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## THE TOOTHAKER GENEALOGY

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(1) Roger Toothaker, the Ancestor in America, was born in England about 1612, and died before 1638. In 1635 he came to America in the ship Hopewell. (See the History of Billerica, Mass., by Mr. Hazen.)

"The original lists of persons of quality and others, who went from Great Britain to the American Plantations 1600-1700, by John Camden Hotten, London, published in 1874; page 130." Sept 1635, their underwritten names were to be transported to New England, imbarqued in the Hopewell, Thomas Babb, Master, Certificates from the Ministers of Justice of the Conformatie in Religion to the Church of England; of yet they are of no subsidy men; they have taken their Oaths of Allegiance of Supreme. ROGER TOOTHAKER, aged 23 years; MARGARET TOOTHAKER, aged 28 years."

The above Margaret Toothaker, as a widow of Roger Toothaker, married (2) in 1638, Ralph Hill, Senior, as his second wife. Savage mentions this in his History. Another writer gives the date of the marriage as Dec 31, 1637, which would seem to be an error. Widow Margaret Toothaker after this second marriage must have lived at Plymouth, Mass., for some little time. The Plymouth Records state: "At a Court of Assessments held Plymouth, Feb 5 in the 12th Year of His Majestie's Reign in England, etc., etc., a garden place at Wellingland, and 6 acres of land upon the Woberry Plains, are granted unto Margaret Toothaker, Widow." "Sept 4, 1638, John Allen and Margaret Toothaker were prosecuted for stoppin the highway that goeth to Monomet. Released."

"Ralph Hill, who married Widow Margaret Toothaker, was an early resident of Plymouth, Mass. In 1634 he was made a Freeman at Woburn, Mass. He was Selectman in 1649. He joined the Settlement on the Shawshin as early as any, and 'lived on the farm'. In 1663 he gave the town a burying place, and died in the same year. His body was no doubt the first to be laid in the 'Old South Burying Ground', Andover, Mass." In his will Ralph Hill, mentions a grand-daughter, Mary Littlefield. Francis Littlefield of Woburn, Mass., had a wife Jane and a daughter Mary, who was born Dec 14, 1645; her mother dyed Dec 20. Mary Littlefield married Nov 1664, John Kitteridge. That Ralph Hill had the above daughter Jane is quite certain. Ralph Hill's children by his first marriage were: Ralph Hill, Jr.; Martha Hill; Nathaniel Hill; Jonathan Hill, who was born Apr 20, 1646; Rebecca Hill, who married Caleb Farley."

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(2) Roger Toothaker, Jr., b 1634. He was one year old when he came to America with his parents. He died at Billerica, Mass., Nov 22, 1683. Others say, "Died 1693, or 1694, as in that year he had 'leave to abide in Charlestown, Mass.'" The 6th day of the 9th Month, 1660, he removed to Billerica, Mass. "We have granted unto Roger Toothaker liberty to live in ye town and to settle upon and improve ye Lott which his father, Ralph Hill, Senior, gave him; which lyeth in the great Common Field on ye East side of ye Concord River, below ye great bridge; also the town do grant unto him commonage and herbage, wood, and timber, for his use." "Here, in Billerica, Mass., he had his home, which, when built, was probably the extreme north in the town. It is still said to be standing as the ell of the Rogers house at the place where the canal leaves the River."

Mr. John Smiley Toothaker wrote in 1901, "The house is still standing in which Roger Toothaker lived. The old Toothaker house at Billerica, Mass., was first built of logs, mud and stones, about 1635, and still stands and is partially stones and wood, but largely brick. It is in a factory village, and and is called Billerica Mills, about  $\frac{1}{2}$  miles from Billerica Center. Generations of Toothakers were born in that house. My father was the last of these. The place is now owned by a Mr. Rogers, who married into the Toothaker Family."

Rev. J. Elliott Bowman wrote in 1905, "The ell of the Rogers house, which is mentioned in Dr. Hazen's History of Billerica, Mass., as probably a part of the original Toothaker house, was torn down 1898-9. For full data write Harriet H. Rogers."

