## Introduction.

This is a historical and genealogical record of a branch of the Thompson Family, the descendants of Alexander Thompson, Fairfield District, South Carolina.

I married one of his great-great-granddaughters, and being interested in genealogy I decided to compile the record. I began this work in 1927 and soon brought it up to date. But did not get it published. So it lay dormant a while, but being born, marrying and passing away continued. So you will find that some of the family lines are not brought up to this date, but what is given is as accurate as I could get it, though there may be a few mistakes. It has been a rather laborious undertaking, due to the spread of the family as the stream extended, but it has been quite a pleasant and interesting work.

In the record, where the State is not given following the location, it means that the place is in Mississippi.

In order to save space I have used certain abbreviations which should not prove too confusing. They are as follows:- B - born; D - died; dau - daughter; mrd - married. All the months which could be, were abbreviated.


At the end you will find that I have added a number of appendixes. This is done in order to preserve and show certain facts and family connections.



Alexander Thompson was born in Ireland. He had two brothers, James and William, who were born in Fairfield District, South Carolina. Alexander, as a young man, was a pugilist or prize-fighter, being quite a man of the ring. He married Belle Campbell. To this union were born three children: John Alexander, Jane, and Simon. His wife died. He married again and reared two sons. Simon was killed in an accident while a young man. (This information was gained from an old paper in possession of Mrs. Horace Weir, nee, Cordie Hooper, Durant, Miss.)

John Alexander Thompson, B Aug 4, 1800, Fairfield District, S. C.

He mrd Sarah Rebecca Young. She was B Jan 30, 1808. He moved to Mississippi in 1847, settling in Winston County, near Bethsalem Presbyterian Church. He was a farmer. Was elected a Ruling Elder in that Church just after moving there, and continued faithful in this office until his death, Sept 28, 1875. Was Clerk of the Session for a number of years.

His wife died April 22, 1881. Children: Isabella Rebecca, B Aug 30, 1826, D Aug 7, 1830; Martin Young, B Nov 7, 1828; Adeline A., B 1830; Alexander William, B Sept 22, 1831; Julia Campbell, B Sept 11, 1834; Jane M., B Mar 9, 1838; Simon Leroy, B June 30, 1840; Isabella Rebecca, B Aug 30, 1844; Cynthia Caroline, B Oct 15, 1847; Mary Laura, B Dec 25, 1851.

Simon Leroy, D Sept 28, 1875, his father dying at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, and he dying at 5 o'clock. Jane M. never mrd; D Mar 4, 1863. Isabella Rebecca (2nd) D May 29, 1862. Adeline A. never mrd; D June 9, 1870. Mary Laura D Mar 9, 1863. Cynthia Caroline mrd Joe Frazier; they had no children; she D May 10, 1883.

Martin Young Thompson mrd Adeline Agnes Wilson of Alabama, Dec 10, 1851. He was apprenticed to learn the Tailor Trade when a boy in S. C. In later years he was a farmer. Deacon in Bethsalem Church a number of years. Served in the Confederate Army. His wife D June 9, 1870. He mrd

Mrs. Angeline West Hooper, in 1872. Spent latter part of life near Kosciusko. He D July 24, 1906. 



One day Mr. Smylie said to his partner: if you will do as I say, and as you see me do, we will get the eating business changed. So that day they went to the dinner table as usual. There was just a little on the table. Mr. Smylie broke the one "pone of bread" in half, took half of it, and passed the other half to his partner, who took it. They did the same with the few other things on the table. The two batchelors had to wait until the cook prepared more food. Afterwards, Mr. Smylie said: "Faith! And I thought if they had no sense, I would have no manners." From that time on, while they were ditching on that place, they had enough to eat. - Mr. Smylie had two sisters who came over from

Ireland and visited with him for a short time about 1902.



Patrick (Uncle Paddie) M. Johnston (brother of Sarah, see below) mrd Elizabeth Lammey (an Aunt of Dorothy Lammey who mrd W. B. Kerr). He was born in County Antrim in 1814. He D 1884, 70 yrs. of age. She D Nov 1893, being 76 yrs. of age. Their Children: James Mann; Margaret Ann, mrd a Mr. Mabus; Elizabeth Jane; Milliam Alexander; John Patrick, died young; Robert Anderson.

