GENEALOGY

Each lineal descendant is designated by a numeral before his name. The last digit in the numeral denotes his order of birth in his immediate family; the digit next before the last his parent's order of birth in his immediate family, and so on back to the earliest known ancestor who is designated by the single digit 1 (one).

From this it follows that the number of digits in one numeral reveals the number of his generation down from the earliest known ancestor.

Direct lineal descendants are listed—with numerals—on the left side of the page; the married—in spouse on the right side of the page—without numeral.

If in a marriage there should be one or more step-children they have added to their step-parent's numeral a "letter" ——a—b—c etc. instead of a digit, to distinguish them from direct descendants in the Wallace Allison Martin line.

"M" indicates "married", "D" - "died", "B" - "buried".

In case of twins both are given the same numeral. Adopted children are given the same numeral as if they had been born in the family.

Descendants are described in several categories—nativity in the immediate family—marriage——identity of the spouse——nativity of their children in turn——lastly a record of education, lifework, special service, etc., residence or place of burial.

The generations have been recorded in sets of two — first & second, second & third, third & fourth together, etc., parents with their children. All the families in one set are recorded before those in the next succeeding set are taken up.

In the first few families (usually large ones) only that descendant who became an ancestor of the Gordon line is recorded in the main genealogy;—in the Appendix a more complete record of these families are given.— From the Gordon - Martin family on, the aim has been to include a record of each and every descendant down to and through the present year 1952, in the main genealogy. In the Appendix the same has been attempted for the Allison-Buchanan family.

#### GENERATIONS I and II.

- 1702-1772 1, Alexander Wallace 1699-1767 M. Agnes 17, Jean was their seventh child, born 1731, died
- 1, Alexander Wallace came to York County, Pennsylvania in 1744 from either Scotland or the North of Ireland. In his home was organized the Guinston, Associate Presbyterian Church, near Muddy Creek Forks, York County, Pennsylvania, the second congregation of that denomination to be established in America, 1754. (see appendix No. I)

#### GENERATIONS II and III.

17, Jean Wallace M. 1, Gavin Allison, born Died 1782, many of this family name are buried in the Hopewell Churchyard, Hopewell Township, York County, Pennsylvania, near Stewartown.

171, Margaret was their eldest child (see appendix No. I)

17, Jean Wallace M. 2, Samuel Martin 1725-1804 who came from Wigton Scotland, first to Northumberland County, Pennsylvania, and later, on account of hostility of the Indians, to York County, Pennsylvania before the Revolutionary War in which he served for a time as a soldier. He was buried in the Guinston Churchyard. By a previous wife, Janet (?) McNeary he had four children; \_17b. Andrew was the second from the oldest of these.

171, Margaret Allison M. Andrew Martin, son of Samuel as above. He also served as soldier in the Revolutionary War, from York County, Pennsylvania (see appendix No. I) 1719, Margaret was their ninth child. March 7, 1801 - December 15, 1833

# GENERATIONS IV and V.

1719, Margaret Martin M. Rev. Alexander Gordon 1789 - August 1845. He was born in Montrose Scotland to John and Helen Hampton Gordon who spent all their lives in that country. They were very religious, members of a small conservative sect, the Anti-Burgher branch of the Associate Presbyterian Church, "the Auld Licht Kirk". They were industrious but poor as had been the parents of both of them. John was by trade a textile worker in a factory, a "thread miller", his wages fifteen shilings a week or less. A brother David in nearby Carrington evidently in easier circumstances had a son Peter who obtained an education and become a Presbyterian minister. Two of John's nieces or grand-nieces lived in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania during the latter half of the last century, Margaret Gordon and Jennie Gray. The home of the latter at 116 Race Street was used by Dr. S. Weir Mitchell the eminent Neuro-psychiatrist as a retreat or private hospital for his widely known "Rest Cure" for nervous exhaustion or Neurasthenic patients. "Gray" was given as the middle name to this compiler by Jennie's second cousin, Auntie Jane Gordon,

then living in the Murray home. John Gordon was lame the most of his life, he died in 1811, his wife Helen in 1810. To them were born eleven children, only four of whom lived to grow up.

