





## FOREWORD

FREDERICK REINHART WALTZ, according to available records, was the first Waltz to set foot on American soil. He was banished from Switzerland in 1731 on account of his violent opposition to the increasing encroachments on civil and religious rights. The constitution of the Swiss Confederation declared a republican form of government, where all men were entitled to certain inalienable privileges. In the seventeenth century the rich and powerful, supported by the crowned heads of Austria, began to usurp authority and choose for their councils only their friends and relatives. By degrees these families perpetuated their posterity; by degrees the council renewed itself annually, until the sovereign power became exclusively hereditary in the families of the great council.

Thus the common people, although declared free by their constitution, were free in name only. Incensed at this outrage, Frederick Reinhart Waltz openly opposed the council. A martyr to the cause of civil and religious freedom, our patriotic, liberty-loving ancestor was banished from his native Swiss home in the Alpine range and sent to the wilds of America. On his arrival in New York City he was involuntarily apprenticed for eighteen months to pay for his passage across the Atlantic. To the memory of this man, who suffered banishment from his home and family and the persecution of enforced slavery for the cause of democracy, the lineal descendants owe honor and respect through all the ages to come.

The Waltz genealogical record is traced to Frederick Reinhart Waltz through his son, John Reinhart Waltz, who emigrated from Switzerland to America in the ship Phoenix on October 20, 1744 and settled in eastern Pennsylvania. Whether or not John Reinhart Waltz had brothers in this country is not positively known; however, it seems probable that Michael, Joseph and Hans Martin, who came to America in 1750, were also sons of Frederick Reinhart Waltz.

John Reinhart Waltz had five sons, viz:-Frederick, who was the father of the Daniel Waltz that married Hannah Kimmel; Peter and Michael, both of whom participated in the Revolutionary War; and John and Samuel. Frederick located about fifty miles northwest of Philadelphia in Berks or Schuylkill county, Pennsylvania; he married Mary Seltzer in 1779 and died in 1799.

Peter was born in 1751; in 1790 we find him in Westmoreland county, Pennsylvania. In 1800 he penetrated the virgin forests of Western Pennsylvania and located in Mahoning county, Ohio. Of a generous disposition, he sought out the poor and needy. One day he heard that a family by the name of Waltz had moved into the neighborhood and that they needed help. He said to his good wife that night, "Ich mus ga und saana eb ich denma ebbes helfa kon." That is Pennsylvania German for:- "I must go and see whether I can help them." Imagine his great surprise when he looked into the eyes of his beloved brother, Michael! After a lapse of forty years the two sturdy war heroes were re-united. Little is known of John and Samuel. However, it is thought that John is buried at Reading, Pennsylvania. Reading is the county seat of Berks county.

Frederick Waltz had seven children the youngest of whom was Daniel. Daniel had two sisters; Catherine, who was born in 1782, married Christian Shell and died at Lewistown, Pennsylvania; and Mary Magdalene, who was born in 1791, married John

Foust, and died in Henry county, Indiana. A granddaughter, Dolly M. Foust, was born at Arcadia, Indiana. The brothers of Daniel Waltz were Frederick Jr., John Henry, Jacob and Peter. Frederick Jr. was born in 1780 and died in 1849 near Pershing, Indiana; a great-grandson, Henry W. Lafeber, was born at Shielville, now Atlanta, Indiana. John Henry was born in 1784 and died in 1870 in Miami county, Ohio; he was the grandfather of Colonel Lee Waltz, who compiled the Waltz record in 1884. Jacob was born in 1787 and died in 1868 near Cambridge City, Ind.; his granddaughters, Clara and Catherine Walter, and Edith A. F. Applegate, were born at Arcadia, Indiana. Peter was born in 1789 and died in 1862 in Wayne county, Indiana; his great-granddaughter, Alice M. Baker, was born at Ovid, Madison county, Indiana.

Daniel Waltz was born in Berks county, Pennsylvania on December 23, 1793. About 1812 he married Hannah Kimmel. In 1820 he and his four brothers came West with a view of settling near Indianapolis; in 1825 he settled about a mile from East Germantown, now Pershing, in Wayne county, Indiana. The other brothers with the exception of John Henry, who stayed in western Ohio, also came across the Indiana line and settled near Richmond. Daniel was a farmer and coffin-maker. His first wife died about 1840; about 1845 he married Catherine Burns, who outlived him a few years. A few of the older Waltzes can still remember Daniel Waltz and his second wife, for they frequently exchanged visits. Wayne, Henry, Madison and Hamilton counties were in the line of march between East Germantown and Arcadia; it was a sixty-mile trip over corduroy and mud roads and consumed about two days time. All of Daniel's children settled around Arcadis, but the father remained with his brothers in Wayne county. He died there in the spring of 1869 at the age of seventy-five years. Few railroads, no telegraph, no telephones, no automobiles, no radios were found in Indiana when Daniel Waltz lived here; only deep forests, wild animals, Indians and ague. Those were the days of the covered wagon, the pioneer days.

