FOREWORD

Because of the unusual combination of material included in this little book it seems desirable to supply an explanation of why it was collected and why it now is published.

The task at first undertaken was to develop the ancestry of Frank Herbert Teel and of his wife Grace Carroll Thomas for the information of the immediate family. In addition, as considerable information had been collected over the years on the more recent generations of the family, a Register of Descendants was also prepared for family use. Nothing further was originally contemplated.

However, in the course of a last minute effort to learn the surname and ancestry of the Lucretia who married Isaac Tinkham (number 54 in the Ancestry), a typewritten manuscript was discovered in the Library of the California Genealogical Society entitled "Some Descendants of Ephraim Tinkham of Middleboro, Mass., and Thomas Family of Middleboro." This contained the names of almost 200 members of the family of David Thomas of Middleboro. Thus, by accident, a fine start toward a genealogy of the Thomas family descended from David Thomas of Middleboro was found; and as such a genealogy never had been published, the compiler was inspired to prepare and publish one.

Three Teel genealogies have been published, but they deal only with the members of the family who were descended from Oliver Teall of Connecticut, all of whom seem to have left New England. There is no published genealogy covering the branches of the family that remained in New England. Much information on the Teel family had already been collected in the course of preparing the Ancestry. Therefore, since a Thomas genealogy was to be prepared, the preparation of a Genealogy of the Teel Family of New England was also undertaken.

Not only the Genealogies and the Register of Descendants but also some of the ancestral lines that were developed for the first time, and quite a bit of the genealogical material in the notes, seemed to be of sufficient general interest to warrant publication. Accordingly it was decided to publish all the material as one volume.

Extensive use has been made of the abbreviations listed at the end of this Foreword. Cities and towns mentioned are located in Massachusetts unless otherwise indicated.

Most of the research was done intermittently over the past twelve years at the Library of Congress in Washington, with much briefer periods at the Library of the Daughters of the American Revolution in that city, at the Library of the New England Historic Genealogical Society in Boston, at the Library of the Essex Institute in Salem, and at the Library of the California Genealogical Society and the Sutro Library, both in San Francisco. Some work was done in the Registries of Probate for Essex, Middlesex and Suffolk Counties in Massachusetts. Much information on recent generations has been supplied over the past forty years by living members of the family.

The Genealogies

The format of the Genealogies is traditional. Asterisks against names indicate that the lines are continued under the same numbers in the next generation, where details of marriage and death as well as of children will be found.

The Ancestry

It has been the objective to run each ancestral line to the immigrant ancestors, who are indicated by showing their names in capital letters in the Ancestry. Those have been treated as immigrants (1) who are known to have been such, (2) who are treated by the authorities as seventeenth century founders of families in America, or (3) who were married and in America by 1640, since all such were born no later than 1625 and so few were born in New England between 1620 and 1625 that if born here it is highly improbable that they would not have been so identified. A list of immigrant ancestors is included (p.162), arranged chronologically according to the earliest known or demonstrable date when they appear here, and within years according to their lowest number in the Ancestry. A supplementary list is set forth (p.169) giving the ancestors with whom lines stop before reaching immigrants under the above criteria.

Before using the ancestral tables one should read the following explanation of the format. In the tables the place and date of birth appear immediately above the name, and the place and date of death immediately below it. The place and date of marriage are on the line midway between the name of the husband and that of the wife. Thus:

*The asterisk after a name in the Ancestry means that there is a note on the individual, numbered to correspond with the number of the individual in the Ancestry. See page 94 for note 4 on George Mirick Teel.

The numbering system of the Ancestry has arbitrarily assigned the number (2) to Frank Herbert Teel and (3) to his wife Grace Carroll Thomas. With this start, the father of every individual has the number which is twice that of the child, and the mother (wife) has a number one higher than that of the father (husband). Thus, with respect to the above example, which is from the Second Generation on page 64:

The father of George Mirick Teel (4) is number 8 (twice 4), Gershom Teel, in the Third Generation, also on page 64. The mother of George (and the wife of Gershom) is number 9 (one above 8), Elizabeth French Scott, also in the Third Generation.

The wife of George is number 5 (one above 4), Abigail Elliot Swan, in his Generation, the Second.
The child of George is number 2 (one-half of 4), Frank Herbert Teel, in the First Generation, also on page 64. Frank is likewise the child of Abigail (5) and has a number one-half that of her husband.

When the ancestor is common to two or more lines there will be two or more numbers assigned to the same individual. Thus, the father of Kezia Eldredge (455) on page 86 is Samuel Eldredge and has a number twice hers, 910. Samuel is also the father of Mehitabel Eldredge (463) on page 87 and hence also has the number 926.

Note that in the Third and Fourth Generations of the Ancestry names in the left-hand column are direct ancestors of Frank Herbert Teel, and those in the right-hand column are direct ancestors of Grace Carroll Thomas. The same pattern obtains in the Eighth and Ninth Generations, the left-hand column being direct ancestors of the first individual in the Sixth Generation, and the right-hand column being direct ancestors of the second individual in the Sixth Generation. In the Fifth Generation the Teel and Thomas lines are indicated. After the Fifth Generation one whole page is devoted to the ancestry of each individual in the Fifth Generation. Thus, still with respect to the above example:

The father of Gershom Teel (8) is number 16, Gershom, in the Fourth Generation, in the left-hand column.
The father of Gershom Teel (16) is number 32, Samuel, in the Fifth Generation on page 65, under The Teel Line.
The father of Samuel (32) is number 64, Benjamin, in the Sixth Generation on page 66; and the whole page, as its heading indicates, is devoted to the Ancestry of Samuel Teel (32).
The father of Benjamin Teel (64) is number 128, WILLIAM, in the Seventh Generation on page 66. Note that WILLIAM's name appears in capital letters, showing that he was an immigrant ancestor (see also p.164).

Note also that the numbering of generations in the Ancestry is inverse to that in the Genealogies. The ancestral tables only go through nine generations. Where there is information as to generations beyond the Ninth it is included in the notes pertaining to the Ninth Generation individual concerned. See, for example, the notation in note 529 that the parents of MARY PIERCE (529) were THOMAS PIERCE (1058) and his wife ELIZABETH (1059), identified as immigrants by their names appearing in capital letters. English ancestry is given where it has been found, but no attempt has been made to search for it once the immigrant ancestor has been reached. See, for example, note 544 for the English ancestors of Henry Adams (544). See also number 670 on page 73, Dericke Williamson, the father of the immigrant MARY (335); but since Dericke did not come to America he is not shown in capitals.

The Notes

Asterisks against the names of individuals in the Ancestry indicate there are notes concerning such individuals. Each note bears the number of the individual to whom it relates. Notes on individuals with multiple numbers will be found under the lowest number.

The notes contain genealogical and biographical information believed to be of general interest. They set forth conflicts and correct errors discovered in other works. The authorities cited in the notes on a particular line are generally the materials from which the ancestral tables were prepared, except for information from the vital records. Where there is a line that has not previously been traced and it is not clear from the vital records, the explanation is set forth in the notes. In the eight principal lines (Teel, Scott, Swan, Shale, Thomas, Barrows, Howes, and Bearse) the notes contain genealogical data on all members of the immediate family in each generation, as far as discovered.

It should be stated frankly that in a few cases relationships set forth in this work have not been established by evidence that would satisfy the stricter standards of the best genealogists. However, when this situation occurs the full evidence and reasoning is set forth in the notes so that the reader can form his own opinion of the correctness of the result reached.

The Register of Descendants

This Register covers all the individuals that could be discovered who are descended from the four male members of the Third Generation of the Ancestry. Since the marriages of the Third Generation took place between 1809 and 1837 the Register covers approximately 125-150 years.

In the Register the descendants of every individual appear under his or her name. The four males of the Third Generation of the Ancestry are given capital Roman numerals. Their children are numbered by the use of capital letters, their grandchildren by small letters, great-grandchildren by small Roman numerals, great-great-grandchildren by small letters in parentheses, and great-great-great-grandchildren by small Roman numerals in parentheses. Cross-references to numbers in the Ancestry appear in Arabic numerals. Where, because of the marriage of a female, the surname changes, the new surname is capitalized. Thus:

Acknowledgements and Apologies

For the Thomas Genealogy I am greatly indebted to Mrs. John W. Heinz (National Chairman, Colonial and Genealogical, of the Daughters of the American Colonists) whose manuscript prepared in 1955 was the basis on which the Genealogy of the Family of David Thomas was developed. Without this material the work of preparing the Thomas Genealogy would never have been undertaken. A similar but considerably more limited manuscript prepared by Mary Lovering Holman in 1926 was also of assistance in preparing this Genealogy.

A notebook kept by the late Ellen Maria Swan (number II,G in the Register of Descendants) and supplemented by notations made after her death by other members of the family was of great assistance on the Swan part of the Teel ancestry as well as supplying considerable information for the Register of Descendants. Manuscript notes on the Thomas ancestry prepared, after investigation on Cape Cod in the early 1920's, by the late Prentice Howes Thomas (number III,D,d in the Register) gave the framework for this portion of the Ancestry; and similarly a manuscript on the Howes ancestry prepared at a somewhat later time for Mrs. Catherine Nelson Vaughan Hellerman (number III,D,g,ii in the Register) gave the groundwork on which the Howes branch of the Ancestry was constructed.

Many living members of the family have generously given information which they possessed, all of which has helped make this work more complete.

For all this assistance, and to all who have contributed to the material now being presented, I am greatly indebted and wish to express my appreciation. In addition I wish particularly to express my appreciation for the financial assistance generously tendered by Mrs. Catherine Nelson Vaughan Hellerman which has made possible the publication of this work.

The compiler, who has discovered errors in certain other works, is keenly conscious that his own undoubtedly contains unintentional mistakes. He also realizes only too well how incomplete each part of this book is. He can only say it was compiled as carefully and as conscientiously as this amateur genealogist knew how with the resources that were available to him.

For the sake of accuracy and completeness it is hoped that those who may detect errors or omissions will communicate with the New England Historic Genealogical Society, 9 Ashburton Place, Boston, Mass., supplying such additional information as they may have. To those who may do so I wish now to express my appreciation. While the Society cannot enter into correspondence concerning such material, it will be filed for reference in the Society's Library.

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THE FIRST TEELS IN AMERICA

The earliest record of a Teel discovered in America is the entry in the record of a meeting of the selectmen of the Town of Malden, Massachusetts, held 4 Nov 1681 at which certain individuals were selected "to cut and cart wood for Mr. Chevis". The list of "Cutters ye 4th day" included "Will Teale". (Malden;Corey,p.259) Thereafter this William Teel appears in the town records from time to time, the last entry of his name being in the record of the annual town meeting held 1 Mar 1713/14 (Malden;Corey). The vital records of Malden show the birth of five children to William Teel and his wife Mary between 1685/6 and 1703. The name has various spellings in the town records: Teale, Teal, Teele and Teel---even Telle. Different branches of the family have perpetuated the first four of these different spellings and in addition one branch spells the name Teall. (In this work it will be spelled Teel unless there is a special reason for giving more precise spelling in a particular case.)

It is thus established that William Teel was in Malden at least as early as 1681. No record has been discovered of his ancestry, nor whence nor when he came to this country. Family tradition as related by Frank Herbert Teel (#264 in the Teel Genealogy below) is that the Teels were Orangemen from Northern Ireland. There were Teels also in England (Teall (3),pp. 12-14). In the absence of any indication of a prior Teel in America (except as discussed below) it seems reasonably certain that William Teel of Malden was the immigrant ancestor, and also that he came from the British Isles. It seems very likely that he was born c. 1660 and came to America c. 1680.

Genealogies of the branches of the family which stem from Oliver Teel of Connecticut were written in 1889 by Edward McKinstry Teall (son of Edward McKinstry who is number 142 in the Genealogy below); in 1922 by Dora Pope Worden (wife of Sylvanus Worden who was the grandson of Horace Valentine Teall, #135 in the Genealogy); and in 1926 by Emma Elisabeth Teall Dunn (dau of Joseph Teall who was son of Asaph, #130 in the Genealogy, and his wife Saphronia). Worden and Dunn accept the thesis of Teall in his first-mentioned genealogy, based on tradition in his immediate family, that "The founder of the Teall family in America was Oliver Teall, who, with Prudence, his wife, came from England about 1723 and settled in New Haven, Conn., where Oliver Teall his son was born February 10, 1724." (Teall (1),p.3; Teall (2),p.3; Teall (3),pp.11,14,50-51) In the light of the information about to be set forth this seems clearly wrong.

The vital records of Malden show Oliver was born there to William and Mary Teel on 19 Jul 1699, and this is the date shown by Dunn (Teall (3), p.14) as the date of birth of the supposed immigrant Oliver. Oliver then disappears from Malden records, but the vital records of Woburn show a son Oliver was born in that town 10 Feb 1723 to Oliver and Prudence Teel. Note that February 1723 Old Style dating would be February 1724 New Style, so the date corresponds precisely with that given by Teall for the birth of the second Oliver allegedly in New Haven. The vital records of Lexington show the birth of Timothy in 1724, and those of Concord show the births of Samuel, Asaph, Jacob, Joseph and Abigail between 1726-1735, all to Oliver and Prudence Teel. These six, together with the younger Oliver, are given by Teall as constituting the family of the first Oliver of Connecticut. It seems clear that Oliver, the founder of the Connecticut family, had origin-

ated in Massachusetts, not England; that he was the son of William and Mary of Malden; that his son Oliver was born in Woburn, not New Haven; and that he did not move to Connecticut until after 1735. This position is supported by Cutter and Wyman (Central NY,p.339; Wyman,pp.934-7). It disposes of the assumption of Dunn (Teall (3),pp.12-13) that Oliver the younger was the grandson of the English Isaac Teel who, in 1689, became Apothecary-General to the British Army and to whose son Isaac a coat-of-arms was granted for this service of his father. The grandfather of Oliver the younger was William Teel of Malden.

Dunn refers to Cutter's Genealogical and Family History of Central New York as saying at pp.339-40 that William Teel was an "emigrant from England in 1636-39" (Teall (3),p.50); but the statement by Cutter is that this is said to be so by Teall (1). Dunn also says that another un-named historian claims all the children of the first William left home except a son William, and that the latter was the one who married Mary (Teall (3),p.50). If a William came from England 1636-39 it was undoubtedly his son who married Mary and who was having children by her as late as 1703. However, no evidence whatever has been discovered of any American ancestor of William Teel of Malden, or of any immigrant of the name who came 1636-39. It would seem proper to accept William of Malden as the founder of the American Teel family.

Certain authorities, apparently following Wyman, say that William Teel of Malden married (1) Mary _____ and (2) Charlestown 20 May 1706 Hannah Kenrick of Newton (Wyman,pp.934-5; Central NY,p.339; Teall (3),p.50). But Corey, in an excellent and accurate History of Malden, points out that the husband of Mary did not marry Hannah Kenrick (Corey,pp.397-8). On 1 Mar 1708/9 the Town of Malden voted "that Leonard drown and William Teele shall have liberty to erect a gate and fence across the highway betweene John willsons and Samuel wayts fence nere the apell tree and the said drown and Telle to give for the towns right in the feed within the sad gate as the selectmen and they shall agree for the present year." (Malden) This privilege given to William Teel was renewed from time to time thereafter by specific votes of the town at least through 1714; but in 1719 it was not William's request but "Goody Teels request (that was) granted so that shee has liberty to hang a gate a thort sandy-bank high-way neer her hous and to have ye benefit of ye feed or paster in ye buring place"---the privileges which had previously been granted to William. Corey concludes, it is believed quite correctly, that William had died and "Goody Teel" was being given these privileges as his widow (Corey,pp.459-60). No record of William of Malden was found after 1714. Note also that all children of William and Mary whose births have been located were born in Malden; all of William and Hannah were born in Charlestown (Wyman,p.934;Central NY,p.339); yet there is no evidence that William of Malden had moved to Charlestown after 1706 when William of Charlestown married Hannah. On the contrary, in 1709 William of Malden was chosen by that town "to se to the swine that they (be) yoked and Ringed that they may not do damage in the medowes", and he again had this task in 1714 (Corey,p.352). He was clearly a resident of Malden at that period although Hannah and her husband William during the same period---in fact in the very same years, 1709 and 1714---were having their children born in Charlestown and were obviously living there. Finally it is to be noted that "Goody Teel" was living in Malden in 1719. This was not Hannah for there is no evidence that the wife of William of Charlestown ever lived anywhere after she was married but in Charlestown---she had children born there

in 1717 and in 1723.

Corey, after showing that William of Malden did not marry Hannah Kenrick and was a different person from William of Charlestown, suggests that the latter was probably the son of William of Malden (Corey, pp.397-8; 459-60). He could well have been born to William and Mary before 1685, and would have been of the right age to have married Hannah Kenrick in 1706. Wyman believed the children of William of Charlestown were of the same family as the children of William of Malden. There was no other Teel family around from which William of Charlestown could have sprung. Corey seems to be right. The fact that there is no Malden record of the birth of a William to William and Mary may be due to the fact that the first record book of the town covering the period back of 1678 is missing (Malden). On the other hand, it seems much more probable that William senior came to America about 1680 bringing his wife Mary and infant son William with him.

Boutelle goes further and asserts that not only was William of Charlestown the son of William of Malden but so was John Teal of Charlestown, whom the other authorities do not connect with the family (Boutelle, v.3, pp.245-253; GDNE, v.1, pp.421, 514; Wyman, p.937). Although quite possible, this relationship seems somewhat more doubtful. John married (1) Woburn 1 Jan 1701/2 Abigail Coggin of Charlestown. She died 21 May 1717, ae 43 years, 2 months, and John married (2) 12 Sep 1717 Mary Woodward (Wyman, p.937). Since his first wife was born in March 1673/4 John was probably born little if any later, and it seems doubtful that William of Malden was married that early. John may have been a younger brother of William (e.g. William seems likely to have been born c. 1660, John c. 1670). No record has been found of any descendants of John. Wyman gives John's occupation as schoolmaster. Boutelle cites v.24, p.337 of the Registry of Deeds as showing that "John Teal of Charlestown and wife Mary, yeoman, conveys a mansion house and barn and land in Charlestown to Ruth Wyer 15 Mar 1724/5." No other information was discovered about John or his family.

William Teel of Malden was a nephew of William Clemens of Newton, who owned a house in Newton as early as 1639 (Jackson, p.260), and who died there 1668/9, ae 70. How the relationship came about is not clear, but it is stated as a fact by Wyman (pp.934-5) and seems to be generally agreed (Boutelle, v.3, pp.245-253; Teall (3), p.50; Central NY, pp.339-40).

All authorities agree that William Teel of Malden was a carpenter (Wyman, pp.934-5; Central NY, pp.339-40; Corey, p.397; Teall (3), p.50). However, he seems to have had a hard time making both ends meet. In the spring of 1695 the town granted him a lot of six acres of land. The grant was one of six grants made at that time to individuals who "were not among the proprietors and freeholders and were not entitled to a share in the division (of common town property). If they were not paupers, they were apparently such as needed assistance." (Corey, p.378) William Teel "seems to have been one of those who needed assistance rather than absolute support..." In 1702 the town voted to forgive him money he "was to pay to ye minestar in ye year 1699...and the town must loos jt." In 1706 he sold the land that had been granted him to Philip Atwood, apparently because he needed the money. At the annual town meeting in March 1713/14 his rate of ten shillings was "forgiuen him". In August 1713 a small piece of town land was granted him and his wife for their use during their lives, apparently because they had no means of acquiring a home. Here, being a carpenter, he built a small house, where he

lived until his death, enjoying the privilege of closing the road and pasturing between the gates. (Corey, pp. 378, 397)

The account book of Samuel Wigglesworth, a physician who came to Malden in 1711, shows William Teel was also indebted for medical services in the amount of twenty-six shillings and eleven pence, "and the only payment which appears to have been made was five shillings 'paid me by his wife'..." (The account book further shows that) William Teele contracted an... indebtedness of ten shillings and eight pence for his daughter Abigail, which was partially offset by a payment of two shillings and six pence, also made by his wife." (Corey, p. 610)

In spite of his financial difficulties William Teel seems to have been well thought of by the people of Malden since the town twice forgave his indebtedness and twice granted him land where he could build a house for himself. This good will extended to his widow, for on 16 Jan 1735/6 the town voted "that the town will do something towards the repairing the widow teals hous; and that the select men shall repare said hous as they shall see necessary." Finally, presumably after her death, it was voted 3 Mar 1745/6 "That Edw. Hollowell shall have liberty to live in the house that was the teels" and the next year the town deeded the house and land to Hollowell (Corey, pp. 397-8). This entry brings to a close all the information discovered about William Teel of Malden and his wife Mary.

Note: Paige is in error in recording an earlier Teel than William of Malden. He shows Alice Teel m. Cambridge 11 Jun 1657 William Mann (Paige, p. 601; Supp., p. 731). Cambridge VR show it was Alice Tid, not Alice Teel, who married William Mann. She was probably the widow of John Tidd (also spelled Tead, Teed or Ted) of Woburn (Sewall, p. 645).

The preceding Teel Genealogy has been compiled from vital records and from Arlington, Boutelle, Central NY, Corey, Cutter, Hunnewell, Paige, Sharples, Swan, Teall (1), Teall (2), Teall (3) and Wyman; from Probate Records in Cambridge; from death notices in newspapers; and (through the courtesy of the New England Historic Genealogical Society) from the Crissey family bible. Some entries were obtained by cross-checking in the genealogies of the family of the spouse. Certain information on more recent generations was supplied by members of the family.

DAVID THOMAS OF MIDDLEBORO

David Thomas of Middleboro, the founder of the family covered in the following Genealogy, is thought to have been born in Wales about 1620 (D. Thomas, p.1). It is believed that he came to America in 1640 in the Sampson (Virkus, v.6,p.809). It certainly is a fact that at a session of the Quarterly Courts in Salem on 8 Jul 1645 "David (also Davie) Thomas" was a witness in a suit for defamation brought by John Bartoll against Alice, wife of John Peach jr., for having said that the plaintiff's wife, Parnell Bartoll, had "committed adultery with the boatswain of the ship Sampson in the cabin of Parnell about four years ago" (Quart Courts,v.1,p.78).

However, a David Thomas, ae 26, left England for the Barbadoes on the Dorsett on 3 Sep 1635, and another described as "Davie Thomas", ae 20, left on the Expedition on 20 Nov 1635 also for the Barbadoes (Hotten,pp.80,133; Thomas Book,pp.567-8). It is barely possible, although quite unlikely, that one of these was David, later of Middleboro, and that he came to America by way of the Barbadoes.

In any event, the first record of David Thomas in America is the entry of his being a witness in court in Salem in 1645 mentioned above. He apparently lived in that part of Salem which was about to become the Town of Marblehead, for he is named in the record of a meeting of people of that area held 22 Dec 1648, at which the division of common lands was settled. The apportionment reads: "finding the comons but littell as we conceive to pasture not more than fifty head of cattell, or cows, accounting a horse or mare as two cows, two yearling cattell for one cowe, four goats or sheep to a cowe, a steer or bullock of two years ould as a cowe, the number of families in the plantation being 44, thus limited:--....David Thomas 1/2 cow..." (Roads,pp.18-20).

David Thomas left Marblehead sometime after 2 May 1649, when it became a separate town, probably shortly prior to June 1661, and removed to that part of Salem which later became Beverly. This appears from a "determination" of William Hathorne (see note 374 on Ancestry) who was arbitrator in an action brought by William Dodge against Roger Haskell. The "determination" was filed with the court on 29 Jun 1661 and the significant part states that Dodge should run a fence "toward the rock, which is against the land now in the occupation of Daved Thomas" (Quart Courts, v.2,pp.313-4). The precise location of the property of David is shown on a map of Beverly that was used in connection with its becoming a separate town in 1688 (Perley, v.2,p.417). It was along the road which paralleled the Bass River on its north side, adjoining the property of William Dodge, and across the street from the lots of Henry Herrick and Andrew Elliot (#368 in Ancestry).

After he had moved to the Bass River area David started to dispose of his Marblehead interests. By bill of sale dated 30 May 1664 "Deauead Thommas of Bass River side (sold) to Richard Norman of Marbellhead, one-half a cow's pasture upon the town common" (Quart Courts, v.4,p.30). A court proceeding shows he had apparently tried to make some disposition of his house in Marblehead, for by writ dated 18 May 1668 David Thomas of Bass River sued "Hen. Peass" for a debt "concerning a house situate in Marvelhead" (Quart Courts, v.4,p.30). Nevertheless, David Thomas is recorded as one of the 114 householders in Marblehead in 1674 (Roads, p.28).

Meanwhile he had become interested in Middleboro, and may have actually lived in Middleboro as early as 1668-70, for the birth of his son Edward on 6 Feb 1669 is the first entry in the town records of Middleboro. However, it is possible that the entry was made at a later date, in view of the Marblehead record showing him as having a house there in 1674. In any event, it is clear that by 1675 he had moved to Middleboro where he was a farmer (Weston, p.34; D. Thomas, p.3). He settled southeast of the town proper, at the end of what is now Thomas Street, in an area that became known as Thomastown, and where a number of his descendants still live (Weston, p.53).

Middleboro was purchased from the Indians at various times, the original purchase being the Twenty-Six Men's Purchase in 1662. While David was not an original purchaser at that time, he later bought into that purchase (Weston, p.53; D. Thomas, p.1). He was, however, an original purchaser of the Sixteen Shilling Purchase of 1675, which was apportioned to the purchasers on 21 Nov 1679 (Weston, pp.619-21). His son David was an original purchaser of the Eight Men's Purchase of 3 Jun 1696 (Weston, p.626).

King Philip's War in 1675 resulted in attacks on Middleboro which so disrupted the town that a readjustment of the property holdings had to be undertaken. On 28 Jun 1677 those who had formerly lived in the town and those who owned land there, numbering 68 persons, met and agreed to resettle the town. They called themselves "proprietors of the town of Middleberry". The list shows David Thomas given "1 propriation". (Weston, pp.550-2)

The foregoing account gives all the significant facts about the life of David Thomas that could be ascertained. On 3 Oct 1689 administration on his estate was granted to his widow Joanna. (D. Thomas, p.1)

One further point should, perhaps, be noted. The Salem vital records disclose that on 28 Dec 1667 George Thomas married Mary Graves, bp 16 Apr 1648, dau of Richard (Perley, v.1, p.427). George was born c. 1640 (Perley, v.2, p.396). George and Mary had the following children born in Salem:

George was the right age to have been a son of David, although no connection between them is mentioned by any authority. George does not seem to be ascribed to any other Thomas family, however, so the possibility cannot be discarded, even though proof is lacking.

Notes of General Application

Dates. "To reduce dates in England and in this country from Old Style to New, ten days must be added for events that occurred between 1600 and 1700; and eleven days for such as took place between 1700 and the adoption of the New Style in Great Britain and its American Colonies in 1752.

