THE AKE AND HARRISON FAMILIES OF MARYLAND.

The early history of some of whose members migrated to Huntingdon (now Blair) and Bedford Counties before 1800, becoming the forebears of the early Trout lines.

THE SMITH FAMILY OF BEDFORD COUNTY, PENNA.

A brief lineage of those Smiths who came from Maryland to Bedford Township, Bedford County, circa 1800 and were the ancestors of the Trout line steming from the marriage of Mary Smith to Thomas Green Trout.

Numerous references are provided throughout the text in support of material given.

Some biographical sketches are interspersed.

An index of nearly 700 names, mentioned in the M.S. is included on pages 39 through 43.

PREFACE

An attempt was made to use all the available information and references in regard to the earliest ancestors. When some of the inclusions are unproven or speculative, they are so designated.

The brevity of some information on subsequent generations, particularly of the Ake, Harrison and Smith lines, can be an incentive to other researchers.

We make no claim to infallibility.

Dates preceded by c. or ca. are mostly derived from census data or by extrapolation and vary at least a year. The ages given to census takers by older females are often lower than true age.

A vast amount of research was performed by Harold K. Trout, a talented generalogist, with whom it was a pleasure to collaborate. He was unstinting with his time and material.

Thanks to Neall Harrison Trout Jr. for his invaluable help in photocopying and binding this M.S.

All credit is due my wife, Mary D. Trout who joined me in nearly all the research. Further, she did the typing of the M.S. making this a joint effort.

The numbers, as used in this geneology, are as follows:

The number "1" Is assigned to the first of that line, Trout, Ake or Harrison, as the case may be.

The children are assigned an additional number, adding it to the right of their parents' number. These children would be numbered 11, 12, 13 respectively, if there were three brothers and or sisters.

Grand children, third generation, take their single number and add it to the right of their parents' two numbers. The oldest child of 11 above would be 111, the second oldest 112, the tenth oldest 11(10).

The children of 111 would be 1111, 1112, 1113 if three children. Children of 112 would be 1121, 1122, 1123, 1124 if four children.

Children of 1124 would be numbered 11241, 11242 etc. Fifth generation.

Bracketed Numbers (12) signify only one generation, but the twelfth child in this example. Where the amount of generations are lengthy, identification is speeded by underscoring units of five and ten: 112428, six g.

OPERATION EXAMPLE.

This system is unique for retracing lineage. First find your name or that of your parent or grandparent. Example:

The Trout Family of Blair and Bedford Counties Penna.

- Parents of John Trout of Antis, were English emigrants. Their names are unknown. There is a possibility his name was John (see text)

 11 John Trout of Antis Twp. b. Mar. 8,1781. d. Nov. 13,1838 married Elizabeth Ake.
- 111 John Trout Jr. b. c. 1806.

This family is of English origin as distinguished from The German Traut, Traute, Trautte families, whose relationship to our family is only a phonetic one.

Altho the early Germans signed their names as, "Johannes Trautte" or "Henery Traute", or "Traut", The court house clerks frequently indexed them on deeds, wills, Orphans Court and census records. as "John Trout", "Henry Trout".

The German Traut or Traute, means dear, beloved.

Trout, as an English surname, is considered to be derived from the fish, but by others as of baptismal origin; The son of Trot or Trote! Beardsley, "Dictionary of Welch and English Surnames".

There was a paucity of English "Trout" in this country prior to the early 1800s and a preponderance of German "Traut". The latter families can generally be distinguished by such given names as Johannes, Henery, Michael, Jeremias, Baltes, Balthazer, Alexander, Abraham, Jacob, Adam, Casper, Valentine, Vandle, which were prevalent in the early German families. They were for the most part Lutherans, whereas our line were Methodists.

Thomas Jefferson Trout stated: --- "his paternal great grandparents were natives of England and settled in America during the latter part of the eighteenth century, their son John Trout (11) was born on the vessel that brought his parents to this country. "Biographical and Portrait Encyclopedia of Blair County, Pennsylvania". by S. T. Wiley, page -239.

Maybury G. Trout stated:"---a son of Thomas G. Trout and a grand-son of John Trout. (11) John Trout was of English parentage, was born on the Atlantic Ocean and was reared near Port Royal, Virginia, where his people settled after landing in the United States. In early man-hood he located in Antis Township Blair Co. Penna. on a tract of land

which he later bought thru Edward Bell, agent for the Philadelphia Owner". "History of Altoona and Blair Co. Penna". page 583.