Alexander Gordon was four times married; his first wife, married in Scotland, was Elizabeth Greig, daughter of John Greig, a member of the Established Church of Scotland. Within a month of her marriage she sailed with her husband to America, 1817, lived at Muddy Creek Forks, York County, Pennsylvania and died there in 1822. Their children

Alexander Gordons third wife, Elizabeth Craig, he married in Putnam N.Y. in 1834. She died there in 1839. His fourth wife, Sarah McQuarrie, he married, 1841, in Putnam, N.Y. also. She died at Johnstown, N.Y. about 1882.

171a, Alexander Gordon was born at Montrose, Scotland where his forebearers had lived before him. QUOTE "At the age of four years I began to follow my father to his employment which was that of a thread miller, at which I continued to labor for eight years. At first the work was tieing threads broken in the spinning machine. At thirteen he worked in a bakery from 6:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M. paid in bread for the family use. At fourteen he was apprenticed to a cotton weaver for three years. At this time never having attended school a day, he was unable to read or write. At seventeen he was bound out as apprentice to a weaver of "household cloth"; attended an evening school three months at one time and six weeks at another; borrowed some Latin and Greek books and taught himself. In 1809 at the age of twenty he was at last freed from the turning of all his wages over to his father, finished his apprenticeship, bought books and entered the Latin School of Montrose. Out of hours he wove sail cloth for his living. In 1810, believe it or not, he succeeded in "raising" a school of his own in which he taught summers and on November 10, 1810 entered the University of Edinburgh continuing winter sessions 4 years to complete the course and taking theological training on the side with a Prof. Paxton of a divinity school connected with the University. From 1814 to 1816 he did private tutoring and

also taught in the parish schools on the Orkney Islands at Stronsay and Kirkwall. He finished divinity studies 1816-1817 at the University, supporting himself by tutoring students in mathematics and medical Latin. He was ordained to the ministry, married, and sailed as a "missionary" to America in the summer of 1817, embarking at Leith, port of Edinburgh July 20, arrived at Halifax after 49 days at sea, spent 10 days there and ten more on the voyage to New York City; preached three months in the Carolinas near Natural Bridge. Disgusted with what he saw of Slavery he settled in York County, Pennsylvania at Guinston Church. Here he remained till 1826, losing his first wife and marrying one from his congregation. After about a year at Baltimore where my mother was born he went to Argyle Presbytery in N. E. New York State remaining at Putnam on Lake Champlain till 1842 where his second wife died and also his third and where he married his fourth. From 1842 to 1845 he preached at Johnstown, N.Y. died there and was buried in the Pre-Revolutionary Angelican Churchyard, since 1856 a closed Memorial Cemetery. His congregation set up a large tombstone, now fallen flat but with the elaborate inscription still partly legible.

171a, Alexander Gordon served the Synod of his denomination as Moderator in 1822. He was intensively religious, wrote many doctrinal articles for the Religious Monitor and other like periodicals over the pen-name "Ego". QUOTE "I also record it as a great favor of Holy Providence that I have had as free access to the press an any man who had money at his command". He was an ardent Abolitionist, wrote tracts and lectured against slavery. His home in Johnstown was a station on the Underground Railway. QUOTE "There was an anti-slavery meeting in Johnstown - 1843.....a riot.....stones were thrown and a poor colored man much abused. To prevent bloodshed the speaker Mr. Brown intimated he would leave the meeting as the house of Mr. Gordon would give him refuge. He and the colored man ran all the way to Mr. Gordon's house followed by the infuriated mob who threw various missiles at them. After the pursued had entered Mr. Gordons house the mob continued yelling hideously before the door". Elizabeth and Margaret Gordon 19 and 17 respectively approached their fathers home. Elizabeth "What shall we do?" Margaret "Follow me" and squaring her shoulders she elbowed a wide path through the howling mob up to the door and into the house.