"Moreover in countries which adopted the New Style at its introduction in 1582 the year began with January; whereas in Great Britain and its American Colonies March was anciently regarded as the first month of the new year....Yet in the eye of the law the first day of the year was not till March 25th....Events that took place before 1752, between March 1 and March 25 were designated in England and this country by a double date, as March 10, 1745/46....The custom of double dating came, at length, to be extended to events in January and February." (Sewall, pp.532-3)

Freemen. "To become freeman, each person was legally required to be a respectable member of some congregational church. Persons were made freemen by the General Court of the Colony, and also by the quarterly courts of the counties. None but freemen could hold office or vote for rulers. This regulation was so far modified by Royal order, in 1664, as to allow individuals to be made freemen who could obtain certificates of their being correct in doctrine and conduct from clergymen acquainted with them." (Felt, Ipswich, p.18)

Titles. "The title of Mr. was applied to captains and sometimes to mates of vessels; to military captains; to eminent merchants; to schoolmasters, doctors, magistrates, and clergymen; to persons who had received a second degree at college, and who had been made freemen. The wives and daughters of such individuals were called Mrs. To be deprived of this address was deemed a serious degradation." (Felt, Ipswich, p.23)

Number references in these Notes. Notes are numbered to correspond with the number of the individual in the Ancestry. Unless the text specifically states that a number reference is a number in one of the Genealogies or in the Register of Descendants, the reference is to the individual with that number in the Ancestry.

FIRST GENERATION

2. For descendants of Frank Herbert Teel see Register of Descendants number I,F,J.

3. Grace Carroll Thomas was descended in all lines from old Cape Cod and southeastern Massachusetts families. The chart opposite note 7 and the note itself deal with the intermarriages in the ancestry of Olive Prentice Howes, the mother of Grace Carroll Thomas. But Charles Austin Thomas, her father, also had in his ancestry a number of other interesting intermarriages, and also cross connections with the ancestry of Olive Prentice Howes. Thus, in addition to those intermarriages shown on the chart the following occur in the ancestry of Grace Carroll Thomas.

SAMUEL HINCKLEY (shown on the chart as son of Mr. and Mrs.

Hinckley who are multiple ancestors) and his wife SARAH, in addition to being the parents of Sarah (as shown on the chart), were the parents of Susanna (401) in the ancestry of Daniel Smith (50). Thus Grace Carroll Thomas descends from Samuel Hinckley's father and mother in five different lines, and from Samuel and Sarah in two.

JOHN HOWLAND and ELIZABETH TILLEY, the parents of Desire Howland (one of the multiple ancestors on the chart), were also the parents of Hope (783) in the ancestry of Moses Thomas (48). Thus Grace Carroll Thomas descends from John and Elizabeth Howland by four different lines.

ROBERT and MARGARET HICKS were the parents of:

(1) Lydia, who was the grandmother of Elizabeth Sparrow (907), wife of Samuel Freeman (906). Samuel and Elizabeth were the parents of Priscilla Freeman who appears on the chart as the wife of John Sears, son of the multiple ancestors Paul and Deborah Sears. For more on Samuel Freeman see under Alexander Carpenter below.

(2) Phebe, who married George Watson and whose daughter Phebe married Jonathan Shaw. JONATHAN and PHEBE SHAW were the parents of George (196) in the ancestry of Deborah Shaw (49) and of Benoni (218) in the ancestry of Isaac Tinkham (54).

Thus Grace Carroll Thomas descends from Robert and Margaret Hicks in three lines and from Jonathan and Phebe Shaw in two lines.

ALEXANDER and Mrs. CARPENTER were the parents of:

- (1) Alice who married Edward Southworth and whose granddaughter Mercy (Southworth) Freeman was the mother of Samuel Freeman (906). For Samuel Freeman's connection with the ancestry see under Robert Hicks above.
- (2) Juliana who married George Morton and whose daughter Sarah (835) is in the ancestry of Nathaniel Barrows (52).

Thus Grace Carroll Thomas descends from Alexander and Mrs. Carpenter in two lines.

MARTHA FORD by her first husband was the mother of Martha Ford (777) in the ancestry of Moses Thomas (48), and by her second husband was the mother of Mary Brown (865) in the ancestry of Isaac Tinkham (54).

ROBERT and BRIDGET BODFISH were the parents of Sarah (413) in the ancestry of Hannah Bates (51) and of Joseph (490) in the ancestry of Rebecca Blush (61).

THOMAS and ELIZABETH PARLOW were the parents of Mary (203) in the ancestry of Daniel Smith (50) and of Joanna (217) in the ancestry of Isaac Tinkham (54).

ROGER and ALICE GOODSPEED were the parents of John (426) in the ancestry of Hannah Jones (53) and of Ebenezer (492) in the ancestry of Rebecca Blush (61).

MATTHEW and Mrs. BARSTOW were the parents of William (838) in the ancestry of Nathaniel Barrows (52) and of Elizabeth (885) in the ancestry of Lucretia Hammond (55).

SECOND GENERATION

4. George Mirick Teel was of Charlestown, and later of Danvers and Peabody. (Wyman, p.936; Swan) For his descendants see Register of Descendants under number I, F.

6. For the descendants of Charles Austin Thomas see Register of Descendants under number III, D.

7. For interesting intermarriages in the ancestry of Olive Prentice Howes see chart opposite. It there appears that:

Mr. and Mrs. HINCKLEY are thrice maternal and once paternal ancestors.

JOSEPH HOWES and ELIZABETH MAYO are thrice paternal ancestors.

RICHARD SEARS and DOROTHY JONES are thrice paternal ancestors.

WILLIAM HEDGE and Mrs. HEDGE are thrice paternal ancestors.

JOHN GORHAM and DESIRE HOWLAND are thrice maternal ancestors.

RICHARD WILLARD by Joane Morebread is twice a paternal ancestor and by Margery is also once a maternal ancestor.

EDWARD STURGIS and ELIZABETH HINCKLEY are twice maternal and once paternal ancestors.

JAMES MATTHEWS and SARAH HEDGE are twice paternal ancestors.



FOURTH GENERATION

16. Wyman gives Samuel Teel (32) as the father of Gershom (8). Samuel (32) had a son named Gershom who was in his 18th year in 1769, who would have been 90 in 1842 when Gershom (8) died. The grave stone of Gershom (8) states he was 62 when he died. It seems clear that Gershom (8) was not the son of Samuel (32). (Wyman, pp.935-6)

Samuel (32) had four sons, Samuel, Gershom, Jonathan and Benjamin (Wyman, pp.935-6). These four include all who might have been the father of Gershom (8). Benjamin in his will of 1815 mentions children but no Gershom, and the same is true of Jonathan in 1824. Samuel in 1831 mentions a wife, nephew, daughter of his wife by another marriage, but no child of his own. There is no probate of Gershom (16). (Probate records, Cambridge) This corresponds with what the vital records indicate: no child to Samuel, children to Benjamin and to Jonathan but no Gershom. From the dates of his marriage and of the births of his known children it is clear that Benjamin could not have had an unidentified child before 1789 unless it were a twin. In any event his first marriage was 1783, so if Gershom (8) was born in 1780 as his gravestone indicates he could not have been the son of Benjamin. Jonathan's children have been carefully sought out and listed in the Cutter Genealogy, for his wife was a Cutter (Cutter, p.129), but again no Gershom is found. By this process of elimination Gershom (16) seems without question to have been the father of Gershom (8).

The vital records show Gershom (16) married Susanna Adams in 1776 and in 1777 had a daughter Susanna (Cambridge and Medford VR). The next recorded birth to them seems to be in 1784, and from then on there was a child every two or three years until 1804, but no Gershom; yet it is known that he and his wife had 12 children whose births are recorded, and it would be very unlikely that with that number they should have failed to name one Gershom for his father. Finally it is to be noted that Gershom (8) had a son Gershom described as "Gershom Teel the third" in guardianship proceedings in 1822 (Probate records, Cambridge), to be accounted for by a father and a grandfather Gershom---there was no other preceding Gershom. It seems certain that Gershom (8) was born to Gershom (16) about 1780, the year that his gravestone indicates that he was born.

For the family of Gershom (16) see the Teel Genealogy, number 46.

Gershom (16) was in a company which assembled on the alarm of 19 April 1775---a Minute Man (Mass SS Rev, v. 15, pp.469-70).

18. As explained in note 9, an Ebenezer Scott seems clearly to have been the father of Elizabeth (9), the wife of Gershom Teel. The only Ebenezer discovered in northern New England at this period who is not otherwise accounted for is Ebenezer, s. Ebenezer and Margaret, b. Roxbury 1762. This Ebenezer (described as Ebenezer "jr." in his marriage intentions) was the Ebenezer who married Roxbury 1785 Rachel Thayer, and it would seem clear that they were the parents of Elizabeth French Scott (9), for Roxbury is in the immediate vicinity of Boston as are Charlestown and Chelsea where she later appears. No other Scott family has been found to which Elizabeth and her sisters might have belonged.

It therefore may be stated that Ebenezer and Rachel (Thayer) Scott had: Harriet, b.c. 1782 (?), bp Chelsea 2 Apr 1797, d. 24 Apr 1858, m. Charlestown 17 Jun 1813 Jonathan Teel (#104 in Genealogy); Elizabeth French (9); Nancy, b.c. 1791, bp Chelsea 23 Oct 1796, bur 16 Dec 1834, m. Malden 23 Feb 1815 Samuel Teel (#91 in Genealogy); Martha Plaisted, b. Charlestown c. 1794, bp Chelsea 14 Dec 1794, d. Charlestown 16 Jun 1843, m. Charlestown

25 Dec 1826 Gershom Teel (8) (#90 in Genealogy) as his third wife; Ebenezer, bp Roxbury 5 Oct 1800; and George, b. Roxbury 23 Aug 1800. (VR)

22. Andrew Shale's parentage cannot be traced. An Edward Shale of Stoughton m. Milton 1753 Elizabeth Kilpatrick (Canton VR). No other Shale is found in New England. It should be noted, however, that a Robert Shale was on a list of political prisoners dated 20 Sep 1685 who were then sent from the Dorchester jail in England "into His Majesties Island of Barbados or other His Majesties plantations in America". (Hotten,p.327) Robert may have been brought to America, and Andrew and Edward may have been his descendants---perhaps grandchildren.

Andrew and Jane Shale had at Beverly: Eleanor, b. 3 Jul 1780, m. 1 Dec 1799 John Waters; Anna Elliot, b. 30 Jan 1783, m. 27 Sep 1803 Joshua Ellinwood; Jane, b. 15 Mar 1786, m. 23 Dec 1804 Joel Tay; Hannah (11); and Thomas, b. 4 Jan 1792, d. 25 Aug 1813. (VR) Jane Elliott had m. (1) Beverly 19 Nov 1764 Israel Smith (VR; Swan).

FIFTH GENERATION

32. For the family of Samuel see Teel Genealogy, number 22.

34. Joseph Adams m. (1) 20 Jan 1740/1 Martha Frost, dau Ephraim and Sarah (Cozen) Frost, who d. 23 Dec 1749, ae 28. He was deacon of the Menotomy (Arlington) Church, and was selectman.

When his dau Ann was but 18 days old, on 19 Apr 1775, his wife was driven out of her house by British soldiers returning from Concord. The Deacon and his two older sons were in the fields. When one soldier poured chips on the floor and set fire to them Joel, who with the other younger children was under the bed, told the soldier not to do it or his father would whip him. Nevertheless they burned the house down. (Bos Eas Mass, p.448; Cutter, p.51; Adams,pp.963, 971, 989)

36. Ebenezer and Margaret (Cole) Scott had the following at Roxbury: Ebenezer (18); Lois, b. 4 Sep 1763; Anne, b. 6 Jun 1765; Mary, bp 17 May 1767; Sarah, b. 9 May 1767, m. 11 Jan 1789 Lott Thayer; Molly, b. 11 May 1769; Jacob, bp 29 Sep 1771; Isaac, bp 15 Aug 1773; and Nathaniel, bp 24 Sep 1775. Jacob or Isaac d. Brookline 10 Sep 1778 "ae 6". (VR)

The Scott family of Hatfield had several members named Ebenezer, but all of them seem to be carefully accounted for (Wm. Scott, pp.22,26,27,30, 31,40,46). The same is true of the Ebenezers in the families of John of Roxbury (NEH&GR, v.110, pp.146ff; Americana, v.21, pp.456ff; Scott, pp.10, 16,25,51), of Benjamin of Cambridge and Rowley (Scott, pp.325-341), and of Joseph of Rowley (Scott, p.343).

It therefore would appear that Ebenezer (36) was of a different Scott family in the vicinity of Boston whose children had not been as carefully recorded, since no record of his connection is found. There seems to be only one such, the family descended from Benjamin Scott of Braintree. The member of this family who was of the right age to have been the father of Ebenezer (36) was Ebenezer Scott of Milton who married Sarah Williams of Dorchester on 16 Apr 1741. Their recorded children were Mary, b. Milton 24 Dec 1748 (VR) and Catherine, bp 19 Nov 1749 (Milton,p.179). Since they married in 1741 they probably had children earlier than 1748 who are not recorded, and it is highly probable that they would have named their first son Ebenezer. A son Ebenezer b.c. 1742 could have married Margaret Cole in

Brookline in 1761, and this seems to be exactly what happened.

37. The ancestry of Margaret Cole has not been identified. She is called "Mrs." in the vital records---but see under "Titles" in Notes of General Application. No record has been found of a Cole who married a girl named Margaret and who d.c. 1751-61, nor has any record been located of a Margaret Cole.

38. It is not certain who were the parents of the Jacob Thayer who married Lydia Farrar (39) and was the father of Rachel (19). He might have been Jacob, the son of Timothy, b. Weymouth 1 Mar 1733, or Jacob, the son of Ebenezer, b. Braintree 7 Jul 1730. Both would have been of the right age to marry in 1760 Lydia Farrar who was b. 1737. All other Jacob Thayers seem to be accounted for (E. Thayer; B. Thayer).

Timothy's son Jacob, though b. Weymouth, is not again recorded there. He probably moved away. He is not traced further in the family Memorial. Jacob, the father of Rachel, does not appear in Boston before his marriage. He apparently had come from elsewhere. It could well be that he came from Weymouth to Boston. The known ancestry of Jacob, s. of Timothy, is traced in E. Thayer, p.1534; B. Thayer, pp.184, 587-9; and Pillsbury, pp.443-8. Note that Timothy was the fourth child of Samuel and Susanna, not of Samuel and Mary, as stated in B. Thayer at p. 589.

Likewise Jacob, the son of Ebenezer, does not appear in Braintree records again and is not traced in the genealogy of the family beyond his birth. He could have moved to Boston. His ancestry is clear (B. Thayer, pp.184-5, 211; E. Thayer, pp.136-8; Ravenscroft, pp.1,2,117,121,125-6 and related pages for collateral branches; Vinton, p.364 and related pages).

It should be noted that Boston VR show the marriage 5 Sep 1751 of a Jacob Thayer to Mary Moore, undoubtedly the daughter of Ephraim and Elizabeth Moore, b. Boston 12 Feb 1722. Mary d.c. 1759 as on 14 Dec 1759 "Jacob Thayer of Boston, housewright", was appointed guardian of Jacob and Mary Thayer, both under 14 years of age, children of Mary, deceased (Suffolk Probate #12178-9). As there is no evidence that there were two Jacob Thayers in Boston at this period the marriage to Lydia Farrar on 11 May 1760 was apparently a second marriage of the Jacob who had married Mary Moore in 1751. This would mean that if he were Jacob, the son of Timothy, he would have been marrying at 18 a woman 11 years older than he, which seems less probable than would be the case if Jacob, the son of Ebenezer, were the one. He would have been 21 and his wife 29 at the time of the marriage. Note further that the wife of Ebenezer was named Rachel, as was Jacob's daughter who married Ebenezer Scott, which lends plausibility to Jacob being the son of Ebenezer. However, the evidence is not sufficient to draw any firm conclusion. Accordingly, the ancestry of both Jacobs is set forth on the following pages, as far as known.

A304. Shadrach Thayer had m. (1) Braintree 11 Mar 1654/5 Mary Barrett, b.c. 1632, d. Braintree 2 Apr 1657. They settled in Braintree. He had come with his father c. 1639 from England. (B. Thayer, pp.184, 587)

A306. William Scant is considered to be the immigrant ancestor. His marriage is the first record of him. (An Heads)

A608. Thomas Thayer came from England c. 1639 with his wife Margery and a number of children including Shadrach (A304) and Thomas (B304---see below), and was in Boston bef 1639. He settled at Braintree where he was a shoemaker. He m. Margery, dau Abell Wheeler of Thornbury, Glouc, and his wife Jane Shepard. Thomas was s. Richard Thayer of Thornbury, who prob m. c. 1587, and who had children as late as 1627/8. Richard was bp Thornbury 2 Aug 1562, s. John and Mary, who had m. c. 1555. John was prob b. Thornbury c. 1532 and was bur there 12 Oct 1584. Mary was bur there 20 Apr 1611. She had m. (2) bef 1599 one Cooke. (Pillsbury, pp.443-8; L. Thayer, pp.1-5; B. Thayer, p.184; An Heads; Pope, p.450)

A610. James Priest had an allotment of land in Dorchester 1637 (Ravenscroft, p.142). He was freeman 1643, rem to Weymouth. (Pope, p.374)

A614. William Brown and his wife Thomasine, servants of Governor Winthrop, were admitted to the Church in Boston 1633 (Pope, p.75; GDNE, v.1, p.274).

B76. Ebenezer Thayer was a Captain (Ravenscroft, p. 125). He m. (2) 18 Oct 1763 Sarah (Mills) Neal, wid Joseph Neale, dau Captain John Mills. Sarah d. Randolph 20 Nov 1800, ae 102. (Vinton, p. 364; B. Thayer, p.211)

B154. Nathaniel Wales settled in Braintree c. 1675. He was Ruling Elder and Deacon. (Vinton, p.312)

B304. Thomas Thayer came in 1639 with his father from England (B. Thayer, p.184).

B306. See note 577 for Henry Neale.

B307. See note 577 for Hannah Pray.

B308. Nathaniel Wales was a ship's carpenter. He was here by 1649 as he had a child born here then. (Ravenscroft, p. 234) He prob came with his parents in the James 1635 (GDNE,v.4,p.391).

B309. Two authorities consulted do not show the name of the wife of Nathaniel Wales junior (B308) (GDNE,v.4,p.391; Ravenscroft,p.234). But Pope states that Susanna Grenaway, dau John, m. Nathaniel Wales. (Pope,p. 200) The papers concerning the administration of the estate of Nathaniel Wales senior (B616) show that his wife was Susanna and that she did not die until shortly before 1719 (NEH&GR, v.11,p.37; v.32,p.321). The vital records of Boston show "Isabel wife of Nathaniel Wales" died 18 Dec 1661. It seems clear that Isabel was the wife of Nathaniel junior, although some authorities give her to Nathaniel senior (see GDNE,v.4,p.391; Ravenscroft, p.233).

B310. Thomas Faxon married here 1653. This is the earliest record of him (Vinton, p.311).

B311. Deborah Thayer came 1641 with her father (Ravenscroft,p.2).

B608. See note A608.

B614. See note 577 for Quinton Pray and his wife Joan.

B616. Nathaniel Wales was a shipwright and weaver of Dorchester (GDNE, v.4,p.391;NEH&GR, v.32,p.321). He was freeman 1637 (Ravenscroft, p. 233). He came in the James 1635 with his wife Susanna (GDNE, v.4, p.391).

B617. Susanna Grenaway was dau of JOHN GRENAWAY (B1234, 2314) and his wife MARY (B1235, 2315). See note 578 for John and Mary. See note B309 for confusion as to the name of the wife of Nathaniel Wales.

B620. Thomas Faxon m. (2) Braintree 5 Sep 1670 Sarah (Mullins) Garnett Savill, wid William Savill, b.c. 1621, d. 1697 (Ravenscroft, p.196). He was freeman 1657, Representative of Braintree 1669 (Vinton, p. 311).

B622. Richard Thayer m. (2) Boston 15 Jul 1646 Jane Parker, wid John, prob b. Eng, and (3) Katherine who d. 1686 in St. Michaels, Barbadoes. He was a cordwainer and farmer. He came to Boston 1641, moved to Braintree, but returned to Boston 1646, decided to return to England but died in Barbadoes. (Ravenscroft, pp.1-2)

B623. Dorothy Mortimer was dau William (Ravenscroft, p.1).

40. Thomas and Hannah Swan had at Marblehead: Hannah, bp 14 May 1727; Rachel, bp 15 Jun 1729; Hannah, bp 23 Aug 1730; Sarah, bp 13 May 1733; Thomas, bp 8 Sep 1734; Mary, bp 9 May 1736; Thomas, bp 13 May 1739; Hannah, bp 29 May 1742, m. Marblehead 22 Mar 1761 John Boden; Sarah, bp 16 Jun 1745, m. Marblehead 30 Jan 1772 Josiah Lea; Robert, bp 10 Jan 1747/8, m. Salem 21 Jun 1770 Elizabeth Symonds; and Joseph (20). (VR)

42. James Symonds was a cooper. (Perley, v.1, pp.392-3)

46. Benjamin Elliot was a captain. (Swan)

48. The family of Moses and Deborah Thomas appears in the Thomas Genealogy under number 80. Moses served in the Revolutionary War (Mass SS Rev, v.15, p.605).

52. Nathaniel Barrows and Hannah had: Lois, b. 28 May 1767; Eunice, b. 13 Oct 1769, d. 22 Aug 1791; Abisha, b. 3 Jan 1772; Nathaniel, b. 24 Mar 1774; Abigail, b. 31 Jul 1776; Josiah (26); Asa, b. 25 Feb 1781; Freeman, b. 22 Mar 1783; Nelson, b. 23 Sep 1786; and Stillman, b. 3 Sep 1789. Asa m. Sarah Cobb and had William Orville, b. 16 Jun 1805, who m. Midd. 18 Feb 1826 Amanda Norton Wood, b. 3 Jun 1805, dau Noah and Nancy (Norton) Wood. William d. 19 Dec 1886, Amanda d. 25 Jun 1866. William and Amanda had: Levi Marshall, b. 13 May 1828, d. 19 Oct 1828; Nancy N., b. 26 Dec 1829, d. 4 Dec 1866; Deborah Shaw, b. Midd. 26 Feb 1832, m. Midd. 1 Jun 1850 Josiah B. Thomas (#497 in the Thomas Genealogy; #III,A in the Register of Descendants); Rozilla Amanda, b. 23 Jun 1846, m. 23 Oct 1866 Charles N. Atwood, d. 22 Nov 1874. (SE Mass, p.612; Thomas)

53. A Hannah Jones of Midd. m. Jacob Booth there 17 Dec 1758 (M.D., v.19, p.48), but as Hannah (53) was not born until c. 1749 this was obviously an older woman. Still another Hannah Jones of Midd. m. Midd. 29 Oct 1765 Edward Washburn (M.D., v.25, p.87).

56. Reuben and Betsey Howes had: Benjamin (28); Reuben, b. 13 Aug 1793, m. (1) Mary G. Hinckley, (2) 1 Dec 1831 Hannah Marston; Lydia, b. 24 Oct 1796, m. _____ Crowell; Betsey, b. 9 Sep 1798, m. (1) Elisha Howes, (2) Joseph Huckins; Rebecca, b. 26 Oct 1800, m. Joseph Huckins; Susanna, b. 27 Oct 1802, m. Thomas Smith; John, b. 12 Oct 1804, d. 1807; Olive, b. 9 Jun 1807, m. John Taylor Davis; Reliance, b. 1 Apr 1809, m. Lot Gorham; Mary Burr, b. 26 Feb 1811, m. Albert Esterbrooks; Emily, b. 25 Jun 1813, m. Dr. Faucett; Hitty Stone, b. 13 Jun 1815, m. (1) _____ Wallace, (2) Freeman Hinckley. (Howes, p.70)

62. Peter and Mary Norris are said to have been the parents of Polly (31), b. Aug 1786 (Hellerman). Town records indicate Peter and Mary were the only Norris family in Barnstable having children 1780-90, so the ancestry seems clearly correct. However, the only recorded births of their children were Peter, b. 10 Aug 1776, Thomas 1 Oct 1781, Ellis 30 Aug 1786 and John 6 Jul 1791. The gaps suggest that only sons were recorded. Polly may have been a twin with Ellis, or the year of her birth may be in error.

Trayser refers to "Captains Norris---John, Peter, Robert and Bradford" as being among Hyannis families (Trayser, p.412). This may have been Peter (62) or his son Peter.

64. For the family of Benjamin Teel see Teel Genealogy, number 4.
66. James Tufts was a brickmaker. (Wyman, p.959)
68. Lieutenant Joseph Adams was selectman of Cambridge for five years. He married (2) 26 Jun 1718 Rachel Allen who d. 1 Aug 1775, ae 85. (Bos Eas Mass, p.448)
70. Thomas Hall was a deacon. He was a weaver by trade. (Wyman, p.457)
72. Ebenezer Scott is mentioned as being a member of the Scott family of Milton founded by Benjamin Scott, although the parents of Ebenezer are not identified (Milton, p.179).
73. The vital records state that Sarah Williams was of Dorchester at the time of her marriage there on 16 Apr 1741. The only Sarah whose birth is recorded in Dorchester in this period is Sarah, dau Preserved and Mary (Maxfield) Williams, b. 22 Aug 1731, clearly too young to have m. bef 1746 at the earliest.

One genealogy of the family (Williams, p.154) says that Professor Edward H. Williams jr. thought that Sarah Williams, dau Joseph of Roxbury, "may have married Ebenezer Scott of Milton". That Sarah was b. 27 Sep 1714, dau Joseph and Abigail (Davis) Williams, who m. 22 May 1706. Joseph was b. 24 Feb 1682 and Abigail was b. 13 Feb 1687. He d. 17 Aug 1720 and she d. 23 Dec 1771 aft m. (2) 2 Jan 1733 Edward Ruggles. Joseph was s. Stephen, b. Roxbury 8 Nov 1640, m. 1666 Sarah, dau Joseph and Mary Wise. Stephen d. 15 May 1720, his wid d. 1728. Stephen was s. Robert, b. Eng c. 1609, and his wife Elizabeth, b. Eng c. 1610. They came from Norwich, Norf., in the Rose in 1637. Elizabeth d. 27 Jul 1674, and he, at age 68, in Nov 1675 m. (2) Hingham Margaret Fering, wid John. Margaret d. Roxbury 22 Dec 1690, and he d. there 1 Sep 1693.

Abigail Davis who m. Joseph Williams was dau John and Mary (Devotion) Davis, bp Roxbury 19 Feb 1687/8. John was a blacksmith of Roxbury. Mary d. 12 Jan 1684, John d. 16 Mar 1705. John was b. 1 Oct 1643, s. William Davis. William had m. here bef 1643 Elizabeth. She d. 4 May 1658 and he m. (2) 21 Oct 1658 Alice Thorp, who d. 1667. William d. 9 Dec 1683, ae 66. Mary Devotion was bp Boston 25 Feb 1648/9, dau Edward and Mary. Edward joined the church in Brookline 1645 but was then single.

Joseph Wise, whose dau Sarah m. Stephen Williams, was servant of George Alcock and named in the latter's will of 1640. Joseph m. 3 Dec 1641 Mary Thompson (perhaps dau of William of Braintree) and had Sarah, bp 26 Dec 1647.