Port Royal Va. in early America was a tobacco port on the Rappahanock River where ships from over seas could dock.

Martin C. Trout told the writer that it was common knowledge that his grandfather (John 11) delighted in telling his children and others that he "came to this country in two vessels".

Since we know the birth date of John, Mar. 8,1781, his parents must have landed before The French Fleet sealed off the Chesapeake early in 1781.

The following children of John and Elizabet attested in the 1870 census of Blair and Bedford Co's Penna.

John Trout 111 and Lydia Trout Burkholder stated, both parents born in Penna.

Gideon Trout stated mother born in Penna. and father in Virginia.

Thomas Green Trout and Perry Green Trout stated their mother born in Penna. and their father in England. (shipboard pregnancy can be confusing).

The only extant clue to the name of John's father are the 1811 and 1312 tax lists where John Trout is listed as "John Trout Jr". His son was only 5 and 6 then. This two year listing is considered significant and not an error.

To aid in spatial relationships; all of Blair County was erected from Huntingdon County 2,26,1846 except for the southern border twps. which were erected from Bedford. Antis and Logan Twps. were out of Allegheney, while Morris stayed in Huntingdon Co. Pa.

The first official appearance of John Trout 11 and his wife is the 1800 census of Morris Twp. Huntingdon Co. where he appears sans children. In the 1810 census of Allegheney Twp, they had 4 boys and one girl under 10. In the 1820 census of Antis Twp Huntingdon Co. they had three girls and three boys under 10, 3 boys 10-16 one boy 16-18, one girl 16-26, one boy 18-26. In the 1830 census, same Twp; one boy 5-10, two boys 15-20, one boy 20-30, John Jr. next door 20-30, John Sr. 40-50, One girl under 5, two girls 10-15 and mother 30-40.

The above, in conjunction with the statements of children of Elizabeth who were living in 1344 and listed, shows by extrapolation, two sons who purportedly were not living in 1844.

John Trout from 1800 until he bought his farm, improved land for others. This required opening an access road, clearing out trees and building a log home and other required buildings.

By 1830 he acquired his first meagre land holding. He is taxed for four horses and four cows. and a lot in Davidsburg. (Now Henshey town, near Bollwood, Pa).

He bought, from Richard Neave of Philadelphia, in 1832, a 225 Acre farm, on which he spent the rest of his life. He also was constable of Antis Twp. and overseer of the township from 1835 until his death.

The above farm lay east of and along the southern Antis Twp. line, lying on both sides of Twp. road T 482, which runs N. by E. from East Altoona, Blair Co. Penna.

When the author worked on the farm as a young man it supported; a 2½ story large log house and a summer kitchen, both covered with siding; a large spring house where milk, butter and numerous goodies were cooled in containers standing in running spring water; The large bank barn, whose large timbers were fastened with wooden pins; At the top of the lane were two log "tenant" houses with cooking fireplaces. This is where the first Trout siblings to marry went to house keeping for a time. Elizabeth spent her last years in one of these, cared for by a Miss Wilson.

"The Antis Buring Ground" where John 11 and Elizabeth are buried is hard to find. It is one mile N. by W. of Pinecroft, Antis Twp. Blair Co. Pa. over and under the P.C.R.R. tracts, thence right on Twp. road T 415.

Since these dates are very important, the exact inscription is given.

"JOHN TROUT"

"Who was born on the 8th of March A D 1781 and departed this life on the 13th of Nov. A. D.1838 aged fifty-seven years eight months and eleven days".

This is the exact wording on the stone and the discrepency of six days is not mine.

"ELIZABETH"

"Wife of John Trout Sr. died July 1-1854. Aged 74 years 3 mo. 27 dys!

For those who are interested in "Arms", altho lineage is unproven:

"Trout of Devonshire England, granted arms in 1538 as follows:
" Ar. a lion rampant sa. holding in the dexter paw a chaplet vert.

Crest on a mount vert. an ostrich close ar".

Ref: "General Armory of England" ---- Burke, John.

My translation:- A black lion, with whitish or silver outlining of detail, depicted in profile, claws extended, rearing up on hind legs, right rear paw raised, holding a green wreath in upraised right fore-paw. Above a shield, a small silver ostrich standing on a green mount, or base.

The shield is not described in the grant and would be plain, sans detail, probably silver.