"In 1664 Roger Toothaker exchanged about 5 acres of land, which lay on the west side of the road, for 12 acres, 'lying on both sides,' and taking in the long span of meadow upon the pine plains on the side of the common field, and on the East side of it. This exchange was doubtless made to insure the town of Billerica the mill privilege for future use. Roger Toothaker seems to have practiced medicine, and was called Dr. at Salem, Mass., but our records do not give him that title. Mch 12, 1683, at a Selectmans' Meeting, Roger Toothaker being sent for and spoken unto concerning many things amiss in his family, he desired that they would exercise a little more patience concerning him, and he promised amendment. But the amendment was not thorough, and on Dec 15, 1684, the Selectmen wrote him a letter, probably at Salem, Mass.,

whither he seems to have gone, 'To come to his wife in ye middle of ye next week, and that they would help away his family in case of need, and help fit him out'. There was need enough, but Roger Toothaker did not heed it. His wife received charitable aid, and two of the children were put out to Joseph Walker and Edwards, the farmer."

"When the Witchcraft troubles came on at Salem, in which Toothaker's wife's sister, Mrs. Currier, suffered, Roger Toothaker appeared as a ready witness", page 197, History of Billerica, Mass. "This was the period of witchcraft trials and troubles to which the Billerica Records make no reference. The aid given to the Roger Toothaker family shows the father's neglect of them. While he was engaged in the 'Salem Foolishness.' And the deaths of Mrs. Rebecca Chamberlain and John Duren 'in ye prison at Cambridge,' in September and October, 1692, suggested the influence of Mr. Farmer that the charge on which he was imprisoned was witchcraft. A woman, whose late residence had been Andover, Mass., Mrs. Wartha Currier, became one of the most notable of the sufferers, being executed at the time with George Burroughs. Her bearing at the trial is distinguished by courage and good sense, and rests chiefly on the admittance of those who exercise the dreary literature of this terrible delusion. Her one child, out of her 8 children, testified that her mother made her touch a book; it was in Andrew Fuller's pasture; Elizabeth Johnson was there; also her Aunt Toothaker, and a cousin, when she was baptized. Roger Toothaker bore swift witness, in language too filthy for quotation." (See Upton's Salem Witchcraft, Vol 2, pages 145 and 208, and also the Mass. Depositions in the Salem, Mass., Archives.)

In the old Records Roger Toothaker's name is spelled Toothacre, Toothakker, and in other ways. These changes were no doubt all made by writers of town records.

From the History of Billerica, Mass., "Roger Toothaker was one of the signers of a Petition to the General Court at Boston, Mass., Oct 19, 1664, for the town of Billerica, stating that the Colonies were not dissatisfied with the Government of Charles Second in 1660. 10th of the Month, 10th day, Lt. Thompson laid out in money at Boston 18 shillings for Roger Toothaker's family; for which he bought 4 pairs of shoes; 1 pound of whalebone; 1 yard of Farradine for caps and 1 blue apron."

"In July 1694, the abatement of Roger Toothaker's tax was made, because of his decease."

- 2 Roger Toothaker married, after he had lived in Billerica, Mass., five years, June 9, 1665, Mary Allen, who was killed by the Indians at Billerica, Aug 5, 1695. Her name is spelled Allin, in an old record, which also states that she was married by Simeon Bradstreet, Esqr.

History of Billerica, Mass., page 130, "The Indian assault, so long dreaded, and guarded against, fell at last on Billerica Aug 1, 1692, and the place of Assault was about half a mile south of N. Billerica. Among the families was that of Roger Toothaker, who at that time was wasting his time and substance in pursuit of the witchcraft delusions at Salem, leaving his family to charitable aid. The second Indian attack was made Aug 5, 1695, and fifteen persons were killed or taken at the surprisal. So Roger Toothaker's wife was killed, and Margaret, the youngest daughter, was taken prisoner."

Mary Allen, the wife of Roger Toothaker, was the daughter of Andrew Allen of Andover, Mass.; he died in 1690; his sons were: Andrew and John Allen.

