

### FOREWORD

In 1897, Theron Royal Woodward of Chicago, Ill., published in volume fifty-one of *The New England Historical and Genealogical Register*, a slight genealogical account of some of the descendants of Nathaniel Woodward, mathematician and surveyor, who settled in Boston, Mass., before November 1635. In the following account of this same family has been incorporated most of his research with corrections of some errors and much additional material. The book has been edited by Mary Lovering Holman, of Boston, but for the compilation and the deductions from found evidences she is not responsible.

Doubtless errors will also be found in this later work although no effort has been spared to make it accurate. It is by no means a complete genealogy of the family but it seemed a waste lo let material gathered by me in searching out my own lines not be made available to others. In the hope, therefore, that what I have gathered here may be of use. I am sending forth this small volume.

## AN EXPLANATION

In dealing with any family of Taunton and Buckland, where the records have been burned in both towns, it is difficult and in most cases impossible to obtain the dates of births. In this book where the birth date is lacking but the date of death and the age is known, the birth date has been estimated from the death record. Such dates are marked (c), and it must always be remembered that they frequently are a little at variance with the real date.

## SOME DESCENDANTS OF NATHANIEL WOODWARD

Nathaniel Woodward came to Boston before 1633 as he became a member of the First Church in that year. He brought with him three sons but apparently was a widower as no wife of his joined the church with him. The fact that his son Nathaniel married a girl from Boston, Eng., has led to the assumption that this branch of the Woodwards origina ed in that shire but this is apparently erroneous as there are few Woodwards in Lincolnshire. A descendant of Nathaniel's who has had research done in England advances the theory that he came from Wiltshire but fails to give any proofs of his hypothesis. Nathaniel was an educated man, and in many records is called "mathematician". He was a carpenter by trade or a builder as his branch of artisanship is called at present. A carpenter, as so considered now, was a "joiner" then. He was admitted a Freeman, 17 Apr. 1637.

He evidently understood surveying as he was used by the infant colony for that purpose. In 1638, he was employed to run the line between the Plymouth Colony and the Massachusetts Bay Colony and also the line between the latter colony and Connecticut. With others, he was ordered, 6 Sept. 1638, to lay out the southernmost part of the Charles River and also to lay out the line north of the Merrimac. A report on the southerly survey was made, 10 Oct. 1638, by Nathaniel Woodward, mathematician, and others to the Court at Boston. On a Sune 1639, the Court at Boston ordered that £3 be paid to Goodman Nathaniel Woodward for the Merrimac survey to which 10s., were added by order of the Governor and Deputy. Later, 5 Nov. 1639, the Court ordered 20s., paid to John Gardner for carrying Goodman Woodward's instruments to Ipswich and for other services.

The Court further ordered, 2 June 1641, that Lieutenant Willard, Sergt. Collicot, and Mr. Holman with Goodman Nathaniel Woodward lay out the south line, or any three of them, but Goodman Woodward to be one of the three. At the same time they were empowered to treat with the Indians. On 14 June 1642, it was ordered that Goodman Nathaniel Woodward and others set down the bounds between

"Charlestowne and Linn" as may be most convenient for them both.
(Records of the General Court of Massachusetts Bay Colony, 3: 107, etc.)

Later Nathaniel Woodward was joined with another surveyor, one Solomon Saffrey, about whom little is known except that he spent a few years in the colonies and then vanished from the archives. He probably returned to England. Later records show that they surveyed the line between Springfield and Windsor. In 1702, John Winthrop writing to Governor Dudley about the boundary line between Rhode Island and Massachusetts Bay Colonies, called his attention to the fact that they had a chance to survey from the line formerly run by Woodward and Saffrey and that would lay considerably East and thence to three miles of Samuel Riswell's house, but otherwise than that the line of Woodward's survey was correct. (State Archives, Mass.)

In 1751, trouble arose about this boundary, the committee from Dorchester and Stoughton and that of Wrentham claiming that, in brief, no one knew about the so-called line, that it had not been accepted by the court, etc., but the matter was finally settled to the satisfaction of the towns concerned. (ibid., vol. 116, pp. 47, 91.)

