

THE TRAIN FAMILY

In tracing the "Train" family in America, we find several families bearing the name who chose the name in preference to their own. Among these are the Train families in Lindsborg, Kansas. There are around a hundred in number bearing the name. This family was originally named Johnson, and came to the United States in 1867 from Sweden. Upon arriving here they decided to take a name which they thought uncommon and chose the name "Train". They raised large families and are now in the fourth generation.

In 1907, there resided in Chicago, a Doctor Train who stated that he emigrated with his father from Russia and the name being Trun, was changed to "Train" at Castle Garden.

In Boston, Massachusetts, we find an Italian family whose original name was not "Train".

There are also several families whose origin is probably the same but who came to America much later. Included in these is the family of Doctor Train of Savannah, Georgia, whose father Hugh Train, son of Adam Train of Muirkirk, Scotland, came to the United States in 1851.

Another family, probably of the same origin, came to this country about 1800 from Nottingham, England. The three brothers; John Henry, Francis Joseph, and Robert Farquhar Train, were sons of John Farquhar and Elizabeth Hood Train, whose father was born about 1839 in Mauchline, Ayrshire, Scotland. According to Robert Farquhar Train, who with his family resides in Los Angeles, California, most of the descendants of this line reside in Australia.

It is claimed by members of the family in Scotland that the name, "Train", was originated when Mary, Queen of Scots, took a liking to a small boy because of his alertness and attractability and chose him to carry the long, heavy train of her throne dress when in court. He was nicknamed "Train", and ever since his descendants have borne the name.

Susan Train Hand, in her book, "John Trayne and Some of His Descendants", believes she has traced the family correctly back to 1552, in Irvine, Ayrshire, Scotland. The name was then spelled "Tran" (with Train in parenthesis) later it was spelled "Trayne", and then "Train". The line as she gives it is as follows:

A—Steven Tran, Provost of Irvine in 1552, married Margaret Brown. He died in 1573. Their children were: Patrick, John, Hew, Alison, and Marion.

AA—Patrick Tran, married Margaret Baillie. He died in 1602. Their children were: Andrew, James, Bessie, Jonet, Eupheme, and Helen.

AAB—James Tran, married (1) Isabella Orr, and, after her death, married (2) Christiana Lowe who outlived him. He died in Glasgow, Scotland, in 1657. Their children were: Patrick, James, John, Jonet, Margaret, and Christiana.

AABC—John Trayne, born between 1610 and 1613, married (1) Margaret Dix in Salem, Massachusetts, shortly after both arrived there in the "Susan and Ellen" in 1635. They settled in Watertown, Massachusetts. She was nineteen and he about twenty-five years of age at the time of their marriage. She died December 18, 1660, at the age of forty-four years — the mother of all of his children. He married (2) Abigail Bent on October 12, 1675. He died January 29, 1680, and Abigail died August 17, 1691. His will was proved April 4, 1681. The inventory of his estate was two hundred and eighty-eight pounds ten shillings, a goodly sum for that period.

It is John Trayne and his descendants whom we have traced in America. His children were:

A—Elizabeth, born September 30, 1640, married John **Stratton** on March 10, 1659. He died April 7, 1691. Elizabeth died May 7, 1708.

B—Mary, born August 10, 1642, married **Memory**.

C—Sarah, born January 31, 1646, married Jacob **Cole** on October 12, 1669.

D—Abigail, born January 31, 1648, married Martin **Townsend** on April 16, 1668. She died January 16, 1691.

E—John, born May 25, 1651, married Mary Stubbs on March 24, 1674. He died February 19, 1717.

F—Thomas, born 1653, married Rebecca Stearns on January 25, 1692. He died January 22, 1738-1739. Rebecca died September 3, 1746. He left no male issue.

G—Rebecca, twin to Hannah, born September 7, 1657, married Michael **Barstow** January 12, 1677.

H—Hannah, twin to Rebecca, born September 7, 1657, married Richard **Child** on January 16, 1679. He was born in 1631, and married (1) Mehitabel Dimmick who died August 18, 1676, and he then married (2) Hannah in 1679. He died November 11, 1694. She died October 16, 1728.

