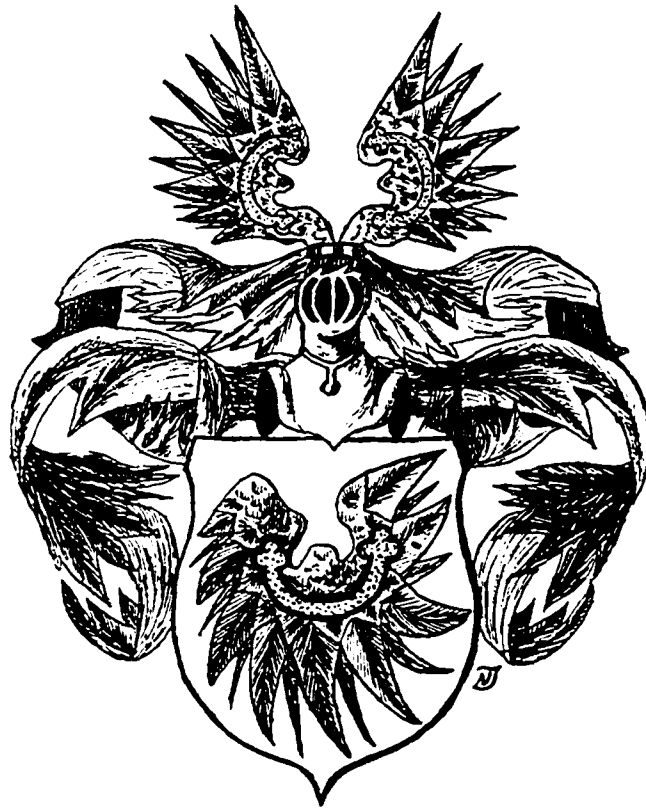

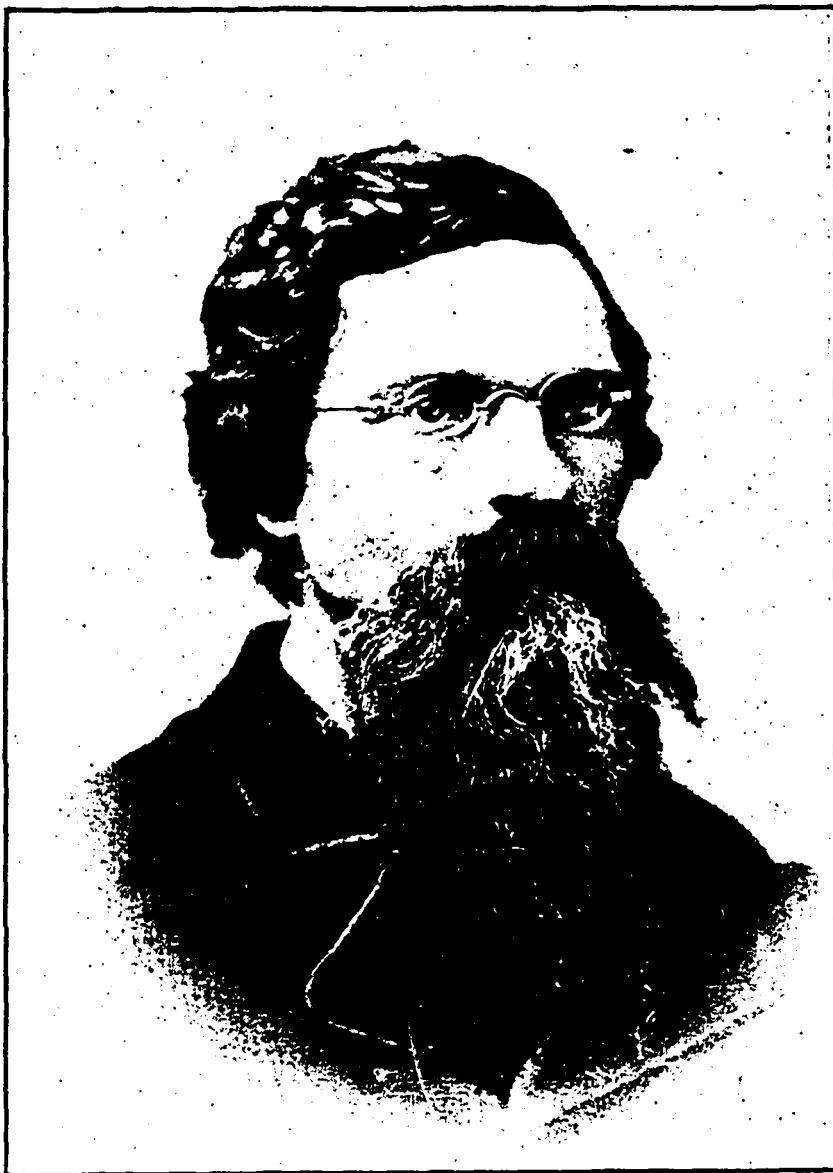

THE VOGTS VON DEM BERGE IN DÜSSELDORF AND AMERICA

CASPAR VOGT, Forestry Officer in the Grafschaft of Jülich, Cleve and Berg, was born in Sterkerade, near Düsseldorf, about 1750. He was the son of The Vidom Vogt von dem Berge. For many years he served as a Legionary under Eichmann. In 1787, Casper Vogt married Anna Marie Elisabeth, daughter of Carl Tangblodt. The children born to him were: 2a Carl Joseph Albert, 2b Helen Wilhelmina, 2c Gerhardine Margarete, 2d Elisabeth Maria, 2e Gertrud Maria. Caspar Vogt died in Düsseldorf about 1800.

2A CARL JOSEPH ALBERT was born in Sterkerade, July 4, 1788. He was a wholesale dealer and manufacturer of furniture. On October 23, 1814, he married Fraulein Katharina Antoinette, daughter of Wilhelm Nix, in Hüzizhofen. Fraulein Nix was born in Geilenkirchen near Aachen, January 4, 1794—she died at Düsseldorf, January 29, 1874. The children born to Carl Vogt were: 3aa William (Wilhelm), 3ab Elisabeth, 3ac Carl Anthony, 3ad Caroline, 3ae Josephine, 3af Katherina. Carl Vogt resided on Ratinger Strasse, Düsseldorf. He died in Düsseldorf, July 12, 1859.

2B HELEN WILHELMINA was born in Sterkerade, November 18, 1789.

2C GERHARDINE MARGARETE was born in Sterkerade, October 10, 1791.

2D ELISABETH MARIA was born in Sterkerade, July 1, 1792. In 1823, she married Johann Arenz (d. in Düsseldorf, April 4, 1856), an owner and proprietor of wine groves near Remagen-am-Rhein. The children born were: Carl (b. in Remagen, December 25, 1823), Peter (b. in Remagen, August 4, 1825), Franziska (b. in Düsseldorf, August 6, 1827), Baptist (b. in Düsseldorf, September 6, 1830), Wilhelmina Bernhardine (b. in Düsseldorf, February 10, 1831), Johann

