

PREFACE.

When the writer began to inquire into the history of his mother's ancestry he was told the common tradition that three brothers bearing the surname of Warren came across the sea from England to Massachusetts in early days and started the various branches of the family here, but the details given were too meagre and indefinite to satisfy him. Therefore as opportunity offered and time permitted he has patiently traced his maternal line to Arthur Warren of Weymouth.

While doing this much information relating to the descendants of this immigrant ancestor had been accumulated and he felt impelled to put it into permanent form so that others traveling through this region might have the benefit of his landmarks. Making this agreeable task his avocation, for a number of years he has had a large correspondence with descendants of Arthur.

Though the Warren family was the principal object of research and the lines of female members were rarely followed far yet, curiously, it appears that persons with this name comprise only one-fourth of the total number indexed. The greatest care has been taken to avoid mistakes in names, dates or facts, but "to err is human" and defects will doubtless be found. The abbreviation "int." is used for intention of marriage which was at one period required to be announced publicly and recorded sometime before the ceremony was performed. (A revival of this practice might be wise today).

Credit for valued assistance in this work is here given to the Hon. Francis E. Warren, Mrs. Angie (Warren) Perkins, Mrs. Elizabeth (Seamans) Haviland, Capt. George Warren, Charles Tubbs, Esq., and Mr. Howard B. Warren.

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INTRODUCTION.

While the history of the Warren family in Europe is not complete in every detail, there are certain facts of interest which seem to be fairly authentic. There is no doubt that the name dates back into the early history of France and England and has been borne by some of their most illustrious sons. Good authority also exists for believing that members of this family have formed alliances through marriage with the ruling houses of both of these countries.

This family name comes doubtless from the Latin word Guarenna or Varenna, of which the primary sense is to stop, hold, or repel, to guard, or keep off. This word in Norman French became Guarenne or Varenne and is sometimes written Guaren or Guarin in old documents. It is likewise found in English as Warren, Warrene, Waren, Warrin, Warin, or Waring. The name Varenne was given both to a river in the County of Calais, Normandy and to the country bordering on this stream. This region, while not large in area, apparently was of sufficient political importance in the 11th century to bring to its possessor the title of Earl or Count.

The first to bear this title was William de St. Martins, so-called from his birthplace, who received the fief of Varenne from Duke William II of Normandy. He lived in the 11th century and was without doubt a descendant from the stock of the Danish invaders. There is considerable data extant, though unfortunately much of it is legendary, which would connect him directly with the warrior chieftain of the Northmen, Rolf or Rollo, who forced from King Charles III of France the grant of the northern section of that country, then called Neustria. The new owners changed the name to Normandy and their leader became the first Duke of Normandy. It is from this ducal lineage that the first Earl Warren, or Comte de Guaren or Varenne, is said to have sprung. History bears eloquent testimony that he was a worthy recipient of this new title, as he served his sovereign nobly both at home and abroad.

The first mention of this name in English history is in connection with the Battle of Hastings, fought in 1066. In this conflict one of Duke William's most trusted lieutenants was Comte de Guaren, or the 2d Earl Warren. He must have been in high favor at court, for he later became the husband of Gundred, the daughter of the Conqueror in whose train he had

come to England. At Domesday he received 298 manors as his share of the kingdom for the part played in the victories of Hastings and Ely and was rated as the richest subject in England. In 1073, he was appointed one of the Grand Justiciaries of England and was created Earl of Surrey by William Rufus in 1088. Both he and his wife seem to have been of a generous disposition as they gave the money for the establishment, at Lewes in Sussex County, of one of the most magnificent Priories in England, and assisted liberally the other churches and monasteries in the counties subject to them. Their last years were passed in their principal castle at Lewes and they were buried in the Chapter House of the Priory which they had endowed.

The line of nobility thus established existed with distinction until the reign of Edward III when the estates and title were surrendered to the crown by John, 8th Earl Warren, who died without male issue in 1347. The King made grants of the lands thus surrendered but took no notice of the title. In fact it was not until more than a century later that the title was again used. being conferred upon the son of the Duke of Norfolk who was created Earl of Warren and Surrey by Henry VI. As he left no male issue the title reverted to the crown. It was not conferred again until 1476, when Richard, Duke of York, son-in-law of the previous holder, was created by Edward VI Duke of Norfolk and Earl of Warren. He also died without male issue and the earldom became once more unenjoyed. It has not been granted to anyone since and, therefore, is extinct, though the title Earl of Surrey is a possession of the noble family of Howard.

