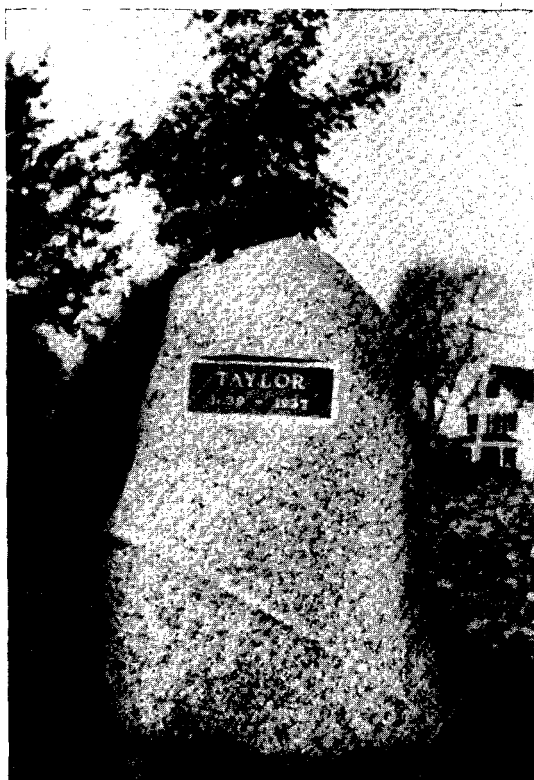

TO THE READER

War and the March of Time have caused many changes among descendants of Anthony Taylor in the eventful decade since publication of the compiler's *Anthony Taylor of Hampton, N. H. and Some of His Descendants, 1635-1935*. Some of these changes, together with important, newly discovered genealogy, and new biographical, historical information appear in the pages which follow.

In particular, preserved for posterity is the factual record of the Family in World War II. The record, of course, is incomplete, but sufficient to show that descendants participated actively and honorably, alongside their fellow-Americans and Allies, on the battlefronts and at home, in the global struggle with Germany, Italy and Japan.

Serial numbers, letters, and general arrangement are the same in these *Additions* as in the First or Tercentenary Edition of the Family History, facilitating ready identifications; but previously published accounts are not here reprinted. Therefore, to obtain all information available about any individual or family group, reference should be made to both volumes.

It is only fair to the reader, and the writer, to say that the *Additions* were produced under even greater difficulties than the First Edition. Not only was the compiler still confined to bed and chair (disabled veteran, total-permanent, of World War I), but throughout the work the Country was engaged in cataclysmic World War II. With the natural shortages in manpower, paper and other materials of book manufacture, plus the personal handicaps, the wonder is the Supplement could be produced.

The compiler wishes to note with appreciation the enthusiastic co-operation of descendants in furnishing information and photographs—all of which encouraged him to complete the undertaking. The increasing interest in Family History, especially by the younger generations, augurs well for the future.

FIRST GENERATION

1. ANTHONY¹ TAYLOR, of Hampton, New Hampshire, Emigrant from England, Founder of the Family in the New World:

His English origin is yet to be established, although anyone would think otherwise from *Banks' Topographical Dictionary*. In that publication Anthony Taylor who settled in Hampton very definitely appears to have come from Cobham, Co. Surrey.

Already the entry has misled a number of persons, and in years to come will confuse others unless widely refuted. Even the experienced compilers of the *Genealogical Dictionary of Maine and New Hampshire* (1939) found it "impossible to tell whether a positive identification or a good clue."

Hence, to help keep the record straight and make it entirely clear that up to now Anthony Taylor's English home is still unknown, the following facts are presented:

The complete title of the publication mentioned above is *Bank's Topographical Dictionary of 2825 English Emigrants to New England, 1620-1650*. It purports to be the topographical dictionary on which Charles E. Banks was working at time of his death. Published 1937, with editing, by Elijah Ellsworth Brownell, Philadelphia, Pa., it lists, page 167, Anthony Taylor, Hampton settler, as originating in Cobham, Co. Surrey, with the Banks' Manuscripts for authority.*

Referring to the Banks' Manuscripts (Bk. T, p. 1222, Rare Books Section, Library of Congress), it is perfectly obvious at once that Col. Banks never intended a positive

