Introduction

This is the family history, as far as we have been able to gather it, of Susan Sinclair, Duncan Sinclair, Donald Sinclair and Moses Sinclair, sister and brothers who left their home in Argyleshire, Scotland and emigrated to Canada in about the year 1819. There are many blank spaces in this history of their descendants. We would welcome correspondence from those who receive copies of this genealogy so that we can make corrections and additions so that a future edition may be more complete and accurate.

History of the Sinclairs:

The name Sinclair has at least two different origins. One comes from the Norman-French who invaded England with William the Conqueror and found their way into Scotland and eventually into Caithness and the Shetlands and Orkney Islands. This name was from a place in Normandy called St. Clair. The second origin is much more humble but stems from the word "tinker" and by some process of phonetic change inherent in the translation from Gaelic into English became Sincler or Sinclair. It is said that the Sinclairs in the western part of Scotland are not related to the Norman Sinclairs -- at least students of history have been unable to trace any connection.

The earliest information of our particular Sinclair family goes back to about the year 1750 when a Peter Sinclair was Lodge keeper for the Duke of Argyle at the castle in Inverrary, Argyleshire in Scotland. According to family records he was in charge of renting out the Duke's estates. This position descended to his son, Donald Sinclair. This Donald Sinclair married either Mary McIntyre or Mary MacCallum - probably the latter. Their children were all born in the lodge house on the castle grounds, "within a stone's throw of the castle" as is stated in the records.

Of the family of Donald Sinclair and his wife, Mary, we have the information that a daughter Catherine and one other child died in infancy; two sons John and Angus, a daughter and one other child remained in Scotland; and four other children, Susan, Donald, Duncan and Moses emigrated to St. Andrews East, Province of Quebec, Canada, in about the year 1819.

Some of the children of Donald and Mary who remained in Scotland may have emigrated to Australia. There is some evidence to bear this out. The same family tradition has it that the parents - Donald and Mary - emigrated to Canada and lived with their children there, but we have been unable to verify this from any reliable source.

The relationship of the MacCallum family and the Sinclair family was apparently quite close in the old country. The record still in the archives of the Duke in Inverrary show that a Donald Sinclair married a Mary MacCallum

and as the time and place is proper it is probably that of the Donald and Mary of our family. At any rate the MacCallum family apparently reached Canada before the Sinclairs or at least some of them did. About the year 1818 or 1819 Susan Sinclair, who had married Malcolm MacCallum in Scotland and was living in the village of Ardrishaig near Inverrary, was on her way with her three small children to the new world. Whether she took her three younger brothers, Duncan age 20, Donald age 16 and Moses age 10 or whether as is more likely they came over with their parents, is not known. But they were about this time living on farms on the River Rouge near St. Andrews East in the Province of Quebec, Canada. The River Rouge is but a small stream and some of the descendants claim that only Susan and her family settled on the place but the family records state that all the Sinclair family lived, for a time at least, on the little river. Some of the MacCallums, who may be more closely related to the Sinclairs than we yet know, had settled in a nearby settlement called Point Fortune across the Ottawa River. It is possible some of the Sinclairs lived there.

The Scotch settlers who came into the little village of St. Andrews East in the early days were a genteel folk and of some means. They were Protestants and Presbyterians and "Orange Men" and probably talked the Gaelic more than they did English. There are two traditions in the family which indicate that our Sinclair family had a gentle strain in it and could trace its origin back to aristocracy. One states that Donald Sinclair married a Margaret McCulloch who was the grand daughter of a Campbell laird, closely related to the Duke. She was the "Lady Margaret" that branch of the family is so proud of and whose wedding band is now handed down from Margaret to Margaret. The other tradition traces, through the MacCallum family, descent from Sarah Campbell, daughter of the Fourth Duke of Argyle. Sarah MacCallum, now living in Montreal, Canada, states that her grandfather, Malcolm MacCallum, brought family records from Argyleshire showing that the family was descended from one Callum Mhor or Big MacCallum. That this MacCallum Mhor is mentioned in Scottish history and that he married the Sarah Campbell mentioned above. It is interesting to note that three of the four Sinclairs who came to the new world married MacCallums. Susan, of course, married Malcolm MacCallum before leaving the old country. Furthermore, there is evidence that the mother of the four Sinclair emigrants was Mary MacCallum who married the father, Donald Sinclair. After arrival in Canada two of the other children, Duncan and Moses married MacCallum girls, the first to Jean and the second to Sarah. The relationship to the MacCallums was thus unusually close.