The above lion is the lion as used by the Dukes of Normandy and their whelps, to identify their lineage. No relationship intended or implied.

Letters granted on Dec. 7, 1838. where upon 1-17-1844 the court issued an order.

Page 129 Petition of Gideon D. Trout and Edward B. Trout, Adm's. of estate of John Trout, stated that :--

"John Trout died on or about Nov. 13, 1833 leaving a widow. Elizabeth and issue eleven children to wit:

"Mary Trout intermarried with James Green; John Trout; Joseph Trout; Gideon D. Trout; Amelia Trout intermarried with Jacob Button - berger; Edward B. Trout; Thomas Trout; Lydia Trout intermarried John Burkholder; Elizabeth Ann Trout intermarried with Philip Bartlebaugh; Perry G. Trout; Jane Trout int. m. William Valentine. -- seized with lands bounded by Thomas Green, Martin Bell and Elias Baker, containing 225 acres, being the same tract purchased from Richard Neave on Aug.6, 1832."

"The above named widow and aforementioned heirs lived in Antis Twp. except Joseph, Thomas, Perry Trout and Lydia Burkholder who reside in Union Twp. Bedford Co. Pa."

Dated April 20, 1844.

"Colonial and Revolutionary Families, Pennsylvania! Vol. 9, p 180. "History of Huntingdon and Blair Counties." Africa.

The store burned, the great spring and lake have been acquired by the State of Penna. for a trout hatchery. A new mill was erected, the mansion was refurbished by the Hon. John M. Reynolds". Above written in 1906. The large brick mansion and the original log cabin, the latter partially damaged by fire, were seen by the authors in 1970.

 After a sojurn in Bedford Co. where he met his wife, he ultimately became the sole owner of the 225 acre farm of his father's. However in 1360 it was still listed as a manor farm in the census. Under the guidance of Thomas and Mary and their industrious children, they prospered and the farm became a show place, where hospitality was proverbial. Nellie N. Trout Hogue, who often visited there, spoke eloquently of the lavishness of their appointments and of their bounteous table. Cyrus B. Lab. (see Trout 11343) told the writer in 1944 (he then was 92 and alert) that it was not

unusual for Thomas and Mary to have "several dozen guests for Sunday dinner".

Thomas supplemented his income by dealing in fancy driving horses. Further, the writer has heard from older members of the family that there was an ore lease on the farm. I do know that on the east rim of the farm is a deep ore pit where ore was extracted for the local iron furnance.

The unsung heroine of this family was Mary Smith Trout, a tiny ball of energy, who bore all these children, worked endless hours. Her son Thomas Jefferson Trout, who adored her, said he "never heard her complain".

Thomas G. was educated in the local English Subscription School as were the children. The family were raised in the Methodist faith.

He graduated in 1872 from The Altoona Business College; became a clerk for Penna. Rail Road in Altoona; Thence to Chicago Ill. where he was a teacher for several years in The West Chicago Commercial College. He left Chicago for Bedford, Pa. where he opened an insurance office in 1873, stayed there for 5 years.

He met at the Bedford Springs Hotel, Virginia H. Neall, who was "summering" there with her parents. The mineral springs here were considered very therapeutic and the "in thing".

They were married at her home at 3343 N. 19th St. Phila. Pa. Rev. David VanHorne presided at the Quaker ceremony. m. 2-23-1382.

They lived in Bedford until 1933 when they moved to Altoona, Pa. where Thomas established a very successful general insurance agency, adding a travel agency and a loan agency for the Reading Trust Co. He was also secretary of two building associations and a member of

the city Board of Trade.

At the turn of the century he sold his business to accept what was. in those days, a very lucrative position as State Field Special for the Fire Association of Phila. Then, in large measure, the success of the company depended on the ability of the Field Specials to correctly assess and evaluate "risks" and appoint and hold good general agents. He kept this position until his full retirement. Virginia H. Trout, wife of Thomas Jefferson Trout was b. in Phila. Pa. 6-19-1361. dau. of James Francis Neall and Sally Rebecca Kepler of Phila. Pa. Virginia (called Jennie) was raised as a Quaker. She was very active in community affairs in Altoona (non political) and gave unstintingly of her time to worthy projects, but never neglecting her family. In later years, after her family was raised, she was active in The Order of The Eastern Star; a district Deputy Grand Hatron of the Order. THE AKE LINE

The history of our ancestor John Ake cannot be given without delving into that of Jacob Ake, purported brother.