## THE CIVIL WAR RECORDS OF JAMES S. TOOTHAKER, SPARTA, MICH.

\* \* \* \* \*

"At the time when the Civil War broke out I was living with my brother, mother, and sister, at Greenbush, Wisconsin. In response to my country's call I enlisted at Greenbush, May 1, 1861, in Co. B, 8th Wisconsin Regt. Volunteer Infantry under Capt. B. B. Conger and Col. R. C. Murphy to serve for 3 years, or during the War. Our Regiment was assigned to the 2nd Brigade, 1st Division, 16th Corps, Army of the Mississippi. Our Company spent about two months at Greenbush in daily drills, and in July we were taken to Madison, Wis., and put in our Regiment, where we had Regimental Drills each day. About Sept 1st we left Madison for St. Louis, a number of our Company going into camp for the night at Benton Barracks on the Fair Grounds, just outside of the city. The next day we were sent out to guard the Iron Mountain Railway against Jeff Thompson's Rebel Cavalry, which had been burning bridges and tearing up tracks. After driving the Rebels back to Frederickton, we returned to the railroad, where we found a train waiting to take us to Pilot Knob. Oct 16, 1861, we again surprised Thompson and his Cavalry, and, after two or three days fighting, we succeeded in taking a few prisoners and some ammunition. This was the last that we ever saw of Thompson and his troops. We then returned to Pilot Mound where we staid for about a month, to guard the railroad. We were next ordered to Cairo, Ill., to await the issuing of the new Springfield muskets. On Mch 1st we crossed the River and went by train to Point Pleasant, Mo., about 30 miles south of Cairo, and from there we marched to New Madrid. Here we had a three days skirmish with the Rebels, fighting daytimes, and advancing as far as we could under cover of the night, digging trenches to protect against the enemy's guns. On the third day we succeeded in driving the enemies from their works and we captured all of their heavy guns. Our Regt. was next sent down below Island No. 10. For three weeks Commodore Foote's flotilla had been bombarding the heavy fortifications at the upper end of the Island, without avail. But Foote at last hit on a plan which was successful. Landing the boat Ohio Belle with men, he cut a roadway around through the forest, and, taking advantage of the flooded condition of the River, floated the gunboats around to the unfortified end of the Island and took over 500 prisoners without firing a shot. We then went back to New Madrid where we were Brigaded under the command of Joseph Mower, Brigade consisting of the following: 5th Minnesota, 11th Missouri, 4th Ill. and 8th Wisconsin. On Apr 26th we went up the River to Hamburg Landing, about 3 miles above Shiloh, marching from there to Corinth, ~~where~~ where, after 3 days fighting, we compelled the enemy to evacuate.

Our next important engagement was at Luka, two days, Sept 19-20. Gen. Mower, our Brigade Commander, being wounded in the neck, and having fallen with his horse, was captured by the Rebels; but they, supposing him to be dying, left him in the care of a single attendant. The General was not so dead, however, as they had supposed him to be, for, watching his chance, when the attendant was looking the other way, he sprang from his cot and ran like a deer to where a mule stood grazing, and, mounting, put spurs to the animal, and rode into the Federal ranks, hat in hand, amidst a shower of Rebel bullets. Oct 3-4 Price and Van Buren tried to retake Corinth, and were defeated with great loss. We had no important engagement in the Winter of 1862. But at the beginning of the next year General Grant began concentrating all of his forces about Vicksburg in the hope of getting a position in the rest of the town. Three months were spent in beating about the bayous. A canal was cut across a bend of the River with a view to opening a passage for the gunboats, but a flood washed all of the works away. Finally it was decided to run a fleet past Vicksburg, and, on the night of April 15th, the boats made the attempt. At once the Rebel guns burst forth with shot and shell, pelting the passing steamers, but they went on with but little damage. The land forces now marched down to form a junction with the squadron, and, on May 2nd, our Regiment helped in the evacuation of Grand Gulf, and on the 14th, we helped in the capture of Jackson, the capital. On the 16th General Pemberton with his Rebel forces from Vicksburg was met and defeated at Champion Mills, and again, on the 17th, at Big Black River Bridge. Pemberton was obliged to seek safety within the fortifications of Vicksburg. Two assaults were made on the Rebel works, but they were repulsed with terrible losses, so it was decided that the only way to capture the city was by laying siege to it. Accordingly we cut off all sources of supply. Two rather important engagements were fought at Haines' Bluff and Mechanicsville in June. Grant continued the siege of Vicksburg until July 4th, when Pemberton, being able to hold out no longer, surrendered the city with more than 30,000 men, thousands of small arms, hundreds of cannon, and quantities of Ammunition and stores. About this time I was taken sick, and, on July 29th, I received my discharge from St. Louis. I returned home and was doctored up. On Nov 17th I re-enlisted, joining my command again at Big Black River Bridge, Miss. From there we went over to Canton with supplies for Sherman, Grant having been put in command of the Army of the West. Sherman then ordered us down to reinforce Banks on the Red River Expedition. Our first battle was fought on Mch 13th, 1864, at Fort de Russey, and resulted in the capture of the first fort and the taking of many prisoners.

