THE NAME

IS FOUND IN PUBLIC RECORDS AS WOODLY, WOODLEY, WODLY, WODLEY, WOODLE, WUTLING, WUTLY, Etc. THE MOST COMMON USE TODAY IS WOODLING.

THE EUROPEAN HOME

OF THE FAMILY IS BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN GERMANY, ALTHOUGH THERE ARE SOME WHO CLAIM THAT THE FAMILY IS OF ENGLISH ORIGIN. ONE INDICATION AGAINST THIS BELIEF IS THAT ALL THE PIONEER MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY WROTE AND SPOKE GERMAN.

1—JOHN WOODLING

JOHN WOODLING, seems to have been the first of the family to live in this country. In 1774 he lived in Northern Liberties Township, Philadelphia County, Pa., and in 1782 in Frederick Twp., same county. This later became Frederick Township of Montgomery County. He must have been an old man at the time, because no record is available showing his service in the Revolution. It is believed that his sons were: Andrew, Mathias, David, John George, Samuel, and John.

2—ANDREW WOODLING

ANDREW, supposed son of John, in 1785 lived in Hamilton Twp., Northampton County, Pa. He was a farmer and blacksmith. He resided in same township in 1797. He seemingly had a son named Peter. Andrew Woodling served as a soldier in the Revolutionary War. His record may be found in the 5th series of the Pennsylvania Archives, Vol. 8, page 383.

3-MATHIAS WOODLING

MATHIAS, supposed son of John, lived in Mahoning Twp., Northumberland Co., Pa., in 1786, and the U. S. Census of 1790 states that in that year the family consisted of one male over and four under 16 years, and one female.

4—DAVID WOODLING

DAVID, supposed son of John, in 1780 lived in Ashton Rate, Chester Co., Pa., and in 1790, in Northumberland Co., and was unmarried.

5-JOHN GEORGE WOODLING (1761-1845)

JOHN GEORGE, supposed son of John, was born Jan. 16, 1761, probably in what is now Frederick Twp., Montgomery Co., Pa., and died near Freeburg, Snyder County, in 1845. He was commonly called "George." His wife was Hannah Herb, she was born October 23, 1762, probably in Montgomery Co., and died near Freeburg on Sept. 18, 1837. Both are buried in St. Peter's Cemetery in Freeburg. Tradition states that George first came into Middle Creek Valley to buy cattle which were driven over the "Reading Road" to the eastern markets. On these trips he was accompanied by his younger brother, John. George bought a large tract in Flint Valley, just prior to 1800, much of this land is today owned by Irvin Steffen. George and his brother built the gristmill on the Middle Creek, not far from Pawling Station, which in later days was known as Renninger's Mill. It is one of the last of the old type stone structures of its kind in the county. The mill seems to have been built about 1795. The compiler, a great-great-grandson of the subject of this sketch, has numerous papers which belonged to George, many of them more than one hundred and thirty years old. During part of the Revolutionary War, George served in Captain Michael Gaugler's Company of the Philadelphia County Militia. After the war he was a Sergeant in the militia. George was a farmer, cattle dealer and land speculator. In 1840, George deeded some of his land to his son, Joseph, in return for which Joseph was to support him for the remainder of his life.

6-SAMUEL WOODLING

SAMUEL, supposed son of John, lived in Cumberland Co., Pa., in 1790, and his family in that year consisted of one male over and two under sixteen years, and two females.

7—JOHN WOODLING (1776-1850)

JOHN, supposed son of John, was born on Jan. 31, 1776, probably in what was then Northern Liberties Twp., Philadelphia Co., Pa., now Frederick Twp., Montgomery Co., and died about 1850 near Selinsgrove, Snyder Co., Pa. His wife was Susanna———. Both are buried in the old cemetery of the First Lutheran Church in Selinsgrove. John like his brother, George, seems to have come to this section a number of times before he located here. John purchased a large tract of land on the "Sand Hill" in Penn Twp., in what is now Snyder Co. John, like his brother, George, bought and sold various tracts of land in Penn and Washington Townships. His will was probated at Lewisburg, Pa., March 1, 1853. John was a farmer and seemingly a member of the Lutheran Church.

JOHN GEORGE, JR. (son of George, John) was born March 14, 1785, probably in Frederick Twp., Northampton Co., Pa. His mother was Hannah Herb. About 1807, he married Elizabeth———. Their son, George, was baptized at the old Lutheran Church, north of Freeburg in 1808. They probably had other children.

DANIEL (lineage as above) was born on April 8, 1788, probably in what is now Frederick Twp., Montgomery Co., Pa. His mother was Hannah Herb. On May 11, 1835, he lived at Millersburg, Pa., and on that date he wrote his father asking for a loan, so that he might buy food for his family. In 1840, Daniel bought a tract of land in Flint Valley, south of Freeburg, Pa., from his father for \$250. On Jan. 25, 1843, he bought a water right from his brother Joseph, in Flint Valley for \$5.00. Daniel had a number of children, but only one is known to the compiler.

MAGDALENA (lineage as above) was born on Oct. 25, 1790, probably in Frederick Twp., Montgomery Co., Pa. Her mother was Hannah Herb. Magdalena married John Miller of Buffalo Valley (now Union County). On December 15, 1840, George sold a tract of land in Flint Valley to Magdalena and her husband. It is presumed that Magdalena and her husband lived in Union County for a time, at least, and possibly later in Flint Valley. Children—

Valentine Haas' Company, 77th Pennsylvania Regiment in the service of the United States at Marcus Hook, Pa., Nov. 10, 1814.

12—JONAS WOODLING (1795-

JONAS (lineage as above) was born January 26, 1795, either in Frederick Twp., Montgomery Co., Pa., or what is now Washington Twp., Snyder Co., Pa. His mother was Hannah Herb. He may have died in childhood, because nothing more could be learned about him.

13—JOSEPH WOODLING (1796-1879)

JOSEPH (lineage as above) was born on June 20, 1796, probably in what is now Washington Twp., Snyder Co., Pa., and died at Millheim, Center Co., Pa., Jan. 25, 1879. His mother was Hannah Herb. Joseph married, Catherine, daughter of Jacob Hains, of Freeburg, Pa. Catherine's mother was a daughter of John George Moyer, a Revolutionary soldier, as was Jacob's father. In 1840, Joseph's father deeded some land to him in Flint Valley in return for which he was to care for the old man until his death, but about 1845, Joseph moved to Haines Twp., Center Co., Pa. On March 25, 1851, he sold the tract he received from his father in 1840, to Isaac Boyer and Edward Bassler. Joseph was a farmer. His wife was born about 1800, and died on April 8, 1874. SAMUEL (lineage as above) was born in what is now Washington Twp., Snyder Co., Pa., Sept. 27, 1797. His mother was Hannah Herb. He died in Penn Twp., Snyder Co., and letters of administration were granted to Daniel Klose on Nov. 21, 1822. If he was married and left offspring, the compiler has been unable to find the information.

WILLIAM (lineage as above) was born in what is now Washington Twp., Snyder Co., Pa., Aug. 20, 1802, and died in Penn Twp., same county, Nov. 24, 1881. His mother was Hannah Herb. William, in June, 1826, married Anna Maria, daughter of Adam and Barbara Gilbert. She was born in what is now Washington Twp., April 7, 1806, and died in Penn Twp., May 21, 1883. Both are buried in St. Peter's Cemetery in Freeburg, Pa. William was a farmer and owned a small farm in Flint Valley, which was part of the original holding of his father. William's brother, Henry, owned the land to the east of his. His daughter, Mrs. Adam J. Fisher, later became the owner of this farm. William and family were members of the Lutheran or Reformed Church.

Her mother was Catherine Hains. She married Joseph Winters, a first cousin of Benjamin Winters, husband of her sister, Catherine. Anna and her husband lived in Flemington, Pa., and both died in the year 1918, and are buried there. They were members of the Christian Science cult. They were childless.

78—BARBARA WOODLING, wife of ADAM J. FISHER

BARBARA (William, George, John) was born in what is now Washington Twp., Snyder Co., Pa., Oct. 15, 1828, and died at the home of her son, Jacob A. Fisher, Selinsgrove, Pa., Dec. 24, 1910. Her mother was Anna Maria Gilbert. Barbara married Adam J. Fisher, Jan. 10, 1847. They operated a farm along Middle Creek in Penn Township, east of Kantz, and in the later years of their life lived on a smaller place in the "Smoketown" valley, same township. Barbara was a slight hardworking woman. Her husband was a grandson of the pioneer, John Adam Fisher. Adam taught school in his younger days, and held numerous public offices, such as school director, tax assessor, tax collector, and from 1871 to 1874, was one of the commissioners of Snyder County. Barbara spent only a few months in school and could read nothing beyond the German Primer, but she was an excellent mental mathamatician. Adam was a very large man and hard worker. He was born in Penn Twp., Snyder Co., Pa., April 7, 1826, and died same place, Oct. 13, 1901. Both were members of the First Lutheran Church of Selinsgrove. They are buried in the Baker's Cemetery at Selinsgrove, Pa. He was a charter member of the Selinsgrove Odd Fellows.
