

#### POLK CHURCH

This is Lower Stillwater church, built in 1844 when James K. Polk ran for the presidency. When the church was completed, there was placed on its spire a pokeberry stalk, put there by one of the workmen who was of the Polk political faith; and from this incident it has always been called Polk Church.

It is situated ten miles north of Dayton on the National Road, being on land which Daniel Waymire settled in 1806 and later donated for public use. The public grounds consisted of sites for a public school, a church with its burying grounds and a grove for public assemblages. It is here on these grounds that the Waymire Family Reunions have been held for fifty years.

#### TO THE WAYMIRE DESCENDANTS

This booklet is but a preliminary publication to permanently fix and disseminate what data has been learned of the first three generations of the descendants of John Rudolph Waymire.

John Rudolph Waymire was born in Hanover, Germany about the year 1725. He was tall, erect and of great physical strength. After having served his term of military service as required in those days, he was retained by the king as an officer in his body guard. Six feet six inches in height and two hundred and twenty-five pounds in weight was the minimum physical requirement to become a member of this unit.

The king being impressed by his executive ability and undaunted courage, soon made him governor of a province that had recently been acquired through conquest. Ere long, he aroused the displeasure of the king by refusing to execute a mandate which he considered unjust. For this insubordination he was thrown into prison for thirty days. Upon release he openly voiced his displeasure of the punishment bestowed and vowed he would leave the country. The king hearing of this had him again placed in prison for a like period of time. This did not dispel his anger but taught him to be more cautious of his speech. So he quietly made his plans to go to America.

In the summer of 1753, he, with his wife and two children, his father and mother and two sisters, took passage at Hamburg on the ship Leathley. After a long and perilous journey of several weeks, during which the mother died and was buried at sea, the party landed at Philadelphia September 19, 1753. In the Pennsylvania archives is the Ship List of the Leathley for this trip in which appears the name "Johan Ludolph Weymeyer" signed by himself in a very legible hand. The spelling of the name plainly shows that it had not as yet been anglicized. In the same list appears the name "Voltine Weymeyer" signed by himself. Probably this was the father, although tradition has always stated his name was John. He may have had a double name, John Valentine. The women and children on that boat were not listed; to us a very regrettable omission, because if they had been we would have learned their given names.

Upon landing in Philadelphia, the sisters were separated from the other members of the family and never afterwards were seen or heard of.

John Rudolph with his family, including the father, settled somewhere in the rural districts of Pennsylvania, to us not known, where the father died in 1857. That same year the family moved to what is now Randolph County, North Carolina and settled on the Uwharie river. At that time Guilford County included, among other lands, the territory within the present boundaries of Randolph County. Here he resided the remainder of his days; and it was here on one of the clay hills of the old North State that his remains were laid to rest.

His death occurred in 1801, some time between July 26th. and Nov. 1st. We thus fix the time by the fact that his will was written July 26, 1801 and probated at the first of the November term of court of the same year.

He was twice married. Unverified tradition states his first, or German wife's name was Lough. She bore him eight children; the first one being a boy, all the others, girls. His second wife, according to tradition, was Miss Elizabeth Louck, but his will states "my beloved wife Molly". She may have been named Mary Elizabeth. She bore him seven children, all boys: making a total of fifteen children, all of whom grew to manhood and womanhood, married and had families.

It is conservatively estimated that up to the present time Rudolph Waymire has had more than thirty thousand descendants.

These people, mainly farmers, were not altogether pleased with the agricultural conditions of North Carolina. The river valleys were very fertile, but narrow and subject to disastrous floods at the time of freshets; the rest of the land was rock infested, clayey hills, mostly impossible to cultivate and non productive. Then again, this state permitted the institution of slavery, and, as most of these people were Quakers, it was galling to their natures to constantly witness around them the workings of this iniquitous, barbarous system.


