#### ANCESTOR WORSHIP ON NANTUCKET



N Nantucket, genealogy assuredly is held in high esteem. Among the descendants of the original families, the ancient island aristocracy, as it were,—and these include

in near or remote lineage practically the entire population, genealogy is a fetish, a passion, a solemn rite. For years Aunt Polly Chase, despite stone-deafness, with sharp, querulous, and forthright tongue, with remarkable octogenarian shrewdness, and with a more than half genuine pretense at guarding sacred treasure, presided with impressive formality over some genealogic remains left by that indefatigable antiquarian, William C. Folger. In every household and preserved in quantity at the local historical societies are family charts in the form of giant half cart-wheels, which provide for the radiating records of both maternal and paternal ancestors in concentric generations back to the fortunate forebear who first courted sure renown by settling on the "hammock isle." An enthusiastic Nantucket lady confessed to me that an absorption in one of these "cartwheels" had taken her all over this country and to Europe in her efforts to complete every "line," and that not even her botanist's thrill at the discovery of a new heather on

her native island had been comparable to the keen joy consequent upon the positive identification of a quite indispensable ancestor, who for years had been under suspicion but had always eluded documentary proof. I have been permitted to use private manuscript genealogical matter (and there are many such collections) in immaculate form, the collection and transcription of which must have filled the leisure of half a lifetime; indeed, these records often descend from mother to daughter, for it is most frequently the women who serve as family historians. Fie upon the ardor of the chase, the collector's passion; away with every game of chance ever played for gold; for they are as dust and ashes in the mouth when ranged beside the fierce zest of consuming ancestor-pursuit.

No less noticeable and impressive than this cult of ancestry to even the merest genealogical tyro and dilletante, is the intense *Inselsliebe* which has marked all natives of Nantucket. A singularly large proportion of the two hundred members of the one family noted in this pamphlet were born, lived, and died on Nantucket. Those of them who now and again joined the ranks of the "off-islanders" (save for the progeny of one prolific David who removed to Maine in 1810) have either ultimately returned to or have seldom left the State, many of them, indeed, never getting beyond the "Cape" towns. This constancy is easy to understand during the prosperous and stirring whaling days. It is harder to account for in recent years, when, save for the brief and somewhat deluding stimulus of the summer

visitor, there is little on the Island for a regular dweller to do or to be. And yet they stay with a loving inertia, rare even in the older parts of our country, and quite incomprehensible to the transient, migratory dweller in the great West.

These records of the Wyer family are the result of finding, on a chance vacation month spent on Nantucket in 1906, that the name, a distinctly uncommon one, was better represented in the Island directory than Smith, Jones, or Brown. Circumstances having delayed their publication for five years, this explanation is offered that the belated data may be understood to be as of 1906, not 1911. Obviously bare names, dates, and places are the veriest shreds of any true family history; yet, as they are not wholly without interest and significance, curiosity as to them may be pardoned, and even such prosaic scraps of unromantic history offer much (when read between the lines and in close connection with the Island history) to fire the imagination and move the deepest feelings.

#### THE NANTUCKET WYERS

In the following genealogy only the male lines are fully traced. All females born Wyer are noted in proper places; the dates of birth, death, marriage, and name of husband are given, but not of the children. Unless otherwise stated, all marriages, births, and deaths occurred on Nantucket.

The emigrant ancestor of the Nantucket Wyers, as also probably of most members of that family in America, was

The following records found on Nantucket relate to individuals named Wyer who can not certainly be connected with any of the foregoing.

- 189 ARTHUR CLINTON appears on Nantucket town record as son of Mary G. (125 above) and John Linez, born July 11, 1867. He married at Nantucket Clara Louise Selden September 27, 1899, and has lived as printer in Providence, Rhode Island, and Montclair, New Jersey.
- New Bedford on a whaling voyage in November, 1801, and on a second voyage 1803 to April 27, 1804. Captain Wyer died during the second voyage. Probably is No. 79 above.
- 191 HEPSABETH, daughter of Hepsibeth Wyer, born 1783; married between April 28, 1809, and 1810 to John Perry.
- 192 Lydia, daughter of William (197) and Margaret (Hussey), born 1809; married Thomas Folger; died August 25, 1839. The William Wyer, father of Lydia, is from Beverly, Massachusetts, whose first wife was Lydia Glazier. He was not directly connected with the Nantucket branch.
- 193 NATHANIEL; moved from Newbury to Nantucket about 1659 and lived there until his death March 1, 1681. Of his seven children only two daughters went with him to Nantucket. Mary was married there to John Swain about 1661, and Mehitable to Daniel Tilton in 1669. These people are entirely unrelated to the Wyer family, and, though the name is frequently spelled so, the correct form is Weare.
- OBED, born January 10, 1816; a private record says son of Obed (89 above) and Polly Gorham. This is clearly wrong, but he may have been a son of Obed (70) and Anna Pease.
- 195 Polly, daughter of Hepsibeth Wyer, born May 15, 1792; married Thomas Hopkins. The mother of 191 and 195 was probably No. 18 above, perhaps No. 43.
- 196 Timothy, born 1787; married Love Delano or Dilsoe, a widow and daughter of D. Swain. Thought to be son of David Wyer of Medford, Massachusetts. A private record says "no issue."
- 197 WILLIAM (father of 192), of Beverley, Massachusetts, and unrelated directly to the Nantucket Wyers, married Margaret Hussey at Nantucket November 5, 1799. (Town Clerk's record.)