The Sinclairs lived for some 20 years in or about the village of St. Andrews East, in the province of Quebec, Canada. Then about the year 1839 the Canada Company opened up for settlement a large tract of land in upper Canada called the Huron tract. This tract was in the midst of country comparatively unknown and unexplored. It was covered with thick woods and uninhabited. However, for some reason or other, Duncan Sinclair, the eldest of the Sinclair brothers, decided to take his wife and three children and emigrate to the new township of Blanchard in the Huron Tract. This must have been about 1840 or 1841. The two younger brothers with their families soon followed - probably in 1844 or 1845. And finally their sister Susan and her husband Malcolm MacCallum and their five youngest daughters, in about the year 1848, moved to Blanchard Township to be near the rest of the family. Thus the Sinclairs left St. Andrews East and settled in Blanchard Township near the village which was later to be called the town of St. Marys. That is, all did except the three oldest children of Susan and Malcolm MacCallum. These three, Mary, Donald and Zachariah elected to remain in St. Andrews East

This, in brief, is the history of our particular Sinclair family. We hope that as descendants of these three Sinclair brothers and their sister read this account and the following genealogies they may be able to fill in some of the missing information and correct any mistakes that the compilers have made. It is our hope that additional information may turn up in the records of the individual descendants of these pioneer members of our family so that we can yet complete a more perfect record of our Sinclairs. The plan of the following sections is to present in four divisions a short history of each branch of the Sinclairs -- the Susan Sinclair MacCallum branch, the Duncan Sinclair branch, the Donald Sinclair branch, and the Moses Sinclair branch - together with a list of their descendants as we have been able to compile it. We have designated the various descendants by generations numbered from one to six inclusive. The first generation begins with the four pioneer Sinclairs who came to Canada in the year 1819 and their descendants follow in order.

The compilers of this family study are very happy, after many years of effort and correspondence, to present this manuscript to fellow members. We believe that "the family" has every right to be proud of its record. As far as our researches have gone there is only evidence of honest, stable and upright citizenship. The family has not been without its talented and able members. It can boast of bankers, lawyers, doctors, teachers, writers, artists, legislators and other professional people.

Finally, the authors want to thank all those "relatives" who took the time to hunt up family records and to send in the information which has made this study possible. Without that help this record could not have been compiled.

A word about the compilers might be of some interest. Mr. John F. Sinclair is descended from Duncan Sinclair and Jean MacCallum. Mr. Edwin M. Ross is descended through his mother Annie Sinclair from Duncan's brother Donald and his wife Margaret McCulloch. Mr. Sinclair is a lawyer, author and businessman. Mr. Ross is a teacher in the Oakland California, Public Schools.

Much of the information of this branch of the Sinclairs is missing. For a long time the authors were unaware that the sister Susan had accompanied the three Sinclair brothers to Canada. It was only accidentally that the existence of this family was uncovered during correspondence between various members of the other branches. Contact was finally made with Miss Sarah MacCallum, now living in Montreal, Quebec, 410 Victoria Avenue. Through her efforts the relatively little material we have was gathered.

The oldest child of Susan Sinclair and Malcolm MacCallum, Mary, married Martin LeRoy of St. Andrews East on January 27, 1837. Since her uncles, Duncan Sinclair and Donald Sinclair were married in 1834 and 1837 respectively she was married about the same time they were. There were 12 children in this family. All the children except one, Alexander, moved from St. Andrews, most of them to the United States. We haven't yet traced these descendants down.

