

Preface

Upon reading Mrs. John W. Dale's report about Captain Thomas White, published in, "Soldiers of the American Revolution Buried in Ohio", Mr. White set out to find the names of all of Captain White's descendants.

Mrs. Dale of Cincinnati sent him the result of her years of research.

He put fellow lawyers to work and kept Probate Clerks busy. He sent telegrams and special delivery letters and advertised in the paper.

Mr. White wrote to members of the family for information and if they did not answer he wrote again and again. At least one lady rightly told him that she was too busy with her war-time canning to bother with such nonsense.

He wrote me that he was not interested in the family's ancestors; only its descendants; but he unearthed data about the Keyes ancestors not heretofore known.

Mr. White sent for books and old maps of Loudoun County and copies of Wills, Marriages and Deeds. He shared this information with many others.

Shortly before his death he suggested that he put the letters about each family in separate large envelopes and ship them to me to assemble the information. He then intended to add "running comments". I put the data together but he passed away before he could complete it as he wished.

I followed several leads he had been unable to pursue, wrote to several people for dates and places and added the narration.

Source of information is given on the last page of each section.

THE ANCESTRY OF SARAH KEYES, WIFE OF CAPTAIN WHITE

SOLOMON KEYES

Solomon Keyes was born in England. Asa Keyes, author of "Robert & Solomon Keyes" in 1880 left it for later generations to prove whose son Solomon was. Across the title page of his book in the Congressional Library is written, "Since the publication of Asa Keyes' book it has been established beyond doubt that Solomon Keyes was Robert's son by the finding of a Will, recorded in Mass. Hon. Wade Keyes, Tremont Bldg., 73 Tremont St. Boston, a lawyer, can give account." (Written before 1928.)

This was accepted by the National Society of New England Women when Mrs. Dale of Cincinnati became a member.

However Chas. C. White was unable to find trace of Hon. Wade Keyes. He did however obtain from another Boston lawyer, Henry W. Keyes (son of authoress Frances Parkinson Keyes) the result of his brother, John Parkinson Keyes' research in England.

He found that Solomon Keyes was Baptised on Feb. 6, 1623-4 at St. Thomas The Apostle, London, the son of Ralph and Maria (Wood) Keyes. Ralph Keyes was a haberdasher of London who was married at St. Olave's, Hart Street, London on July 19, 1612. Died May 28 1659.

This line he traced back thru two more Ralphs, Edward, Ralph, Gilbert to John Keyes of Horsley, County Derby born 1350.

Solomon Keyes settled in Newbury, Mass. and moved 1664-5 to Chelmsford where he served as town clerk and tithing man. He was known as Sergeant Keyes (also written Keies or Keys). The family homestead was reported standing in 1880 in the modern town of Westford, which set off from old Chelmsford. He died March 28, 1702.

He married in Newbury Oct. 2, 1653, Frances Grant who died 1708. Daughter of Thomas and Jane Grant.

JOHN KEYES

was born in Chelmsford, Mass., Aug 14, 1674. He lived in Marlborough, Mass., removing about 1720 to Shrewsbury, Mass., where he was one of the founders of the first church. He was known as Captain and later Major Keyes. Three of his four sons, all minors, were burned to death in a fire which broke out in a house he was building in Shrewsbury in 1723.

John died March 31, 1768. He married March 11 1696, Mary Eames daughter of Gersham and Hannah (Johnson) Eames. She was born March 1677 and died April 11 1772.

GERSHOM KEYES

WAS BORN Mar 1, 1698, and was the only surviving son of John Keyes. His early life was spent in Marlborough, Mass., removing to Shrewsbury about 1739 and soon after to Boston where he in 1735 was a wealthy and prominent merchant. His name is found repeatedly in town and colony records especially in the decade 1730-40. On Dec. 29 1735 the Boston Town Meeting selected Mr. Gersham Keyes and two others to Survey and Plat three townships for the Town of Boston.

One of the earliest important literary works published in America was Princes' "Chronology" and we find the name of Gershom Keyes on the list of subscribers which fortunately has been preserved. In the words of the historian Samuel G. Drake, "the individuals whose names are given in the ... list may be justly regarded as the principal literati of New England who flourished about the beginning of the (18th) century". There were over 700 subscribers of whom only 11 took more than six copies. Among the 80 subscribers for six copies was Gershom Keyes. Gov. Belcher subscribed for six while Gov. Phips ordered but two.

