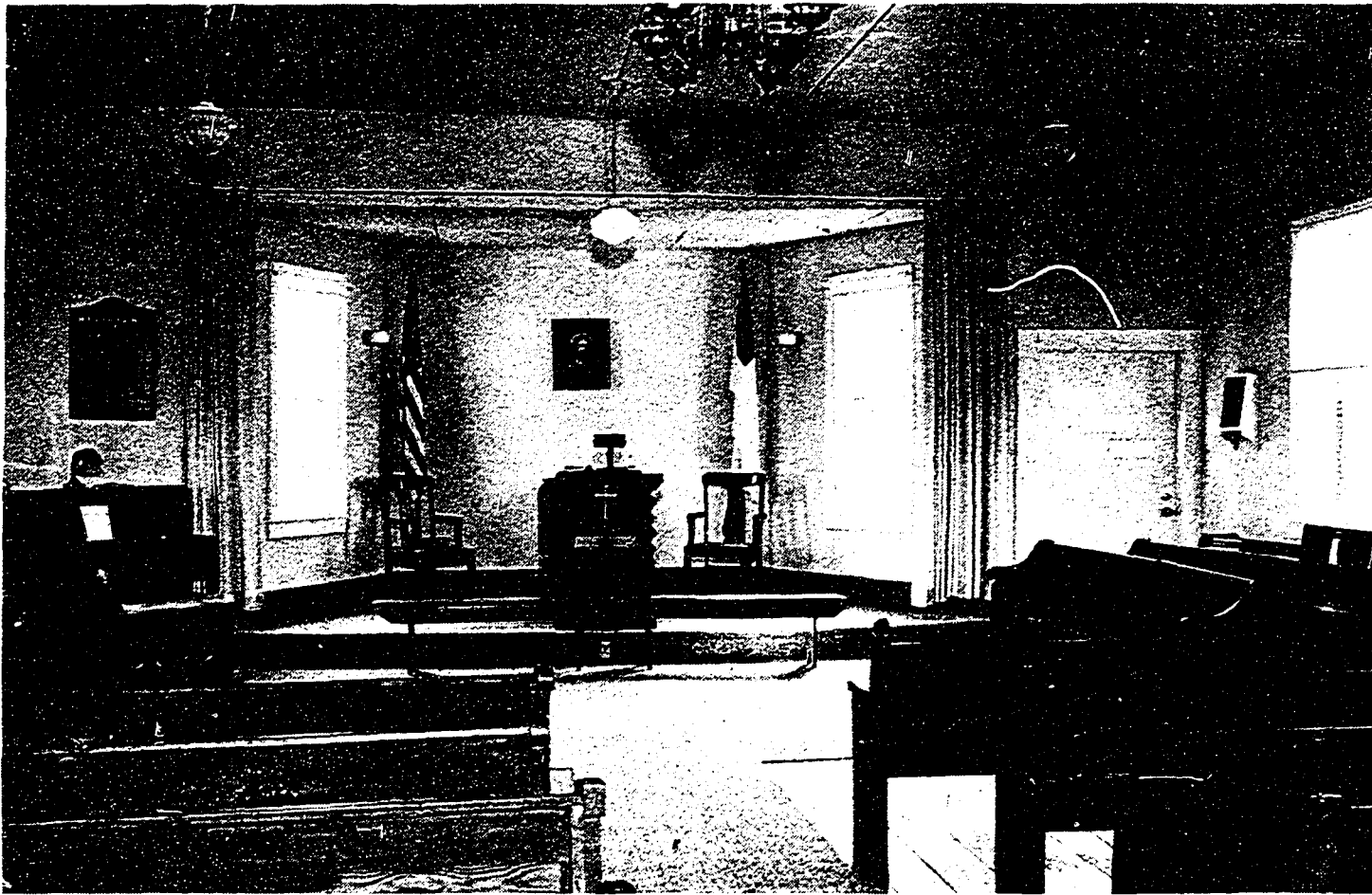
FOREWORD

The Wildermuth family has a long history in this country and its members have been God-fearing law abiding people. If none have achieved world fame, neither has the name featured in sensational news headlines. Its members reflect a cross section of American life, representing a great variety of occupations scattered across the nation. Their emphasis on education is seen in every generation. Two interests which recur so frequently that they may almost be described as family characteristics are musical talent and an interest in the general field of medicine. They have served their country in times of war from the American Revolution to the Korean conflict and many lost their lives. Indeed a true picture of America can be drawn from the lives of the generations of Wildermuths described in the present volume.

The early data included in this volume has been verified and proved. More recent records have been contributed by the families listed. Where complete records are not given, it has been because we have not been able to secure the information either through research for early data or through direct contact for later records.

The present volume is the result of many years of genealogical research by many people far apart both in time and geography. The thorough and painstaking work of both Charles Wagner and his wife Alice not only became a solid foundation but also added hundreds of items of human interest news. The monumental task of compiling and arranging hundreds of records in a usable form was the contribution of Roy L. Wildermuth, Jr. The unflagging zeal and enthusiasm of E.F. Wildermuth who has been eager for this book to become a reality and who has devoted time and money to the Wildermuth Association has been a tower of strength. Dave Patterson, president of the Association when this volume was begun and now treasurer, has given much encouragement and has assumed the responsibility for the sale and distribution of the history. William Wildermuth has provided most of the pictures which has involved research as well as photography. In addition I am grateful for the assistance of Lucille Kennedy and a very heartfelt appreciation goes to Cecilia Getreu for her typing. We wish also to acknowledge with gratitude the assistance given us by the many descendants of Johann Wildermuth who gave of their time and energy in answering questionnaires on their line of descent.

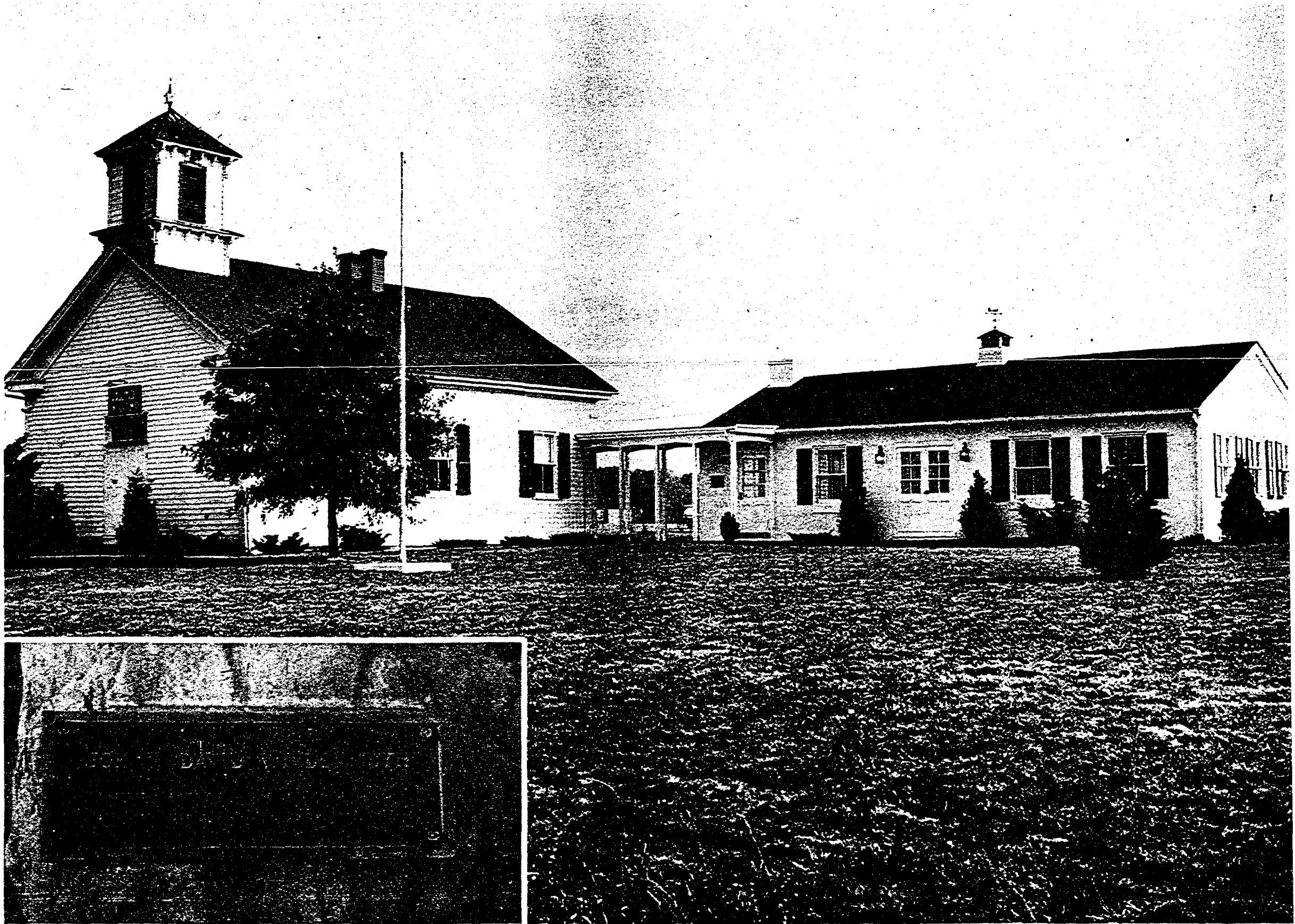
Interior view of Wildermuth Memorial Church today.