The second child, Donald MacCallum married Mary MacMartin of St. Andrews East and took over the family farm on the River Rouge when the parents, Susan Sinclair and Malcolm MacCallum, decided to move on to St. Marys in Ontario to be near the rest of the Sinclairs. There were six children - five girls and one boy. None of the children married. The Sarah MacCallum mentioned above and now living in Montreal, is the only living child. When she passes on this family becomes extinct.

The third child, Malcolm Zachariah, and the last of the children to have come from Scotland, married Eliza Fraser of River Rouge. We have no record of this family.

The five younger daughters were taken with their parents when the change to St. Marys was made. The only one we have record of is Susan MacCallum who married W. P. Smith of St. Marys. This family left St. Marys in 1868 and finally settled in Portage La Prairie, Manitoba, Canada. One of the grand-daughters, Susan (Nova) McQueen now lives at 5910 Blenheim Street, Vancouver, B. C.

Malcolm MacCallum and his wife, Susan Sinclair, lived some 27 years in St. Marys. After the death of her husband in about 1875, Susan returned to St. Andrews East and died there five years later in 1880 at the age of 92. She lived there with her son, Donald and his family, on the old farm which she and her husband had held when they first arrived in Canada. She is buried in St. Andrews East - her husband in St. Marys.

Edwin Ross, one of the authors, visited St. Andrews East in 1949 and found the old farm still intact with friends of the MacCallum family now in possession. The old home is now gone but the new one is on the same spot. The River Rouge, little larger than a brook, runs directly in the back. An old well near the house still gushes out pure water just as it did in the early days. He also visited the Presbyterian Church in St. Andrews, built in 1819 with the help of the Sinclairs and the MacCallums. In the cemetery he found

the grave of Susan Sinclair MacCallum. Incidentally in the church at St. Andrews are still extant the birth records of three of Susan's children. The little village of St. Andrews East is in a beautiful country and it is hard for a visitor to understand why one would want to leave. There may have been both religious and economic reasons for the departure of the Sinclairs from there to the wildness of upper Canada.

DESCENDANTS OF

DUNCAN SINCLAIR AND MARY JEAN MACCALLUM

Duncan Sinclair, the eldest of the three Sinclair brothers who came to Canada in 1819, was married to Mary Jean MacCallum in St. Andrews East on February 11, 1834. They lived on a farm near St. Andrews where their first three children were born. About 1840 or 1841 they decided to move on further west to try their fortunes in the new land being opened for settlement in Upper Canada. They thus arrived in the Township of Blanchard as one of the very first pioneers in the area. The little village on the Thames River, later to be known as the town of St. Marys, was the home of only a few hardy souls who had ventured into the heavily wooded wilderness. Here one mile north of the future town, Duncan settled with his family to make his home. The records state that the first pioneer families on the land occupied by Duncan Sinclair were those of Mr. McGregor, Mr. McIntosh and John Legg. It may be that the 100 acres purchased from the Canada Company, owners of the township, by Duncan, had already been cleared by these families. If so he was more fortunate than those settlers who were to follow him, including his brothers, Donald and Moses. On this farm were born seven other children, Donald, John, Duncan, Mary, Angus, Jean and Archie.

An interesting fact is that this same Sinclair farm is still owned and occupied by descendants of the Sinclair family. The present owner is the great grandson of Duncan Sinclair. The township is divided into divisions called "concessions" and these into lots of 100 acres each. This farm, now operated by John Lorraine Seeley, is in concession 17 and is lot 13 just in case some future generation wants to locate the site.

This branch of the Sinclair family has had some of the more successful and accomplished members of the family. Angus Sinclair, one of the sons of Duncan and Mary Jean graduated from the University of Toronto with a B. A. and M.A. He was a gold medalist in Math and Principal of Windsor, Ontario Schools for many years. Another son, John, graduated from Toronto University Medical School, took his post-graduate work at Bellview Hospital and Rush Medical College in Chicago. He then returned to his home town of St. Marys to become one of the most successful physicians in its long history. Elizabeth Dale Sinclair became a graduate of the Toronto Conservatory of Music and a well known singer. Arthur H. Sinclair became a well known physician and surgeon in Toronto. Katherine (Billy) Sinclair, the daughter of Arthur, graduated from the Toronto Conservatory of Music and later became a member of the teaching staff. John F. Sinclair, one time secretary of the Y.M.C.A. of Montreal, Canada, later became a lawyer and financial editor of the N.A.N.A. Gregg Sinclair, brother of John F., is President of the University of Hawaii. Gladys Sinclair, daughter of John F. Sinclair, is an outstanding civic and religious leader in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

The majority of this family have remained in Canada but some migrated into California, Minnesota and Arizona.

SECTION #3

DESCENDANTS OF

DONALD SINCLAIR AND MARGARET MCCULLOCH

Donald Sinclair was 16 years of age when he left his home in Argyleshire, Scotland with his brothers and sister, and probably his parents, for a new home in Canada. He had been born in the Lodge House of the Duke of Argyleshire's castle at Inverrary on Loch Fyne. His father and grandfather before him had been the lodge keepers for the Duke. Besides checking the traffic in and out of the estate the family was in charge of renting out the lands to the tenants. It was a position of importance. The fact that the Sinclairs did not emigrate sooner to the new world when so many Scotchmen were leaving the country is a pretty good indication that the position of the family was better than most. Just why the Sinclairs finally decided to go is not indicated in the family records. It may be that the head of the family remained at Inverrary and continued as the Lodge Keeper. The record is not clear. One report states that "Donald the elder, with his wife, followed his sons to Canada." It is interesting to note that when Samuel Johnson and his faithful friend and biographer, Boswell, visited the castle at Inverrary they had to pass through the Lodge gates which were attended by the Sinclairs.

Donald Sinclair settled in or near St. Andrews East, a small village some 20 miles from Montreal with his brothers and sisters. To reach this village the travellers had come up the St. Lawrence River as far as Montreal and then taken a small steamer up the Ottawa river to the village. The only records we possess say that the Sinclairs lived on the River Rouge a few miles from the village of St. Andrews East. Across the river lived the family of William McCulloch and his wife, Margaret Sloane McCulloch. It was this Margaret who was the granddaughter of a Laird on the Argyll estates. Her mother had married one of the employees on the estates by the name of Sloane and according to family tradition was disowned. Her daughter, named Margaret, married William McCulloch in Scotland, where were born seven children, Jean, Mary, Margaret Sloane, William, David, George and Robert. The McCulloch family moved from Scotland to Lower Canada, St. Andrews East, Quebec. It was at a singing school in the village that Donald Sinclair met his future wife, Margaret Sloane McCulloch. The marriage license now in the possession of descendants, the Ward Ridgley family of 104 South Pacific Avenue, Redondo beach, California, reads: "Donald Sinclair and Margaret McCulloch both residing in Argentueil having been regularly proclaimed and no objections offered were married by me at Carillon, Lower Canada on this third day of March in the year of Our Lord, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty Seven. (signed) William Mair, Minister of Grenville and Chatham." The Ridgley family also have Margaret's wedding ring. It is a slender gold band with a double wing setting. Each wing has a center of black jet surrounded with tiny seed pearls. It has been handed down to the Margarets in the family. We have no record of the other members of the McCulloch family. Apparently the McCulloch family arrived in St. Andrews East some time after the Sinclairs and the MacCallums.

