

# THE THAYER FAMILY OF BROCKWORTH

## Always ahead.

The Thayer Family of Brockworth, in the county of Gloucester, is settled there prior to 1542, probably in the fifteen century came from the East or South the first of the name; but no documentary evidence, no positive proof exists of the fact.

We know there were two lines of the same family: Joan Theyer (1) and Thomas Theyer the elder (40).

Joan Theyer was a widow in 1545. She mentions in her will a son, Thomas Theyer and several persons of her family. We think her children were: the mentioned Thomas Theyer the younger (2), of

Brockworth; John Theyer the elder of Brockworth (45); Walter Theyer of Churchdown (70); and William Theyer of Hucclecote (92], all heads of families.

Thomas Theyer the elder of Brockworth (40) died in 1542 or 1543. He was married second time Agnes (will 1547). He mentions his son John as a minor in his will dated 31 July, 1542. Other children unknown.

The Theyer family settled afterwards at Church down (\*), Hucclecote (†), Warpley, Whittington, Sandurst, Walton, Stinchcombe, Üley, Frocester and other villages and hamlets of Gloucestershire.

It is not improbable that the Thayer family settled at Thornbury (‡) prior to 1558, were another line of the family of Brockworth.

The origin of the Thayer name, as far as we have been able to look, is of German procedence, and it seems probable that the ancestors of Brockworth's family took their name of the word *Their*, that the German pronunciation is like *teir*. In the English

registers of the 16th century the Thayer name was spelled in different ways: Their, Theyr, Theyre, Theyer, Theire, Thaire, Thayr, Tair, Tayer, Tawer, Tawier, Tawyer and other. (\*)

It is the common way Theyer, and so we can see some signs in Gloucestershire's manuscripts, of the 16th and 17th century. In the beginning of the 17th century we find the name spelled Thayer. The way Theyre is also very common (†).

The old Theyer's homes remain at Churchdown,

Hucclecote and Cooper's Hill.

Rev. Canon Bazcley with Dr. Oscar Clark did take a photograph of the oldest home of the Thayers, known as Cooper's Hill. There are two houses, a fifteenth-century half-timbered house and adjoining a little to the southeast, an early-seventeenth century house, built in the time of King James I [1603-1625]. Originally the 15th century house was built partly of oak frame, which was filled in with strips of oak bark and covered with mud or plaster known in the locality as wattle and dab. In later years the wattle and dab has been taken away and bricks substituted.

Rev. Canon Bazcley found, in an upstairs bedroom, in the wall two stone faces of an animal,

partly covered with paper. These he believes are crest or badge of the Thayer family (\*).

The second house seems to have been built as a home of a second branch, perhaps by the father of John Thayer the Antiquary (†).

The next is a copy of an important manuscript relative to him.

"John Thayer, senior. Inquisition taken at the city of Gloucester 20th September, 8, Charles I (1632) before Toby Bullock, Esq., Mayor and Escheator, George Raymond, Esq., Feodary, after the death of John Thayer, senior, late of Coopers in the parish of Brockworth, by the vath (?) of John Heyward, Thomas Hill, Henry Matheu, Richard Elliotes, Robert Dobbes, John Reak, William Kent, Henry Robbins, Nicholas Wesse, Richard Caggley, Robert Tayloe, William Bond and Roger Davis, who say that John Thayer, senior, was seized of 2 messuages ortchener's in Brockworth, one thereof is called Coopers and the other Hampen, and of all the lands, meadows, pastures, feedings and cornlands to the said messuages belonging; also of one portion ot the tithe of hay growing in the meadow called Hampen Meade in Brockworth. So seized the said John

Thayer by indenture dated 16 June, I, Charles I (1625) on consideration of the love which he has towards John Thayer, junior, his son and heir apparent and of the sum of £ 400 paid to him by the said John, granted him at the said premises: to hold to him and his heirs. The two messuages aforesaid are held of the king-in-chief by knight's service, but (?) by what part of a knight's fee the jurors know not, and we (?) worth per annum clerk 20s."

John Thayer, senior, died at Brockworth 22nd April, 7, Charles I (1631) John Thayer is his son and heir and was then aged 32 years and more. He took all the profits of all the premises from the death of his father (ap. (?)) to the taking of this Inquisition. Inq. p. m. v. o. 8 Charles I, No. 20.



# EXTRACTS OF WILLS EXAMINED BY REV. CANON BAZCLEY

I.

THOMAS THEYER, of Brockworth, called the elder, 21 July, 1542. Bequenths his soul to Almighty God, the blessed Lady St. Mary, and all seynts in heaven, and his body to be buried in Brockworth churchyard, betwene the yew tree and the church dore. He bequenths to wife Agnes the feather bed she lyeth in, blanket, pillow, pair of sheets, a powter pot, mete cloth and candlestick. He wills that his son John pays his second wife 20 shillings yearly and the increase in lambs and wool of 20 ewes, which are to be son John's after wife's death. He leaves £20 to wife and son his to pay her 20 marks. John is to be sole executor, but John Wyman and John Wylsh are to have authority during son's nonnage (minority) and to see his son ordered.—Proved January 29, 1543.

