PREFACE

The descendants of Isaac West and Sarah Huff hold an annual reunion on the second Tuesday in August at Standing Spring Church, in Greenville County, South Carolina. Several years ago I was asked to act as historian and I have spent much time, labor and some money on this little book, which gives in brief a history of the West family.

The data for this book I got from many sources. I obtained much of the early history from a genealogist of Washington, D. C., but later I received a book, "THE WEST FAMILY REGISTER" by Mrs. Letta Brock Stone which gave the information in chronological order and I used that in this volume. I secured the South Carolina history from Civil War records, cemeteries, libraries and members of the families most concerned.

I am also indebted to Mrs. Stone for the loan of the etchings for the coat of arms of the family.

Mrs. Stone's book, "THE WEST FAMILY REGISTER" con tains many facts of interest and much more detailed information than I am able to give here for lack of space. She states on page 452 of her book that there are only three associations of the West family in existence, one in South Carolina, one in Ohio and one very active in McLean County Illinois. If you feel interested in the further history of the family, I suggest that you secure a copy of this book.

I am publishing this with the sincere hope that the present and future generations will enjoy tracing their families in this little volume.

Coat of Arms

The coat of arms of the Earl de la Warr is described in terms of heraldry, below:

Arms, Quarterly; first and fourth, argent, a fesse dancette, sable, for West; second and third quarterly, gules, a lion rampant, argent, armed and languid azure between a seme of cross crosslets (eight).

Crest, out of a ducal coronet, or, a griffin's head, azure beaked and eared, gold.

Supporters, Dexter, a wolf coward, argent, gorged with a plain collar, or, a sinister, a cockatrice, or, shadowed and scaled, azure.

MOTTO "Jour de ma vie."

The great houses from the west of England were the first to display arms upon their shields. These early armorial bearings were usually very simple, the colors in strong contrast so that they could be readily distinguished in the confusion of battle. Many reasons guided the choice of armorial bearings by their first owners. Quite often there was a play upon the name, as in the case of Barnard who had a ramping bear upon his shield; Piriton, who had a pear tree; Horsley, horses' heads, and Bower, who depicted bent bows on escutcheon. Three capital T's were borne by Toft of cheshire, and it is possible that the choice of a fesse dancette by the Wests originally suggested a capital W. The earlier drawings of their shield show the points of the fesse much higher and deeper than the later designs, making, as it did, a bold dash across the center. This black, jagged figure on the silver background would be unmistable wherever the shield was displayed.

The original arms of the de la Warr family are quite like those of William de Mowbray, who was one of the twenty-five barons appointed to enforce the Magna Charta. The silver lion on the red shield is the same, the only difference is in the eight small crosses in the background (Seme of cross crosslets). Medieval wisdom gave every noble quality to the lion; therefore this animal was chosen by many knights as well as by the royalty of England and Scotland. When Lord West married the heiress of lord de la Warr, the West arms were quartered with those of the de la Warr family.

The West crest, the head of a griffin, was retained. Nearly all records of West arms in England show the "Fesse Dancette" on the shield and the griffin's head as the crest, suggesting the relationship of the Wests from Devonshire. The fabled creature, the griffin, is an emblem of a valiant hero, unyielding to the enemy, in heraldry symbolizing strength and vigilance.

The right to supporters of a shield is limited to the sovereigns, peers of the realm (in England), knights of the garter, knights of the bath, etc. They descend through the male line. Therefore, the supporters on the coat of arms of Lord de la Warr are those of Lord West. The wolf "coward" on the dexter side suggests a wolf subdued to serve his master, the bearer of the shield. On the sinister side the ancient creature, the cockatrice, was supposed to strike terror to beholders and indicates that in warfare it would be difficult to be interfered with.

The motto on the West coat of arms is: "Jour de ma vie" (Day of my life). This was formerly the motto of the La Warrs. It was adopted to commemorate the capture of King John II of France in the battle of Poitiers by Roger La Warr.

The "manteling" in an armorial achievement is the ornamental design representing the drapery first worn about the helmet as a protection from the sun during the crusades. With the ancient arms the colors are usually specified in the grant as "gules" lined with argent.