*Col. Charles Edward Banks, eminent medical officer in the U. S. Public Health Service, recognized historian, genealogist, spent five years in England collecting original records which might connect New England colonists with their English homes. He was compiling a topographical dictionary based on his research when he died suddenly, Oct. 21, 1931. His unfinished manuscript was published posthumously, some six years later, as stated. All his valuable collections of genealogical records and notes, called the Banks' Manuscripts, are deposited (1945) with the Bangor Historical Society, Bangor, Me., the New England Historic Genealogical Society, Boston, Mass., and the Library of Congress, Washington, D. C., which last has the bulk of them—44 titles in 56 volumes.

identification, but simply offered Cobham as another possible clue of origin—a clue like those in the First Edition of *Anthony Taylor of Hampton*, 21-3. Further, just before his death, Col. Banks wrote this compiler: "So far as I know, the English origin of Anthony Taylor has never been found"—a statement substantiated by one of his scrap books wherein he had preserved this compiler's tentative account of Anthony Taylor's sailing from London, 1635, for Barbados and St. Christopher, and the subsequent settlement at Hampton. (See *Anthony Taylor of Hampton*, 30-2).

The record Col. Banks uncovered relating to Cobham was in the Subsidy Roll for Co. Surrey, 4 Charles I (4th year of the reign of Charles I, or from Mar. 27, 1629 to Mar. 26, 1630).^{*} This lists a man named Anthony Taylor then living in Cobham, Elmbridge Hundred. It is marked 186-441, Surrey Subsidy Rolls, which, before 1940, were in the Public Record Office, London.

It seems unlikely the Cobham man could have been the Hampton settler, for the latter was born 1607-11, and in 1629-30 would have been between 18 and 23 years of age—ordinarily too young to be a freeholder and so included in the Subsidies.^{*}

In his original manuscript of the *Topographical Dictionary* (also, in the Library of Congress), Col. Banks wrote the names of many English Parishes in red ink. Cobham is so written. While no explanation appears, it is probable Col. Banks considered parishes so designated as promising fields for further investigation, and would have so stated by footnote or otherwise had he lived to finish what he called his *magnus opus*†.

On supposition that Cobham and vicinity—in convenient proximity to London, port of embarkation—might be

^{*}Subsidy Rolls were general Tax Lists as distinguished from Local Tax Lists. They represent specific grants by Parliament to the King in various years. Thus, Subsidies of Charles I were for the first, third, fourth and sixteenth years of his reign.

As Col. Banks says in his Introduction to the Dictionary: "Not many of the New England emigrants will be found in the subsidies because only a few of them were freeholders."

†Besides using red ink for certain listings, against others Col. Banks wrote in lead pencil "perhaps," or "?". In Brownell's publication, these "perhapses", "?"s and red ink do not appear.

a "promising field" and the Cobham man, while probably not the Hampton man, was perhaps related, a search was initiated, May, 1940, to be undertaken by Miss Doris A. Leach, recommended record-searcher of Ilford, Co. Essex, and London. A preliminary report showed that Parish Registers of Cobham Baptisms from 1565 to 1609 or 1610 were lost (Brayley, *Hist. of Surrey*; also, Powell, *Guide to Surrey Records*).

This precluded possibility of finding the baptism of Anthony Taylor of Hampton in Cobham up to and including 1609, but left open years 1610 (perhaps), 1611, and later ones. A manuscript copy of surviving Cobham Registers was located in the Minet Library, London; these and other available records were to be examined. However, before the work could get under way, the blitz bombing started, and genealogical research had to be deferred until a happier day.

THIRD GENERATION

7. SARAH³ TAYLOR (*John², Anthony¹*), of Hampton (Rye), N. H., married PETER³ GARLAND, mariner: her husband was most likely a grandson of Peter¹ Garland, mariner, of Charlestown, 1637 Boston, Mass., 1638, Dover, N. H., 1640—certainly *not* William Garland as inadvertently printed in 1st edition. See Dow's *Hist. of Hampton*; also, *Gen. Dict. of Me. & N. H.*

9. RICHARD³ TAYLOR (*John², Anthony¹*), of Hampton and North Hampton, N. H., carpenter, farmer, town officer (his wife's identity incorrectly stated in Dow's *History of Hampton*, incorrectly conjectured in *Anthony Taylor of Hampton*; her true identity discovered by compiler when Family History was in bindery—too late):

Richard Taylor married at Newbury, Mass., intentions Dec. 23, 1704, SARAH CARR (VR), daughter of James and Mary (Sears) Carr, born there, Mar. 8, 1682 (VR); died at North Hampton, N. H., after Jan. 26, 1757, surviving her husband. (*See Anthony Taylor of Hampton*, 77-8).

