

Webbers of Methuen.

(1) Edward Webber:

In 1703 Edward Webber married Patience Hobbs of Ipswich, Mass. He lived in Ipswich. Two children are known certainly.

(2) William, born April 22, 1711, in Ipswich, and

(3) Edward.

(2) William Webber,

Son of (1) Edward Webber and Patience Hobbs, was born April 22, 1711, in Ipswich, Mass. About 1737 he married Mary Wells, of Ipswich. About 1740 he moved to Methuen, Mass., (a township on the Merrimac River, near the city of Lawrence), as he was taxed there in 1740, his tax being £0 7s 0d. In 1760 his tax was £3 5s 1d, showing his gain in wealth. He united with the church on confession of faith in 1743. In 1760 he sold a farm in Pelham, N. H., to his son, William, Jr. His wife, Mary, died June 27, 1753. He married again January 1, 1754, to Lucy Kimball of Wenham, Mass.

After William's death, Lucy, his wife, was in Holland, Mass. (Did he move there before his death?) In 1789 he gives to his son, Daniel (15), a minor, four tracts of land in Methuen, including his mansion and buildings. Daniel (15) mortgages land in Methuen in 1797, so he was then at least 21 years old and must have been born before 1776. It is interesting that in 1799 he mortgages land in Methuen to Samuel Webber, Professor of Mathematics and later President of Harvard College, for security of a debt of \$295.

Son of Edward Webber (1) and Patience Hobbs, of Ipswich, Mass., married a Sarah ——— before 1749.

Edward, Jr. (3) of Ipswich bought land in Methuen in 1739 and sold it to William (2) in 1741. He lived in Methuen and later in Wenham. Probably, therefore, the Edward who was taxed in Methuen from 1746 to 1748 and again from 1751 to 1758, was brother to William (2). After 1758 he lived permanently in Wenham, Mass., and died there in 1764.

(4) William Webber,

Son of William Webber (2) and Mary Wells, was born June 18, 1738, in Ipswich, Mass. He was taxed in Methuen, Mass., in 1759, when he was 21 years old. He was taxed last in Methuen in January, 1761. He then moved to Pelham, N. H. He married Dec. 3, 1761, Ruth Merrill of Methuen, Mass. She died in 1765 or 1785 (figures not distinct). He married (2d) Elizabeth ———. His will was probated at Exeter, N. H., in 1801. Children are:

(5) John Webber,

Son of William Webber (2) and Mary Wells, was born Sept. 26, 1741, in Methuen, Mass., the twin of Joanna. He probably married March 11, 1769, Hannah Webster of Plymouth, N. H.

(6) Joanna Webber,

Daughter of William Webber (2) and Mary Wells, was born Sept. 26, 1741, at Methuen, Mass., the twin of John. She married March 13, 1764, Joseph Hodgkins of Ipswich, Mass.

(7) Benjamin Webber,

Son of William Webber (2) and Mary Wells, was born Sept. 29, 1744, in Methuen, Mass. He married in 1772 Rebekah ——— and had 11 children. Benjamin Webber was a private in Capt. Eliphalet Bidwell's Company, Col. Edward Wiggleworth's Regiment, during the Revolutionary War. In December, 1776,

he received pay for mileage from Albany, N. Y., to his home in Methuen

(8) Thomas Webber,

Son of William Webber (2) and Mary Wells, was born Dec. 5, 1746, in Methuen, Mass. He married April 4, 1776, Elisabeth Kimball of Wenham. He afterwards, or before, lived in Wenham. Probably he was the administrator of the estate of Edward Webber (3). He died Aug. 18, 1799. The deaths of three young children of Thomas are recorded in Wenham, births not given, Nov. 27, 1777; Jan. 26, 1787, aged 5 years; Feb. 12, 1795.

(9) Nathaniel Webber,

Son of William Webber (2) and Lucy Kimball, was born Sept. 16, 1754, in Methuen, Mass.. He married Sept. 28, 1775, Rebekah Peabody of Atkinson and moved to Londonderry, N. H. His wife was a daughter of Jacob Peabody of Leominster and a grand-daughter of Jacob and Rebecca Peabody, of Topsfield. (The Peabodys of that region think well of themselves now.)

(10) Samuel Webber,

Son of William Webber (2) and Lucy Kimball, was born Aug. 21, 1755, in Methuen. He married Elisa-

beth ——— before Oct. 5, 1785.

(11) Elisha Webber,

Son of William Webber (2) and Lucy Kimball, was born April 10, 1757, in Methuen, Mass. He married March 2, 1780, Esther Brown of Methuen.

(12) Lucy Webber,

Daughter of William Webber (2) and Lucy Kimball, was born Nov. 18, 1758, in Methuen, Mass. She married Feb. 17, 1778, Jesse Tyler of Methuen. Dr. S. G. Webber of Boston, Mass., writes:

“At Salem, I found that Jesse Tyler lived for a while at Topsfield, so births in his family may be recorded there.”

