P R E F A C E .

THE gathering of this Genealogy has occupied occasional thought during many years, and has taken all my leisure hours the past two years.

The correspondence has necessarily been large, and the families widely scattered, but from all directions there comes a manifest reverence for "a good name."

It is an honorable family pride that every one may cherish, to trace the excellences of past generations, and it is equally honorable to emulate the virtues of worthy ancestors. Among these are names who have been abundantly honored, and rarely excelled—whose fame may stimulate all coming generations. Among these, too, are the names of many who, though less famous, have patiently and well performed their life work. They have left a bright example, and are worthy of imitation. Perfection in detail concerning every family is not to be expected, but for general correctness and family history, these records will not soon lose their value. IN the office of Heraldry, England, the following origin of the Stoddard Family is found :

WILLIAM STODDARD, a knight, came from Normandy to England, A. D., 1066, with William the Conqueror, who was his cousin. Of his descendants, we find record of RUKARD STODDARD, of Mottingham, Kent, near Eltham, about seven miles from London Bridge, where was located the family estate of about four hundred acres, which was in possession of the family in 1490, how much before is not known, and continued till the death of NICHOLAS STODDARD, a bachelor, in 1765.

THE

STODDARD FAMILY.

- (1) **Anthony Stoddard** emigrated from England and came to Boston about 1639. He was admitted Freeman in 1640, was a representative in 1650, 1659, 1660, and during twenty successive years from 1665 to 1684. He married, first, Mary, daughter of Hon. Emanuel Downing, of Salem, who, with Lucy his wife, was admitted to the church in Salem Nov. 4, 1638, and sister of Sir George, afterward Lord George Downing, by whom he had three sons:

SOLOMON, born Oct. 4, 1643, died Feb. 11, 1729.

SAMSON, born Dec. 3, 1645, died Nov. 4, 1698.

SIMEON, born 1650, died Oct. 15, 1730. Simeon was member of an artillery company in 1675. He had three sons: *Anthony*, born Sept. 24, 1678, died March 11, 1748; *David*, born Dec. 5, 1685; *Jonathan*, born Feb. 5, 1688.

He married, second, Barbara, widow of Capt. Joseph Weld, of Roxbury, who died April 15, 1654, by whom he had two children:

- (2) I. SOLOMON, born Oct. 4, 1643, died Feb. 11, 1729, æ. 86. He graduated at Harvard, 1662, was afterward elected "Fellow of the House," and was the first Librarian of the College, which office he held from 1667 to 1674. About this time, on account of his health, he accompanied the Governor of Massachusetts to Barbadoes, in capacity of Chaplain, and remained nearly two years, preaching to the Dissenters. In 1669 he received a call to the church in Northampton, and settled as minister Sept. 11, 1672. He married, March 8, 1670, Mrs. Esther Mather, originally Esther Warham, of Windsor, Conn., and widow of Rev. Eleazer Mather, his predecessor at Northampton. She died Feb. 10, 1736, æ. 92. In 1726 Mr. Jonathan Edwards, his grandson, was elected his colleague.

Among the publications of Rev. Solomon Stoddard are the following: The Trial of Assurance, 1696. The Doctrine of Instituted Churches, 1700, written in answer to the work of Rev. Increase Mather, entitled "The Order of the Gospel," which occasioned exciting controversy. The Danger of Degeneracy, 1702. Election Sermon, 1703. Sermon on the Lord's Supper, Ex. xii., 47, 48, 1707. Sermon, Ordination of Rev. Joseph Willard, Swampfield, 1708. Inexcusableness of Neglecting the Worship of God, 1708. Falseness of the Hopes of Many Professors, 1708. An appeal to the Learned on the Lord's Supper, 1709. The sermon of 1707 and the "Appeal" of 1709 were a renewal of the controversy of 1700. A Plea for Tithes. Divine Teachings Render Persons Blessed, 1712. A Guide to Christ, 1714. Three Sermons: The Virtue of Christ's Blood, Natural Men Under the Government of Self-love, The Gospel a Means of Conversion; and a fourth, To Stir Up Young Men and Maidens, 1717. Sermon at the Ordination of Mr. Thomas Cheney, 1718. Treatise Concerning Conversion, 1719. Answer to Cases of Conscience, 1722. Inquiry whether God is not Angry with this Country, 1723. Safety of Appearing in Christ's Righteousness, 1724.