The Wildermuth Memorial Church and Youth Center. The original church was built on the Daniel (4) Wildermuth farm sometime before 1859. It was moved to the John (4) Wildermuth farm about 1875 because a new road there would make the church (known as the Mount Gilead E.U.B. church) more accessible. It has been restored by the Wildermuth Association. The Youth Center and the 19 acres of land on which the church stands is the gift of E.F. Wildermuth.

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JOHANN DAVID WILDERMUTH

FIRST GENERATION

JOHANN DAVID WILDERMUTH, the emigrant ancestor from whom the people in this book are descended, came to the United States, 22 Sept. 1752. He arrived on the ship Halifax which sailed from Rotterdam with Thomas Coatam, Captain. (Ref: Rupp, "Thirty Thousand Names of Emigrants"). He signed the oath of allegiance the same day.

There is no family listed for Johann on the passenger list and it is not known if he brought wife and sons with him or acquired them here. According to the "Adler" a German newspaper, the wife of his son William died in 1824, at the age of 75. This would make her date of birth as 1749. Since William died eight years earlier, it would appear that William was born before 1749 and that Johann David brought a family with him.

On the 13 March 1755, Johann David paid fifteen pounds for a warrant of land, to take up 100 acres in Bern Township, Berks Co., Pa. (Warrant #49 recorded in the Land Office of the Dept. of Internal Affairs, Harrisburg, Pa.).

Warrant: By the Proprietaries,

Whereas David Wintermood of the County of Berks hath requested that we would grant him to take up 100 acres of land adjoining Peter Robinson and Bernard Zweizig in Berne Township, in the county of Berks, for which he agrees to pay to our Use - Fifteen pounds per shillings current money of this Province for said hundred acres, and the yearly quit-rent of one Half Penny Sterling for every acre thereof. These are therefore to authorize and require you to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said David Wintermood at the place aforesaid, according to the method of Townships appointed, the said quantity of one hundred acres if not already survey or appropriated, and make return thereof into the Secretary's office, in order for further confirmation; for which this shall be your sufficient warrant: which survey, in case the said David Wintermood fulfil the above agreement within six months from the date hereof, shall be valid, otherwise void. Given under my hand and seal of the Land Office, by virtue of certain Powers from the said Proprietaries, at Philadelphia, this thirteenth day of March, Annis Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty Five.

In 1767, David paid taxes on 40 acres of land, 1 horse and 2 cows; in 1768, on 55 acres, 2 horses, and 3 cows; in 1779, the cleared land on which he paid taxes had increased to 75 acres, 2 horses and 2 cows. (Ref: Penn. Archives, the third series, vol. 18, pages 85, 112 and 205).

In 1780, William Wildermuth paid the taxes on this land and continued to pay them. By deed, dated 12 Nov. 1787, Johann David conveyed his warrant of land to William for 65 pounds and 7 shillings and William received the patent of land from the State of Pennsylvania, 8 Jan. 1788. The patent contained 175 acres and is described as follows:

The Supreme Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. To all to whom these presents shall come greeting. Know he that in consideration of the monies paid by David Wintermood to the late proprietaries at the granting of the warrants hereinafter mentioned and of the sum of Sixty-five pounds seven shillings, lawful money now paid by William Wintermood into the Receiver General's Office of this Commonwealth, there is granted by this Commonwealth unto the said William Wintermood a certain tract of land called "Freezeland" situate in Bern Township, Berks County. Beginning at a corner post of George Bender's land thence by the same North twenty eight degrees East one hundred and forty five perches to a post thence by land of John Althouse South by east sixty four perches to a post South eighty-two degrees East one hundred and forty five perches to a post and North fifty degrees East 18 perches to a post thence by vacant land South forty degrees East Ninety two perches to a black oak South () thirty four degrees West eight perches to a black oak West forty perches to a red oak South nine degrees West seventy nine perches to a post South forty three degrees West twenty four perches to a black oak North seventy degrees West thirty two perches to a chestnut oak North twenty degrees East thirty one perches to a post North seventy degrees West fifty eight perches to a post South twenty degrees West six perches to an Hickory North seventy degrees West one hundred and ten perches to a White Oak thence by land surveyed to Philip Hund North forty four degrees West thirty perches to a White Oak North eighty four degrees West twenty four perches to the place of Beginning, containing one hundred and seventy five acres and three quarters & allowance of six per cent for roads & with the other Appurtenances which said tract was surveyed in pursuance of a warrant granted to the said David Wintermood dated the 13 March 1755, who by deed dated the 12 November 1787 conveyed the same to the said William Wintermood in fee To have & to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the Appurtenances unto the said William Wintermood and his heirs to the use of him the said William Wintermood, his heirs & assigns forever, free & clear of all Restrictions & Reservations as to tenes, Royalties, Quit-rents or otherwise, excepting and reserving only the fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of this Commonwealth to be delivered at the Pits Mouth clear of all charges. In witness whereof the Honorable Peter Muhlenberg, Exec. Vice President of the Supreme Executive Council hath hereto set his hand and caused the State Seal to be hereto affixed in Council the eighth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight and of the Commonwealth the Twelfth Attest James Trimble for Charles Biddle, Sec'y P. Muhlenberg and enrolled 17 January 1788. Patent Book Volume P-11, pages 531 and 532).

The only identifying record of the wife of Johann David appears in the Baptismal and Marriage Records of Rev. John Woldschmuck, Lancaster, Pa. Penn. Archives, 6th series, vol. VI., page 182. On 17 Mar. 1765, David Wildermuth and wife Anna Marie were sponsors at the baptism of Anna Marie Mastallart, daughter of Ludwig and wife Ann Elizabeth.

They, Johann David and Anna Marie, apparently had four children. The two daughters are identified as Elizabeth and Ann Elizabeth who were among 68 persons who took Communion for the first time at Epler's Church, Bern Township. (Ref: Penn. Archives, 6th series, vol. VI). Ann Elizabeth was a sponsor for Henry Wildermuth's oldest son Johannes, bapt. 30 Apr. 1775.

Nothing further is known about them. The William who received the deed of land from Johann David must certainly be a son. In 1784 William Wildermuth and Michael Wagner, a neighbor, went the securities for Anna Wildermuth, Administrator, widow of Henry. This Henry must be a brother of William.

Nothing has been found regarding date of death and place of burial of either Johann David or his wife. He must have been alive in 1787 when he signed deed but he does not appear in the U.S. Census of 1790.

SECOND GENERATION

Henry Wildermuth died before 13 Oct. 1784 and was buried in the Zion Lutheran Cemetery adjoining Red Brick Church, two miles from Owigsburg, Pa. At the gate, Henry's name is on a bronze tablet listing Revolutionary soldiers buried there.

Information concerning Henry is very meager even to discrepancy in the names of wife or wives. The first mention of him is in 1771 when Henry Wildermuth signed a petition against calling a convention to change the form of Government.

Warrant #3, issued to Thomas Willetts, Manheim Twp., Berks Co. 20 Apr. 1752, was patented to Henry Wildermuth (Patent book H-10-287). Manheim Twp., is also called Brunswick Twp., and became a part of Schuylkill Co., in 1811.

Henry is taxed on 100 acres, 2 horses and 2 cows, in Brunswick Twp. in 1781 and again in 1784 with the addition of 1 sheep and 2 persons. (Penn. Archives, 3rd series, Vol. 18, Page 461).

13 Oct. 1784, Henry Christ, Registrar of the Probate of Wills and granting letters of administration in and for the County of Berks. To Anna Mary, Administrator, widow and relict of Henry Wildermuth, late of Brunswick Twp., Berks Co., Pa.

William Wildermuth and Michael Wagner were the securities for Anna Wildermuth, Administrator of the estate of Henry Wildermuth, deceased. Vol 3 - page 396, Adm. Rec.

1 Jan. 1799, John Wildermuth, oldest son of Henry signed a quit-claim deed for the sum of thirty seven pounds, ten shillings releasing his claim to his father's estate and naming the seven children. (Vol. 16, page 287).

The record of the orphans court held in Reading in and for the County of Berks on the 11 day of January 1799 reads: "Upon the petition of Henry Wildermuth, 2nd son of Henry Wildermuth, deceased, late of Brunswick Township, left a widow Margaret and seven children to wit: John Wildermuth who hath released his right to petition, Henry Wildermuth, the petitioner, Margaret, the wife of Daniel Moyer, Michael Wildermuth, Elizabeth Wildermuth, Adam Wildermuth and William Wildermuth. The last four are in their minority. The land joined that of Jost Fall, Daniel Bryon, Michael Wagner, and Andress Rinkle. (Ref. - Vol. 4, No. 1, Page 360.)

The 1810 and 1820 Census shows an older female which could be Anna Mary as living with Adam.

Because of the lack of proof and the inability to put them in their proper relationship, names of various descendants of Henry are placed in Appendix B.