Some time before 1748 he moved to Virginia. He located on the Shenandoah River in the "Northern Neck of Virginia" on Lord Fairfax's Proprietary in what was then Fredrick County. (the part set off as Berkely County in 1772 and again set off from Berkely to Jefferson County in 1801).

Nov. 12, 1748 he was, by Sir William Gooch, his Majesties Lt. Gov. & Commander in Chief of the Colony of Virginia, appointed as one of the Justices of the County Court. He was sworn in Dec 7, 1748 and sat in court May 12 1750.

Aug. 14 1751 he bought for Fifty Pounds Sterling Money of Great Britain from Lawrence Washington (George's $\frac{1}{2}$ bro.) 100 acres of land in Frederick County adjacent to land already owned.

Feb. 9, 1748 Gershom Keyes had mortgaged to Lawrence Washington, 568 acres in Frederick County on the Western side of the Shenandoah River on both sides of Eavata Marsh "whereon the said Gershom Keyes now lives".

April 3, 1754 there was admitted in Court Gershom Keyes' bond for "Keeping Ferry cross Shanando River". Thomas Rutherford was his Security. Keyes Ferry or Ford still bears the name and is located about four miles East of Charlestown, W. Va. In the old days the actual ferry was half a mile below its present site, opposite Shelters Spring, now Keyes Switch. The spot now designated as Millville and the local power company purchased the old mill and converted it into a power plant.

Lawrence Washington's will of 1752 mentions legal difficulty with Gershom Keyes, "I also desire my just suit of Complaint at Law against Gersham Keyes of Frederick County for breach of trust be effectually prosecuted by my Executors".

In 1755 Gershom Keyes sold supplies to Gen. Braddock as the army passed on its way to disastrous defeat at Duquesne. See Braddock Orderly Book; Sergeants "The Braddock Boad; Hennings, "Virginia Statutes".

We find no record of any land grant from proprietor Lord Fairfax until

March 25, 1761 when Gershom Keyes was granted 10 acres near William Davies in Fredrick County.

There is preserved among the descendants of Gershom Keyes the following letter from George Washington, surveyor to the Lord Fairfax Estate:-

Mt Vernon 26th March, 1762

Mr Keyes

Your letter of the 18th Feb'y was delivered to me at our last court, by Mr Ramsay. In regard to the Warrant which you enquire after, I can only repeat what I have often done before that it must have been returned with the others to the Proprietor's office if I ever had such a one, but since it is not to be found there, I shall at your request declare all I remember concerning this, that there was a Warrant direct to me for surveying you (I think) four hundred acres of land, either at or about your Ferry, which then stood lower down the river, but who it was to join to, or what was the reason of not executing it I cannot absolutely recollect; this I perfectly well know, that I did make you a survey at some place near to where your Ferry then stood, but I think it was in consequence of another Warrant, and that I have had such a Warr't as you ask after in my Possession and more over that it was not executed owing to some dispute between Col. Fairfax and yourself.

Gershom Keyes was continually suing or being sued in the Frederick County Court.

Record is found of four Deeds from Lord Fairfax to Gershom Keyes totalling 1084 acres in Frederick County. Two deeds mention that the land was surveyed by George Washington.

In "Legands of Loudoun" by Harrison Williams, p. 92, Mrs. Brown's Journal says, "June 6 1755. At 7 we halted at Mr Keys', a fine plantation. Had for dinner, two chickens."

The Will of Gershom Keyes was admitted to Probate at Winchester, Fredrick County, Virginia, Aug 5 1766. The "still house" and ferry given to his wife and his son, Humphrey. He left 3850 acres of land in the County of "Hampshear."

Gershom Keyes married Sarah Eager in 1718. She was probably the daughter of Abraham and Lydia (Woods) Eager born May 27, 1699 and lived in Shrewsbury.

Gershom's will names his wife, Ruth, who he must have married in later years.

HUMPHREY KEYES

Was born in Marlborough, Mass., Aug 29, 1721. He married Marcella Wade.