At Alexandria we were joined by Banks. We were sent in pursuit of some Rebels who had gone out a little bit from Alexandria on our entering the city, and, on our overtaking them, we engaged them in a skirmish until 3 p.m., when we went into a camp on a hill, less than a mile from the Rebel camp. In the evening General Mower sent word around that the boys might build all the fires they wanted to, and soon the top of the hill was covered with camp fires. About 9 o'clock we received orders to fall in and not speak a loud word. We could see where the enemy had gone into camp, but we kept off to the left and went in around them. When we had them well surrounded General Mower heard some one coming, and, halting them demanded the countersign, which he received, they thinking him to be a Rebel picket. Mowers then inquired where they were going, and, upon their replying that they were going for reinforcements, for their General, Mower replied 'I am just the one you are looking for, for General Taylor ordered me down to reinforce you.' After getting from them all the information that he could, Mower said, 'You may consider yourselves prisoners.' 'Why,' they answered, 'we are not Yankees.' 'That is just it,' Mower replied, 'We are.' We were marched on up to the Rebel lines, and, giving the countersign, we marched right in among the sleeping troops and took about a thousand prisoners without firing a shot. Banks' troops suffered a defeat at Sabine Cross Roads on April 8th, but the next day our troops met these same Rebels and fought two battles with them at Pleasant Hills and Cane River, defeating them at both places and capturing back more than half the artillery that Banks had lost at Sabine Cross Roads. Generals Smith and Mower wished to pursue the Rebels further. But Banks said that we had no more than ammunition enough to cover our retreat. May 13th we again encountered those same Rebels at Alexandria, defeating them and driving them out, after which we burned the town. During the battle of Alexandria some of our artillery horses had received broken legs from a bursting shell. But when the bugle call sounded to limber up to the guns the faithful horse hobbled around on three legs to his post in front of the gun; he had to be shot he was so badly hurt. Our next battle was at Lake Chico, July 7th and 8th, where we had some hard fighting. We did not take many prisoners. From there we went to Memphis and I was detailed to care for the wounded soldiers at Adams Hospital. Our Regiment was next sent to Little Rock, Arkansas, to find out why no word could be received from General Steele. We found that Price had been making a raid through Arkansas, and had cut off the communication with Steele. We were sent on in pursuit of Price, marching through Little Rock to Camp Jarard, Mo., where we were taken aboard a transport and carried to Jefferson City, Mo., repairing bridges that Price had burned; but we failed in overtaking Price's Army.

The next day we marched to Lexington, Mo., going into camp for the night. The next morning we had just got into ranks when General Smith received a dispatch from General Rosecrans stating that he had got Price cornered on the Little Blue River, and that, if we could get up there that day, we could capture Price and his whole force. But General Smith said, 'It is 45 miles to the Little Blue River, and I want every man to do the best that he can.' And we went through in just eight hours and with less straggling than on any day before. But when we got there we found that Price had broken through Rosecrans' lines, but with the loss of his whole wagon train and nearly all of his artillery. From there we went to St. Louis, and we had no sooner arrived there than we were ordered to Nashville, Tenn., to reinforce Thomas. The next morning we left by transport, arriving at Nashville on the day of the battle at Franklin. We immediately began fortifications outside of Nashville. About this time a heavy storm of rain and sleet set in, covering the ground with about eight inches of ice. This prevented the moving of our troops until the ice broke up again on the morning of the 14th, when Thomas sent us word to be ready to move at daybreak, with two days' rations in our haversacks. At daybreak, however, the fog was so dense that one could not see across the yard ahead, so that we did not dare to start out until 9 o'clock a.m. We were marched out to about five miles from Nashville, to a Rebel stronghold situated on the top of a hill. We marched down through a thick ravine, and, reforming, charged right up the hill and took the fort with only one man killed and one wounded. As soon as we had taken the fort we saw the long lines of the Rebels crawling up behind the stone wall down about 40 rods from the fort, but, instead of marching directly for them we marched to the right through the woods, surrounding them, and capturing more than 2,000 prisoners, including one battery of light artillery. With a part of my Company I went in pursuit of some Rebels who were trying to escape. We succeeded in capturing a part of them, but when I got back I found that the rest of my Company had gone back to Nashville to guard the prisoners. The next day at 3 p.m. we made another desperate charge on the enemy's lines, and it was during this charge that I was disabled by a gun shot wound through my left shoulder. For four weeks I was confined in a hospital at Nashville. As soon as I was able to be moved I was taken to Louisville, Ky., where I remained three months. I then received a furlough and went home for 30 days. I returned to Louisville at the expiration of my furlough, but we were soon transferred to Madison, Wis., where I was in the hospital four months longer."