After the marriage of Earl de la Warr to Elizabeth Sackville, heiress of the Duke of Dorset, he (West) and his some in 1843 took the name of Sackville-West. The present Earl De La Warr has his shield quartered with that of the house of Sackville, and has also included the Sackville crest in his achievements. Thus two crests are shown, the griffin's head of the Wests and the star (estoile argent) of the Sackvilles. It is interesting to note that the older son of the Earl De La Warr, who was born in 1921, is called Viscount cantelupe. This holding was acquired by Sir Thomas West, early in the 14th Century, when he married Eleanor, daughter and heiress of Sir John de Cantelupe of Hempston, Devon.

West De La Warr

"Besides the Virginia Wests who descended from Sir Thomas West, second Lord de la Warr and the Marvland Wests who descended from Sir William West, there are many other early colonial families of lineal descent from the Wests of the Warr. This family traces its lineage to the early kings of Burgundy A. D. 450 of France 732, of England 800, of Italy 850, of Germany and emperor Elect 900, Alfred the Great 901, Conrad, Holy Roman Emperor 1030, William The Conqueror 1060, Saint David, King of Scotland, Ann of Russia and the Plantagenets.

"Sir Thomas de West of Hamperden, Cantelupe, and Great Tarrington, Devonshire took part in the French wars of Edward III and in 1316 personally captured King John of France at the battle of Cressy. He married Lady Elenor of Cantelupe and their grandson, Sir Thomas de West, was summoned to parliament in 1401. He married Lady Joan, sister and heiress of Thomas Lord de la Warr, whose family traces back to the Eighth of John, when John de la Warr had a ratification of a grant made by King John, on the Lordship of Bristolton.

"In 1568, Sir William West was knighted in Hampton Courts and created Lord de la Warr (new creation, the male line having become extinct). He was a member of the Privy Council of Queen Elizabeth and distinguished himself at St. Quentin. He married Elizabeth Straange (or Strauss) and had Sir Thomas West second Lord de la Warr, who was head of the American branches of this family. He married Annie, cousin of Queen Elizabeth, and their sons came early to Virginia where they at once became prominent in Colonial affairs."

CHAPTER II

Lineage of the De La Warr Family

Among the families of noble descent who were represented in this country in its early days, none were of more distinguished lineage than that of the De La Warr. Royal blood flowed in its veins, albeit somewhat thinned by the passage of time, and the family tree is traced from Alfred The Great, through thirteen generations, to Edmund, Earl of Lancaster, the son of Henry the Third. Henry Plantagenet, the son of the Earl of Lancaster, had a daughter, Joan, who married Lord Mowbray; and their son, John, Lord Mowbray, had a daughter, Eleanor, who married Roger La Warr.

The earliest La Warr recorded, is John La Warr, who, during the reign of King John (1199-1216) received ratification of a grant of the Lord of Bristolton, Gloucestershire, which had been given him prior to John's coming to the throne. Six years later he died, and was succeeded by his son.

Jordan La Warr. He in turn was succeeded by his son.

Iohn La Warr, who in the reign of Edward I was sheriff of Herfordshire. Following came his son,

Roger La Warr. He was created Baron in 1299 and married Clarice, daughter of Baron Tregoz. Dying in June 1320, he was succeeded by his son,

John La Warr, the second Baron, who took part in the wars of Edward I and III and was with the Black Prince at Crecy. He married in 1294, Joan, sister and heir of Baron Gresley of County Lancaster and had one son John, who died before, 1345, preceding his father in death. He and his wife, Margaret Holland, were the parents of two sons and one daughter: 1 Roger; 2 Sir John of Bokampton in Berks, who died without issue; and 3, Catherine, who married Sir Warine Latimer. When the second Baron De La Warr died in 1347, he was succeeded by his grandson.

Roger La Warr, the third Baron, who took part bravely in the victory of Poictiers. He married first, in 1338 Elizabeth, the daughter of Lord Welles, having 1 John, the 4th Baron, who died 1398 without issue; 2. Thomas, 5th Baron De La Warr, a priest who died 1426. He married in 1358 Eleanor, daughter of Lord Mowbray, and died in 1370 aged 43 leaving one daughter only, Joan, who married Sir Thomas West, Lord West, whose descendants succeeded to the title of La Warr.

Sir Thomas West, the earliest one traced in this line, was knighted in 1326 in the reign of Edward II. He served in Flanders and Brittany in the reign of Edward III and for his services was created a Baron. He was known as Thomas de West and was probably from County Devon where Wests have been found down to the present time. In 1328 he married Eleanor (Alianore), the daughter of Sir John de Cantelupe of County Devon, and they were the parents of a son, Thomas West, who succeeded him when he died in 1344.