Through marriage the Warren family was later allied with the houses of Wirmgay and Poynton. From this latter branch came the William Warren who settled in Caunton, Notts Co., England, in the 15th century and was (probably) an ancestor of the Arthur Warren who emigrated to America about 1635. Though this last statement is not established beyond question, yet John C. Warren, Esq., of Nottingham, Eng., who has made a study of this family, writes as follows: "One notable thing is that Arthur was not a common Warren name. Indeed I cannot find it used in old days among any branch of the family except the Leicester and Notts Warrens."

The physiognomy of various descendants of Arthur Warren clearly showed traces of a French ancestry.

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SOME DESCENDANTS OF ARTHUR WARREN.

I. ARTHUR WARREN undoubtedly emigrated from England to New England about 1635, though diligent and repeated efforts have failed to discover the date and place of his birth or the exact time when he came to this country. However, it is known that he settled in Weymouth, Massachusetts Bay Colony, before 1638. In that year he married Mary ---. At the Ouarter Court held in Boston December 7, 1641, he was a witness in the case against Walthian Richards. In the list of the real estate owned by the various proprietors of the plantation of Weymouth, made between Oct. 26, 1642, and May 21, 1644, "the land of Arthure Warren" is described as follows: "Tenn acres of upland and swampe, first given to himselfe, bounded on the East with Mr. Gloveres marsh, on the west and south with Mr. Barnardes land, on the north by the sea." "Tenn acres in the Mill-field, given to himselfe, bounded on the East and south with Hingham line, on the north with the land of of Walter Harris, the comon on the west." In 1645, Arthur "Waring" joined with about 20 members of the church in Braintree in a petition to the General Court of Massachusetts Bay Colony "for a grant of the Narragansett lands supposed to have been rendered forfeit by the heresy of Gorton, Holden and the others, just proprietors." "At a meeting of the Townsmen the 2d of the 12th mo. $165\frac{1}{2}$," it was ordered by them that certain lands be divided, "The names of those that are to have lots in order as followeth:

(No. 5.) Arthure Warren-4 (lots)."

He died after July 6, 1658. Among the probate records of Suffolk County, Mass., kept in Boston, is a document numbered 2,625 and undated, though it must have been made before 1660, as one of the persons who signed it died in that year. It shows by its wording that he left a will but none can be found. This paper reads as follows: "An inventory of the goods and lands of Arthur Warren of Weymouth, late deceased, which he bequeathed to his wife for the maintenance of his children.

A list was made in 1663, of the number of acres in each person's lots. In the first division beginning on Braintree line the widow Warren owned lot number 69, containing 5 acres, and in the second division beginning on this line lot number 32 measuring 15 acres.

In 1664, the selectmen "ordered that Sergent Whitmarsh shall be and is hereby empowered to lay out unto Samuel Pratt a swamp lot which he hath in the right of the heirs of Arthur Warren, deceased." The date of the death of Arthur Warren's widow is unknown.

of County Records, Vol. I, in the office of The Registrar of Births, Marriages and Deaths in Boston, Mass., it appears that the Fearnot born June 29, 1655, was a son of John and Hester King.)

2. ARTHUR WARREN (I. Arthur), born Nov. 17, 1639, in Weymouth, Mass., was granted 37 acres of land in Chelmsford, Mass., Dec. 24, 1660. He married Abigail Rogers, daughter of John and Priscilla (Dawes) Rogers, Sr., of Billerica, Mass., about 1667. She was born there about 1647. Arthur died April 25, 1671, in Chelmsford. Then Abigail with her infant daughter returned to her father's home in Billerica, and died there June 15, 1671. Her will, casually burned in Oct. 1671, was probated Nov. 13, of that year. In this instrument she commends her "poor fatherless and motherless babe" to the care of her father, John Rogers, and provides that, if this child dies, half of her property shall be given to her "husband's two brethren, Jacob Warren and Joseph Warren, and theire sister, Abigail Wright."