- (3) II. SAMSON, born Dec. 3, 1645, married and had issue one son.

(a) SAMSON, who graduated at Harvard, 1701, settled as minister in Chelmsford; who had one son, Samson, who graduated 1730; and he had two sons, Samson, who graduated 1763, and Vryling, who graduated in 1765, and three daughters, one of whom married a Wilder, one a White, and one Dr. Hopkins.

- (4) III. SIMEON, born 1650, died Oct. 15, 1730, æ 80. He married, and had issue as follows:

(a) MARY, born May 20, 1676.

-(b) ANTHONY, born Sept. 24, 1678, graduated at Harvard, 1697. He married Martha Belcher, daughter of Hon. Andrew Belcher, and sister of Governor Jonathan Belcher. She was a member of the Old South church at the age of twenty, and died Feb. 11, 1748, aged 62. His children were *Martha*, *Simeon*, who graduated at Harvard, 1726, and *Anthony*.

(c) ELIZABETH, born Feb. 15, 1680, died June 25, 1757, æ. 77.

(d) SIMEON, born Oct. 20, 1682, murdered in England, 1706.

(e) MARY, born Sept. 19, 1684.

(f) DAVID, born Dec. 5, 1685, married, Dec. 23, 1713, Elizabeth Shrimpton, granddaughter of Colonel Samuel Shrimpton, by whom he had issue, *Sarah*, born Aug. 10, 1718, married Elder Thomas Greenough, died March 8, 1778, æ. 60; *Mehitabel*, born July 5, 1719, married William Hyslop, died Nov. 19, 1792; *Mary*, born July 20, 1720, married Charles Chauncy, D. D., died 1782; *Elizabeth*, born June 27, 1723.

(g) JONATHAN, born Feb. 5, 1687.

(h) MARTHA, born Dec. 14, 1689.

(i) WILLIAM, born Nov. 8, 1693.

(j) JONATHAN 2d, born May 4, 1695.

(k) JOHN, born June, 1697.

His first wife died Aug. 13, 1708.

His second wife was Elizabeth Shrimpton, relict of Col. Samuel Shrimpton, whom he married May 31, 1709. She died April 13, 1713.

He married for his third wife Mehitabel Seargent, relict of Hon. Peter Sergeant, and niece of Governor Stoughton.

He had no children by his last two wives.

- (5) I. MARY, born Jan. 9, 1671, married, Oct. 2, 1695, Rev. Stephen Mix, who graduated at Harvard, 1690, and was settled as minister at Wethersfield, Conn.

The matrimonial correspondence of that early day is a curiosity. Rev. Stephen Mix visited Rev. Solomon Stoddard, and proposed marriage to his eldest daughter Mary. Her answer, after several weeks' consideration, is in the following letter, remarkable for brevity :

"NORTHAMPTON, 1695.

"*Rev. Stephen Mix :*

"Yes.

"MARY STODDARD."

This was followed by marriage in a few weeks. Children :

(b) ELIZABETH, born April 14, 1697, died September 21, 1733, married, June 30, 1724, Jabez Huntington, Esq., of Windham, Conn. They had four daughters.

(c) ANN, born April 28, 1699, died April 11, 1790, married, May 8, 1734, Capt. John Ellsworth, of East Windsor, Conn. Children:

2. *Solomon*, born April 30, 1737.

3. *Frederick*, born October 20, 1738, died Feb. 20, 1799.

4. *Ann*, born Jan. 23, 1741, died Nov. 8, 1819.

(d) MARY, born Feb. 11, 1701, died in East Windsor, Sept. 11, 1776, unmarried.

(e) JONATHAN, born Oct. 5, 1703, died March 22, 1758, at Princeton, N. J., married, July 28, 1727, Sarah Pierpont, who died in Philadelphia, Oct. 2, 1758, daughter of Rev. Jas. Pierpont, of New Haven, Conn., graduated at Yale College, 1720; in Sept., 1723, he received his degree of A. M. In Aug., 1722, he went to New York, and labored eight months among the English Presbyterians of that city. About 1724 he was chosen Tutor in Yale College, where he continued two years, till Sept., 1726, when he was chosen colleague for his grandfather, Rev. Solomon Stoddard, of Northampton, and was ordained Feb. 15, 1727, and successfully labored twenty-four years, till June 22, 1750. In Aug., 1751, he was sent as a missionary to the Indians at Stockbridge, where he continued till he was chosen to the Presidency of Naussa Hall College, to succeed his son-in-law, Rev. Aaron Burr, about Oct., 1757. He entered upon his duties at Princeton, N. J., in Jan., 1758, was inducted into office Feb. 16, and died, March 22, 1758.

