P R E F A C E

Research on this line was started by Hon. Elisha C. Leonard of New Bedford, Mass. Then Mr. Josiah H. Drummond of Portland, Me., became interested and turned over the data to Mr. J. Oliver Williams of Brookline, Mass., to complete. Mr. Williams is a descendant of Emmanuel Williams.

Mr. Leonard and Mr. Drummond were making research studies of the two early Williams' families of Taunton. In preparing the Genealogy of Richard Williams of Taunton, they found names and families by the name of Williams not belonging to the line of Richard, although some of the descendants of Emmanuel Williams for a time thought that they were descendants of Richard.

Mr. J. Oliver Williams, during the past 40 years, has collected the data of the later generations, but it is far from complete.

Mr. Drummond did not attempt to trace the female lines. This has been edited and arranged by Mr. J. Oliver Williams of Brookline, Mass., formerly of New York City.

The first generations were published in the New England Historical & Genealogical Register, Vol LVII, Jan. 1903, by the Author, but many corrections and additions are now made.

EMMANUEL WILLIAMS

TAUNTON, MASS,

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William Makepeace and Abigail Tiedale, the father and mother of Abigail Makepeace, were married Dec. 2, 1685, and she was born Nov. 26, 1686. (Freetown Records). Makepeace conveyed to Mr. "Immanuel Williams" the husband of his daughter, June 10th, 1703, fifty acres of land as the portion of Immanuel Williams and his wife Abigail, daughter of said William Makepeace, in his estate.

Abigail was then but sixteen years old, six months and fifteen days, and had undoubtedly just been married and this land was a marriage portion.

It has been suggested that this may have been a second marriage of Emmanuel, but there is no ground for such a supposition, for he died intestate and Oct. 8, 1730, his real estate was divided among his six children, and William Makepeace, by will dated Nov. 16, 1736, leaves legacies to the six children of his daughter Abigail, not naming them.

Emmanuel's wife, Abigail Makepeace, is descended direct from Abel Makepeace, Esq., who married a daughter of Lawrence Washington, Esq. of Gray's Inn, Mayor of Northampton, 1532-1543, in England. This Lawrence Washington was the Ancestor of our George Washington, the first President of the United States. See book of Burke's "Visitation of Seats and Arms of the Noblemen and Gentlemen of Great Britain", published in London in 1852. Grantee of Sulgrave Manor, birthplace of George Washington.

This Williams' line also connects with Mr. Thomas Rogers, Mayflower Ancestor, through Abigail Tisdale who married William Makepeace. Also with Gov. Thomas Hinckley of Barnstable, Gov. of Plymouth Colony. Also with Capt. Peter Tufts of Medford, Mass., Founder of Tuft's College. He married Mercy Cotton daughter of Rev. Seaborn Cotton, son of the Puritan, Rev. John Cotton, a very distinguished Divine from Boston, England. See History of Medford, Mass. Rev. Seaborn Cotton married Dorothy Bradstreet, daughter of Gov. Simon Bradstreet of Boston & Salem, Mass., and Gov. Bradstreet married the daughter of Gov. Thomas Dudley, Colonial Governor of Massachusetts. His Daughter, Ann Dudley, was a Poetess. Gov. Dudley's name is on one of the entrance gates of Harvard College, Cambridge, Mass.

Gov. Thomas Hinckley's great-granddaughter, Mercy Hinckley, married Capt. Thomas Weeks in Brockfield, Mass. His Ancestor is George Weeks, from Devonshire, Eng. to Dorchester, Mass. He came in the Ship with Rev. Richard Mather in 1635, the "Mary & John". George Week's wife, Jane Clapp, was sister of Capt. Roger Clapp of Dorchester. His name is one the Tablet at entrance to King's Chapel & Burial Ground, Tremont & School Sts. Boston.

Document #1.- Petition; To the Hon. Nathaniel Blagrove, Esq., Judge of the Probate of Wills & granting of Letters of Administration within the County of Bristol, Mass.