The families were intimately connected through several generations. The first evidence of John and Jacob is the 1800census of Maryland, where John Ake is living in Baltimore Co. Md. with 5 females and no sons. Jacob Ake is in Frederick Co. Md. with 2 sons and 3 females.

There were no other Ake families in Maryland at this time, no Auch, Ache, Eke, or Eache, but one Jacob Egg (pronounced aka) in Frederick Co. He listed 7 females and 2 males under 16 and one over 16 as of the 1790 cencus.

There is no evidence to support any relationship to the Auche brothers of Penna. as explained in one unsuported brief. The given names are entirely unrelated.

The 1300 census of Maryland lists a William Ake, over 45, and family in Worcester Co. Jacob and John are gone.

Jacob and John were settled in Huntingdon Co. Pa before 1793.

The book "175th Anniversary of the founding of Williamsburg, Pa" claims that "Jacob Ake, a German immigrant, came from the Conococheague county of Maryland to Penna. and founded Williamsburg, formerly called Aketown."

The fee per lot in Williamsburg Pa. was one Spanish eight reales dollar per year forever.

References: Huntin, don Co. Deed Book E1P146 12-12-1795, 314 acres Morrison and Woodbury Twps. Also deed book F.1 P331 11-1-1797. GranteeJacob Ake, land in Woodbury Twp. Jacob listed as of Morris Twp. Huntin, don Co. Pa.

Jacob built the first schoolhouse and paid the teacher out of his own pocket. He provided land for the first church here, Methodist Episcopal. Ultimately he joined this denomination.

Mothodist cometery, Williamsburg:

inscribed on two adjacent huge stone slabs:

"Jacob Ake, Founder"

died july 14th 1333 age 37 yrs.

Beside Jacob is a slab engraved;

"Pamela Be????" (name mutilated)

"Consort of Jacob Ake, Founderdied dec.3,1337 age 35"

These grave sites have, since the writers first visit, been obliterated by turning one slab upside down over the other and setting the large obelisk of son David on top, thereby effectively erasing history.

The wife of Jacob is apparently not buried here. Dates given for catharine are those of Pamela.

The will of Jacob Ake of Morris Twp. Huntingdon Co. (he lived just outside Williamsbirg) WillBook 4 p 114 and 115 dated 5, 4, 1827, signed and copied by court clerk. "Jacob Ake"

He mentioned his mansion and farm in Huntingdon Co; his land in Harrison Co. Va. (Now W. Va); his beloved wife Catharine; his sons, Joseph, David, William, John, and Jacob, his daughters Mary Butterbaugh and Catharine m. to John White.

The children are not neccessarily in chronological sequence.

f. John Ake, Sen. our ancestor, came from Baltimore Co. Maryland, in the mid 1790's. Both he and Jacob Ake had the Penna, fever, where some of John's wife's family had settled.

Jacob Ake purpored brother transferred a tract of land at the Big Spring along the Junita River, to John Ake and Andrew Bell, tenants in common. signed "Jacob Ake". and Catharine by her (x). Jacob was then living here in Aketown (Williamsburg)Pa. The transfer is to John Ake of Morris Twp. dated 1797. Apparently John was already living there.

Morris Twp, now lies on the N. Bank of Frankstown Branch of the Juniata River, whereas Williamsburg in Woodbury Twp lies on the south bank. The other Twp on the North of Williamsburg is Catharine, which probably was part of old Morrison.

Antis (Antes) Twp. lies N. E. of Altoona Penna. and was erected from Allegheny in 1311. Allegheny in turn was erected from Frankstown Twp. in 1793. Except for Morris, all these townships were taken from Huntingdon Co. when Blair Co. was erected in 1846 from Huntingdon and Bedford Co's.

The Direct Tax List of 1793 shows John Ake as occupier and owner of four 14'x14' log cabins, one 12'x16'log kitchen and one log stable on two one acre lots in Woodbury Twp. Williamsburg, Pa.

All the log cabins at this time were without windows; one room down and a ladder to the sleeping loft. The fireplace provided light in cold weather and the open door in warm.

Here lives John Ake, Sen, his wife, two young sons and three girls. The fourth daughter, Elizabeth, our ancestor, is living not far away married to John Trout (our ancestor) see Trout 11.