Wilhelm (b. in Aachen, January 29, 1832—d. in Aachen, March 28, 1910).

Carl Arenz was the director of the Manual Training (Higher Trades) School in Prag. Peter Arenz was a chemist. Baptist Arenz was a Jesuit Priest and a Papal Legate. Johann Wilhelm was a merchant in Aachen. Frau Arenz died in Düsseldorf, July 6, 1872.

2E GERTRUD MARIA was born in Sterkerade, January 27, 1794.

3AA WILLIAM (WILHELM) was born in Düsseldorf, August 20, 1816. He was graduated from the Royal Polytechnic School of Düsseldorf in 1836, and from the Brühl Normal School in 1839. Dr. Vogt studied medicine at Heidelberg and at Bonn from 1840 to 1846. He took a prominent part in the student's rebellion of 1846, and was as a consequence provided with funds by his father, that he might escape from Germany for a year. After visiting South America as a ship's surgeon, he resided for a time as a house physician in the Charité Hospital, New Orleans. While practicing among the German intellectuals colonized about Belleville, Illinois, he was invited by the Governor of Iowa to visit Iowa City, and to translate the laws of Iowa into German. Before the latter work was completed, he married in Iowa City, on May 16, 1849, Mary, daughter of James O'Connor (Kerry)* of Clonassey House, Cashel, Ireland. After his marriage he decided to continue the practice of his profession in Iowa City. The children born to him were: 4aaa Carl, 4aab Catherine, 4aac William Jules, 4aad James Francis, 4aae Mary Anna, 4aaf Caroline. He adopted, in 1850, Peter (later known as Edward Vogt), son of Peter Maloney.