A — ELIZABETH

Elizabeth, daughter of John and Margaret Dix Train, was born September 30, 1640, married John **Stratton** on March 10, 1659. She died May 7, 1708. He died April 7, 1691. Their children were:

AA—Elizabeth Stratton, born February 23, 1660, died soon thereafter.

AB—John Stratton, born August 24, 1661.

AC—Elizabeth Stratton, born July 2, 1664.

AD—Joseph Stratton, born January 13, 1667.

AE—Samuel Stratton, born September 18, 1669.

AF—Rebecca Stratton, born May 16, 1672.

AG—Ebenezer Stratton, born October 2, 1678.

AH—Jonathan Stratton, born March 6, 1680.

B — MARY

Mary, daughter of John and Margaret Dix Train, was born August 10, 1642. She married **Memory**. Their children were:

- BD—Mary Memory.

C — SARAH

Sarah, daughter of John and Margaret Dix Train, was born January 31, 1646, married Jacob **Cole** on October 12, 1669. Their children were:

- CB—Abigail Cole. *b. 26 march 1673 - " (V.R. p. 87)*

Abigail, daughter of John and Margaret Dix Train, was born January 31, 1648, married Martin **Townsend** on April 16, 1668. She died January 16, 1691. Their children were:

- DA—Abigail Townsend, born September 18, 1669.
- DB—Martin Townsend.
- DC—Hannah Townsend, born October 6, 1673, died at the age of two years.
- DD—John Townsend, born May 26, 1679, died at the age of four years.
- DE—Jonathan Townsend, born April —, 1688, died at the age of three months.
- DF—Jonathan Townsend.

G — REBECCA

Rebecca, twin to Hannah, daughter of John and Margaret Dix Train, was born September 7, 1657, married Michael **Barstow** on January 12, 1677. They had just one child.

- GA—Hannah Barstow, born January 20, 1679.

H — HANNAH

Hannah, twin to Rebecca, daughter of John and Margaret Dix Train, was born September 7, 1657, married as his second wife, Richard **Child**, on January 16, 1679. He was born in 1631 and died November 11, 1694. She died October 16, 1728. Their children were:

- HA—Joshua Child, born December 30, 1682.
- HB—Margaret Child.
- HC—John Child, born May 16, 1687.
- HD—Rebecca Child, born February 4, 1694.

E — JOHN

John, son of John and Margaret Dix Train, was born May 25, 1651. He married Mary Stubbs, daughter of Joshua and Abigail Benjamin Stubbs, on March 24, 1674. Mr. Stubbs was one of the founders of Watertown, Massachusetts, and a large landowner. John and Mary resided in Weston, Massachusetts, where he died February 19, 1717. Her maternal grandparents were John and Abigail Benjamin. Their children were:

- EA—John, born and died January 2, 1675.
- EB—Abigail, born June 5, 1677, married William **Sanderson** on May 14, 1702. She died soon after.
- EC—Elizabeth, born January 6, 1679, married (1) Thomas **Spring**, on November 30, 1701, and (2) Joseph **Bullard** in 1706, and (3) Thomas **Upham** on April 24, 1723. She died August 6, 1753.
- ED—John, born October 31, 1682, married Lydia Jennison on May 5, 1705.
- EE—Margaret, born August 18, 1685, married (1) Samuel **Perry** in 1706. They had at least six children. Mary, the sixth, was born September 7, 1718. She married William **Lawrence** on November 28, 1734.
- EF—Thomas, born May 20, 1688. He never married. He died in September, 1768.

F — THOMAS

Thomas, son of John and Margaret Dix Train, was born in 1653. He married Rebecca Stearns on January 25, 1692. He died on January 22, 1738-1739. Rebecca died September 3, 1746. Only a daughter survived.

- FA—Benoni, born November 11, 1694, died in infancy.
- FB—Rebecca, born April 27, 1696, died in infancy.
- FC—Deborah, born December 16, 1698, died May 25, 1718.
- FD—Rebecca, born December, 1701, married John **Bright** on December 17, 1726.