(VR; Williams, pp.26,31,42,149,152-4; GDNE, v.2, pp.19,23,42; v.4, p.614)

However, although Sarah, the dau of Joseph Williams of Roxbury, may have m. Ebenezer Scott, it is at least equally possible that Sarah Williams (73) was a different girl. Ebenezer Scott (72) was the son of one of three brothers b. bet. 1700 and 1706 (see notes 144 and 288) and who would hardly have married until c. 1717-1723 at the earliest. Ebenezer was therefore prob b.c. 1720 and more likely would have married a girl b. 1722-1723 than one born 1714. A Sarah Williams of Boston, dau Robert and Sarah, was b. 28 Feb 1722 (VR) or 13 Jan 1723 according to the family bible. She could very well have been of Dorchester 1741 and there m. Ebenezer Scott.

Robert Williams had m. Sarah Peirse 27 Nov 1713. He was b. Boston 16 Oct 1691, s. Robert and Margery, who had m. bef 1673. Robert senior is said to have been "the grave digger, bell-ringer, etc." and to have died 25 Aug 1695. Sarah Peirse was dau Moses and Mary Peirse and was b. 19 Jun 1680. Moses was bp Boston 15 Sep 1661, s. William and Hester Peirse, who had m. bef 1656. (VR;GDNE,v.4,p.566;NEH&GR,v.62,p.66)

But it must be noted that in addition to the daughters of (1) Joseph and Abigail and of (2) Robert and Sarah, Boston VR show the following individuals named Sarah Williams who are not otherwise accounted for: (3) dau Joseph and Sarah, b. 20 Jun 1715; (4) dau John and Rebecca, b. 31 Jan 1717; and (5) dau Joshua and Anne, b. 1 Jan 1719. Furthermore, in addition to (1) the Sarah Williams who m. Dorchester 16 Apr 1741 Ebenezer Scott there was (2) a Sarah Williams who m. Boston 18 Aug 1737 Samuel Gray, (3) a Sarah Williams who m. (int.) Boston 9 Aug 1739 Richard Phillips, and (4) a Sarah Williams who m. Boston 17 Jun 1742 Atkins Marshall (VR). Under these circumstances it is impossible to tell which Sarah Williams m. Ebenezer Scott.

79. Dorchester VR show the birth of "Millaha" Bradley, dau Nathan and Lidia; also the marriage of Peter Farrow to "Meletiah" Bradley. Boston VR show the birth of Lydia to Peter and "Malatiah" Farrow; also that "Militiah" Farrow m. (2) Boston 16 Apr 1743 Edward Stove. Presumably all quoted names refer to the same person as nothing similar appears elsewhere.

80. Thomas and Rachael Swan had at Marblehead: Robert, b.c. Apr 1699, d. Marblehead 16 Sep 1747, m. Marblehead 3 May 1722 Sara Harris of Ipswich; and Thomas (40). (VR)

81. Rachel Hunt may have been a sister (possibly a daughter) of Captain Lewis Hunt who m. Salem 27 Nov 1684 Mary Lake. Mary d. 27 Mar 1695. (VR) Capt. Lewis Hunt m. (2) 30 Nov 1696 Elizabeth Palfrey. He d. 1717. (Perley, v.3,p.182) He was a sea-captain (Hunt,p.248). On the other hand, Rachel may have been a daughter or a sister of Edward Hunt of Amesbury who d. 23 Dec 1727. Edward m. Ann Weed prob bef 1685 (Hunt, p.11). There seem to have been no other Hunts in this part of Massachusetts.

82. It would seem that Isaac Follett was undoubtedly the father of Hannah (41). The Follett family of Essex County was that of Robert of Salem. Robert had five sons: Robert, b. 1659, d. bef 1687, apparently unm (Follett, p.19); John who moved to Attleboro, whose children seem well identified, but who had no daughter Hannah (N.Y.G.&B.R., v.72,p.191); Abraham who also moved to Attleboro and also had no Hannah (see RIVR, v.9, p.504); Benjamin who moved to Windham, Conn., and there had a dau Hannah b. 1716, too young to have m. 1726 (Follett, p.20); and Isaac. Only Isaac and Benjamin were left in Salem after 1700, and only Isaac after 1709 (Follett,pp.16-19). Isaac, the only one remaining in Essex County, continued to live in Salem after marrying, at least until 1716, when he was fined for neglecting public worship (Perley, v.3, p.417). He had at least one child baptised in Salem, on 17 Oct 1703, John according to the VR, Isaac according to Perley (v.2,p.385), and seems to be the only one of the sons who might have had a dau Hannah who would be marrying in Marblehead in 1726. Isaac had a sister Hannah (Perley, v.2, p.385) as well as a wife Hannah, and it would be quite natural to find him with a daughter of that name. He seems clearly to have been the father of Hannah (41).

83. Hannah Starr had a twin sister, Sara (Perley, v.2, p.405).

84. John Symonds was a husbandman and joiner. His first wife was Sarah Waters. (Perley, v.1,pp.392-3)

94. Peter Groves m. (1) 26 Jan 1702/3 Hannah Winter, who d. 20 Nov 1707, (2) 1708 Abigail _____, who d.c. 1717-18, (3) 7 Jan 1718/19 widow Hannah (Woodbury) Stone, and (4) 8 Oct 1747 widow Mary Maxfield or Maxwell. He was a sea-captain. (Groves, p.8)

96. The family of Henry and Ruth Thomas appears in the Thomas Genealogy, number 16.

98. The father of Deborah Shaw (49) was George Shaw according to the family record (Thomas). Note that Horatio Nelson Thomas (12) named one of his sons George Shaw Thomas (see #III,C in the Register of Descendants). The only George discovered who could have been Deborah's father is George of Eastham. This George had ties in Middleboro. He had an uncle, Jonathan Shaw, who, with his family, was living in Middleboro (SE Mass, p.696); also George's father had property interests in Middleboro as early as 1696 (Weston, p.626).

The children of George whose birth records have been located are the following, born in Eastham: Elkenah, b. 21 Nov 1724; John, b. 16 Sep 1727; James, b. 12 Oct 1728; and Mary, b. 7 Jun 1731 (MD, v.16, p.197). The family record says Deborah was born c. 1729 (Thomas). George's wife was Mercy Rich (MD, v.28,p.113) and the ancestries of George and Mercy are clear (GDNE,v.4, p.624; SE Mass, p.696; Townroe, p.18).

Elkenah Shaw of Middleboro m. Plymouth 11 Apr 1745 Johannah King of Plymouth (MD,v.17,p.5); Mary Shaw jr. of Middleboro m. Midd. 20 Feb 1746 Eleazer Thomas (MD,v.16,p.109); James Shaw of Middleboro m. Midd. 12 Oct 1749 Lois Thomas (MD,v.18,p.82); and a George Shaw jr. of Middleboro, undoubtedly another son of George (98), married Midd. 26 Jul 1750 Marcy Thomas (MD,v.18, p.83). These were not descendants of Jonathan, the uncle of George Shaw. Jonathan had a wife Mary, which would account for Mary sr., but no child Elkenah, George or Mary (SE Mass, p.696). His son James m. Rochester 14 Apr 1719 Faith Doty (Plympton VR), but no children of his are found in Middleboro, Plympton or Carver records. Jonathan's son Jonathan had a daughter Mary, but she m. Plympton 25 Oct 1733 Nathaniel Morton (VR); and he had no son James, Elkenah or George (SE Mass, p.696). Jonathan's third and last son Samuel had children including a James b. 1746, but no George, Elkenah or Mary (Plympton VR). The Elkenah, Mary, James and George of Middleboro who m. 1745-50 were therefore not descendants of Jonathan. It would seem clear that the family of George of Eastham had moved to Middleboro by 1745.

101. That John Smith married a Deborah Barden is shown by the records (Bailey, v.2,p.72;Mid Ch,p.90). The only Deborah discovered who could have been his wife was the daughter of John and Mary (Barden,p.38; Tingley,p.35).

102. Joseph Bates m. (1) Midd. 16 Apr 1716 Joanna Tinkham of Midd. She d. 28 Jun 1738, ae 42. (VR; Mid Ch,p.85)

104. Benjamin Barrows m. (2) 8 Jun 1757 Hannah, dau Barnabus and Lydia (Shurtleff) Atwood. (Virkus,v.5,p.321;Maine H&GR,v.7,pp.136ff)

Benjamin and Lois had: Nathaniel (52); Isaac, m. Menitab _____; and Asa. Benjamin and Hannah had: Ephraim, b. 1762, m. Charlotte Churchill; Benjamin, m. Polly Tubbs; Barnebus, m. 27 Jun 1793 Martha Tool; Daniel; Hannah, m. William Bumpas; and Lois. The family of Benjamin and Hannah lived in Hebron, Maine. (Tilson, p.386)

106. The family record shows Hannah Jones (53) was b. Midd. c. 1749 (Thomas) and her marriage record of 1766 shows she was of Middleboro at that time. She was clearly of a Middleboro family. The only mention in the VR or the church records of a preceding generation of Jones in Middleboro is the marriage of Josiah Jones to Naomi Peirce jr. in Midd. 22 Apr 1747, both parties being stated to be of Middleboro. Here would seem to be the parents of Hannah. It is to be noted that Hannah named her son Josiah (26), which was not a Barrows family name but would be her father's name on this assumption. Josiah and Naomi also would seem to have been the parents of Naomi Jones who married Simeon Vaughan in Midd. 14 Aug 1766, both being of Midd., although her birth too is not found in records of the town. (VR in MD, v.25, p. 107; v.18, p.81; v.16, p.137). Josiah Jones was a colonial soldier who died in military service (Peirce, p.46).

While a John Jones was a proprietor of Middleboro 1679-98, he does not appear to have had any family there (Weston, pp.564, 616, 621; Mid Ch; VR). He was prob the John who was the son of Ralph (424) b. 14 Aug 1659 (GDNE, v.2, p.564). But Matthew Jones of Barnstable, another son of Ralph, had a son Josiah (Otis, v.2, p.107). As no other Josiah is mentioned anywhere, this would seem to be the Josiah who was later of Middleboro.

109. Hannah Shaw had a twin brother, Benjamin. (GDNE, v.4, p.63)

112. Benjamin and Betty Howes had: Reuben (56); Tamson, b. 8 Dec 1769; Elizabeth, b. 18 Jun 1773. (Howes, p.36)

122. John Blush was the oldest of six children of Reuben, all baptised 20 Dec 1730. Their births are not on Barnstable records. (Otis, v.1, p.92)

128. For notes on William Teel and his family see "The First Teels in America" and Teel Genealogy, number 1.

130. Obadiah Jenkins was of Malden. He became freeman 1690. (GDNE, v.2, p.542)

132. James Tufts moved to Boston from Salem 12 May 1704, bringing his family with him, and again moved to Charlestown in 1708/9. His wife Ruth was admitted to the church in Cambridge 4 Nov 1705. She d. of small pox. (Wyman, p.959)

134. Jonathan Hall was of Medford. (Wyman, p.456)

137. Margaret Eames m. (2) Cambridge 27 Dec 1705 Lieutenant Daniel Dean of Concord (Bos Eas Mass, p.448), s. Joseph and Elizabeth (Fuller) Deane (or Dane). (Henry Adams, p.55)

138. William Cutter was a farmer and housewright. He also dealt in real estate and owned a mill. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1877)

139. Rebecca Cutter m. (2) 3 Jun 1724 John Whitmore Sr. (Cutter, p.25)

140. Thomas Hall m. (2) Abigail Palfrey and (3) 16 Apr 1747 Elizabeth Davis. (Wyman, p.457)

142. The only Patience Allen discovered was the dau of Joseph and Anna of Weston (Bond,p.6). The rather unusual name (Patience) and the proximity of Weston and Cambridge make it highly probable that this Patience married Thomas Hall.

144. Since Ebenezer Scott (72) was descended from Benjamin of Milton (see note 72) he must have been the son of one of the sons of Benjamin. Benjamin had three sons: Benjamin, John and Peter (see note 288). No record has been discovered, however, of whom, where or when Benjamin, John and Peter may have married.

158. Nathan Bradley m. (1) Dorchester 2 Jan 1695/6 Ruth Hause who d. Dorchester 25 Mar 1701. Nathan was found 13 Dec 1750 "in water dead and yet floating, supposed to have fallen out of his canoe the same day". (VR)

159. As the marriage of Lidia Harden was in Boston (VR) and as Richard Harden who was resident of Boston 1671 (An Heads) is the only one of the name found in Boston, he undoubtedly was her father. Who Lidia's mother was is not clear, but quite probably she was Hannah Long. The Boston VR show "Hanna Harden, dau of Joseph and Mary Long dyed Janry 7 1690". A Joseph, s. Philip and Anne Long, was b. Boston 16 Aug 1652 but he d. there 28 Aug 1652. Perhaps Philip and Anne had another Joseph later.

166. Robert Starr m. (1) 24 Nov 1650 Susanna Hollingsworth, dau Richard and Susan, who d. 17 May 1665. Robert was a sea-captain. He was killed by the Indians. (GDNE,v.4,p.170; Perley,v.2,pp.53,405)

167. Mary Gardiner m. (1) Jeremiah Conckling of Long Island, (2) Robert Starr and (3) 8 Sep 1680 William Nick of Marblehead. (Perley,v.2,pp.53, 405).

168. James Symonds was a joiner. He resided in Salem many years but removed to Northfield where he died. His estate was inventoried at 1482. (Perley, v.1, pp.392-3; Bos Eas Mass, p.1187)

170. Hon. John Foster was "an active, energetic, earnest citizen, frequently serving the town as moderator at town meetings, acting as magistrate under his commission as justice of the peace, representative to the General Court 1723,25,31,32,38 and 39." He was a blacksmith. He m. (2) 12 Jul 1692 Mary (Howes) Pomeroy, wid John Pomeroy. (Bos Eas Mass, p.721; Foster, p.697)

172. Thomas Cloutman (or Cloudman) is said to have come from the highlands of Aberdeen, Scotland. Tradition says he had a stalwart form and great strength, also a large Roman nose. He was a Quaker. (Bos Eas Mass, p.2071)

185. Mary Brown m. (1) Newbury 15 Dec 1675 Nathan Parker. (Hoyt, v.3, p.887)

186. Israel Porter was one of the first taxpayers of what is now Danvers, where he was a member of the first church. In 1681 he was agent and trustee for Salem Village (Danvers), and in 1686, with other selectmen and trustees, purchased of the Indians all land lying west of Bass River within the town of Salem. In 1689 he was a petitioner for a new town to be formed out of Salem. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1010)

188. Nicholas La Groves was a Huguenot refugee who fled to the Isle of Jersey from France. He came from there to Salem bef 1668. In 1682 his name was on the list of French Protestant Exiles who were then naturalized by Royal Letters Patent. He was a sea-captain in the trade with the West Indies. In the next generation the prefix "La" was dropped from the name. (Groves, p.7)

192. The family record shows that Henry Thomas was the "son of William and grandson of William the immigrant from Wales". No names of their wives are given, nor any dates or places, nor any further facts. (Thomas) No other record showing Henry to have been the son of a William or the grandson of a William has been found. Henry was rather the son of the second David (VR; Mid Ch; Davis, p.355). The family record seems to be in error in assigning the name William rather than David to the father and grandfather of Henry, but it is correct in stating that they had the same name, and in the further fact that the immigrant ancestor came from Wales.

The family of David (192) appears in the Thomas Genealogy under number 2. Authorities differ regarding the parentage of the wife of his son William (#8 in the Genealogy). Some follow Pratt who says Samuel Pratt, s. Phineas and Mary (Priest) Pratt, and his wife Mary had Samuel b. 15 Nov 1670 and "probably also had three daughters whose Christian names are not certainly known to the compiler; but it is believed" that one of them was "Susanna Pratt who married William Thomas of Middleboro before 1711" (Pratt, p.58; Thomas Fam, p.8; Tinkham). No further evidence of such a daughter or of this relationship has been discovered. On the other hand, the later Bates genealogy definitively asserts (Bates, p.20) that Susanna Bates, daughter of Edward (204) and Elizabeth (205), married that William Thomas. There is no reason to doubt this, particularly as the Bates family of Weymouth to which she belonged had a number of ties with Middleboro and in particular with the family of David Thomas (see Bates, pp.20-22). Bates is therefore followed here. It is quite possible that Samuel Pratt did have a daughter who married a William Thomas of Middleboro before 1711, but that it was Sarah, not Susanna, for a Sarah Pratt married 1691 William Thomas (#6 in Thomas Genealogy) not William (#8 in that Genealogy). (VR)

194. Thomas Nelson was taken by his mother as an infant to Plymouth to escape the Indian war of 1675. He was perhaps the first white settler of that part of Middleboro called Lakeville. He became dissatisfied with the preacher at Middleboro and in 1717 moved to Assowampsett and joined the Swansea Baptist Church. He and his wife made the trip each week-end to the church 25 miles away. (SE Mass, pp.1546-7)

195. Hope Huckins was of Barnstable. Tradition has it that one night, while living in Lakeville far from any other white settler and while no men were around, she heard a noise in the cellar. She crept there in the dark and suddenly attacked an Indian so fiercely that he only escaped by tearing his garments. She is said to have lived 105 years 6 months 20 days. (SE Mass, pp.1546-7)

198. Thomas Rich removed in 1738 to Middle Haddam, Conn. (Townroe, p.18)

200. The vital records show John Smith and his wife Mary to have been the parents of John (100). (MD, v.14, pp.132-3; v.18, p.80) John (200) died 16 May 1727 "in 69th year" (VR), which would place his birth c. 1658.

A John was born Sep 1656 to John and Susanna (Hinckley) Smith of Barnstable (MD,v.12,p.154; GDNE,v.4,p.119), where they had married 1642 (Clemens, p.198). An error of two years would not be unusual for such records, and since no other John Smith is found in the vicinity in this period he seems clearly to have been John (200).

204. Edward Bates was a deacon of Weymouth (Bates, p.9). See note 192 for his daughter Susanna.

206. Joseph Blossom m. (1) Mary Pinchon. She d. 6 Apr 1706 and he m. (2) Mary _____. (Otis,v.1,p.77)

208. George Barrows m. (2) 25 Jun 1724 widow Anne Dunham, and (3) 20 Dec 1736 Hannah Jackson. George and Patience had: Moses, b. 14 Feb 1696/7, m. 4 Dec 1717 Mary Carver; George, b. 11 Mar 1698, m. (1) 23 Aug 1722 Desire Doty, and (2) 10 Jun 1745 Mary Ransom; Samuel, b. 1700, d. 1777, m. 21 Nov 1723 Susanna Tobey; Peleg, b. 1708, d. 24 May 1803, m. 26 Nov 1733 Hopestill Darling; Benjamin (104); James, d. 1750, m. (1) 3 Nov 1726 Tabitha Richards and (2) 29 Mar 1746 Mary Coffin; Patience, m. 19 Apr 1733 Joseph Waterman; Ruth, m. 19 Mar 1723/4 Seth Sampson; Keziah, m. 21 May 1728 Samuel Benson; Deborah, m. 11 Jan 1732 Caleb Benson; Sarah, m. 11 Nov 1742 Caleb Cushman. (Maine H&GR,v.7,pp.143-4, 202)

210. Ephraim Tilson m. (2) 31 Jul 1744 Deborah, wid Samuel Ransom. (Tilson, p.384)

217. Joanna (Parlor) Tinkham m. (2) 23 Dec 1720 Robert Mackfun of Middleboro. (Wood;MD,v.4,p.72)

218. Benoni Shaw was the child of the first wife of his father, Phebe Watson. (Americana, v.36,p.509) (See note 392)

222. Caleb Lumbert (222) and his wife Elizabeth (223), the parents of Elizabeth (111), were among the first settlers of Chatham (NEH&GR,v.7, p.82). Thomas Lombard (888) had a son Caleb who married (Lumbert,p.3;Pope, p.295;NEH&GR,v.12,pp.249ff;MD,v.16,p.124). The branches of the family descended from Thomas (888) have been rather fully traced (Lumbert; Early Lom, pp.25-7; Randall, pp.332-3) except that as to his son Caleb there is "no further record" (Randall, p.333); yet Caleb is mentioned in his father's will of 1662 (Truro, p.542) and he was then an inhabitant of Barnstable (Freeman, v.2,p.271). Thomas was born c. 1610 and d. Barnstable May 1662 (MD,v.16,p. 124;NEH&GR,v.98,p.84;Early Lom,p.24). His son Caleb seems to have been born aft 1644, but certainly well bef 1662 (Randall,p.333) and most prob c. 1645, as he would hardly have been mentioned as an "inhabitant" in 1662 (as he was ---Freeman,v.2,p.271) were he any younger. If born c. 1645 it seems very doubtful that he would be having children born as late as 1717, which was true of Caleb (222), the father of Elizabeth (see NEH&GR,v.7,p.82). Two authorities therefore suggest that Caleb (444), the son of Thomas, was prob the father of Caleb (222) who married Elizabeth Smale (Lumbert, pp.4-5;Small,v.1,p.115). This would seem to be correct. In any event it is clear that the family stems from Thomas (Otis,v.2,p.217). The surname has several spellings.

224. Amos and Rebecca Howes had: Hannah, b. 22 Nov 1737, m. 27 Nov 1764 Zacheus Hall; Amos, b. 3 Apr 1739, d. 12 Nov 1771; James, b. 15 Jul 1742, d. 22 Mar 1825, m. 1 Feb 1770 Mary Howes; Edmond, b. 10 Aug 1743, m. _____

Crosby; Amos, b. 25 Jun 1745, m. 4 Jan 1776 Sarah Blossom; Benjamin (112); John, b. 26 Jul 1750, m. 1773 Thankful Blossom; Rebecca, b. 18 Mar 1755, m. 8 Jan 1777 John Welts. (Howes,p.21)

226. John Sears was a deacon. (Hellerman,p.2)

228. Samuel Howes was known as Sam Doctor. He moved to Ashfield. (Howes,pp.26,207)

229. Mary Howes' ancestry has not been traced. Mary Howes, dau Ebenezer and Lydia (Joyce) Howes, m. Aron Crowell (Howes,pp.11-16). No other Mary has been located in this period.

240. Augustine Bearse was engaged in the whale fishery and owned try works. Augustine and Bethia had at Barnstable: Prince (120); Temperance, b. 17 Mar 1732/3, m. 7 Mar 1750 Lemuel Lewis; Mercy, b. 9 Mar 1734/5, m. 20 Feb 1752 Thomas Buck; Lydia, b. 25 Dec 1736; and Simeon, b. 27 Jun 1739. Augustine m. (2) 7 Sep 1744 Thankful, wid Nathaniel Bacon, and had at Barnstable: Sarah, bp 9 Mar 1745/6, m. 15 Nov 1764 Samuel Bearse; Levi, bp 25 Oct 1747. (Otis,v.1,p.56)

246. Ebenezer Goodspeed resided at Mistik, where he owned large real estate. On 30 Dec 1746, at the age of 91, he conveyed part of his lands to a son in consideration of a promise to maintain him for the next ten years. (Otis,v.1,p.399)

EIGHTH GENERATION

264. James Tufts had a child, James, by Elizabeth Wells, over which there was a court case in 1669. The selectmen's records of 27 Jun 1672 show the following: "Child of James Tufts and Eliz. Wells, to be kept by Susanna White." Elizabeth had come from England c. 1669, and after this affair married Thomas Bathrick 5 Apr 1673, and then died 3 Feb 1673/4. James Tufts entered the Narragansett campaign and was slain in the Battle of Bloody Brook 18 Sep 1675. (Wyman, pp.959,1010)

266. George Grimes "arrived from Nevis (apparently the British island in the Antilles) c. 16 mo. prior to 26 Aug 1674; living at Goodman Tufts, Mystic side." (Wyman, v.1,p.447)

268. John Hall was of Concord, Cambridge and Medford. (Wyman,p.457) In 1652 he took the oath of fidelity; also was granted by Cambridge twenty acres of land in Billerica. Prior to 1667 he lived several years in Concord, then back to Cambridge, but in 1675 he bought a farm in Medford to which he removed. He was constable and selectman in 1677, and again selectman in 1690. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1015)

270. Gershom Cutter was a farmer at Menotomy (Arlington), at the "Foot of the Rocks". He was admitted to the Cambridge Church 6 Aug 1721. In Dec 1675 he and his brother Ephraim served in the Rhode Island campaign against the Narragansetts. (Bos Eas Mass, pp.283,450)

272. John Adams was apprenticed in Cambridge until he came of age, when he joined his father in Braintree. In 1646 he moved to Concord. Early

in 1650 he went to England where his first child was born. He returned in 1651. (Henry Adams, pp.83-85) He then became a first settler of that part of Cambridge called Menotomy, now Arlington. He was a millwright, freeman 1666. Earlier works doubted that he was the son of Henry Adams of Braintree. (Bos Eas Mass, pp.447-8; Adams, pp.957-8) Later research definitely established the relationship. (Henry Adams, pp.65-6, 83-8)

274. Thomas Eames came from Stratford-on-Avon. He was a brickmaker and mason. He resided in Dedham in 1640, Medford 1652-59, Sudbury 1669, and Sherborn (the part now called Framingham) 1674-5. He m. (1) Margaret _____, (2) Mary Blanford. He was a soldier in the Pequot War in 1637. (Eames, pp.167-8)

275. Mary Blandford or Blanchard m. (1) 5 Oct 1652 Jonathan Paddlefoot or Padelford. (Cutter, p.959; GDNE, v.3, p.328) On 1 Feb 1675/6 the house of Thomas Eames was assaulted by the Indians and Mary and five children were killed. Four of her children, including Margaret (137), were captured, but later escaped or were released. Their large Framingham house, barn and stock of cattle were burned. (Cutter, p.50; Eames, pp.167-8; Bos Eas Mass, p.448)

276. Richard Cutter was a cooper of Cambridge. He was one of the first to build outside the settlement. His house was accordingly "furnished with flankers" for defence against the Indians. (Bos Eas Mass, p.283; Wyman, p.260)

278. John Rolfe was of Newbury and Cambridge. He came about 1670 from Nantucket Island. (Cutter, p.21; Bos Eas Mass, p.1877) One authority says he was grandson of Henry (Cutter, p.25), but it is more probable that he was the son of Henry (GDNE, v.3, p.571).

280. See note 268.

284. Walter Allen, of Newbury 1640, moved to Watertown 1652. He had a wife Rebecca in 1665. After 1673 he moved to Charlestown and there m. (2) 29 Nov 1678 Abigail Rogers. In Charlestown he was a "Haberdasher of hats". (Bond, p.6; Allen, p.1)

286. Savage says the father of Anna Brazier may have been Edward. (GDNE, v.1, p.33) This is an unusual name. Edward is said to have had at least two daughters, Abigail and Rebecca. Joseph and Anna (Brazier) Allen also had daughters named Abigail and Rebecca. (GDNE, v.1, pp.33, 240) Though not conclusive these facts make it quite probable that Edward was the father of Anna.