Dr. Vogt limited his practice to internal medicine. He was one of the organizers of the Medical Department of the State University of Iowa, and the first to occupy the chair of medicine. He was the president of the Johnson County Medical Society for several years. Doctor Vogt was the Postmaster of Iowa City during the years (1854-,) it was the distributing point for all the mail to the North-west. For over twenty years he was the president of the Iowa City School Board. He was the acknowledged leader of the German Democrats of Iowa and was a candidate for senator but was defeated. Doctor Vogt declined the Ministership to Denmark offered to him by President Buchanan. After serving as a Commissioner for Iowa to the Paris Exposition of 1867,

he studied in London and Berlin, and traveled for a year through Europe and the Orient. When a boy he studied music for several years under Mendelssohn; he was an accomplished violinist and singer, and, for many years, was the director of the Iowa Sangerbund. Doctor Vogt died in Iowa City, August 21, 1873.

Doctor Vogt's home occupied the quarter block on the north-east corner of Dubuque St. and Burlington Ave., Iowa City.

3AB ELISABETH was born in Düsseldorf, July 11, 1819. On May 5, 1854, she married Herr Gustav Worms, a government official and a banker of Düsseldorf, (see Worms pedigree below). The children born were: Gustav, and Heinrich. The Worms resided on Bolker Strasse, Düsseldorf. Elisabeth died in Düsseldorf, May 1, 1874.

3AC CARL ALBERT was born in Düsseldorf, June 27, 1821. He died in Düsseldorf during his infancy.

3AD CAROLINE was born in Düsseldorf, February 3, 1823. On April 13, 1865, she married Herr Joseph Bensberg (d. March 14, 1890), a coffee and tobacco importer. Child born: Martha (b. in Düsseldorf, January 4, 1867—d. in Düsseldorf, March 20, 1912). The Bensbergs resided on the Market Platz, Düsseldorf. Caroline died in her home city, April 6, 1909.

3AE JOSEPHINE was born in Düsseldorf, April 17, 1826. On February 12, 1848, she married Herr Professor Heinrich Andriessen, (see Andriessen pedigree below). Children born: Emilie, and Alice. The Andriessens lived on a corner of Ratinger Strasse and the Grand Alle in Düsseldorf. Josephine died there, February 28, 1903.

3AF CARL ANTHONY was born in Düsseldorf, May 28, 1828. He came to America in 1849 and took up residence in Iowa City. He was a breeder of fine cattle and horses, and was the leader in the trotting horse industry of Iowa. He married in Iowa City, January 29, 1856, Miss Bridget (b. county Clare, December 25, 1837—d. in Iowa City, August 3, 1912), daughter of Thomas McInerney (d. June 2, 1849) of county Clare, Ireland. The children born to him were: 4afa William, 4afb Louise, 40afc Albert, 4afd Carl, 4afe Mary W. Carl Vogt died in Iowa City, January 5, 1890.

3AG KATHERINA was born in Düsseldorf, September 8, 1830. On April 25, 1865, she married Herr Adelbert Kamp, a pharmacist, (see the Kamp pedigree below). The Kamps lived on the Market Platz, Düsseldorf. Children born: Katherina, Maria, and Paul. Frau Kamp died in Düsseldorf, June 15, 1903.

The Descendants of Doctor William Vogt.

4AAA CARL ALBERT was born in Iowa City, February 10, 1852. He traveled through Europe and studied in Düsseldorf from 1867 to 1873. He was Treasurer of Iowa City, and associate editor of "The State Press" from 1873 to 1881. Carl was editor of "The Burlington Gazette" from 1881 to 1889. From 1885 to 1895 he was trustee of the Public Library, and from 1889 to 1895, City Auditor of Burlington, Iowa. On October 31, 1883, in Burlington, he married Helen Fullerton Abercrombie (b. August 28, 1859), daughter of Colonel John Cree Abercrombie, a dentist, of Lancaster, Pennsylvania (C. O., 11th Iowa Inf.); no issue. Carl Vogt moved to Denver, Colorado, in 1896. After engaging for a time in mining enterprises, he became an auditor for the Colorado Iron and Fuel Co., and later for the Colorado Southern Railroad. He resides at 1628 Cook St., Denver.

4AAB CATHERINE HANNORA was born in Iowa City, November 15, 1853. She was graduated from St. Agatha's Seminary, Iowa City, in 1869. She afterwards traveled through Western Europe. Catherine studied in Düsseldorf from 1869 to 1873. She was summoned to the Court of St. James in 1872. On December 7, 1876, she married John Wesley, son of William Slater, (see Slater pedigree below). The children born were: Marie Wilhelmina, and William Alfred. Catherine died in Iowa City, June 4, 1889.