EC — ELIZABETH

Elizabeth, daughter of John and Mary Stubbs Train, was born January 6, 1679, married (1) Thomas **Spring** on November 30, 1701, (2) Joseph **Bullard** in 1706, and (3) Thomas **Upham** on April 24, 1723. She died August 6, 1753. Their children were:

ECA—Mary Spring, born January 19, 1703.

ECB—Elizabeth Spring, born September 10, 1705.

ECC—Thomas Spring, born July 5, 1708.

ECD—Henry Spring, born February 2, 1710.

ED — JOHN

John, son of John and Mary Stubbs Train, was born on October 31, 1682. He married Lydia Jennison, daughter of Samuel and Judith Macomber Jennison on May 5, 1705. Her grandfather was Robert Jennison, prominent in the early years of Watertown, Massachusetts. He died in 1742, and Lydia died September 18, 1773. Their children were:

EDA—**John**, born February 9, 1706, married (1) Jane (sometimes mentioned as Jean) Cunningham, on October 4, 1737. He died in Tinmouth, Vermont, in 1777. His second wife was Mary.

EDB—**Judith**, born August 26, 1708, married Joshua **Upham** on February 17, 1731.

EDC—**Samuel**, born December 22, 1711, married (1) Mary Holding of Concord, on April 2, 1738. She died soon and he married (2) Rachel Allen on December 31, 1741.

EDD—**Ebenezer**, born June 25, 1715, married Sarah Church, daughter of Richard and Mary Church. She was born January 14, 1722.

EDE—**Joshua**, twin to Jonathan, born November 7, 1718, married Mary Nichols, daughter of Nathaniel Nichols of Framingham, Massachusetts, on March 25, 1743.

EDF—**Jonathan**, twin to Joshua, born November 7, 1718.

EDG—**William**, born December 18, 1721, married Mary.

EDH—**Peter**, born January 9, 1724, married Sarah Cowles, daughter of Timothy (who was the son of Jonathan and Sarah Cowles). She was born September 7, 1740, and died May 4, 1792. He died January 21, 1793.

EDI—**Thomas**, born August 9, 1727 (Intentions to marry Abigail Viles published March 15, 1750, at Hatfield, Massachusetts, thus Mary Corse may have been his second wife as Abigail Viles may have died young), married (1) Mary Corse on February 8, 1753. She was born August 2, 1727. He married (2) Rachel Simonds in 1772.

THE CUNNINGHAM FAMILY

Robert Cunningham settled on the south part of lot eighteen at Spencer, Massachusetts. His deed, from Colonel Joshua Lamb, one of the original proprietors of the town, bears the date September 9, 1731. He was born in Scotland in 1677, and came to Boston in 1717, where he lived until he came to Spencer. He had four sons; John, born 1700; Hugh, Robert, James, and one daughter, Jane, who married John Train in Warren, Massachusetts. He died May 13, 1766, age 89 years.

His son, John, married Ann Sinclair, daughter of William Sinclair, on March 22, 1739. He was a man of sound judgment and unimpeachable moral character. He was often promoted to offices of honor and trust and acquired large holdings having added 500 acres to his paternal estate.

JOHN AND (1) JANE CUNNINGHAM

(2) MARY

EDA — JOHN

John, son of John and Lydia Jennison Train, was born February 9, 1706. He married (1) Jane Cunningham, daughter of Robert Cunningham, on October 4, 1737. Mr. Cunningham was born in Scotland in 1677, and came to America in 1717 with his brother, Hugh, and sister, Margaret, from Ayrshire, Scotland. He settled in Spencer, Massachusetts. He had five children. They were: John, Hugh, Robert, James, and one daughter, Jane, who married John Train in Warren, Massachusetts. John and Jane removed to Greenwich Village, Massachusetts, where their daughter, Mary was born. After Jane's death he married (2) Mary. She was the mother of Orange, and possibly of John. He seemed to have pioneered considerably making it difficult to trace the family. In 1774, he, with his son, Orange, was among the first settlers at Tinmouth, Vermont. There he died in 1777. Their children were:

EDAA—Lydia, born 1738, died 1740 of scarlet fever.

EDAB—Robert, born 1740, died the same year of scarlet fever.

EDAC—Jonathan, born May 20, 1742.

