Tipton Family

These notes represent an effort to arrange the various conflicting data on this famous family in a manner that will reconcile, as nearly as possible, the various lines, so as to aid future searches.

No attempt has been made to bring the various lines down to the present time for the reason that they are too numerous and too widely scattered.

It seems obvious that there have been incorrect listings in every compilation of this family, and there are doubtless some in this one. However, we have set out deductions as such, so that there need be no doubt.

We have set out as the probable Emigrant Ancestor, Edward Tipton, although there has been found no tangible proof to support this. Moreover, it seems clearly apparent that if Jonathan Tipton was 118 years old when he died in 1757, there obviously was one or more intervening generations before we reach the Jonathan referred to as the father of Colonel John Tipton reported as born in 1730.

It appears there was a Jonathan, Jr., as well as a John in Baltimore County in 1725, and that a Jonathan was in Ann Arundel County records in 1700.

While it has been claimed by some that the Tipton Family is of Irish Origin, the origin of the name strongly supports the belief of others that the name was in England before it was in Ireland.

In England there is a Tipton Parish in an Urban District of South Staffordshire. It is an ancient church, and its parish registers go back to an early period.

The name Tipton appears in the DOMESDAY BOOK as TIBINTONE. Its meaning was "The tun or town of TIB'S or TIBBA'S people". It has been suggested on very good authority, that the name had its origin from the Seventh Century St. TYBBA, patroness of hunting.

As early as 1606 there were Tiptons in Bedford County, England.

The New Harlem Register, by H. P. TOLER, giving the genealogies of 23 original patentees of New Harlem, (N. Y.) includes in the list of names a Jonathan Tipton, born 1790. He married Mary Waldron, August 6, 1815, and had six children. No details are given as to location, etc.

He witnessed the will of Robert Goldsborough in Ann Arundel County, Md., November 23, 1700. In the will of Henry Attwood in Ann Arundel Co., Md., February 20, 1729 mention is made of 100 acres of land purchased from Jonathan Tipton.

We deduce that he probably married Mary Kemp, sister of Richard Kemp. Also, she probably was the Mary Tipton whose death was reported December 6, 1736, in the Register of St. Paul's Church in Baltimore. They had:-

He appears of record in Ann Arundel County, Md., 9/12/1719, as a witness to the will of William Pearce (Pierce) with his brother Thomas. They are referred to in that will as nephews.

He made his will April 5, 1726, and it was proved in Baltimore Co., Md., August 2, 1726.

He seems to have had only the three children named in his will, all very young at the time of his death.

(30) JOHN TIPTON, born August 15, 1730; died August 1813 or 1815. He was born in Baltimore Co., Md., where his birth is recorded in the old St. Paul's Church Register. He died in Tennessee and is buried on Sinking Creek in Washington County, Tenn. He was the famous Colonel John Tipton, whose fame is outstanding even in his great family of fighters.

He moved to Frederick County, Virginia while a young man. Later when Dunmore was formed he was located in the new county. He continued there when Dunmore was renamed Shenandoah County.

From Virginia he moved into North Carolina, and his location fell within the later state of Tennessee. His activities in connection with the formation of the new state have no place in this compilation.

He served in the Revolutionary War, and in various Indian engagements before and after it.

(32) JONATHAN TIPTON, born October 23, 1732; died _____. This man has been claimed by some compilers as the Major Jonathan Tipton who fought at Kings Mountain. However, it is to be noted that this man was born about 16 years before the Major Jonathan.

He probably was the Jonathan Tipton, mentioned as a Constable in Frederick Co., Va., August 7, 1771. (Order Book 15, Page 247).

Jonathan Tipton was defendant in a suit in Frederick Co., Va., March 6, 1756. (O.B. 7, page 38).

It may have been this Jonathan Tipton who deeded land on Cedar Creek, Dunmore County (now Shenandoah Co., Va.) December 24, 1774. The land was deeded to Lawrence Snapp, Jr., and Jonathan's wife signed as Elizabeth. Both signed by mark.

He is reported as having gone to the Watauga District of North Carolina with his brother Jonathan about 1775, and he was a member of the Jonesboro Convention there in 1784-1785. With his brother John he opposed the creation of a separate state. They lost and the state of Tennessee was the later result of that movement. He also was a member of the committee to ratify the constitution of the state of Franklin which preceded Tennessee.

He was in the Shenandoah Co., Va., tax list of 1782 and 1783, with 2 whites, but was not in the 1785 list. This indicates he moved to what is now Tennessee about 1784. He is buried in Green Hill Cemetery, Carter Co., Tenn., Elizabethton.

He married REBECCA CUSIC, December 19, 1796, Blount Co., Tenn.

In 1782 he was in the Shenandoah Co., Va., tax list.

The papers also refer to an unsuccessful attempt made by an alleged illegitimate son, to obtain a pension as the heir of this man.

He was wounded at Savannah.

His discharge was sent to Richmond in 1782.

He applied for a pension in Knox Co., Tenn., July 9, 1834 (S 295). The application recited that he moved to Green Co., Tenn., about 1784, then to Knox Co., Tenn., about 1787 or 1788 and finally to Blount Co., Tenn., near the Knox Co., line in 1815 or 1816.

He surveyed a road in Botetourt Co., Va., 12/12/1782.

His age was recorded in the Old Family Bible.

He stated his father had been a member of the Virginia Legislature.

He married PHOEBE MOORE. (A William Tipton married Peggy Tipton in Blount Co., Tenn., Jan. 22, 1802, with John Tipton as security.)

They marched to Ft. Washington near Cincinnati reaching there July 19, 1791. His company was attached to the Regular Army, but he longed for action so he joined a party of militia November 4, 1791, stating: "I came here to fight, and I will do it." He fell mortally wounded and his last words were: "My brave fellows, I am a dead man; do you fight on, and bravely do all you can for your country." (Knoxville Gazette 12/17/1791).

He seemed to have had a premonition of his fate for as he rode from home he turned and called his wife. He asked her in case he was killed on the expedition that she re-name their son William as Jacob. His wishes were complied with and this son became General Jacob Tipton in carrying on the family tradition.

In the file is a letter from Irvine, Estill Co., Ky., dated September 2, 1834 from Samuel Tipton and John Tipton in which they refer to their father Jonathan Tipton, who died in Cumberland Co., Ky., in 1833. They deny that their father had married Leviney Stephens or Stevens. They say "This woman was not the wife of Jonathan Tipton, neither was she ever married to him", and that his "only legal heirs live in this county".

They were advised by the Pension Bureau to sue to recover the amounts paid the widow if they were correct. Levinty (Stephens) Tipton lived in Buncombe Co., N. C., until 1826, then moved to Overton Co., N. C. Later she lived in White Co., Tenn., and finally in 1861 she was in Reynolds Co., Mo.