Her father, James Carr, has been a first class case of mistaken identity, genealogically non-existent, ever since printed family records. He has been confused by all authorities without exception—in every genealogy, local history, county history, genealogical compilation—with another man of the same name, similar age, who lived nearby but was not related or even married. Accordingly, up to now, his many descendants have been forced to accept not only the wrong emigrant ancestor, but also the son who had neither wife nor child*. The evidence is absolutely clear, bombproof, to be found in numerous unpublished deeds and probate records of Essex County and in other original records. Among references, see this compiler's note, *James Carr of Newbury*,

*The other James Carr, who never married, was son of George¹ Carr of Carr Island, Salisbury, Mass., ferryman at the Merrimack; b. there, Apr. 28, 1650, d. there, Aug. 5, 1726.

Mass., published July, 1944, *N. E. Hist. & Gen. Register*, 98:284-5.

Born 1650-3, place unknown, James Carr first appears on Massachusetts records, 1672, in all probability having arrived the previous year; was engaged at Iron Works, Rowley Village, 1672-3; soldier from Reading, in Narragansett Expedition and frontier posts, King Philip's War, 1675-6; settled at Newbury—first lived near Frog Pond, but prior to 1700, removed to West Parish, now West Newbury, and resided on bank of Merrimack River east of Long Hill until death, June 15, 1740; was a housewright, husbandman, free-man, freeholder or proprietor.

James Carr married at Newbury, Nov. 14, 1677, Mary Sears, daughter of Thomas and Mary (Hilton *alias** Downer) Sears, born there, Oct. 30, 1657; died in what is now West Newbury, Feb. 27, 1742. [Mary (Hilton *alias* Downer) Sears was most likely a daughter of William Hilton, one of the first settlers of New Hampshire, who came to Plymouth on the *Fortune*, 1621—next ship after *Mayflower*]. James and Mary (Sears) Carr founded the Carr Family originating in West Newbury. (See compiler's manuscript, "James Carr of Newbury, Mass. and Some of His Descendants").

*Probably refers to a first husband named Downer and the custom in many English parishes of a widow resuming maiden name but keeping husband's name as an *alias*; very rare in New England. See *Gen. Dict. of Me. & N. H.*, 333. Thomas Sears d. Newbury, May 26, 1661; his widow m. (3) Abel Huse of Newbury and had 8 children recorded there.

- JAMES CARR, deacon, mem. Mass. Legislature ratifying U. S. Constitution; m. Sarah Follansbee; res. Haverhill, Mass., Hallowell, Me., etc. 10 Ch., of whom Francis⁴ Carr, mem. of Congress, had sons, James⁵ Carr, mem. of Congress; Joshua⁶ Wingate Carr, Mayor of Bangor, Me., great-grandfather of Dr. Elliott⁸ F. Cutler, brain surgeon of Boston.
- DANIEL CARR, Ensign, Revolution; m. Betty Chase (*Charles*), (2) Elizabeth Chase (*Moses*); occupied father's homestead, Newbury, but rem. Brier Hill, No. Haverhill, N. H. 9 Ch., descendants include: Byron⁶ L. Carr, early Att. Gen., Colorado; Daniel⁷ Carr who owned and occupied (1945) historic Carr homestead, Brier Hill, No. Haverhill, whose s., Daniel⁸ Edwin Carr, Maj., USAAF, India-Burma-China front, World War II.

