He sold this home and removed, in 1732 or 3, into Farmington, afterwards Southington, and now the southeastern corner of Wolcott, where he lived and died, respected and esteemed, leaving a numerous family, who have done great honor to his name. His wife, Rachel, died July 13, 1750, aged 56. He died Sept. 29, 1761, aged 68.

28, 1783. He married 2d, widow Mary Moulthrop, Nov. 24, 1784. He resided on the homestead, and was a man of large influence in the community, and in 1805 had the largest tax list of any man in the Society. He subscribed the largest sum for the settlement of Rev. Mr. Woodward in 1792. He was Justice of the Peace so many years that he was spoken of mostly as "Squire Charles," and the farm where he lived is known at the present time as the place of "Squire Charles Upson." He was accidentally killed in New Haven by hitting his head against a beam while riding into a barn on a load of hay, April 29, 1809, aged 57. His widow, Mary, died March 30, 1826, aged 76.

Mr. Upson was a man of fine character and genial kindly personality, an elder of the Calvary Presbyterian church of Milwaukee, respected and esteemed by all who knew him. He attended the common school and the Academy in his native town of Southington. He then taught for seven winters during two of which and also one summer he was in charge of the Union School in Farmington, Conn. In the spring of 1844 he began the study of law under Judge Lowry of Southington. In the following fall he entered Yale College law school, continuing there one year.

In the fall of 1845 he went to Michigan and taught school in the village of Constantine, St. Joseph County. The following winter having continued his law studies in the summer of 1846, he went to the village of Centreville and entered the law office of Gurney and Hammond. He taught the village school the next winter. In Jan., 1847, he was appointed deputy clerk of St. Joseph County. The following spring, after an examination before the Supreme Court at Kalamazoo, he was admitted to the bar. He was elected county clerk in 1848 and served two years. In 1852 he was elected prosecuting attorney and held that office until Nov., 1854, when he was elected State Senator. In the summer of 1856 he removed to Coldwater for the practice of his profession. When war was declared against Mexico Mr. Upson enlisted in a company that belonged to the celebrated Jeff Davis regiment and served in this regiment during the war. Returning to Jackson he resumed his business and continued here until 1850, when he went to New Orleans and joined the Lopez expedition against Cuba. Landing upon the island, Gen. Lopez found he had been too sanguine of Cuban help and so reembarked, reaching Key West just in time to escape the Spanish war steamer on his track. After this he returned to Southington, Conn., his birthplace. In 1857 he went to Kansas, where he remained two years. In 1860 he was clerk of the Interior Department, Washington. In 1864 he was appointed Indian Agent in Idaho and while there was nominated for Delegate to Congress and defeated. He died in San Francisco, Cal., in Feb., 1866.