In 1657, Nathaniel Woodward made an inventory of the estate of Nicholas Barby. When the great allotments were made at Muddy River [Brookline], 8 Jan. 1637, Nathaniel Woodward, the elder, was given 28 acres of land bounded south-east by widow Anne Ormsby and northeast by the Cedar Swamp. (Boston Records, 1634–1660.) Again on 28 Oct. 1639, a great lot was granted to Brother Nathaniel Woodward for three heads. (ibid.) He was also paid for a water channel of timber in one of the causeways towards Roxbury. Various deeds of inhabitants of this district are bounded by the property of Nathaniel Woodward, "senior" and "elder." He appears in the following land records:

"Nathaniel Woodward of Boston Carpenter for . . . a valuable Summe . . . pajd . . . Doe . . . sell . . . vnto Richard Richardson of Boston . . . plainter & Johana his wife. a parcel of land nere the fort hill in Boston," 26 May 1655. (Suffolk Deeds, 4: 115.)

"Nathaniel Woodward of Boston . . . Carpenter & margaret his wife . . . for . . . tenn pounds sterling to them . . . paid . . . by James Penniman of the same Boston felt maker . . . Doe . . . Confirme vnto the sajd James Penniman all that theire peece or parcel of land . . . in Boston . . . Contejning . . . thirty foote in breadth and sixty ffoote in length," 4 Jan. 1659. Signed by Nathaniel Woodward with a seal and by Margaret by mark and a seal. Wit: Thomas Wiborne, Jonathan Negus. (ibid., 3: 364.)

"Nathaniell Woodward of Boston . . . Carpenter and Margaret his wife . . . for . . . one hundrd Pounds sterling . . . paid . . . by John Marion of the same Boston Shoomaker . . . Doe . . . Confirme vnto the said John marion . . . All that theire dwelling house and houseing thereunto belonging together with the yards Orchard with the trees growing therevoon, . . . upon

the streete that leadeth to Roxbury," 18 July 1661. Signed by Nathaniel Woodward and Margaret woodward, with seals. Wit: Samuel Eddy, Joshua Rise, Jonathan Negus. (ibid., 519.)

Nathaniel Woodward had by 1661 sold all the land he possessed in Boston. He must have been at least seventy-one or two years of age and possibly went to Taunton. It is also possible that he went back to England where he may have had other children living. He left no will and no administration was taken on his estate. Nothing is found of him later than the deed in 1661 although his property or property lately his is mentioned as late as 1670, but in no mention is he called "deceased."

<sup>\*</sup>It is possible that Ezekiel Woodward, another early settler of Boston, may have been a son of Nathaniel Woodward. Ezekiel Woodward deposed at Salem, Mass., 30 Nov. 1680, aged about 58 yrs., hence born about 1622. He married about 1650, Anne Beamsley, daughter 0 William Beamsley of Boston and had deeds of land in Boston in 1651 and 1658. (Suffelk Deeds, 3:306.) He moved to Ipswich and sold lands in Boston in 1662, while living in Ipswich. (bdd. 4: 42.) He married secondly, 20 Dec. 1672. Elizabeth ( ) Solart, widow of John Solart and, after her death, 3 Feb. 1677-78, he married thirdly, Sarsh, widow of Nathaniel Piper. The Will and Testament of Samuel Jackson, son to Mr. Edmund Jackson late of Boston, dated 7 Aug. 1642, proved 21 Nov. 1646, states, "I do freely give unto my loving brother Nathaniel Jackson, son to my father Edmond Jackson, the sum of five pounds which was left me by my uncle Mr. John Storie at his death, which was due to me the fifteenth day of March last past. A. D. 1641, and was to be paid me by Mrs. Millicent Storie, wife to Mr. John Storie whom he left his executor. And I do freely give unto my sister Sarah Jackson, daughter to my father &c., eight pounds which was given me at the death of my grandfather Mr. Robert Story, due to me the fifteenth day of March last, and five pounds which was given me by the will of my grandmother Mrs. Elizabeth Storie, wife to Mr. Robert Storie, which was left to be paid by my uncle Story, son to the said Robert and Elizabeth Storie, due to me the fifteenth day of March aforesaid, but with a proviso that the said Sarah pay unto John Perrott, citizen and merchant taylor of London, who liveth in Abchurch Lane in the parish of St. Nicholas Acons, the sum of twenty shillings which I borrowed of him for my own use. And I do give unto my brother Elisha Jackson, son &c. twenty shillings to be paid unto him or whom he shall appoint. And I do likewise give to my sister Mary, now Mary Woodward, living in Boston in New England, twenty shillings, to be paid to her or her child or to my brother Elisha if in case she should die; so likewise if my brother Elisha should die before the receipt thereof to fall to my sister Mary Jackson, and if they both die to fall to my sister Sarah." Wit: John Fullerton.