They had a son, Kimball Tyler. Horace Webber (35) married his second cousin, Relief Tyler, daughter of Kimball Tyler. Sarah (Whitcher) Marsten of Stoneham, Mass., daughter of Sally Tyler and grand-daughter of Kimball, writes:

“My mother’s father’s name (my grandfather) was Kimball Tyler and his father’s name was Jesse Tyler. Kimball Tyler was born in Methuen, Mass. Where his father (Jesse) was born we do not know. It is said there were three brothers who came over from England. One settled in Pennsylvania. It is reasonable to suppose one settled in Massachusetts,

my grandfather's grand—or great grandfather. Kimball was a butcher and worked for Peter Gage, of Haverhill, Mass., called Old Haverhill then. He went to New Hampshire to buy cattle. He called at a house and my grandmother came to the door. He was pleased with her appearance, an acquaintance was formed and she became his wife. Her name was Sally Streeter of Landaff. Kimball had three brothers. Elisha and Samuel both went to Michigan. Jesse died in Benton, N. H. It was thought he had heart trouble. He was sick. They called a doctor. The doctor left him an emetic. He took it and died while vomiting in the night. His wife was alone with him, except two or three little children. They lived quite a distance from neighbors. In the morning she sounded the horn and neighbors heard the sound of distress and went to her. Kimball also had three sisters, Lucy, Hepzibah and Persis.

“My grandfather's mother was Lucy Webber (12) and Lucy Webber's was a Kimball [see William Webber (2)]. We think Kimball Tyler might have taken the name Kimball from that family, though we do not know.”

(14) Andrew Webber,

Son of William Webber (2) and Lucy Kimball, was

born Feb. 18, 1763, in Methuen, Mass. He married Lucy Cross Nov. 29, 1784, in Methuen, according to the records there. They moved to the vicinity of Bath, N. H. Lucy, his wife, died June 11, 1828, aged 63 years. He married (2d) Mary, the widow Kincaid. She died June 6, 1844, aged 65 years. Andrew Webber was a stone-mason by trade. He was also a farmer and lived in Strafford, Landaff, Lyman, Bath, and afterwards with his second wife in Benton. He died May 10, 1845. He is buried in Bath, N. H., between his two wives. The tombstone, furnished by his son, Horace, gives his age as 84 years and 3 months. His children by Lucy Cross are:

Charles H. Webber, son of Horace (35), writes: "My grandfather Webber moved from Methuen, Mass., to Lyman, N. H., from thence to Landaff,

N. H. When I was about twelve years old (1842) father took his whole family—mother and five children—from Sandwich, N. H., where he was pastor of the Free Baptist Church, to Benton to see Grandfather Tyler and to Landaff to see Grandfather Webber, who had met with some reverses. When he died father furnished the tablets to his grave.”

Son of William Webber (2) and Lucy Kimball, was born between 1768 and 1776. He married Prudence Webber of Holland, Mass., in 1789, the year his father gave him the land [see William Webber (2)]. In 1793 a Daniel, perhaps the same, married Sally Webber, of Hopkinton, N. H.

Son of Edward (3) and Sarah Webber, married Anna Porter May 27, 1772. He lived in Wenham, later in Beverley. In Wenham he had children:

(30) Andrew Jackson Webber,

Son of Andrew Webber (14) and Lucy Cross, was born July 27, 1794, in New Hampshire, probably in Lyman or Strafford. He married Sophia Wilkins Oct. 31, 1816. She was born Sept. 18, 1794, and died Jan. 3, 1840, in Monterey, N. Y. They lived in Newbury, Vt. In 1828 they moved with five children to Monterey, Orange township, Schuyler Co., N. Y., overland by wagon to Troy and by canal boat from Troy to Geneva. Their children are:

In April, 1840, Andrew J. Webber married Beulah Welch, widow of Almer Welch. She was born Jan. 11, 1794. He died June 17, 1847, in Monterey, N. Y.

A history of Schuyler County says about Orange township: "About this time (1828) a family by the name of Webber came in from Vermont and settled along the creek (Mead's). This family, though humble and poor in the beginning, has by industry and perseverance made itself felt and well known throughout the country."

"A special town meeting was held at the house of Alonzo Gaylord in the town of Orange on the 17th day of May, 1836. Among the town officers elected was Andrew Webber, one of the assessors. At the first annual town meeting, March 28, 1837, Andrew Webber was again elected one of the assessors."

Son of Andrew Webber (14) and Lucy Cross, was born about Sept., 1797, probably in Landaff, N. H. He married Mary Tewksbury and moved to Newbury, Vt. Mary Tewksbury died Jan. 18, 1846, aged 49 years. He married (2d) Louisa Heath, widow, in Wells River, Vt. He died July 23, 1870, aged 72 years, 10 months, in Newbury, Vt., and is buried there. His children were born in Newbury, Vt.

Daughter of Andrew Webber (14) and Lucy Cross, was born Feb. 3, 1799. Jan. 16, 1822, she married Sylvester Gordon, who was born July 10, 1800. They lived in Landaff, N. H. He died Oct. 16, 1873, after which she lived with her daughter, Lucy Ann, Mrs. Caleb Wells, in North Haverhill, N. H. She died there Jan. 19, 1890, aged 90 yrs., 11 mo., 16 da. Both she and her husband are buried in Landaff Center, N. H. Of six children two died young.