Sarah Johnston, B in County Antrim, Ireland. She mrd James Hutchinson. He B in County Antrim, Jan 1798. They lived on farm near Bethsalem Church. He D Jan 18, 1862. She D Feb 10, 1871, being 74 yrs, 2 months, 12 days of age.

Here is an account, given to me in 1925, of how Mr. James Hutchinson died: He was a bricklayer and was engaged in building a chimney for a Mr. Hudson, down on Lowbutcha, in southern part of Chectaw County. The Slave who cooked, wanted to poison his laster, Mr. Hudson. He put some seed from the Jimson weed in the coffee he made. Mr. Hutchinson said he did not like the taste of the first cup, and drank a second cup thinking it would be better. Mr. Hudson did not drink his on account of the taste. Mr. Hutchinson walked home, after a couple of days, almost blind. He lived only a week after he was poisoned. The Negro Slave leter confessed that he was trying to poison his master.

Appendix D. Stewarts.

John Stewart lived in Rosherry, Ireland. He D in 1822, age, 44 yrs. His wife, Mary ---, D in 1855, age, 79 yrs. They had five children of whom we know or have learned. There were three girls:- one mrd a Mr. Lilley; one mrd a Mr. Smiley; one never mrd and D in Philadelphia, Pa. There were two sons, Robert and James, who came to S. C., about 1837. It took nearly eight weeks to cross the Atlantic because a storm damaged the sails on the ship and blew the ship off its course. The usual trip then was about six weeks. After a while in S. C., Robert started off on his return to Ireland. James wrote his Mother to that effect. But we can find no further record of him.

James Stewart was 26 yrs of age when he came over from Ireland. Elizabeth Hutchinson was 14 yrs of age when she came over from Ireland and landed in Charleston, S. C. Lr. Stewart was a Tailor by trade. In 1913, Howard (Rev. H. H. Thompson D.D.) visited in Ireland and called on Ers. Jane Cameron at Bellamena. She remembered James and Elizabeth, and recalled that she, when a girl, would thread the needle for him in his tailor trade. It took nearly 8 weeks for James

Stewart to cross the Atlantic in 1837. Howard Thompson crossed by ship in 6 days in 1913. Now, in 1950, they can cross the Atlantic by Plane in almost nothing-flat.

James Stewart was B 1811. He settled near Blackstock, Chester District, S. C. He mrd a Miss Lee. Children:- Ellen, B 1841, never mrd and is buried in S. C.; John Alexander, B 1844; Jane, B 1847. Wife died and he later mrd Elizabeth Hutchinson. He moved to Winston Co., Miss. in 1855. He had to give up his tailor trade on account of his eyes, and engaged in farming. He was elected to the Office of Deacon, and later to the Office of Ruling Elder in the Bethsalem Church. He D May 14, 1895. She D Jan 20, 1904. Children:- Mary, 1849; Robert Scott, 1854; Sarah Agnes, 1859; Elizabeth Peggy Brice, 1862; Hutchinson McBride, 1865; Mecklin Fairchild, 1868; Hughle and William, never mrd, died and are buried at Bethsalem.

(The following is a letter written by A. W. Thompson while in the Confederate Army. It is given here because of historical interest. The blank spaces are words faded out of the original.)

Camp Near Dalton Georgia.

Jan 2, (1864?)