The petition of Gershom Williams, son of Emmanuel Williams, late of Taunton, deceased, intestate; whereas, my father died seized of a considerable estate, both real and personal, and since his decease there has been but very little care taken concerning said estate, so that the movables are most of them destroyed. As to the real estate, John Williams, my eldest brother does make great havoc of its timber, both on the homestead and cedar swamp, and when he has cut down all the cedars in the cedar swamp, the land will be of but little value, and to the rest of the children, they will be much wronged of their rights; and I, now being 31 years of age, and having a desire, and also in great necessity, of receiving my part of my father's estate, which by right of inheritance belongs to me, therefore, I would humbly beseech that your Honor would appoint five men to make a division and distribution of the estate which my father died seized of, to and amongst his children agreeable to an act for the settling & distribution of intestate estates, for which favor towards him your Petitioner, as in duty bound, shall every pray.

Dighton, Feb. the 2nd. 1729/30. (Signed) Gershom Williams. I would humbly pray that your Honor would appoint these men hereunder named to make the division and distribution. To Hon. Nathaniel Blagrove, Esq. living in Bristol, these present; John Mason, John Macomber, Wm Hopkins, Abraham Waldron.

Document #2, Book 8, page 257;

Known all men that I, Immanuel Williams of Taunton, Bristol Co., Mass., Province of Massachusetts, in New England, for diverse good causes as thereunto moving, give, grant, bargain, sell, and confirm unto my honored father-in-law, William Makepeace, of said Taunton, my dwelling house and home land I live on, being 50 acres more or less, I bought of Thomas Joslin adjoining thereto, and one half part of saw mill, which I bought of John Sparr, and a half purchase right in the sixteen shilling purchase in Middleboro, which I bought of Ebenezer Richmond, with one yoke of oxen, three cows, one heifer and the yearling, three swine and one mare, and all my household stuff, husbandry tools and other tools and tacklin, within doors and without, to have and to hold all and singular the premises and privileges and appurtenances thereof, to him-said Wm Makepeace and his heirs and assigns forever, to his and their only proper use and behoofs, covenanting that I have good right at the time of sealing thereof, to sell ye same as aforesaid and promising to acknowledge this to be my act and deed before lawful authority, and to do ye any other act needful in ye case for ye fuller conveying the premises to him as aforesaid, and acknowledging that I have received the sum of three hundred and fifty pounds current money of him, Wm Makepeace, in full payment for the premises, and do acquit and discharge said Wm. Makepeace, his heirs and Executors & Administrators thereof, and every part and parcel thereof. In testimony hereof, I have set my hand and Seal this eighteenth day of March, anno domini, one thousand seven hundred and thirteen, fourteenth in the year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Anne of Great Britain, &c. Queen.

Sybil Tallman's statement as given by Mr. Leonard.

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*Information obtained by Richard Williams from Sybil (William Tallman of New Bedford, Jan. 1848. Thinks that her great-grandfather's name was Emmanuel; is not absolutely certain of this however, but always understood it was. Is certain that her grandfather's name was John; her father's name was Lemuel.

(1st) Emmanuel Williams of Taunton, (2) John Williams son of above; (3) Lemuel Williams son of above John. The above John Williams married Elizabeth Caswell; his children were John, Jacob George, Lemuel, Joshua, Silas, Elisha, Elizabeth, Abigail and Rachel. John of above family married Rhoda Crowel; lived Middleboro. Jacob m Sarah Dean (Cousin of Sybil wife of Lemuel; had five daughters but no son; lived probably in Braintree; his children were Charity, Katy, Lucy, Sally and Hannah. Charity m a Dexter; Lucy m a Dean; Sally & Hannah m Perry's & Terry's. George m Keziah Atwood of Carver; lived and died near his brother (Lemuel) in Taunton; his children, George, John & Keziah. George m Judith Pierce and lived near the precinct meeting house. John m Silence Dean, Keziah m John Hart. The above George wgo m Judith Pierce had 2 sons, George & Elkanah, and 3 daughters, Keziah, Judith & Hannah. John who m Silence left no children. Keziah m Hart and had 2 sons, John & George and a dau Keziah who m James Crossman; his dau Keziah m (Obed I suppose) Myrick. Keziah dau of George Williams & Judith Pierce m a Lincoln and moved to Mich. Lemuel m Sybil Tisdale; his children were Lemuel, Sybil, Elizabeth (called Betty) Richard & Charity. Lemuel & Elizabeth never