Edward may have been the Edward who in 1621 was in England and married to Ann, dau Thomas and Joane Boylsonn of Bewdly, Worces. (NEH&GR, v.47, p.531) In that case Magdalen (287) would have been his second wife, and Ann rather than Magdalen would very possibly have been the mother of Anna (143).

288. Benjamin Scott was the first Scott of Milton. In 1711 an area known in the early days as "Scott's Woods", now known as the Blue Hills, was purchased by three citizens of Milton and was divided by the General Court between Milton and Braintree. It probably got its name from the family of Benjamin Scott which was living there "before its annexation to Milton and continuing in Milton through the whole of the (seventeenth) century". (Milton, p.179) Benjamin and Mary had: Benjamin, b. Braintree 18 Feb 1699/1700;

John, b. Milton 3 Nov 1702; Jemima, b. Milton 26 Oct 1703; and Peter, b. Milton 17 Aug 1706 (Scott, pp.323-4).

316. Nathan, or Nathaniel, Bradley is given by Savage as the founder of the family (GDNE, v.1, p.234). Pope says he was s. John who was of Dorchester 1641 (Pope, p.64). Savage, however, points out that John d. Jun 1642 and his will mentions only a wife and brother-in-law (GDNE, v.1, p.233). It would seem Nathan was not John's son.

334. Lyon Gardiner was of Saybrook, Conn., 1635. He prob lived on Long Island aft 1642. (GDNE, v.2, p.226)

336. John Symonds may have been in Virginia in 1635, but he was residing in Salem in 1636. He became freeman 1638. He was a carpenter and acquired considerable property. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1187) Some accounts say he was the son of Deputy Governor Samuel Symonds. He and his wife Mary were admitted to the church in Salem in 1638. (Felt, v.1, p.173) After her death he m. (2) Elizabeth _____. It is said he lived much of the time in England. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1007)

338. Thomas Browning came from Yarmouth, England. He settled at Salem bef 1637. He moved to Topsfield in 1661. (Browning, p.367)

340. John Foster, called "Corporal", was a farmer, but as he built a bridge for the town he may also have been a carpenter or stone mason. He was made freeman in 1682. (Bos Eas Mass, p.720) His wife Martha m. (2) Richard Adams. (Tingley, p.401)

368. Andrew Eliott was still in East Coker, Som., in 1668, but he came to New England shortly afterwards as he was admitted to the Beverly Church in 1670. He was "a man of goodly estate, both in property and social position," a cordwainer, the first regular town clerk (in 1690), an office he held until his death. He was Representative five years. He was on the witchcraft jury in 1692 which afterwards publicly recanted. A year or two after having sent certain of the accused to their death the entire jury including Andrew Eliott signed a statement which recited that they "were, for want of knowledge in ourselves and better information from others, prevailed with to take up with such evidence against the accused as, on further consideration and better information, we justly fear was insufficient for the touching the lives of any (Deut.xvii.6), whereby we fear we have been instrumental, with others, though ignorantly and unwittingly, to bring upon ourselves and this people of the Lord the guilt of innocent blood; which sin the Lord saith in Scripture he would not pardon (2 Kings xxiv.4),--- that is, we suppose, in regard of his temporal judgments. We do therefore hereby signify to all in general, and to the surviving sufferers in special, our deep sense of, and sorrow for, our errors in acting on such evidence to the condemning of any person; and do hereby declare, that we justly fear that we were sadly deluded and mistaken,---for which we are much disquieted and distressed in our minds, and do therefore humbly beg forgiveness, first, of God, for Christ's sake, for this our error, and pray that God would not impute the guilt of it to ourselves nor others; and we also pray that we may be considered candidly and aright by the living sufferers, as being then under the power of a strong and general delusion, utterly unacquainted with, and not experienced in, matters of that nature. We do heartily ask forgiveness of you all, whom we have justly offended; and do declare, according to

our present minds, we would none of us do such things again, on such grounds, for the whole world."

In 1698 Andrew Elliott was called "Lieutenant". His first marriage was to Grace Woodier, 23 Apr 1649 in East Coker, Som., but she died 8 Feb 1652. He then married 2 Feb 1654 Mary Vivion. His first child, b.1651, was Andrew, his only son by Grace. William (184) came next, by Mary. (Bos Eas Mass, p.108; Hurd,v.1,p.690; Dawes-Gates,v.2,p.331; Upham, v.2,pp.474-5)

370. Francis Brown was of Newbury. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1058) He m. (2) 31 Dec 1679 Mary Morse, prob wid Joseph Morse. (Hoyt, v.3,p.887)

372. After a possible sojourn in Boston or Dorchester John Porter settled in Hingham in 1635, where he was appointed in 1640 by the General Court to appraise horses and cattle; in 1641 he was a constable, and one of those to fix the tax rate; in 1644 he was Deputy to the General Court. Later in 1644 he removed to Salem and settled in the Danvers area. He became one of the largest land owners in Salem Village (Danvers). In 1668 he was Deputy. With Mr. Endicott he built a saw mill. He is spoken of in colonial records as "of good repute for piety, integrity, and estate". (Bos Eas Mass,p.1009; Upham, v.1,p.137)

374. Major William Hathorne came with Winthrop. He settled first at Dorchester, but in 1636 removed to Salem. "No one in our annals fills a larger space. As soldier commanding important and difficult expeditions, as counsel in cases before the courts, as judge on the bench, and in innumerable other positions requiring talents and intelligence, he was constantly called to serve the public. He was distinguished as a public speaker, and is the only person, I believe, of that period, whose reputation as an orator has come down to us. He was an Assistant, that is, in the upper branch of the Legislature, seventeen years. He was Deputy twenty years. When the Deputies, who before sat with the Assistants, were separated into a distinct body, and the House of Representatives thus came into existence, in 1644, Hathorne was their first Speaker. He occupied the chair, with intermittent services on the floor from time to time, until raised to the other house." (Upham,v.1,p.99) Cutter describes him as "one of the most able, energetic, and widely influential men in New England in his day". He was the immigrant ancestor from whom Nathaniel Hawthorne descended. (Bos Eas Mass, p.38) Major William Hathorne's father and mother were William and Sara Hathorne of Binfield, Berks. (Bos Eas Mass, p.38) For another mention of William Hathorne see note on David Thomas of Middleboro.

378. Robert Sallows died by drowning. (GDNE,v.4,p.703)

384. For notes on David Thomas and his wife Joanna see "David Thomas of Middleboro" and the Thomas Genealogy under number 1.

386. Henry Wood and Ephraim Tinkham (864) were, according to tradition, the first settlers of Middleboro. From Plymouth Henry moved to Yarmouth, then in 1649 again to Plymouth; and in 1655 to Middleboro. One record gives his name as Henry Wood, alias Atwood. (Weston,pp.54,61-2)

390. One account asserts that Joseph Huckins, brother of John, was the father of Hope who married Thomas Nelson (SE Mass,pp.1546-7). However, three other accounts make her the daughter of John (Otis,v.2,p.65; GDNE,v.2, p.487; Virkus,v.3,pp.276,334). Note that Hope was the name of John's wife

and of his wife's mother. Hope who married Thomas Nelson was undoubtedly his daughter.

391. Hope Chipman Huckins m. (2) Barnstable 1 Mar 1682/3 Jonathan, s. Elder Henry Cobb (1924). They moved to Middleboro, then to Portland, Me. (Otis,v.1,p.158)

392. Jonathan Shaw was of Plymouth. He m. (2) Persis, wid Benjamin Pratt and dau Deacon John Dunham (1690). (GDNE,v.4,p.624) He was deacon of the Plympton Church in 1698. (Americana,v.36,pp.508ff)

394. Daniel Doane, the first physician of Eastham, m. (2) aft Jul 1682 Hepzibah, wid Daniel Crisp and dau Daniel and Mary Cole of Eastham, where Daniel Doane had gone from Plymouth with his father 1645. He was selectman five years, deacon many years. The birth of his dau Constance (197) is recorded as "Constant", a son. (Doane,p.26; Dawes-Gates,v.2,pp.304-7)

396. Richard Rich, a mariner, was at Dover Point, N.H., 5 Dec 1667, and prob m. there c. 1674, but he had been of Eastham 1665 and was there again later. (Townroe,p.18; Rich,p.8)

398. Samuel Knowles was a deacon. (Townroe,p.23)

400. John Smith was of Barnstable 1640. (GDNE,v.4,p.119)

404. William Barden came to America bound to Thomas Boardman to learn the trade of carpenter. Later he was bound to John Barker (810) to learn bricklaying. He went to Concord, Duxbury, Barnstable and about 1683 to Middleboro. (Barden,pp.36-7; Otis,v.1,p.66)

406. Thomas Parlow may have been the son of Symon Parler who was born in England in 1611 but went to Barbadoes in 1635. Thomas first appears in Beverly in 1675, but was in Middleboro by 1701. He was a soldier in King Philip's War. His wife (or daughter) Elizabeth married James Lewis after 1705. (Tingley,p.266)

408. Edward Bates came from the vicinity of Boston, Lincs. He joined the church in Boston 1633, being called "man servant to our brother Thomas Leverett," so he probably came with him in the Griffin in 1633. He was disarmed as a follower of Ann Hutchinson in 1637, but was made freeman in 1639. He was Deputy to the General Court 1639 and three more years. He was an elder of the Weymouth Church more than thirty years, to which place he removed about 1638. (Bates,pp.6-7)

410. John Shaw was a deacon. He was of Weymouth. (Bates,p.20; GDNE,v.4,p.64)

412. Peter Blossom was a farmer of West Barnstable. (Otis,v.1,p.77)

416. Robert and Ruth Barrows had: John, b. 1667, d. 1720, m. (1) Sarah Briggs, and (2) 1714 Bethia King; Eliezer, b. 15 Sep 1669, d. Dec 1669; George (208); Samuel, b. 1672, d. Midd. 30 Dec 1755, m. (1) Mercy Coombs, d. 4 Mar 1718, ae 44, and (2) Joanna Smith; Mehitabel, m. 20 Jun 1717 Adam Wright. Robert m. (2) Lydia, dau John Dunham, and by her had: Elisha, b. 17 Mar 1686, d. 1689; Robert, b. 8 Nov 1689, d. Mansfield, Conn., 17 Aug 1779, m. Bethia

Ford; Thankful, b. 8 Dec 1692, m. 11 Feb 1713/14 Isaac King; Elisha, b. 6 Jun 1695, d. Rochester 1767, m. (1) Thankful ____, (2) Nellie ____, Thomas, b. 14 Feb 1697, d. Mansfield 1776, m. 1721 Esther Hall; Lydia, b. 19 Mar 1699, m. 11 Oct 1720 Thomas Branch. (Maine H&GR,v.7,p.199; Mid Ch,p.82; SE Mass, p.611)

417. Ruth Bonum was of Plymouth. (Barrows)

422. John Rickard was a deacon. (Tilson, p.384;VR)

424. Ralph Jones was able to bear arms in Plymouth 1643, was of Barnstable 1654. He was a farmer. He was a zealous Quaker, and the following story is told of him. It seems he had four cows and some calves seized by the constable to pay his ministerial tax. The minister killed one cow and sent parts to his daughter, then in child-bed. She ate a little and "fell into trouble" and asked her father to return the cows. He kept them, and she died forthwith. The minister claimed the Quakers had bewitched her. Later he killed another cow to eat himself, saying he would see if they could bewitch him. Before all was eaten he died. (Otis,v.2,p.106)

428. Isaac Peirce was called "Mr." Tradition says he had two thumbs on one hand. He was a soldier in the Narragansett campaign. (Peirce,pp.8, 10)

432. Ebenezer Tinkham was a deacon. (GDNE,v.4,p.306) He married Elizabeth Burrowes, not, as earlier accounts say, Elizabeth Liscomb. (MD, v.17,p.186) He and Elizabeth died the same day of small pox. (Tinkham,p.4)

434. See note 406.

438. John Waterman was of Marshfield. (GDNE,v.4,p.431)

440. Samuel Hammond was a founder and prominent member of the First Congregational Church in Rochester (SE Mass, pp.1175-6).

444. See note 222.

446. Edward Small was of Dover, N.H. Dover suffered severely during the Indian Wars following 1675, and by 1695 Edward was an inhabitant of Chatham. After his death his widow returned to Dover, N.H., her home town. (Small, v.1,pp.112-3)

448. Amos and Susanna Howes had: Mercy, b. Apr 1702, m. 12 Feb 1736 Aron Crowell; Elisha, b. May 1704, d. 21 Nov 1728; Amos (224); Lemuel, b. 1711, d. 18 Feb 1795, m. 20 Feb 1734/5; Stephen, m. 17 May 1739 Thankful Hall. (Howes,p.14)

454. John Crowell moved to Falmouth c. 1750. In 1733 he had a grant of land in Gorham, Me. (Crowe,p.21)

460. John Howes m. (1) 28 Nov 1689 Elizabeth Paddock, (2) Mary Matthews. (Howes,p.10)

480. Benjamin Bearse was one of the early settlers of Hyannis. He m. (2) Anna Nickerson. Benjamin and Sarah Bearse had at Barnstable: Martha,

b. 9 Nov 1702, m. 15 Oct 1730 Antipas Lewis; Augustine (240); Elizabeth, b. 3 May 1706; Joseph, b. 30 Oct 1708, d. 1751, m. 12 Oct 1749 Lydia Deane; Benjamin, b. 26 Mar 1710, d. 1753, m. Jane Godfrey, rem to Chatham; Jesse, b. 22 Oct 1711; Priscilla, b. 5 Jun 1713, m. 16 Oct 1735 Elnathan Lewis; David, b. 27 Mar 1716; Peter, b. 25 Oct 1718, m. 12 Nov 1741 Deborah Bacon; Samuel, b. 9 Dec 1720, d. 30 Oct 1751; Sarah, b. 5 Jul 1722, m. 17 Feb 1744 Ebenezer Nickerson of Yarmouth; Thankful, b. 4 Feb 1724, m. 6 Mar 1746 Shobael Nickerson; and Stephen. (Otis, v.1, pp.56-7)

484. Two of the name of William Downs are found in Massachusetts at the end of the seventeenth century who could have been William (484). William Downes (Downe or Downs), a merchant of Boston, m. Hannah Appleton, b. 9 Jan 1652, dau Samuel and Hannah (dau William Paine of Ipswich). William and Hannah had a son William b. Boston 2 Feb 1675/6 who could have m. bef 1701 Elizabeth Gorham. Samuel Appleton was b. Little Waldingfield, Eng, 1624 and came 1635 with his father Samuel and mother Judith (Everard). He was a Captain in King Philip's War and commanded the Massachusetts forces at the Narragansett fight. He was imprisoned in 1687 by Governor Andros for sedition. He d. 1695/6. (Downs, p.5; Appleton, p.16; VR)

There was also a John Downs (or Downes) who m. Dorothy bef 1657 and had among other children John b. 1664 and William b. Boston 23 Feb 1666/7 (VR). A John and a William appear briefly on Long Island 1687-97, John being mentioned there 1687, 1693 and 1697, and William in 1691. It has been suggested that these were either the two brothers or the father and the son William. Downs says: "I personally feel sure that William (of Long Island) is the son of John of Boston." As a John m. Boston 30 Aug 1696 (VR) he was very probably the son, and the John of Long Island the father. William does not appear again on Long Island or in Boston. (Downs, pp.5-7) He could easily have gone from Long Island to Bristol, R.I., where William (484) lived.

Finally it should be noted that a "William Downs" (intention reads "Downes") m. Boston 14 May 1713 Rebecca Peirson (VR). If this were either of the above it was more probably the younger William, b. 1675/6, who would have been 37, rather than the son of John, b. 1666/7, who would have been 46 at the time. However, it was very possibly a first marriage of still another William called "Colonel William Downe" of Boston, b. 1686 (Am. Ancestry, v.9, p.203) who seems to have been the "William Down" who m. Boston 4 Jul 1717 Sarah Danforth (VR).

No other William is found in New England at this period. In the light of the foregoing evidence it is thought most probable that William, the son of John and Dorothy Downs, went with his father to Long Island and shortly after 1691 moved on to Bristol, R.I., where he m. bet 1694-1700 Elizabeth Gorham. As Elizabeth m. again bef 1711 William must have died bet 1705-1710. The children born to William and Elizabeth were: Edward, b. 22 Jun 1701; William (242); Samuel, b. 2 Oct 1705. (VR)

485. Elizabeth Gorham and her husband William Downs lived in Bristol, R.I. (NEH&GR, v.34, p.136) She m. (2) Shobael Baxter, bef 1711, and rem to Yarmouth (MD, v.13, p.226). He died bet 1738-41 (MD, v.13, p.247). He was s. Thomas Baxter (972) and Temperance Gorham (973). (MD, v.12, p.219)

488. Joseph Blush was of Barnstable. (GDNE, v.1, p.200)

490. Joseph Bodfish (or Bootfish) was of Barnstable. He was a good shot, and it is said that the last wolf killed in Barnstable was shot by him. (GDNE, v.1, p.211; Otis, v.1, p.70)

494. John Stacy was of Salem 1690, Watertown 1696, Barnstable 1709, Ipswich 1719 and Gloucester 1722. (Goodspeed,v.1,p.116) He was an innholder and miller, later a millwright. (Bos Eas Mass, p.363)

NINTH GENERATION

528. Peter Tufts is believed to have come from southern Norfolk, Eng. He was an inhabitant of Charlestown on the Malden side prior to 1638. With his brother-in-law William Bridges he kept the Malden ferry during the years 1646 and 1647. He was a man of unusual thrift, owning property in Charlestown, Medford, Malden and Everett. (Wyman,p.959; Bos Eas Mass,pp.974-5)

529. Mary Pierce was dau of THOMAS PIERCE (1058), b. Eng 1583/4, d. 7 Oct 1666, and his wife ELIZABETH (1059), b. Eng c. 1595/6, d. aft 1667. Thomas Pierce was admitted freeman 6 May 1635. On 27 Sep 1642 he was appointed one of twenty-one commissioners "to see that salt peter hops were made by the farmers of the colony." He first settled in Charlestown, then removed to Woburn where he was a proprietor in 1643, and elected to town office. (Bos Eas Mass,p.1477)

534. George Blanchard m. (1) _____ Hills, (2) Mary _____. (Wyman,v.1, p.88) He was son of THOMAS BLANCHARD (1068) who d. 21 May 1654. Thomas came from London in the Jonathan 1639. He was of Braintree 1646-50, then Charlestown. He m. (1) _____, (2) Agnes Bent who d. on the Jonathan 1639, and (3) Mary _____. (Wyman,v.1,p.88)

537. The widow Mary Hall appears in Cambridge in 1653. Tradition says her husband came in 1630 in the ship with his brother John, and settled in Charlestown. Some say he was "Mr. Nathaniel Hall" to whom lands were granted in Dorchester in 1634. Mary joined the church in 1658, and in 1662 had lands granted to her by the town of Cambridge. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1015)

538. Percival Green was of Cambridge. (Bos Eas Mass,p.1015) He was freeman 1636, the entry being "Passevil". His death record is "Perceiveall". (GDNE,v.2,p.304)

539. Ellen Green m. (2) Thomas Fox. (GDNE,v.2,p.304)

540. For Richard Cutter and his wife Elizabeth Williams and their ancestries see numbers 276 and 277 and corresponding notes.

542. Thomas Hall was of Cambridge. (Bos Eas Mass,p.450) He m. (2) 24 Mar 1683 Martha (or Mary), wid Humphrey Bradshaw who had previously been wid William Russell. It has been said that he "is supposed to have come to Virginia in the Plain Joan 1635". (Hall,p.301)

544. Henry Adams was the son of John Adams, b. Barton St.David, Som., c.1555, bur 22 Mar 1603/4, and his wife Agnes, bur Barton St.David 15 Jan 1615/16, who were married 1576. John was the son of Henry Adams, b. Barton St.David c. 1531, d.c.1596, who m.c.1554. Henry was the son of John Adams, b.c.1500-5, and his wife Alice. (Henry Adams,pp.28-46)

Henry Adams (544) moved from Barton St.David (7 mi southeast from Glastonbury) to Kingweston bet 1614-22. He came to America in 1638 and settled in Wollaston, which became part of Braintree in 1640. (Henry Adams,pp. 10,49-51,66)

Henry Adams' son Joseph, b. 1626, had a son known as Captain John Adams, b. 1661, who was the father of Samuel Adams of Revolutionary fame, b. 1722. Henry's son Joseph also had a son Joseph, b. 1654, who had a son known as Deacon John Adams, b. 1691/2. Deacon John was the father of President John Adams, b. 1735, and the latter was the father of President John Quincy Adams, b. 1767. (Henry Adams, pp.100,102; Bos Eas Mass, pp.589-590)

545. Edith Squire Adams m. (2) 1651 John Fussell of Weymouth and Medfield. He d. Medfield 21 Feb 1675-6 when he was nearly 100 years old. His house was burned by the Indians and he was burned with it. (Henry Adams, pp.55,72)

Edith was dau Henry Squire, b. Charlton Mackrell, Som., c. 1563. Henry was s. William, b. bef 1521, d.c. 1567. (Henry Adams, pp.52-5)

550. John Blandford was an original proprietor of Sudbury. He m. (2) bef 1643 wid Dorothy Wright. (GDNE, v.1, p.197)

553. Elizabeth Cutter was born near Newcastle-upon-Tyne, Eng. She "knew not" her father. She was placed by her mother in a "godly" Newcastle family about seven years, then in another "where religious privileges were less". After her husband's death "she was sent to Cambridge, New England." (Bos Eas Mass, p.283)

554. Robert Williams was of Roxbury. (Bos Eas Mass, p.283) He was freeman 1638. Although over 80 he is said to have married (2) 3 Nov 1675 Margaret, wid of John Fearing of Hingham, and again (3) Martha Strong. (NEH&GR, v.34, p.69)

558. Samuel Scullard rem from Newbury to Hampton in 1638, but soon returned. His widow m. (2) Oct 1647 John Bishop and rem to Woodbridge, N.J. (GDNE, v.1, p.184; v.3, p.12; v.4, p.43)

559. Rebecca Kent was dau RICHARD KENT (1118), b. Eng, d. 11 Jun 1654. He was of Ipswich 1634, freeman 1635, rem with the first settlers to Newbury 1635. (GDNE, v.3, p.12)

561. See note 537.

562. See note 538.

563. See note 539.

564. For Richard Cutter and his wife Elizabeth Williams and their ancestries see numbers 276 and 277 and corresponding notes.

566. See note 542.

576. Peter and Abigail Scott had: Benjamin, b. Braintree 24 Nov 1674; John, b. Braintree 9 Jun 1676; Peter, b. Braintree 20 Sep 1680; Abigail, b. Braintree 1 Oct 1685; Joseph, b. Braintree 28 Dec 1688; and James, bp Braintree 17 Feb 1688/9 (VR; NEH&GR, v.59, p.270)

Peter Scott (576) was s. BENJAMIN SCOTT (1152) and HANNAH (1153) who m. bef 1640. Benjamin was of Braintree 1643. They had: Hannah; John, b. 25 Dec 1640; Peter, b. 6 Mar 1643; and Benjamin, b. bef 1647, d. 1683. Benjamin senior d.c. 1646-7 and Hannah m. (2) 21 Sep 1647 John Harbor. (Pope,

p.404) Authorities which say that he rem to Cambridge and then to Rowley (GDNE,v.4,p.36; An Heads) are apparently wrong. Benjamin of Cambridge and Rowley was another man, whose wife Margaret on 22 Sep 1693 was executed in Salem for witchcraft (Pope,p.404; and see Scott, pp.323 and 325).

577. Abigail Neale was dau HENRY NEALE (1154), b. Eng 1617, d. Braintree 16 Oct 1688, m. Braintree 14 Feb 1655/6 HANNAH PRAY (1155), prob b. Eng, d. Braintree aft 1688. Henry had m. (1) bef 1643 Martha _____ who d. Braintree 23 Jul 1653 (Ravenscroft,p.224). He was a carpenter, of Braintree 1640. His gravestone says he fathered 21 children. His will provides for his wife Hannah, 4 sons and 11 daughters. (GDNE,v.3,p.264;Pope,p.325) One authority says he rem to Providence, R.I., c. 1657 but returned to Braintree c. 1661 (Pope,p.325). See also note 38, #B306 and #B307.

Hannah Pray was dau QUINTON PRAY (2310) and his wife Joan (2311), but there is no evidence that Joan came to America. Quinton was b. Eng 1595, d. Braintree 17 Jun 1667. He was at Lynn 1640 (Ravenscroft,p.230). See also note 38, #B614 for Quinton and #B615 for Joan.

578. John Daniel was s. WILLIAM DANIEL (1156), b. Eng, d. Milton 1678, m. bef 1648 KATHERINE GRENAWAY (1157), prob b. Eng, d. aft 1678. William was an inn-keeper and a proprietor of Dorchester 1646, freeman 1648. He had a grant of land in Milton 1650. (An Heads; Pope,p.130; GDNE,v.2,p.10; Milton, p.12) Katherine was dau JOHN GRENAWAY (2314) and MARY (2315) who m. Eng bef 1591. Mary d. Dorchester 23 Jan 1658/9. John d.c. 1653 prob Milton. They came prob 1630 in the Mary and John, settling at Dorchester where he requested to be freeman 19 Oct 1630, and was admitted as such 1631. He was a millwright "of much esteem". He prob brought several children from England some prob already married. His dau Ann m. Robert Pierce and d. 31 Dec 1695, ae 104. (GDNE,v.2,p.310; Pope,p.200). John was early of Milton where he had land prior to 1633 (Milton,p.12). See note 38---sub-note B617---for another dau of John and Mary.

579. Dorothy Badcock was dau GEORGE BADCOCK (1158) and his wife Mary (1159), who m. bef 1655. He d. 1671 and she d. aft 1671. He was servant of Governor Theophilus Eaton of New Haven, Conn., 1640. He rem to Dorchester 1646, and in 1654 had a grant of land in Milton where he settled. (An Heads; Pope, p.27; Milton, p.117)

670. Dericke Williamson was of Worden, Holland, and had been in the service of its Prince. (GDNE,v.2,p.226)

682. Ralph Tompkins lived in Dorchester and in Bridgewater before coming to Salem, where he was a planter as early as 1642. He m. (2) Hannah Aborne. His first wife Katherine was prob a widow eight years older than he. (Perley,v.1,p.426)

740. Thomas Brown was a weaver of Newbury. He came from Malford, Wilts, in 1635 on the James, in the employ of Thomas Antram. He brought his wife Mary, by whom he had Mary, the first English child born in Newbury. She was born in 1635. Thomas died by a fall at the age of 80.