2. WILHELM (WILLIAM) (2) WILDERMUTH, b. Germany ca 1745; d. Greenfield Twp., Fairfield Co., O., 21 Jan. 1816; m. Berks Co. ca 1773, MARIA BARBARA EBLING, b. Alsace Twp., Berks Co., Pa., 1745; d. near Lancaster (called New Lancaster) Greenfield Twp., Fairfield Co., O., Sept. 1824, dau. of Johannes (John) and Maria Phillipina (Yager) Ebling. She m. (2) Fairfield Co., O., 14 Jan. 1817, the Rev. Mr. Gabriel Kemp, Bloom Twp. Fairfield Co., O., by Andrew Wickhizer. (Ohio Genealogical Quarterly, page 94 and Fairfield Co. marriage records).

There is an indenture dated 3 July 1823 between Gabriel Kemp and wife Barbara, and Reuben Newkirk, Henry and Peter Kemp, Trustees for the school lot, in consideration of one dollar for 1/2 acre of land in Hocking Twp., Fairfield Co. being at the S.E. end of the W 1/2 of the N W 1/4 sec. 6, twp. 14, Range 19. Signed Gabriel Kemp and wife and Barbara Kemp, his wife. (Deeds, vol. N, page 440, Lancaster Co. Courthouse). The old Betzer church, German Reform and Lutheran, was built on land in Bloom Twp., owned by John Fellers. The hewed church building was erected in 1809. Father Kemp and others preached here, some even two or three years before this building was erected. (Graham's History of Fairfield Co.)

"The Adler", a German newspaper published at Reading, Pa. contains notices of the Wildermuth deaths: in the Tues. 20 Feb. 1816 edition, "Wildermuth - Died the 21st of January in New Lancaster, Ohio, Wilhelm Wildermuth, at one time an old resident of Bern Twp. and in the Tues. 23 Nov. 1824 edition, "Wildermuth - Died, Sept. last in the State of Ohio, Barbara Wildermuth, widow of William Wildermuth, formerly of Bern Township in her 75th yr."

Inasmuch as all of the descendants of William Wildermuth are also descendants of his wife Maria Barbara, daughter of Johannes Ebling, it seems proper to include this history of the Ebling Family.

Maria Barbara Wildermuth is named as a daughter and one of the heirs in the will of Johannes Ebling dated 11 Nov. 1786 and in the settlement of his estate 13 Mar. 1795. Maria Phillipina Ebling as executrix and son-in-law Daniel Missey as executor sold to Wendel Bernhart for 2600.05 Pounds of gold and silver money, as the highest bidder, the property of Johannes Ebling and entered into an indenture recorded 31 Mar. 1795.

These three pieces of property are described as follows: "Where as the Honorable Thomas Penn and Richard Penn, Esquires, Late Proprietors of Pennsylvania by their patent or grant bearing date of January in the year of our Lord 1771 did grant and confirm unto said John Ebling (by the name of Evling) two certain tracts, pieces, or parcels of lands situated in Alsace Township aforesaid, the one of them called Openheim and bounded and described as follows. Vis. beginning at a marked Spanish Oak thence by part of the 12000 acres Manor of Penn mount West, one hundred and 58 perches to a stone. Thence by Charles Hunters land and said 12000 acre tract, North 10 degrees West 122 perches to a stone. Thence by the said 12000 acres tract East 179 perches and a quarter to a stone. North 61 perches to a stone. North 80 degrees, East 104 perches and a quarter to a marked Black Oak, South 142 perches to a stone, thence by Nicholas Sutzinger and William Millers land West 102 perches and a half to a stone and South 54 perches to the place of beginning, containing 201 acres and a half and the allowance of six acres for roads, etc."

2-"And the other called Undenheim, beginning at a marked White Oak, thence by the land of the late Isaac Maytime, North 20 degrees West 60 perches to a post. Thence by Michael Fishers land and vacant land North 20 degrees East 240 perches to a stone. Thence by vacant land part of the 12000 acres South 20 degrees, East 104 perches to a stone South 20 degrees, West 109 perches and a half to a stone, South nine degrees West 18 perches to a stone. Thence by Henry Garrets land, North 81 degrees, West 87 perches to a stone, South 70 degrees, West 42 perches to a stone, thence by Henry Garrets land, North 20 degrees West 17 perches and a half to a post and South 70 degrees. West 4 perches to the place of beginning and containing 137 acres and 97 perches and allowance of 6 acres for roads, etc." (patent recorded at Philadelphia in Patent Book AA Vol. 11 page 476, May 1779).

3-"vis. beginning at a stone at a corner of the land of the late James Seull, thence by the other part of said above tract of said William Green, South 20 degrees, East 18 perches to a stone for a corner

and South 71 degrees 116 perches and three quarters to a stone corner, thence by the said John Eblings land North nine degrees, East 18 perches and a half to a stone and North 70 degrees, East 108 perches to place of beginning, containing 12 acres and 8 perches of land. (Excepting and forever reserving on the second herein mentioned and described tract of land, 25 square perches of ground where said John Ebling is buried for a family burial ground with free liberty privileges, ingress, egress and ugress unto said burial ground and for any of the said family to bury their dead or to make, mend and repair the enclosure or fencing around said burial ground as often as the same may be necessary at any time hereafter forever.)" (Deed Book No. 21, page 197, Berks Co., Pa.) There is a quit claim deed signed by children of John Ebling plus their husband's signatures as children and heirs, also by Molly Ebling, Daniel Rollin, William Rollin. In the will, the oldest son Ludwick was to receive five shillings only but his children would receive his share. Molly Ebling may be his daughter.

The former private burial ground known as Ebling Cemetery near Temple, Pa. in Berks Co., a tract of land 25 perches square, was laid out by Johannes Ebling and where he was buried. After his son-in-law bought the plantation and cemetery, it was called Bernhardt Cemetery. In recent years being where the government wanted to build a lake, it was removed to the Minnershitz Cemetery about 5 miles north of Reading, Pa. Besides Johannes, his wife and his mother, Paul and his wife, Wendel Bernhart and his wife and family are also buried there.

John (Johannes) Ebling b. 20 Aug. 1725; d. 21 March 1787; married Maria Phillipina Yager b. 13 Feb. 1735, bapt., 23 Feb. 1735, dau. of Philipp Jaeger, (John Casper Stoevers-baptismal records - Berks Co. Historical Society, Reading, Pa.); d. 6 May 1816, (tombstone inscriptions). "The Adler" newspaper dated 14 May 1816 states "Died Monday a week ago Maria Ebling, mother of the aforesaid Henrich Ebling, of the same township in her 82nd year. She left 138 grandchildren and 91 great grandchildren. Maria Barbara Ebling, Mother of Johannes b. 15 Aug. 1697, d. 19 Mar. 1785".

William Wildermuth served as a private in the Revolutionary War. (Penn. Archives 3rd Series - Vol. 6, pages 269, 322). In a list of exercise fines received by Jacob Morgan, Sen. Esq. late Lieutenant, Berks Co., Pa. incurred in the years 1777 and 1778 by the third battalion of Berks County Militia in

Captain Sebastian E Emericks Company, William Wildermuth's name appears three times - 0.7.6, 20.0.0 and 5C 20.00. These fines incurred for non-attendance upon days of exercise. This battalion was engaged in service in the Schuylkill Valley until Washington went into winter quarters at Valley Forge on Dec. 18, 1777. (D.A.R. papers of Ivy Fisher and Ruth Lee).

An advertisement appeared in "The Adler", dated 16 Oct. 1804 as follows: "For sale in Bern Township 125 1/2 acres land adjacent Philip Reiser, Philip Rehn, Valentine Spax, George Bend, Daniel Althouse by Wm. Wildermuth."

A deed is recorded at Reading, Pa. dated 25 April 1805 between Wm. After the sale of Wm. Wildermuth's farm in 1805, the family migrated to Greenfield Township, Fairfield Co., Ohio. It must have been a large migration for in addition to his own family, his oldest son David was married and brought his wife's widowed mother with them, also a couple of her brothers came as well as at least one sister (Catherine m. Nicholas Radebaugh), also some of the Ebling clan and the Althouses.

Among the taxpayers in 1806 in Greenfield Township were William Wintermood and John Wintermood.

In 1808, William bought for his son David 194 acres costing \$389.43 in Range 19 Township 15 - Section 9 S.E. (Vol. G, page 194). For his son Daniel with whom he lived 195 acres costing \$502.60. R 19 - T 15 - Sec. 9 N.E. (Vol. G, page 147). In 1810 his sons Abraham and Henry received their inheritance: Abraham, 107 acres at a cost of \$430.50 R19 - T 15 Sec. 8 (vol. G, page 616) and Henry's 96.62 acres at \$370.50, Range 19 - Twp 15 - Sec. 8. (Vol. G, page 614). Record of Warranty Deeds, Fairfield Co., Lancaster, O.) The following sketch shows the location of the various farms:

In 1812 Henry, David, Daniel and William paid taxes on this land, William paying for Abraham. The four sons paid taxes on this same land in 1823 and 1829.

Translation of the Will of Wm. Wildermuth

In the name of God! Amen

I, William Wildermuth, residing in Greenfield Township, Fairfield County, State of Ohio, contemplating my frailty, and, thanks to God, being of sound mind, do direct the disposition of my possessions in the following manner.