Sir Thomas West, 2nd Baron, had his holdings at Hempston, Cantelupe. He fought at the battle of Crecy, and served both Edward III and Richard II. He married Alice, daughter of Reginald Fitz-Herbert of County Worcester and had a son,

Sir Thomas West, who was knighted in 1399. He married Joan, half sister and heiress of Thomas 5th Baron De La Warr, and daughter of Roger 3rd Baron De La Warr. From this point the two lines are merged into one, the West family taking the title Baron De La Warr. The eldest son of Joan De La Warr and Sir Thomas West,

Thomas, Lord De La Warr, was fourteen when his father died in 1405. He would have been the 4th Baron West but was known as the 5th Baron De La Warr. He served in the Agincourt campaign in the reign of Henry V. He married Ida, daughter of Almaric de St. Amand but died September 30, 1415 without issue. He had two brothers, Reginald and John West, and was succeeded by,

Reginald, Lord De La Warr, his second brother. In the reign of Henry VI, Reginald, the 6th Baron, made two pilgrimages to the Holy Land. He was twice married; 1st to

Margaret Thorley who died in 1433; 2nd to Eleanor, the daughter of Henry Percy, Earl of Northumberland. He was the father of: 1 Richard West; 2 John West, who married Agnes Iveson and had children; 3 Margaret West, who married Sir Thomas Erpingham of Sussex; 4 Anne West, who married Sir Thomas Berkeley of Gloucestershire, whose descendant, John Berkeley came to Virginia in 1620: 5 Mary West, who married Roger Leuknore of Sussex, and 6 Catherine West, who married Roger, Lord Hungerford. The eldest son succeeded to the title

on the death of his father, August 27, 1451.

Richard, Lord De La Warr, the 7th Baron, fought for the House of Lancaster in the War of the Roses. He married: 1st Catherine, daughter of Robert, Lord Hungerford, and was the father of: 1 Thomas West; 2 John West; 3 Reginald West, a sub-deacon in Wells Cathedral; 4 Edward West; 5 Richard West, a Franciscan Friar; 6 Frances West; 7 Margaret West, who married Sir Nicholas Strelly; 8 Margery West, a nun; 9 Alice West, a nun. On his death, March 10, 1475/6 at the age of 45, Richard was succeeded by his eldest son,
Thomas, Lord De La Warr, who was born about 1457 and

died 1525. He was created Knight of the Bath in the reign of Henry VII and Knight of the Garter by Henry VIII and attended the King at the Field of the Cloth of Gold. This 8th Baron De La Warr married; 1st Elizabeth, the daughter of Hugh Mortimer of Southampton County; and 2nd Elizabeth, the daughter of Sir Roger Copley of Sussex. He and Elizabeth Mortimer were the parents of: 1 Thomas, who succeeded to the title; 2 William, who died childless; 3 Eleanor West, who married Sir Edward Guilford of Kent and was the grandmother of Earl Leicester (Elizabeth's favorite); 4 Dorothy West, who married Sir Henry Owen; 5 Elizabeth West, who married Charles Somerset, Earl of Worcester; 6 Anne West, who married Thomas, Lord Clinton. By his second marriage to Eleanor Copley, he was the father of: 1 Sir Owen West, who married Mary, the daughter of Sir George Guilford and had Mary and Anne West only; 2 Sir George West of Sussex who died 1538; 3 Leonard West, the youngest, of Gloucester County who married Barbara, daughter of William Goscoigne of Sussex. The children of Leonard West and Barbara were: Thomas, William, John, Marie, Simon, Margaret and Anne. All these died young except John who lived in County Oxford.

(See Burke's Landed Gentry for the Wests of Alscot Park.) Thomas, Lord De La Warr, who succeeded his father 1525 and became the 9th Baron, married Elizabeth, daughter of Sir John Bonville, and died childless in 1554. He was suc-

ceeded by his nephew, the son of Sir George West,

William, Lord De La Warr, who had been named as heir by his uncle but was debarred from the succession for attempting to poison him. Later, however, for services to the King, William was created anew, Lord De La Warr. His brother was Sir Thomas West of Seltwood and his sister was Margaret West who married Thomas Arundel. William married Elizabeth Strange and was the father of: 1 Thomas who married Anne Knowlles or Knollys (her mother was the first cousin of Queen Elizabeth); 2 Jane West (who married 1st Thomas Weynman, 2nd James Cressy, 3rd, Sir Thomas Tasburg, and 4th Rolph Sheldon): 3 Elizabeth West who married Richard Blount, of Suffolk County; 4 Mary West, who died unmarried. William, the 1st Lord De La Warr of the new line died in 1595 and was succeeded by his eldest son,