1. John Ake, Senior and Pamelia his wife appear in Allegheny Twp.in 1303 and by 1309 had sold the The Big Spring property at Williamsburg to G. Knepler. John Ake's wife was Pamela Harrison. See Harrison 1 23

The 1310 census of Allegheny Twp. could be confusing if the writer had not seen the tax lists for the year.

The census lists "J. Ake", "Y. Ake", and "John Trout". The tax lists for the same place show "John Ake", "Francis Ake" and "John Trout".

The "Y" on the census certainly means "Younger". Since neither John or Jacob had a "Francis", Would this not mean, younger brother Ake?

When Antis Twp. was being erected from Allegheny, an appeal dated

April 1803 was granted, to include the house of John Ake in the last end of Antis Twp.

The 1811 tax list of Antis Twp. shows John Ake owner of 500 acres, a grist mill and saw mill, valued at \$2,140. These acres must have been warranted by 1811, but not recorded as patented at the Land Office in Harrisburg, Pa. until 1817 & 1818.

John Ake 300 acres, Huntingdon Co. Pa. Also John Ake 200 acres same C. John was Constable in Antis in 1811.

By 1820 we find John Ake, Sen. has moved to Union Twp, Bedford Co. where he secured two farms and built his mansion.

He left his son John Ake (jur) in charge of his Antis Twp. property. His son-in-law John Trout improved 180 acres of this Antis property.

Thomas Green moved onto the Ake property in Antis. John Ake (jur) has followed his dad to Bedford Co. along with brother Joseph Ake and Jacob's son William and John Trout's son Joseph, all to Union Twp. Bedford Co. Penna.

The Trouts and Akes intermarried with the Green family.

HARRISON

Pamelia, Pimeally or Amelia Harrison, our ancestor, was born in the year 1760, came to Penna. with her husband John Ake, (see Ake-1) between, 1790 and 1797. She died in Union Twp. Bedford Co. Pa. on May 2,1850 aged 90 yrs.and 3 mos. Her parents are unknown.

Since Pamela could not write her name, there is no way to check her preference. Her husband in his will wrote "Pamela", altho many deeds were, Amelia. She is first mentioned by name in the will of her brother:-

"In the name of God, amen, I, Zenphiniah Harrison of Frederick Co. in the state of Maryland, being in perfect health, Thanks be to God, do make this my last will and testament in manner following".

"I give and devise to Zephiniah Harrison, son of Josias, one hundred acres of land out of any part of the plantation wheron I now dwell, known by the name 'Hazzard and Never Fear', he to choose where to lay off such apart, and one negro boy"

"Item, I give to John Augustus Queen, son of Sarah Queen of Frederick Co. the sum of five hundred dollars, but if he should die before he arrives at age twenty-one, then the sum of five hundred dollars shall be equally divided between my brother Grove Harrison and his children now in Kentucky and among my sister Pimeally Ake and her children, now in Juniatta, in the state of Pennsylvania, in equal portions".

"Item, I give to Eliza Watts, daughter of Elizabeth Watts of Elk Ridge in Ann Arundel County, the sum of five hundred dollars, but if she should die before age twenty one, the said five hundred dollars to be divided among my brother Grove Harrison and my sister Pimeally Ake and their children."

"Item, I give and bequeath to my late wife's sister's daughter, Sarah Moberly, daughter of Denton Moberly of Junitta in Pennsylvania, the sum of one hundred and thirty five dollars".

"Item, After Zepheniah Harrison makes the choice of one bed and bedding, I give and bequeath to Sophia Bivens of Juniatta in Pennsylvania all of the remainder of my feather beds and all household furniture".

"I devise and bequeath all of the rest of my estate, both real and personal, to be divided equally along my brother Grove Harrison

and my sister Pimeally Ake and her children in equal portions. And I do hereby constitute Walter Bivens of Juniatta and Josha Todd of Baltimore County, my sole executors. In testimony whereof I have here unto set my hand and affixed my seal this 25th day of January 1316".

Zepheniah (his X mark) Harrison.

At the rquest of John Ake, the following indenture was recorded ed 12-4-1319.

Zepheniah Harrison, son of Josias Harrison of Frederick Co. gives his bond to convey to John Ake of Bedford Co. Pa. 100 acres of land devised to Zepheniah Harrison son of Josias Harrison by Zepheniah Harrison in his will. John Ake passes his bond to convey to Zepheniah son of Josias, 100 acres of land in Huntingdon Co. Penna. now in possession of John Cadwallader, to be consumated whenever Zepheniah shall come to Penna.