First, I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God and direct that my body be buried in a Christian manner. Second, I direct that all my just debts be paid.

As regards my six children, those who have already received their inheritance in money, a hundred pounds of Pennsylvania money in full shall have nothing more to demand of the property I leave.

My son, David, has received his inheritance in full and has nothing more to demand, my son, John, has received his share in money in full and has nothing more to demand, my daughter, Mary, also has received her share in full and has nothing more to demand. My son, Henry, has received his share in

First, I reserve for myself the dwelling house in which we are now living and direct that it be always kept in a habitable condition with a good roof, the spring and springhouse to be kept in usable shape if we are no longer able to do it ourselves, a part of the old garden, the stable and yard in which to keep our cattle, the parcel of pasture which we already now are using, to help cut and haul feed without pay and pasturage for my cattle. I reserve the right to keep two cows on pasture with his cattle and my sheep with his sheep during the summer. A quarter of an acre to seed flax where he seeds his, potatoes and fruit as much as we need, to help and chop all the firewood we need, one horse for riding when needed, two fat hogs each weighing a hundred pounds or over, sugar sufficient for our actual wants, twenty six bushels of sound wheat or as much flour as we annually need, and every year a pair of good shoes for each of us as long as we live and a bushel and one half of salt whenever cattle are to be fed. I furthermore reserve the right to hold church or meeting in my home undisturbed and as long as I please. In case one of us old people should die only one half of the aforementioned articles need be furnished. Now if all these stipulations are strictly performed so that we have no reason to complain then all possessions that we leave behind shall go to Daniel Wildermuth and his heirs. And that no one can ever have the right to demand any of the possessions we leave behind without his goodwill, I with this my last will revoke and disannull all former made wills in the year of our Lord 1814 on the 11 day of April, residing in Fairfield County, Greenfield Township, State of Ohio, and that all things stipulated herein be kept without fail in life and in death, I William Wildermuth as father, and I, Daniel Wildermuth as son, do in the presence of witnesses set our hand.

The parents of David's first wife, Elizabeth, Jacob and Catherine Wagner, lived in the same township in Pennsylvania as the Wildermuths, that is, Bern Township.

David Wildermuth and wife, Elizabeth, with their 4 children came to Ohio in 1806. Along with them were Elizabeth's widowed mother, a couple of her brothers and at least one sister. Since the family of Jacob and Catherine Wagner are thus so intimately associated through marriage in several generations with the Wildermuths, material on their genealogy is included in Appendix C.

In 1808 David purchased 194 acres for \$389.45 from his brother-in-law Jacob Wagner and wife Barbara Bacher.

"This indenture made this 7th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight between Jacob Wagner of the county of Fairfield, state of Ohio, of the one part and David Wildermuth of the county and state aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Jacob Wagner for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and eighty nine dollars and forty five cents (389.45) current money of the United States to him in hand paid, the receipt where of he doth acknowledge and forever acquit and discharge the said David Wildermuth, . . . That tract of land lying and being in the county aforesaid, Bounded and described by the following line to wit:

Beginning at the SoutEast corner of Section No. 9 in Township No. 15 and range No. 19, Thence west 37 chains and 50 links to a post where a white ellum 15 inches in diameter bears N 60 W 6 links and a hickory tree 20 inches in diameter bears S 23 W 7 links, Thence North 16 chains and 50 links to a post, Thence West three chains and 42 links to a post where a dogwood 6 inches in diameter bears N 70 degrees E 19 links and beach 2 inches in diameter bears S 29 degrees E 16 links. Thence North 26 chains and 86 links to a post where a sugar tree 6 inches in diameter bears S 6 W 8 links and a sugar tree 9 inches in diameter bears N 61 degrees E 24 links. Thence West 1 chain and 51 links to a post where a Spanish Oak 24 inches in diameter bears 78 degrees E 80 chains and 6 links and a sugar tree 8 inches in diameter bears S 56 degrees 30 chains West 5 links, Thence North 6 chains and 3 links to a dogwood thence East 41 chains and 42 links to a postwhere a Spanish Oak 18 inches in diameter bears North 173 - 10 links and an ash 8 inches in diameter bears S 39 degrees W 17 links and thence South 49 chains and 39 links to the place of beginning, consisting of 194 acres and 70 hundreths."

The above described Section of land was conveyed to Jacob Wagner by Thomas Jefferson, President of the United States. By patent No. 553 bearing date of September 21, 1807. Signed Jacob Wagner." (Vol. G - 194 - Lancaster Courthouse, Ohio.)

In 1815 David sold a part of this land to Henry Hanna. In 1812 he paid taxes on 193 acres in 14 - 15 - 9; but in 1823 and also in 1829 he paid taxes on only 184 acres so the part sold to Henry Hanna must have been about 10 acres.

Appraisers of the estate of David Wildermuth Sr. late of Greenfield Township, Fairfield Co. Ohio, dated 15 Oct. 1846 were David Brandt Jr., Jacob Brandt, and Samuel Fisher. The following debt was owed to said estate: Eli and John Wildermuth, note 27 Oct. 1843, due 9 mos. after date or 23 July 1844. The sum originally was \$48.50. On Sept. 1844 paid \$4.50 leaving am't. due \$44.00.

Heirs named in the will were Christina Wildermuth, the widow, and Louisa Ann Wildermuth, his minor child.

His goods were sold at public auction 16 Oct. 1846 and among those who bought articles were Daniel Wildermuth, Jr., David Bougher, Jacob Weist, Jacob Bowser, Christina Wildermuth the widow, Michael Wagner, Isaac Wildermuth, and Teney Wildermuth. (From inventory and sale records No. 4 at Lancaster Courthouse, Ohio. Also an account record dated 14 Jan. 1847, No. 7 - 10.

The description is "Beginning at a hickory tree in the Northern Boundary line of said section and formerly of the north west of Abraham Wildermuth's land thence by said Abraham Wildermuth's land South forty-five chains and eighty three links to a post where a hickory bears N 72 E 5 links and a dogwood bears South 30 W 14 links thence West twenty chains and twenty one links to a post where a sugar tree bears S 62° E 14 links and a White Oak bears N 66 W 32 links. Thence North forty five chains and twenty one links to the place of beginning." (Vol. G - page 514, Record of Warranty Deeds, Fairfield Co. Lancaster, Ohio.)

Sometime before 14 Nov. 1836, Henry must have moved back to Pennsylvania for on that date, he and his wife Catherine appointed David Wildermuth and Daniel Wildermuth as their attornies to sell their 92 acres of land (Ibid. Vol. 1 - page 377)

David and Daniel on 13 Nov. 1836 employed Lewis Flattery to survey the tract of land (92.64 acres) as described into 3 lots or tracts of 31.05 acres each and to make out a plot. (Survey No. 10-1836, recorded 22 Apr. 1846).

At a public sale at the house of Abraham Wildermuth, 16 Dec. 1836, Lot No. 2 on said plat was sold to Nathaniel Minthorn for \$764.60 by David and Daniel as attornies for Henry. This was not recorded until 10 May 1843 (Ibid. Vol. 9 page 54).

David and Daniel sold Lot No. 3 to Abraham Wildermuth 8 Dec. 1837 for \$663.00. This was recorded 14 Apr. 1838 (Ibid. Vol. 3 - page 454).

(Will record No. 4, Page 50, Fairfield Co.)

In 1832, Henry Bacher (Catherine's father) sold to Frederick Bacher, his share of their father Solomon Bacher's estate in South Whitehall Twp., Lehigh Co., Pa. (Recorder's Office at Lancaster).

Solomon Bacher came to this country on the ship Phoenix, John Mason, Master and arrived at Philadelphia, Friday, 15 Sept. 1749. He was in the 2nd Company of the 3rd battalion of Northampton Co. Militia in 1778.

Jacob Wagner sold to Daniel Wildermuth 7 July 1808, 195.65 acres for \$502.60 in Section 9, Township 15, Range 19. This adjoins the land of David Wildermuth who purchased his land the same day. This section of land was conveyed to Jacob Wagner by patent No. 553, dated 21 Sept. 1807 by the President of the United States Thomas Jefferson. This is the description of the land, "Beginning at the North East Corner of Section No. 9 Thence South 30 chains and 40 links to a post where a Spanish oak 18 inches

in diameter TE 13 links and an ash 8 inches in diameter S59 degrees w 17 links Thence West 41 chains 42 links to a dogwood 5 in. diameter Thence North 30 chains and 49 links to the quarter section just established by the district sureyor of the United States and thence East 41 chains to the place of beginning." (Vol. G - Page 147 Record of Warranty Deeds, Fairfield Co. Lancaster, Ohio)

In 1838, Daniel Wildermuth sold or gave land for School Dist. #2 (Ibid. Vol. 4 - Page 207).

In 1855 Daniel Wildermuth, Sr. and wife sold part of his farm to Jno Wildermuth (19-15-9) (Ibid. Vol. 22, page 598). In 1854 he sold to Solomon part of Section 4. (Ibid. Vol. 22, page 289)

In a partition of land, Daniel Wildermuth, Sr. bought 6/11 of N.E. 1/2 of Section 4, dated 8 April, 1844 from John Hanna and wife Catherine as follows: "Beginning at the N E Corner of Section 4 Thence South 44 chains and 26 links to a post, Thence West 40 chains 90 links to a post on the West boundary of said 1/2 section thence North 44 chains 34 links to the North West corner of said 1/2 Section Thence East 40 chains and 45 links to the place of beginning, containing 180.16 acres."