Thomas, Lord De La Warr, the second Baron, who was born in 1577 and died 1601/2. He and his wife, Anne Knollys became the progenitors of a large number of descendants, many of whom claim America as their home. They are said to have had twelve children, ten of whom are known: Thomas West; Robert West (no issue) Capt. Francis West; Letitia West, who married Henry Laidlow; Capt. Nathaniel West; Elizabeth West who married Sir Robert Pelham; Penelope West who married Herbert Pelham; Eleanor West who married Sir William Savage; Anne West who married John Pelott; Capt. John West.

Thomas West was succeeded by his eldest son,

Thomas, Lord De La Warr, first governor of Virginia. He was born July 9, 1557 and was married at St. Dunstan's in the West, November 25, 1596 to Cecily, daughter of Sir

Thomas Shirley of Sussex. This third Lord De La Warr was made governor of Virginia in 1609 and he owned large grants called Shirley and Westover but these had passed out of the possession of his descendants long before the Colonial mansions of these names, now in existence, had been built. He died on his third voyage from England, off the coast of Delaware, and was succeeded by his eldest son, Henry who became the 4th Lord De La Warr. Thomas' children remained in England.

Henry, Lord De La Warr, was born October 3, 1603 and died June 1, 1628. He married Isabella, daughter of Sir Thomas Edmunds in March 1624/5. He was succeeded by his

son,

Charles, Lord De La Warr, 5th heir to the title, who was born in February, 1625/6. He died December 22, 1687. His wife was Anne Wild whom he married September 25, 1642. He was succeeded by,

John, Lord De La Warr, who married Margaret Freeman in June 1691. He died May 26, 1723 and was succeeded by,

John, Lord De La Warr who was created Earl. He was born April 4, 1693 and married in 1721 Charlotte McCarthey. He was governor of New York in 1737. He had three sons: John, George Augustus and Harry; and two daughters. At

his death in 1766 he was succeeded by,

John, Lord De La Warr, the second Earl who was born in 1729 and married Mary Wynyard August 8, 1756. They were the parents of three sons: William Augustus, the 3rd Earl, who died in 1783 without issue; John Richard, the 4th Earl, who married Catherine Lyle in 1783; and Frederick, born in 1767, who had one daughter only. John Richard was succeeded by George John West, 5th Earle. This line can be traced to the present time in Burke's Peerage. Lord Sackville-West, once British Minister to the United States belonged to this line of the De La Warrs.

CHAPTER III American Descendants of The De La Warrs

Thomas West, 3rd Lord De La Warr and first governor of Virginia, was born July 9, 1577. He had several children who remained in England, but it is not unlikely that some of their descendants came to the Colonies at a later date. From 1608 to his death, Lord De La Warr was active in promoting settlements in the New World. He died June 7, 1618, while making his third voyage to America, and was buried at sea.

Capt. Francis West was born October 28, 1586, and came to Virginia about 1608. He was a member of the Council in 1609 and again served from 1619 to 1633. He was living on his plantation at Westover, about a mile from Berkeley Hundred, 1622, but he seems to have been in New England for a few months the next year. However, in 1624, he was again living in Virginia at "West and Shirley Hundred Island." The next year he was at Elizabeth City, where the widow of his brother, Nathaniel, and her infant son were living. (Virginia Magazine, Vol. 2, p. 308).

Capt. Francis West first married in England, Margaret, the widow of Edward Blaney; and during the time he was governor of Virginia, from 1627 to 1629, he married as his second wife, Temperance Flowerdew, widow of Sir George Yeardley. They had no children, but she was the mother of Argoll, Francis, and Elizabeth Yeardley. (Virginia Magazine, Vol. 25, p. 208). She died 1629/30 and Capt. West married Jane, the daughter of Sir Henry Davey.

Captain West died in 1634, leaving a wife, Jane, in England and a son, Francis, of whom nothing further is known. (Virginia Magazine, Vol. 11, p. 359).

Capt. Nathaniel West, also connected with the early history of our Colonies, was born in 1592 and came to America about 1620. He established himself near his brother and in 1622 had a plantation in Westover Hundred. He married Frances Hinton who after his death in 1623 married, as her second husband, Francis Piersey. (Tyler's Hist. Mag. Vol. 2, pp. 115-16.)