(Richard) Hildreth March 16, 1692.

"The 5th day of 12 mo. 1677, were given to Jacob Warren two acres of land lying adjoining to Richard Hildreth's land on the south side of the bridge for him to build a house on fc1 his subsistence.

This land was "bounded east and south by the lands of Robert Proctor, west by the highway to Tadmack (Pond) and north by the Town Common" and lies in what is now called Westford. April 6, 1711, three acres were laid out to him "on the Right of Thomas Hinchman in the first division of Commons" in Chelmsford, and March 12, 1712, one acre more on the same "right." He died in 1722, at the age of 80 years, in Chelmsford, and is buried there with his wife who died in that town Dec. 17, 1730, at the same age.

She married William Pierce, son of Sgt. Thomas and Elizabeth (Cole) Pierce, April 8, 1690, in Woburn. He was born there March 7, 1657, and was a soldier in 1675 (King Philip's War). He died Aug. 22, 1720, in Woburn, and she died there June 4, 1726.

His wife was born in 1667. He was a member of the "Garrison in the West Regiment in Middlesex" in Chelmsford March 16, 1692; surveyor of high-ways for the south part of the town in 1693 and 4; appointed (with Edward Foster) "to run the perambulation betwixt Concord and Chelmsford" in 1695; and was constable and collector of taxes in 1696.

He emigrated to Connecticut in 1697, settling east of the Quinebaug, and at once took a prominent place in public affairs. May 9, 1699, he joined with 21 other settlers in a petition to the General Court of Connecticut for "town privileges," and when the inhabitants of Quinebaug Plantation (later,

Plainfield) met to organize their town government May 31, 1699, they chose him first selectman. He was the first recorder of deeds and registrar of births, marriages and deaths in Plainfield and clerk of that town for a time. Nov. 13, 1699, he united with 36 other inhabitants on the east and west sides of the Quinebaug in an agreement "to maintain an able, faithful, orthodox, gospel minister, so as that the sure worship of God may be at all times upheld and maintained amongst us," and was rate collector for the east side of the town. Dec. 24, 1702, he with others agreed to divide Plainfield into a township east of the Quinebaug (Plainfield) and another west of this river (Canterbury). Jan. 1705, a church was gathered in Plainfield and Rev. Joseph Coit was ordained as its minister with Jacob Warren as one of the first two deacons.

He was a Representative of the town of Plainfield in the General Assembly of the Colony of Connecticut in 1708 and 10, and again selectman in 1709 and 12. Oct. 3, 1715, he joined in a petition to the General Court that the vacant land east of Plainfield be annexed to them. In 1718, he was one of a committee of three to build a new meeting-house, gave 40 shillings above his lawful proportion toward its cost and Sept. 1720, was one of the five selected to "seat it." April 17, 1725, he contributed "two pounds ten, money," to promote the settlement of Mr. Samuel Dorrance, a Scotch-Presbyterian, as minister of the church and township of Voluntown, Conn. He died Sept, 3, 1727, in Plainfield, and is buried in the old cemetery there. His estate inventoried about £900, including books valued at £5.

His widow Sarah married John Fellows, son of Ephraim and Mary Fellows of Ipswich, Mass. He was born about 1668, in Ipswich, and married, first, Rachel ——. He came to Conn., and took land east of the Quinebaug about 1695. He joined in the petition to the General Court for town privileges May 9, 1699, and was chosen constable May 31, 1699. He signed agreement of Nov. 13, 1699, to maintain a minister. In 1702, he was a surveyor on the east side of the Quinebaug and an inspector of the cedar swamp; in 1704, on the committee of three selected to lay out the first allotments of land in Plainfield; and a Representative in the General Assembly of the Colony of Conn. in 1708, 9, 14, 17 to 21, and 25. In 1719, he and Timothy Pierce were appointed to press the claims of Plainfield to the country land eastward of that town. He died March 29, 1751, in Plainfield.

the land in Plainfield, except the "General Field," into five equal parts, and in 1711, 12, 15 and 17, was a Representative in the General Assembly of the Colony of Conn. He was deacon of the church from 1719, until his death, Dec. 1, 1753, in Plainfield. His widow Sarah died Mar. 28, 1759, in that town and is buried there.