Married. Sybil m Elkanah Tallman of New Bedford. Richard m Rebecca Smith and Charity m Cromwell Washburn of Taunton. Lemuel died about 1812 aged 80 yrs. Joshua m Bethia Clark and moved to Maine; had a son named Clark. Silas went to Maine and there married. Elijah supposed to have moved to Hardwick; had a son named Prince. Elizabeth m Jabez Eaton of Titicut; her children were Lucy who m Sam Edison; Elizabeth m a White and probably a son named Oliver and others not known. Abigail m Joshua Shaw of Titicut and her children were Joshua, Eliphalet, Ezra & Abigail and probably others not known. Rachel m Jonathan French of Berkeley who moved away after her death."

F I R S T G E N E R A T I O N.

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(1) Emmanuel Williams; was born about 1680, probably in Eng. He m about 1703, Abigail Makepeace, dau Wm Makepeace of Freetown, afterwards Taunton, Mass. She b Nov. 35, 1686. He d about 1719 or 20, and she died about 1734.

Will of Wm Makepeace, Dated 1756, refers to children of Dan Abigail. Inventory of estate of Emmanuel Williams returned July 4, 1730, by Abigail Williams, Adm'r, book 5, p 647. William Makepeace was appointed Administrator de bonis non of estate of Emmanuel Williams Feb. 17, 1724/5, book 5, p 17. On Feb. 2, 1729 Gershom Williams complains to Probate Court that John Williams, the eldest son, is making havoc of the timber of his Father's estate and prays for a distribution.

William Barney of Taunton appointed Guardian of Lydia Williams (over 14) dau of Emmanuel, Mar. 30, 1730, Vol 6. John Williams of Taunton appointed Guardian of Phoebe Williams (14) dau of Emmanuel Williams, Mar. 30, 1730, Vol 6. Division of estate of Emmanuel Williams Oct. 28, 1730. To John, eldest son, the 2nd & 3rd lots, with dwelling house and barn thereon for his double share. To Gershom, 2nd son, the 6th lot. To Simeon, 3rd son, the 4th lot. To Anna, wife of Wm Barney, eldest dau, the 5th lot. To Lydia 2nd dau, the 7th lot. To Phoebe, 3rd dau, the 1st lot.

Will dated Oct. 31, 1765, proved Sept. 15, 1780, (Vol 26 p 279 gives names of these 10 children in the above order. Rachel is-scribed as single. Sybil Tallman gave same names but in a different order. Lemuel & Jacob Ex'ors. On Oct. 30, 1765, he gave by deed two thirds of his homestead farm to son Lemuel, reserving a life estate to himself and his wife Elizabeth.

3 Gershom Williams (Emmanuel) was born in Taunton 1706. He m Aug. 2, 1729, Abigail Waldron, dau of Samuel of Dighton. He d 1775 and she April 6, 1789.

Deed from Jonathan Barney 2nd (in former deeds called Jonathan Jr.) to Wm Barney "all the real estate which descended to me out of the estate of my honored father Wm Barney, deceased, and all which I purchased of Anna Barney Nov. 26, 1763". Deed dated Mar 23, 173- (book 26 p 71) shows that Lydia wife of John Terry of Freetown, blacksmith, was dau of "Immanuel Williams of Taunton, deceased".

6 Phoebe Williams (Emmanuel Williams) was b in Taunton about 1712; she was the youngest dau and was over 14 Mar 30, 1730, when her Guardian was appointed; her older sister Lydia was then also a minor. Comparing the ages of all the children it is quite certain that Phoebe was born in 1712 or very soon after. I have not traced her. Real estate was set off to her in the division of her father's property and its subsequent disposition ought to throw some light on her history.

