Dr.Abel Waters fought in the Militia in the Revolutionary War in Capt.Samuel Curtis' South Company of Minute-Men in Charlton which marched on the alarm of April 19,1775. Service twelve days. The designation "surg.m."meaning Surgeon's Mate appears after his name. He also was a member of Capt.Abijah Iamb's Company in Col.Jonathan's regiment, marching from Charlton to Providence, R.I. on the alarm of 10 December 1776. Service eleven days.

^{*} Richard Waters left England, and settled in Salem, Massachusetts, U. S. A., in 1636.

SELECTIONS FROM OLD FAMILY RECORDS.

"Richard Waters is first mentioned in the records of Salem, anno 1636, where he has ten acres granted him."

"This may certify that my father-in-law, Wm. Plaise, gunsmith, departed this life in Salem, this fifteenth day of the 2d mo., 1646.

RICHARD WATERS."

"16th July, 1676, 'being ancient,' Richard Waters wrote his will, which was sworn to by the witnesses in court at Salem, 28 d. 9 mo., '77."

"Fourteenth February, 1715, Nathaniel Waters of Salem, buys of William King and Benjamin Marsh, both of Salem, one-tenth of the township of Sutton, deemed to contain about thirty thousand acres, of which one-tenth equals about three thousand acres, etc."

Among the officers and men from Sutton in the Colonial Service for various lengths of time, from 1755 to 1761, were, as Privates, John King and Nathaniel Waters.

Among the officers and men from Sutton in the Revolutionary War, was John King, one of the Sergeants.

Proofs of the authenticity of these records are to be found partly in the "History of the Town of Sutton," and partly from certified copies of will, deeds, and other documents, held by Ethel C. Waters, 8 Grove Place, Rochester, N. Y.

MEMORIAL OF DR. ABEL WATERS.

ABEL WATERS, son of Nathaniel and Mary Waters, was born in Sutton, Massachusetts, January 25th, 1749.

Born of a Puritan family, he was brought up in their faith, with the love and fear of God, and the strict integrity of character which so strongly marked the religious life of that people.

On January 15th, 1783, he married Sara Davis, widow of Captain Reubin Davis. They then moved to Charlton, Mass., where he practiced medicine, and where their five children were born.

As physician in a country town, he endeared himself to all, winning by his sympathetic and faithful ministries, the love and esteem so often won by those of his profession.

Late in life, their children having all married and moved to homes of their own, the Doctor and his wife went to live with their daughter, Lucy Bowles, in Wayne, Maine. Here his wife died, and, later, he moved to Augusta, Maine, the home of their daughter, Hannah Williams. In her family he spent the last days of his life, surrounded by those he loved, and cared for with a daughter's tender affection.

> " Thou hast walked by my side, and my board thou hast spread, For my chair the warm corner hast found, And told my dull ear what the visitor said When I saw that the laughter went round. Thou hast cherished me still, and my meaning expressed When memory was lost on its way, Thou hast pillowed my head when I laid it to rest, Thou art weeping beside me to-day "

On February 7th, 1829, he died, in the 81st year of his age.

MRS. ABEL WATERS.

SARA LEARNED, daughter of Elijah and Dorothy Moore, was born in May, 1749. At the age of twenty-four she married Captain Reubin Davis, who was also her first cousin. By this marriage she had three children, two sons and a daughter. After eight years of married life, Captain Davis died, and on Jan. 15th, 1783, Mrs. Davis was married to Dr. Abel Waters.

In their home at Charlton, Mass., their five children were born, and for many years her life was principally given to the loving care of these little ones, and the many duties necessary to "looking well to the ways of her household."

The sweet influence of her Christian character, and the refinement and cultured polish of her conversation and manners, were felt not only in the immediate home circle, but also by others whose lives came in touch with hers.

In the seventy-fourth year of her age, from the home of their daughter Lucy Bowles, where she and the Doctor had lived for some years previous, she was called to her Heavenly Home to receive the reward of loving devotion to her family, kindly charity to all, and earnest consecration to her Saviour.