Because of these conditions and environments they had for some time contemplated migrating to the new lands in the northwest. Immediately after the death of the father the children began the exodus from the old North State and by 1808 had all migrated to Ohio, settling at first in Warren, Montgomery, and Miami Counties. Some remained here while others soon migrated farther west and scattered in different directions until, today, his descendants are found throughout all parts of the United States and Canada.





Comparatively early in life his hair was thin and gray with a tendency to be curly, or wavy, and he wore it roached in the middle.

Hard work, thrift and honesty were his hobbies which he rode without mercy.

### John Waymire

John Waymire, son of Daniel and Sophia (Plummer) Waymire, was born August 30, 1808, in the Daniel Waymire log cabin located near the present site of Polk Church. He was the second Waymire boy born in Butler Township, Montgomery County, Ohio. Starting life in the presence of the frontier conditions of those times his neighbors were, in the main, native Miami Indians. He was inducted into this world in the midst of the primeval forests which at that time were so infested with wild animals that the howl of the wolf and the scream of the wild cat were almost as familiar to his ears as the honk of the automobile is to the modern child.

Under these environments he developed into childhood and while yet a mere boy had to assist in the clearing of the land and the cultivating of the soil. These tasks so occupied his time that he had but little opportunity of attending the meagre schools then existing. He never had but the one teacher, David Akers, and the amount of time spent in school was so limited that he never progressed further than the Rule of Three. The school he attended was held in a small log cabin located about one-fourth of a mile west of Polk Church on the corner of Solomon Coble's farm where it joined that of Jess Swallow.

When he quit school he could barely read and afterwards developed but little in that line. He had an excellent memory which he cultivated by depending upon it. As time passed on and the development of newspapers and books became such that printed matter was more plentiful, he did not even then acquire the habit of reading because by that time he had become accustomed to relying upon his son Dan to read to him. In this manner he kept posted as to passing events, and his mind stored with a stock of knowledge; because what interestd him in the subject matter thus imparted was retained in his memory for months and years.

In those pioneer times, houses were built and their equipment constructed from materials fashioned by hand out of the timber of the native forests. Most of the earlier Waymires by occupation were rated as both carpenters and farmers. We have learned that Daniel Waymire, father of John, was a carpenter who in those early days worked at his trade in the building of Dayton. That on Monday mornings he went to his work ten miles distant leaving his wife and little children alone in the cabin in the wilderness until his return at the end of the week. The son, John, raised amidst these surroundings developed an aptness in woodworking handicraft that served him well. With muscles hardened by continuous, arduous labor and trained by prolonged practice, he acquired endurance and the knack of unintermittingly executing laborious tasks with the constancy and precision of a perfectly working piece of machinery. Thus as a trained woodsman he was a master in mechanical skill and physical endurance. It is related that he could drive his end of a crosscut saw through a log, however large, by a constant rythmic motion as regular as a sweep of a swinging pendulum and never stop or straighten until the log was severed. Early in life he specialized in timber working by selecting as his chosen occupation that of a cooper. This he followed for a time, or until his farm duties grew so as to demand his entire attention.

On September 13, 1831 he bought of George Fouts for \$300, sixty-four acres which was always afterwards known as the house, or home place. This tract of land passed down the family through his son Dan to his grand-daughter Eva (Waymire) Bohlender and thus remained in

the family until it had to be abandoned on account of the building of the Englewood dam when it was sold to the Miami Conservancy Works.

At the time of purchase from Fouts this tract was heavily timbered and the splendid walnut, oak and ash trees were cut and burned to make a clearing on which to start farming. When he married Margaret Coble in 1833, he settled on this land and here he lived the remainder of his life. His first house, the nest for the bride, was a log cabin that stood to the east and a little to the north of the location of the more pretentious house built later, and which we in our day remember as his home. This latter house was a two story structure built of hewn logs. In this house he lived the remainder of his days and in it he died February 24, 1894.

In those pioneer days when a cabin was to be built, assistance was necessary because it was constructed throughout from heavy, oversized green timbers, with no means of placing them except by man power. Neighbors or relatives, or both, always cheerfully rendered assistance. In this instance help was rendered by his brother Davis and his three brothers-in-law, William, Daniel and John Coble.