EDAD—Robert, born July, 1744, married Abigail Wilson on March 28, 1770, at Stockbridge, Massachusetts. He fought in the Revolutionary War.

EDAE—Silas, born May 19, 1747.

EDAF—Mary, born February 20, 1751, in Greenwich Village, Massachusetts.

EDAG—John, born 1754, baptized in Hardwich, Massachusetts, on August 15, 1756. He fought in the Revolutionary War. He died in Tinmouth, Vermont, at the age of 86 years.

EDAH—Orange, baptized August 15, 1756, at Hardwich, Massachusetts, married Rebecca Spofford. She died at Tinmouth, Vermont, on February 14, 1813.

THE WILSON FAMILY

James Wilson. In the history of Leicester, Massachusetts, it states, "James Wilson came from Lexington and settled on lot ten on the Charlton Road about half a mile from the meeting house." He was there in 1714 and was probably the first settler, or among the first, in that town. How long he remained in Leicester, and when he came to Spencer, is unknown. His title to lot five in Spencer is 1730. He did not take possession of his lot until some years after. His house stood about fifty rods south of the Wire Village, where the remains of his cellar may now be seen (1860). He was often promoted to offices of trust while in Leicester and Spencer. Mr. Wilson built the mills lately owned by F. Howe, and later by Myrick and Sugden; they were the first erected in Spencer, having been built about 1740. He was the first deacon in Mr. Eaton's church in 1744.

In 1758 Deacon Wilson sold his farm and removed to Stockbridge from Spencer as at this time the Stockbridge Indians were selling their lands and removing farther west. The fertility of the lands on the Housatonic River arrested the attention of the people. He was a pioneer in the settlement of three Massachusetts towns: Leicester, Spencer, and Stockbridge. In Reverend David D. Fields' "An Historical Sketch, Congregational Church in Stockbridge, Massachusetts, 1853", he mentions the death of James Wilson in 1771.

His wife's name was Mehitabel and they had ten children. They were: Joseph, Dorothy, Sarah, Mehitabel, James, Anna, born 1725; Benjamin, 1727; William, 1729; John, 1730; and Azariah, 1731.

Joseph, son of James, married Grace Harrington of Brookfield, Massachusetts, in 1745.

Benjamin, son of James, was born in 1727, and married Mary Stower of Leicester on July 7, 1748. Their children were: Mary, born December 29, 1748; Abigail, born July 18, 1751, and Rachel, born June 21, 1753.

James, son of James, senior, married Lydia Vinton of Leicester in 1748. Their children were: Hannah, born January 28, 1749; a child born September 30, 1750; Elizabeth, born January 2, 1753; and Abigail, born May 16, 1755.

EDAD — ROBERT

Robert, son of John and Jane Cunningham Train, was born July, 1744. He married Abigail Wilson in Stockbridge, Massachusetts, on March 28, 1770. She was probably the daughter of James and Lydia Vinton Wilson and was born May 16, 1755, in Spencer, Massachusetts.

Benjamin and Mary Stower, married July 7, 1748, also had a daughter, Abigail, who was baptized June 23, 1753, in Spencer.

Robert entered the Revolutionary War as a private and was raised to the rank of corporal and sergeant. He fought at Fort Ticonderoga. He lived in Clarendon, Vermont when the 1790 census was taken and it lists him as having two sons under sixteen years of age and two daughters. In 1801-1803 he had an account with the Monckton Iron Works at Vergennes, Vermont. In 1804 he is with a group of first settlers from Vergennes, Vermont, who settled at Hopkinton, St. Lawrence County, New York. Accounts of the settlement mention Robert, Horace, and Harry among the settlers. It is presumed that Robert is the father of the latter two for he opened an account for merchandize immediately. Horace did not open one until the year 1807 when he probably married, and Harry, who worked in the store, did not collect his salary but it was collected by Robert. Their children were:

EDADB—Horace, born 1784, married (1) Aretta Powers about July, 1807, (2) Rhodina Woodworth, (3) Lydia Comstock, who died in childbirth, and (4) Lavina Barrett.

EDADC—Richard, born 1787.