The following documents show that quite early in life Andrew Toothaker removed from Billerica, Mass., to York, Maine. It is thought that all of his children were born in that town as the dates of their births were recorded there.

From Maine Wills and Deeds, Volume 9, Folio 9: To all Christian people to whom these presents may come, or doth concern, ANDREW TOOTHAKER of York in ye County of York, in ye Province of Maine, in New England, sendeth Greeting: Know ye that the said ANDREW TOOTHAKER, for and in Consideration of a valuable sum of money to him in hand well and truly paid by Hannah Smith, Widow of York, in ye County of York aforesaid; hath given, granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeofed and confirmed, and doth by these presents give, grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoffe and confirm, and fully, freely, and absolutely make over unto ye said Hannah Smith, her heirs and assigns forever, a certain piece, parcel, or tract of land lying on the South West side of York River, being by estimation thirty acres by it, more or less, which said parcel of land was given at the Town Meeting in said York, June 17th, 1685, unto Timothy Henderson, ye former husband of ye said Hannah Smith, as by said Town Records will more fully appear, and is butted and bounded as folloeth, namely:

Beginning at a beech tree standing on ye Eastward side of ye land of Joseph Maine, and run by said River East 30 and two poles, and backward South East to ye brook that runs into ye old Mill Crick, and by said Timothy's returns, as York Town Records will more fully show; Together with all ye rights, privileges, and advantages, belonging to said land, or any of its appertunances, or any wise, or any time, redounding to ye same, or any part or parcel thereof, unto ye said Hannah Smith, her heirs and assigns forever. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD and quietly and peaceably to possess as a sure estate in fee simple. Moreover, ye said ANDREW TOOTHAKER doth for himself, his heirs and administrators, covenant, ingage, and promise, to and with ye said Hannah Smith, ye above said premises with all its privileges, to be free and clear from all encumbrances, as also from all future claims and interruptions to be had, or commenced by him, his heirs and assigns, doth by these presents acquit and discharge the same, yet notwithstanding this above Deed is to be understood that if ye above named ANDREW TOOTHAKER, his heirs and executors, do well and truly pay, or cause to be paid, unto ye above named Hannah Smith, her heirs and assigns, ye full and just sum of thirty pounds money, say seven pounds and ten shillings, money, at or before the First day of November next, 1714, and so yearly

until ye whole is paid; then this Deed is null and void and of non-effect. Otherwise to stand and remain in full force, effect, and virtue, to the true performance of these presents, ye above ANDREW TOOTHAKER has hereunto set his hand and seal ye 7th day of December, in ye year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Thirteen. Signed and Delivered in ye presence of Lewis Bane, Samuel Came, Abraham Preble. York SS. Dec 7th, 1713.

ANDREW TOOTHAKER personally appeared before me, one of her Majesties Justices of ye County of York, and acknowledged the above sale to be his free act and deed.

his heirs and assigns forever, TO HAVE AND TO HOLD and quietly and peaceably possess, occupy, and enjoy. Mr James Toothaker, Franklin, Mass.: My dear Sir:  
I received yours of Apr 10th, and I feel very sorry that I have not answered it before. I have been collecting what Toothaker data I could in my vicinity. But I cannot give you the name, nor the place of birth, nor the date of death, of the first settler of the name of Toothaker in Maine. But I think that I can get records. I know the name of the town in a distant part of Maine where the Ancestor Toothaker settled, when he emigrated from Billerica, Mass. I have thought proper, with the advice of the family, not to go and find this until we hear from you again, and know your object, if you see fit to tell it, why you are desirous to know the particulars of this branch of the Toothaker Family, as my search will be attended with some expense to find out all of the particulars. We have come to the conclusion to hear from you again and learn your reasons. I have forgotten whether or not I answered any of your questions in regard to the pursuit or calling in life of the Toothakers. They were mostly farmers. Some are mechanics; some are merchants; some ship owners and shipmasters of vessels employed in the European trade to London and Liverpool. Some of the Toothakers have held military and town offices at various times. There are none that I know of that belonged to the learned professions, but one young man of the family has entered Bowdoin College this year. The Toothakers are a smart, enterprizing, industrious, and intelligent people, as far as I know them. They are scattered over different parts of this State. It would be impossible to find out the number of of Toothakers now living, without great expense. One of the Toothakers in Franklin County, Maine, raised 30 tons of hay, 1,400 bushels of oats, 100 bushels of wheat, 50 bushels of barley, 300 bushels of potatoes; made some 600 pounds of butter and 400 pounds of cheese. He had a herd of 115 head of horned cattle, 12 horses and 175 sheep. This I saw in the Report of the Secretary of Agriculture in Maine in 1860. I would further say that my grandfather Toothaker settled in the town of Harpswell, Maine, adjoining this, about 1740 or 1741. His name was Seth Toothaker. His brother, Ebenezer Toothaker, settl settled there at the same time. From these two, I think, are descended all of the Toothakers in this vicinity. If you please, when writing in the future, direct your letter to John Toothaker, Esqr., of Brunswick, as he is better qualified than I am to answer questions. They will be promptly answered and attended to. Yours in haste, but with much respect, Charles Toothaker."