23. EPHRAIM WARREN (4. Jacob), born June 24, 1680, in Chelmsford, Mass., married Abigail Burnham, daughter of Lt. Thomas and Lydia (Pengry) Burnham, May 13, 1701, in Ipswich Mass., where she was born June 2, 1680. He followed his brother Jacob to Plainfield, Conn., in 1703, and was active in affairs there until his removal about 1708, to Killingly, Conn. Jan. 2 1707, it was voted that he be allowed "to enjoy his labor in getting fencing stuff in cedar swamp without molestation from the town (Plainfield)." Nov. 16, 1708, Ephraim Warren. husbandman, "of Killingly" purchased Thomas Stevens, Sr.'s right to the Owaneco land in the south of Killingly and the next day bought the interest in Killingly land of Jacob Warren, weaver, of Plainfield. April 14, 1709, Jacob Warren and two other selectmen of Plainfield proposed that the south line of Killingly shall begin at a black-oak tree (the reputed northwest bound of Plainfield) standing on the Ouinebaug River near Sergeant Ephraim Warren's place. He with 43 others received a patent of the remaining lands in Killingly from the Governor and Company of Conn., Oct. 13, 1709, for 40 pounds paid through Capt. Chandler. A large tract lying east of the Assawaga River, bordering south on Whetstone Brook, was deeded by Nicholas Cady Jan. 23, 1710, to Ephraim Warren, yoeman, of Killingly, "County of New London," who also purchased Break-neck Hill on the east and much other land in this vicinity and was one of the first settlers of Killingly Center, living where the tayern now stands. July 16, 1711, Eleazer Bateman and

Ephraim Warren were appointed a committee to survey the 350 acres of land which the town of Killingly agreed to give Mr. John Fisk of Braintree, Mass., for his encouragement to settle in the work of the ministry.

In 1721, he was chosen lieutenant of the train-band and was elected a Representative of the town of Killingly in the General Assembly of the Colony of Connecticut May 6, 1723. received deeds of land in Killingly, Jan. 4, 1723, from his brother-in-law, James Burnham, (80 acres); April 20, 1723, from Nathaniel Kee; Dec. 18, 1723, from Michael Heulett (34 acres); and Dec. 21, 1730, from David Russell. In 1730 he was chosen captain of the military company in the south part of Killingly (1st Co.). In 1731, Capt. Ephraim Warren. Capt. Sampson Howe and George Blanchard were appointed "to perambulate the highway that comes from Plainfield, leading towards Oxford," remove nuisances and report needful alterations, and May 20, 1734, the town voted to pay each of these men fifteen pounds for three days perambulating of county road from Plainfield to Oxford in Dec., 1732. April 26, 1739, he asked to be dismissed from his commission as captain because he was in his 50th year and very infirm in body by reason of a long sickness.

In 1742, he offered to give the First Ecclesiastical Society of Killingly land for a training-field and burial-ground and a quarter-acre for the meeting-house on "Bone Hill," now called Break-neck Hill, which was located near the center of the society. His proposition was accepted, and Apr. 9, 1744, he was chosen one of a committee of three to supply the pulpit. (About 1757, this building was removed to Killingly Center and still stands there on land given by Capt. Eleazer Warren.) The Rev. Nehemiah Barker was ordained as the first pastor of the new church Feb. 25, 1746, and Capt. Ephraim Warren was his staunch supporter until he died Apr. 20, 1747, in Killingly. His remains rest in the little burial-ground on Break-neck Hill. (His armory was inventoried at over £20.) His wife's sister, Mary Burnham, was a member of his family for a number of years and in his will he bequeathed to her "twenty-five pounds old tenor in bills of credit." His widow died Mar. 21, 1752, in Killingly, and was buried beside him.