Commission, as above, to Nathaniel Jackson, brother &c., to administer goods &c. according to the tenor of the above will, no executor having been named. Twisse 160.

[In the probate Act Book for the year 1646 the testator of the above will is called "late of Boston in the Co. of Lincoln." (Genealogical Gleanings in England, by H. F. Waters, p. 1015.)

From this will it is evident that Mary Jackson was the wife of Nathaniel Woodward of Boston. Of the two children who are recorded in Boston, Mass., the first was named Elisha, which is an unusual name at the time. Edmund Jackson had a large family of which, by the repetition of the names, most are shown to have died. Of these children, Mary was baptised, 26 Nov. 1618; Samuel, 15 Mar. 1620-21; Nathaniel (the second of the name), 28 Nov. 1622; Elisha, 6 Nov. 1623; Sarah, 8 Jan. 1625-26. The mother may have bethat Barbara Jackson, gentlewoman, buried 13 Nov. 1626. "Edward" Jackson, Alderman was buried 8 Mar. 1627-28. This is probably Edmund, not Edward, the names being frequently confused. Edmund Jackson was an Alderman and apparently a warden of St. Botolph's Church.

Nathaniel Woodward, Jr., of Boston, granted 29 acres of land at Muddy River [Brookline] to Henry Stevens, 5 Mar. 1645. (Suffolk Deeds, 1: 58.) and 16 Oct. 1648, he sold his dwelling house and garden in Boston to John Langdon. (The Book of Possessions, p. 47.) He had already received letters to the church at Taunton, dated 8 Oct. 1648, but was not dismissed there until 14 Aug. 1653. He served on a

jury of inquest on 11 May 1650, on one 10 June 1651, and again, 2 Aug. 1653. He was a proprietor of the Ancient Iron Works, established in Taunton, 1653-54. He later returned to Boston where, 25 Feb. 1655, he and his family were admitted as inhabitants, giving the town a bond of £20, Thomas Harwood going his bondsman.

Remaining only a few years in Boston, he went back to Taunton where in a division of lands, 28 Dec. 1659, he received six acres. He, Nathaniel Woodward "of Tanton in the Collony of Plimouth in New-England Carpenter" with Katherine his wife, for £22, sold to William White of Boston, Bricklayer, their dwelling house in Boston, standing on the town land for which they paid 8 shillings yearly ground rent to the town for the two lots, bounded as follows: E. by John Rosse, W. by town land held by Phebe Blanton, N. by the town highway, and S. by the sea, 21 Mar. 1664. (Suffolk Deeds, 7: 110.)

In a deed, dated 14 Sept. 1686, in which he gives 20 acres of housing, orchards and meadows to his son James Woodward, Nathaniel is called "Senior."

He has no will in Plymouth or Bristol County Registries. Children:

She married secondly in Boston, 7 July 1654, Thomas Harwood, who died after 1695, by whom she had five more children.

John Smith, a tailor of Boston, in his will, dated 23 Sept. 1673, proved 13 June 1674, after giving legacies to his grandchildren, Nathaniel and Robert Woodward, of land on which they had already built houses, bequeathed the residue of his property to his daughter Rachel Harwood. (Suffolk Probate.)