EDADD—Harry, born , married Anna Murill.

EDAH — ORANGE

Orange, son of John and Mary Train, was baptized in Hardwich, Massachusetts, on August 15, 1756. He married Rebecca Spofford. In 1774 he removed to Tinmouth, Vermont, with his father. He served in the Revolutionary War. Rebecca died February 14, 1813, at Tinmouth, Vermont. They had quite a number of daughters. One, Marcia, married **Ballard** and another Gilbert **Dexter**.

EDADB — HORACE

Horace, son of Robert and Abigail Wilson Train, was born in 1784. He married (1) Aretta Powers about July, 1807. She died young. He married (2) Rhodina Woodworth, who bore him nine children, and (3) Lydia Comstock, who died in childbirth November 9, 1847, at the age of twenty-one years. He then married (4) Lavina Barrett. She was born in Vermont in 1798, and died at Hokah, Minnesota, in 1875. He outlived all his wives and died in Salem, Wisconsin, in 1880, at the age of 96 years. Wisconsin 1850 census states Horace was born in Massachusetts.

He took up a tract of land, southeast of the village of Hopkinton, New York, and lived there on Independence Hill until 1830, when he moved to

Stockholm, New York, near the farm of O. E. Phelps. He also lived in Pierrepont, New York. About the middle of the nineteenth century he moved to Wisconsin, locating at Southport (now Kenosha) and later in Salem, Wisconsin, where he is buried. His children were:

EDADBA—Edson, died young.

EDADBB—Horatio Church, born in Hopkinton, New York, January 12, 1814, married (1) Maria Eunice Bullen on May 21, 1838, in Salem, Wisconsin. She was born April 12, 1819, at Clinton, New York, and died October 7, 1871, at Salem, Wisconsin, where she is buried. He married (2) Mrs. Jennie Pinnager Dewey, November 18, 1875. He died in Minneapolis, Minnesota, July 5, 1895, at the age of 81 years.

EDADBC—Harrison, V., born 1816, died in 1895. He married (1) Emeline , who was born in Vermont in 1820, and (2) Harriet E., who was born in 1831, and died in 1915. He went to Wisconsin early, thence to California where he died. He was a Methodist minister. He was a Captain in Company "F", 16th Infantry, Wisconsin Volunteers, during the Civil War. One known child, Clarence, born 1859, died 1935, married Mattie B., born 1865, died 19... Harrison V. is buried in Alhambra, California, as is also his second wife and his son Clarence and his wife.

EDADBD—Phymania, born , married . Settled in Ohio where she died.

EDADBE—Abigail D., born , married Miles D. Hitchcock. She resided in Mauston, Wisconsin, where she died. They had three children: Agnes, Eugene, and Horatio.

EDADBF—Rhodina B., born , married O. C. Bundy. She settled in Wisconsin and later resided with her niece in Helena, Montana.

EDADBG—Hamilton, B., born , married . He was a physician and lived in Hokah, Minnesota, where he died. They had two children, Clarence and Theresa.

EDADBH—Pamela, born , married . Lived and died in New York State.

EDADBI—Edgar H., born , 1831, married Phoebe Goodell. He lived in Idaho, Oregon, and California. He was a miner, a pioneer, in Helena, Montana, in 1866. He died there on June 11, 1899. They had two children, Adah and Percy.

EDADD — HARRY

Harry, son of Robert and Abigail Wilson Train, was born . He married Anna Murill. They lived in the vicinity of Potsdam, New York.

He was born in Vermont and Anna was born in New York State. Their children were:

EDADDA—Harry, born _____, married Rebecca Cole.

EDADDB—Ashael, born about 1821, married Martha Cutting. He died on September 12, 1905. Martha Cutting was the daughter of Daniel and Harriet Spear Cutting. She was born about 1848, and died October 31, 1921, at the age of 73 years.