The rect hereof we do acknowledge and ourselves therewith satisfied contented and paid by these presents. Have Given Granted Bargained and Sold and by these presents do fully freely & absolutely give grant bargain sell Enfcoff Convey & Confirm unto him the said Andrew Burley his Heirs Exors & admors & assigns forever all our right title interest Claim Challenge & Demand whatsoever that we have or ought to have in the Lands of ve Township of Haverhill or Methuen which descended to us from & by our Hond. Mother Lydia Burnam of Ipswich aforesaid Deceased and Bequeathed to our Hond. Mother Lydia Eurnam aforesaid by Mr. Robert Clements of Haverhill Deed in his Last Will & Testament. To Have & To Hold ye sd. granted & bargained premises with all the Right Title & Profits Privileges & appurtenances thereunto belonging or any waves appertaining unto him the said Andrew Burley his Heirs Exors admors & assigns forever as an absolute Estate of Inheritance in fee simple and have in ourselves good right full power & lawful authority to dispose of the same in manner as aforesaid. And Furthermore we the said Ephraim Warren & Abigail my wife and Mary Burnam do Covenant & Engage to & with the said Burley to secure & Defend the said bargained premises against the Lawful Claims of all persons whatsoever. In Witness Whereof we ye sd. Ephraim Warren and Abigail my wife & Mary Burnam have hereunto set our Hands & Scals this twentieth-eight Day of June A. D. 1737 In the Tenth year of His Majesties Reign.

(Robert Clements came from Coventry, Warwickshire, England, to Salisbury, Mass., early in 1642, and to Haverhill, Mass., that summer with his wife and several children. He was the first Deputy to the General Court elected by the latter town and held this office from 1648 to 1654. He owned the first gristmill built in this town and was a man of rare integrity and superior talents. Their daughter, Abigail Clements, married Dea. Moses Pengry who was a salt-maker, of Ipswich, Mass., in 1641, and a Deputy to the General Court of Mass., in 1665.

Their daughter, Lydia Pengry, married Thomas Burnham, Feb. 13, 1665, in Ipswich, Mass.

The Burnham family is said to be descended from Walter Le Ventre who came to England with William the Conqueror in the train of his cousin German, Earl of Warren, in 1066. He was made Lord of the Saxon village of Burnham in the County of Norfolk, England, and took the surname de Burnham. Robert Burnham was born in Norwich, Norfolk County, Eng., in 1581, married Mary Andrews in 1608, and had seven children. Their sons John, Robert and Thomas sailed for America under the care of their uncle, Capt. Robert Andrews, early in 1635, in the ship "Angel Gabriel" of which he was the owner and master. This vessel was wrecked at Pemaquid on the coast of Maine and Capt. Andrews with his three nephews settled in Ipswich, Mass., that spring. Burnham was "out in the Pequot expedition," and married Marie Lawrence in 1645. He was a Deputy to the General Court in 1683, 4 and 5. Their son Thomas Burnham was born Jan. 19. 1646, wounded "at the Eastward" July 4, 1677, and appointed lieutenant by Gov. Joseph Dudley in 1702. Marie Lawrence (aged 9) daughter of Thomas and Joan (Antrobuss) Lawrence. from St. Albans, Hertfordshire, Eng., embarked on the ship "Planter" Apr. 2, 1635, with her mother, step-father, John Tuttell, and grandmother, Joan Antrobuss, and came to Ipswich, Mass.)

Nehemiah Barker baptized "Olive Day, the daughter of Jonathan Day and Olive, now the wife of Eleazer Warren, presented by her father-in-law and her mother," Feb. 6, 1754. In Oct., 1745, he was chosen ensign; in 1746, lieutenant; and in Oct., 1756, captain of the 14th Co., 11th Regt. Conn. Militia. Capt. Eleazer Warren was married to his third wife, Zerviah Russell, daughter of David and Anna (Carpenter) Russell, Jr., of Killingly by Jabez Fitch, Justice of ye Peace, Nov. 29, 1757. She was born Dec. 7, 1738, there. In 1760, he was chosen key-keeper of the meeting-house at Killingly Center, and was elected selectman in 1770, 1771, and 1775. He was chosen to provide a work-house for the poor of all the parishes, except the north one (Thompson), and be master of the same in 1770 and 1772. He was appointed on a committee to build Cotton's bridge in 1773. In May and July, 1775, he was a Representative of the town of Killingly in the "General Assembly of the Governor and Company of the English Colony of Conn." In 1776, he was chosen a surveyor of highways. Apr. 7, 1777, he was elected a member of a committee to look after the families of soldiers in the Continental service.