7 Simeon Williams (Emmanuel) was b in Taunton in 1716. On Mar 8, 1730, his brother John was appointed his Guardian, probably to enable the Court to divide the real estate of his father among the heirs. The division of the real estate was made Oct 28, 1730 and to Simeon was assigned the 4th lot. There was another Simeon Williams in Taunton (John, Nathan, Richard I) b Feb 21, 1717, whose Mother, Hannah, was appointed his Guardian Oct. 2, 1730. One of the two became "Capt. Simeon Williams" of Easton & Taunton. Mr. Leonard in his Notes, assumes that he was Emmanuel's son, but the family Bible of Capt. Williams and especially a Deed dated Sept. 10, 1744, from Simeon Williams of Easton and others to Benjamin Terry, recorded in Plymouth Registry, book 40 p 53, renders it absolutely certain that Capt. Simeon Williams was son of John 3, Nathaniel 2, Richard I. So far as I have been able to discover Emmanuel's Simeon entirely disappears from the record and I conclude died comparatively young without issue.

T H I R D G E N E R A T I O N

8 John Williams (John, Emmanuel) was b in Taunton 1735/50. He m March 5, 1752, Rhoda Crowell of Chatham, Mass., in Middleboro-Rochester, Mass., as on Plymouth County records. She was born in 1731/33. He is described as of Rochester in his Father's will dated Oct. 31, 1765, by which a deed of lands to him is confirmed "The said land lies part in Middleboro and part in Rochester, in the County of Plymouth and consists of 80 or 90 acres. He lived awhile in Middleboro and apparently on the portion of this farm that lay in this Town. He afterwards moved to Williamsburg, Mass., where he died Dec. 17, 1804, in his 74th year, and she d Feb 22, 1814, in her 81st year. He moved to Williamsburg about May 15, 1763/70. He appears on the records of the First Congregational Church of Rochester, Mass.

Goshen, Mass. & Williamsburg (18910 p 183, erroneously says that the Williamses of Goshen & Williamsburg are descendants of Richard of Taunton, through John 4, John 3,, Benjamin 2, Richard I

He further says that John 4, b in 1728 resided in Middleboro but moved to Williamsburg and died there in 1802. Some of the descendants have been misled by this and make the claim that John 4 or John 3 moved to Williamsburg. John son of John who did move there says "John Williams, my father was born in Taunton moved to Middleboro and when about 40 years old left Middleboro and moved to Williamsburg and there lived until Dec. 17, 1802/4 and then died in the 74th year of his age."

Rhoda Williams, my mother, was born in Chatham, Cape Cod, Mass, and came to live with my father in Middleboro, and there lived about 30 years and then moved to Williamsburg and died Feb. 23, 1814, in the 85th year of her age."

In Richard's line there were two Johns 3; first John 3, Nathaniel 2, b Aug. 27, 1765; he had a son John 4 b Oct. 31, 1708, who died unmarried as early as 1736. Second John 3 (Benjamin 2, b Mar 27, 1699, m Abigail King and lived in Easton on land inherited from Benjamin 2, and died there Oct. 16, 1756. He had a son John 4, b Sept. 2, 1756, who d unm. in 1782. Probate records Vol 27 p 435. A comparison of these dates shows conclusively the error into which the Historian fell.

Sybil Tallman was granddaughter of John 2 (Emanuel) and John 3 of that line was her Uncle. She said her Uncle John married and moved, as is supposed, to Williamsburg and had a son John 4.

Deed of John Williams of Taunton to John Williams of Rochester, Dated Feb. 12, 1750 reads, - "For and in consideration of the love, good will, and natural affection which I have and do bear towards my son John Williams, convey a certain tract of land containing by estimation 88 acres, and is part of the 15th lot in number, in the purchase known as the "Snipetuit purchase", which purchase lyeth partly in Middleboro and partly in Rochester and is the N.W. end of the aforesaid 15th lot." Plymouth Co. Reg. book 52 p 182.