To those acquainted with the religious and philosophical labors of the last century little need be said of Jonathan Edwards. To those interested in his ancestry it is pleasing to know that his biographer attributes no small part of his intellect and ability to his mother, who was the second daughter of our honored ancestor Solomon, of Northampton, Mass. Concerning the celebrated treatise on *The Freedom of the Will*, able judges of Scotland, England, and Germany declared it one of the greatest efforts of the human intellect, and with equal esteem was he regarded in his own country. Other of his works of rare merit may be mentioned: *A Narrative of the Work of God in Northampton*, 1736. *Thoughts on Revivals*, 1742. *Religious Affections*, 1746. *Life of Rev. David Brainard*, 1749. *Qualifications for Communion*, 1749. *Original Sin*, 1758. *History of Redemption*, published in 1774. *God's Last End of the Creation*, 1788.

His death, which was very unexpected, was occasioned by inoculation for small-pox, followed by fever. Concerning this strange providence, his epitaph declares, "How many groans his departure excites. His loss the college mourns—the Church mourns; but heaven, where he is received, rejoices. Farewell, beloved leader, we will follow your holy example." His children were,

3. *Esther*, born Feb. 13, 1732, died April 7, 1758, married, June 29, 1752, Rev. Aaron Burr, born Fairfield, Conn., Jan. 4, 1715. Educated at Yale College. Pastor in Newark, N. J., afterward first President of the College at Princeton, where he died, Sept. 24, 1757. Two children: *Sarah*, born May 3, 1754, died March 30, 1797, married, June 24, 1772, Hon. Chief Justice Tapping Reeve, of Litchfield, Conn.; *Aaron*, born Feb. 6, 1756, in Newark, N. J., died Sept. 14, 1836. Vice President of the United States 1801 to 1805, married, July 2, 1782, Theodosia Provost, of New York, who died 1794, daughter of Col. Provost, of the

British army. They had one child, *Theodosia*, born 1783, who married, Jan., 1801, Gen. Joseph Allston, of Charleston, afterward, 1812, Governor of South Carolina; one child, *Aaron Burr*, born Jan. 8, 1802, died July 26, 1812. She was lost at sea on her passage from Charleston to New York, in 1813.

4. *Mary*, born April 7, 1734, died Feb. 28, 1807, married, Nov. 8, 1750, Timothy Dwight, of Northampton, Mass., and had thirteen children. The eldest son, *Timothy*, born May 3, 1752, was pastor of the church at Greenfield Hill, Fairfield, Conn., and President of Yale College.

5. *Lucy*, born Aug. 31, 1736, died Sept. 18, 1786, married, June 7, 1764, Jahleel Woodbridge, of Stockbridge, Mass., and had nine children. The youngest son, *Timothy*, born Nov. 23, 1783, lost his sight while preparing for the ministry, but completed his studies, and settled in Green River, N. Y., where he married Cynthia Phelps, and removed to Spencertown, N. Y., where he died, 1863.

6. *Timothy*, born July 25, 1738, died Oct. 27, 1813, married, Sept. 25, 1760, Rhoda Ogden, and had fourteen children. Residence, till 1771, Elizabethtown, N. J., afterward Stockbridge, Mass., where he was deacon in the Congregational church, and in public office till 1787.

7. *Susannah*, born June 20, 1740, died May 2, 1803, married, Sept. 17, 1761, Eleazar Porter, Esq., of Hadley, Mass.; had six sons.

8. *Eunice*, born May 9, 1743, died Sept. 9, 1822, in Newbern, N. C., married, first, Jan. 1764, Thos. Pollock, of Newbern, N. C.; second, about 1780, Robt. Hunt, Esq., of Elizabethtown, N. J.

9. *Jonathan*, born May 26, 1745, died Aug. 1, 1801, in Schenectady, N. Y., married, first, Oct. 4, 1770, Mary Porter, daughter of Eleazar Porter, Sr., of Hadley, Mass.; second, Dec. 18, 1783, Mercy Sabin, daughter of Col. H. Sabin, of New Haven. Jonathan received the title of D. D., and was President of Union College, New York, at the time of his death.