4AAC WILLIAM JULIUS AUGUSTINE was born in Iowa City, June 19, 1855. He was graduated in pharmacy from the State University of Iowa in 1873, and in early life he was the proprietor of a pharmacy in Iowa City, and later at Lemars, Iowa. He was the first medical student of the State University of Iowa (graduated M. D. 1881). He practiced his profession in Lemars, Iowa, and later in Omaha, Nebraska. Dr. Vogt never married. He is now the office manager of The Denver Electric Wiring Co., Denver.

4AAD JAMES FRANCIS was born in Iowa City, January 20, 1858. He is a real estate dealer by occupation. On June 15, 1882, he married Minnie West White (b. in Kalamazoo, Michigan, September 1, 1856), daughter of Professor

Elijah R. White (b. Boston, January 28, 1824), in West Union, Iowa. Child born to him: 5ada Edith. In 1878 he sailed with his uncle Commodore Francis Connor on S. S. Oregon from New York, around The Horn, to San Francisco. After a number of years as a druggist in, and the Postmaster of Lemars, Iowa, James Vogt moved to Kalispel, Montana in 1893. He was largely instrumental in organizing Flathead County, Montana, being the first commissioner and later the county recorder. He moved to Seattle, Washington, in 1898, and to San Francisco in 1913. He resides at 3255 Sacramento St., San Francisco.

4AAE **MARY ANNA** was born in Iowa City, December 20, 1859. She was graduated from St. Agatha's Seminary in 1874, and from Mount St. Joseph's College in 1878. Mary Vogt was the teacher of English in the Iowa City High School from 1880 to 1884. She married in Iowa City, October 5, 1886, Patrick Joseph, son of Thomas Toomey of Newcastle West, county Limerick. Children born: Thomas Noxon, a physician, (b. St. Louis, Mo., January 8, 1893), Mary Wilhelmina (b. St. Louis, September 10, 1903—d. St. Louis, February 28, 1904). (See "The O'Toomeys of Croom, and Their Descendants", and "Woman's Whos Who of America 1914-1915"). For many years, Mrs. Toomey has been the Corresponding Secretary, General Council, Daughters of the Queen of Heaven. She studied in Paris in 1908-1909. Mrs. Toomey was presented to Pope Leo XIII, and to Pope Pius X; since 1889 she has been prominent in charitable and civic work. Mr. and Mrs. Toomey reside at 11 Aberdeen Place, St. Louis, Mo.

4AAF **CAROLINE** was born in Iowa City, December 27, 1861. She was graduated from St. Agatha's Seminary, Iowa City, in 1877, and from Mount St. Joseph's College, Dubuque, in 1881. On April 20, 1905, in Leavenworth, Kansas, she married a lawyer, George Benjamin, son of Jacob Hufford of Austin, Texas; no issue. The Huffords reside on Evergreen Ave., Evergreen Heights, Austin, Texas.

5ADA **EDITH** was born in Lemars, Iowa, April 23, 1887. She lived with her parents in Seattle, Washington. Edith was unmarried. During her senior year in the college of the University of Washington, she was accidentally drowned in Lake Washington, May 19, 1907.

The Descendants of Carl Anthony Vogt.

4AFA **WILLIAM JOSEPH** was born in Iowa City, February 17, 1858. He was a stock breeder by occupation. He mar-

ried Josephine (b. December 16, 1859), daughter of Ziprian Aicher (d. in Iowa City, in 1900), in Iowa City, February 20, 1884. The children born to him were: 5faa Helen Mary, 5fab Albert Francis, 5fac Caroline Elizabeth, 5fad Edward Charles, 5fae Henry William, 5faf Robert Raymond, 5fag Leo Louis. William Vogt died on his farm near Iowa City, May 30, 1906.

4AFB LOUISE was born in Iowa City, September 23, 1859. She has never married. Miss Vogt resides in Iowa City.

4AFC ALBERT was born in Iowa City, June 2, 1861. He never married. Albert Vogt was an accountant by profession. He died without issue in Guadalajara, Mexico, March 15, 1911.