Capt. Nathaniel West and Frances Hinton had one son, Nathaniel West, of whom nothing is known. It is an interesting fact, however, that some of the West families living in Norfolk County and in counties adjoining have a family tradition of descent from one Nathaniel West, an early colonist of the Lord De La Warr Line. (The West Family Register).

Wests of Princess Anne and Norfolk County, Virginia

The Wests of Princess Anne County, as well as Norfolk, claim descent from Capt. Nathaniel West, brother of Lord De La Warr. That they were well connected is not to be denied. They early intermarried with the family of Woodhouse, whose ancester was the same as that of Anne Knollys, mother of Lord De La Warr and his three distinguished West brothers. The name Nathainel is found at intervals in the Princess Anne family, one having died in 1822.

William West, the first mentioned in Norfolk records filed at Portsmouth, died about 1685. He did not leave a will but there were doubtless several heirs, for the name West continued without interruption in the county. There was a Willoughby West who died before 1774 and a John West who appeared in

frequent court action in the latter part of 1700.

In a history of Norfolk County, Virginia by Col. William Stewart, is given the lineage of John West, of Norfolk, a descendant of William West, who fought in the Revolution. John West was born in 1814 and married Sarah Hodges, who died in 1850. They were the parents of: 1 John T.; 2 Amanda; 3 Mary; 4 William A.; 5 Leroy; 6 Josephine; 7 Luther; 8 E.

Jordan; 9 Annie.

In Princess Anne County a William West carried on the line. He leased land in 1718, and he and his wife, Frances, sold land to his brother-in-law, William Brown in 1720. In 1730 he made gifts to his relatives, Mary and Amy Dawley, probably his step-daughters. He died in 1764, leaving a wife, Amy, who died 1771. He did not name a son William in his will but nevertheless the records indicate that he had such a one among his children:

William West Thomas West Lemuel West Willoughby West Mary West Lydia West.

William West, son of William and Frances West, died in 1790. In the tax list 1783 he is given with a family of six children, four of whom are known:

Caleb West Willoughby West William West Elizabeth West.

(West Family Register, by Letta Brock Stone, 1928).

William West, does not give the name of a son Isaac, but it is known that he had six children and only named four of them in will. After very extensive inquiries, both in South Carolina and Princess Anne County, Virginia, we learn that Isaac was a son of William of Princess Anne. Isaac West migrated to South Carolina and married, Mary Payne, some time prior to 1790 as he and his son, Isaac, Jr., are given in the census of 1790 as residing in the Ninety Six district of Greenville County. Isaac West and Mary Payne West were the parents of:

Mary West.
Isaac West, Sr., died in 1820 and soon thereafter, his widow, with her sons, Jonathan, William and Thomas, moved to Franklin County, Alabama, James West settled at Marietta, S. C. Isaac at Grove, S. C. Jacob was a soldier in the Indian War and never returned, having died on his way home. Annie,

Rachel and Sallie never married. Mary married Samuel Patton. Prudence married Collins Rollins and Susan married Joe Bolling. It is understood that all of these lived and died in Greenville County.

Isaac West, Jr., married Sarah Huff and settled at Grove, S. C. He died in 1839 and his widow, Sarah died about 1850. The following is a nearly complete list of his descendants:

I. William James West was the eldest son of Isaac and Sarah Huff West and was born near Piedmont, S. C., February 6, 1819 and died July 7, 1887, being nearly 68 years of age at the time of his death. He was the eldest of the ten brothers, whom he helped to rear and educate, his father having died while he was yet a young man. He remained at home with his widowed mother until he was 32 years of age and on the 21st of June, 1851 was married to Eleanor Jones of Anderson County. He was the most successful farmer of the community in which he lived. He had ideas of scientific farming far in advance of those of his day. He was a fine upright man, never using any language unbecoming to a Christian, or tell a joke that could not be told in the presence of ladies without causing a blush.

He enlisted for service in the Confederate States Army and was in camp at Pocataligo, near Yemasee, S. C., but was sent home to run his mill and for his knowledge of farming.

Besides helping to rear and educate his nine brothers, he

reared eight children of his own and gave a home to six nieces and nephews of his wife, thus assisting them in their education, so it will be seen that he reared and helped to rear twentythree children. He was never happier than when helping others to help themselves. To the union of William James West and Eleanor Jones was born:
