PREFACE

DEAR KINSFOLKS:

When assisting last year at the twelfth family reunion of the Staudt-Stoudt-Stout Family, held at Perkasie Park on June 7th, 1924, I witnessed the particular interest that many of my American cousins had in our family history and the general feeling of kinship. I also realized at the same time that the knowledge of their history and the knowledge of how they are related one to another was rather vague.

Practically nothing was known about our common ancestors in the Palatinate and little about the descent of the different American branches. It was more or less the identity of the name that had brought them together. How could this be otherwise as no complete printed or even written family tree of the family existed?

I should here like to mention that the Stout family of New Jersey, who trace their family back to Richard Stout of Nottinghamshire (England) and his wife Penelope van Princes, are already ahead of us. Their complete family tree has been published by Dr. Stillwell in his "Historical and Genealogical Miscellany, Early Settlers of New Jersey and their Descendants," New York 1916. It is found in every large library and will enable practically everybody in the States whose name spells "Stout" to discover, if he belongs to the Stouts of English origin or to the Staudt-Stoudt-Stout family of Palatine origin.

However, considerable data on the Staudt-Stoudt-Stout family is included in genealogical publications, published in the course of the last twenty years and in addition a great deal of research work had been done besides.

To achieve what I am aiming at, to link together all the different branches I found it best to collect all the data already obtainable and to try as soon as possible a first publication of a rough family sketch. Such a publication can never be faultless or complete, but it will reveal to everyone of us for the first time what has already been done and what is still left to be done.

For this purpose your historian, Rev. Dr. John Baer Stoudt, put all his extensive material at my disposal; Dr. Philip S. Stout, your president, Dr. George C. Stout, the Hon. Ralph B. Strassburger and Mr. Frank L. Crone added other parts. The dates of the Palatinate I owe specially to Mr. Hermann Friedrich Macco, of Berlin-Steglitz, who has been at work for many years for that part of the Staudt family still in Germany. I particularly want to state here my gratitude towards these gentlemen who enabled me to compile the present composition.

My present sketch contains only dates of American members of our family and their direct ancestors in the Palatinate. A definite publication would of course comprehend both the German and the American branches. But for the purpose of completing the American part, we can do without the knowledge of the German descendance of our common forefathers.

Of the eighteen different male Staudts whose names were found in the Pennsylvania archives as immigrants between 1733 and 1770 (cf. page 5) thirteen have al-

ready been located in the Palatinate so that we know where and when they were born and who were their parents. Their birthplaces were situated in the country of Pfalz-Zweibrucken, which proves that they must have been all related to one another. Many of the different branches who went to Pennsylvania, are already linked together. These branches that are still single can doubtless be connected to the main tree. The task before us is still great. But if everybody contributes with the dates he has it will be a great step forward.

For a complete genealogy of a family it is absolutely indispensable that not only the name but every member's data are given with place and dates of birth, marriage and death. It is remarkable that I have been able to state rather completely, where and when the members of the older generations in long past centuries were born, when and whose daughters they married, what profession they exercised ietc., and when and where they died and that in comparison in the nineteenth and twentieth century one will find that these datas are mostly missing. We often don't even know, when and where a kinsman has lived, although such datas are doubtless easy to obtain if everybody of our kinsfolks contributes what he knows to complete the work. A list I put at the disposal of the President of the Family Reunion contains the addresses of 30 Staudt, 204 Stoudt and 302 Stout family residences in Pennsylvanis, 526 altogether. From this list it is evident that many members of our family living in Pennsylvania are not even mentioned by name in my sketch. Still more incomplete are the datas about those who left this State and their descendants. And as one will see there have been many who in the first half of the past century became affected with the western

fever and resolved to sell out "Go West" and and finally grew up with the development of the western states, specially the State of Ohio.

The designation of the different members in my composition has not been made yet as it is the rule by giving a continuous number to each. This is to be done in a later state of elaboration. How the actual designation works will be easily found out through the outline map which precedes each branch. The generations are always marked by Roman numbers, each male who left male descendance has got a special letter.

My wish and hope when publishing this little booklet, is that everybody who gets hold of it, will look it through and contribute in completing it by supplying us with all the dates he can give.

The president of our Family Reunion, Dr. Philip S. Stout, Medical Arts Building, Philadelphia, Pa., as well as myself, will be very grateful to receive any data our kinsmen and any other friend of the family may send us.

To finish I wish to refer to a thought mentioned once to me by Reverend John Baer Stoudt: Many people spend considerable sums in erecting valuable but silent tombstones to honor and perpetuate the memory of their relatives who passed away. The number of people who will look at these monuments and know about those who lie beneath them is limited, and even the length of time that these tombs will be cared for by the children and grandchildren is limited. On the other hand a family history edited with far less expense for every member will give a vivid and perpetual picture of all their kinsmen and guarantee far more that their memory will live now and in future days,

not only in the hearts of their grandchildren and greatgrandchildren, but in the hearts of all those who can feel proud to be of the same descent.

INTRODUCTION

The name Staudt has never been a name one finds very often. It is an old name. Very likely originally it has only been given to or adopted by few people.

It has not yet been possible to ascertain what the name really means and where it originally comes from. Some explain it as a "Staude," a little shrub, others think it was given to a family living near a "Stud"— "Studu" in Anglo-Saxon—which has the same meaning in early English as in early German, a pillar or cornerstone situated at the boundaries of a town. Both explanations may be correct.

The latter explanation seems to me to be the one corresponding to our family. All the Staudts originating from Franconia and from the Palatinate may be "Stud" people, while the Staudt people of Thuringia must have been originally "Staude" people. Nowadays one finds descendants of the Staude also in Franconia and vice-versa, and as they spell their name in the same way, it is sometimes misleading.

The earliest mentioning in deeds of the Staudt name in Franconia date back to the middle of the fourteenth century.

Those "Staudt" are supposed to come originally from the vicinities of the old independent town of Rothenburg, on the River Tauber, that is situated about half way between Frankfort and Munich. This old town is unique: its style of houses and everything else has the same appearance as it had about four to five hundred years ago, in the time of middle ages before reformation was introduced in Germany. It is

unique because it is the only town in Germany which has maintained its walls and gateways, and where by order of the city council no building may be changed into modern styles. It remains thus a true witness of past days, being of great interest to thousands of visitors, specially Americans travelling on the continent.

Since the Staudts migrated to Rothenburg from the flat land they have been grocers. They, however, changed their profession later and became owners of a dry goods store. At the end of the following century we find them members of the city council. At that period they were already living in the old patricial house in the "Herrengasse." That meant in their native city the "street of Lords." Emperor Charles V, the first of that name as king of Spain, lived in this house as a guest when he stayed at Rothenburg in the year 1546, after the reformation was introduced. This event is commemorated by a memorial stone placed on the front of the house.

And this same house is still held today by that branch of the family which remained in Rothenburg. This branch has been knighted by one of the emperors more than two hundred years ago. General von Staudt, who resides in Munich, spends the summer months every year in Rothenburg and lives in this enchanting old house. Its court has been painted by many famous painters because of its beauty and picturesqueness.

If the Palatine Staudts are of the same origin as these Rothenburg Staudts, or if the Staudt name in the Palatinate originated independently is still unknown. Maybe that in the fifteenth century one branch of the family left Rothenburg and moved to the Palatinate. We find them about A. D. 1500 as patricians in Worms, the place where A. D. 1521

Luther defended his new doctrine before Charles V and in Speyer. Both these old independent towns, like Rothenburg, are situated on the left bank of the River Rhine in the Palatinate. We also find them as owners of the "Staudterhof," a large seigniorial estate north of Kaiserslautern, also in The Palatinate.

A. D. 1549, Christoph Staudt, a member of the city council of Worms, died, and as was the custom, a wooden plate in his memory was hung in the Cathedral of Worms. This wooden plate still exists in the Museum at Worms and shows a family crest. There is no earlier record than this, mentioning a family crest of the Staudt family, and it is supposed that the figure shown on its shield was specially invented for Christoph Staudt as it is merely a composition of numbers presenting the year he died. On the helmet, one of the deers of the city crest of Worms, is to be seen, i. e., a dragon's head, neck and wing. From this crest the family crest used later on by the Staudt family most probably developed. Apparently the dragon was taken for a fox, which is today the ensign of our family.

The Staudts in Worms and Speyer seem to have died out, not later than during the Thirty Years War, victims perhaps, as so many others, of terrible diseases which raged among the population of Germany. In the records no traces are left of the descendants of these branches of the family, whose members in the sixteenth century were found in distinguished positions.

The "Staudterhof" had burnt down already long before that time and those to whom it belonged had had to remove to villages of the neighborhood where they soon became members of the town councils and intermarried with the most prominent families. They never recovered the position of wealth they had lost through war and misfortune, but they never forgot what they had formerly been. They lived there in prosperity until the beginning of the eighteenth century. The French then occupied this territory and conditions for the population of the Palatinate became very similar to those of the present day. As the Edict of Nantes was already abolished and in consequence the protestants were persecuted and expelled from France, The Palatines of protestant faith were those who suffered most from the French opperssion. They emigrated in large numbers to Northern Germany, Hungary and Roumania, and were received everywhere with open arms as worthwhile settlers.

At the same time the first Palatine immigrants went to Pennsylvania, called over by the Agents of the Penn Brothers. John Michael Staudt, who arrived in 1733, was the first Stuadt who went to America. They found a country of virgin soil and in appearance and climate resembling very much that of their old fatherland in the Palatinate.

In comparison to their former life under French oppression they preferred living in freedom in this new country even if they had to defend themselvesagainst the Indians. And so in the following forty years nearly twenty male Stoudt over sixteen years of age are mentioned in the old Colonial disembarking lists of Philadelphia. They all were of Reformed or Lutheran faith and brothers, counsins, fathers or sons called over by their relatives who had migrated before. Each family flourished and had many children, few only dying in childhood. So it is that the Staudts are now more numerous in the States than in Germany.

The date of his arrival is not certain. He may have already arrived with John Michael, in 1733, or he may have come only with John Jacob in 1737, as both times a Johannes Staudt is mentioned among the immigrants.

He settled in Brunswick Tp., now Schuylkill Co., where he had an estate of one hundred acres.

At the time of his death his eldest son was only 14 years old, and he petitioned the court, on October 28th of 1773, that his uncle, Michael Staudt, of Bern Tp., be appointed his guardian. On the 11th of November 1773, Michael Staudt was also appointed guardian for the other three children of John Stuadt of Brunswick. He arrived on the ship Merchant of London from Rotterdam at Philadelphia, and took the oath of allegiance at this town in the year 1783, September the 18th.

He was accompanied by his cousin Mathias Stoudt, age 8 years and Johannes Stoudt, who is supposed to have been his brother.

(In 1773, October 28th, the late Johannes Staudt (of Brunswick), eldest son, John (14 years of age), petitioned the court that his uncle Michael Staudt, should be appoined his and his brothers' and sisters' guardian.)

In 17137, October 25th, there was surveyed for him a tract of land consisting of 180 acres on the west bank of the Schuylkill River, opposite the flat meadows. Later the number of acres was almost doubled. The scenery along the river is romantic; a bridge known as Stoudts Ferry Bridge, now spans the river where formerly a ferry was the means of crossing. The house, a substantial stone building, was built over a spring of good water, no doubt in order to have water in case of an Indian attack.

This Stoudt homestead was owned by Johann, Michael's male descendants until the twentieth century and only recently sold to Ferdinand Tuhn, of Wyomissing, near Reading, Pa., a textile manufacturer.

Johann M. was naturalized as a citizen of Berks Co., on April 10th or 11th of 1761, a which time he declared that he had taken the sacrament on April the 1st of 1761.