14. JOSEPH⁴ TAYLOR (*Richard³, John², Anthony¹*), of Chester, N. H., farmer; wife's surname incorrectly given in Dow's *History of Hampton*:

He probably married, about 1740, ELIZABETH LITTLE, who died Oct. 10, 1751, as indicated by following Family Record:

Joseph Taylor's son-in-law, Weare Drake, left a detailed account in his handwriting, entitled "Weare Drake, His Booke, containing the births and deaths of Weare Drake and Anna Drake, their children and theirs, *and the mothers* (italics by compiler). Following data on himself, wife, children and grandchildren, he wrote: "The death of Elizabeth Little was on Oct. 10, 1751." She may have been his wife's mother, though why use of maiden name is not clear; she does not seem to be identified in *Descendants of George Little of Newbury, Mass.* (1882), but her date of death "fits" with known records for her to have been the wife of Joseph Taylor.* (See "Weare Drake—His Booke," manuscript in possession of Effingham descendants, examined and communicated, 1944, by Edith⁷ Knowles Taylor (156.iv.) of Effingham, N. The account of this Family was badly reported, 1st edition, pp. 168-9: Horace Marshall was a Forty Niner; four children of Horace and Nancy (Taylor) Marshall did *not* "d. young" as there stated, but instead all grew up, married, went West, were pioneer or early settlers of California and Missouri, leaving numerous descendants now living in those States, Washington, Oregon, and elsewhere.

Horace Marshall was a blacksmith (shod oxen); lived in Biddeford, Bangor, Isle au Haut, Me.; in 1849, upon news of Discovery of Gold in California, he, Capt. E. H. Kimball, and others built a vessel on shares at Machias, Me., were towed to Boston where vessel was rigged, outfitted, including lumber for building homes; with 214 adventurers on board, they sailed to the West Coast, via Cape Horn; after voyage of six months, arrived at San Francisco, 1850; Horace Marshall was accompanied by oldest son Benjamin⁷; they went to Antioch, Pitt River, and prospected for gold in northern fields in such famous boom towns as Marysville and Grass Valley.* Horace Marshall is said to have died at latter "a few years afterwards, before his wife could join him." When husband left for the Gold Fields, Mrs. Marshall returned to Biddeford and ran a boarding house there for some years. She was always a Baptist though most of the family became Congregationalists.

Ambrotypes (patented July, 1854) showing the widow, sons Richard⁷ Taylor and Horace Turner Marshall, and daughters Elizabeth and Sarah, are (1945) in possession of grandchildren Cora⁸ (Dennett) Huse and Emma (Dennett) Skinner of Wakefield, Mass., and reproduced herein.