A life long friend of the Gordons who voyaged on the same ship with them to America was Rev. Peter Bullions. He became one of the foremost classical scholars of the United States in his day. His Latin Dictionary, Grammer, Caesar, Cicero and other text books of the Classics were widely used for fifty years and more in American College and Universities.

Quotations and much other material in the above record are from a 170 page MEMOIR OF A. GORDON compiled from his diary and printed without family participation in 1846 by a former parishioner. Copies of this little book are still to be found in the possession of various families of his descendants. It is unknown whether or not the original diary is still in existence.

### GENERATIONS V AND VI

1719a, John Bullions Gordon M. Jane Kennedy of Johnstown, N.Y., aunt of the late James Kennedy, and son Wilbur.

Their three children died in earliest infancy and were buried in the Angelican Memorial Cemetery in Johnstown beside their grandfather.

- 1719a, Uncle John Gordon was born in York County, Pennsylvania, was a skilled carpenter and cabinet maker around Johnstown, New York for twenty years; was the first of all his connection to "go west", about 1865, plyed his trade building houses in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, later at Albia, Iowa. Spent several years in Des Moines working on the new Capitol, building stairs, and at other fine structural and cabinet work; drifted to California around Wildomar and Pasadena, returned to Cedar Rapids to die; buried in Linwood. Several pieces of furniture of his handwork are still in use in families of his relatives.
- 1719b, Alexander B. Gordon M. Sophia Pine Tizzard, English born, a widow with four children.

Their only child. 1719bl, Belle Blythe - 1880

- 1719b, Uncle Aleck Gordon was born in York County, Pennsylvania, glove maker in Gloversville, New York. Summers he travelled selling stocks of gloves in Cedar Rapids, Iowa and vicinity. He also worked as a mechanic at house painting, carpentry and cabinet making in Johnstown, New York. Retired to Cedar Rapids where he died and was buried in Linwood. With his brother John he purchased land near Albia, Iowa, on which coal was found and some time later prospected and mined for a time by his nephew David Murray.
- 17191, Aunt Lizzie Gordon was born in York County, Pennsylvania, employed as a milliner in Albany, New York for a time. Missionary to the Punjaub North India 1854 to 1900. Retired to Cedar Rapids, Iowa and later Pattersonville, New York, buried in the United Presbyterian Cemetery, Philadelphia, Pa.
- 17192, Margaret M. Gordon M. Andrew K. Murray, native born of native born parents,
  Montgomery County, New York, farmer there. Taught
  school, District No. 5 Schenectady County; also singing
  school, Choir-master, Dutch Reformed Church, Rotterdam,
  New York. To Cedar Rapids Iowa 1868, farmer and retired,
  buried Linwood 1901.

- 17192, Mrs. A. K. Murray was born at Thistle Factory a suburb of Baltimore Maryland, lived during her childhood and youth at Putnam, New York on Lake Champlain, attended Johnstown Academy and worked at glove sewing there till married, 1854. Influenced by her brother Rev. D. M. Gordon then pastor of the church at Kingston, afterwards Cedar Rapids, Iowa the family moved there in 1868. Died 1904 the morning after a Christmas Day family reunion.
- 17193, Rev. Andrew Gordon DD M. Rebecca Campbell Smith of a pioneer Ohio family. She accompanied her husband throughout his adventurous career and was buried beside him in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