Robert Woodward was allowed a house plot in Boston, 18 Dec. 1637. He owned a house lot with a garden in 1664 but was arraigned

in court for not having built on it. In 1651, his house and garden were bounded by Jacob Leger, south; Thomas Buttolph, east; the High Street, west; and the lane, north.

In the administration of Robert Crossman's estate, granted 26 Nov. 1692, it was divided to his children, John Crossman, Robert Crossman, Sarah Woodward, Mary Gould, Elizabeth Hayward, Samuel and Mercy Thresher, and the children of his son Joseph Crossman, deceased. (Bristol Probate.)

John Woodward was made a Freeman, 1 June 1680. His name appears on the original roster of the First Military Company, first squadron, of Taunton, 8 Apr. 1682. With his wife Sarah, he sold land to Shadrach Wilbore in October 1684.

8. NATHANIEL <sup>2</sup> WOODWARD (Robert <sup>2</sup>, Nathaniel <sup>1</sup>), baptised in Boston, Mass., 30 Oct. 1642, died, probably in Boston, between the 29 Sept. 1675 and 26 Jan. 1675-76. He married about 1665, MARY——, who died before September 1675.

He was a mariner. In 1656, with his brother Robert, he inherited two houses on the west side of Hanover St., from his grandfather, John Smith.

He made his will, 29 Sept. 1675, "Sick and Weake of Body", leaving his dwelling house in Boston, "now in the Tenure and Occupation of Samuell Walker with all the Lands belonging to the Same" to his daughter Mercy Woodward and to her lawful issue and failing such issue to his "Dear mother Rachell Harwood" for life and then to the eldest son of his sister Mercy East and for want of such then to her daughters, equally between them, and for want of them to the next heir of "mee the S4 Nathaniel Woodward" bearing th. name of Smith, and to his heirs forever. All the residue to daughter Mercy Woodward, and mother Rachell Harwood to be sole executrix. Witnessed by Bartholomew Cheever and John Hayward, Scr., who proved the will, 26 Jan. 1675–76. (Suffolk Probate.)

Deliverance was admitted to the First Church of Dorchester, being baptized there, 26 May 1678, with her children, Smith Woodward, Nathaniel Butt, Sherebiah Butt, Samuel Butt, and Elizabeth Butt. She is buried in the old yard in Dorchester, her stone bearing this inscription:

10. JOHN 'WOODWARD (John 3, Nathaniel 2, Nathaniel 1), born in Taunton, Mass., 3 July 1676, died in Taunton in July 1765. He married about 1697, DEBORAH \*———.

John Woodward enlisted for service in King William's War, 25 July 1697, being then a resident of Taunton. He served at Castle Island, Boston Harbor, under Major John Walley. He was a member of the First Military Company of Taunton, 30 May 1700, and of the First Foot Military Company there, 16 Jan. 1710.

With his wife, Deborah, he joined the Baptist Church in Norton, Mass., in 1748. In 1759, he was excused from taking an oath to a legal document on the ground that he was a Quaker. Several of his children also embraced the Quaker faith.

He appears in the following land records, which are of interest:

We John Woodward Senior and Robert Woodward, yeomen, both of Taunton, quit claim unto Jonathan Woodward of Taunton all our right and title that we have in the land belonging to the right of our honored grandfather Robert Crossman in Taunton, 4 Apr. 1749. Signed by both John and Robert Woodward. Witnessed by Samuel Woodward and Deborah Woodward. (Bristol Deeds, 42: 293.)

John Woodward sold land near Spring Brook, 12 Sept. 1722, and, with his wife Deborah, sold more land, 18 Jan. 1731, to Robert Woodward.

John Woodward of Taunton, being 83 years of age, testifyeth and said that for sixty years past or more I well remember going to work in a swamp called y\* Pine Swamp, and I well remember that on the northerly side of said swamp was land reputed to be the land of Isaac Dean, etc., 24 Mar. 1759. Signed by John Woodward. He was a Quaker and would not "swear" but avowed this was the truth.