The will of Daniel Wildermuth dated 28 April 1862, bequeaths to his wife Catherine 45 acres of land on which they resided. The balance of said tract had been by him conveyed to "my son John". After the death of his wife Catherine, the 45 acres shall be sold to John for \$26.00 per acre."

She is to occupy the house in which they live, will have all of the household and kitchen furniture, one horse and buggy, also 3 cows, 6 sheep, 5 hogs, and the sum of \$300.00, also apples, peaches, cherries, and other fruit. If she becomes helpless, John Wildermuth should provide and care for her. He bequeathed his granddaughter Elizabeth Feeman \$300.00. The 98 acres of land on the canal that he owned, Catherine Wildermuth should have for her use during her lifetime. All lands and personal property should be sold and divided equally among legal heirs. Codicil Sept. 1867, the share of Solomon Wildermuth living in Fulton Co., Ind. shall be paid to wife Emily and children.

Abraham Wildermuth bought 107.62 acres of land for \$430.50 in Section 8, Township 15, Range 19, from Daniel and Magadaline Wagner, 8 Sept. 1810. This lies next to Henry Wildermuth's land. The description is "Beginning at the North East corner of Section 8, thence South 53 chains and 25 links to a post where Beach tree 8 inches in diameter bears S 82 W 15 links and a Beach tree 9 inches in diameter bears N 52 W 21 links thence West 20 chains and 21 links to a post where a Beach 8 inches in diameter bears N 23 East 9 links to a sugar tree 10 inches in diameter bears S 45 W 30 links thence North 53 chains and 25 links to a hickory tree 10 inches in diameter and thence East 20 chains and 21 links to place of beginning." (Vol. G Page 616 Record of Warranty Deeds, Fairfield Co., Lancaster, Ohio)

He also bought lot No. 3 of Henry Wildermuth's plot of land 8 Dec. 1837, containing 31.05 acres for \$663.00.

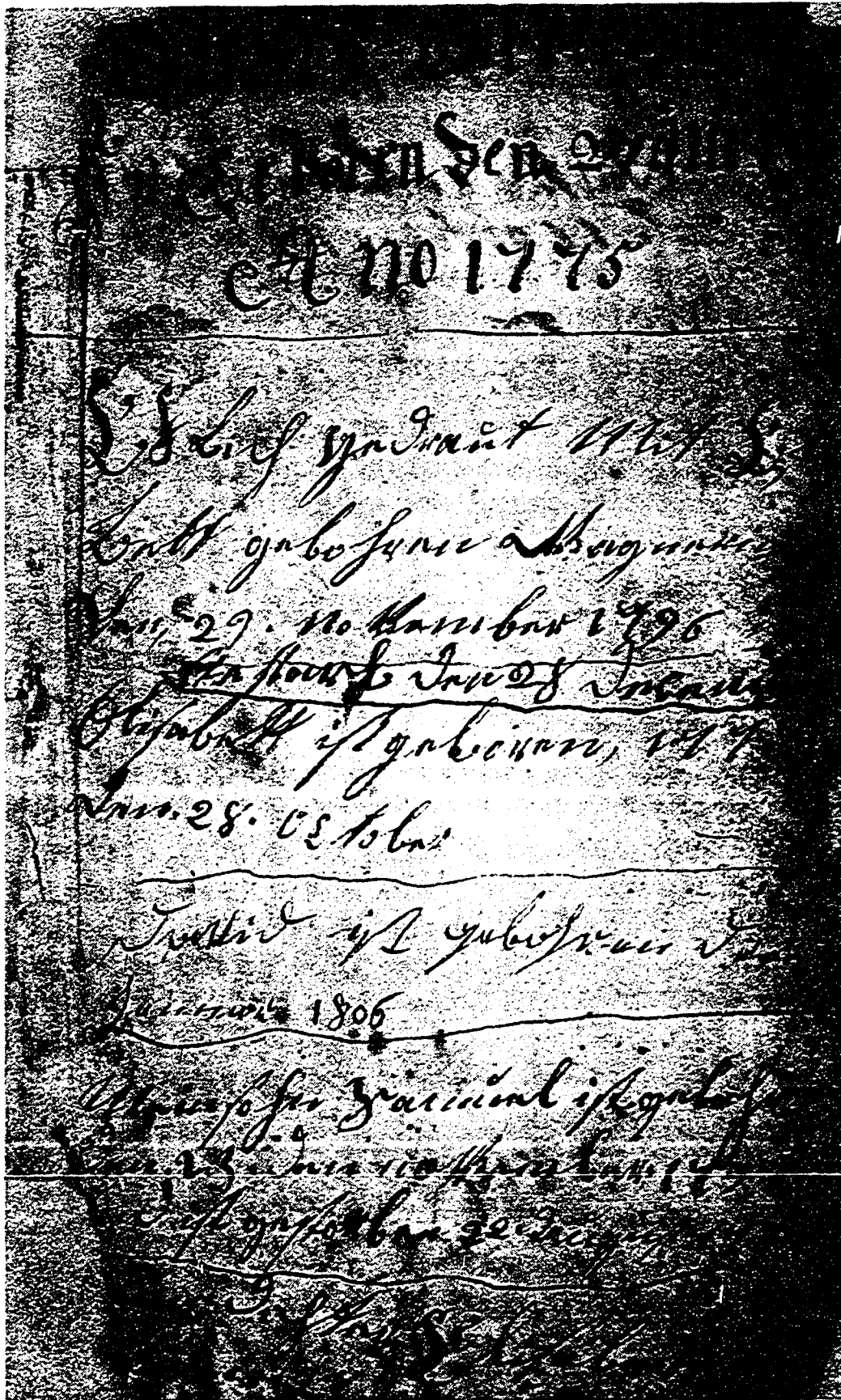
Henry O. Hanna and John Hanna bought both the farm and the lot for \$3000.00, on 21 April, 1846, giving a mortgage for \$1500.00. This was not satisfied until after his death in 1848 when the widow Elizabeth Wildermuth signed the release as Administratrix for the Estate of Abraham Wildermuth. Elizabeth Wildermuth named and appointed her son Henry Wildermuth with power of attorney to settle her late husband's Estate in Ohio.

Elizabeth and Abraham Wildermuth moved to Indiana after the death of their daughter Lidia in 1831

and before the birth of their daughter Leah Louise in 1838.

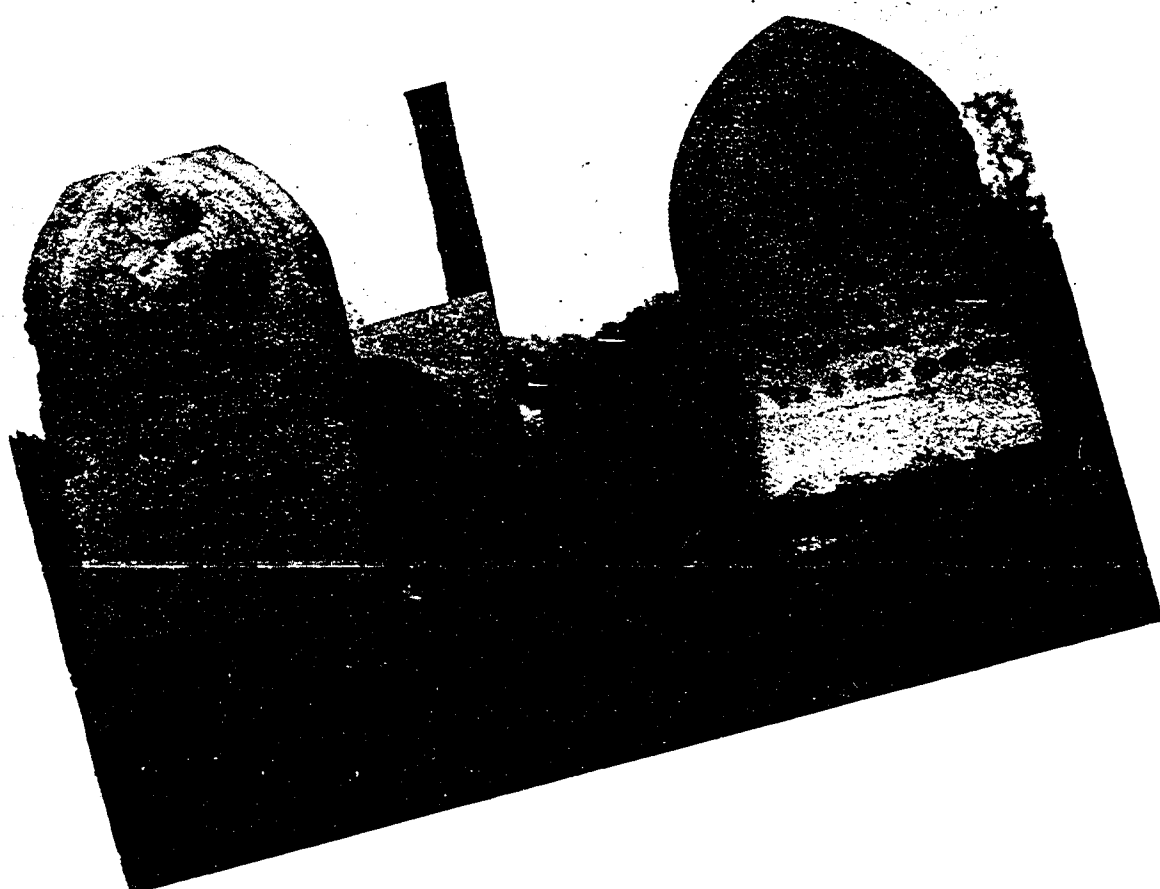

8. CATHERINE (4) WILDERMUTH (David-3, William-2, Johann David-1), b. Berks Co., Pa., 17 Oct. 1799; d. 8 Nov. 1882; m. Fairfield Co., O., 20 Sept. 1820, CYRUS NEWKIRK b. Beckley Co., Va., 27 May 1800, son of Reuben and Mary (Kemp) Newkirk. Cyrus and Catherine with their brothers and sisters are buried in the Cemetery on the David C. Wildermuth farm in Richland Co.

They migrated to Blanchardville, LaFayette Co., Wis., via Cass Co., Ind., and Coles Co., Ill., with their sisters and brothers, Elizabeth and Wm. Cline, David Clinton and Ann (Newkirk) Wildermuth, also Adam and Rebecca (Wildermuth) Neibling. Just how long Adam and Rebecca were there is not known but their daughter was born there in 1846. However they were not there in the U.S. Census 1850.

The families left Fairfield Co., about 1836. Cyrus and Ann's 3 children, Catherine, George W. and Elizabeth were born in Ill., but their youngest son Teunice was born in Wis.

On the south bank of the Pecatonica River and the present site of Blanchardville, Samuel Horner, of Penn., entered Government land and received a patent 31 Aug. 1848. He built a dam and grist mill and that improvement, together with a few log cabins constituted Horner's Mill. (Ref. Memoirs of the old Grist Mills on the Pecatonica River Valley by Catherine Barry, Argyle) 1951. On 13 Dec., 1849 he sold his grist mill to Cyrus Newkirk.

Zarahemila, City of God, a title taken from demoninational literature, was the name given to their community by Blanchardville Latter Day Saints back in the 1850's. In the early spring of 1851, the Cyrus Newkirk family were baptized in the Pecatonic River into that faith. The first General Conference was held Oct. 6, 1952 in Cyrus Newkirk's flour mill when temporary organization of the Reorganized Branch of Latter Day Saints of Jesus Christ was provided. In 1853 Cyrus and son Reuben were ordained to Apostleship.

On Apr. 14, 1857, Alvin Blanchard and Cyrus Newkirk signed an owner's certificate as owners of the village of Blanchardville and offered land for sale to the public. In 1860, the Newkirks joined the families' general exodus to Willow Twp., Richland Co., Wis., where Cyrus and Catherine bought an adjoining farm to that of David C. and Ann's. Reuben and David, their sons, moved to Elizabeth, Ill. in 1873.

According to one of his daughters, Wm. Cline was the eldest of 7 children born in the foothills of the Allegheny Mountains where his father was murdered. The Cline name was spelled with a K until misspelled in Blanchardville.

Wm. and Elizabeth Cline had 7 children born in Ohio and it was probably after the birth of David in 1835 that the family started their trek west. They first stopped at Cass Co., Ind., and then continued to Coles Co., Ill. on the Embarrass River where the last 2 daughters were born in 1839 and 1842. Here William Cline bought 20 acres of land from his brother-in-law who had secured a patent of 40 acres from the United States. This is located in Section 14 Township 15 N of Range 10 E and is now Douglas Co., Illinois. The drinking water there made Wm. ill and so the family continued its travels. Whenever the hills proved too steep for the horses to pull the full load, Elizabeth carried Baby Hannah in her arms

and with "Jane" (as she was called) by the hand would walk up hill.

They finally reached Blanchardville, Wis., in the late summer of 1843. Here they found a farm on the banks of the Pecatorica River with crops ready to harvest and a good spring. Wm. was delighted with his first drink of the spring water and bought the farm.

The line between the counties of LaFayette and Iowa runs through the village of Blanchardville so that the Wm. Cline farm was in Iowa County and the Cyrus Newkirk property, although adjoining, is in Lafayette Co.

Wm. Cline owned a great deal of land in this corner of Iowa County. He received one patent from U.S., the NW 1/4 of SE 1/4 of Sec. 11, Twp. 4, R 5 East of 40 acres 1 Feb. 1848 under Cash Patent No. 7980 with the name spelled Kline. He also bought much land before that time. The final land transaction in Iowa County took place when he sold 4 pieces of land to Josiah Baker for \$1500.00, May 31, 1859. He bought from Josiah Baker in 1861, forty acres in Willow Township, Richland Co., Wis.

Elizabeth and her brother David Clinton Wildermuth and wife Ann Newkirk together with Cyrus Newkirk and wife Catherine Wildermuth must have all left Ohio together for Elizabeth and Catherine each had a son age 15 and David a son age 14 and each had her next child in Illinois. The Cyrus Newkirks also settled in Blanchardville where he owned a flour and grist mill on a bend in the Pecatonica, adjoining Wm. Cline's farm. David Clinton Wildermuth settled at Yellowstone, about 7 miles West.

After the conversion of the David Clinton Wildermuth family to Mormonism in 1850 and that of the Cyrus Newkirks 6 mos. later, the Wm. Cline family was baptized in the Pecatonica River into the church in the summer of 1851. Beginning 6 Oct. 1852 meetings of this branch of the church were held in Cyrus Newkirk's mill. In the spring of 1853 the Annual Conference met at Zarahemla, where a log cabin school and church, had been built on the Wm. Cline Farm, was literally full of Saints. Here the reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints was founded. Wm. Cline was ordained to apostleship and the Zarahemla Branch was organized with Wm. Cline as Branch or State President. Wm. Cline, Jr. was ordained a Seventy at this 1853 Conference. A Seventy is a special minister chosen and ordained from the ranks of the Elders and set apart to give his first attention to the Missionary activity of the church. In 1855, David Cline was ordained a Seventy, also Eli Wildermuth and Isaac Newkirk.

The burying ground was in the churchyard and later became the Blanchardville Cemetery. Rebecca Jane, also called Jane or Jennie, dau. of Wm. Cline is buried only a few feet from where the log building stood. A great granddaughter (Mrs. O. (Nora) Phillipson is also buried there.

Rebecca Jane was married to W.L. Risley Sept. 9, 1860, just as the family was packing and preparing to move to Richland Co., Wis., and she remained in Blanchardville, Wis.

Wm. Cline bought 20 acres of land in Willow Township, Richland Co., Wis., 22 Oct. 1860, Vol. N. of Deeds, Pages 351, 525, and 526; Vol. L, page 497 and Vol. LQ page 75. He sold his son Samuel 40 acres, 19 Apr. 1864, Vol. R Page 79. Most of it was in Section 6. David C. Wildermuth sold 60 acres in Section 7 to his son Edwin C. 15 July 1864. There the little Mormon Cemetery is located where Wm. Cline was buried in 1870.

David C. Wildermuth as a youth began to wander, spending one winter in New Orleans, another as an overseer on a sugar plantation in New Orleans. When the Ohio Canal was built, he worked during the construction as a foreman.

After his marriage, he settled on a small farm near his father. In 1835, along with the families of his two sisters, Elizabeth Cline and Catherine Newkirk, David moved his family to Coles Co., Ill. on the Embarrass River. The country was still a wilderness and the settlers made their homes in the edge of the timber that skirted the river. David bought a patent of 40 acres of land from the United States and sold 20 acres to William Cline. This located as follows: Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 14 Township fifteen North of Range ten East, certificate No. 7383 Coles County Illinois, signed by Martin Van Buren, President. This portion of Coles Co. is now Douglas Co.

The Wildermuth Family moved to Southern Wisconsin in 1846 to join the Newkirks and Clines who had gone there earlier. He bought a claim on Yellowstone Creek in LaFayette Co. This was the lead mining region and here for some years he farmed and mined.

In the summer of 1850, his infant son died and since David had withdrawn from the Methodist Church, there was no one to preach the funeral sermon. It so happened that Rev. Zenas Gurley, "a Mormon preacher" was in the neighborhood and he agreed to preach. The family was so pleased with his concept of religion that within a few weeks, were baptized in Yellowstone Creek into that faith. In less than a year the entire relationship had been baptized into the same faith.

When word came that polygamy was being practiced, David C. said "I am going to bolt, I will not belong to a church that practices that abominable doctrine." The entire family membership "bolted" also.

After a series of meetings and conferences in the spring of 1853 the groups from Blanchardville (The Clines and the Newkirks) and Yellowstone (the Wildermuths) met in the log schoolhouse and church on the Wm. Cline farm and there effected an organization which became the foundation for the Reorganized Branch of the Church of the Latter Day Saints for Jesus Christ. The David C. Wildermuth Family remained true to his faith and numbers among the members, many ministers, elders, and missionaries.