This first cabin was of the crudest and simplest form, consisting of straight round logs, notched and placed each in its turn upon the other until the walls were of the desired height. Then the rafters, consisting of peeled saplings, were set and the roof, which was of clapboards four feet long, was applied. For a floor small sized logs were split in half, adzed off and laid close together, flat side up, on sleepers. In this cabin the four children were born, and upon this floor they first undertook self-locomotion by learning to crawl.

Later on when the more pretentious two story log house was built and the old one torn down, these floor puncheons, as they were called, were preserved and utilized as trestle platforms, or benches to be used for butchering and various other purposes for which benches were required in the performance of operations connected with farm activities.

When his wife Margaret died, September 14, 1846, he was left with four small children. His brothers and sisters rendered assistance for a time in caring for them. But eventually he secured the services of Betsy Woodhouse as a house-keeper for himself and two younger children, while Sarah and Isaac were placed in the home of his brother Davis.

This business contract with Betsy went along very satisfactory for a period of four or five years, when it was terminated as such, and in its stead a social arrangement was agreed upon and adopted; and they were married.

About this time he built the two story log house which he ever afterwards occupied as his home. Though added to and covered with boards, it was the same old house that was still standing there many years after his death, but eventually torn down by the Miami Conservancy Works when constructing the Englewood dam on Stillwater River. The very soil upon which stood this old house was removed to a depth of more than twenty feet, transported and deposited into the body of that structure. In fact most of the fertile soil of his numerous acres was placed in that great engineering project, built to tame and control at the time of freshets, the raging torrents which would otherwise threaten the destruction of the prosperous cities situated further down the course of the stream, especially Dayton.


To his second marriage was born one child, John Jr., who lived but a short time. On July 15, 1863, the second wife, Betsy, died and he was again left a widower.

In the meantime his youngest son, Hamilton, had enlisted, gone to war and was lost in the battle of Shiloh. So completely lost that no record was found of him after the battle was well under way; and the body, though diligently searched for, was never recovered.

The second wife at the time of her death, was one of the heirs of

the undivided Woodhouse estate. John Waymire as her husband heired her portion and soon afterwards purchased the landed interests of the other known heirs. Thus he came in possession, July 30, 1863, of the so-called Woodhouse farm consisting of three tracts, 90 acres, 60 acres and 38 acres. This farm lay on the east side of Stillwater river about a half mile south of the home place.

On June 21, 1864 he married Mrs. Margaret Jackson who, at the time of his death, February 24, 1894 survived him. They were a very happy, congenial couple and during his latter years of ill health and partial helplessness her kind ministrations were a source of much gratification to him and his children.

On April 15, 1889 though almost eighty-one years of age, he bought of Silas Coble sixty-four acres which joined the home place and lay to the south of the National Road. Thus he displayed his tenacity of purpose by still taking part in worldly affairs even though past his four score years.

He was a good husbandman that took great pride in tidying up the farm so it always presented a neat appearance. He tended the soil well, raised the best of grain, took good care of it, stored it in good buildings and always had on hand the finest and the best of grain so that his granaries were more dependable than a national bank. Thrift and frugality were natural traits and nothing was ever permitted to go to waste or to deteriorate, if toil and attention could prevent. Farm equipment, when not in use, was put in good shape and carefully housed until needed. After the early clearings not a log or a tree top was allowed to go to waste. Any log that was good enough for lumber was sawed and stacked in perfect shape. All other fallen timber was prepared to be used as wood by being reduced to convenient dimensions for handling and stood on end in conical Indian tepee shaped stacks to await the time when needed, when it would be cut by the power saw. These conical stacks of wood were characteristic of his timbered acres.