A descendant who went to England reported that he "finds no such place in England as Malford". Savage says it is shown on the map of Wilts in Camden's Britannica as Christian Malford, a parish in the hundred of No. Damenham about six miles from Malmesbury and five miles from Chippenham. (GDNE, v.1,p.266)

741. Mary Newhall was dau THOMAS NEWHALL (1482), d. 25 May 1674, and his wife MARY (1483), d. 25 Sep 1665. Thomas was a brother of Anthony Newhall. They were both of Lynn. (GDNE, v.3, p.273; Pope, pp.74, 328)

748. See note 374.

756. Michael Sallows was of Salem 1635. (GDNE, v.4, p.5)

758. Peter Woolfe was freeman of Salem 1634. In 1646 he was appointed lieutenant in command of a group of soldiers. With his wife, Martha, he was a founder of the First Church of Beverly in 1667. (Groves, p.7; GDNE, v.4, p.624)

774. John Jenney had been a brewer of Norwich, who went to Holland. (GDNE, v.2, p.546) He was Assistant to the Governor 1637, 1638-40. (Plym Lists)

776. William Nelson is said to have been the brother of John, the postmaster of Scrooby, Eng. He was at Plymouth bef 1636, and was granted land there in 1640. He was among the first settlers of Middleboro. He was made freeman at Plymouth 1658, and Middleboro 1670. (SE Mass, pp.1546-7) He was at the Fort Fight in King Philip's War. (Weston, p.51)

777. According to one authority Martha Ford (777) was born 21 Nov 1621, the day after her mother arrived on the Fortune, and is said to have been the first white child born in Plymouth. (SE Mass, pp. 1546-7) She was dau of MARTHA (FORD) (1555, 1731). If she was not born then she must have come with her mother, as to which there is no evidence. See also note 865. However, Banks says the child b. 21 Nov 1621 was a son. He also says, contrary to most authorities, that the father came at the same time but died shortly thereafter. (Eng Anc, p.117)

778. Richard Foxwell (Foxel) was first of Salem or Boston, asked to be freeman 1630, and sworn as one 1631. He was of Scituate 1634, having then married, his wife being a servant who came that year. She was possibly sister of Robert Shelley (1930)---see note 965. He was a founder of Lothrop's church at Scituate in 1635. (GDNE, v.2, p.198)

780. Thomas Huckins (or Hutchins) was of Barnstable, although he had lived in or near Boston. In 1637 he was number 6 of those signing the organization roll of the Ancient and Honorable Artillery Company. He was eight years Representative of Barnstable, and a member of the Council of War in Plymouth Colony in 1671. He and his son Joseph were both lost at sea 9 Nov 1679. (SE Mass, pp.1546-7; GDNE, v.2, p.487) He m. (1) Mary, dau Isaac Wells of Barnstable. She d. 28 Jul 1648 and he m. (2) Rose, wid Hugh Hillier. His son Joseph, who one authority says was the father of Hope (195) (see note 390), was born 21 Feb 1655. Thomas kept a public house. He was Commissary General of the Colony in 1675. (Otis, v.2, pp.58-63)

782. John Chipman prob came in the White Angel or the Friendship. He was at Plymouth or Yarmouth a few years before 1650, but was later of Barnstable. For a long time he was ruling elder of the church, Representative five years, selectman four years, member of the Council of War 1667. He m. (2) Ruth (Sargeant) (Winslow) Bourne, dau William Sargeant, who was born Charlestown 25 Oct 1642, d. Sandwich 4 Oct 1713. (Otis, v.1, pp.153-6; GDNE,

v.1,p.380; Shaw,pp.106ff)

John Chipman was s. Thomas Chipman. Thomas had a good estate at Brinspittell, about 5 miles from Dorchester, Dorset. (Otis,v.1,p.153; GDNE, v.1,p.380)

783. Hope Howland was dau JOHN HOWLAND (1566, 3882, 3894, 3898) and his wife ELIZABETH TILLEY (1567, 3883, 3895, 3899). John was b.c. 1592, s. Henry of Fen Stanton, Hunts, near Newport, Essex. John d. Plymouth 23 Feb 1672. Elizabeth was b.c. 1607 and d. Swansea 21 Dec 1687. They were married c. 1623. (Shaw,pp.106 ff)

Elizabeth was dau JOHN TILLEY (3134, 7766, 7790, 7798) and his wife TILLEY (3135, 7767, 7791, 7799). The three of them came to Plymouth on the Mayflower in 1620, but John and his wife died the first winter here. (Bradford, pp.532,537;MD, v.10,p.65) Elizabeth was the last but three of Mayflower passengers to die. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1860) Note that the wife of John Tilley was not Bridget Van der Velde as is so often claimed. (MD,v.10, p.65)

Governor Bradford, after reciting the storms encountered by the Mayflower at sea, adds the following incident concerning John Howland: "In sundrie of these stormes the winds were so feirce, & ye seas so high, as they could not beare a knote of saile, but were forced to hull, for diuerce days togither. And in one of them, as they thus lay at hull, in a mighty storme, a lustie yonge man (called John Howland) coming upon some occasion above ye grattings, was, with a seele of ye shipe throwne into sea; but it pleased God yt he caught hould of ye top-saile halliards, which hunge over board, & rane out at length; yet he held his hould (though he was sundrie fadomes under water) till he was hald up by ye same rope to ye brime of ye water, and then with a boat hooke & other means got into ye shipe againe, & his life saved; and though he was something ill with it, yet he lived many years after, and became a profitable member both in church & comone wealth." Bradford also calls him "servant" of Governor John Carver.

A staunch orthodox Puritan, John Howland was a member and officer of Rev. John Cotton's church. His name is 13th on the list of 41 signers of the Mayflower Compact in Cape Cod Harbor 21 Nov 1620. He was third on the list of the Governor's Council of seven. He served as Assistant to the Governor 1634-5. He was a lieutenant of the militia. He was assessor 1633-4; selectman of Plymouth 1666; Deputy of Plymouth 1652,56,58,61,63,66,67 and 70. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1860; Bradford,pp.92-3,534; Plym Lists)

For other connections with John Howland and Elizabeth Tilley see notes 970, 973 and 974.

784. John Shaw was of Plymouth 1627, freeman 1632, one of the original purchasers of Dartmouth 1652, an original owner of Bridgewater, and a first settler of Middleboro 1662. He joined the military company in 1643, was one of eight men who went out against the Narragansetts in 1645, and served in King Philip's War. (GDNE, v.4,p.624; Americana, v.36,pp.508ff; SE Mass,p.696; Weston, p.53) See number 872.

786. George Watson was s. ROBERT WATSON (1572,1748), d.c. 1637, and his wife ELIZABETH (1573,1749). See number 874.

787. Phebe Hicks was dau ROBERT HICKS (1574, 1750, 7262), b. Eng c. 1570-5, d. Plymouth 24 Mar 1647, and his wife MARGARET WINSLOW (1575, 1751, 7263), d. 1665. Robert came in the Fortune in 1621 and settled at Plymouth after a stay at Scituate. Later he rem to Duxbury. His wife Margaret came

in the Ann in 1623 with her children, including, presumably, Phebe. In 1618 Robert had been a leather-dresser at London, "or rather Bermondsey str. Southwark". He had married (1) Elizabeth, dau John Morgan. (GDNE, v.2,p.410; Americana, v.36,pp.511-14)

Robert was s. James Hicks, b. 1550, and his wife Phebe Allyn, dau Ephraim, a minister. James Hicks traces through Baptist and Thomas to John Hicks who d. 1492. John is said to have been a lineal descendant of Sir Ellis Hicks, who was knighted on the field of Poitiers in 1356 by Edward, the Black Prince. He was of Gloucestershire. (Americana, v.36,p.511ff)

See also notes 875 and 907.

788. John Doane settled in Plymouth in 1630 and became deacon 1634, but in 1645 removed to Eastham. (Doane, pp.1-2,7,15) By 1659 he had m. (2) Lydia, although Ann was living 1648. (Dawes-Gates, v.2,p.304) He seems to have m. (3) Abigail. (Doane, p.15)

792. Richard Rich was Lord Chancellor of London. (Townroe, p.18)

794. Thomas Roberts settled at Dover Neck, or Dover Point, N.H., in 1623 for the purpose of trading. In 1638 and in 1640 he was President of the Court, or chief magistrate, of Mason's Colony, hence is frequently called Governor. (Rich, p.19; Townroe, p.22) He was the son of Thomas Roberts.

795. Tradition says Rebecca Hilton was a sister of Edward Hilton with whom Thomas Roberts came in 1623 and to whom he was apprenticed. (Scales, p.302)

796. Richard Knowles rem from Plymouth to Eastham 1650, where he was a ship master. He was called before the court for sailing a boat on Sunday. (Townroe, p.23)

797. Ruth Bower was dau GEORGE BOWER (1594) and his wife BARBARA (1595), d. Cambridge 25 Mar 1644, who had m.c. 1623. George was an early planter at Scituate, where he was freeman 1636. Before 1639 he rem to Plymouth, later to Cambridge. He m. (2) c. 1649 Elizabeth Worthington. (Townroe, p.24)

798. Major John Freeman was a member of the Council of War 1667-76, Deputy eight years, selectman ten years, Assistant 1667-92, appointed to the Court of Common Pleas 1692. (Townroe, p.25) He was the s. EDMUND FREEMAN (1596), b. Pulborough, Sussex, 25 Jul 1590, d. Sandwich 1 Nov 1682, and his wife ELIZABETH (PERRY) (1597), b. Eng c. 1600, d. 14 Feb 1676, who had m. Eng c. 1618. Edmund m. (1) 16 Jun 1617 Bennett, dau John and Faith Hodsol of Crawford, Sussex, and (2) Mrs. Elizabeth Perry. (Townroe, p.25) "According to the best authorities" Elizabeth was the mother of his children born 1618 and afterwards. (NEH&GR, v.20,pp.59,353) He settled in Lynn but rem to Plymouth. He was made freeman 1637. He was one of the ten men who settled Sandwich 1639. He was Deputy 1641, Assistant 1640-47, member of the Council of War 1642, Presiding Officer of the Court, and later a judge. (Townroe, p.25) His parents were Edmund Freeman and Alice Coles.

799. Mercy Prence was dau THOMAS PRENCE (1598), b. Eng c. 1601, d. Plymouth 29 Mar 1673, and his wife PATIENCE BREWSTER (1599), b. Scrooby, Eng., bef 1600, d. Plymouth 1634. They had m. Plymouth 5 Aug 1624. Thomas was first of Plymouth but after the death of Patience he rem to Duxbury where he

m. (2) 1 Apr 1635 Mary, dau William Collier (7254). In 1645 he rem to Eastham and m. (3) 1662 Apphia (3625), wid Samuel Freeman (3624). He rem to Plymouth c. 1663 and c. 1667-8 m. (4) Mary (1793), wid Thomas Howes (1792), who survived him. (NEH&GR, v.59,p.217; GDNE, v.3,p.477; Thomas Howes,p.1; Hills, p.47) See also notes 896 and 906. Thomas Prence was a member of the Council of War, served in the Pequot War, and was Commissioner for the Colonies 1645. He was chosen Governor of Plymouth Colony 1635, 1638, and 1657-72, besides being Assistant for many years. (GDNE, v.3,p.477; Plym Lists, p.3) He was the son of Thomas Prence of Lechdale, Glouc., near Cricklade, Wilts, who d. c. 1630, and who was described as a London carriage maker of All Saints, Barking, Eng. (GDNE, v.3,p.477; Townroe,p.26)

Patience Brewster was dau of Elder WILLIAM BREWSTER (3198), b. Scrooby, Notts, c. 1566, d. Plymouth 10 Apr 1644, and his wife MARY (3199), b.c.1569, d. Plymouth 17 Apr 1627. They had m. Scrooby c. 1592. William Brewster matriculated at Peterhouse, University of Cambridge, 3 Dec 1580. Thereafter he entered the service of William Davison, Secretary to Queen Elizabeth, and went with him in 1585 when he (Davison) was sent as Ambassador to the Low Countries to perfect a league to maintain independence from Spain. After Davison fell from grace in 1587 Brewster became postmaster at Scrooby, where he lived in the manor house of the Archbishop of York. There he had meetings of those Separatists, many of whom later went to Holland and ultimately to America. He was the first prominent layman to reject conformity to the ceremonies of the Church of England. His first attempt to flee to Holland led to his arrest, but in 1608 he got away, after 12 years at Scrooby. After 12 more years at Leyden he came with his wife in the Mayflower. He brought a library of over 400 books and was the teacher of the colony in the early years as well as the religious leader until the arrival of Rev. Ralph Smith in 1629. He was the Ruling Elder of the Church at Leyden and of the Church of the Plymouth Colony, and one of the most distinguished of the Pilgrims. He soon rem from Plymouth to Duxbury. (GDNE,v.1,p.245; Bryant,v.1,pp.372-381; Bos Eas Mass, p.1392; Townroe,p.27; Shaw,pp.47ff)

William Brewster was s. William Brewster, d. Scrooby 1590, and his wife Prudence, d. aft 1590. The senior William was appointed by Archbishop Sandys Jan 1575 "receiver of Scrooby and all its liberties in Nottinghamshire and also bailiff of the Archbishop's manor house, which post he held until his death in 1590". (Townroe, p.27)

802. Samuel Hinckley and his wife Sarah came from Tenterton, Kent, in the Hercules, bringing with them four children including Susannah (401), Sarah (1925) (see note 962) and Thomas, who was later Governor of the Colony. They were at Sandwich 1635, later at Scituate, and in 1640 they moved to Barnstable. Samuel was freeman 1637. (Hellerman, p.3; GDNE,v.2,p.424; Otis, v.2,p.31) He m. (2) Barnstable 15 Dec 1657 Bridget, wid Robert Bodfish (826, 980). Samuel was bro of Thomas Hinckley (3610, 3886, 3902). (Sturgis, p.11) See note 971. See also notes 826 and 962.

810. John Barker was of Duxbury but in 1638 rem to Marshfield, then called Rexame. He was ferryman at Jones River, Kingston, where he drowned in 1652. His wid m. (2) Abraham Blush (976) of Barnstable. (Otis,v.1,p.64; Barden, p.36)

John was s. Robert Barker and his wife Catherine Ackworth, dau George. Robert's ancestry traces back through eleven more generations to Roger de Barker who d. 1368. His father was William de Calverhall. William's ancestry traces back through five more generations to Randolph de Calverhall who d. 1200 and who would be number 212,336,640 in the Twenty-Seventh Generation

in the system employed in this Ancestry.

Sir Robert Barker was knighted by James I in 1602. (Tingley, p.37)

William de Calverhall fell into disfavor with Edward II and had to flee from the manor of Calverhall to Hallou. He changed his name to William de Barker. (Tingley, p.37)

811. Anna Williams was dau JOHN WILLIAMS (1622), d. 1667-8, and his wife ANN (1623), d. Barnstable. John was of Scituate. (Otis, v.1, p.64) He was Deputy 1640, 43, 44, 47 and 48. (Tingley, p.441) Anna m. (2) Abraham Blush (976). (Otis, v.1, p.64)

820. Abraham Shaw was of Dedham 1638, but his house and goods had been lost in a fire at Watertown in 1636. He was prob there several years earlier. He was freeman 1637. (GDNE, v.4, p.64)

824. Thomas Blossom was first deacon of the Plymouth Church. He was one of the Pilgrims who went from Leyden, Holland, to Plymouth, Eng., in order to sail to America, but was on the Speedwell which was to accompany the Mayflower and which developed unseaworthy condition which forced her back into port in England. Blossom returned to Leyden, but came with Hig-genson in 1629. After his death his widow Anna m. (2) 17 Oct 1633 Henry Rawley and rem in 1639 to Barnstable, taking her son Peter (412) with her. (Otis, v.1, p.77)

826. Robert Bodfish (or Bootfish) was of Lynn, where he became freeman 1635. In 1637 he rem to Sandwich and was an original proprietor. At Barnstable on 15 Dec 1657 Bridget Bodfish, his widow, became the second wife of Samuel Hinckley (802,3850). See note 802.

Robert was an expert hunter and trapper. Once he incautiously struck a large wolf, which was in his trap, with a pine pole, which broke. The enraged wolf sprang at him. Bodfish stepped aside suddenly and the wolf passed. Before the animal could recover Bodfish was beyond his reach. A pencil note in the copy of Otis in the Library of Congress says that that trap in 1951 was in the possession of Edward H. Bodfish of Cleveland Heights, Ohio. (GDNE, v.1, p.211; Otis, v.1, pp.68-9)

832. John Barrowe (Borowe, Barows), a cooper, and his wife Ann are recorded as being in Yarmouth, Eng., 10 May 1637, desiring passage to Salem. They prob came in the Mary Ann. In Aug 1637 John Borows was received as an inhabitant of Salem. Possibly John had been to America before as a John Barrow of the right age embarked in 1635 in the Plaine Joan for Virginia. John remained in Salem 28 years, but by 1665 had rem to Plymouth. Robert (416) went to Plymouth with his father. (Maine H&GR, v.7, pp.136ff; Salem, p. 54; SE Mass, p.612; Barrows) As far as is known John and Ann Barrows only had Robert (416). John m. (2) Salem or Plymouth Deborah _____ and by her had: Joshua, d.c. 1750, m. Deliverance Wedge; Benajah, b. 1683, d. 1754, m. (1) Lydia Bucklin, (2) 1726 Elizabeth Lincoln, (3) 1736 Hannah Bennett; Ebenezer, m. Elizabeth Lyon; Deborah, m. 20 Dec 1687 Archippus Fuller; Mary, d. 1711, m. 1698 John Wonnall. (Maine H&GR, v.7, p.198)

835. Sarah Morton was dau GEORGE MORTON (1670), b. Yorks, d. Plymouth Jun 1624, and his wife JULIANA CARPENTER (1671), bp Bath, Som., 17 Mar 1584, d. Plymouth 19 Feb 1644/5, who m. Leyden, Holland, 23 Jul 1612. Juliana was dau Alexander Carpenter (3342,14506), and was sis Alice Carpenter (7253) ---see note 906. The ancestry of Alexander traces back through eight more

generations to John Carpenter, who would be number 855,552 in the Nineteenth Generation, and number 3,713,536 in the Twenty-First Generation in the system employed in this Ancestry. Alexander Carpenter was of Wington, Eng. He rem to Holland with his wife and five daughters and became a member of the church at Leyden. (Hills, pp.99,121) John Carpenter was a member of Parliament c. 1300. (Hills, p.121)

837. Sarah Chandler was dau ROGER CHANDLER (1674).

838. William Barstow (Beresto) was of Dedham. He came from London. He rem later to Scituate. His wid m. (2) John Prince of Hull. (GDNE, v.1, p.129) William was the founder of a family that were ship-builders for two centuries. He was bro of Elizabeth (885) and s. of Matthew, b. Yorks bef 1580, d. Eng. (Randall, p.295-7)

841. Joan Tilson m. (2) Giles Rickard Sr. (1688). (Tilson, p.31)

844. Giles Rickard was s. GILES RICKARD (1688), b. Eng 1597, d. Plympton 1-2 Feb 1684, and his wife JUDITH COGAN (KING) (1689), d. 6 Feb 1662, who m. West Hatch, Som., 7 Jan 1623. Giles Sr. m. (2) 20 May 1662 Joan Tilson (841), and (3) 29 Jun 1669 Hannah, wid John Churchill, dau William Pontus. (GDNE, v.3, p.540)

845. Hannah Dunham was dau JOHN DUNHAM (1690), b. Eng 1589, d. Plymouth 2 Mar 1668/9, and his wife ABIGAIL BARLOW (1691), d. aft 1668, who m. Leyden, Holland, 22 Oct 1622. John was Representative 1639 and often thereafter; a deacon; and among the first purchasers of Dartmouth. He m. (1) by 1614 Susanna Kenny, and (2) Abigail Barlow. (GDNE, v.2, p.81; Am.Gen., v.30, pp.144-5) Abigail was dau Thomas Barlow.

850. Matthew Fuller did not come with his parents in the Mayflower but followed later. He was apparently a grown man in 1620. He was of Plymouth c. 1640, removing to Barnstable 1652. He was a physician, and became surgeon of the force of the Colony in 1673, Captain 1675. He m. (2) Hannah —. (GDNE, v.2, p.217)

Matthew was s. EDWARD FULLER (1700), bp 4 Sep 1575, d. Plymouth 1621, and (Mrs.) FULLER (1701), d. Plymouth 1621. Edward, Mrs. Fuller and another son, Samuel, came in the Mayflower 1620, as did Edward's bro Samuel, who became the physician of the Colony. (GDNE, v.2, p.215) Edward was s. Robert, a butcher of Redenhall, Norf. (Eng Anc, p.55)

852. Roger Goodspeed came to Barnstable in 1639. He became freeman 1651. He was a planter or farmer, and is said not to have had the advantage of an education. (Otis, v.1, p.391) He was s. Robert Goodspeed, bp 3 Aug 1578, d. Wingrave, Bucks, c. 1659, and his wife Alice Harris, d. aft 1658, who m. Soulbury, Bucks, 6 Nov 1609. Robert was s. Robert and Isabel (Allyn) Goodspeed and the grandson of Nicholas Goodspeed who d. Wingrave, Bucks, c. 1558. See also number 984.

854. Joseph Holley was of Dorchester 1634, of Weymouth 1639, and of Sandwich 1643. (GDNE, v.2, p.448; NEH&GR, v.4, p.257; Pope, p.236)

856. Abraham Peirce was freeman 1633. In 1643 he was a soldier under Captain Miles Standish. In 1645 he was an original purchaser of Bridgewater. (Peirce, p.7)

864. Ephraim Tinkham in 1634 was apprentice to Timothy Hatherly, who in 1642 had transferred him to John Winslow. He was first of Plymouth, but was among the early settlers of Middleboro, and tradition has it that he and Henry Wood (386) were the very first. He was a sergeant. He was freeman 1670, selectman 1675. (Weston, pp.34,54)

865. Mary Brown was dau PETER BROWN (1730), d. bet 7 Jan 1632/3 and Oct 1633, and his wife MARTHA (FORD) (1555,1731), who m. Plymouth 1624-7. Peter came on the Mayflower 1620. Martha came in the Fortune 1621---see note 777. Peter m. (2) Mary _____. (Shaw, pp.56ff)

867. The wife of Jeremiah Burrowes, known to be a Huet, was prob dau THOMAS HUET (1734), d. Aug 1670, and Mrs. HUET (1735). Thomas was of Hingham, freeman 1647. (GDNE, v.2, p.490) Although Savage says he was "perhaps" the father of Mrs. Burrowes (867) (GDNE, v.1, p.311), he seems to be the only Huet around who could have been if she was born here.

872. See note 784.

874. For ancestries of George Watson and his wife Phebe Hicks see notes 786 and 787.

875. See notes 787 and 907.

876. Robert Waterman was of Plymouth 1638, but had been of Salem in 1636. He rem to Marshfield after his marriage. He was Representative 1644-9. (GDNE, v.4, p.431)

877. Elizabeth Bourne was dau THOMAS BOURNE (1754), b. Eng c. 1581, d.c. 1664, and his wife ELIZABETH (1755), b. Eng c. 1590, bur 18 Jul 1660. Thomas was early at Marshfield, at Plymouth 1637, freeman 1638, "a man of substance and repute". He m. (2) Martha _____ who survived him. (GDNE, v.1, p.219)

880. Benjamin Hammond was s. William Hammond and his wife ELIZABETH PENN (1761). William was bp 30 Oct 1575 and d. London bef 1634. He was s. Thomas of Lavenham, Suff., and his wife Rose Tripp, who m. 14 May 1573.

Elizabeth Penn m. William Hammond 9 Jun 1605. She is said to have been the sister of Admiral Sir William Penn and aunt of William Penn, the Quaker of Pennsylvania, although the relationship has been doubted (Comeovers, p.191). Elizabeth came with her son Benjamin to New England in the Griffin in 1634 (Topo Dict, p.109). An earlier authority saying she came in the Francis (Otis, v.2, p.67) is apparently in error. The Rev. John Lothrop (see note 903) also came in the Griffin, and after four years in Boston and Watertown Elizabeth and her son Benjamin moved to Scituate and she joined his church. She d. Boston 1639/40. Benjamin rem to Sandwich. (SE Mass, pp. 1175-6; Comeovers, pp.191ff); NEH&GR, v.30, pp.28ff).

881. Mary Vincent was dau JOHN VINCENT (1762). As Mary was b. Eng 1633 (SE Mass, pp.1175-6; NEH&GR, v.30, pp.28ff), and as John had land granted to him in Sandwich in 1636/7 (Pope, p.471), both of them must have come from England c. 1633-6 since there is no indication that John's wife ever came to America. Savage says John was originally of Lynn (GDNE, v.4, p.373). He represented Sandwich in the first representative Legislative Assembly of Plymouth Colony 4 Jun 1639 (NEH&GR, v.3, p.341).

882. Two authorities state that Arthur Hathaway (882), the father of Mary (441), was the son of another Arthur who came from Wales to Plymouth in 1630 and who is said to have remained in Plymouth (NEH&GR, v.32,pp.92,236; the Leonard Papers in New Bedford Free Public Library---see SE Mass,p.800). Most authorities consider Arthur (882) as the immigrant. (Davis, p.130; An Heads; GDNE,v.2,p.376; Pope, p.219; SE Mass, pp.782,1502; Comeovers, p.131) Pope confuses the matter further by indicating that Arthur who married Sarah Cooke was a different person from Arthur, the father of Mary Hammond (Pope, p.219). However, it seems generally accepted that Arthur, of Marshfield 1643, possibly of Plymouth 1646, and later of Dartmouth, married Sarah Cooke and was the father of Mary Hammond (SE Mass, pp.782,800,1309-10,1502; GDNE,v.2,p.376; v.3,p.630; MD, v.16,p.110; Comeovers, p.131). Arthur was among those able to bear arms in Marshfield 1643, and was one of the first settlers of Dartmouth c. 1655. He was many times selectman bet 1664-84. (SE Mass, pp.782,800, 1309-10)

883. Sarah Cooke's parents were JOHN COOKE (1766), a Baptist minister, b. Holland c. 1612, d. Dartmouth 23 Nov 1695, and SARAH WARREN (1767), b. Eng, d. aft 15 Jul 1676, who m. 28 Mar 1634. John Cooke was s. FRANCIS COOKE (3532), a wool comber, b. bef 1582, d. Plymouth 7 Apr 1663, and ESTHER MAHIEW (MATT-HEWS?) (3533), d. aft 1659, who m. Leyden, Holland, c. Jun 1603. Esther was dau of Jenny Mahiew and came from Canterbury, Eng.

John Cooke and his father, Francis, came 1620 in the Mayflower, and John was the last male survivor of her passengers. He was a founder of Dartmouth. Esther came 1623 in the Anne. She was a Walloon.

Sarah Warren was dau RICHARD WARREN (3534), b. Eng 1575, d. Plymouth 1628, and ELIZABETH MARCH (3535), b. Eng c. 1583, d. Plymouth 2 Oct 1673, who m. Eng bef 1611. Elizabeth was the wid of Juat Pratt. Richard Warren came 1620 in the Mayflower. Elizabeth came 1623 in the Anne, bringing Sarah with her.