After a year's residence in Iowa, he bought a farm in Willow Township, Richland Co., Wis.,

hewing out a house in the wilds and caring for his family. Here, too, he and his wife are buried in the little cemetery on the farm that he cleared. Here, too, are buried Elizabeth and Wm. Cline, and Catharine and Cyrus Newkirk, who had bought farms nearby in Richland Co. in 1860.

John H. Wildermuth went to California in 1846 but returned to Missouri in 1856 where he married Elizabeth Summers. They stopped to visit his parents in Ohio enroute to the east coast to return to California by boat. His half sister Louisa returned with him. In 1861 he built a large stone house at the approach to Pardee Dam, near Campo Seco, Calaveras Co., which became a noted landmark. Only the chimney is still standing today. After the death of John and Elizabeth, their children all moved to Fresno Co., in the Selma and Kingsbury districts where they established themselves as vineyardists and their extensive interests were carried on by the next generations.

grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said Henry Underwood, Daniel Wildermuth Sr. and Daniel Wildermuth Jr. Trustees in trust for the United Brethren in Christ, their heirs, assigns and successors in office as Trustees in trust for the Church of the United Brethren in Christ the following parcel or tract of land to wit; being a part of Section No. 4, Township No. 15 in Range No. 19, being the same piece of ground upon which there is now built a church or house of public worship for the members of the denomination called the United Brethren in Christ, commencing at the northwest corner of the said church at a stone thence forty-five (45) feet Southeast to a stone; thence one hundred and thirty feet (130) northeast to stone; thence forty-five (45) northwest to stone; thence one hundred thirty feet (130) southwest to the place of beginning, containing one fourth of an acre being the same more or less.

In the 22 Feb. 1877 Lancaster Gazette, "We learn that the smokehouse of Mr. Daniel Wildermuth, East of Carroll, was burned last week and a large amount of bacon and lard consumed. There was no insurance".

Solomon lived near the village of Basil, O. where he was a partner in a firm running a general store when the business failed. Still in the family, is an old hand made rifle that was turned in to settle a debt of about \$150. The family migrated in two wagons to a small settlement called Salem, near Rochester, Ind. They helped to build a log church in the Salem Cemetery. Three later churches were built on the same location, the last one torn down in 1914. One of the treasured stories of the family was told to a Brother Slaybaugh who was preaching a funeral sermon years ago. Two elderly ladies came up and told him that when they were young girls, they and many others came to the services in the Salem Church just to hear Solomon pray. In 1855, he purchased the original Wildermuth farm from his father Daniel and sold it, 31 Mar. 1880 when he moved to Indiana. (Recorder's Office, Lancaster, O.). A Quit Claim deed dated 11 June 1875 reads as follows: "John Wildermuth and wife Sarah for the sum of \$5.00 to them paid by Daniel Wildermuth, Joshua Miller, Silas Miller and James Shell, Trustees, sold them that parcel of land on which the said Mount Gilead Church now stands with sufficient room for the convenience of those who may attend church at said place. And it is expressly understood by and between said parties as well as their successors that in the event if said society shall cease to exist or cease in said church, then and in either case said lands shall become the property of the said John Wildermuth but said will lay no claim to the church buildings and fixtures therein". John Wildermuth and family settled in Wayne Township, near Warren, Ind. where he bought a 320 acre farm. Very soon they built a church on a corner of this farm which they named Mt. Gilead like the church they had left on his farm in Ohio. The Indiana Church remained until after the death of John when it was sold to another denomination, moved away and later torn down. 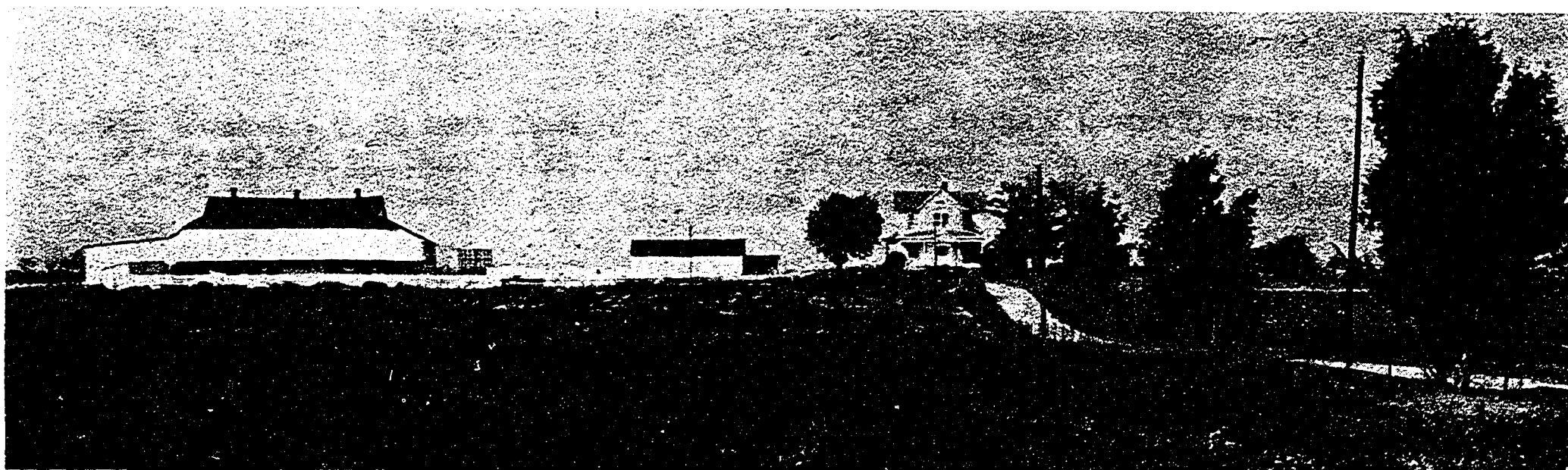

Bausch and Lomb, Inc. also awarded him a citation as follows: "In recognition of a half century of distinguished service to human vision."

Given a good musical education at the instigation of his father, E.F. early took his turn in playing the organ at the Wildermuth Memorial Church. During his lifetime he has continued to give the church his devoted supervision and guidance. He has devoted much time and effort in the restoration of the church. In 1960 he purchased the farm on which the church stands and is the original farm which William and Daniel bought in 1808. He has given the church 19 Acres surrounding it. The Youth Center is a gift to the church for community use in memory of his parents.

Oliver moved to Gary, Ind., from his boyhood farm home near Royal Center, Ind., in 1908, driving a one horse wagon. With his brother Elias, he entered the hay, grain and feed business here operating at the Southwest Corner of 7th and Washington. It was on this site that the two brothers erected the two story brick store and apartment building. In subsequent years, Oliver Wildermuth bought and sold many parcels of Gary real estate, business and residential, many of which were located in the high value districts. His last purchase was a three story brick store and apartment building at 5th and Jackson Sts.

He built up a comfortable fortune from the profits of his real estate transactions although he had been a heavy loser in the business crisis of the early thirties. Preceding his first marriage and for a year afterwards he supplemented his earnings from farming and as a wild game hunter along the Kankakee marshlands. 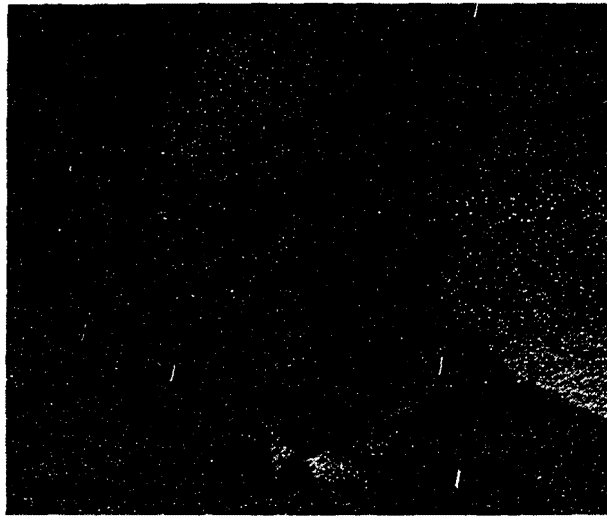

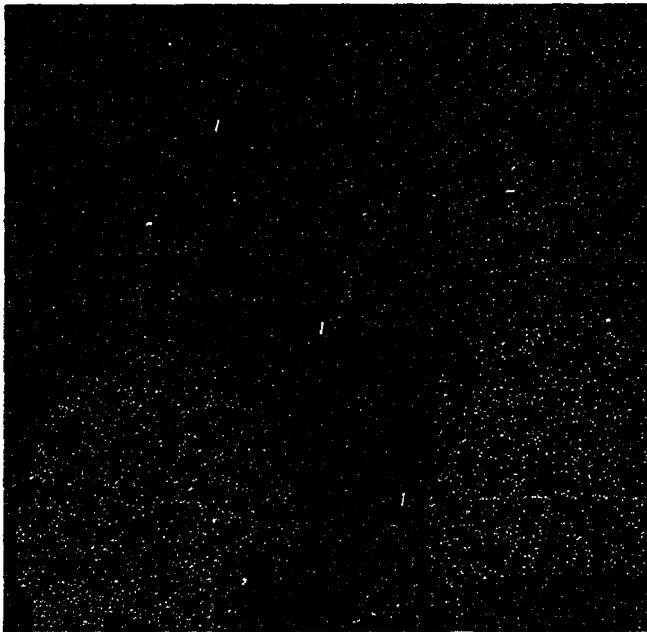

Judge Ora L. Wildermuth was born on a farm south of Star City, Ind. and as a poor farm boy entered Indiana University in 1902. This began a record of service with the University which was to continue for 62 years.