10. *Elizabeth*, born May 6, 1747, died Jan. 1, 1762, at Northampton.

11. *Pierpont*, born April 8, 1750, died at Bridgeport, Conn., April 5, 1822, married May, 1769, Frances Ogden, of Elizabethtown, N. J. Had six children. The youngest daughter married Eli Whitney, of New Haven, the celebrated inventor of the cotton gin.

(*f*) EUNICE, born Aug. 20, 1705, died June 1, 1788, at East Windsor, Conn., married Rev. Simon Backus, pastor of the church in Newington, Conn., Oct. 1, 1729, "by Rev. Timothy Edwards, minister"

(*g*) ABIGAIL, born Dec. 25, 1707, died Sept. 24, 1764, married Oct. 25, 1737, William Metcalf, of Lebanon, Conn. Had five children.

(*h*) JERUSA, born May 30, 1710, died Dec. 22, 1729.

(*i*) HANNAH, born Feb. 8, 1713, died June 7, 1773, married, Jan. 15, 1746, Seth Wetmore, Esq., of Middletown, Conn. Had three children.

(*j*) LUCY, born May 25, 1715, died Aug. 21, 1786.

(*k*) MARTHA, born Jan. 5, 1718, died Feb. 1794, in Wapping Society, East Windsor, Conn., married, 1746, Rev. Moses Tuthill, first pastor of the church in Granville, Mass. He died at Southold, L. I., Oct., 1785. They had four daughters.

(7) III. SAMUEL, born Feb. 5, 1674, died March 22, 1674.

(8) IV. ANTHONY, born June 6, 1675, died June 7, 1675.

(9) V. AARON, born Aug. 23, 1676, died Aug. 23, 1676.

(10) VI. CHRISTIAN, born Aug. 23, 1676, died April 23, 1764, married Rev. William Williams, who graduated at Harvard, 1683, and settled as minister fifty-six years in Hatfield. He died Sept. 1, 1741, æ. 76. Children as follows:

(*a*) SOLOMON, D. D., graduated at Harvard, 1719. He was ordained as minister at Lebanon, Conn., Dec. 5, 1722.

(*b*) ISRAEL, graduated at Harvard, 1727, died Jan. 10, 1788, æ. 79.

(*c*) ELIZABETH, married Samuel Barnard, of Salem.

(*d*) DOROTHY, married Rev. Jonathan Ashley, of Deerfield, and died Sept., 1805.

(11) VII. ANTHONY, born Aug. 9, 1678, died Sept. 6, 1760, graduated at Harvard, 1697, settled as minister in Woodbury, Conn., where he continued sixty years. He married, first, by Rev. Stephen Mix, Oct. 20, 1700, Prudence Wells,

of Wethersfield, who died May, 1714. Married, second, Jan. 31, 1715, Mary Sherman, who died Jan. 12, 1720.

- (12) VIII. SARAH, born April 1, 1680, married, March 19, 1707, Rev. Samuel Whitman, who graduated at Harvard, 1696, and settled as minister in Farmington, Conn. Children,

(a) SARAH, married Rev. J. Trumbull.

(b) ELIZABETH, married Rev. Thomas Strong, of New Marlboro'.

(c) ELNATHAN, graduated at Yale, 1726, and settled as minister over the Second Parish in Hartford. He died March 4, 1777, æ. 69, in the forty-fourth year of his ministry.

(e) SAMUEL, graduated at Yale, 1735.

- (13) IX. JOHN, born Feb. 17, 1682, died June 19, 1748, graduated at Harvard, 1701, married, Dec. 13, 1731, Prudence Chester, of Wethersfield, Conn., who was born March 4, 1699, died Sept. 11, 1780, æ. 81.

He lived in Northampton, and was often a member of the General Court, and for many years one of the Governor's Council, also Chief-Justice of the C. Court Common Pleas, Judge of Probate, Chief Colonel of the Regiment, &c.

- (15) XI. REBECCA, born 1686, died Jan. 1766, married Joseph Hawley, Nov. 16, 1722. Their children were,

(a) JOSEPH, born Oct. 8, 1723, graduated at Yale, 1742, married Mercy Lyman, of Northampton, but had no children. He died March 10, 1788.