4AFD CARL ANTHONY MAX was born in Iowa City, August 25, 1868. He attended the State University of Iowa for three years. He is a merchant tailor by occupation, and is unmarried. He lived in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, until 1918, since when he has resided in Rock Island, Illinois.

4AFE MARY WILHELMINA was born in Iowa City, October 9, 1871. On January 12, 1898, she married in Iowa City, Charles Unash, a musician (b. in Iowa City, December 13, 1872). Children born: Florence Wilhelmina (b. March 4, 1902), Cora Louise (b. January 9, 1904). The Unash family resides in Iowa City. The children will soon be graduated from the State University of Iowa.

5FAA HELEN MARY was born in Iowa City, May 26, 1885. She was graduated from the State University of Iowa with honors (A. B., 1908), is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, and is a school teacher by occupation. She entered religion March 18, 1911, as Sister M. St. Theresa in the Congregation of the Sisters of Charity of the B. V. M. She lives in Chicago.

5FAB ALBERT FRANCIS was born in Iowa City, October 19, 1886. He married in Iowa City, June 3, 1914, Clara (b. in Iowa City, July, 1886), daughter of Paul Dilger. The children born to him are: 6aba John Edward, 6abb William Paul. Albert Vogt is an accountant by profession.

5FAC CAROLINE ELIZABETH was born in Iowa City, August 24, 1888. She was graduated from the State University of Iowa (A. B. 1921).

5FAD EDWARD CHARLES was born in Iowa City, October 12, 1891. He was a first lieutenant, Air Service, U. S. Army. He now is a senior medical student, State University of Iowa.

5FAE HENRY WILLIAM (HARRY) was born in Iowa City, April 8, 1893. He was a captain, U. S. Army, assigned to 108 Ammunition Train. He is now a senior law student in the State University of Iowa.

5FAF ROBERT RAYMOND was born in Iowa City, May 20, 1895. On April 26, 1919, in Davenport, Iowa, he married Clarie (b. in Iowa City, 1899), daughter of William Evert Smith, (b. in Iowa City, in 1868). Child born to him: 6afa Robert William. By occupation a pilot in the U. S. Air Mail Service.

5FAG LEO LOUIS was born in Iowa City, April 22, 1899. He served in "A" Company, 109th U. S. Engineers.

6ABA JOHN EDWARD was born in Iowa City, May 12, 1916.

6ABB WILLIAM PAUL was born in Iowa City, January 23, 1919.

6AFA ROBERT WILLIAM was born in Iowa City, May 11, 1920.

Herr Gustav Worms and His Descendants.

Herr Gustav Worms, a government official and a banker of Düsseldorf, was born in that city, June 5, 1821. He married Fraulein Elisabeth Vogt, May 5, 1854. The children born to him were: 2a Gustav, 2b Heinrich. Herr Worms resided on Bolker Strasse, Düsseldorf. He died in his home city, July 30, 1863.

2A GUSTAV was born in Düsseldorf, May 28, 1855. He is a successful merchant and capitalist. On May 29, 1901, he married in Düsseldorf, Fraulein Maria Konsinger (b. in Düsseldorf, January 24, 1868); no issue. Herr Worms resides in Düsseldorf.

2B HEINRICH was born in Düsseldorf, May 27, 1859. He is the proprietor of a book publishing company. Herr Worms married, on June 7, 1887, Fraulein Anna Müller (b. in Griefswalde, April 23, 1865). Child: 3ba Gustav. Herr Worms resides in Schoneberg near Berlin.

3BA GUSTAV was born in Berlin, May 18, 1888. He was a bank official by occupation. During the World War he was an aviation officer. He died unmarried in Schoneberg, May 3, 1919.

Herr Heinrich Andriessen and His Descendants.

Herr Andriessen, a professor of modern languages, was born in Elbenfeld, June 11, 1824. He studied at the University of Bonn. On February 12, 1848, he married Fraulein Josephine Vogt, in Düsseldorf. After his marriage he taught in England for seven years; he later returned to Düsseldorf. The children born to him were: 2a Emilie, 2b Alice. Herr Andriessen died in Geldern, June 11, 1856.

2A EMILIE was born in Ipswich, England, November 16, 1851. On August 8, 1874, she married Herr Max Dürr, an architect by profession (b. in Berlin, February 4, 1845—d. in Düsseldorf, June 30, 1877). Children born: Elisabeth Dürr (b. in Düsseldorf, June 18, 1875—unmarried), Emil Dürr (b. in Düsseldorf, September 5, 1876—unmarried—a consulting engineer by profession). She married secondly, Herr Arthur Wansleben, an artist, (b. in Krefeld, December 19, 1851—d. in Düsseldorf, June 19, 1917), in Düsseldorf, November 7, 1893; no issue. Frau Wansleben resides at Schützenstrasse, 49, Düsseldorf.