After their marriage, Donald and his wife lived on a small farm seven miles from St. Andrews. Just where we do not know. Here, however, were born their first four children: (1) James Duncan, (2) Daniel, (3) Angus John (died very

young), and (4) Robert. In about the year 1848 the family followed the older brother Duncan and his family to Upper Canada, Blanchard Township, County Perth, Ontario, where on the Third Line in the first log house of the Line were born the rest of the children: (5) Margaret Sloane (died at age 3 years, 9 mos.) (6) Mary, (7) Andrew (died at age 19), (8) Moses Hiram, (9) Jean, (10) Katherine, (11) Margaret Sloane (the second Margaret Sloane), (12) William, (13) Duncan (died at 3 years).

(1) James Sinclair the eldest son married Annie Tufts in St. Marys and had two children, Margaret and James Jr. Annie met her death in a fire a few years after the marriage. James then left his two children with his mother and with his younger brother Robert went to California. He returned to St. Marys after a short stay in the west, married Eliza Bell who resided on a farm adjoining that of his parents in Blanchard township, and with his two small children and his sister Catherine and her husband Louis Kirk, returned permanently to California. The families settled near Eureka in 1877 where both lived for many years. In the early days of the present century the families moved to Oakland, California, where most of the descendants now live. Edwin Ross, one of the compilers of this genealogy is a member of this branch of the Sinclair family. Members of this family have been talented in the arts and active in the business and professional world. William Sinclair and Stanley Cookson have been successful artists. Milton Kirk and Irene Reynard have been singers of more than average ability. Edwin Ross is a graduate of the University of California and is active in the educational field, being at the present time the President of both the Oakland Federation of Teachers and the California State Federation of Teachers. His brother, Herbert L. Ross, is a successful business man and active in civic affairs in Oakland. Margaret Sinclair and James, the children of James Sinclair and Annie Tufts both died at an early age. James at 28 and Margaret at 40. They are buried in Eureka, California. James died unmarried. Margaret married John Pinkerton, a rancher. Their only child, Harry Owen Pinkerton, became Sheriff of Humboldt County. He married Maude Foster. They have three children, John, Dorothy and Donald. This family with the exception of the son John, still lives in Eureka.

(2) Daniel Sinclair, the second child of Donald Sinclair and Margaret McCulloch, married Jane Bothwell. Their seven children were born in St. Marys. In about 1880 the family moved to Hannaford, North Dakota. Their children were (a) Fred, (b) Andrew, (c) Wallace, (d) James, (e) Edith, (f) William, (g) Sadie.

(a) Fred Sinclair, the eldest son, had ranching interests in Canada and his own bank in Leavenworth, Washington. He had three children but only Fred Jr. survives. Fred Jr. is employed by the Los Angeles County Water Department.

(b) Andrew Sinclair was a county superintendent of schools in Griggs County, North Dakota. In 1913 he became a farmer in Potter Valley near Ukiah, California. His first wife, Florence Haskell, died after the birth of their daughter, Florence. This daughter was cared for in her childhood by her grand aunt, Margaret Sinclair Stewart (Aunt Maggie). She established her own dressmaking establishment and also learned the printing trade. She and her husband, Harry Arnold established their own printing shop. Two daughters, Margaret and Evelyn, are now married with families of their own. Andrew married his second wife, Bertha Zimmerman, and had

three children, Esther, Bruce and Ralph. Esther married Penrose Wright and adopted two boys, Gerald and Earl. The family is ranching in Absarokee, Montana. Bruce married Virginia Fitzpatrick. He is with a construction company in Spokane, Washington. Ralph married Frances Smith and is an official of the Consumers' Power in Williamston, Michigan.

(c) Wallace Sinclair left Hannaford, North Dakota, and came to Ukiah California in 1913. He finally settled on a dairy ranch in Fairmead, Madera County, California. He married Clara Nelson and had four children, Grace, Alice, Mary Jean and Willard. Grace graduated from the University of California in 1931 with an A.B. degree and received her M.S. in 1942. She and her husband, Harold Bodenhamer, have two children, Mary and John. Alice is living in Fresno, California with her husband, Carlton Swanson and their daughter, Grace Edith. Mary Jean is running the dairy in Fairmead. Willard also has a dairy near by. He is married to Ida Nelson and has one son, Wallace Dee. Wallace Sinclair had a particular interest in live stock breeding and specialized in registered jersey cattle.