He was a sea captain in early life. On one of his voyages his vessel was wrecked off Turkey and he fell into the hands of the Algerines. After years of captivity he escaped and returned home to find that his wife had given him up as dead and married another with whom she passed the remainder of her life.

Humphrey moved to Virginia, probably with his father, before 1748. At the death of his father in 1766, Humphrey and his mother ran the ferry.

In Virginia, after hearing of his first wife's death, Humphrey married Sarah Hall, daughter of Aquilla and Sophia (White) Hall, born in 1745.

Humphrey Keyes served in Captain John Harding's Foot Company, 1755.

Humphrey bought 793 acres of Fairfax land in Fredrick and Berkeley County and 1980 acres in Hampshire County.

Humphrey died Mar 19, 1793 and his will probated in Berkeley County (now West Virginia) gave the Ferry and ferry plantation to his wife, Sarah, and son Humphrey. "I Tam I give and bequeath unto my two Oldest Daughters Sarah Wight (White) and Lucritia Piles my lease on the east side of Shanondo River".

Sarah died Dec 31 1822.

THE DESCENDANTS OF CAPTAIN THOMAS WHITE

Captain Thomas White was born on March 17, 1754 to John and Isabella White in New Castle County, Delaware.

It is tradition that Thomas was the first of his family born in the colonies and that the rest of his family came from Ireland.

John and Isabella White and children moved to the growing settlement in the part of Fredrick County, Virginia, that was later set off as Loudoun County. The spot was near Leesburg. Besides Thomas the children were Josiah and Joseph.

On June 5, 1777, at twenty-three years of age, Thomas White enlisted in the 1st Regiment of Virginia Militia in Loudoun County, Virginia, and three days later was appointed Ensign of Captain Thomas' Company in Colonel Claphem's Regiment.

He fought shortly thereafter in the battle of Brandywine on September 11, 1777, with 13,000 Americans under Washington. December 17, 1777 Thomas White was one of the 11,000 left who encamped at Valley Forge and wintered there.

On a day in March 1778 he was promoted to Captain of his company. He served as Captain on various tours between April 4, 1778 and July 1778. On June 29, 1778 he fought in the Battle of Monmouth. He served again as Captain beginning Sept 21, 1780 for 28 days and again Sept 1, 1781 for one month and 28 days. A part of that time in command of a company under Colonel Holms, after the command had been relinquished by Thomas White's elder brother, Captain Joseph White, because of illness. The company detailed to guard British prisoners at Winchester, Virginia.

Thomas White (Captain) received his Honorable Discharge late in October 1781, credited with service as a Captain for fifteen months and thirteen days.

At Keyes Ferry on the Shenandoah River in Berkeley County, Virginia, he met Sarah Keyes, eldest daughter of Humphrey Keyes and Sarah (Hall) Keyes. Humphrey Keyes, once a Captain of the Sea, owned Keyes Ferry and its adjacent fine plantation. Sarah Keyes was born at Keyes Ferry on November 11, 1764.

On October 13, 1783 at Keyes Ferry, twenty-nine year old Thomas White married nineteen year old Sarah Keyes. Their ten children, whose progeny we shall follow, were all born in Virginia.

About the year 1816 the family moved to Belmont County, Ohio. Left behind was their first born, Elizabeth E., who died in infancy. A later born Elizabeth took her place. The oldest daughter, Sarah, bearing the name of her mother, grandmother and great-grandmother Keyes, was not along for she had earlier married and moved to Maryland.

Their 2nd Elizabeth had moved to Ohio before the rest of her family with her husband early in 1809.

In 1830 between April 12th and August 20th Captain Thomas White and family removed to Tuscarawas County, in One Leg Township, to the town of

Leesburgh. This spot, with the same name as their home in Virginia, was formed as a town in 1812. When this section became Carroll County the township was named Orange Township. In his pension papers it appears that he moved but actually he remained on the same farm while the County boundaries were changed.

On April 12, 1830, Thomas White Sr. of Belmont County, Ohio, bought three lots, numbers 5, 8 and 17 in Leesburgh, Tuscarawas County from Steen and Virginia Lowry of Tuscarawas Co. for \$300.

On August 20, 1830, Thomas White, of Tuscarawas Co., bought lot # 61 in Leesburgh from the estate of William Price for \$178.25.

On May 18, 1831, Thomas White of Tuscarawas Co. bought about 204 acres of land in Steubenville Land District for \$500 and a \$1000 mortgage to John Sheppard of Tuscarawas Co. (On Sep 26, 1836 he sold 100 acres of this to James White, his son, for \$700. On Sep 28, 1836, he sold 81 acres of the 204 to John McCoy, his son-in-law, for \$600.)

On May 28, 1833, Thomas White Sr. bought $4\frac{1}{2}$ acres in the bottom east of Leesburgh from the estate of John Stoneman for \$80.71.

On April 5, 1833, Thomas White bought the east half of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 14. Tp. 15. Range 7 in Steubenville Land Dist. for \$500 from Peter and Jane Everhart.

On April 14, 1837, Thomas White Sr. bought 3 acres on the bank of One Leg Creek, Orange Twp. Carroll Co. from the Sheriff for \$65.

The Tax Duplicates of One Leg Twp show Thomas White Sr. taxed for one horse and one cow; \$48 valuation in 1820-30-31-32.

On May 3, 1834 Captain Thomas White was granted a pension of \$279 a year for his service in the Revolutionary War.

Captain Thomas White died September 10, 1839 on his farm at Leesburgh, Orange Township, Carroll County, Ohio.

The post office at Leesburgh was named Leesville because of another Leesburgh in Ohio and as Leesville it is now known.

He left everything to his widow, Sarah. In his will he said that after her death his daughter Elizabeth Nichols should have, "a certain Bureau mounted with brass mountains" and his daughter, Ruth McCoy, "a certain mantel clock".

Sarah Keyes White lived with her daughter, Elizabeth Nichols, and son-in-law, Eli Nichols, and their fifteen children in Union Township, Belmont County, Ohio, where she died in 1845. She is buried in Taggart's Quaker Grave-yard in Uniontown, Ohio.

From Captain Thomas White's pension papers as summarized by P.M. Hamer, Chief Division of Reference, The National Archives, Washington, D. C. This information was first brought to light by Mrs. John W. Dale of Cincinnati. The County-line changes as effecting Thomas White's place of residence and his land deeds and tax duplicates were unearthed by Charles C. White.

THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT
OF
CAPTAIN THOMAS WHITE

"The Estate of Thomas White, Deceased.

"Be it remembered that heretofore, towit, at a Court of Common Pleas began and held at the Court House in Carrollton, within and for the County of Carroll, and State of Ohio, on the twenty-eighth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, before the Hon. George W. Belden, President, Robert George, George Reynolds, and Robert McElderry, Esquires, associate Judges of said Court, in and for said County:

"The last Will and Testament of Thomas White, deceased, was brought into court, the two subscribing witnesses thereto being qualified, say they saw the Testator sign said will; that they signed said will as witnesses in the presence and at the request of the Testator; that the Testator when he signed said will was of sound mind and memory, of full age and under no restraint. Thereupon the same was approved and ordered to be recorded, with the proof taken. Which said will so proven and approved is in the words and figures following, towit:

"I Thomas White of Carroll County in the State of Ohio do here-by make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following: First, I will that all my just debts as shall be by me owing at my death, together with my funeral expenses, and all charges touching the proving of this my last will, shall in the first place be fully paid and satisfied out of my personal estate and effects. Second, I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Sarah White, all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate both real and personal, "to have and to hold the same for and during her natural life. And further my will is that if necessity requires it for the better support and maintenance of my wife, Sarah White, that Lots No. 8 and 5 in the Town of Leesburgh be sold for that purpose. Third, I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Nichols a certain Bureau mounted with brass mountains now in my possession, to have the same from and after the death of my wife, Sarah White. Fourth, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Ruth McCoy a certain mantel clock now in posesion to have the same from and after the death of my wife Sarah White. Fifth, I will and devise that at the death of my wife Sarah White, that all the property then left both real and personal be valued by heirs or a majority of them, or by five disinterested persons chosen by a majority of my sons then living, and that my son John White, or any other of my sons have the privilege of purchasing the same or any part or parts thereof and that all the moneys arising from the or sale thereof, together with any other money that may be left by my wife Sarah White be equally divided among my lawful heirs, viz: John White, Elizabeth Nichols, Humphrey K. White, Thomas White, James A. White and Ruth McCoy. Sixth, and last, I do hereby appoint my beloved wife, Sarah White, Executrix and Thomas White and James A. White Executors of this my last will, revoking all other wills by me made.

"I- testimony whereof I Thomas White have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of April A.D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven.

Thomas White (Seal)."

"Signed sealed published and declared by Thomas White, the above named testator as and for his last will and testament, in the presence of us, Gaven Lathers -- Thomas S. Smith.

"Thereupon Letters Testamentary were issued and recorded in Letter Record Four, page 51 Bond having been given in the sum of \$1200.00 Gavin Lathers and Thomas S. Smith were accepted as surety. Executrix and Executors qualified in open court.

Five of Captain Thomas White's Daughters

1. Elizabeth E. This, his first daughter was born on June 8, 1785 and died young. She was born and died in Virginia. Of her no more is known.
2. Sarah Named for her mother, grandmother Keyes, and great-grandmother Keyes, she was born on Feb. 17, 1787. At the age of 20 she left the Virginia homestead and was married to Thomas Smith at Fredrick County, Maryland on February 19, 1807. No mention is made of her in her father's will of October 28, 1839. A Thomas S. Smith witnessed the will.
4. Lucretia His fourth child was born in Virginia, as were her brothers and sisters; probably in Loudoun County near Leesburg. She was born on June 21, 1791. She married Jonas Walraven. She was undoubtedly married in Virginia since she was 27 when her parents moved to Ohio. It is presumed she died, leaving no children, before 1839, since her father makes no mention of her or her children in his list of lawful heirs.
6. Catherine The sixth child was born on April 18, 1796. She was 20 when her family moved to Ohio and if she took after her sister, Elizabeth (2nd), she had already married and left home. She married Phillip Koonz. Her father makes no mention of Catherine or children in his will so it may be believed that she had passed away by 1839, leaving no children.
10. Ruth Pemberton She, the youngest, was only ten when she traveled to Ohio with her family, having been born Jan 23, 1806, in Virginia. She married John McCoy. In 1839 she was still his wife. Thereafter he died. In the year, 1852 she was the wife of John R. Dunlap. She lived in Carroll County, Ohio, near her parents, during her two marriages. No record is found of her nor of her children, unless the Martha, Hugh, James, and Sarah McCoy named in the petition filed in 1845 by Thomas White, administrator of John McCoy's estate, are her children. This petition to sell lands mentions, "Ruth McCoy (now Ruth Dunlap, wife of John R. Dunlap) his widow".

3. JOHN WHITE (Thomas), the son of Thomas White and Sarah (Keyes) White was born on April 6, 1789 in Loudoun County, Virginia, probably near Leesburg.

There, at the age of 24, he enlisted and served as an orderly sergeant in Captain James Cockran's Company of Virginia militia, from August 24th to September 22nd, 1814. This was the 56th (Taylor's) Regiment of the Virginia militia. He was allowed five days pay for traveling home.

After this service in the War of 1812 he went to Belmont County, Ohio with his parents.

On May 4, 1817 he married Elizabeth Ann Soper. She was born February 17, 1796.

In 1823, he built a mill in Morgan County, with his brother Humphrey, six miles below McConnellsville, Ohio, on the west bank of the Muskingum River.

He was a Justice of the Peace and in 1846-7 was elected to serve as Representative to the State Legislature.

Elizabeth Ann, his first wife, died May 2, 1846 at the age of fifty. He married second, Mrs. Lavina Keadle, nee Bain, a widow with children, Feb. 14, 1847. He married third, Abigail McCarty in February 1852.

John White was allowed 160 acres of bounty land on his application to the Veterans Administration at Washington. It was executed April 28, 1855, at which time he was aged 66 years and a resident of Stockport, Morgan County, Ohio, where he stated he had lived since 1836.

In 1868 at the age of 79 he married his fourth wife, Margaret Belch, who died before he did.

At the age of 89 years and living in Stockport he was given a monthly pension for his war service.

On October 28, 1876 he sold his right to locate his warrant on public lands to John S. Braddock.

John White died on April 28, 1882, aged 93. He is buried at Stockport and Elizabeth Ann (Soper) White is buried at McConnellsville, Ohio.

12. GERSHOM KEYES WHITE (John , Thomas), the second child and oldest son of John White and Elizabeth Ann (Soper) White was born March 3, 1820 in Belmont County, Ohio. He was named after his great-great-grandfather, Gershom Keyes, through his grandmother Sarah (Keyes) White. He came to Morgan County, Ohio, with his parents as a child less than three years old. At the age of 26, on July 19, 1846, he married Hannah Narcissa Scott. She was 21; born September 10, 1825.

He was a successful farmer and stock raiser. He also was Morgan County Infirmary Director for a number of years. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge during its early days in Morgan County. He walked across Panama on his way to and from California in the days of the gold rush.

Gershom Keyes White died Oct. 24, 1896, aged 76. His wife, Hannah died Apr. 15, 1904, aged 75 years, 7 months and 15 days.

He entered the service of the United States Department of Agriculture in 1906 as an expert in animal bacteriology in the Bureau of Entomology as insect pathologist. 14. HERSCHEL BASIL WHITE, the fourth child of John White (Thomas) and Elizabeth Ann (Soper) White, was born in Morgan County, Ohio, on March 22, 1824. At the age of 24, on November 9, 1848, he and "Miss Caroline Ellis were by me legally united in bonds of Matrimony. William Beswick, J.P."

She was born March 23, 1830 and died July 9, 1903 aged 73 years, 3 months and 16 days.

He was a farmer and carpenter and lived near Stockport on what is now the Henry Hook farm.

On October 18, 1861 he enlisted in Company F, 77th Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry which in February 1862 was assigned to General Sherman's Division of Grant's army. He was a First Lieutenant and was wounded at Shiloh.

He died on August 8, 1878 and with his wife, Caroline, is buried at Stockport, Ohio.

16. Lucretia White, one of twin daughters born to John White (Thomas) and Elizabeth Ann (Soper) White, was born in Morgan County, Ohio on August 15, 1826, per the John White bible. The Abbott family records this event as 1827.

She married Dr. John S. Abbott at Stockport, Ohio in 1847 on April 22nd. Dr. Abbott was born in Washington County on March 10th, 1824. He came to Morgan County in 1840 and practiced his profession in Stockport.

They resided in Stockport all their married life. Lucretia (White) Abbott died in 1906, aged 80 years and is buried in the Stockport Cemetery.

17. Martha Ellen White, the seventh child born to John White (Thomas) and Elizabeth Ann (Soper) White, was born in Morgan County, Ohio, October 19, 1829.

At the age of twenty-one years on September 1, 1850, she married Dr. John Warren White, who was then thirty-one years of age. Dr. J. W. White was a physician and surgeon and proprietor of a drug store on Main Street in Stockport, Ohio. He was not a descendant of Captain Thomas White. Dr. White was born in Marietta on November 3, 1819 and moved to Morgan County, Ohio in 1825, locating at Big Bottom. He graduated from Oberlin College and Cleveland Medical College. He practiced medicine in Stockport from 1848 until he retired in 1867.

Martha Ellen White died December 10, 1857. Dr. White married second Mary Wade.(who was Mary Eddleblute and after Dr. White died she married Rev. Wade) Dr. White died February 2, 1875.

The well marked graves of Dr. and Martha Ellen White are adjacent to the Capt. I.N. Hook monument in the "Brick Church" Cemetery along the Muskingum River between Stockport and McConnelsville, Ohio.

At the time of her death Martha Ellen was only 28 years old.

18. John Quincy White (John , Thomas) the eighth child born to John (Thomas) White and Elizabeth Ann (Soper) White was born in Morgan County, Ohio, on April 27, 1831.

On September 27, 1867, at the age of 36, he was married to Sarah Catherine Callaghan. She had been married before to William R. Shoop, by whom she had two children, Ada M. Peebles and Nettie M. Sherwood. Sarah C. Callaghan was born February 16, 1836; died February 8, 1923, Cleveland.

During an adventure to California to prospect for gold, John Quincy White lost his left arm by reason of an infected thumb. During the Civil War he served in Company D. of the 1st California Cavalry.

He is mentioned in the Morgan County Atlas of 1875 as "professional teacher". He taught school at Newton Ridge and at Sherwoodsborg. In 1878 he became Superintendent of the County Infirmary. He owned a farm a mile and a half from Stockport where the family lived in a log cabin.

John Quincy White died in Chester Hill on June 27, 1880 and with his wife is buried in the Stockport Cemetery.

Charles C. White was born on Decoration Day, 1874, in the log cabin on his father's farm near Stockport.

He attended school at Newton Ridge under Jessie T. Elliott and Sylvester Brown; at McConnelville under Stella Courtwright; at Chesterhill; at Stockport under Mollie Gormerly, "Kin" Abbott, A.J. Breeze, J.C. Welty and F.M. Gill. He was one of the first four graduates of Stockport High School in 1890 under F.M. Gill with Frank McDermott, Link Russell and Harvey Fleming.

After graduating from High School he taught at Olivet on "Heathen Ridge" and at Sherwoodsborg where his father taught before him.

In the Fall of 1892 he attended Marietta Academy under the principalship of Martin R. Andrews and graduated in 1893. He then entered Marietta College. He worked his way through, doing some teaching and as a waiter in Mrs. Dye's Boarding House. He was a leader in nearly every major student activity, including most of the pranks. He found time for athletics and the record shows that he won in open competition the all-round championship of the college. He graduated in June 1897 with the degree of Bachelor of Arts, "Magna cum Laude". He was a Phi Beta Kappa, a member of Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity and Psi Gamma Literary Society.

In 1941 his alma mater awarded him the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws. In 1942 he was made a trustee of the college. Credited with being the largest donor of books to the college library, the school reports these gifts were invariably characterized by "familiar underlining, marginal notes, statements with which he agreed or disagreed with the author, and in his most emphatic manner. He participated in every campaign of the college, financial and other.

"While teaching in Morgan County after graduation from college I registered for the study of law with the late J. A. Ivers and read law somewhat desultorily until I came to Cleveland in October 1903."

From the fall of 1903 until the summer of 1905 he was employed as a clerk with the New York Central Railway.

In the fall of 1904 he entered Cleveland Law School, then the Law Department of Baldwin-Wallace College, and graduated there-from in June 1905, with the degree of Bachelor of Laws. He was admitted to the Bar in June, 1905.

He practiced law for a few months, from the summer of 1905 until February, 1906, when he entered the employ of what was then The Land Title Abstract Company, the name of which was later changed to The Land Title Abstract and Trust Company. In 1932 the company took over the business of The Guarantee Title and Trust Company, and has since been known as the Land Title Guarantee and Trust Company. In 1908 he made Title Officer and after 1932 was Chief Title Officer. In 1944 he was made Vice-President and Advisory Counsel.

He was dean of the Ohio Title Association whose annual convention he addressed for many years. He also spoke before the Ohio Real Estate Board and the New York Title Association.

He belonged to the Knights of Columbus, the University Club, the City Club, the Cleveland, Ohio State and National Bar Associations, and the Ohio and American Title Associations. He wrote for, Ohio Law Reporter, Cincinnati Law Review, Yale Law Review, Michigan Law Review, Cornell Law Quarterly, West Virginia Law Quarterly, Real Estate Outlook, Indiana Title Bulletin and the American Bar Association Journal.

In 1921 he joined the faculty of John Marshall Law School, where he taught real property law for three years. In 1927 he was made adviser on real property for the American Law Institute. He was the only "non-academic" adviser.

He was beloved by many and knew personally each member of the John White branch of the family.

The ELIZABETH (WHITE) NICHOLS Line

5. ELIZABETH WHITE, daughter of Captain Thomas and Sarah (Keyes) White, was born in Loudon County, Virginia. She was their fifth child and second daughter to bear the name of Elizabeth. (The first died as a baby.) This second Elizabeth was born on September 10, 1793.

At the age of 15, on December 14, 1808, she married 21 year old Eli Nichols, son of George and Nancy (Hoge) Nichols, in Loudoun County, Virginia.