EDADBB — HORATIO CHURCH

Horatio Church, son of Horace and Rhodina Woodworth Train, was born January 12, 1814, in Hopkinton, St. Lawrence County, New York. He married (1) Maria Eunice Bullen, daughter of John and Mary Brockway Bullen, in Salem, Wisconsin, on May 21, 1838. She was born in Clinton, New York, on April 12, 1819, and died in Salem, Wisconsin, October 7, 1871, where she is buried. She was a granddaughter of the Reverend Thomas and Eunice Lathrop Brockway. Horatio Church moved to Kansas City about 1870. He married (2) Mrs. Jennie Pinnager Dewey at Kansas City, Missouri, on November 18, 1875. She was born in Farmington, Illinois, on April 14, 1842. There was one child by this marriage. He died in Minneapolis, Minnesota, on July 5, 1895, age 81 years. Horatio was a wagon maker. His children were:

EDADBBA—John, born September 1, 1839, died in infancy.

EDADBBB—John Lathrop, born March 2, 1842, married Ella Blossom on February 21, 1868.

EDADBBC—Mary Rhodina, born January 13, 1845, married Charles Clement, on January 16, 1867. She died in Hollywood, California, August 9, 1931. He died in Minneapolis, Minnesota, on March 26, 1922. Their children were: Charles, Bessie, who married Eugene Roth; Susan, who married Harry de los Davis; Van, who married Sarah Everett; and Helen, who married Fred Barthe.

EDADBBD—Susan, born February 8, 1847, married (1) William Reppy on May 31, 1866, and (2) Robert Bellamy. She died February, 1911. No issue.

EDADBBE—William, born December 25, 1848, married Florence Mills about 1880. He died at New Rochelle, New York, in 1887, and his widow later married Frederick L., his youngest brother.

EDADBBF—Charles Durkee, born January 19, 1855, married (1) Mahala Fry, July 16, 1890. She died in Noel, Missouri, on July 30, 1900. There were five children by this marriage. He married (2) Mrs. Pearl Richards Lasky in Belknap, Illinois, on July 17, 1905. There were four children by this marriage. He died December 26, 1936, at Mounds, Illinois.

EDADBBG—Harry Depue, born April 5, 1860, in Winona, Minnesota, married Dora Langdon (known as Freeland) in Kansas City, Mis-

souri, on June 18, 1881. She was born March 18, 1862, and died July 3, 1916, at San Francisco, California. He died July 15, 1915, at Kansas City, Missouri.

EDADBBH—**Frederick Lincoln**, born May 10, 1862, married Mrs. Florence Mills Train (widow of William) in 1893.

EDADBBI—**Cora A.**, born April 10, 1877, in Kansas City, Missouri, married **Harry Strunk** on September 24, 1902, at Upland, California. She died during the "flu" epidemic in 1918. One daughter, **Helen**. Her first husband must have been **Bruce** as her marriage to Mr. Strunk is announced as to Cora A. Bruce.

EDADBG — HAMILTON B.

Hamilton B., son of Horace and Rhodina Woodworth Train, was born , married . He lived in Hokah, Minnesota, where he died. He was a physician. His children were:

EDADBGA—**Clarence**, born about 1856, married **Mary E.** , who was born about 1860. They had a daughter **Edith A.**, born in 1879.

EDADBGB—**Theresa**.

EDADBI — EDGAR H.

Edgar H., son of Horace and Rhodina Woodworth Train, was born in New York State in 1831. He married **Phoebe Goodell** in Idaho City, Idaho, in 1865. He lived in Helena, Montana, where he died June 11, 1899. He was a miner in California, Oregon, and Idaho, and was also a photographer. His children were:

EDADBIA—**Adah C.**, born in Helena, Montana, in 1868, married **Emmett M. Fisk** on October 22, 1890, in Helena, Montana.

EDADBIB—**Percy**, born in Helena, Montana, in 1876, married **Lena Dillard** on March 12, 1900, in Helena, Montana.

EDADDA — HARRY

Harry, son of Harry and Anna Murill Train, was born in New York State. He married **Rebecca Cole** who was also born in New York State. Their children were:

EDADDAA—**Andrew J.**, born about 1831, married **Betsey J. Rose**. He died March 19, 1899, and is buried at Oneonta, New York.

EDADDAB—**George H.**, born , married . They had three children: **Frank**, **Fred**, and **Ida**.