Son of Andrew Webber (14) and Lucy Cross, was born Mar. 8, 1801. He married Mary Gordon, sister of Sylvester Gordon (see 32), and lived in Landaff, N. H. In 1851 they lived in Lisbon, N. H. In the cemetery at Bath, N. H., are buried two children: Henry S., d. Aug. 25, 1827, aged 1 yr., 10 mo.; and Charles, d. July 30, 1829, aged 5 yrs., 7 mo. Mary Gordon died in Landaff, N. H., in 1862. Nathaniel moved with his family to Manchester, Delaware Co.,

Iowa, and lived on a farm about a mile and a half south of Manchester. He died Aug. 16, 1878, and is buried in Manchester.

He was a preacher and a farmer by turns and lived in several places in New Hampshire. In 1864 he had a farm in Hill, N. H. He died in Sandbornton, N. H., on town meeting day in March, 1868, aged 65 years. His wife, Mahala, was born Dec. 14, 1804, and died May 29, 1882.

Son of Andrew Webber (14) and Lucy Cross, was born April 19, 1807, in Lyman, N. H. He was married in Benton, N. H., March 6, 1827, by Rev. Mr. Baker to his second cousin, Relief Tyler, daughter of Kimball Tyler and Sally Streeter (see 12). Relief Tyler was born Nov. 2, 1805, in Benton, N. H. Horace Webber was a Free Baptist preacher in New Hampshire. One pastorate was at Woodstock, but the last was in Ossipee, whence he moved in 1859. He died there Feb. 21, 1862, aged 64 years. His wife, also, died there Dec. 30, 1889, aged 84 years. Both are buried in Ossipee, N. H.

Son of Joseph Webber and Nancy Mallet, was born in 1818. He married Mary Hays Feb. 15, 1843. He lived in Monterey, N. Y., where he worked for Lorenzo Webber (40) for a time. About 1875 he moved to Montcalm County, Mich., where he lived with his second wife. He died in Six Lakes, Montcalm Co., Mich., about 1893.

Daughter of Joseph Webber and Nancy Mallet, married Charles Stow of Benton, N. H., in Monterey, N. Y. Her children are two girls and one boy. She lives in Huron, Beadle Co., South Dakota.

Son of Andrew J. Webber (30) and Sophia Wilkins,

was born Sept. 12, 1817, in Newbury, Orange Co., Vt. He moved with his father in 1828 to Monterey, Orange township, Schuyler Co., N. Y. He married Feb. 27, 1840, Jane Albina Welch, daughter of Almer Welch and Beulah Kent. His father (30) married Mrs. Beulah Welch in April, 1840. In 1864 and 1865 he represented his district for two terms in the New York Assembly. May 1, 1867 he moved to Elmira, N. Y., where he died Nov. 15, 1884. Before his death he weighed 267 pounds. Jane Albina Welch was born Nov. 28, 1818, in Pawlet, Vt., and died Jan. 5, 1891, in Elmira, N. Y. Their children were born in Monterey, N. Y.

He died Aug. 11, 1883, in Monterey. Hannah, his wife, died Dec. 13, 1883, in Virginia. Both are buried in Monterey, N. Y.

Son of Andrew J. Webber (30) and Sophia Wilkins,

was born May 25, 1823, in Newbury, Vt. His father took him to Monterey, N. Y., in 1828. He married Maryette Bowen June 27, 1846, in Union Springs, N. Y. Maryette Bowen was born in Ledyard, Cayuga Co., N. Y., July 1, 1823, and died April 8, 1859, aged 35 yrs., 9 mo., 7 da. Their children are:

In 1855 Samuel W. Webber moved to Ionia County, Michigan, where he engaged in farming. April 11, 1890, in Ionia, Mich., without children. He married E. Gertrude Brown Nov. 1, 1890, in Boston, Mass. One child:

George W. Webber engaged in the lumbering business in Manistee County, Mich., from 1852 to 1858, when he removed to Ionia County, first to Lyons, and later to Ionia. In 1868 he started a private bank in Muir with his brother, Samuel, which he sold to Samuel four years later. He was one of the founders, and later president, of the Second National Bank of Ionia, which was changed to Webber Bros., Bankers, owned by himself and his brother, A. Jackson. For fifteen years he engaged with his brother, A. Jackson, in the lumbering business in Mecosta County. He was twice elected mayor of Ionia and was elected to the forty-seventh Congress from the fifth district of Michigan.

was born June 25, 1827, in Newbury, Vt. He married Louise Tompkins in Monterey, N. Y.

Oscar Webber engaged in the mercantile business in Monterey, N. Y., in the firm of L. & O. Webber, and in the same business in Ionia, Mich., when he removed there. He was member of the firm of Webber & Chapin, Bankers, in Stanton, Mich., until he sold his interest to Chapin in 1893. He is called by his relatives "the best Webber living."