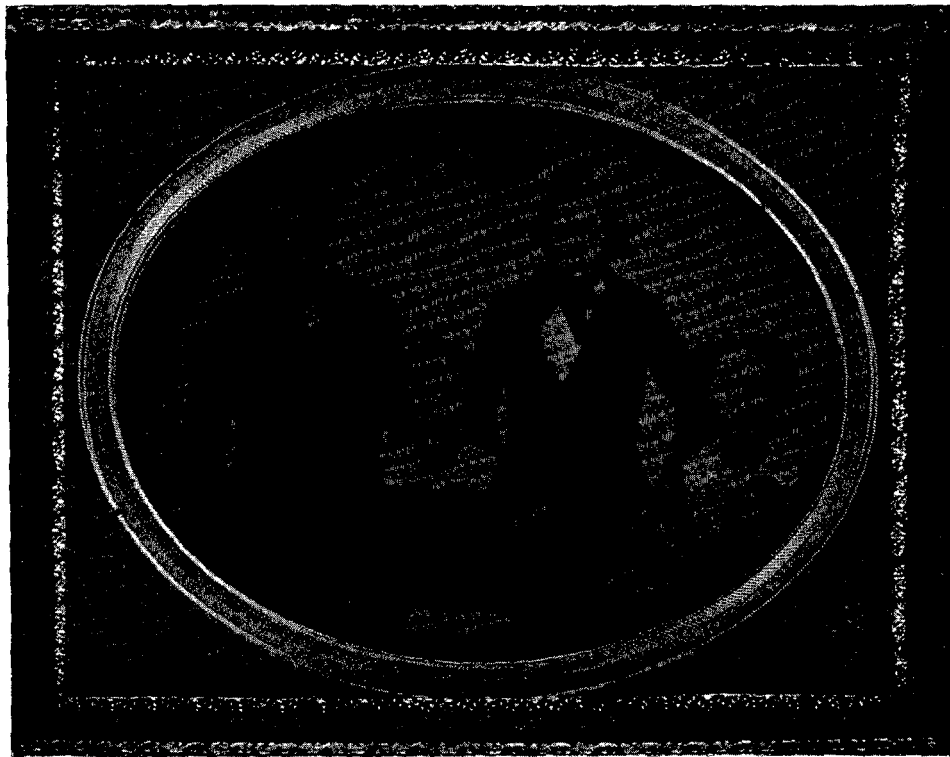

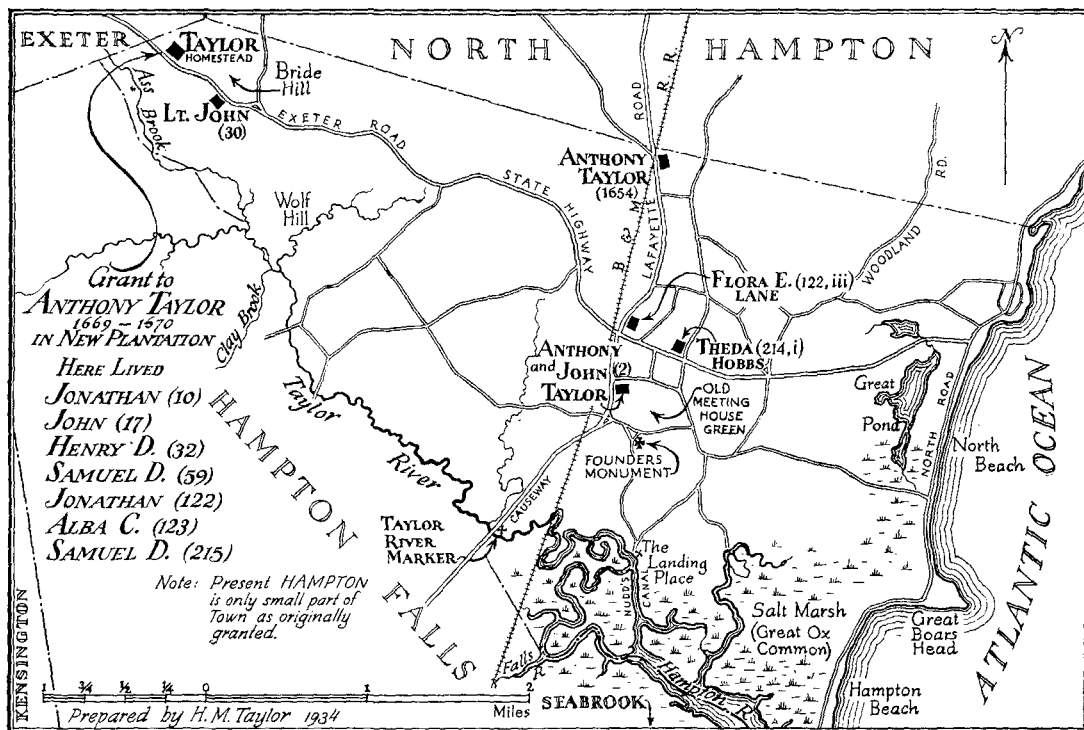

TAYLOR FAMILY STONE HAMPTON, N. H.

In October, 1937, following publication of the Family History, over 40 loyal descendants of Anthony Taylor erected in Hampton Memorial Park, Hampton, N. H., a monumental stone in commemoration of their emigrant ancestor, his wife, and the Family they founded. The Taylor Stone is on the east side of the Park, a short distance from Park Ave., on the left side as you face Founders Monument. Not far to the north, corner of Lafayette and Winnecunnet Roads, is the site of Anthony Taylor's last place of residence (See *Anthony Taylor of Hampton, N. H., and Some of His Descendants, 1635-1935*, p. 36 and illus. opp. p. 66).

Hampton Memorial Park, also called Meeting House Green and Founders Park, is probably without counterpart anywhere else in the country. As no description appears in permanent form, so far as known, an account of it has special historic interest.

This unique Park is situated south and east of Hampton's business center. Going north on Lafayette Road from Massachusetts, you cross over Taylor River, identified by roadside marker (*do.*, pp. 59-60), and a mile beyond, the Boston & Maine R. R. at Ward's Bridge. Take first right, Park Ave., for a quarter-of-a-mile, directly to Park. (See Map, opp.).