John Williams of Taunton by will dated Oct. 31, 1765, proved Sept. 15, 1780 (Vol 26 p 273) gives his son John Williams of Rochester, two shillings &c. and confirms his previous deed of gift of land lying partly in Middleboro and partly in Rochester, containing about 80 or 90 acres. When the above described deed was made, John 3 the son of Benjamin 2, lived in Easton and his son John had not been born, and when the will was made the former had been dead 9 yrs, and the latter was only a little over 9 yrs old. John Williams of Middleboro, March 24, 1773, conveyed the same land to John Benson, his wife Rhoda Williams joining with him in the deed. Plymouth Co. book 5 p 192. See also deed from John Williams & Rhoda Williams dated Oct. 9, 1771, and acknowledged Dec. 10, 1773, Plymouth Co. book 57 p 220.

9 Elisha Williams (John, Emanuel) previously wrongly named Elijah. Was b in Taunton. In his Father's will he is described as of Middleboro. Oct. 31, 1765, Sybil Tallman said that it was understood that he moved to Hardwick and m Ruth? Oh b in----?

Jos Augustus Deane says Katharine never married but lived and d with her Uncle John Gilmore, who m Elizabeth Deane, a sister of her Mother. He said that Lloyd Deane, a son of Lucy, came to Maine with him in 1821. John 5 (John 4, John 5) told Mr. Boltwood that his grand Uncle Jacob Williams moved to Williamsburg. This is confirmed by the fact that his death is recorded on the Williamsburg records. Jacob 3, m for 2nd wife, Ruth Day, widow of Samuel, whose dau Ruth m Samuel Munson. Deed of George Williams of Middleboro to Jacob Williams of New Braintree, April 12, 1782, book 20, p 43; deed J.W. of N.B. to Jno Palmer of land bought of my brother Geo Williams of Middleboro, book 37 (?) p 228. This John Williams⁴, of Goshen, was called "Squire Williams". He was a man of much shrewdness as well as solidity of character and amassed a respectable property. He was Justice of the Peace a good business man, careful and prudent, and an esteemed citizen.

He was one of the Founders and chief supporters of the Baptist Church in Goshen, and lived and died a consistent Member of that branch of the Christian Church.

The first highway through Goshen was the old military road Boston to Albany, N. Y., established 1758, and his Home and Hotel was on this highway.

He was the first Postmaster of Goshen in 1817. Was called "Squire John" as there was another John in Goshen. He owned the first wagon in Town.

His House combined his Home, the Goshen Hotel, and Town Store Postoffice, and was occupied by his son Minckley after his death. The Misses Boltwood, Granddaughters still live there in 1933.

This John Williams's wife, Mercy Weeks, was dau of Capt. Thomas Weeks, as previously stated, and his wife, Mercy Minckley, b Sept. 22, 1757, of Brookfield, Mass., was dau of Job Minckley of Barnstable and wife Sarah Tufts. Job Minckley was grandson of Gov. Thomas Minckley of Plymouth Colony. He was Deputy to the General Court Plymouth, 1848; Assistant 1658 to 1880. Commissioner of Plymouth Colony 1675-76. Was at the Great Swamp Fight. Was Deputy Governor 1680, Governor 1881. Assistant of the Province of Massachusetts Bay.

Sarah Tufts was dau of Capt. Peter Tufts of Medford, Mass., Founder of Tufts College. Capt. Peter Tufts of Medford, as above m Mercy Cotton dau of Rev. Seaborn Cotton who m Dorothy Bradstreet dau of Governor Simon Bradstreet of Boston. Rev. Seaborn Cotton's Father was the Puritan, the Rev. John Cotton.

Gov. Simon Bradstreet m Ann Dudley dau of Gov. Thomas Dudley of Boston, whose name is on one of the gates at entrance to Harvard College, in the City of Cambridge, Mass.

John Williams 3, son of John 4 above, was b Apr 6, 1700, and m Obedience Todd Oct. 3, 1815. She was the dau of Rev. Asa Todd & wife Abigail Bishop, who were m May 25, 1778.