2B ALICE was born in Harwich, England, April 11, 1853. She is unmarried and lives at Schützenstrasse, 49, Düsseldorf.

Herr Adelbert Kamp and His Descendants.

Herr Kamp was born in Düsseldorf, June 6, 1823. He was a pharmacist and merchant by occupation. He married Fraulein Katherina Vogt, in Düsseldorf, April 25, 1865. The children born to him were: 2a Katherina, 2b Maria, 2c Paul. Herr Kamp resided on the Market Platz in Düsseldorf. He died in his home city, October 22, 1894.

2A KATHERINA was born in Düsseldorf, January 26, 1866. Unmarried. She resides in Düsseldorf.

2B MARIA was born in Düsseldorf, December 27, 1866. Unmarried. She resides in Düsseldorf.

2C PAUL was born in Düsseldorf, June 28, 1870. He is occupied as a wholesale importing and exporting merchant in Shanghai, China, and is unmarried.

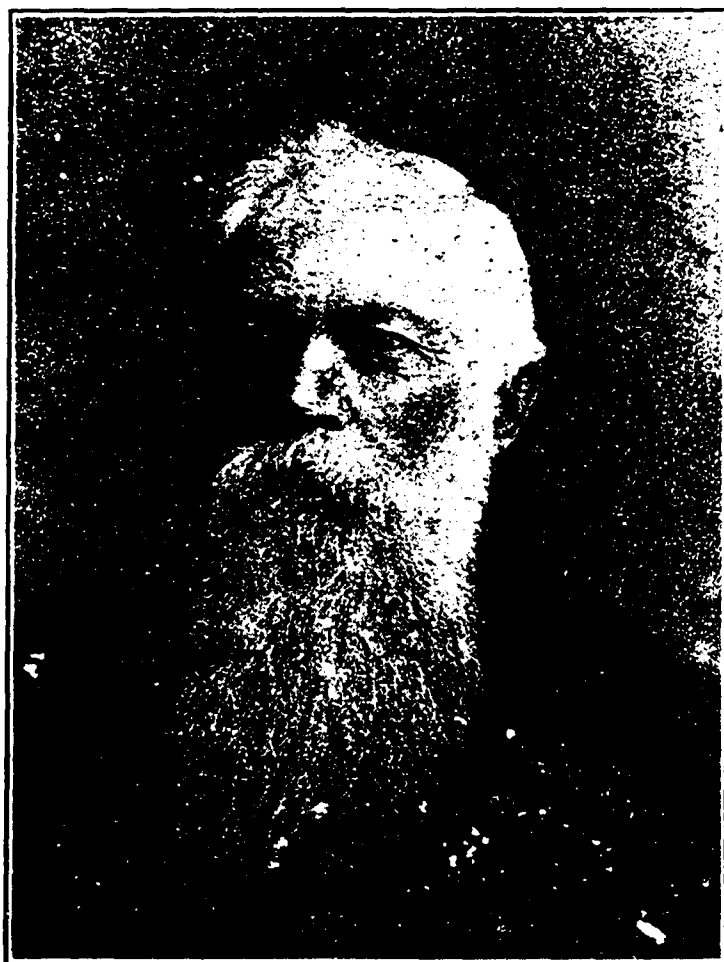
John W. Slater and His Children.