Zepheniah Harrison of Fred. Co. purchased this tract in said county from Andrew Biddle, 11-24-1797. This was called "Hazzard and Never Fear", named in will. Later in 1801 he sold part of this tract to William Webb.

Family tradition states that Pamilia Harrison had a brother "Kins". From therecords of the Veterans Bureau, Wash.D. C. it is shown that a Kinsey Harrison of Frederick Co. Md. was a soldier in the Revolutionary War.

At the time he made his first pension application, Kinsey lived in Frederick Co. Md. but at the time of his death in 1834 was a resident of Ann Arundel Co.Md. His widow Sarah Saffle Harrison lived in Carroll Co. Md. in 1840. His deposition:-

Frederick Co. Md. Jan. 20, 1320. "Appeared in open court, Kinsey Harrison, aged 63 years, resident of said county, who being sworn, declares he served in the Company of Thomas Beall's Rifle Regiment, Maryland Troops, volunteering in 1776".

Kinsey (his X mark) Harrison.

Further, the records of Ann Arundel Co. Md. show:-

"Know ye by these presents that I Kinsey Harrison of Ann Arundel Co. and Zepheniah Harrison of same for the sum of 150 pounds current money paid me by said Zepheniah Harrison, have sold unto him all goods household furniture etc. in the schedule following; livestock,

wheat and corn---- all being now in possession of said Zepheniah Harrison*.

Kinsey (his X mark) Harrison.

The foregoing disclosed Kinsey had no realty.

The foregoing pages of information enable the reconstruction of the family of Pamelia Harrison with reasonable accuracy, except for 1 and 11,, speculative.

Nothing is known of Pamelia's parents but future historians might pursue the following:-

All Hollows Parish, Ann Arundel Co. Md.

"Josias Harrison married Dec. 20, 1723 Mary Cornelius". Their son Josias was christened on July 3, 1726.

The Josias who in 1753 married Elizabeth Holland, all of Fred. Co. Md. are not parental canditates, as suggested in the book "Colonial and Revolutionary Families", for their children were Nathan, Elizabeth, Joshua, Greenbury, Henry, Amy Hawkins and Sarah.

Josias and Mary might qualify as grand parents; Josias and Elizabeth as uncle and aunt.

The Frederick Md. Reformed Church records show:

Grove Harrison m Hannah Fuller 7, 20, 1786. Samuel Harrison married Elizabeth Schaun on Feb. 21, 1783. The Frederick Lutheran Church records reveal marriage of Grove and Hannah Fuller and marriage of Sapenia Harrison and Sarah Biddle Oct, 29, 1793 (Zepheniah??)

Casper Smith, our ancestor, a German emigrant who settled in South Mountain, Frederick Co. Md. about 1750. His wife's name is unknown. He established a successful iron furnace and became wealthy.

Three of his sons, Mathias, Peter and John Smith, about 1800, came to Bedford Co. Penna. and secured 2000 acres of prime timber, located between the Raystown branch of the Juniata River and the Dunning's Creek Branch, near Bedford, Pa.

This timber was sold as far away as Baltimore. When the Raystown Branch was high in the spring, the logs were floated down to the main Juniata River. Here they were rafted together into a huge raft; thence down the Juniata to the Susquehanna River; thence to the Chesapeake River and on to Baltimore.

The men lived on these rafts and covered hundreds of river miles. The operation required organization of a large number of men.

The forgoing is a compendium of The "Biography of William Compton Smith". and statements of bro. George Emory Smith to Florence B. Smith Young, a niece.

11 Peter Smith, son of Casper, was born at South Mountain Md. and died in Bedford Co. Penna. Jan. 16, 1838 "age 75 yr, 7mo. 5 days".

Devises to son Charles Smith, the Mansion and farm attached.

Devises to dau. Mary Smith intermarried Jacob Wolf, 170 acres where she now resides in Bed. Two.

Grants to grandson William Laymaster, son of my deceased dau. Elizabeth Smith \$1000.

Grants to 3 grand children, Elizabeth, John and Samuel Bailor, children of deceased dau. Margaret, wife of Peter Bailor, \$1000.

All bequests to Matthias'es children stipulated that if they died sans issue then their grants would be life interest only and would be divided among the living grandsons of William, Charles and Hary.