Deborah is said to have been daughter of Nathaniel and Rebecca (Briggs) Thayer. They were married in 1891, and Deborah's first child was born about 1898. She was born therefore probably about 1890 or earlier and could not be their child. No proof is given that she was a Thayer.

He left this will:

"In the name of God Amen this fifth day of April 1760, I John Woodward of Taunton . . . yeoman, being in my advanced age but of sound and disposing mind and memory, thanks be given to Almighty God, . . . do make and ordain this my last will and testament . . .

After my just debts and funeral expenses are paid, I give and devise the piece of land lying on the easterly side of Boston Road . . . to be equally divided among all my children, namely John, Thomas, Caleb, Peter, Jonathan, Isaac, Hannah, Abigail, Mary, Lydia, Joannah, and the children of my daughter Ann deceased and said Ann's children to have one equal twelfth part of the whole of said piece of land.

My rights in the Cedar Swamp to be equally divided between my four sons,

Caleb, Peter, Jonathan and Isaac.

The Pine Swamp to be divided among my daughters, Hannah, Abigail, Mary, Lydia Joanna and the children of Ann.

John Woodward.

I appoint my son Caleb to be sole executor.

Robert Woodward purchased in Sept. 1744 from John Cook of Connecticut, land on both sides of the Rumford River in Norton, Mass. In 1763, he was in partnership with Israel Woodward. On the 30th May 1700, he was a member of the First Military Company of Taunton.

Israel Woodward lived in Taunton. On 12 Mar. 1749-50, he sold all his rights in the estate of his grandfather, Robert Crossman, located in Taunton, near Prospect Hill on the east side of the pond. Later, on 26 Apr. 1755, he deeded land to his son Benajah Woodward.

He was detached, 2 July 1705, from the military company of Taunton for service in Queen Anne's War, and on 21 May 1706, was ordered into Her Majesty's Service.

His estate was divided, 9 Nov. 1769.

He purchased land in Providence from Zephaniah Peck, 28 Dec. 1748, being then a resident of Taunton. And later, as a resident of Providence, sold land to his son Jacob.

He left the following will:

"I, Ezekiel Woodward of Providence . . . Rhode Island, yeoman, being in declining state of Health, but of sound mind do make and ordain this my last will and testament . . . Imprimis my will is that my just debts and funeral expenses be punctually paid by my executrix by the selling of so much of my homestead land as will be sufficient for that purpose, and I give my said

executrix full power and authority to sell as much thereof as will be required to meet my debts . . . Item. I give unto my daughter Ruth Woodward one feather bed and furniture thereto belonging. Item. I give unto my daughter Sarah Woodward on other feather bed and furniture thereto belonging. Item. I give to my daughter Phebe one other Feather bed and furniture thereto belonging. Item. I give to my beloved wife Sarah Woodward the possession occupation, issues and profits of my dwelling house and all my lands whatsoever and wherever situated . . . to remain to her for so long time as she remains my widow for her support with the full privilege to sell wood from the same, and also give my movable and personal estate whatsoever, that is not disposed of . . . Item. I give and devise unto my sons Ezekiel Woodward. Jacob Woodward and Paul Woodward . . . all my land in Smithfield . . . that I bought of my said son Ezekiel to be equally divided between them. Item. I give to my daughters Ruth, Sarah, and Phebe Woodward, their liberty and privilege to inhabit and live in the north fire room and chamber above it in my dwelling house situated in said Providence and also privilege to take apples out of the orchard to eat for so long time as they respectively remain unmarried, with liberty to pass and repass through the other rooms in said house as the doors now stand to and from forsaid apartments. I give and devise to my said son Ezekiel one full ninth part of all my real estate whatsoever, his part of my homestead to be set off at the southerly side adjoining to Hawkins nearby the dwelling house which I gave to my other two sons Jacob and Paul Woodward. I give and devise to my said sons Jacob and Paul two full ninth parts of my said homestead next adjoining my son Ezekial together with my mansion house standing on said part to be equally divided between them . . . Item. I give and dispose to my six daughters, namely Huldah, Ruth, Rachel, Sarah, Patience, and Phebe Woodward, . . . the other six ninths parts of my said homestead land and all other real estate whatsoever, to be equally divided between them . . . Item. If one or more of my said children shall die under the age of 21 years without lawful issue. I give and devise the part or portions of the deceased to the survivors of them equally . . . I constitute, ordain and make my said wife Sarah Woodward, sole executrix of this my last will and testament . . . in testimony hereto I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day of June . . . 1759."