(b) ELISHA, born July 18, 1726, killed Sept. 4, 1755, at the battle of Lake George. He was captain in the army. He married Miss Elizabeth Pomeroy, of Northampton, but had no children.

- (16) XII. HANNAH, born April 21, 1688, died Dec. 29, 1745, married Rev. William Williams, who graduated at Harvard, 1705, and settled as minister in Weston, Mass. Children,

It contains much of his early years, an interesting account of his life in the army, the years spent in study and active life, and many poems and literary productions of merit. His autobiography says: "If in childhood I possessed any valuable qualities, they were, a strong memory and an aptness in acquiring whatever I aimed at." "I used to recite the whole books of Samuel, Kings, and Chroni-

cles." "The prayers I heard at school in the daytime I frequently repeated to my mother in the evening." "I was more than once called on to recite the sermon I had just heard in church, and always succeeded—once in the presence of the Parson, who had his notes before him." While he read with avidity and was thrilled by the thoughts of others, he often grieved that he lacked ideas of his own. His autobiography shows that his tenacious memory was sustained by sound sense and scholarly attainments, and he proved himself a vigorous and pungent writer. Early in 1779, before he was seventeen, he entered the army, being mustered into service at West Point by Baron Steuben. He was at first in the infantry, but soon entered an artillery company, in which he remained till the close of the war. When he enlisted he was small and frail, and soon suffered by sickness; after this he was in excellent health, and at the close of the war, six feet in height, and strong in body. His battery was near Haverstraw Bay when Arnold escaped, and were soon transferred to New Jersey, and were present when Andre was hung. They also took part in the campaign prior to the siege of Yorktown, and were present at the surrender of Cornwallis. He shared with others in privations and suffering. Months at a time he was without shoes or a vest, two shirts and a blanket being all his stock of clothing not in constant use. He was mustered out of service at West Point, receiving his pay in currency worth only one tenth of its face. In the spring of 1784 he went to Boston and obtained a clerkship in the office of the Supreme Court, under Charles Cushing, Esq., in whose family he resided several years. Here he devoted himself to study, in leisure from office duties, and in one year read one hundred and fifty volumes. In 1786 the Shay's rebellion broke out, and with a commission under Gen. Lincoln, he was actively engaged in suppressing it. In Jan., 1787, he was sent from Boston with dispatches to several counties in the western part of the State, under Gen. Patterson, of Berkshire. Served as commandant of an artillery company till the insurgents were subdued in the following spring

and was stationed during the summer at Great Barrington. Resumed his duties as clerk at the close of 1787. In 1789 he entered the office of Seth Padelford, Esq., of Taunton, Mass., where he continued the study of law, and was admitted to the bar in April, 1793. His fondness for military life seemed never to forsake him. He was commissioned Brigade Major and Inspector of the Second Brigade Massachusetts Militia by Gov. Samuel Adams, April 13, 1796. In 1798 he was Captain of United States Artillery at Newport, R. I. He was soon sent west as Captain in Second Regiment of Artillerists and Engineers, under Gen. St. Clair, and in 1806 he was promoted to the rank of Major, which he held till his death. Jan. 24, 1804, he was appointed by Gov. Claiborne as First Civil Commander of upper Louisiana and Intendant at St. Louis, and from the commissioners appointed received the surrender of that newly ceded territory, together with the public archives. He remained there about three years, exercising all the powers of government, and then, returning to Washington, was stationed in or near New York. While he resided at the west he gathered material and afterward published a volume entitled "Sketches, Historical and Descriptive, of Louisiana, by Major Amos Stoddard, U. S. M. P. S., and New York Historical Society." This volume was published in Philadelphia, and bears date "Fort Columbus, 1812." At that date this work was standard authority concerning that portion of the country. His autobiography was also written in 1812. While at St. Louis, about 1806, he invested in government lands which afterward came within city limits, and very valuable. The title was confirmed to his heirs in the year 1851 by the Supreme Court of the United States.

In the opening of the war of 1812 he was ordered to Pittsburgh to superintend and forward material for the campaign near the lakes. Upon the surrender of Hull, he was ordered to Fort Meigs to prepare that post for the defense of the settlements south of the lakes. So skillfully and judiciously was it done that Gen. Harrison was able to resist the combined force of British and Indians.