The youthful bride and groom went on horseback to the newly settled Belmont County, Ohio. Her parents followed them eight years later. They are known to have lived at Uniontown, where her mother lived with them from 1841 to 1845. Thus the "certain Bureau mounted with brass mountains" left Elizabeth by her father, Captain White, was in her care even before the death of her mother.

Eli Nichols died in Uniontown on November 15, 1850. Their sons, Thomas, David, Humphrey and James went to Illinois early after their father's death and induced their mother to follow with several younger children.

Elizabeth (White) Nichols died in Bureau County, Illinois, on February 3, 1853. She is buried at LaMoille, Illinois with several of her children.

7. Humphrey Keyes White, born on August 9, 1798 in Loudon County Virginia, was the seventh child of Captain Thomas White and Sarah (Keyes) White.

He was named for his grandfather, Humphrey Keyes, his mother's father who was "lost" at sea only to return and find his first wife married to another. This grandfather married second, Sarah Hall, who became the mother of Sarah Keyes and grandmother to Humphrey Keyes White.

Humphrey Keyes White was 18 years old when he migrated with his parents and two or three sisters and brothers to Belmont County, Ohio in the year 1816.

He married first, Elizabeth Stedman, by whom he had seven children. She died in 1844.

He married second, about 1847, Mary Magdalene Bumgardner (Polly), born 1818, died 1883, the daughter of Jacob and Rebecca Bumgardner.

Humphrey and his brother John came to Morgan County, Ohio in 1823 and built a mill with two runs of stones at Big Ludlow, six miles below McConnellsville on the west side of the Muskingum river. The land on which the mill was built is now owned by Kate and J. Harrey Henery. This land was deeded by Thomas Devin and wife to John White, April 20, 1830; and by John White and Elizabeth Ann White to Humphrey K. White and Richard McPeak on November 9, 1835.

By a wing dam the current was concentrated on a reaction wheel for each run, and on one for a carding machine operated by S. M. Dyke. The mill was kept in operation till 1840.

In 1853 Humphrey Keyes White lived in Leesburgh (Leesville), Carroll County, Ohio, on town lots 5, 8 and 17 formerly belonging to his father, Captain Thomas White.

Mary Magdalene, who bore his second five children, died in 1883, just two weeks after the death of Humphrey Keyes White.

THOMAS WHITE (Thomas), number eight on the list of children of Captain Thomas White and Sarah (Keyes) White, was born February 2, 1801 in Loudoun County, Virginia, and named for his father.

He came to Belmont County, Ohio, with his parents in 1816. He was a school teacher and during the summer months traveled over the country-side mending clocks.

He lived in One Leg Township, Tuscarawas County, Ohio, in 1831, as did his father, as shown by personal property tax records for that year. Each was taxed for 1 horse and 1 cow, \$48 valuation. The father is shown on this tax record begining in 1829 but the son's name appears only in the one year. This township later became part of Carroll County.

In 1845, Thomas White (Thomas) was administrator for the estate of John McCoy, husband of his sister, Ruth Pemberton White. This was in Carroll County.

He married Eliza Morris.

At the time of his death he lived on a 32 acre farm between Leesburgh (Leesville) and New Hagerstown, Carroll County, Ohio. This farm was left by his father. He bought all the heir's rights to it, except Elizabeth Nichols', on October 14, 1851.

He died in February 1882. His wife died in July 1874. They are buried at Uhrichsville, Tuscarawas County, Ohio.

9. JAMES ALBERT WHITE was born in Loudoun County, Virginia, on April 1, 1803, to Captain Thomas and Sarah (Keyes) White. He was only thirteen when his family took him to Belmont County, Ohio. Like his older brothers, John and Humphrey, he later moved to Morgan County, Ohio.

He owned the farm in Windsor Township, Morgan County, now owned by Obediah McKibben, the house setting on the bank of the Muskingum River north and west of the Hooksburg school-house. A quit claim deed to his father's land in 1851 shows him living in Morgan County.

He married first, Louisa Soper, by whom his children were born. She was born October 29, 1806 and died February 16, 1848. She lies buried in McConnellsville cemetery close to the graves of John and Elizabeth (Soper) White. He married second Sarah _____ and moved to the West where he died. Buried in Missouri. He was blind all his life.