At any time that boards were needed for tables, platforms or benches for a public gathering, Uncle John's lumber pile could be depended upon. He would see to it that all that were needed were transported and when the meeting was over the faithful old horse and wagon were put into service and the lumber returned to the farm; and without delay, restacked with exactly the same precision as originally. Anyone visiting at the time of the Reunion or Annual Basket Meeting could not but observe this,—illustrative of his practical thrift.

His home was noted for its hospitality. While he was not much of an entertainer, that is, lacked the traits of a gifted conversationalist,—not even able to repeat a good story, yet he was never more pleased than when tendering the hospitality of his roof and table.

In personal appearance he was of rather slender build, tall, and straight as an arrow until way past the age of three score years and ten. His eyes were light blue and had a kindly expression, but were capable of flaming up and snapping with fire when angered. Anger was more expressed in actions than in words. Comparatively early in life his hair was thin and gray, with a tendency to be curly or wavy, and he wore it roached in the middle.

He placed great confidence in humanity, too much at times and because of misplaced trust he sustained many financial losses. He was always ready to forgive an unintentional wrong, but he never forgave a deliberate injustice.

He was a Republican, but never sought office. He never belonged to church but was a liberal contributor of both time and money in its support. In this he was similar to his two brothers Davis and Henry, neither of whom ever united with any church, though each attended regularly and rendered financial aid.

He had lived to see the wonderful development of the country, by which dense forests, traversed almost exclusively by Indians and wild animals, were transformed into broad cultivated fields; by which human habitations had changed in form from that of rude log cabins to mansion-like homes; by which lines of travel had developed from that of winding trails into splendid roads. In all of these he acted his part by doing his share in bringing about the transformation. In later years, after having passed his three score years and ten, and no longer able to perform heavy toil, he took great enjoyment in wandering over his lands, studying the growing crops, inspecting the fields with their well kept encompassing fences, and strolling through his woodlands, including the sugar camp, which were kept as tidy as a city park. Or he would wander down to the bank of the river where he had in earlier life pulled fish from its waters and thus secured much enjoyment, not to mention sustenance.

But as time passed and his physical being became afflicted and he grew more feeble, he would sit on the corner of his porch from which he had a commanding view of the National Road, which passed through his farm near the house. Here he would sit throughout most of the day and observe the traffic and look out over his fertile fields with their growing crops and gaze over the valley of the Stillwater, bounded on the west by almost abrupt bluffs but on the east by sloping wooded hills. On these eastern hills lay, in plain view, his well kept sugar camp from which he always secured maple sugar and syrup for his table use. In all his life he never used store syrup or store sugar on his table. His coffee had to be sweetened with sugar made in his own camp from his own trees.

Practically his entire home and sustenance was derived from his holdings. The timber furnished his sweets and the logs and lumber out of which was constructed all his buildings and most of his furniture; the river yielded him fish and the neighboring wild areas, his game; the orchard and garden his fruits and vegetables, and the fertile fields his staple articles of food. The corner of his porch commanded a view of the region from which all of these were derived and he enjoyed it to the very last days of his life.

Hard work, thrift and honesty were three traits that were inseparable to his nature. They were his hobbies which he rode without mercy.

His last days were peaceful and passed amidst the scenes of his earthly activities. His body was laid to rest in Polk Cemetery located on the pioneer farm of his father, in a spot which he long before had selected and prepared.





### The Emigrant's Trunk.



The trunk the Waymire family brought with them when they crossed the ocean in emigrating from Germany in 1753. It had been handed down, at first, because of its utility and later on account of sentiment. Finally it was placed in a museum of old relics in the library of Richmond, Indiana. The spirit of this ultilitarian age crowded it out of its conspicuous resting place and it was stowed away in an attic of one of the descendants, Joseph C. Ratliff. When the owner of the attic died, the family connection with the trunk was broken and it came near being lost, because the property was sold, and the new owners not knowing its history placed it in the stable loft, where it was found almost accidently on August 14, 1921, and restored to its place among the family relics.

This trunk is covered with skin to which the hair remains attached, and has raw hide hinges that have withstood usuage for one and three quarters centuries.