EDADBBB — JOHN LATHROP

John Lathrop, son of Horatio Church and Maria Bullen Train, was born March 2, 1842. He married Ella Blossom on February 21, 1868. He died in Minnesota. Their children were:

EDADBBBA—George, born February 28, 1871.

EDADBBBB—Ella, born December 24, 1872.

EDADBBBC—Florence, born January 10, 1875.

EDADBBBD—Blossom, born January 18, 1884.

Captain Train was appointed to the United States Naval Academy by his greatuncle, Senator William Warner of Missouri. He entered the Naval Academy September 9, 1905, and graduated with the class of 1909, with the rank of Passed Midshipman. From July, 1909, to March 6, 1912, he was a watch and division officer in the old armored cruiser U. S. S. West Virginia (later the Huntington). On June 4, 1911, he was commissioned Ensign, U. S. Navy. From March 6, 1912, to March 15, 1913, he was watch and division officer in the old armored cruiser U. S. S. California (renamed the San Diego and sunk by enemy action in World War I off Fire Island, New York). From August 22, 1912, to November 22, 1912, he commanded a company of the U. S. S. California Battalion during the First Nicaraguan Campaign. On April 1, 1913, he was ordered to the U. S. S. Yorktown as Gunnery Officer, and on December 1, 1913, became Engineer Officer of that vessel where he served until July 9, 1915. During this period he took part in

the Mexican Campaign. On June 5, 1914, he was commissioned Lieutenant (junior grade), U. S. Navy.

Captain Train served in the famous battleship Oregon from August to September, 1915, as a watch and division officer. From September 9, 1915, to December 8, 1915, he was Engineer Officer of the U. S. S. Cheyenne, a monitor.

On December 27, 1915, Captain Train received his first shore assignment in the Communication Office in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., and continued in this duty until March 25, 1918. On June 5, 1917, he was commissioned Lieutenant, U. S. Navy, and on February 1, 1918, he was commissioned Lieutenant Commander (temporary), U. S. Navy. He reported as Executive Officer of the U. S. S. Siboney, a troop transport, on April 8, 1918, and served in that vessel during World War I until February 8, 1919. From February 12, 1919, to April 1, 1921, he was Gunnery Officer, First Lieutenant, and Engineer Officer, respectively, of the battleship U. S. S. New Hampshire.

On April 15, 1921, he reported to the Chief of the Bureau of Navigation for duty in that Bureau in the Officer Detail Section, where he remained until October 27, 1923. On June 3, 1921, he was commissioned Lieutenant Commander, U. S. Navy.

S. S. Mississippi and held that office until June 8, 1936, when he assumed command of the U. S. S. Vestal, one of the Navy's repair ships.

During the period Captain Train was in command of the Vestal she won the coveted Iron Man awarded for athletic proficiency, something rare in the annals of repair ships. She was extremely prominent in athletics in which Captain Train was interested for a number of years.

Captain Train relinquished command of the Vestal on January 16, 1937, and reported to the Chief of the Bureau of Navigation for duty in the Detail Section of that Bureau on February 4, 1937. He was commissioned Captain, U. S. Navy, on June 3, 1937. On January 28, 1938, he was assigned duty as Director of Officer Personnel in the Bureau of Navigation and remained there until January 15, 1940.

Captain Train assumed command of the battleship U. S. S. Arizona on February 3, 1940, and held that command for exactly one year, being detached on February 3, 1941, at which time he assumed the duties of Chief of Staff and Aide to Vice Admiral William S. Pye, U. S. Navy, Commander of the Battle Force, United States Pacific Fleet.

On December 7, 1941, Captain Train participated in the engagement between the Japanese Naval Air Force and the United States Pacific Fleet at Pearl Harbor, T. H. He was on the bridge of the Flagship California during the engagement.

Captain Train holds a Mexican Campaign medal, First Nicaraguan Campaign medal, Victory medal with transport clasp, expert rifleman's medal, expert pistol shot's medal, and is a member of Abdon Calderon, second class, which decoration was conferred upon him by the President of Ecuador.

He is a member of Columbia Country Club, Army and Navy Country Club, Army and Navy Town Club, in Washington, D. C., and a member of the Jonathan Club in Los Angeles, California.