Letters of Administration were granted to Sarah Woodward on the personal Estate of her deceased husband, Ezekiel Woodward, 7 July 1760. (Town Council Records, 4: 202.)

Ezekiel Woodward of Smithfield sold to Jacob Woodward of Providence, all his right in the Homestead farm of his honored father, Ezekiel Woodward, deceased, in Providence, in 1762. (Providence Deeds, 17: 287.)

We Anthony Newland of Norton, Bristol Co., Mass. and Patience his wife in consideration of money paid by Jacob Woodward of Providence, convey all right to any and all the lands that Ezekiel Woodward, deceased, gave in his last will to the said Patience, she being one of the said deceased's daughters, 24 June 1761. Signed by Anthony Newland, Patience Newland. (ibid., 17: 289.)

Ezekiel's will shows that he had more than one child under age when he made it.

There is no doubt that it was Ezekiel's two daughters who married his nephews.

Caleb Woodward sold land in Taunton to his son Caleb Woodward, Jr., 30 Oct. 1782, the deed being witnessed by Spencer Woodward and Isaac Brigs. Recorded, 18 Nov. 1799. (Bristol Co., Deeds, 78: 329.)

Caleb Woodward sold land in Taunton to his daughter Hannah Bassett, 9 Feb. 1784. Wit: Daniel Woodward and Rachel Bassett. Recorded 27 Jan. 1786. (ibid., 78: 138.)

He also sold land to Samuel Gardner, 18 Feb. 1785, and with Peter Woodward, bought land of Ezekiel Woodward in 1757. (ibid., 64: 196, 59: 379.) See account of Ezekiel Woodward.

Ebenezer and James Woodward of Conway, Mass., sell land to Henry and Spencer Woodward both of Taunton, part of the estate of their father Ebenezer Woodward of Taunton, 21 Sept. 1789.

David Woodward of Taunton sells land to Henry Woodward of Taunton, part of the estate of mother Mary Woodward, widow of Ebenezer Woodward, 9 Apr. 1795.

Ebenezer Woodward of Conway and James Woodward of Buckland sell to Henry and Spencer Woodward of Buckland, land they originally had of their father, Ebenezer Woodward of Taunton, 16 Oct. 1797.

In two other deeds, one in 1790 and one in 1791, the two brothers are arranged as Spencer and Henry, and in the two above as Henry and Spencer.

Between 9 Apr. 1795 and 16 Oct. 1797, Henry moved to Buckland, and it is probable that Spencer went there the same time.

32. DANIEL <sup>6</sup> WOODWARD 2nd. (Caleb <sup>5</sup>, John <sup>4</sup>, John <sup>3</sup>, Nathaniel <sup>2</sup>, Nathaniel <sup>1</sup>), born in Taunton, Mass., 20 Aug. 1758, died in Heath, Mass., 5 Mar. 1832. He married first in Taunton, 1 Sept. 1786, Mercy Eddy, born in Norton, Mass., 4 Feb. 1764, died in Buckland, 28 July 1820, daughter of Abiel and Zerviah (Harvey) Eddy. He married secondly Mary ———, who survived him. She married before 30 Apr. 1833, as his second wife, Billy Johnson, of Charlemont and Colrain, Mass., who died 31 Mar. 1849 and who is buried in Colrain beside his first wife, Levina.