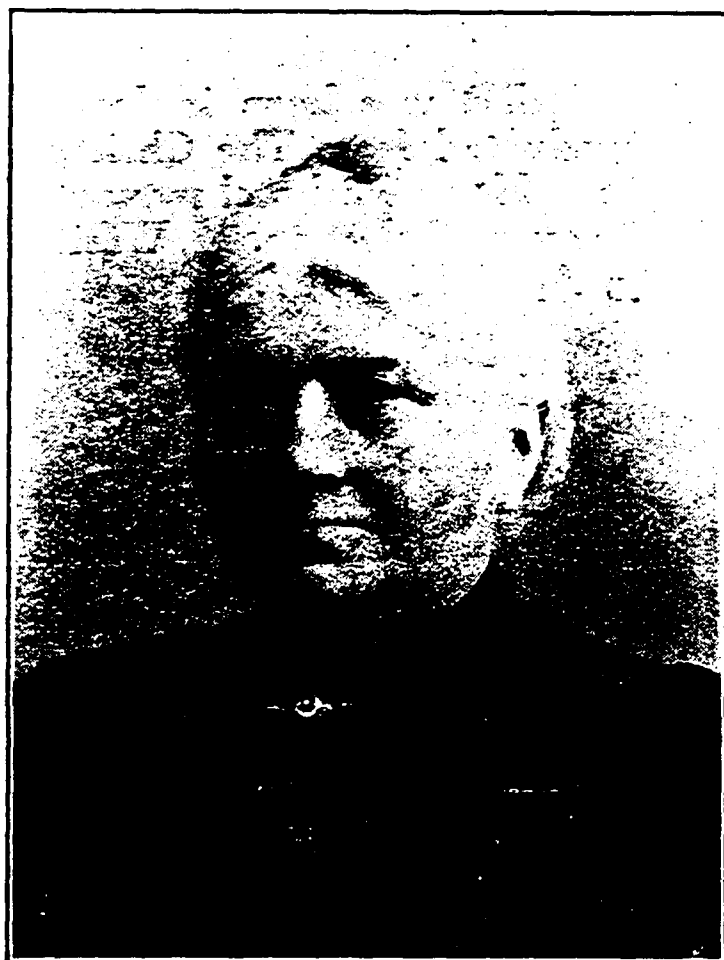

2A MARY WILHELMINA (MARIE) was born in Iowa City, June 13, 1878. She attended the State University of Iowa for three years. On April 18, 1900, she married in Iowa City, Dr. Charles Schaefer Grant (b. Ithica, New York, July 6, 1872—M. D., State University of Iowa, 1897), son of Chauncey Lewis Grant (b. Ithica, October 3, 1834) by his wife Martha Scribner Schuyler (b. Ithica, August 3, 1842). After their marriage the Grants lived in Riverside, Iowa, until 1908. Since then Dr. Grant has been practicing his profession in Iowa City. Children born: Martha Schuyler (b. in Riverside, February 3, 1901), Gertrude Scribner (b. in Riverside, October 1, 1905). The children are students in the State University of Iowa.

2B WILLIAM ALFRED was born in Iowa City, June 13, 1880. He was graduated from The Christian Brothers College, St. Louis, Mo. He was a hotel manager by occupation, and resided in Denver, Colorado. William died without issue in Iowa City, April 16, 1907.

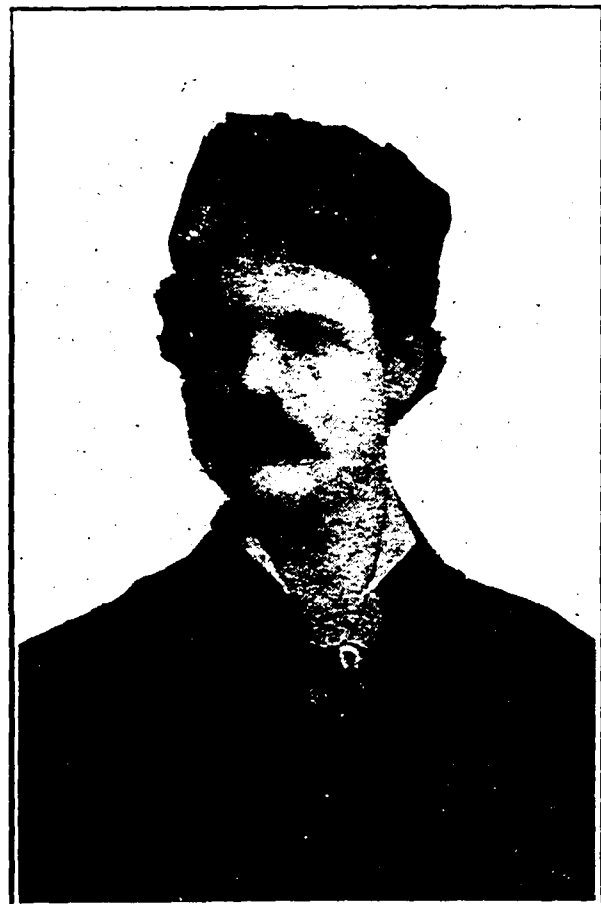