(d) James Herbert Sinclair was a graduate from a normal school in North Dakota and became a teacher and school administrator. He went into politics and represented the state in the United States Congress for many years. He married Laura Retzloff and had four children, Eleanor, James, Daniel and Muriel. Eleanor received a scholarship to Wellesley College for women. James attended the University of North Dakota where he was a football star. Daniel attended the U. S. Naval Academy at Annapolis. Muriel specialized in music. All are now married and have families.

(e) Edith Sinclair lives in Pasadena, California. She raised her sister's two boys, Gregg and Keith, after Sadie died.

(f) William Sinclair is a business man in Hannaford, North Dakota. He has been a member of the Board of School Trustees for many years. He had four children by his first wife, Ethel Sinclair, who was also his first cousin from the Moses Sinclair-Sally MacCallum branch of the family. The children were: Marjorie, who was an exceptional scholar in college and who became a school teacher; Arthur, who is in the Veterans' Administration in Minneapolis; Genevieve and Mae who are living in Maryland.

(g) Sadie Sinclair married A. D. Anderson and had two sons, Gregg killed in World War II and Keith who is living in Pasadena with his wife, Helen and daughter, Jill.

(4) Robert Sinclair, who came to California with James, married a girl of German parentage, Anna Maria Schmidt, in Oregon. Later they moved to Victoria, B.C. where they are buried in Ross Cemetery in that city. They had no children.

(6) Mary Sinclair married William Tufts, of Brussels, Ontario. Their first four children, Andrew, Ida, Laura and William were born in that city. The fifth child, Stuart, was born in London, Ontario. Mr. Tufts operated a general store for many years in Ontario before moving to Victoria B. C. with his family. After a few years in Victoria he settled permanently in Vancouver, B.C., where he opened a retail store selling tea, coffee, spices and extracts. Of their children, Ida, Laura and Stuart, are still living in Vancouver. Ida married Wallace Terry who owned one of the principal drug stores in Victoria

for many years. One son, Kingsley, is a physician in Victoria, and the other son, Goldwin, is an insurance broker. Laura married Doctor Caleb Mansell. She is the authoress of a published novel. Her children live in Vancouver. Stuart Tufts is an attorney with offices also in Vancouver.

(8) Moses Hiram Sinclair settled in Los Angeles, California, where he married Mary Archer Clewett, a school teacher. They had two daughters, Margaret and Adeline. Margaret married Ward Ridgley and had three children, Frances, James and Margaret. She died in September 1938. Mr. Ridgley owns and operates a dry goods store in Redondo Beach, California. Both Margaret and her sister Adeline were school teachers. Frances Ridgley graduated from Stanford University and is a teacher, thus carrying on the tradition in the family. Margaret Ridgely has recently been married. She is the latest Margaret to possess the wedding band of her great grandmother, Margaret McCulloch Sinclair. This family, as noted elsewhere in this history, also possesses the marriage license of the progenitors of this branch of the Sinclairs. Moses' daughter, Margaret, had a great interest in the Sinclair family history and with her aunt Margaret (Maggie) Sinclair gathered information about it. Much of our early history of the family came from information kindly sent to us by her husband, Ward Ridgely. Adeline Sinclair, the other daughter of Moses, married Ross R. Cole, who was in the life insurance business at the time. He served as an officer in the United States army during World War II. They have no children.

(9) Jean Sinclair married Robert Tufts, the brother of William Tufts. After a short married life they separated and Jean moved to Vancouver where she lived out her life with her niece Ida Tufts Terry. She had no children.