It was dedicated, Oct. 14, 1925, "as a mark of respect to Rev. Stephen Bachiler, the Father and Founder of the Congregational Church* and Town of Hampton, Oct. 14, 1938." It is a triangular shaped piece of land about 127 yards across the front on Park Ave., by 100 yards and 90 yards on the sides. The central motif is the Founders Monument, above referred to, a 12-ton natural granite boulder resembling a gigantic Indian arrowhead. In the corners of the triangle (three stones in each), are the Town Stones representing the parent town and the eight others subse-

quently severed from the original Hampton grant—Hampton, and Hampton Falls, North Hampton, Seabrook, Kensington, Kingston, East Kingston, Danville, Sandown.

Spaced along the sides of the triangle, between the Town Stones, are some 36 Family Stones, each commemorating a Pioneer Family.* These are somewhat smaller than the Town Stones, —each generally uniform in size, averaging about three feet in height, up to 300 pounds in weight. All Stones are native boulders obtained locally‡. Each one is firmly set on a cement base and is provided with a cast-bronze plate or tablet, cut in, inscribed in bas-relief with Family Name, date Family settled in Hampton and date Stone was erected. The whole collection suggests a modernized Stonehenge and the Druid monuments of old.

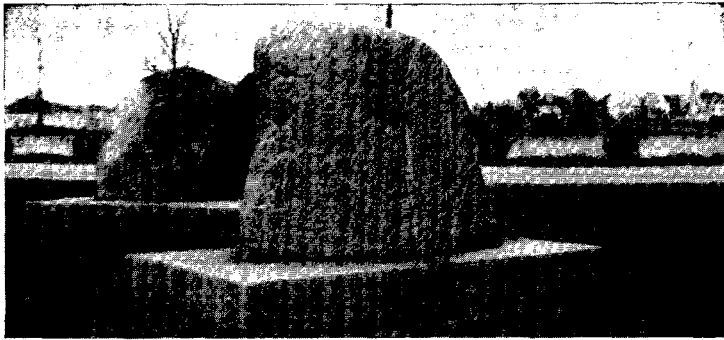
Credit for the idea of Memorial Park belongs to the late Rev. I. S. Jones, former resident of Hampton. Although not a descendant of a Hampton settler, he also contributed extensively both time and money to develop the project to perpetuate the names of the Hampton Pioneers. Without these long-continued expenditures, his idea would never have crystalized. Further substantial aid was furnished by the late Hon. Edward S. Tuck of Paris, France, who always maintained a lively interest in his native New Hampshire and the Town where his father, as a young man, taught school and where his emigrant ancestor, Robert Tuck, kept the first ordinary or tavern (succeeded by Anthony Taylor).†

Across Park Ave. from Memorial Park is a large tract of land, about 16 acres, which constitutes another part of the project. Here is a Log House, a Stone and Tablet near the site of Old Hampton Academy, and Tuck Memorial House containing the Hampton Historical Society and living quarters for the custodian and caretaker. The rest of the land beyond has been developed into an athletic field and playgrounds.

It was during preparation of *Anthony Taylor* that the compiler first heard of this Memorial Park. With considerable chagrin, he learned that individual Family Stones had been erected by respective descendants to most all of the pioneer settlers—with the notable exception of Anthony Taylor. Accordingly, at earliest opportunity, a circular was sent out, a subscription list started, and contributions received—with the ultimate result announced in first paragraph of this sketch. Being physically unable to go to Hampton to supervise actual work, he was most fortunate in obtaining the cordial assistance of Rev. Herbert Walker, then pastor of Hampton Congregational Church, and Mrs. Vina M. Jones, widow of the originator of the project, who attended to all details. The late Edward^s Morris Smith (28.vi.7.c.) of North Hampton also co-operated. To these are due the sincere thanks of the compiler and all members of the TAYLOR FAMILY.

And so, when Hampton celebrated its 300th Anniversary, Oct. 14, 1938, and visitors flocked to the Town and Memorial Park from far and near to participate in the exercises, the long-overdue Stone commemorating Anthony Taylor, his wife, and the Family which played such a prominent part for many generations in Hampton history, was there with the Stones of the other Pioneers.

son Robert entered Phillips Exeter Academy on Mr. Tuck's recommendation and lived at the Tuck home until young Edward, home from Dartmouth, found him a suitable boarding place; just before Lincoln's nomination to the Presidency, he visited his son in Exeter and also stayed at the Tuck home.