He received a gift of land from his father Feb. 25, 1759, and bought more acres from him Jan. 11, 1769. He was a farmer and, as he became nearly seven feet tall, was called "Longitude" Ephraim. He was on a committee to furnish clothing to the "Continental" soldiers sent by the town of Killingly, in 1777, and was one of a committee to collect clothing for the army in 1778. He was chosen in 1780, as a member of a committee to divide all of the inhabitants of Killingly into as many classes as the town is deficient in its quota in the "Continental Army." He lived first about 500 feet south of the cemetery on Break-neck Hill and later moved to a site near Mashentuck Brook on the "new road." His wife died Feb.

His father gave him a tract of land June 12, 1764, and he lived at the junction of the old turnpike from Hartford, Conn., to Providence, R. I., with the road to Ballouville, near the recent home of Franklin P. Warren. In 1772, he was chosen captain of the 14th Co. of 11th Regt. of Conn. Mil. Capt. Ephraim Warren marched "for the relief of Boston (Mass.) in the Lexington alarm" of Apr. 1775, and was in service seven days. In the autumn of 1776, he was captain of the 5th Co. of 11th Regt. of 5th Brigade of Conn. troops in the Revolutionary War. In Dec. 1776, he was elected tythingman. May 12, 1777, he was appointed on a committee to procure soldiers to enlist for the Continental service, and July 14, 1779, was selected as a member of a committee to enlist men to fill up the quota of Killingly in the Continental army. Feb. 15, 1781, he was elected a member of a committee to supply clothing for the soldiers in the Continental army, and of another committee to procure the quota of men which the town of Killingly was called upon for by an Act of the General Assembly, to serve on the "western frontiers" for one year. Mar. 5, 1782, he was chosen a member of a committe of three to hire the quota of men assigned to the town for the state service, and in the same month he and Lieut. Daniel Larned were selected to settle with the soldiers agreeably to a vote of the town of Killingly. In June, 1782, he was on a committee to hire three men to serve in the Continental army for the town of Pomfret. May 6, 1783, he was chosen a member of "a committee to settle with the Horse Neck soldiers that were out in the summer of 1782, in the militia."

Sept 3, 1785, he was elected a member of a committee to join with a similar committee chosen by the new town of Thompson in settling all the town accounts which was rendered necessary by the division of the town of Killingly. Dec. 12, 1785, he was chosen selectman, fence-viewer and key-keeper of the church in the "Middle Society," located at Killingly Center, and it was voted that his old house be made a work-house for the accommodation of the town's poor and that he be the "master of the same." Apr. 9, 1787, he was one of the men chosen to draft a petition to the General As-

sembly for the repeal of the Act which deprived the town of Killingly of the liberty of sending two deputies to the General Assembly of the State and to sign the same in the behalf of the town. Dec. 7, 1789, it was voted in the town meeting "That Capt. Ephraim Warren have liberty to erect a pound on the southwest corner of the meeting-house lot in the Middle Society by subscription." Nov. 17, 1800, he was elected a member of the grand jury. His wife Susannah died Apr. 9, 1799, in Killingly, and was laid to rest in the burial-ground on Break-neck Hill. 204. LUTHER WARREN (64. Eleazer), born Oct. 3, 1767, in Killingly, Conn., married Sarah Davis Howe, daughter of Capt. Perley and Tamar (Davis) Howe, Oct. 5, 1788, in Killingly. She was born in that town Nov. 9, 1764. (Her father was a captain in the Revolutionary War.) He removed to Killingly Hill in 1794, settling on land purchased of Isaac Cady Howe. He was a farmer and later a popular hotel called Warren's Tavern on Killingly Hill (now Putnam Heights) at the old Capt. John Felshaw stand. He was a good landlord, a strong democrat and a prominent Freemason. In 1788, he was a captain in the 11th Regt, of Conn. Militia. He was elected a selectman in 1800 and 1801; collector of taxes in 1800; town clerk in 1804, succeeding Sampson Howe, and 1817; town treasurer and justice of the peace in 1804; Representative in the General Assembly of Conn. in 180-; and pound-keeper in 1806, 1833, 1837 and 1838. Apr. 30, 1802, he was chosen one of the agents to join with those from other towns in Windham Co. in preparing a petition to the General Assembly praying to have a half shire (so-called) established in some town in the easterly part of said county. Dec. 15, 1806, he, Joseph Dexter and David Day were selected as a committee to build a pound near his house.

