The information herein contained is published in this manner for the threefold purpose:

Of preserving it to the use of the writers' own families.

Of distributing it to the other branches of the family.

Of affording an opportunity to some one of building upon this small beginning, a more complete record of the genealogy of the family.

Should any one desire to take up this work, the writers would suggest an examination of the military records of the Revolutionary War and of property transfers between 1735 and 1800, in the County Records of Franklin, Cumberland and Dauphin Counties.

Genealogical Record of the Thompson Family.

Written Thomson prior to 1810; see stone tablet, southwest corner of stone mill at Mexico, Juniata County. and on west end of stone house at Thompsontown, "built by William and J. Thomson in 1798," and all deeds, letters, etc., of that and prior date.

From memoranda made by Theodore Samuel Thompson, of Thompsontown, Juniata County, Pa., between the years 1880 and 1885, upon information from his mother (Charlotte C. Patterson Thompson) and other sources. Added to by Heber S. Thompson, of Pottsville, Schuylkill County, Pa., and Theodore S. Thompson, in 1885, 1886 and 1887.

The greater part of the earliest information below is derived from data furnished in 1857 by Charlotte Chambers Patterson, wife of William Thompson, Jr., (III. 4) son of William Thomson, Sr., (II. 4) of Thompsontown, Juniata County, Pa.

John Thomson, Sr., (I. 1) and brother James, originally from Scotland, emigrated from County Antrim, Ireland, about 1735, to Cross Roads, Chester County, Pa., and moved to Hanover Township, now Lebanon County, (Chester County then) near to Derry Church, still preserved and rebuilt in 1886. (They were Scotch Covenanters and doubtless worshipped at Derry Church). From Hanover Township, they moved to near (about ten miles from) Harrisburg, where John married his second wife, Miss Slocum; thence he moved to the farm three miles east of Thompsontown (afterwards owned by his sons, Peter and Thomas. Thomas died leaving his share to Peter. Then owned by Peter's son, John Peter, who died in 1882). He and two, perhaps three, wives are buried in a graveyard one and one-half miles east of Thompsontown.

James settled along South Mountain (Cumberland Valley and County then, now Franklin County and Chambersburg), and his descendants reside there still.

John, Sr., (I. 1) came up the Susquehanna and Juniata Rivers and landed at the mouth of the run, three miles east of Thompsontown. The first wife of John, Sr., (I. 1) was a Miss Green-

leaf (or Greenlea). Miss Slocum, second wife, and Sarah Patterson, third wife, only are mentioned in the manuscript of Charlotte Patterson Thompson, of 1857. As his oldest daughter married a Greenleaf, the marriage of John, Sr., (I. 1) with Miss Greenleaf may be a mistake, although marrying cousins was common.