II.

Joanne Theyer, widow, of Brockworth, 19 March, 1545. She bequeaths soul to God, blessed Lady and all seynts in heaven, and her body to be buried in Brockworth churchyard. She bequeaths to Joanne Theyre, daughter of William Theyre as dowry on her marriage. To Robert Theyer, the younger, son of John Theyer, 13 shillings that John owes her. To Agues, her son's wife, various garments. To Elizabeth Vyler, her brown Kersey. To Joan Tirret, her best petticoat. To John Vyler, a garment. To Robert Theyer, the elder, a new pair of shoos (shoes). To all her godchildren 4 pence each. To Katharine Harbarde, her daughter, her best kirtle (tunic) and best cordelles (girdle, tassel). To Margery Dowert, a kirtle. To Joan Theyer, the residue of her garments. All the residue to son Thomas and makes him her sole executor. Witnesses: sir Roger Parsons, vicar, John Theyre, Richard Sterings.—Proved 1546.

#### III.

AGNES THEYER, widow, of Brockworth, 11th June, 1547. Bequeaths soul to Almighty God, body to be buried in Brockworth churchyard. She gives Elizabeth Ryre dwelling, with the "fermor" at Brockworth one shete, one pecoter platter. To Margery Lytill a kercher and apron. To Margrett Wylsh a smock. To sir Roger Persons, vicar, these 5 shillings. To every godchild 2 pence. The residue of her goods and the debts due to her under husband's will to son John, her sole executor. Witnesses: sir Roger Parsons, vicar, Gyles Brugge, James Wodccocke, with moo (more).—Proved 1548. "Widow Theyer."

#### IV.

Will of Walter Thayer, of Churchdown, made 11th August, 1558. He commits his soul to the Almighty God, the blessed Ladie and all the holie companye and his body to be buried in Churchdown churchyard. Four shillings to mother church of Gloucester. £ 4 to each of daughters Joane, Mand, Agnes, on marriage. A black coat to servant William Sommers. Residue equally between wife Katherine and son John. Executors: Richard Tiles and William Theyer. Witnesses: Sir Thomas Vawlens "my shosty father," Richard Tiles and William Theyer.—Proved 1558.

#### V.

John Theyer, the younger, of Brockworth, 1559. Gives soul to God, Blessed Ladie and Seynts in heaven; body to be buried in Brockworth churchyard. Gives to the parish of Brockworth 3/4. To mother a ewe and his sowe at Bendall. Also 12 pence to vicar to pray por him. To Anne Bower, 12 pence. John Miller, 8 shillings. To each brother, and brother-in-law, and to sister Ales 2 sheep. To godson, son of William, a ewe, to his brother a sheep. Residue to John Theyer, the elder, his father, whom he makes his executor. Witnesses: Roger Parsons, vicar, Williams Theyer, William Downall.—Proved 8 April, 1559.

#### VI.

John Theyer, the elder, of Brockworth, 3 Abril, 1561. Whose in mind but sick in body; to be buried in Brockworth church-Bequeaths to wife Elizabeth 3 cows, half the ledding, with the (?) hold imploroust, etc. The other half to Robert Theyer, the elder, his son all his bacon, beef, wheat, barley, etc., to be divided between wife and son Robert. To wife 20 bushels of wheat and barley, also half poultry and swine. He gives to son "Robert the younger" £ 6.13. O and an ox. To son Richard To Edmond his son a cow 2 yearlings and six ewes. daughter Ales £ 5, 13, 4., also sheep, silver spoons, etc. Towards reparation of Brockworth church 3/4. The residue to son Robert the elder, sole executor. Witnesses: Roger Parsons, clerk, vicar of Brockworth, "my curate and pastor" William Long, John Wylsh; neighbours, and Thomas Bowlands, the write hereof. - Proved 1561.

#### VII.

Cathamne Thaire, 1568, of Churchdown (not Sherston) widow. Body tobe buried in Churchdown churchyard. To daughter Elizabeth, one kettle, one pot, one pan of brass, 9 pieces of powter, a flock bed all his apparel; 10 sheeps at Michaelmass. If she died before marriage to be given to son John and daughter Jonabetween them. To Catren Thewer, daughter of John Theyer one cow and one ewe with lamb. To Katren Theyer, daughter of William Theier, 12 shillings. To John Organ, son of Thomas Organ, Caterine Organ, Margaret Organ, one sheep each. Walter Theyer, Margaret, John and William, children of John Theier one sheep each. To daughter Jone one long petticoat and one smock. To daughter-in-law Alex Theier one apron. Residue to daughter Elizabeth sole executrix. Overseers: John Draycot and William Theier, John Kloxles (?) curate; Antonius Huggins (surgate?) connsellor.—Proved 1568.

Mr. William Turpin Thayer lived in 1797 at Boston, Mass., and carried in the upholstery business. He had also been associated with a brother-in-law in a grocery store, 18, Middle Street, the firm being Brown & Thayer. His mother and his brother lived, in that year, at some distance from Boston. He had likewise an uncle and an aunt living in that city in 1828, and a relative named Mr. William Turpin.