During this siege he received a wound of which he died.

He entered West Point, 1836, and graduated sixth in his class June 30, 1840, and at once entered service. He was Second Lieutenant Third United States Artillery. Served in Florida, winters of 1840 and 1841. November, 1841, promoted to First Lieutenant, and was afterwards stationed at Fort Moultrie, South Carolina. In 1846 he was sent with his company to California, and remained there through the Mexican War, having reached the grade of Captain. Perhaps at that time no man more fully comprehended the magnitude of the impending struggle. He at once offered his services, and May 13, 1861, was appointed Colonel in the regular army. In the affair at Manassas, July 21, he com-

manded the Third Brigade, First Division. August 3, 1861, he was confirmed Brigadier-General. In the Department south of the Ohio he was second, and when General Anderson was relieved he was first in command. He assisted General Grant when he moved on Donaldsonville in 1862, and he was rendering most effective assistance when he moved on Petersburg and crushed the rebellion, in April, 1865. In the battle of Shilo, April 6, 1862, he commanded the leading division, and General Grant says, "To his individual efforts I am indebted for the success of that battle." In May following he was appointed and confirmed Major-General. We must let history speak of his part at the siege of Vicksburg—of his command in the campaigns of Chattanooga and Atlanta—of the bold and successful march to Savannah and through the Carolinas, and the power of his brave army in closing the war, all of which "entitle General Sherman to more credit than usually falls to the lot of one man to earn."

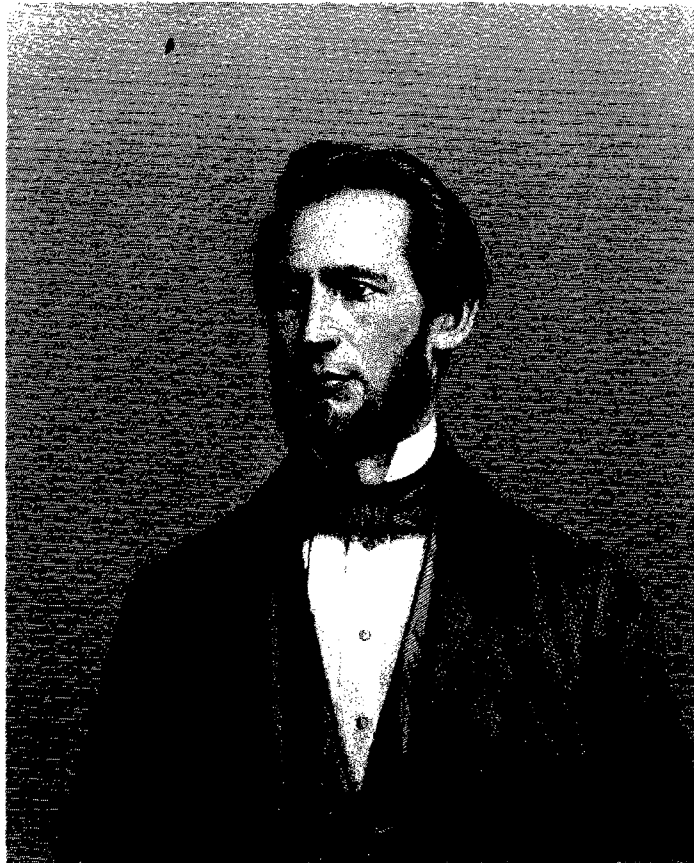

entered Yale College. There he maintained a good standing as a student, and was assigned an English oration in the graduating class of 1790. Previous to his death he was the oldest living graduate of Yale College, with one or two exceptions. After leaving college, Mr. Stoddard entered the office of the late Governor Strong as a law student. For eighteen months he practiced law in Williamstown, Mass., and then settled permanently in his native town, where he continued the active duties of his profession till 1810, when he was chosen Register of Deeds for the county of Hampshire, and served ten years. In 1821, he was appointed Clerk of the Courts for the same county, which office he resigned, after sixteen years, in 1837. He was sent by the town as Representative to the General Court in 1807, 1808, and 1838, and he filled besides many offices of trust in the region where he resided, always discharging the duties connected therewith with scrupulous fidelity. He was of a modest, retiring disposition, and never put himself forward, or claimed precedence over others; kind, gentle, obliging, he was ever esteemed among his fellow-citizens as a good neighbor and a man of unswerving integrity and uprightness. Originally a Federalist of the Governor Strong school, he became a Whig and Republican, as parties modified or were dissolved. He was always firm and decided in his political opinions, though prudent and courteous in his intercourse with those who differed from him. At the age of sixty-seven he retired from public life. The chief glory and ornament of his character was his constant and exemplary piety. For forty years he was a member of the church in Northampton of which Rev. Jonathan Edwards was former pastor, and his walk and conversation, in humility and devotion, were a fitting exemplification of the spirit and temper of the gospel of our Lord. He outlived most who commenced the race in company; and the later years of his life, free from many of the cares of earlier days, were passed in the bosom of his family, where the Christian virtues shone with bright