(10) Catherine Sinclair married Louis Kirk, of the family which founded Kirkton near St. Marys, Ontario. One son, Donald was born in the village before the family moved with the brother James, in 1877, to Eureka, California. Here were born the other children, Sue, Milton, May and Florence. Donald died unmarried. Sue married Frank Cookson and had two children, Stanley and Alto who married and have families. Milton, May and Florence married but have no children. Milton died in Seattle in 1944.

(11) Margaret Sloane Sinclair married John Stewart in Brussels, Ontario. He died in 1888. Aunt Maggie, as she was affectionately known, knew every member of the family and kept in constant touch with them by visits and letters. Of all the members of the family, she was the most interested in its history and the most proud of the Sinclair name and record. She never tired of relating the long and glorious descent of its members from the time of the Norman conquest of England in 1066. She firmly believed that we were descended from the family of William the Conqueror and the great St. Clair and Sinclair families of Scotland. Perhaps we are, although at this late date it is impossible to trace our particular branch back any earlier than about 1760 when we find it in Inverrary, Argyleshire, Scotland. However that may be, much credit must go to her for stimulating interest in our early history. If she were alive today many of the blank spaces in this genealogy could be filled and much conjecture eliminated. We remember with affection her gentle and kindly nature. She had no children of her own. She did however raise her niece, Florence Sinclair, daughter of her brother Daniel's son, Andrew, when his wife passed away shortly after the birth of the baby.

The strain of gentility which seemed to mark the women of the Sinclair family would appear to authenticate the persistent tradition of high birth and social rank in Scotland. Among the men, James Sinclair, the eldest son of Margaret McCulloch Sinclair was said to have been the image of the Duke of Argyll. In support of this relationship is the "Sinclair eye" which bore a marked resemblance to the well known eye peculiar to the Argyll family. Again the fact that the Sinclairs in Argyllshire were among the important members of the Duke's household lends weight to the claim of relationship. Aunt Maggie is authority for the statement that her great grandfather, Peter Sinclair, was the Lodgekeeper in charge of renting all estates for the Duke of Argyll. This position descended in the family and may have been hereditary. At any rate it was an important position and such positions usually went to members of the family rather than to strangers. Although we are as yet unable to trace any connection between our Sinclair family and the Sinclairs of Caithness there may still may be a direct relationship lost in the mists of the past. We know that there were many marriages between the noble families of Scotland. History records such marriage ties between the Sinclairs of Caithness and the Argyll Campbells, even though there were armed conflicts between them frequently. At one time the Campbells marched in and by force took over Caithness. They were later made to relinquish their possession. One of their best known marching songs commemorates the incident. Such inter-marriages could have brought members of the Sinclairs into Argyllshire and into the relationship we find our own Sinclair family had in the Duke's household. If nothing more it is an interesting speculation. At least Aunt Maggie Sinclair Stewart believed we were related to the Caithness family if not to the Argyll Campbells. It is interesting to wonder why our family has never associated itself with the Campbell clan inasmuch as members lived in the territory of that clan and had lived there for probably a hundred years. Aunt Maggie, who should have known, always claimed the Tartan and Shield of the Sinclairs of Caithness. Perhaps members of the family may have information on this question which will settle the matter.

(12) William M. Sinclair, the youngest child of the family was born in Brussels. He married Grace Ronald, daughter of the wealthy manufacturer of the Ronald fire apparatus. He practiced law in Brussels and is said to have been an excellent tennis player. He has two daughters, Lovise and Ruth and one son, Ronald. Lovise is married to Donald Clarke who is in the hardware business and a city official of Hamilton, Ontario. They have a son Kenneth who is a student at MacMaster University in Hamilton and a daughter, Lucille, married to Roy Wakelin. Lucille and her husband are representatives of a correspondence school with headquarters also in Hamilton. Ruth Sinclair is married to Gordon Hartry who is employed in the Bank of Canada, Hamilton. They have no children. Ronald Sinclair is a business man in Miami, Florida. He has a son Ronald Jr. and a daughter, Phyllis, both married.

Donald Sinclair and his wife Margaret McCulloch sold their farm in Blanchard township and moved to Brussels, Ontario. Here they purchased a home and lived out their lives. They are buried in Brussels.

