is my will and desire that the whole of my said estate be equally divided among my twelve children that are now living, to wit: Elizabeth Dale, John Shouse, Rachael Martin, Samuel Shouse, Daniel Shouse, Nancy Carpenter, Melinda Roper, William Shouse, Mary Mosby, Diannah McQuiddy, Rebecca Mosby and Permelia, deceased, to them and their heirs forever.

Thirdly. I appoint my beloved wife, Eliza-

beth Shouse, my executrix and son, William Shouse, executor of this, my last will and testament.

Fourthly. It is my will and desire that my wife and son, William, sell a tract of 100 acres of land I hold in the County of Caldwell at any time they may be able to do so to advantage in their judgment and the money accruing from such sale to be equally divided among my twelve children as above.

Fifthly. It is my will and desire that my three grandchildren, Sally, John and Permelia Shouse, who are now living with me, remain with my wife and under her care until they are raised, and it is further my will and desire that the tract of land where I now live shall be sold at the death of my wife all together and the money divided equally among my children above named.

And lastly, I bequeath to my son, Thomas Shouse's seven children, fifty dollars each at my wife's death.

Signed, sealed and acknowledged the 31st day of August, 1825, in the presence of Ruben Love, Abraham Dale, Lewis Sullivan.

Note that the children of Henry Shouse by his first wife are not mentioned in the will. According to the laws of Kentucky at the time the will was written, if a man had previously made provision for a child or children it was not necessary to mention their names in the last will.