- 17193, Uncle Andrew Gordon was born in Putnam, New York. Graduated from Franklin College 1850, Cannonsburg Seminary 1853, sailed in 1854 around Cape Good Hope to Indian and founded a Mission of the United Presbyterian Church in the Province of the Punjaub, North India amid perils and hardships during the Sepoy Rebellion or Mutiny. Invalided home in 1865 he toured in the United States lecturing on Mission Work in India, accompanied by a native christian Hindu and an exhibit of Hindu handicraft and curios. He also for a time ran a lumber yard in Cedar Rapids at 4th Avenue and 1st Street S.W. Regaining his health he went back in 1875 for another ten years of Mission Work in India and on his return again to America wrote and published a six hundred page book "OUR INDIA MISSION" many thousand copies of which were sold to the church people. He died at Clifton Springs, New York and was buried in the United Presbyterian Cemetery, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
- 17194, James W. Gordon M. Eleanor Dougall, native born in New York State of Scottish parents, worked some at glove sewing in Johnstown, New York before marriage. Was said to have been among the very first to have owned a sewing machine for that work.

17194, Uncle Jimmie Gordon was born in Putnam, New York, engaged in mercantile business in Johnstown, New York, in glove making and also in farming near there. In 1865 with his wife and two children he embarked on six months voyage in a sailing ship around Cape Good Hope to British India where he established an industrial and agricultural mission in connection with the United Presbyterian Church work of his brother Rev. Andrew Gordon, in the Punjaub Province. Returning in 1871 and purchasing land near Cedar Rapids he operated a dairy farm successfully for more than twenty years, supplying high grade butter to city families. In 1893 he sold out and bought a large old farm in Schenectady County, New York, The Taws place on which he lived the rest of his long life. Buried, Dougall Cemetery, Pattersonville, New York.

17195, Rev. David M. Gordon M. Sarah Graham of a pioneer Ohio family, graduate of the Oxford Ohio Female Seminary. In a nearby Men's College was Benjamin Harrison as a student whom she knew at that time.

17195, Uncle David Gordon was born at Putnam, New York, graduated from Union College, Schenectady 1859 and from Kenia Seminary. United Presbyterian Pastor at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Unionville, Ohio and Evans, Colorado. Buried at Loveland, Colorado. In Cedar Rapids the name of Rev. D. M. Gordon appears on the charter as one of the founders of the original YMCA formed in the city in the late 1860's.

Is a great lover of horses and an accomplished equestrienne. She assisted her husband in his profession and since his death lives at Palm Springs, California.

171921, Gordon Murray was born in Florida Township, Montgomery County, New York, graduated in the first class from the Cedar Rapids High School, 1873.

Attended Parsons Seminary in Cedar Rapids and Monmouth College, honorary PhD of Cedar Rapids Philosophy Club. Cashier for many years Sinclair Packing Co., Manager in Chicago of the Bicycle Stepladder Co. Traveled extensively in the United States, toured Europe one summer in company with Sloan Wallace. He was authority on the location of family relations far and near; lived for over twenty-five years in the Jackson Park section of Chicago, died of Stokes-Adams (heart) Disease and was buried in the Chicago Cemetery near his home.

171923, Edward M. Murray M. Flora A. Evans born 1858 Shueyville, Johnson Co., Iowa of a pioneer Linn County Iowa family formerly from Pennsylvania. She attended Cedar Rapids High School, clerked in N. O. Lawton's Dry Goods Store, was an accountant for the F. J. Upton Co. She survived her husband a year and a half.

- 171923, E. M. Murray was born in Florida Township, Montgomery County, New York. Graduated from Cedar Rapids High School 1876, clerked for F. C. Olmstead and C. Butler Weeks, proprietor of shoe store, at Kresge's \$1.00 store site, Murray and McClenahan, in Cedar Rapids and later E. M. Murray & Co., Cedar Rapids and in Davenport, Iowa. E. M. Murray invented 1890 the Bicycle Steplader, a rolling fixture for store counters and shelving, and from 1890 to about 1910 carried on the manufacture and sale of the same in Davenport and Cedar Rapids, Iowa and Chicago, Illinois. Subsequently leaving the business in the hands of his brother Gordon Murray he travelled extensively in Europe, sojourned in Switzerland and retired to Pasadena, California, raising oranges and developing real estate. Died in Pasadena, California of Pneumonia and Arteriosclerosis.