and constant lustre. He was the patriarch of the house, who led the family devotions morning and evening. He manifested a lively interest in the benevolent efforts of the day, and was ever ready to contribute to promote them. To the period of his last illness, his mental powers were active, and he kept himself familiar with all the movements of the political and religious world.

He studied medicine at Springfield, was surgeon in the army, afterwards practiced at Whitehall, N. Y., Blakeley, and Covington, La. He died at Covington, Nov. 9, 1821.

David Tappan Stoddard returned to America with his children Oct., 1848. Married, Feb. 14, 1851, Sophia D. Hazen, of Berlin, Vt., and returned to Persia, March, 1851. He died Jan. 22, 1857, at Mount Seir, near Oroomiah.

A brief notice of the life and labor of David Tappan will be of interest. Those who would fully appreciate this excellent man and model missionary will not fail to read his memoir by Rev. J. P. Thompson, D. D., of New York.

He entered Williams College as sophomore in 1834. After remaining one year he entered Yale College. His generous, genial, studious, and truthful bearing gained him friends, and the very best of his class. Like the noble young man whom Jesus loved, he *yet lacked one thing*. On the day of Prayer for Colleges his mother spent the whole day in prayer for him, and by letter reminded him that in infancy she had consecrated him to the work of the ministry. On this same day his pious classmates prayed and wrestled for him, and he is converted—their prayers were answered, and from that day he was in heart a minister and a missionary. He graduated with honor, in 1838, accepted a tutorship in the college, and pursued his theological course in the seminary connected with it. The visit of Dr. Perkins and Mar Yohannes to this country awakened in his mind a strong interest in the Nestorian Mission, and he accompanied Dr. Perkins on his return to Oroomiah, in 1842. While on the voyage he began the study of the languages, and was, very soon after his arrival, able to enter upon the work of instruction and translation of the Scriptures. As a teacher, he won the hearts of his pupils; as a preacher of Christ, with whom he seemed always to be in personal communion, he stirred the emotions of his hearers as with a fire from heaven. His fine imagination, and the peculiar glow of his mind in all the exhibitions of knowledge and truth, pre-eminently fitted him to attract and impress the Orientals. While in college he constructed with his own hand a large telescope, a really good instrument, grinding and polishing the speculum, and adjusting the tube with the skill of a practical workman. He carried this with him to Oroomiah, and there in Persia, where Astronomy had its birth, it became to him a powerful assistant. A group of influential persons once assembled at his invitation to view the rings of Saturn. At first they refused even to look into the telescope, so confident were they that he was trying to deceive them with “lying wonders,” but no sooner did they look than they exclaim, “You know everything, we will believe all that you tell

us!" His labors were untiring, and seriously affected his health. In 1848, he was advised to visit Constantinople for the benefit of the sea air; on his way he encountered the cholera at Trebizond, and there, in the wretched quarters of a Turkish quarantine, his wife died. This new and painful affliction brought him to his native land. This visit of about two years greatly refreshed the churches, and will long be remembered. In the early part of 1851, greatly improved in health, and through the favor of Providence having entered anew into the marriage relation, he returned, with a bounding heart, to his loved field in Persia. There, during six years, with renewed energy, success, and delight, he labored till the hand of death overtook him at his post, and at the early age of thirty-eight, he went from Mount Seir, near Oroomiah, to the "New Jerusalem," the City of our God. His death was an irreparable loss to the Mission. Dr. Perkins says of him, "He was a great light here—an eminently holy man, a very able and devoted missionary. He has accomplished a great work, how great the records of eternity alone will unfold."