He came to Gary, Ind. in 1906, the same year he earned his degree in law from Ind. U. He taught in Gary's first school for a year and opened Gary's first law office. He was involved in many "firsts" in the development of Gary. In 1908, he became first librarian in Gary's first library, later a trustee on the library board until 1958, serving as president from 1913 - 1950. He was active in the Indiana Library Trustees Association and the American Association of Library Trustees, and published "A Handbook for Library Board Trustees".

He helped to organize the first Congregational Church of Gary and the first Sunday School, serving as the first Sunday School teacher.

A member of Lucas, Clifford and Wildermuth law firm, he was the first City Judge in Gary in 1910. He was a member of the American, the Indiana State, Lake Co. and Gary Bar Associations and chairman of committee on admissions to Bar, 1916 - 1925. He was listed in "Who's Who".

Ora L. Wildermuth was a trustee of Indiana University from 1925 to 1952 and served as President of the Board from 1937 to 1950 when he was named President emeritus. APPENDIX A

NOTES ON THE ANCESTRY OF JOHANN DAVID WILDERMUTH

Although Johann David Wildermuth was among the passengers on the ship Halifax which arrived in the United States 22 Sept. 1752, there is no family listed for him. We do not know whether he brought his wife and sons with him or if he married here. We have not been able to locate his family in Europe.

There is a Wildermuth Street at Tübingen, Germany, named in honor of Ottilie Wildermuth, the poetess. She was the wife of Dr. Johann David Wildermuth who was a High School Professor who originated from Pleidelsheim, Kreis County, Ludwigsburg. The old church registers of the Evangelical Congregation Tübingen do not contain the names of our family according to the office of Vital Statistics. Dr. Hans Wildermuth, grandson of the High School Professor born 1807, knew of no one named Johann David who emigrated to America. His letter reads: "The Wuerttemberg Wildermuths have their origin in the village of Pleidelsheim and Riedinshausen near the small town of Marbach (where the poet Schiller was born) in the North East of Stuttgart.

Although there has been speculation that Johann David's father was a Daniel Wildermuth and his grandfather was Ludwickle, these names do not appear in any records which we have been able to reach through our letters.

Our inquiries elicited these replies: (1) Ev. Pfarrant - Rielingshausen, 2 Apr. 1957, "Unfortunately I could not find the name of Johann David Wildermuth and his father Daniel in the old records of the Parish Rielinghausen. The Wildermuths have their origin in our village but Johann David Wildermuth and his wife were probably living in another village." Signed, Herman Seegar; (2) "Johann David Wildermuth cannot be found in the registers of weddings, 1670 to 1752, no in the registers of born children and in the registers of baptisms, 1724 to 1752 nor is the son Wilhelm in these registers. The name Daniel nor Ludwig (Ludwickle is a diminutive of Ludwig) cannot be found in the years 1676 to 1672. The Wildermuths of those years have all other names." Signed, Martin Benzing.

APPENDIX C

THE WAGNER FAMILY

JACOB WAGNER, b. date unknown in Germany, d. ca December 1784 married in Berks County, Pa. date unknown to CATHERINE b, 1745, d. 27 Nov. 1820, Fairfield County, Ohio. They lived in Bern Township, Berks Co. Pa. as did the Wildermuths. Since their lives and those of their descendants were so closely intermingled with those of the Wildermuths, the following information will be of much interest.

The oldest child of Jacob Wagner, deceased, Philip Wagner, at Orphans' Court, 6 Dec. 1784, being above 14 years, chooses Rev. Daniel Wagner of York Co Pa. for guardian. Rev. Daniel Wagner, a brother of Jacob Wagner, was born in Ebelshausen, near Dillenburg in the Duchy of Nassau, Germany, 11 Jan. 1750. When he was two years of age, his parents emigrated to this country bringing with them 2 sons and 3 daughters. They settled temporarily in Chester Co. Pa. and 5 or 6 years later moved to Bern Township, Berks Co. where they settled on a farm. Here both parents lived, died, and are buried. In 1772 he was ordained a pastor in the Reformed Church. He served pastorates at Kreutz's Creek and Tulepocken, York Co. Pa. and Frederick, Md. where he died in 1810. In 1775 he married Anna Maria Reitzel of Lancaster Co. Pa. Their children were: George, Anna Maria, Elizabeth, Catherine, Samuel, and William. The eldest son George and cousin Andrew Kramer of York Co. Pa. are named as joint executors in his will recorded 11 June 1811 in Frederick Co. Md. (History of York Co. by John Gibson, 1886; Historical Manual of the Reformed Church by Dubbs, 1888; Fathers of the Reformed Church, P. 229.)

Also at Orphans' Court, 6 Dec. 1784, Reading, Pa. Adam Blatt and Daniel Schlabbish were appointed guardians for 6 minor children of Jacob Wagner, deceased.

31 May 1785 Orphans' Court received the petition of Catherine Wagner, administratrix of Jacob Wagner of Bern Township that deceased left 8 children, one of whom to wit. Anna Maria, is under 14 years of age and praying for a guardian. The court appointed Yost Fahl.

In regard to Esther Wagner, daughter of Jacob Wagner, deceased, who was intermarried with Michael Fisher who also died and there was one son, Daniel Fisher. As one lawful heir of the said Jacob Wagner, deceased, now a minor under 14 years, Philip Klein was appointed guardian at an Orphans' Court in Reading, Pa. (Book 16, P. 463)

Again at an Orphans' Court held in Reading, Pa. 10 March 1796, "upon petition of Philip Wagner, oldest son and heir at law of Jacob Wagner, late of township Berne, yeoman, died about 10 years ago, since intestate leaving a widow Catherine and issue 8 children to wit; The petitioner Philip Wagner; Ester Wagner since deceased, leaving one child by her husband Michael Fisher; Daniel Wagner; Elizabeth Wagner; Jacob Wagner; John Wagner; Catherine Wagner; and Margaret Wagner; the last seven named as yet in their minority. The intestate died seized in his demise as of fee of and in a certain Messuage Plantation and tract of land situated in Bern Township, Berks Co. Pa. adjoining land of Christian Kaufman containing two hundred acres or thereabouts with the appurtenances." The court appointed twelve men to appraise the estate: Frederick Blatt, Andrew Great, Nicholas Great, Peter Noecker, Martin Weitman, Daniel Weitman, Ludwig Faust, John Kuebel, Valentine Grim, Casper Gryman, Yost Schlappig, and Conrad Hershner, "twelve free, honest and lawful of the said county, who upon their oaths and affirmations 19 March 1796 that they went to the real estate, or land and tenement and appraised the said real estate with the appurtenances at 1300 and 75 pounds, gold or silver, money current in Pennsylvania, subject to all monies, interest and quit rent due and becoming due and payable for same. The same day, Philip Wagner, oldest son of said inestate, appeared in court and accepted of said real estate at the valuation thereof which was thereon ordered and adjudged to him by the court; and the said Philip Wagner, offering to the court Nicholas Klein and Yost Schlappig as securities to enter into bond with him, to secure unto the other children and representatives of the said inestate, their respective shares and dividends, of and in the valuation monies aforesaid, the Court here does approve of the said securities." (Orphan Court Record No. 1 Vol. 4 P. 277, Reading, Pa.)

26 Aug. 1797, Catherine Wagner adm. for estate of Jacob Wagner, paid 45 pounds to Philip Wagner, 226 pounds to Adam Blatt and Daniel Schlappish guardians for 6 minor children (45 pounds, 4 shillings each), 45 pounds to Philip Klein, guardian for Daniel Fisher, 45 pounds to Yost Fahl guardian for Anna Mary (also called Maria and Margaret). (Orphans' Court Record Vol. 16 P. 462)

~ Philip Wagner died 4 Dec. 1799 leaving one child, Elizabeth. Upon the petition of Susannah Wagner and Jacob Hummelberger, adm. of estate, the estate containing 195 acres was sold to Daniel Wagner for 1,470 pounds, he being the highest bidder.

Catherine Wagner (widow of Jacob) with sons Daniel and Jacob and daughter Catherine came to Ohio with David Wildermuth and his wife Elizabeth Wagner in 1806. Daniel Wagner, David Wildermuth, and Henry Johns of County of Fairfield, Ohio are held and firmly bond in the sum of \$300, 27 Dec. 1825 for Daniel Wagner to administer the estate of Catherine Wagner.

"The Adler" a newspaper published at Reading, Pa. 1 Sept. 1821 contained the following notice: "Died on the 27 of November 1820, near New Lancaster, Ohio, Catherine Wagner formerly of Bern Township, Berks Co. Pa. She was the wife of the deceased Jacob Wagner. Mrs. Wagner was 75 years old."
