RICHARD, 1st Generation, m. Elizabeth March, a widow, her maiden name was Juat or Pratt, they had seven children, their names and births will be found below. He d. in 1628, his widow in 1673, aged about 92 years.

May, m. Robt. Bartlett (who came in ship Ann 1623) in 1637. Annie, m. Thos. Little 1633 Apr. 19th. Sarah, m. John Cook in 1637. Elizabeth, m. Richard Church (Father Capt. Benj. Church) 1636. Abigail, m. Anthony Snow 1639. Nathaniel, m. Mary Walker in 1645 and Joseph, m. Priscilla Faunee. She d. in 1707, aged 74 years.

\* It appears that Richard married before he came to Plymouth and that his 5 daughters were born there. He was a merchant from London and not one of the original "Pilgrims" that went to Leyden, Holland. His daughters all m. active men of the colony. Thos. Little was a lawyer and settled in Hingham. She died there. John Cook was one of the first settlers in Mansfield and his wife d. there. Anthony Snow was a leading man in Middleboro' and one of the selectmen. R. Bartlett's descendants are in Freetown to this day. R. Church was a prominent man in his day in old Plymouth. He was the father of Capt. Benj. Church (the old Indian fighter of King Philip's war). The sons, Nathaniel and Joseph, were also prominent men in the Colony and their names are often mentioned in the "Old Colony Records." Nathaniel died in 1667, and Joseph in 1689.

NATHANIEL, 2d Generation, had by his wife Mary, 12 children. Their b. as copied from the Old Colony Records will be found below, together with their names in their proper order.

RICHARD, 3d Generation, went to Middleboro' and Sarah —, the maiden name I cannot learn, but they settled there and had 2 children born to them. James, the eldest, d. in 1709, probably without children. Richard, the father, d. there 1696, about 48 years of age. The names, James and Samuel, their children.

Samuel was by trade a tanner and carried on the business in Midd. I have not been able to learn the time of his death.

James was the 5th child and 4th son of Samuel. He was a shoemaker, probably worked with his father.

JAMES,† 5th Generation, m. Mary Terry, of Freetown, Sept. 4th, 1735, by whom he had 5 children. He d. in Tiverton, R. I. (now F. River) about 1790 in the 80th year of his age. Names and births of the children will be found below, as copied from the records in Midd. and Freetown. The exact birth of Gamaliel not recorded, but his baptism.

His eldest son, Samuel, m. Elizabeth Parker, Jan. 29th, 1763; Mary m. Smith Bowen (of Warren, R. I.) Nov. 26th, 1758; Cornelius m. Mary Terry (dau. of Robt.) Dec. 13th, 1762; the m. of James, the youngest, I have not been able to learn. These 3 sons, Samuel, Cornelius and James, all settled in a place called the 9 Partners, a pleasant settlement in Dutchess Co., N. Y., about 40 miles from Albany. There they all died and are buried, together with their mother, who went to live with Cornelius, after her husband's death. There must be many of their descendants in that part of the state. Names and births of the children of Gamaliel

will be found below, as copied from the records by me in Tiverton, R. I. This Tiverton is now part of the city of Fall River and consequently in the state of Mass.

† James was buried in the orchard on the old farm, which is now being cut up into house lots. I have found the grave and purpose to move the remains to my family lot in the cemetery.

GAMALIEL, 6th Generation, m. Ruth Jenckes, about 1765. They had 12 children, 11 of which grew up and were married. He was the *only* child that settled down here. He d. March 10th, 1807, about 63 yrs. old. His widow died Aug. 26th, 1835, in her 89th year. They are both buried in the old burial ground, near the farm on which they lived.

Gamaliel, the youngest son (my father) had his name changed to Minton; by it he was known when he came to man's estate, and is so called here. My br. Samuel has an only son by this name.

‡ The deaths of Gamaliel's children occurred as follows: Abigail who m. a Thompson d. in 1814, aged 24. Joseph, Apr. 12th, 1820, aged 53. Minton, Jan. 1, 1830, aged 43. Abraham, May 23, 1842, aged 70. Henry, Dec. 6, 1842, aged 73. Perry Oct. 17th, 1844, aged 77. Benjamin, Jan. 1853, aged 83. Samuel, Aug. 30, 1860, aged 80. Russell, Nov. 6th, 1862, aged 80. Elnathan, July 6, 1858, aged 80; and Aunt Ruth Feb. 27th, 1854, in her 87th year. I have the names of most of their wives and children. They had as a rule pretty large families, but they have mostly died, many comparatively young and unmarried. Aunt M. left 4 children; there are only 2 of us. Uncle S. left 7 children, Uncle Abraham none, Uncle Nathan 2, Uncle Russell 1, Uncle Joseph 4, Uncle Benj. 5, I think Henry none, I believe Uncle Perry 2. So you see we are fast going the way of all the earth.

MINTON, 7th Generation, m. Lucretia Durfee Feb. 28th, 1814. He d. Jan. 1st, 1830, in the 43d yr. of his age. Lucretia d. June 26th, 1840, in the 46th yr. of her age. Charles D. d. at Greenwood Valley, Cal., Dec. 26th, 1850. James H. at French Carroll, Col., in 1866. Loring D. D. at Germantown, Pa., in 1847.