SECTION #4

DESCENDANTS OF

MOSES SINCLAIR AND SALLY MAC CALLUM

Moses Sinclair was the youngest of the four Sinclairs who came to Canada in about the year 1819. Since he was born in Inverrary in 1809, he must have been about 10 years of age when he arrived in the new world. This would lend weight to the belief that his parents also came with the children. On the other hand it may be that the four Sinclairs arrived in Canada at different times. Future information may clear up this matter.

According to the meager information we have been able to obtain about this branch of the Sinclairs, Moses lived with his brothers and sisters or possibly with his parents near the village of St. Andrews East on the small stream called the River Rouge. His future wife Sarah was born in Inverrary, Scotland in 1813 and so was some four years younger. We do not have the date of their marriage but their first child, Daniel, was born in St. Andrews East in 1844. We believe that the second child, Duncan, was born in St. Marys but we are not sure. The next four children, Archibald, Malcolm (Mack), Sarah and Mary were all born on a farm in the little village of Anderson near St. Marys, Ontario. From the date of birth of the children and from other information we know that Moses and Sarah or Sally as she was more familiarly known, moved to Blanchard Township, Perth County, Ontario about the same time if not at the same time, as did Donald Sinclair and Margaret McCulloch. At any rate the two brothers were close neighbors, each acquiring 100 acres of land in Concession 2 on the Third Line. Moses' Lot number was 13 and Donald's was 16. At the present time (1950) Moses' property is owned by a Robert Ratcliffe and Donald's by a Clarence Hawkins. At this time, in the year 1845, the three brothers were living near St. Marys - Donald and Moses neighbors, and the eldest brother, Duncan, a few miles away. Susan Sinclair was still living in St. Andrews East and would not join her brothers in St. Marys until about the year 1848.

Moses and Sally had six children, Daniel, Duncan, Archibald, Malcolm (Mack), Sarah-Jean and Mary. It appears from the information we have, that all six children left Ontario and moved to Hannaford, North Dakota, where they lived for a number of years. Daniel finally returned to Ontario and died in London, Ontario. Duncan left Hannaford in about 1907 and moved to Taber, Alberta, Canada and died there. Archibald, Malcolm and the two sisters also moved to Alberta. Archie died at Coutts on the Milk River near the border between the United States and Canada. (The towns of Taber and Coutts are about 50 miles apart.) Malcolm, Sarah and Mary never married. All three died in Taber, Alberta.

Daniel and his wife, Rose Hardy, had three children; Emily is the only one still living. Frank was killed in World War I and Helen died of heart trouble the same day Frank, her brother, left home to go into World War I. The two latter children were unmarried. Emily and her two children now live in London, Ontario.

Duncan married Maggie Francis and had six children: Herbert who moved to Taber, Alberta in 1907 and still lives there; Ethel who married her first cousin, William D. Sinclair of Hannaford of the Donald-McCulloch-Sinclair branch; Myrtle, who became a well-known physician and surgeon in San Francisco and who died in Tucson, Arizona in about 1933; Lillian, Elmer and Earl. All these are deceased save Herbert.

Archie married Lucy Belle Merryman, school teacher in North Dakota. They have three children: Douglas who died in 1935 and Gerald and Ardelle-Earl, both married and living in Coutts, Alberta, Canada. Gerald has two children Enid and James. Ardelle, married in 1942, has no children.

The living descendants of Moses Sinclair and Sally MacCallum are few. If our record is correct they are: Emily Sinclair Legg and her two daughters Edith and Alma; Gerald and Ardelle Sinclair and Gerald's two children, Enid and James. It would seem that only James is left to carry on the Sinclair name in this branch of the family.

Moses Sinclair and Sally MacCallum are buried together in the Kirkton cemetery not far from their farm in Anderson. A simple headstone marks their graves, with their names, date of birth and death and country of their birth.