(GDNE,v.1,pp.445-7; v.4,p.427; Bradford, p.532; Mayflower, pp.31,180; Pope, p.480; Hills,v.1,pp.85-6,156-8; v.2,pp.150-1)

884. William Randall was first at Providence, R.I., but rem to Marshfield 1637 and to Scituate 1640. (Randall, p.3)

885. Elizabeth Barstow was dau Matthew who was b. Yorks, Eng. bef 1580 and d. Eng. She was sis William (838). She m. (2) John Prince. (Randall,p.295)

886. William Parker m. (2) 13 Nov 1651 Mary Turner (d.aft 1684), dau Humphrey, who arrived in Plymouth 1628. He settled in Scituate as a tanner. (Randall, p.298)

887. Mary Rawlins was dau THOMAS RAWLINS (1774) and MARY (1775). Thomas was b. Eng c. 1600, d. Boston 15 Mar 1660. Mary d. here 1643. Thomas was freeman of Roxbury 1631 but was in Scituate 1638, where he was Deputy 1642-3. He moved to Boston where he m. (2) 2 May 1656 Sarah, wid Thomas Mattocks of Roxbury. (Randall, p.301)

888. See note 222. Thomas Lombard with his brother Bernard and their wives came to Dorchester in the Mary and John 1630, but rem to Barnstable 1639, where he was an inn keeper. (Pope, p.295; GDNE,v.3,p.106; Early Lom, pp.8-11) The family genealogy says Joyce was a second wife (Lumbert, p.3) although this does not appear elsewhere.

892. Francis Small was s. EDWARD SMALL (1784), one of the founders of Kittery, Me. (Small, v.1, p.41) Edward prob came to New England c. 1634-5, bringing Francis with him. Edward was in Maine 1640. Francis is recorded in Dover, N.H., 1648. In 1657 Francis was a fisherman of Casco Bay, Maine, but he was pre-eminently a trader with the Indians. After 1673 he rem to Plymouth Colony. Edward's wife, Elizabeth, apparently never came to this country, for she was bur Bideford, Devon, 10 Feb 1665. They had m. there bef 1634. As Edward drops out of New England records aft 1653 the belief is that he returned to England. (Small, v.1, pp.3, 20, 41-4, 48, 110) If so, it may well be that Elizabeth did come to New England with him and, aft 1653, returned with him to England and died there 1665.

894. John Woodman was perhaps at Ipswich 1648, but after marrying in Newbury in 1656 moved to Dover, N.H., 1657. He became freeman 1666, Representative 1684, Delegate to the Convention 1690, and was a judge and a captain. He was s. EDWARD WOODMAN (1788) who came in the James 1635 bringing John with him. Edward was freeman 1636, Representative 1636-7 and several years later. He had a wife JOANNA (1789), mentioned 9 Nov 1653, perhaps by then his wid as the date of his death is not known. (Small, v.1, p.111; GDNE, v.4, pp.640-1)

895. Mary Field was dau DARBY FIELD (1790), b. Boston, Lincs, c. 1610, d. 1649. The name of Mrs. FIELD (1791) is not known. He came to Boston 1636, rem to Exeter, N.H., 1638, and to Dover, N.H., 1648. In 1642 he ascended the White Mountains accompanied by two Indians, the first European to do so. It took him 18 days. He was s. John Field Jr., b. London 1579, who m. Boston, Eng., 13 Aug 1609 Elen Hockison or Hutchinson. The ancestry traces back to Roger del Field who was b. Sowerby, Eng., c. 1240, who in turn was descended from Sir Hubertus De la Field who went to England with William the Conqueror in 1066 from near Colmar in Alsace. (Field, v.1, pp.10, 66-70; v.2, pp.949-961; GDNE, v.2, p.156)

896. Joseph and Elizabeth Howes had: Samuel (912); Joseph, m. 28 Nov 1689 Mary Vincent; John (460); Nathaniel, d. 26 Jul 1745, m. 22 Feb 1704/5 Esther Ryder; Thomas, m. Rebecca Howes; Amos (448); Mary, m. 16 Feb 1681 John Hallett; Elizabeth; Hannah, m. 15 Dec 1698 William Matthews. (Howes, p.10)

Joseph was s. THOMAS HOWES (1792, 1840, 3648), b. Eng 1590, d. 1665, and his wife MARY BURR (1793, 1841, 3649), d. Yarmouth 9 Dec 1695. Thomas and Mary Howes had: Joseph (896); Thomas, b. Eng., d. 20 Nov 1676, m. 1656 Sarah Bangs; Jeremiah, b. on passage over, d. 5 Jan 1705/6, m. Sarah Prince. (Howes, p.10) Thomas and Mary Howes came c. 1637 and after a brief residence at either Salem or Lynn they settled at Yarmouth. Despite the short time Thomas was in Essex County the Essex court records list six judgments against him for trespass. Yet on his removal to Yarmouth he, together with John Crowe (1972, 3632) and Anthony Thacher, were the grantees of land for the town, as appears in the court records of 7 Jan 1638/9. Thomas Howes was Deputy to the General Court for six years beginning in 1652. He was a captain 1674. He is described in one account as belonging to the "substantial middling class;" another account says "he was a man physically strong and robust, of good moral character, possessed of a fair education, and was largely endowed with good common sense." (Thomas Howes, pp.1ff, 32; Howes, p.7; Plym Lists)

Thomas was s. Thomas and grandson of Robert Howse who d. 1618. Thomas Sr., after his marriage, rem from Besthorpe to Morningthorpe, or Thorpe Hall manor, the estate of his father-in-law John Roope in Norwich, Norf. Morningthorpe was settled in 1186 by Henry, s. Jocelyn, who had it of the Vauxes,

by the Abbot of Bury. In 1198 it was settled on Wido, who assumed the surname of Thorpe. It was sold about 1412 to Gurness of Boyland Hall, in whose possession it remained until it came into the Roope family, prob by marriage. It was still in the possession of the Howes family in 1892. (Howes, pp.4-6)

The first of the Howes family of whom there is mention is John de Huse, who received a grant of land in 1066. It is said there is an unbroken line from him to John Howys who, in 1457, settled in the family seat "Besthorpe" in Norfolk. There was unbroken succession of Besthorpe from John to Robert, the grandfather of Thomas (1792,1840,3648), detailed in Howes. A coat-of-arms was granted to the family in 1519 in the reign of Henry VIII. (Howes, pp.3,5) Robert, on marrying his wife Ann, removed to her town, Caralton Rode. (Howes, pp.3-5)

However, the author of Thomas Howes of Yarmouth, Mass., says there is no proof that Thomas Howes (1792,1840,3648) married Mary Burr, or that he was the son of Thomas who was the son of Robert. Nevertheless, the ancestry as given by Howes is reproduced above as it was presumably based on some research by the author of that work.

Mary, the wid of Thomas Howes, became the fourth wife of Gov. Thomas Prence (1598) of Plymouth Colony. (Thomas Howes, p.1) See note 799. For other references to Joseph Howes see number 920 and note 912.

897. Elizabeth Mayo was dau JOHN MAYO (1794,1842,3650), d. Yarmouth May 1676, and his wife TAMOSIN (1795,1843,3651), d. Yarmouth 26 Feb 1682/3. Rev. John Mayo came to New England c. 1638, settling the following year at Barnstable, where he was ordained teaching elder. He was made freeman 1640. In 1646 he moved to Eastham and later took charge of the church there. In 1655 he took over the Second (North) Church in Boston. In 1673 he returned to Barnstable to be with his children. (Bos Eas Mass, p.756)

See also number 921 and note 912.

898. Elisha Hedge was of Yarmouth (GDNE,v.2,p.400). He was s. WILLIAM HEDGE (1796,3602,3690), d. 1670. William was first of Lynn, where he became freeman 1634. He rem to Sandwich, thence to Yarmouth, where he was living in 1643. He was a soldier in the Pequot War, captain in 1659, and a member of the Council of War. (GDNE, v.2,p.400; Plym Lists; Swift,p.63) His second wife, Blanch, was the wid Tristram Hull (978) who d.c. 1667, so she was not the mother of Elisha (898) who was b. 1661 nor of Sarah (1801) who must have been born still earlier. (Otis, v.1,p.407) As to Blanch see note 979. The mother of Elisha and of Sarah has not been identified. See also notes 900 and 922.

900. Thomas Matthews was s. JAMES MATTHEWS (1800,1844), d. 29 Jul 1685, and his wife Sarah Hedge (1801,1845), dau WILLIAM HEDGE (1796,3602,3690). See notes 898 and 922. (GDNE,v.3,pp.176,652; v.2,p.400; NEH&GR, v.7,p.235)

James Matthews was of Charlestown 1634. He rem, prob bef 1639, to Yarmouth. He was Representative in 1664 and was selectman and constable several years. (GDNE,v.3,p.176; Swift,p.62)

902. Thomas Sturgis was of Yarmouth. He was s. EDWARD STURGIS (1804, 1942,1950) and his wife ELIZABETH HINCKLEY (1805,1943,1951). (Sturgis,pp. 16,26) See notes 971, 973 and 975.

903. Abigail Lothrop was dau Barnabus Lothrop (1806), bp Scituate 6 Jun 1636, d. 26 Oct 1715, and his wife Susanna Clark (1807), b. Plymouth 1641, d. 28 Sep 1697, who m. 1 Dec 1658. Barnabus was the first Probate Judge for Barnstable, Deputy 1675-82, Judge of Common Pleas 1692, and in 1692 was counsellor to represent New Plymouth at Boston, together with Gov. Hinckley, Gov. Bradford and John Walley. He m. (2) wid Abigail Dodson, b.c. 1643, d. Boston 21 Dec. 1715.

Barnabus was s. Rev. JOHN LOTHROP (3612), bp Etton, Yorks, 20 Dec 1584, d. Barnstable 8 Nov 1653, and his wife ANNE (3613), d. 25 Feb 1687/8, who m. bet Jan-Jun 1635 at Scituate. She is said to have been a widow, dau William Hammond of Watertown. (Otis, v.2, p.162; NEH&GR, v.56, p.184; NYG&BR, v.48, p.305) However, these authorities apparently all stem from Otis who gives the date of the marriage as 16 Feb 1636/7. But entries by Rev. John Lothrop himself show he had a wife by 14 Jun 1635, although he appears to have been single at the time his Scituate church was organized 8 Jan 1634/5 (NEH&GR, v.9, p.279). Furthermore, the date of death of Mrs. Lothrop, whose name definitely was Anne, is given by Otis as 25 Feb 1687/8, while Anne Hammond is said to have died 1 Sep 1685 (Bos Eas Mass, p.189). William Hammond and his wife Elizabeth Paine, dau William, had a dau Anne bp Lavenham, Suff., 14 Jul 1616 (NEH&GR, v.56, p.184; Bos Eas Mass, p.189), and John Lothrop refers to Elizabeth Hammond, another daughter of William, as "my sister". Were it not for the inconsistencies just mentioned it would look as though John Lothrop had married Anne Hammond. However, this reference may be explained by the fact that Elizabeth Hammond married Samuel House, thought to be a brother of Lothrop's first wife---see below (Goodwin, v.1, pp.273ff; NEH&GR, v.56, p.184; v.69, p.284). William Hammond was bp Lavenham 30 Oct 1575, s. Thomas and Rose (Tripp) Hammond. He m. Lavenham 9 Jun 1605 Elizabeth Paine, b. Edmunds, Suff., 1578. She and her children came 1634 in the Francis, but William is thought to have come earlier. He settled in Watertown in 1636. William d. Watertown 8 Oct 1662, Elizabeth d. 14 Sep 1670 (Bos Eas Mass, p.188).

Rev. John Lothrop (3612) received his B.A. from Queen's College, Cambridge, 1605, and an M.A. 1609. He was curate at Egerton, Kent, 1611-23, but then became a non-conformist preacher in London, for which he was imprisoned from 1632 to 1634. Upon his release on bond he sailed for America, arriving on the Griffin and proceeding to Scituate where he started a church. He rem to Barnstable and started a church there in 1639, remaining there until he died. He had m. (1) Canterbury c. Oct 1616 Hannah House who d.c. 1633. John's parents were Thomas Lowthroppe, b. Cherry Burton, Yorks, E.R., d. Etton, Yorks, E.R., 1606, and his second wife Mary, bur Etton 6 Jan 1588. Thomas was s. Robert, d. 1558, and Mary, d. 1572. Robert was s. John Lowthroppe of Lowthorpe, Dickering, Yorks, E.R. (Lothrop, pp.15-18, 23-33, 41, 50; GDNE, v.3, p.120; Sturgis, p.16)

Susanna Clark (1807), wife of Barnabus Lothrop (1806), was dau THOMAS CLARK (3614), b. Eng c. 1599-1605, d. Plymouth 24 Mar 1697, and his wife SUSAN RING (3615), d. bef 1664, who m. bef 19 Jul 1631. Although some early accounts say Thomas was first mate of the Mayflower (Clark, pp.9-11; Lothrop, p.41) that officer was John Clark (Mayflower, p.129; Eng Anc, p.140). Thomas was deacon of the Plymouth Church 1654-97. Bet 1655-60 he rem to Boston and there m. (2) 1664 Mrs. Alice Nichols, dau Richard Hallett. Later he rem to Harwich. (Clark, pp.9-11; Hills, p.150) Savage says he m. (3) Elizabeth Crow (GDNE, v.1, p.400)

Susan Ring (3615) was dau of wid MARY RING (7231), d. Plymouth 15 or 19 Jul 1631. Mary Ring, possibly wid of William of Eng., came in 1629 with three children including Susan. (Hills, p.147)

904. Paul Sears was of Yarmouth (GDNE,v.4,p.46). He was s. RICHARD SEARS (1808,3636,3658), bur Yarmouth 26 Aug 1676, and his wife DOROTHY JONES (1809,3637,3659), bur Yarmouth 19 Mar 1678/9. They m. 1632. Richard, who was known to have been a man "of education and social standing" in England, was among the last of the Leyden congregation to emigrate to New England. (Swift,p.75) He settled at Yarmouth. Family tradition says he came in 1630 to Plymouth, and the fact is that he was taxed there in 1633. On 1 Jan 1637/8 he was assessed as an inhabitant of Marblehead, and on 26 Nov 1638 he was formally granted land in Marblehead which he had previously planted. (GDNE,v.4, pp.46,704; Thomas Howes,pp.1ff; Salem,pp.63,74; Roads,p.13)

The Sears family is said to date from 1066. One genealogy says that Richard was the son of John Bouchier Sayer and Marie L. van Egmond, who were married in Amsterdam in 1585, and that Richard married Dorothy Thatcher. Another says his parentage is unknown, and that his wife may have been Dorothy Batts; a note in ink in the margin of the cited work says she may have been named Jones. William P. Davis, long-time clerk of Yarmouth, says she was Dorothy Jones. (Hellerman, p.2)

See notes 909 and 914.

905. Deborah Willard was dau GEORGE WILLARD (1810,3638), bp Horsmonden, Kent, Dec 1614. George was of Scituate 1638. He was heavily fined in 1641 for erroneous opinions. His son Daniel and dau Deborah were both bp the same day in 1645. Shortly thereafter George moved away, perhaps to Maryland. (GDNE, v.4,p.553)

George was s. Richard Willard (3620,3866,7276) and his wife Joane Morebread (3621,7277), d. Eng 25 Feb 1617. Richard and Joane m. 17 Jan 1610. Richard had m. (1) Margery (3867), who d. 12 Dec 1608, and who was the mother of Margery Willard (Davis) (1933), mother of John Davis (966). Richard Willard was of Horsmonden, Kent. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1733) Richard was s. Richard Willard, a yeoman at Brencley, Eng., who d.c. Oct 1558. (Bos Eas Mass,p.1733)

See notes 909 and 966.

906. Samuel Freeman was captain in charge of the militia of Eastham. Later he was a deacon. He was six years a selectman and nineteen years a Representative. Pratt says he was "a man of large property, for the times; always much engaged in public affairs, and a liberal supporter of education and religion." (Bos Eas Mass,p.848)

Samuel Freeman was s. Samuel Freeman (1812), b. Watertown 11 May 1638, d. 25 Nov 1712, and his wife Mercy Southworth (1813), b. 1638, d. 25 Nov 1712, who m. 12 May 1658. In 1676 Samuel (1812) became deacon of the church in Eastham, where he was an influential man and "possessed of goodly fortune". After his father's death his mother m. again (see below) and the family rem to Eastham from Watertown. (Bos Eas Mass, p.848; GDNE,v.2,p.204)

Samuel Freeman (1812) was s. SAMUEL FREEMAN (3624), d. Eng c. 1639, and his wife APPHIA QUICKE (3625), d. bef 1667. Samuel (3624) came with Winthrop in 1630 from Devon, and settled at Watertown. He was one of its original proprietors and tradition says he owned one-seventh of it. He became freeman 22 May 1639. He died at his former home in England while there on business. (Bos Eas Mass, p.848; GDNE,v.2,p.204) Apphia Quicke, after the death of her husband, m. (2) Governor Thomas Prentice (1598) of the Plymouth Colony (Hills,p.47). See also note 799.

Mercy Southworth (1813), the wife of Samuel Freeman (1812), was dau CONSTANT SOUTHWORTH (3626), b. Leyden, Holland, 1615, d. Duxbury 11 Mar 1678/9, and his wife ELIZABETH COLLIER (3627), who m. Duxbury 2 Nov 1637. Constant did not come with his mother in 1623 (see below); it was prob in 1628 that

he came to Plymouth. He was made freeman 1637, and resided thereafter in Duxbury. A real estate broker for Duxbury, Tiverton, and Little Compton, he was Representative for Duxbury in 1647 and 22 years following. He was Treasurer of the Colony several years. From 1669 to 1679 he was Assistant, and he was once Commissioner for the United Colonies. He volunteered for service against the Pequots. (Bos Eas Mass, p.848; GDNE, v.4, p.143; Hills, p.100)

Constant Southworth was s. Edward Southworth (7252), b.c. 1590, d. Eng 1623, and his wife ALICE CARPENTER (7253), b. 1590, d. Plymouth 26 Mar 1670, who m. Leyden, Holland, 28 May 1613. Edward was a silk worker of Leyden. (Hills, p.99) Alice Carpenter was of Wrentham, Eng. She was in love with William Bradford, the Governor of the Plymouth Colony; but her family objected on the ground of his inferior rank and fortune. She m. Edward Southworth, but after his death came to America in the Ann in 1623 and m. Bradford 14 Aug 1623. (Hellerman, p.3; GDNE, v.4, pp.143, 707; Hills, p.99) Alice was sis Juliana Carpenter (1671) and dau Alexander Carpenter (3342, 14506). See note 835. Bradford had m. (1) Amsterdam, Holland, 10 Dec 1613 Dorothy ____, who drowned in Cape Cod Harbor 7 Dec 1620. (Shaw, pp.42ff)

The parents of Edward Southworth were Thomas Southworth, b.c. 1548, d. 30 Nov 1616, and Rosamond Lister, dau William, who m. bet 1563-71. Thomas was s. Sir John Southworth, b. 1526, d. 3 Nov 1595, and Mary (Ashton) Goulard, who m. 23 Jul 1547. During the reign of Queen Elizabeth Sir John was in trouble because of his "Romanism" and questionable loyalty to the Queen. His son, Sir Thomas, had become a protestant. In 1584 Sir Francis Walsingham, hearing Sir John was going to disinherit Thomas, placed him under detention. He spent several years in Fleet Prison until released in 1594. He died "broken in spirit and health", but his will states he was "Weake in Bodie but of perfect remembrance". (Hills, p.98) Sir John was a member of Parliament 1566, and High Sheriff of Lancashire. (Weiss, line 9)

Sir John's parents were Sir Thomas, also High Sheriff of Lancashire, b. 1497, d. 13 Jan 1546, and Margery Boteler, who m. 9 Aug 1518. Sir Thomas was s. Sir John de Southworth, Lord of Salsbury, Sheriff of Lancashire, b. 1478, d.c. 1517-19, and Helen de Langton, dau Sir Richard and Isabel (Gerard) de Langton. (Weiss, line 9) Sir John de Southworth was s. Christopher, b. c. 1443, d. 1487, and his wife Isabel Dutton. The ancestry of Christopher traces back through four more generations to Gilbert de Southworth who would be number 3,713,024 in the Twenty-First Generation in the system used in this Ancestry. Sir Gilbert had the Manor of Southworth in South Lancashire, in the parish of Wirwick, confirmed to him at Westminster on 20 Jan 1326. It was called Salmesbury Hall. The family name seems to originate from the Manor. (Hills, p.98)

Isabel Dutton, the wife of Christopher Southworth, was in direct line of descent from the Plantagenet Kings of England. Edward I, King of England 1272-1307, and his wife Eleanor of Castile, besides having Edward II, King of England 1307-1327, had a daughter, Joan Plantagenet, who m. Sir Gilbert de Clare, Earl of Hertford and Gloucester. Their daughter Margaret m. (2) Windsor 28 Apr 1317 Hugh de Audley, 8th Earl of Gloucester, Ambassador to France. They had a daughter Margaret who m. Sir Ralph de Stafford and had Beatrice, who m. Thomas de Ros, Member of Parliament 1362-1384. Their son Sir William de Ros was Treasurer of England 1403-4. He m. Margaret Fitz Alan de Arundel. Their daughter Margaret m. James Tuchet, Member of Parliament 1421-1455. Their daughter Anne m. Sir Thomas Dutton and they were the parents of Isabel Dutton who m. Sir Christopher de Southworth, Lord of Salsbury. (Weiss, line 9)

NOTE: Underlining shows the line of descent of Isabel (Dutton) Southworth from King Edward I.

The direct ancestry of Edward I is traced back through a line of English Kings to Henry I, King of England 1100-1135, and his wife Matilda. Matilda's mother (St. Margaret of Scotland) traces directly back through earlier English Kings to Alfred the Great, to his grandfather Egbert, the first King of All England (827-836), and to the Saxon kings starting with Cerdic who assumed the title of King in 519. Matilda's father was Malcolm III Canmore, King of Scots 1058-1093. His father was Duncan, King of Scots, who was slain by Macbeth near Elgin 14 Aug 1040. From Duncan the direct ancestry traces through Scottish Kings to Fergus the Great who crossed from Ireland in 496 to become first King of the Dalriad Scots, and to Eugenius, King of Ireland.

Through Eleanor of Castile, wife of Edward I, the direct ancestry goes back through Kings of Castile and Leon and Dukes of Burgundy to Robert II, the Pious, King of France 988-1031, and his father, Hugh Capet, the first of the Capetian Kings of France who ruled France for hundreds of years. Back of him the line goes through Kings of Italy to Charlemagne, King of France 768-814, crowned Holy Roman Emperor 28 Dec 800. Still further back the line is traced to Clovis the Riparian, Frankish King of Cologne c. 420, and in another branch to Ansbertus, the Gallo-Roman Senator, and through him to Afranius Syagrius, Gallo-Roman Consul in 381. Another branch traces to Robert de Mortain, Earl of Cornwall, half brother of William the Conqueror, and a companion of his at the Battle of Hastings in 1066. Still another branch leads to Henry I, the Fowler, Emperor of Germany 919-936.

Edward I's mother, wife of Henry III, was Eleanor of Provence and in her ancestry are found Kings of Aragon and Counts of Barcelona and of Provence. Edward I's grandmother, Isabella of Angoulême, wife of King John, descended from Louis VI, the Fat, King of France 1108-1137, who was a Crusader. His mother was Bertha, dau Florent I, Count of Holland, while his grandmother was Anne of Russia, dau of Jaroslaus I, Grand Duke of Kiev, and Ingegard, dau Olaf III, King of Sweden.

Full details of the foregoing royal lines will be found in Weiss.

Constant Southworth (3626) was also collaterally related to other English Kings. Edward II, son of Edward I, was King of England 1307-27, and his son, Edward III, was King of England 1327-77. Edward III married Philippa of Hainaut. Their son, John of Gaunt, the Duke of Lancaster, by his wife Blanche of Lancaster, had Henry IV, the first of the English Kings of the House of Lancaster. After Henry IV and his son and grandson, Henry V and Henry VI, the House of Lancaster was succeeded by the House of York---Edward IV, Edward V and Richard III. Edward IV and Richard III were the sons, and Edward V the grandson, of the Duke of York and his wife Cicely Nevill. She was dau Ralph Nevill, the First Earl of Westmoreland, and Joan Beaufort, dau John of Gaunt. The York line, in turn, was succeeded by the Tudors, Henry VII, his son Henry VIII, and children of Henry VIII---Edward VI, Mary and Elizabeth. Henry VII was the great-grandson of John Beaufort, who was the son of John of Gaunt.

Henry VII m. Elizabeth, dau Edward IV. Their dau m. King James IV of Scotland. Their son was King James V of Scotland, his dau was Mary Queen of Scots, and her son was James I, who became King of England upon the death of Queen Elizabeth, dau of King Henry VIII. James I was succeeded by his son Charles I and he, in turn, after the Commonwealth of the two Cromwells, by his sons, Charles II and James II. Then came William III (grandson of Charles I) and Mary II (dau of James II), followed by Anne, another dau of James II. She was succeeded by the House of Hanover beginning with George I, great-grandson of James I, and ending with Queen Victoria, all in direct line. Queen Victoria was the great-great-grandmother of Queen Elizabeth II and also of Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh.

Elizabeth Collier (3627), the wife of Constant Southworth, was dau WILLIAM COLLIER (7254), d. 1670. William, a merchant of London, came to Duxbury in 1633. Although it is doubtful that he had his wife here, he did bring four daughters with him, including Elizabeth (3627). Another dau whom he brought was Mary who m. 1 Apr 1635 Thomas Prence (1598) who became Governor of Plymouth Colony. See note 799. William Collier was an Assistant from 1634 to 1665 except for four years, and one of the two plenipotentiaries at the first meeting of the Congress of the United Colonies in 1643. He was among the first purchasers of Dartmouth in 1652. (GDNE, v.1, p.433; Plym Lists)

907. Elizabeth Sparrow was dau JONATHAN SPARROW (1814), d. Eastham 21 Mar 1706/7, and his wife Rebecca Bangs (1815), b. Plymouth c. 1636, d. bef 19 Oct 1677, who m. Eastham 28 Oct 1654. Jonathan came with his father to Plymouth in 1632. Later he was of Eastham. He served as lieutenant in King Philip's War for which his heirs in 1723 received a share in a township in Gorham, Me. Before 6 Jun 1677 he became captain in command of a horse troop. Between 1668 and 1686 he served as Deputy to the Old Colony Court at Plymouth nineteen times, and between 1689 and 1702 was Representative to the General Court of Massachusetts at least eight times. He served Eastham as selectman ten times between 1671 and 1686. In 1681, 1685 and 1689 he was a member of the Council of War. He served as associate judge or magistrate 1690 and 1691. (GDNE, v.4, p.145; Hills, p.63; Americana, v.27, p.359)

Jonathan Sparrow was s. RICHARD SPARROW (3628), d. 8 Jan 1660/1, and his wife PANDORA (3629). Richard was of Plymouth 1632. He moved to Eastham 1653, and was Representative 1655-6. (GDNE, v.4, p.145)

Rebecca Bangs (1815), wife of Jonathan Sparrow (1814), was dau EDWARD BANGS (3630), bp Panfield, Essex, 28 Oct 1591, d. Eastham 1678, and his wife LYDIA HICKS (3631), b. Eng, who m. c. 1612. Edward and Lydia came in the Anne to Plymouth in 1623. He was made freeman 1633, was assessor for taxes 1634-6 and held other offices in the Plymouth Colony before moving to Eastham in 1645. He was Deputy to the General Court in 1647, 50, 63, and 64, town treasurer 1646-65, selectman 1665 and afterwards. He was a shipwright, and tradition has it that he directed the labor on the first vessel built in the Colony in 1641. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1076; GDNE, v.1, p.111) He is believed to have been s. John Bangs of Hempstead, Essex, who d. c. 1631, and his wife Jane Chavis, who m. 30 Jan 1586/7. (Americana, v.27, p.125; Eng Anc, p.138)

Lydia Hicks was dau ROBERT HICKS (1574, 1750, 7262) and his wife MARGARET WINSLOW (1575, 1751, 7263). See note 787 and number 875.