He was an officer in the First Regt. of a Vol. Brigade under Gen. David Humphreys in the War of 1812. He was a delegate from Killingly to the convention which met Aug. 26, 1818, at Hartford, Conn., to form the present Constitution of the state. June 26, 1819, he, Penuel Hutchins and William Read were chosen a committee to confer with agents of other towns in Windham Co. in relation to selecting a suitable site for a court house and jail for the county. Apr. 5, 1824, he was selected as an agent to oppose the petition of the inhabitants of Windham and other towns for a new county and any other division of the County of Windham. In 1836, he was postmaster at No. Killingly. He died Aug. 6, 1839, in No. Killingly, and his widow died there May 13, 1850. They are buried in the cemetery on Putnam Heights.

In 1862, when he was but 18 years old, he enlisted in the 49th Mass. Vol. Inf. and served as private and noncommissioned officer in that regiment until it was mustered out of service. He received the Congressional medal of honor for gallantry on the battlefield at the siege of Port Hudson. He was afterwards a captain in the Mass. militia. For several years after his discharge he was engaged in farming and stock raising in Massachusetts. Early in 1868, he went to Iowa in charge of a construction gang on the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad. A little later he emigrated to the town of Cheyenne, Wyoming (then a part of the Territory of Dakota). That settlement, composed of tents and "shacks," was the terminus of the Union Pacific Railway and many people doubted its permanency, but he with others has made it a substantial and prosperous city. He married Helen Maria Smith, daughter of Matthew and Maria Delight (Root) Smith, Jan. 26, 1871, in Middlefield, Mass. She was born there Dec. 11, 1843, studied in Mount Holyoke Seminary, and was a woman of good attainments whose life was centered in her husband's career and their children. She was a faithful member of the Baptist church. After more than 30 years of happy married life his wife died Mar. 28, 1902, at the home of her sister, Mrs. H. E. Stanton, in Huntington, Mass., and he felt the bereavement keenly. She is buried in Chevenne.

Mr. Warren's genial manners and rugged, honest character made him popular in the frontier settlement and he was soon in politics. He was President of the Senate of Wyoming in 1873–4, and a member of this Senate in 1884–5; was twice member of the Council and also Mayor of Cheyenne, and served three terms as Treasurer of Wyoming. He was a member of the Wyoming delegation to the National Republican Convention in Chicago in 1888, and Chairman of the Wyoming delegation to the National Republican Conventions in Philadelphia in 1900, and Chicago in 1904 and 1908. At various times he has been Chairman of the Republican State Central Committee of Wyoming. He was appointed Governor of Wyoming by President Arthur in February, 1885, and removed by President Cleveland in November, 1886; was again appointed

Governor of Wyoming by President Harrison in Mar., 1889, and served until the Territory was admitted as a State, when he was elected the first Governor of the State. He was elected to the United States Senate, November 18, 1800, and served from Dec. 1, 1890, until the expiration of his term, Mar. 3, 1893, and was re-elected in 1895, 1901, and 1907. He is Chairman of the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate, and the highest ranking member of the Committees on Military Affairs, Agriculture and Forestry, Expenditures in the Department of State, Irrigation and Reclamation of Arid Lands, Public Buildings and Grounds, and Rules. Senator Warren has been a strong and persistent advocate of the policy and necessity of reclaiming the arid lands of the West by irrigation supplied by Federal resources and this cause was supported also by President Theodore Roosevelt. He is a conscientious worker and a determined fighter for measures which he favors. He is a member of the Metropolitan and Chevy Chase clubs and a 33° Mason. He is a prosperous ranchman, an extensive owner of real estate and President of the Warren Live Stock Company of Wyoming. He is fond of books and possesses a good private library, but he enjoys most life on his ranches among his old friends and neighbors. He was wedded to Clara Le Baron Morgan, daughter of John Sands and Susan (Goodwin) Morgan, June 28, 1911, in New York, N. Y. She was born Feb. 5, 1876, in Groton, Conn., but had lived with her mother in New York for some time.