From Oliver Toothaker, a descendant, "I think that my Grandfather Toothaker was named William. He lived not far from Searsmont, Me. He went West. On his return trip he d in the Allegheny Mountains before 1831. He was travelling on foot, as there were no public conveyances. He stopped over night, at a tavern, as such places were called then. In the morning he was found dead in his bed. I suppose that he was buried in that place. At one time he owned a ship. I cannot tell the name of his wife, or the date of her birth. I think that she died about 1841."

Another descendant writes, "Capt William Toothaker and his wife, Mary Trim, died at Spy Island, Ill. He had two brothers and five sisters."

In the expedition under General Greiderdon, from Memphis to Vicksburg, with a loss of 120 killed and wounded; took 600 prisoners and 5,000 small arms, 4,000 of these being new English carbines on their way to Forrests' Cavalry. We also took 800 mules and horses, and all of the wagon train which he had lost at Sabine Cross Roads, and 60 more, besides. We destroyed scores of loaded railroad trains of factories of every sort, with millions of dollars worth of cotton. In action against Price and Marmaduke, Oct 1864, the 4th Iowa captured 240 prisoners, 5 guns and 2 battle flags. After the capture of Selma, Ala., Apr 2, 1864, our Regiment had in possession many trophies, including 3 Colonels, 76 lesser officers, 9 guns and 3 battleflags. There was a night attack at Columbus, Ga., in which our Regiment came off the field with 341 prisoners, 67

officers, 12 guns, and 7 battle flags. Among the enemy's dead was Colonel Lamar, of 'Slave Pirate' fame. The next day we assisted in destroying 125,000 bales of cotton, 20,000 sacks of corn, 15 locomotives; 250 cars; the naval armory and yard; 2 rolling mills; 2 powder works, 2 iron works; 3 foundries; and 10 factories. The Confederate ram Jackson I think was the most gratifying part of our capture, and the Memphis Appeal a notorious paper, which had been driven to Granada from its home at Memphis. Then we marched to Jackson; and on to Montgomery and finally arrived at Columbus, where we caught the vile thing and Editor Dill, whom we compelled to take the oath binding him against further publications. When we got Dill he was as meek as a kitten. His press and entire outfit was destroyed with conspicuous care in the principal street of the town. After the close of the Civil War I took a four-years' course of study in Wilton, Iowa, Collegiate Institute. Until 1880 I taught school in western Iowa. Then moved to O'Brien County, Iowa, and settled on a piece of prairie land in a sparsely settled portion of Iowa. By industry and economy I added to this original homestead until it contained 600 acres of rich, valuable land, with commodious buildings, groves, orchards, etc. A beautiful Chapel and school house were also erected on this farm. It is 6 miles from Sheldon, Iowa. In an early day I purchased 5 acres within the present city limits of Sheldon. In 1894 I built on this land a handsome residence and moved there from my farm so that my children might have the benefits of the schools. I always took a great interest in educational matters, for I had taught 26 terms of school, and, while living at Wilton, Iowa, I was a trustee of Wilton Collegiate Institute for several years. I was one of the organizers of Morningside College at Sioux City, Iowa, and have been its ardent supporter with my influence and donations. I have served many years as School Director, Township Treasurer, Justice of the Peace, etc., etc. I was converted at 16 years and have always been active in Christian work, and have held many offices in the Methodist Church and its Sunday Schools."