908. John Crowell was s. John Crowe (1816), b. Charlestown c. 1639, d. Yarmouth 28 Jan 1688/9, and his wife Mehitable Miller (1817), b. Roxbury 13 Jul 1638, d. 23 Feb 1714/5. John was s. JOHN CROWE (1972, 3632), b. Eng, d. 14 Jan 1672/3, and his wife ELISHUA (1973, 3633), b. Eng, d. 1688. John (1972, 3632), according to one account was of "the substantial middling class" He was of Charlestown 1635. His wife Elishua had come in 1634 and joined the church on 4 Jan 1634/5. In 1638 he rem to Yarmouth where, with Thomas Howes (1792, 1840, 3648) (see note 896) and Anthony Thacher (or Tucker), he received the grant of land of the town. He was made freeman in 1640 and was Representative 1641-3. On his gravestone the name is spelled "Cro". (GDNE, v.1, p.479; Thomas Howes; Hellerman) See note 986.

Mehitable Miller (1817), wife of John Crowe (1816), was dau JOHN MILLER (3634), b. Eng, d. Groton 12 Jun 1663, and his wife LYDIA (3635), b. Eng, d. Boston 7 Aug 1658. John Miller received his A.B. degree from Gonville and Caius College, Cambridge, Eng., in 1627. He is said to have been of Dorchester 1636. In 1637 he had a share of the lands that are now South

Boston. With his wife Lydia he belonged to the Roxbury Church of Rev. John Eliot, of which he was an elder. In 1639 he was minister at Rowley and the first town clerk. Soon after 1642 he went to the Yarmouth Church. (GDNE, v.3,p.209)

909. Bethia Sears was dau Paul Sears (904,1818) and his wife Deborah Willard (905,1819). See notes 904, 905 and 914.

910. Samuel Eldredge was s. WILLIAM ELDRED (1820,1852) and his wife Anne Lumpkin (1821,1853), bur 1 Nov 1676, who m. bef 1656. Anne was dau of WILLIAM LUMPKIN (3642,3706), d. 1671, and his wife THOMASINE (3643,3707), d. aft 1668. William Lumpkin was of Yarmouth and was Deputy to the General Court. (Eldredge, p.5)

911. Keziah Taylor was dau RICHARD TAYLOR (1822,1854), d. 1 Aug 1703, and his wife Ruth Burgess (1823,1855), d. 22 (9?) Jun 1693, who m. 1646. There were two Richard Taylors in Yarmouth. Richard (1822,1854) was called "Rock Richard" because he built his house against a rock; Richard (1922,1926) was called "Tailor Richard" because of his trade. While in the past there has been some confusion as to which Richard married Ruth Burgess and which married Ruth Wheldon, there seems no reason to doubt the court evidence cited in note 961, which confirms local tradition that "Tailor Richard" married Ruth Wheldon. "Rock Richard" was constable in 1656 and 1668; surveyor of highways in 1657; excise officer in 1664. (Hellerman, p.2; GDNE, v.4,p.263; Swift, p.62; Taylor, pp.7-8)

Ruth Burgess (1823,1855) was dau THOMAS BURGESS (3646,3710), b.c. 1603, d. 27 Feb 1685. Thomas was of Duxbury in 1637, but in 1638 he moved to Sandwich. He was Representative in 1646 and some years after. One account shows him (under the spelling "Burge") to have been originally in Lynn. (GDNE, v.1,pp.302-3)

912. Samuel Howes was s. JOSEPH HOWES (896,920,1824) and his wife ELIZABETH MAYO (897,921,1825). See numbers 896 and 897 and corresponding notes. See also numbers 920 and 921.

914. Zachariah Paddock was s. Zachariah Paddock (1828), b. Plymouth 20 Mar 1636/7, d. Yarmouth 1 May 1727, and his wife Deborah Sears (1829), b. Yarmouth Sep 1639, d. 17 Aug 1732, who m. 1659. Zachariah (1828) was originally of Barnstable but after his marriage lived at Yarmouth. (GDNE, v.3, p.328) Zachariah (1828) was s. ROBERT PADDOCK (3656), d. 25 Jul 1650, and his wife MARY (3657). Robert was at Plymouth in 1643 and prob for some years before. (GDNE, v.3,p.328)

Deborah Sears (1829) was dau RICHARD SEARS (1808,3636,3658) and his wife DOROTHY JONES (1809,3637,3659). See notes 904 and 909.

920. For ancestry of Joseph Howes see note 896. See also note 912.

921. For ancestry of Elizabeth Mayo see note 897. See also note 912.

922. James Matthews was s. JAMES MATTHEWS (1800,1844) and his wife Sarah Hedge (1801,1845). See notes 900 and 898.

924. Elisha Hall was of Yarmouth. He was s. JOHN HALL (1848), d. 1694, and his wife BETHIA (1849). John Hall came to America in 1630 and settled in Charlestown. It is thought he came from Coventry. He was number

19 on the list of members of the Boston Church and in 1632 he and his wife Bethia were among the founders of the Charlestown Church. He was made free-man 14 May 1634. (GDNE,v.2,p.333) He moved to Barnstable c. 1640, and by 1653 had moved again, this time to the part of Yarmouth that is now called Dennis. He owned a number of parcels of land on Cape Cod. He was constable in 1647, surveyor of highways in 1653. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1886)

926. For ancestry of Samuel Eldredge see note 910.

927. For ancestry of Keziah Taylor see note 911.

960. Joseph Bearse was prob in King Philip's War. Joseph and Martha Bearse had at Barnstable: Mary, b. 16 Aug 1677, d. 19 Jan 1760; Joseph, b. 21 Feb 1679, rem to Maine; Benjamin (480); Priscilla, b. 31 Dec 1683, d. 31 Mar 1684; Ebenezer, b. 20 Jan 1685, m. (1) 25 Nov 1708 Elizabeth Cobb, (2) 4 Sep 1712 Joanna Lambert; John, b. 8 May 1687, m. 15 Nov 1711 Elinor Lewis; Josiah, b. 10 Mar 1690, m. (1) 2 Nov 1716 Zeurich Newcomb, (2) Mary ____, rem to Greenwich, Conn.; James, b. 3 Oct 1692, m. 17 Mar 1719/20 Mary Fuller. (Otis, v.1,p.55)

Joseph Bearse (960) was s. AUSTIN (AUGUSTINE) BEARSE (1920), b. 1618, d. 1697. Austin sailed from Southampton in the Confidence 24 Apr 1638. He was with the first company that went to Barnstable in 1639, where on 29 Apr 1643 he was the first to join Mr. Lothrop's Church when Mr. Lothrop moved it to Barnstable (see note 903). Very observant of religious duties, Austin had all his children baptised the Sunday after birth and, in the case of Joseph (960), on the very day of birth, though the church was two miles away. He was surveyor of highways in 1674. He was a farmer. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1294)

Austin Bearse had children at Barnstable as follows: Mary, b. 1640; Martha, b. 1642; Priscilla, b. 10 Mar 1643/4, m. 1660 John Hall jr.; Sarah, b. 28 Mar 1646, m. Aug 1667 John Hamblin; Abigail, b. 18 Dec 1647, m. 12 Apr 1670 Allen Nichols; Hannah, b. 16 Nov 1649; Joseph (960); Hester, b. 2 Oct 1653; Lydia, b. 30 Sep 1655; Rebecca, b. Sep 1657, m. Feb 1670/1 William Hunter; and James, b. 31 Jul 1660, d. Plympton 1728, m. 1683 Experience _____. (Bos Eas Mass, p.1294; Otis,v.1,p.52)

961. Martha Taylor was dau RICHARD TAYLOR (1922,1926), d. 4-13 Dec 1673, and his wife RUTH WHELDON (1923,1927), d. Duxbury 4 Dec 1673, who m. c. 27 Oct 1646. Richard, a tailor, was called "Tailor Richard" to distinguish him from another Richard Taylor (1822,1854), also of Yarmouth. See note 911. A resident of Yarmouth by 1643, he had trouble in 1646 with Gabriel Wheldon, who objected to his marrying his dau Ruth; but the court took cognizance of the matter and Wheldon gave his consent. (GDNE,v.4,p.263; Swift, p.62; Taylor, p.1) See note 963.

Ruth Wheldon died by drowning in Duxbury. She was dau of GABRIEL WHELDON (3846,3854), d. Malden Jan 1653/4. Gabriel was of Plymouth. He was of Mattacheese (now called Barnstable) in 1638. He was surveyor of highways 1642 and 1647. (Hellerman, p.8; Swift, p.68)

Richard Taylor (1922,1926) came from England. He was surveyor of highways 1648, 1657; constable 1656, 1668; collector of taxes 1661. On 8 Mar 1670/1 he was fined 10 shillings for being in the company of John Sprague and others, "sitting tippling with them, and by his prence abeting them in their evill practices," in the course of which Sprague gamed, and also brought a mare into the parlor. (Taylor, pp.2-5)

962. Samuel Cobb was a farmer (Otis,v.1,p.173). He was s. HENRY COBB (1924), d. 1679, and his wife SARAH HINCKLEY (1925), who m. 12 Dec 1649. Henry was of Plymouth c. 1629. He and his wife were two of the thirteen original members of Lothrop's church at Scituate, Jan 1635 (see note 903), where he had rem in 1633. He prob came from Kent, but had been of Lothrop's church in London. He escaped being confined for two years in London prisons, a fate that happened to Lothrop himself and about 24 members of his congregation for holding unorthodox religious views. Lothrop came over in 1634 and started his church at Scituate. He soon removed it to Barnstable because of a doctrinal difficulty over baptism. Cobb became a deacon of the church, and for 44 years was either senior deacon or ruling elder. He was Representative in 1645 and for six more years. (GDNE,v.1,p.413; Otis,v.1,pp.166-8) Sarah Hinckley (1925) was sis of Susanna (401) and also of Thomas who was Governor of Plymouth Colony. She was dau SAMUEL HINCKLEY (802,3850), d, 31 Oct 1662, and his wife SARAH (803,3851), d. 18 Aug 1656. See note 802.

963. Elizabeth Taylor was dau RICHARD TAYLOR (1922,1926) and his wife RUTH WHELDON (1923,1927). See note 961.

964. David Linnell settled in Barnstable. He was s. ROBERT LINNELL (1928,1934), d. 27 Feb 1662/3, and his wife PENNINA HOWES (1929,1935), dau Samuel. Robert and his wife, who were dismissed from the church in London, came to Scituate and joined the church there on 16 Sep 1638. In 1639 they removed to Barnstable. He was called "Mr." indicating some wealth and standing. Possibly Pennina (elsewhere called Jemima) was a second wife. (GDNE, v.3,p.97; NEH&GR,v.69,p.284; Otis,v.2,p.150) See note 967.

965. Hannah Shelley grew up under the bad influence of her mother. She is said to have spoken "inconsiderately, loosely and lasciviously". In 1652 she and her husband were "cutt off from that relation which they hadd formerlye to the church", and also were tried, sentenced and publicly whipped. (Otis,v.2,p.157)

Hannah was dau ROBERT SHELLEY (1930) and his wife JUDITH GARNET (1931), b. Eng 1608, who m. Scituate 26 Sep 1636. Robert came to Boston in the Lion in 1632 but had removed to Barnstable by 1640. He joined Lothrop's church at Scituate 14 May 1637. (GDNE,v.4,p.71) His wife, Judith Garnet, came in the Francis in 1634 from Ipswich, Eng. In Sep 1634 she was admitted to the Boston Church as "our br. John Coggeshall's maid serv." She was "proud, tenacious of her own opinions, and had very little control over her tongue, which ran like a whip-saw, cutting everything it came in contact with." For venting her spite on members of the church and abusing Rev. Mr. Lothrop with her language she was excommunicated. (GDNE,v.2,p.233; Otis,v.2,p.156)

Robert was possibly a brother of Ann Shelley (779).

966. John Davis was s. DOLOR DAVIS (1932), b. Eng c. 1593, d. Barnstable Jun 1673, and his wife Margery Willard (1933), who were m. Eng c. 1618. Margery was dau Richard Willard (3620,3866,7276) and his wife Margery (3867). See note 905. Margery (1933) apparently did not come to America.

Dolor Davis (also known as Dollard, or Dollar) was of Cambridge 1634. He rem c. 1638 to Duxbury and then to Barnstable c. 1642, where he joined the church 27 Aug 1648. In 1655 he rem to Concord, and that year was an original proprietor and member of the first Board of Selectmen of Groton. In 1667 or 1668 he returned to Barnstable. He became freeman 1646. He was a carpenter and master builder. (GDNE,v.2,p.16; Otis,v.1,p.289)

967. Hannah Linnell was dau ROBERT LINNELL (1928,1934) and his wife PENNINA HOWES (1929,1935). See note 964.

970. Jabez Gorham was a brother of Temperance Gorham (973) and of Joseph Gorham (974). He was s. JOHN GORHAM (1940,1946,1948), bp Benefield, Nthan, 28 Jan 1620/1, d. Swansea 5 Feb 1675/6, and his wife Desire Howland (1941,1947,1949), b. Plymouth bef 22 Dec 1627, d. Barnstable 13 Oct 1683, who m. 1643. (Shaw, pp.106ff)

Captain John Gorham (1940,1946,1948) came with his father to New England and was in Plymouth in 1637. He is believed to have served apprenticeship as a tanner and currier of leather, having to rely on himself after his father's death in 1643, as he had no family and little means. In 1646 he rem to Marshfield and in 1652 to Yarmouth. On 5 Mar 1655 he was presented for "unseamly carriage toward Blanch Hull at unseasonable time being in the night." She was Blanch (979) the wife of Tristram Hull (978). See note 979. John was fined 40 shillings, she was fined 50 shillings. He was made freeman in 1650, and in 1673 and 1674 was selectman of Barnstable. He was a lieutenant of the Plymouth forces in the Dutch War of 1673. In 1675 he was captain of a horse troop from Yarmouth and was in several battles in King Philip's War. At Swamp Fort in the Narragansett country, where the Narragansett's power was crushed on 19 Dec 1675, he suffered seriously from exposure, from which he never recovered. He was taken with fever at Swansea and died there. (Bos Eas Mass, p.586; Otis, v.1, p.407) For a description of the Swamp Fort battle see Upham, v.1, pp.118-124.

John Gorham was s. RALPH GORHAM (3880,3892,3896), b. 1575, d.c. 1643. Ralph was of Benefield, Nthan, and came with his family to New England, being of Plymouth in 1637. (Bos Eas Mass, p.586) Ralph was s. James Gorham, b. 1550, d. 1576, and his wife Agnes Bernington, who m. in 1572, and who were also of Benefield. (Bos Eas Mass, p.586)

Desire Howland, the wife of John Gorham and the mother of Jabez (970), was dau JOHN HOWLAND (1566,3882,3894,3898) and his wife ELIZABETH TILLEY (1567,3883,3895,3899) who came in the Mayflower. See note 783.

971. Hannah Sturgis m. (1) c. 1670 John Gray of Yarmouth. He d. bef Mar 1673/4. (Sturgis, p.16) She m. (2) Jabez Gorham and they rem to Bristol, R.I. (MD, v.5, p.180; NEH&GR, v.52, p.358) They had children born in Bristol bet 1682-1701, but there is no record of the birth of Elizabeth (485). (VR) Elizabeth's relationship is established by the will of Jabez Gorham (MD, v.17, p.67) and the wills of Elizabeth and Shobael Baxter (MD, v.13, pp.247-8; and see Virkus, v.6, p.548).

Hannah Sturgis was dau EDWARD STURGIS (1804,1942,1950), bp Woodnesborough, Kent, 30 Jan 1613/14, d. Sandwich 1695, and his wife ELIZABETH HINCKLEY (1805,1943,1951), bp Harrietsham, Kent, 20 Sep 1617, d. 14 Feb 1691/2, who m. c. 1640. Edward m. (2) Apr 1692 Mary, wid Zachariah Rider. (Sturges Lin, pp.6-7; Sturgis Fam, p.1; Sturgis, p.14) Edward came to Charlestown but was one of the first settlers of Yarmouth, where he is found Apr 1639. He was freeman 1651. He represented Yarmouth in a dispute with the Indians in 1658.

One authority shows that the Edward who settled in Charlestown brought a wife Susan, and a child Edward, bp Eng 10 Apr 1624, and says that it was the younger Edward who married Elizabeth. (Sturgis Fam, p.1) Another says the wife of the immigrant Edward was Elizabeth and that the Edward b. Eng 1624 m. Temperance Gorham (see note 973). (Sturges Lin, pp.6-7) But a later work shows clearly that the immigrant Edward was b. 1613/14, that he m. here c. 1640 Elizabeth Hinckley, and that their son Edward (who m. Temperance Gorham)

was born here c. 1642. (Sturgis, pp.11ff) See for other children of Edward Sturgis and Elizabeth Hinckley notes 902 (Thomas), 973 (Edward) and 975 (Sarah).

Edward Sturgis (1804,1942,1950) was s. John Sturgis, "crystned" 27 Apr 1578, and his wife Margaret Austin, bur Eastry, Kent, 3 Apr 1622, who m. Tilmanstone, Kent, 28 Nov 1608. John was s. Edward Sturgis who was bur Sturry, Kent, 23 Jan 1624/5.

Elizabeth Hinckley (1805,1943,1951) was dau Thomas Hinckley (3610, 3886,3902), d. 1634, and his wife Anna (3611,3887,3903). Thomas was a bro of Samuel (802,3850). See note 802. Elizabeth came with her uncle Samuel from Harrietsham in 1635. (Sturgis, pp.3,10-11)

972. Thomas Baxter came from Scotland. He was a lieutenant. (Virkus, v.6,p.755)

973. Temperance Gorham m. (1) 1663 Edward Sturgis, s. Edward (1804, 1942,1950) and Elizabeth Hinckley (1805,1943,1951). See notes 902, 971 and 975. He was b.c. 1642, and was not as earlier writers have indicated the one b. Eng. 10 Apr 1624 who was also the son of an Edward. (Sturgis,p.14) He died 8 Dec 1678. (Sturgis,p.15) Temperance was dau JOHN GORHAM (1940,1946, 1948) and his wife Desire Howland (1941,1947,1949). See notes 970 and 783. She was sis Joseph Gorham (974) and of Jabez Gorham (970).

974. Joseph Gorham was a shoemaker and also an ensign. (Otis,v.1, p.415) He was s. JOHN GORHAM (1940,1946,1948) and his wife Desire Howland (1941,1947,1949). See notes 970 and 783. He was a bro of Temperance Gorham (973) and of Jabez Gorham (970).

975. Sarah Sturgis was dau EDWARD STURGIS (1804,1942,1950) and his wife ELIZABETH HINCKLEY (1805,1943,1951). See notes 902, 971 and 973.

• 976. Abraham Blush was an early settler of Duxbury, where he bought land in 1637. He was of Barnstable in 1641. (Otis,v.1,p.89) He m. (2) Anna Williams (Barker) (811). (Otis,v.1,p.64) He m. (3) Alice (Derby) _____. (Goodspeed,v.1,p.117)

978. Tristram Hull was of Yarmouth, 1643. (GDNE,v.2,p.495) He was s. JOSEPH HULL (1956), b. 1595, d. 19 Nov 1665, and his wife Joane, d. aft 1632. Joseph was prob b. Crewkerne, Som. He graduated from Oxford in 1614, and after five years as curate in Devon he was ordained and made rector of North Leigh, Diocese of Exeter, where he served eleven years. In 1632, about the time of the death of his first wife, he resigned, returned to the vicinity of Crewkerne, gathered a company of 106 persons, and brought them to New England in 1635. His second wife Agnes came with him, as did Tristram, then 11. He was the minister of a colony of 21 families from England who settled at Wessagusset, now Weymouth, on 5 May 1635. He became freeman that year. He was a magistrate of Hingham in 1638 and Deputy 1638 and 1639. In 1639 he removed to become a founder of Barnstable, for which he was Deputy 1639. In 1641 he became pastor for a group at Yarmouth, apparently without leave, and was excommunicated by the Barnstable Church. They took him back as a member in 1643, but he never was allowed to preach there again. He went to Dover as minister about that time, for a few years, then to the Isle of Shoals, N.H., where again he preached. (Otis,v.2,pp.19ff; Scott,p.236)

Joseph Hull was s. Thomas Hull and his wife Joane Peson, who m. Eng bef 1590.

979. Blanch Hull "was a bad woman, frequently involved in broils and difficulties." For her difficulty from her relations with John Gorham see note 970. After the death of Tristram Hull c. 1667 she m. (2) Capt. William Hedge (1796,3602,3690), who at his death in 1670 cut her off with only 12 pence because she "had dealt falsely with him in the covenant of marriage and departed from him". (GDNE,v.2,p.400; NEH&GR,v.7,p.235) As to William Hedge see note 898.

980. See note 826.

982. Anthony Besse came in the James in 1635 and settled at Lynn. He went to Sandwich in 1637 and spent many years "in holy service to the Indians". (GDNE,v.1,p.172)

984. See note 852.

986. Both Crowe (p.21) and Crowell (p.1) show that Lydia Crowell (493) who m. Ebenezer Goodspeed was dau John Crowe (1816) and Mehitable Miller (1817). But Goodspeed (p.104) says "this could not have been because John's Lydia was born about 1668", and asserts it was the daughter of Thomas Goodspeed, John's brother, who m. Ebenezer Goodspeed. Savage (GDNE,v.1,p.479) and Bos Eas Mass (p.633) are in accord. As Goodspeed has discovered the birth of John's dau was c. 1668 it is clear it was not she who m. in 1677/8. Ebenezer Goodspeed's wife seems clearly to have been the dau of Thomas Crowe.

Thomas was s. JOHN CROWE (1972,3632) and his wife ELISHUA (1973,3633). See note 908.

988. Thomas Stacy is known to have been in America 1646 and was of Ipswich 1648. (Bos Eas Mass, p.362) He rem to Salem where he, his wife and nine children were received in the church from Ipswich 20 Apr 1676. (Pope, p.430) Thomas was s. SIMON STACY (1976), d. bef 1649, and his wife ELIZABETH CLARK (1977), d.c. 1670, who m. Eng c. 1620. Simon was a commoner in Ipswich 1641. (Bos Eas Mass, p.362)

989. Susanna Worcester was dau WILLIAM WORCESTER (1978), d. 28 Oct 1663, and his wife SARAH (1979), d. 23 Apr 1650. William Worcester (or Wooster) was the first minister of Salisbury. He m. (2) 20 or 23 Jul 1650 Rebecca, dau Bennett Swayne of Salisbury, Wilts, who had previously m. (1) Henry Byley (or Bayley) and (2) John Hall. She m. (4) Samuel Symonds, Lt. Gov. of Massachusetts, whom she also survived. She d. 21 Jul 1695 in her 79th year. (GDNE,v.4,p.651)

990. Matthew Clark was a mariner, first of Boston, later of Marblehead where he is known to have been in 1668-74. (GDNE,v.1,p.399)

991. Abigail Maverick was dau ELIAS MAVERICK (1982), b.c. 1604, d. Charlestown 8 Sep 1684, and his wife ANN HARRIS (1983), b. Eng c. 1613, d. Reading 7 Sep 1697, who m. c. 1633. Elias was of Chelsea 1630, freeman 1633, of the artillery company 1634. (NEH&GR,v.69,p.154)

Elias Maverick was s. Rev. JOHN MAVERICK (3964), bp Devon 28 Dec 1578, d. Dorchester 3 Feb 1635/6, and his wife MARY GYE (3965), d. aft 1666, who m. Ilington, Devon, 28 Oct 1600. Rev. John Maverick was of Exeter College, Oxford, where he received his B.A. in 1599 and his M.A. in 1603. He became deacon of the church at Exeter, Eng., 26 Jul 1597, and later was ordained minister of the Church of England. In 1615 he was rector of Bea-

worthy, Devon. He sailed 30 Mar 1630 on the Mary and John to Nantasket, the captain of the ship refusing to take them further. The group from this vessel succeeded in planting Dorchester a month before the arrival of Winthrop. (Swift, p.178) He became freeman 1631 and was minister of the Dorchester Church until his death. (NEH&GR,v.69,p.154)

John Maverick was s. Peter Maverick, b.c. 1550, d. bef 3 Feb 1616/17, who m. Awliscombe, Devon, 7 Nov 1577 Dorothy Tucke, dau Robert and Alice Tucke. Peter was s. Robert, bur Awliscombe 14 Nov 1573. Peter, like his father, was clerk of Awliscombe. He is first recorded as "Peter Bull, alias Maverick" when he was ordained as deacon 15 Jan 1573/4. "Peter Maverick alias Bull" was ordained as priest 17 Mar 1573/4 and on 3 Nov 1580 was admitted to the perpetual vicarage of Awliscombe. He met a violent death. (NEH&GR,v.69, pp.151-2)

Ann Harris (1983), wife of Elias Maverick (1982), was dau THOMAS HARRIS (3966), d. Charlestown bet 1631-4, and his wife ELIZABETH (3967), b.c. 1577, d. Charlestown 16 Feb 1670/1. Thomas Harris (or Williams alias Harris) came with Winthrop and was in Charlestown in 1630. He was admitted freeman 1631 as Thomas Williams. He installed and kept the ferry from Boston to Winissimet (now called Chelsea) and Charlestown. After his death his widow Elizabeth m. (2) Deacon William Stilson (Stitson or Stetson). Stilson continued the ferry operation after Sep 1634. (Wyman,pp.467,902; Am Gen, v.24,p.153; Harris,pp.6-7)

Thomas Harris was s. William Harris, d. 1599, and his wife Agnes Mason, d. aft 1599, who m. 30 Jan 1579. William had m. (1) Cheltenham, Glouc., 21 Nov 1568 Katherine Kiche. William was s. John, a yeoman of Hatherup, Glouc., b. bef 1514, d.c. 1554, m.c. 1533 Anne, d. 1585. Agnes Mason was dau Henry Mason who d.c. 1584. (Harris,pp.4-5)

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Page viii. In the paragraph concerning service against or encounters with Indians add references to notes #131 and #262.

Page ix. In the paragraph concerning descent from European royalty add reference to note #883.

The First Teels in America

Page 2. Before the first full paragraph insert the following:

Mrs. Arch Fisher of Los Angeles kindly furnished the compiler a photostatic copy of the pedigree of the descendants of Isaac Teale, the Apothecary General of the English Army, certified by the College of Arms, London. It shows that Isaac m. aft 1697 and d. 1710; that he had only two children, Isaac and Elizabeth; and that the younger Isaac, who m. at age 11 a girl aged 8, had sons named Isaac, Richard, James and George, but no Oliver.