ISAAC WATERS.

ISAAC WATERS was born in Charlton, Mass., August 22nd, 1787, being the eldest child of Abel and Sara Moore Davis Waters. When quite a young man he went to Boston and was in business with his half-brother, Ezra Davis, a merchant in Boston. He went to Europe and was there seven years, most of the time in France, on business for the firm. While there he went to Wales to the birth-place of the Waters family, and got the coat-of-arms of the family.

He was in France at the marriage of Napoleon and his second wife, Marie Louise of Austria, and was sent by Napoleon with despatches for the Czar of Russia, going all the way by carriage.

When John Quincy Adams was President, he was appointed appraiser in the Boston custom house, which office he held until General Jackson became President.

On May 15th, 1815, he married Josephine Augusta Hatch, and they had twelve children, of whom seven died under two years of age.

He was many years a member of Boston Common Council, and was the first one to propose the making of the public garden from the waste land on the river, where the city garbage was thrown. He died Sept. 26th, 1847, before the garden was fully made.

REUBIN DAVIS WATERS.

REUBIN DAVIS, second child of Abel and Sara Waters, was born Sept. 15th, 1785, in the town of Charlton, Mass., where he spent his childhood. When grown, he moved to Calais, Vt., where his principal business was farming, and where late in life he married Polly Jack, of that town.

He was a very peculiar and eccentric man, always dressing in "ye olden costume" of brown home-spun cloth, long tight-fitting coat with brass buttons, and tall hat.

After some years of married life, he and his wife went to live with a niece of hers in East Montpelier, Vt., where they both died, leaving no children.

LUCY BOWLES.

LUCV, eldest daughter of Abel and Sara Waters, was born at Charlton, Mass., in 1788; was married to Joshua Bowles, of Wareham, Mass, in 1809 and moved to Wayne, Maine. In 1840 she moved to Evansville, Ind,, where she died in 1875. Lucy Waters spent the early years of her life in Boston, where her naturally fine intellect received the advantages of education and culture. She was a deep thinker and polished writer. She kept herself thoroughly informed on the current events of the time, and was always found on the side of what she believed to be right. The elevation of the human race and the spread of the Gospel throughout the world, were to the last of her life, objects of her efforts and prayers. Soon after her marriage she became a member of the Congregational Church of Winthrop, Maine, and after her removal to Indiana, of the Presbyterian Church of Evansville.

HANNAH WILLIAMS.

HANNAH, second daughter of Abel and Sara Waters, was born at Charlton, Mass., Sept. 24th, 1791, where her childhood was spent. She, like her sister Lucy, was educated in Boston, which gave her fine opportunity for study. On Aug. 8th, 1816, she was married to Seth Williams, of Augusta, Maine, at which place they made their home, and where their children were born.

Vigorous in mind, she might have shone in the intellectual world, if opportunities had been given for mental pursuits; but with a large family and limited means, she was forced to lead a practical rather than ideal life. "The trivial round, the common task," afforded her full occupation, while a deeply religious spirit enabled her to meet her duties bravely, yet gladly to welcome the hour when she might hope to "fall asleep in Jesus." She "fell asleep" July 16th, 1866, in the seventy-fifth year of her age.

GARDNER WATERS.

GARDNER, youngest son of Abel and Sara Waters, was born in Charlton, Mass., October 3rd, 1793, where he received his early education. From there he moved to Augusta, Maine, and later on to Waterville, Maine, where he found his future wife, Charlotte Mathews, daughter of Col. Jabez Mathews, to whom he was married by the Rev. Dr. Cushman, Dec. 16th, 1817.

The war of 1812 found him enlisted, but he was not called into active service.

The love of study implanted in early life, remained with him to the last. His mind was original in thought, independent in judgment, being broadly and well-informed. He was a man of unpretentious character, preferring to spend his leisure hours with his books and study to a more stirring life in the world,