Daniel Woodward is called "2nd", because of the presence in Taunton of Daniel 6, (Samuel 5) who was born about 1749. As Daniel Woodward, 2nd, he appears on the town books of Norton in the publishment of his marriage in 1786, and in 1790, Daniel Woodward, 2nd, was of Taunton with a family of two males above sixteen, two below sixteen, and four females. As in 1790, according to the Taunton records, his family consisted of himself, two daughters, and his wife, it is evident that there were others, probably relatives of his or his wife's, living with them in this year.

On 11 Jan. 1798, Daniel Woodward, 2nd, sold land in Taunton, wife Mercy assenting. Two years later, on 7 Jan. 1795, Daniel Woodward bought land in Buckland, 49 acres. (Franklin Co., Deeds, 7: 688.)

Daniel Woodward of Buckland sold to his brother-in-law, Jeremiah Bassett of Taunton, land in Buckland and also a piece of land in Taunton containing 21 acres which was all he had in that place, 15 June 1795. (ibid., 8: 341.) In 1797, he repurchased from Bassett the Buckland land.

Daniel Woodward deeded to Marcy Woodward Jr., and to Joel Woodward, a tract of land in Buckland, in July 1816, and on the following 4 Mar. 1817. Marcy, Jr., and Joel gave a life lease to the selectmen of Buckland of land to be used for the support of said Marcy. In 1821, Marcy Woodward Jr., deeded a tract of land to Rachel Woodward; on 1 May 1832, Joel deeded his part of their inheritance to Marcy Woodward Jr., and on 30 Apr. 1833, Joel Woodward deeded to Daniel Barnes, land in Heath, this deed being signed by

<sup>•</sup> The only mention of the name of Cave in the Taunton records is in a marriage: William Cave and Susanna Dean, 27 Oct. 1811. Either Susanna Woodward married a Dean first, or she was the first wife of William Cave, and died before 1811.

Billy Johnson, Mary Johnson, Mercy Woodward, Rachel Woodward, Joel Woodward, Daniel Woodward, Cephas Woodward, and Alfred Woodward.

Abner Lincoln and Zeruiah Lincoln of Norton, Bristol Co., and Mercy Woodward, Rachel Woodward, Joel Woodward, Cephas Woodward, and Alfred Woodward all of Buckland, and Daniel Woodward of Conway, Franklin Co., all heirs of Abiel Eddy and Zerviah Eddy deceased quit all right to certain land in Norton, one tract being one-half the farm of the said Abiel Eddy, deceased. They all sign and Delania and Nancy Woodward wives of Daniel and Alfred release their dowers, 8 Apr. 1830. (Bristol Co., Deeds, 131: 123.) In another deed, Joel is called the attorney for the heirs of Mercy Woodward, deceased. (ibid., 131: 339.)

Daniel Woodward purchased land in Heath and developed it with one Daniel Barnes. If he moved there, his family apparently remained in Buckland. As his death is entered on the town records of Heath, as "Mr. Woodward", it is very probable that he was not a resident of the town, but possibly was there on business.

On 15 May 1832, Mary Woodward petitioned the probate court to have Joel Woodward, the oldest son, appointed to administer the estate of her husband, Daniel Woodward, and 12 Feb. 1833, Mary Woodward, wife of William Johnson of Colrain, petitioned for her dower in the estate of her husband, Daniel Woodward, deceased.

Daniel Woodward, 2nd, his wife Mercy (Eddy) Woodward, and their daughter, Mercy Woodward, were all buried on their farm in Buckland. The little plot is now badly overgrown but the field stones marking the graves can still be found.

He and his partner, Oscar Kinney extended the lunches through Connecticut, New York, and into Ohio. In 1919, The Waldorf System, Incorporated, was organized and the following year Mr. Woodward was elected president of the corporation. In 1928, he sold out his interest intending to retire, but later organized The Textile Thread Company of Watertown, Mass., and also helped to develop Brigham's Candy Stores throughout greater Boston. He was also forced through foreclosure of the mortgage to take over most of the land occupied as the Albemarle Golf Club. He ran this as a public golf course for a number of years, later developing it as a residential section, known as Albemarle Village.


