ROGER AND ROBERT WILLIAMS, .

Brothers, of Welsh origin, sailed from Norwich, England, about the year 1638. ROBERT settled at Roxbury, Mass., and from him our branch of the Williams family are descendants. Robert was admitted a freeman in 1638, and his first wife was Elizabeth Stratton; they were married in England.

vations of life's comforts—Mother and daughters not seeing the face of a white woman for six months, when Aunt Abigail Williams visited us from Detroit. He also built and finished a frame barn 40x40 feet; plank, boards and shingles, all sawed and made on the place by hand, and all of pine. This barn was the first frame building raised and finished in Oakland County, and still stands in good condition on the old homestead.

As the Country settled and improved his sons began to look for newer regions, and about 1830, A. S. and B. O. WILLIAMS located in Shiawassee County, where they still reside at Owosso. G. D. and E. S. WILLIAMS, in the spring of 1828, went to Saginaw City and engaged in the fur trade, under the auspices of the American Fur Company, of which James Abbott, Esq., of Detroit was Agent; which trade they followed for ten or twelve years.

There being no roads, only Indian trails at that time, we had, with others, then at Saginaw, to ride on horse (or Poney's) back, from Saginaw to Grand Blanc, some 45 or 50 miles—not a house or white family the entire distance—carrying our children before us, and often unable, from high water and bad roads to get through, were obliged to camp out for the night, always going prepared for that emergency. Over bad places, swamps, &c., we carried our wives and children on our backs, over fallen trees, old logs, &c., while the men took the Ponies through or around places almost impassable. We usually traveled in companies of a dozen or more, for mutual protection and assistance.

Our oldest children, Mary and Oliver, had only Indian children for playmates, and the Chiefs gave them Indian names, in token of their friendship. Their wives and daughters would take them to the pay-grounds, when by direction of the Chiefs they would draw their share of money with the Indian children.

Now, in 1876, see the contrast, in place of a wild Indian country, splendid Cities, Towns and Villages abound, with rail roads in almost every direction; beautiful cities now stand upon our old camping grounds.

President Jackson appointed E. S. WILLIAMS Post Master at Saginaw City, which he held until he left Saginaw, in 1840:

In 1850, E. S. WILLIAMS moved to the City of Flint, where he was in trade several years. Upon the election of President Pierce he was appointed Post Master, which he held for eight years. During which time he was elected Mayor of the City.

Grand Father JAMES HARRINGTON and Father ELIAS GOTEE, with their families, moved from Aurelius, New York, in May, 1822, taking passage on the steamboat Superior, from Buffalo to Detroit, the second and only steamboat then on the lake, this being her first trip, the first steamboat, "Walk-in-the-Water," having been lost. The family settled on a large farm near Auburn, Oakland County, then Territory of Michigan, with a family of eight children, old folks and son-in-laws, total number fourteen. Now, in 1876, all are gone but one, MRS. R. W. JENNY, now residing in the City of Flint.

This is only a brief sketch of the early life of our Families, merely for our children when we are gone.

Many more interesting incidents of the early life and trials of a new country might be mentioned with much interest, but let this suffice.