One authority asserts that William Teel, the immigrant, was "b. 1663, son of Benjamin Teale, surgeon general of the English Army" (Virkus, v.6, p.559; v.7, p.613). That Benjamin was b.c. 1664 and m. 1690 (Harl, v.31, p.149). He could not have been the father of William of Malden, who very likely was "b.1663" as he is recorded as having had a child b. 1685/6 (VR) and prob had at least one child earlier (see original work, pp.2-3).

Between the first two full paragraphs insert the following:

It has been asserted that William Teel m. 1684 Mary Coggen at "Clinton, Conn." (then part of Killingworth); and that his son Oliver m. 1723 Prudence Mayhew at New Haven, Conn. (Virkus, v.6, p.559; v.7, p.613). Another source says William m. Mary Freeman (Nat Cyc, v.20, p.38). No other evidence of dates or places of the marriages or of the surnames of the wives has been located, either in the published VR of Killingworth and New Haven, or elsewhere, and these assertions seem too doubtful to be accepted. William seems to have been continuously of Malden after 1681, and Oliver seems not to have gone to Connecticut until after 1735 (see original work, pp.1-7). No Mary Coggen who could have married William

Teel, and no Prudence Mayhew who could have married Oliver, have been found. Samuel Freeman (3624) and his wife Apphia (3625)---see note 906---had a son Henry who had a dau Mary (Freeman Gen,p.354), but there is no indication she married William Teel.

Page 3. At end of second full paragraph add: "For the ancestry of Abigail Coggin see NEH&GR,v.111,p.179."

Delete the third full paragraph and substitute the following:

William Teel of Malden is said to have been a nephew of William Clements (Clemens, Clemence) of Newton (Wyman,pp.934-35; Boutelle,v.3, pp.245-53; Teall (3),p.50; Central NY,pp.339-40). An effort was made to clarify this relationship. As the relationship might have been through the wife of William Clements, her identity was also examined. Such information as was found is set forth below.

There were two William Clements of Newton, Senior and Junior, apparently father and son, owning different properties in Newton (GDNE, v.1,p.408; Jackson, pp.27,28,260; Newton, pp.115,130,133; Paige, p.511). The elder owned a house in Newton as early as 1639 (Jackson, p.260). Savage refers to "William Clements, Cambridge 1636" and states: "I am not able to distinguish him from another William of Cambridge called junior". (Newton was part of Cambridge until 1691.) This suggests that one should seek additional proof regarding the further statements of Savage: that it was William Senior who tried for a divorce in 1656; that his wife was the Martha Clemance who d. 1659; that William Senior then m. 1660 Ann Taylor and in 1672 gave all his property to one Hudson "on condition of support for himself and wife Ann for the rest of their lives"; and that it was William Junior who d. 16 Jul 1669 (GDNE,v.1, p.408).

While Paige (p.511) follows Savage, the Newton historians say William Junior d. 1691 "and Capt. Prentice administered on his estate" (Jackson,p.260; Newton,p.133); and Pope (p.105) says it was William Senior's estate which was inventoried 15 (12) 1669 by Samuel Hide and John Jackson. Wyman refers to a "William Clemens of Newton" who "died 1668/9, ae 70" (Wyman,v.2,p.934). If one William lived until 1691, the other who died at age 70 in 1669 could not have been the son, William Junior, but must have been William Senior.

These latter authorities seem to be reliable and to establish that William Senior was b.c. 1599 and d. 1669; that William Junior d. 1691; and that therefore William Junior was the one who conveyed his property to Hudson in 1672 on condition of support of himself and his wife Ann.

In 1655 the wife of one of the William Clements was placed in the care and custody of John Fuller, as she was neglected by her husband (Bond,p.742). On June 9, 1656 the County Court sitting in Charlestown entered the following judgment in the first divorce proceedings commenced in the courts of Middlesex County:

"William Clemence craving a divorce from his wife; do judge it not meet to grant a divorce at present, but do order that they

both owe each other according to their marriage covenant, and that upon complaint made such party as shall be found faulty in refusing so to do shall be severally [sic] punished." (Anc Mdsx, pp.18-19)

This William is said to have been William Senior (GDNE, v.1, p.408; Pope, p.105), which would appear correct since there is no notation of "Junior" in the official judgment. Pope adds: "The wife Susan" also desired the divorce, citing the files of Middlesex County. Thus it appears that William Senior's wife was Susan.

It follows that the Martha Clemance who d. Cambridge 10 Dec 1659 (VR) was prob the first wife of William Junior, and that it was William Junior who m. (2) Cambridge 3 Apr 1660 Ann Taylor (VR). Ann was prob the wid of Richard Taylor, freeman 1642, who d. Charlestown 10 Jul 1659 and whose will of May 6, 1659 mentions his wife Ann (GDNE, v.4, p.263).

The connection between William Clements, Senior or Junior, or Susan, Martha or Ann, on the one hand, and William Teel of Malden, on the other, could not be established.

#91, for "1782" substitute "1778", and add the following:

Neither the birth nor the baptism of Gershom (90), Jonathan (90A), or Samuel (91) are found in the VR. The family bible shows the first four children of Gershom (46) as follows: Susanna (89), b.1776; Gershom (90), b.1780; Jonathan (90A), b.1782; and Betsy (92), b.c. 1784. Other children were recorded in the bible as

being born later every two or three years, but no Samuel (Teel Fam Bib). However, there were other ch. who are shown by the VR to have been ch. of Gershom but who are not recorded in the bible. For several reasons it becomes clear that, although not recorded in either the VR or the family bible, Samuel (91) was the son of Gershom (46).

(I) It would follow the two-year pattern of his children's births for Gershom (46) to have had a ch. b.c. 1778. If Samuel (91) were s. of Gershom (46), b.c. 1778, Gershom would have done a very natural thing in naming his first five children Susanna (89) for his wife (see #46), Samuel (91) for his father (22) and his older full brother (45), Gershom (90) for himself (46), Jonathan (90A) for his younger full brother (48), and Betsy (92) for his mother (see #22). Note further that Samuel (91) m. a third sister of the girls who had m. the brothers Gershom (90) and Jonathan (90A)--- see note 9 to Ancestry as amended below. Samuel (91) in every way fits the picture of a son of Gershom (46).

(II) Samuel (91) named certain ch. by his second wife thus:

Ann (181), for his second wife.
Ebenezer S. (184), for his second wife's father.
Rachel (182), for his second wife's mother.

He had named ch. by his first wife as follows:

Samuel (176), for himself.
Abigail (175), for his first wife.
Benjamin Floyd (180), for his first wife's father.

His only other dau by his first wife he named Susanna Adams (179), not for his first wife's mother, Rebecca Floyd, but for Susanna Adams, the wife of Gershom Teel (46). There arises a strong inference that Susanna Adams was his mother, and hence Gershom (46) his father.

(III) A review of the Teel families indicates a strong probability that Gershom (46) was the father of Samuel (91). Benjamin Teel (19) d. childless in 1784, and so did Samuel (45) in 1832 (see note 16 to Ancestry). James (47) d. in infancy (see addition to #47 above). The census shows that in 1790 Aaron (52) had no ch., and he could not thereafter have fathered Samuel (91) who m. 12 Jun 1803. In any event there is no record of his having a s. Samuel. Blaney (37), Jonathan (48) and Benjamin (51) each had a s. Samuel (#85, #106 and #115) who were different people from Samuel (91); so neither Blaney, Jonathan or Benjamin would have been his father. The only other married males of the Teel family who appear to have been living around Boston c. 1778-83 were Joseph (20 or 30) and Gershom (46). If Samuel (91) were s. of Joseph (20), Gershom (46) would have been his first cousin; if of Joseph (30), his second cousin. In either event there is no apparent reason why Samuel would have named his dau for the wife of his cousin; but if he were the s. of Gershom he would have been

naming her for his mother. Again the conclusion is indicated that Gershom (46) was most probably the father of Samuel (91).

(IV) Samuel (45) in his will of 12 Dec 1831 mentions his "nephew Samuel Teel jr." and also mentions "Samuel Teel 3d (eldest son of Samuel jr.)". (Middlesex Probate, v.167, p.466) We find that Samuel (91) is always referred to as "Samuel Teel jr." in the Medford Church records of his marriage and of the baptism of his children (VR). This appears to be the way he was distinguished locally from Samuel (45). Furthermore, the eldest son of Samuel (91) was named Samuel (176). Here we clearly have "Samuel Teel jr." and "Samuel Teel 3d", the nephew and grandnephew of Samuel (45). Of the previously known nephews of Samuel (45) only two were named Samuel, the son of Jonathan (48) and the son of Benjamin (51). Neither of these could have been the "nephew Samuel Teel jr." referred to by Samuel (45) in his will of 1831 as then living and having a son "Samuel Teel 3d (eldest son of Samuel jr.)". Jonathan's son, Samuel Cutter (106), had d. in 1816, apparently unm. (Cutter, p.129) While Benjamin's son, Samuel Pierce (115), had a son Samuel P. (235), he was not his eldest son, and moreover, Samuel Pierce was younger than both Samuel (45) and Samuel (91), and he had a distinguishing middle name, so he would not have been referred to as "Samuel Teel jr." but rather as "Samuel Teel 3d" or as "Samuel Pierce Teel"; and his son would have been called "Samuel P. Teel jr.", not "Samuel Teel 3d". Samuel (91) was unquestionably the "nephew" referred to by Samuel (45).

Samuel (45) had five brothers to whom we must look to trace this relationship: Gershom (46), James (47), Jonathan (48), Benjamin (51) and Aaron (52). As noted above under (III), James d. in infancy, Aaron could not have been the father of Samuel (91), and Jonathan and Benjamin had sons named Samuel who were different people from Samuel (91). This leaves only Gershom (46) to be the father of the "nephew" Samuel, who, as we have seen, was Samuel (91).

#92, delete the entry (see new #340 below) and substitute:

92. Betsy, b. 30 Jan 1784, d. 29 Aug 1801. While the family bible shows her death was on 6 May 1802 (Teel Fam Bib), that entry appears to have been made many years later at a time of recording the b. and d. of many members of the family. The VR show no death of a ch. of Gershom on that date; but the records of the Medford Church show a dau of Gershom bur 31 Aug 1801 "ae 27", and the Cushing book shows she d. 29 Aug 1801 (VR). These records being contemporaneous should be more accurate as to dates than the bible record. The only dau of Gershom who is named as dying bet 1799 and 1805 was Betsy, according to all records found. The 10 year error in her age in the Church record could well have been a clerical error, compounded in another work which shows "Betsey Teel d. 25 Oct 1801, ae 23" (Arlington, p.309). The most reliable information is that Betsy (92) d. 29 Aug 1801.

Notes Regarding Individuals in the Ancestry

Page 93. Note #3, just above the paragraph relating to JOHN HOWLAND and ELIZABETH TILLEY insert the following:

JOHN CHIPMAN (782) and HOPE HOWLAND (783) in the Ancestry of Moses Thomas (48) were the parents of Elizabeth Chipman (919) in the Ancestry of Betsey Howes (57).

The paragraph regarding JOHN HOWLAND and ELIZABETH TILLEY should be amended to show that Grace Carroll Thomas descended from these two ancestors in five rather than four different lines, and by adding after "Hope (783)" the following: "(another multiple ancestor--- see above)".

Page 94. Note #3, add at end of the note the following:

THOMAS PRENCE (1598,1834) by his first wife, Patience Brewster (1599), was the father of Mercy Prence (799) in the Ancestry of Deborah Shaw (49), and by his second wife, Mary Collier (1835), was the father of Sarah Prence (917) in the Ancestry of Betsey Howes (57).

Chart B at the end of the present publication shows the inter-marriages mentioned in this note, as amended, and the cross connections with the ancestry of Olive Prentice Howes.

Note #7, add the following at the end of the note:

THOMAS HOWES and MARY BURR are four times paternal ancestors.
JOHN HALL and BETHIA FARMER are twice paternal ancestors.
AUSTIN BEARSE and (MRS. BEARSE) are once paternal and once maternal ancestors.
WILLIAM COLLIER and (MRS. COLLIER) are twice paternal ancestors.

Chart A at the end of the present publication shows these additions.

Page 95. Note #2, second paragraph, after the second sentence delete the rest of the paragraph and substitute the following:

Jonathan Teel 2d, another brother, m. Charlestown 17 Jun 1813
Harriet Scott (Hunnewell, p.248; Wyman,p.936). See Teel Genealogy #90, #90A and #91. As to Jonathan 2d see the last two paragraphs of this note, as amended.

At the end of the note add the following two paragraphs and footnote:

There has been little attempt to identify the Jonathan Teel who m. Harriet Scott in Charlestown 17 Jun 1813. Wyman thought this was Jonathan (#104---see footnote on this page) marrying a second time; but he seems to have been mistaken. Cutter's Arlington has been found to be a reliable work, particularly on the descendants of Jonathan Teel (#48) and his wife Lydia Cutter. At pp.307-09 it gives the family of their son Jonathan (#104) and shows he had only one wife, Lydia Hill, whom he m. 1805. More conclusively, Jonathan (#104) d. 1850 but Lydia did not die until 24 April 1858 (Cutter,p.129; Arlington,pp.307-09; Boutelle, v.3,pp.245-53). Harriet Scott certainly did not m. Jonathan (#104) in 1813. Jonathan (#48) is the only other Jonathan heretofore definitely identified; but Harriet did not marry him for his wife, Lydia Cutter, whom he m. 1776, survived him (Cutter,p.129; Arlington, pp.307-09; Arlington VR; Boutelle,v.3,pp.245-53).

Jonathan (#104), b. 1784, is called "Jonathan 3d of Charlestown" in the record of his marriage in 1805 to Lydia Hill (Cambridge VR; Arlington,p.307). The first Jonathan was Jonathan (#48), b.c. 1754, d. 1828. Gershom (#46) had a son Jonathan b. 2 Mar 1782 who d. 11 Nov 1819 (Teel Fam Bib), called "Jonathan 2d" (Wyman,p.936). This was the only other Jonathan Teel of that period and he must have been the Jonathan who m. Harriet Scott in Charlestown 17 Jun 1813---the third Teel brother to marry one of the Scott sisters.

Footnote: Numbers in this paragraph and the next one are the numbers used in the Teel Genealogy, not those used in the Ancestry.

Page 96. Note #16, add at the end: "The family bible confirms that Gershom (8) was the son of Gershom (16). (Teel Fam Bib)."

Note #18, second paragraph, second line, delete "b.c. 1782 (?)"; and in the third line delete "(#104 in Genealogy)" and substitute "(#90A in Teel Genealogy)".

Page 97. Note #36, delete the last sentence of the note and substitute the following: "According to Milton Church records an Ebenezer Scott was bp 7 Aug 1743 (NEH&GR,v.23,p.260). As no other Scott family was in Milton at this period he was clearly s. Ebenezer (72) and Sarah (73)."

Page 98. Note #38, delete the material on this page and substitute the following:

Jacob Thayer (38) who m. Lydia Farrar (39) and was the father of Rachel (19) seems clearly to have been s. of Ebenezer, b. Braintree 7 Jul 1730. Ebenezer's son Jacob does not appear in Braintree records after the record of his birth, and is not traced in the family genealogies beyond his birth. His ancestry is clear (B.Thayer, pp.184-85, 211; E.Thayer, pp.136-38; Ravenscroft, pp.1, 2, 117, 121, 125-26 and related pages for collateral branches; Vinton, p.364 and related pages).

Boston VR show the marriage 5 Sep 1751 of a Jacob Thayer to Mary Moore, prob dau of Ephraim and Elizabeth Moore, b. Boston 12 Feb 1722. Mary d.c. 1759 as on 14 Dec 1759 Jacob Thayer of Boston, housewright, was appointed guardian of Jacob and Mary Thayer, both under 14 years of age, children of Mary, deceased (Suffolk Probate #12178-9). This family of Jacob and Mary is not found in the family genealogies.

As there is no evidence that there were two Jacob Thayers in Boston at this period, the marriage there of a Jacob Thayer to Lydia Farrar on 11 May 1760 was apparently a second marriage of the Jacob who had married Mary Moore. Jacob and Lydia had b. Boston: Melatiah, 13 Mar 1761; Jacob, 3 Oct 1762; Lydia, 11 Nov 1764; and Rachel, 28 Mar 1766 (VR). This family of Jacob and Lydia is not found in the family genealogies.

We see that in his first marriage this Jacob named one child for himself and the other for his first wife. In his second marriage he names one for himself (his first son Jacob apparently having died), one for his second wife (Lydia), and one for his second wife's mother (Melatiah). To complete this pattern he should give his fourth child, a daughter, his own mother's name. He named her Rachel. The wife of Ebenezer Thayer of Braintree was Rachel (Wales) Thayer.

The only other recorded Jacob Thayer who is not accounted for in the family genealogies was the son of Timothy and Experience Thayer of Weymouth, and no Rachel has been found in the ancestries of Timothy or of Experience. None of the descendants of Jacob and Lydia Thayer bore the names Timothy or Experience or names found in the ancestries of Timothy and Experience Thayer of Weymouth. (See E.Thayer, p.1534; B. Thayer, pp.184, 587-89; and Pillsbury, pp.443-48) Jacob (38) seems clearly not to have been the son of Timothy and Experience but rather to have been the son of Ebenezer and Rachel Thayer of Braintree.

Page 99. Delete all except note A608.

Page 106. Insert a new note #131 as follows:

131. Mary Jones had m. (1) Swansea 13 Jun 1671 Joseph Lewis, s. Edmund. Joseph was killed and scalped by the Indians at Swansea 24 Jun 1675. (Am Gen, v.31, p.90)

Page 108. Note #192, second paragraph, line 8, delete "Thomas Fam, p.8" and substitute "D. Thomas".

Page 110. Note #229, delete the entire note and substitute the following:

229. Howes (pp.17 and 26) and Hellerman state the maiden name of the wife of Samuel Howes (228) was "Mary Howes". Mary Howes, dau Ebenezer and Lydia (Joyce) Howes, did not marry Aron Crowell as Howes says (p.16). The girl, b. 27 Dec 1713, who m. Aron Crowell was Mercy Howes, also dau of Ebenezer and Lydia. Mary Howes, b. Yarmouth 7 Jan 1722/3, dau Ebenezer and Lydia, though quite young, is the only Mary Howes discovered who could have married Samuel Howes 26 Jul 1736. (VR---see MD,v.6,p.91 and v.11,p.114; Crowe,p.25)

Under EIGHTH GENERATION insert new notes #260 and #262 as follows:

260. Joel Jenkins was of Braintree 1640 but removed to Malden (An Heads,p.132; Pope,p.257; NEH&GR,v.66,p.268). He had a dau Lidia b. Braintree 13 Oct 1640 (NEH&GR,v.20,p.144). A "Jo Jenkynn, 26" came to New England in the Defence 1635 (Hotten,p.107). This may well have been Joel (260), although others suggest it was John Jenkins who was freeman of Plymouth 1636 (GDNE,v.2,p.542; Pope,p.257).

262. Robert Jones lived in Hull 1653, Rehoboth 1654, and Swansea c.1669. He was in King Philip's War and was killed and scalped by the Indians at Swansea 24 Jun 1675. (Am Gen, v.31,p.90; Jones,p.3)

Page 115. Insert a new note #458 as follows:

458. Ebenezer Howes had m. (1) 20 Apr 1699 Sarah Gorham, d. 9 Sep 1705 (Howes,p.16).

Page 116. Note #484, first paragraph, add at end the following:

But a William Downes d. Boston 1692 (Am Gen,v.14,p.40), and another William Downes was a merchant of Boston in 1713/14 (Am Gen,v.14, p.177). These would seem to be the father dying and the son carrying on his father's business. A William Downes m. Boston 14 May 1713 Rebecca Peirson (VR). This again would seem to be the son of William and Hannah.

Second paragraph, delete the last two sentences and substitute: "(Downes, pp.5-7) William was living in Southold, Long Island, in 1698 and 1699, with a wife Abigail and a dau Abijah jr. (Am Gen,v.14,p.6; v.20,p.28) He d. 2 Mar 1707 and his wid d. 28 Dec 1751 (Downs (2), p.10)."

Delete the last two paragraphs and substitute the following:

Finally it should be noted that a "Colonel William Downe" of Boston was b. 1686 (Am Ancestry,v.9,p.203) and seems to have been the "William Down" who m. Boston 4 Jul 1717 Sarah Danforth (VR).

No other William Downs has been found in New England at this period. It is not known who the William was who m. Elizabeth Gorham bef 1701. Their children were: Edward, b. 22 Jun 1701; William (242); and Samuel, b. 2 Oct 1705 (VR). As Elizabeth m. (2) Shobael Baxter c. 1709, her husband William must have d. bet 1705

and 1709. The three sons of William and Elizabeth m. their second cousins, three dau of John Baxter (486) and Desire Gorham (487). (Transc.5339) As noted, Elizabeth herself m. Shobael Baxter, who was a brother of John (486). Thus she later became the mother-in-law of her husband's nieces.

A recent article, carefully prepared, reviews other authorities and documents contemporaneous with the events and concludes, it would seem quite correctly, that MARTHA FORD (1555, 1731) and her husband FORD (1554) and also their dau MARTHA (777) arrived together on the Fortune 9 Nov 1621. Martha's husband (1554) d. bet 1628-30. Their ch. born the day after their arrival was a son. (Am Gen,v.42,pp.35ff)

Richard Rich came to Dover Neck, N.H., in 1625. He was prob the father of Richard (396) who later was of Dover Point, N.H. Judith (1689) had m. (1) Taunton, Som, 13 Apr 1618 William Kinge who was bur Taunton, Som, 15 May 1619. (GDNE,v.3, p.540; NEH&GR,v.111,pp.168-172)

Add at end of note the following:

According to a chart in the Sutro Library in San Francisco prepared by Howard K. Jones, Alameda, California, 1923, Richard Warren descends in direct line from William, 2d Earl Warren, who m. Isabel, dau Hugh the Great and Adela. Hugh the Great was s. Henry I of France, who was s. Robert the Pious. Adela descended in direct line from Charlemagne. (See note 906) William, 2d Earl Warren, was s. William de Warrene, 1st Earl Warren, and Gundreda, dau William the Conqueror. The 1st Earl Warren descended from Nicholas de Bocqueville and his wife, who was a niece of Gunorra. Gunorra and his sister (apparently the mother of this niece) were grandchildren of Eadred, the grandson of Alfred the Great (see note 906). The wife of Eadred was Goom del Gammel, who descended from Frada, King of Denmark, and his wife Hilda. Hilda descended from Constantine, Claudius and Mark Antony.

Add in references at end of note "Shaw,p.151".

Note #885, add at end: "But see note #838 as amended."

Elizabeth Hammond; and Hannah House, sis of Thomas and Samuel, is thought to have been the first wife of Rev. John Lothrop (3612) who also came 1634 to Scituate. See note #903. It has been suggested that this Thomas House may have followed his bro and bro-in-law to Cape Cod in 1637 and have been the Thomas Howes (1792, 1832, 1840, 3648) of Yarmouth. (NEH&GR, v.56, pp.356-58)

John is thought to have been the first mate of the Mayflower in 1620, who d. Jamestown, Va., 1623. (Am Gen, v.42, p.201)

After the last paragraph add the following:

William Ring of Pettistree, Suff, m. Ufford, Suff, 21 May 1601, Mary Durrant of Ufford. They had Elizabeth, bp Ufford 23 Feb 1602/3. By 1614 a William and Mary Ring were in Leyden with a family of which the eldest dau was Elizabeth, and William d. there bet 1620-29. It prob was the same family, and Mary prob came on the second voyage of the Mayflower in 1629. (Am Gen, v.42, p.195)

Page 135. After note #914 insert new notes #915-919 as follows:

915. Bethia Hall was dau John Hall jr. (1830), bp Charlestown 13 Jun 1638, d. Yarmouth 14 Oct 1710, who m. 1660 Priscilla Bearse (1831), b. 10 Mar 1643/4, d. 30 Mar 1712. John, a Deacon, was s. JOHN HALL (1848, 3660) and BETHIA FARMER (1849, 3661). Priscilla was dau AUGUSTINE (AUSTIN) BEARSE (1920, 3662) and MRS. BEARSE (1921, 3663). See note 960. (Virkus, v.5, p.227; Curfman)

John Hall (1848, 3660) came 1630 from Coventry, Warw. He was prob b.c. 1609. (Hall, p.211) His wife was known to be named Bethia, and she seems clearly to have been Bethia Farmer, dau of John Farmer (3698, 7322) of Ansley, Warw., d. bef 1669, and his wife ISABELLA BARBAGE (3699, 7323), as one of their daughters "m. John Hall of Warwickshire". Isabella came to New England shortly after the death

of her husband, John Farmer, and here m. (2) Elder Thomas Wiswall of Newton, who d. 6 Dec 1693. Isabella d. Billerica 21 May 1686. (NEH&GR, v.1, p.24; Hall, p.211; GDNE, v.2, pp.333-34)

916. Jeremiah Howes was s. THOMAS HOWES (1792, 1832, 1840, 3648) and MARY BURR (1793, 1833, 1841, 3649). See note 896. On Jeremiah Howes and his wife Sarah Prentice see NEH&GR, v.59, p.217.

917. Sarah was dau THOMAS PRENTICE (1598, 1834) and his second wife MARY COLLIER (1835), dau WILLIAM COLLIER (3670, 7254) and Mrs. Collier (3671, 7255)---see notes 799 and 906. Since Sarah's grave shows she was in her 60th year at death in 1706 (the town record gives 1703/4) she was b.c. 1643-46. Similarly Jeremiah Howes' grave showing he was 71 at death in 1708 places his birth c. 1637. They had a son Prince b. 1669 so they had married bef that year (NEH&GR, v.59, p.217), but Savage must be wrong in saying they married as early as 1650 (see GDNE, v.3, p.477); it was prob c. 1660-68.

918. Hosea Joyce m. (1) c. 1665 Martha ____, d. Yarmouth 3 Apr 1670. He was s. JOHN JOYCE (1836), b.c. 1615, and his wife DOROTHY COCHET (1837), who m. bef 1646. John was in Lynn but rem 1637 to Sandwich, thence in 1643 to Yarmouth, where he d. 21 Dec 1666. Dorothy was sis Robert Cochet of Mickle Over, Derby. She d. Yarmouth 12 Jan 1679/80. (GDNE, v.2, p.573; An Heads; NYG&BR, v.41, p.9; Am Gen, v.43, pp. 1-12)

919. Elizabeth was dau JOHN CHIPMAN (782, 1838) and Hope Howland (783, 1839)---see notes 782 and 783. (Howland, p.30) Elizabeth Chipman, not Martha, the first wife of Hosea Joyce, was the mother of Lydia (459). (MI, pp.150, 434; Virkus, v.4, p.102)

Note #924, second line, after "BETHIA" insert "FARMER".




Chart A.

in Ancestry of OLIVE PRENTICE HOWES