## My dear Father:

I take this opportunity of writing you all a few lines to let you all know that I am in good health. I have got entirely well of disease. Lighter rations of meat has cured me. We are having some of the coldest weather at this time that I have seen in a long time. Last night was very cold. I have nothing of any importance to write. Gen Johnstone is here in command of this Army. The roads are getting so bad here that it is almost impossible to haul anything. Father I received a letter yesterday from Martha and I was glad to hear that brother Martin has not been taken prisoner. I think Martin might write to me sometimes. The soldiers are all getting in --- spirits now. We have all been down in the spirits for sometime back but --- for sometime after I got up here. But I am thankful to Almighty God for his kind protection saves me. I made some very narrow escapes. It did seem that no one could of escaped being shot. We got the best view of the fight that we --- . We could see all of the enemy. You must write to me and let me know how many of the Negroes you have hired out. Martha wrote to me that she was going to try to get some stocks hauled to have some plank sawed for to curb a well. I am afraid they will make a poor out at hauling them unless you see to them which I know you will do. I do hope that I may get home in the spring to see you all again but I can't tell what is in the future but let us all trust in God for his times are the best times. I have read both of the books that Mother gave me through and I hope they have been of great bebefit to me and others are reading them now. We get very few papers of any kind here. The political papers have nothing in them worth reading. I noticed in a

paper some little time back of the death of an old friend of yours C Shannon of Camden, S. C. I heard that Van Shoemaker was mortally at the last fight Longstreet had. I have nothing more of any interest to write. If William Hanna gets to come home he can tell all the news. I remain your son. Write soon. My love to all.

I think the weather has been cold enough to save all the meat. Well I wish I was with you all to help you eat your sausage up. I don't think many of them would get to spoil if I was with you all.

(Here is given a letter written concerning the passing of A. W. Thompson to his widew, copied from the original.)

> Franklin, Tenn. Way 26, 1865.

## Dear Friend:

This morning I seat myself to answer your kind letter which I received last Saturday bearing date of the 19 of April. You requested me to write the particulars of your husband. Mrs Thompson it is a painful task to me to do it and a great deal more so to you. Your husband was brought to my house on the 1 day of Dec, and Mr McCameron and Mr Thompson's brother came with him and they stayed until the morning of the retreat and the Yankees were coming in and they were compelled to leave but Mr Thompson conversed with his brother about staying and he told him to go and not to stay and be made a prisoner. I prevailed on him to stay and he said no that he thought it best to go and he was fearful that his brother could not live and perhaps he could be of some benefit to his wife and children. Mr Thompson left on Saturday and your Dear Husband departed from this world on the next Friday. He died clapping his hands and praising his Maker and seemed perfectly resigned to his heavenly Father's will. He was engaged in prayer during all of his sickness. Almost his last words were that he could see his Dear wife and little ones once more and all the time during his sickness would he express himself that way every day more or less and nearly evAppen. ery morning when I would go into the room to inquire how they were he would say 0 that looks like my poor Mother had come and Mrs. Thompson surely I was a Mother to them for I did everything that could be done owing to the situation we were in. The Yankees came in the next day after the rebels left and went into their room and talked with them. They treated them very kindly. Mr Thompson died on the 23 of Dec at 7 o'clock in the evening and was buried the next day in our grave yard. Mrs Thompson I have a lock of his hair that I took off for your special benefit and I have a very fine Bible that he gave me a week before he died and a very nice needle case he gave me and requested me to be sure and keep them for you. My dear Friend I sympathize with you very deeply for the loss of your dear Husband but I hope you will put your trust in your Heavenly Father and prepare to meet him in Heaven. I will close for this time. I am in a great deal of trouble. I have a son in prison at Point Lookout, Maryland and I can't hear from him. Write to me as soon as this is received. I would have written long since but I did not know that I could get a letter through to you. Send me word whether Mr Thompson's brother has got home or not.

A few lines for Mr McCameron's Sister. He died on 22 of Dec at 8 o'clock in the evening and was buried on the 23 and he is buried by the side of Mr Thompson. I went to him a few minutes before he died and took hold of his hand and I said to him Jimmie if it is the Lord's will to take you are you afraid to go and he said no that there was plenty of room in Heaven for him. He gave me a heavy gold ring and a gold pen and requested me to keep them until I could send them to you. Jimmie bore his suffering with great fortitude and often spoke of his Mother and Sister. I will write to you and Mrs Thompson when my mind is better composed and write all the particulars and try and give you more satisfaction about them. I will close remaining your sincere friend.