Author of Japanese English Grammar that ran through several editions, also of a number of religious books. ## NOTES

- 1. Letters to Rev. Alexander Gordon at Putnam, New York from the minister who succeeded him at Guinston, York County Pennsylvania lamented that his farmer parishioners there neglected the week day prayer services to haul lime to spread on for the enrichment of their fields (early conservation note).
- 2. 1712, Jean Martin who married Joseph Thompson, with her family, followed her sister Mrs. Alexander Gordon, when Rev. Gordon went to the Church at Putnam, New York on Lake Champlain. From there the Thompsons emigrated West to Somanauk, Illinois, in the 1830's. They almost persuaded Rev. Gordon to pioneer in the West with them in that early day but the precarious state of his health made him hesitate. (my mothers recollection.)
- 3. On his death bed in Johnstown, New York, August 1845, ageing Alexander Gordon lay fretting himself feebly over something which the grieving family finally made out was NOT their approaching bereavement, but: What would President Polk be able to do with the grave problems of Slavery, Secession and the War with Mexico which were besetting the National Government?
- 4. From many circumstances of his later years one might speculate that Rev. Gordons last illness was complicated with Pernicious Anemia, then a little known and unrecognized disease.
- 5. The old stone church of the Guinston Congregation (built in 1756?) is still standing, used now as a parish house or rural community center. Within is still to be seen the old style high pulpit (with stairs and gate at the top) on which Rev. Alexander Gordon sometimes found himself so giddy he had to descend and finish his sermon from the floor below.

# APPENDIX NO. I (Contt)

- 6. In that southern countryside of York County Pennsylvania and its Stewartown, Muddy Creek Forks, High Rock and Hopewell are still to be found many farmers and townsmen by the names of Wallace, Martin, Grove, Hyson, and other names recorded in this Genealogy.
- 7. 17107, Carrie Martin and Mer brother William about 1898 visited in Cedar Rapids, with their cousins 17192 Mrs. A. K. Murray and her brother 17194 James Gordon. Much later Ella Gordon daughter of James while visiting Carrie Martin in Bellevue, Pennsylvania obtained from her, records of the early Wallace-Allison-Martin ancestors, and kindly passing them on to the compiler provided the beginnings of this genealogy.
- 8. In his History of Big Spring Presbytery (Associate Presbyterian) J. B. Scouller mentions that Alexander Wallace came from Scotland. In another place it is stated that he came to York County Pennsylvania in 1730. That is 14 years earlier than is recorded in this genealogy.

James Gordon himself followed the sea as a sailor for a time in his youth, settled in America at Brooklyn in the jewelry business. One of his grandchildren also a James Gordon was known to the late Willy Donnan who gave us the Gordon address in Glen Ellyn, Illinois where we visited him and obtained their genealogy above mentioned. A short time after James Gordon lost his life in an automobile accident on the streets of Glen Ellyn. He was then in his 80's.

Jane Gordon was born in Montrose, Scotland about 1800, came to America in adult life, engaged in millinery work at Albany, New York. Retired with the family of her niece Mrs. A. K. Murray in Montgomery County, New York and Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Buried in Linwood Cemetery.

David Gordon M. Miss Hutton, member of a pre-Revolutionary Tory family living between Lake George and Lake Champlain with large land holdings which were forfeited to the Government at the end of the Revolutionary War.

Rev. David Gordon was born at Montrose, Scotland in 1804. Came to America with his brother Alexander 1817. Educated privately he became a pastor in Salem, New York and about 1841 went as a missionary to the Island of Trinidad where he died in 1843 and was buried there. His wife returned to the States, died at Putnam, New York and was buried in the United Presbyterian Churchyard there. Some of her people came West to Morning Sun, Iowa. A Mr. Hutton from there, recently in charge of a finance company in our building, told the writer the connection with the Gordon family of over a hundred years ago was well remembered by his people.