Today the Daniel Waltz-Hannah Kimmel family tree comprises almost nine hundred souls. In 1884, or forty-two years ago, this branch had only one hundred and seventy-one, as recorded in the genealogy compiled by Colonel Waltz. An increase of seven hundred in four decades. Almost three thousand names are listed in the Colonel's book. If the other branches have increased as rapidly as ours, then it is not exaggeration to say that the Waltz family in America now numbers more than ten thousand.

The first Waltz reunion was held in the Buckeye state. The invitation read:- "You and your family are hereby invited to be present at a Waltz family reunion to be held at the old Waltz church near Doylestown, Wayne county, Ohio on Friday, September 19, 1879. You are requested to invite anyone related to the family by blood or marriage." David Waltz of Wadsworth, Medina county, Ohio deserves the credit for starting the reunions; he was almost an octogenarian when he set about this labor of love, for he was born in 1802. He was the youngest son of Peter Waltz of Revolutionary fame and a first cousin of our common ancestor, Daniel Waltz. This David Waltz, tall, slender, agile as a man of sixty, was a striking figure not only at the first reunion but at many subsequent ones. The Waltzes are known for their musical talents; that the Waltz Silver Cornet Band, an organization then over thirty years old, played at this first reunion added much to the occasion. The crowd was estimated at one thousand. Both Doylestown and Wadsworth are only forty or fifty miles south of Cleveland.

The second reunion was again held at Doylestown. The third took place September 29, 1881 at West Cairo in Allen County, Ohio. West Cairo is a few miles north of Lima and about fifty miles east of Ft. Wayne. The fourth was held at St. Matthew's church, near New Cumberland in eastern Ohio. The fifth reunion was a two-day affair held at Wadsworth, the home of David Waltz, who founded the Waltz reunion association. The sixth was held at the National Soldiers' Home Dayton, Ohio on August 28 and 29, 1884.

The eighth annual reunion was held at Arcadia, Indiana on August 18 and 19, 1886. It was held on the old fair grounds west of the village, just accross the street from the Peter A. Waltz home of today. Two of Daniel Waltz's descendants live on this very ground now, viz:- Henry Waltz, a son of Daniel Waltz Jr; and Mrs. Curtis Sumner, a daughter of Mrs. Sarah Catherine Brenner and a grand daughter of Henry Waltz. Supper was served in the town hall above what is now the Frank Wolff general store. The venerable old David Waltz was present and remarkably spry for a man almost eighty-five years old. My father and mother were both in attendance at the reunion and they still remember seeing the tall, gaunt figure of David Waltz. They also remember how he hopped over the rows of board seats, remarking that he guessed he could do it if the rest of the young folks could. His mental faculties were unimpaired and physically he was still in sound health. Truly a remarkable character! He told the large audience that if any one could make a better speech than he did "to drive them up to the platform;" this of course after he had recounted some of the incidents of pioneer life. The crowd was estimated at one thousand.

The twelfth annual reunion was also held at Arcadia. The date was August 21, 1890 and the place the fair grounds. Good music, both vocal and instrumental, was a special feature at this reunion, just as it had been in 1886. A brass band of twenty pieces, composed largely of members of the Waltz family, entertained those present with choice selections. Jonathan Knause, a son-in-law of Daniel Waltz Jr., looked after the arrangements for both of the reunions held at Arcadia.

Daniel Waltz and Hannah Kimmel had eight children, two daughters and six sons. Named in order of birth they were:- Joseph, born 1813 in Pennsylvania, died 1884 at Arcadia; Daniel Jr., born 1815 in Pennsylvania, died 1895 at Arcadia; Sarah, born 1816 in Pennsylvania, died 1888 at Atlanta, Indiana; George, born about 1818, died about 1835; William, born 1821 died 1902 near East Germantown, Indiana; Henry, born 1826 in Wayne county, Indiana, died 1900 near Arcadia; Andrew J., born 1829 in Wayne county, died 1902 at Indianapolis; and Rebecca, born 1832 in Wayne county died 1913 at Atlanta, Indiana.

Joseph Waltz settled one mile north of Arcadia in 1837; about 1873 he moved to the Mt. Pleasant neighborhood one and a half miles southeast of Arcadia. The oldest living descendants of Joseph Waltz by his first wife are Mrs. Sarah A. Trietsch, age eighty-six, and Mrs. Judith Lorenz, age eighty; by his second wife, Peter A. Waltz, age seventy-one. All three live in Arcadia. The youngest descendants by his first wife are Helen Jean and Hilda Jane Henderson, September 5, 1926, the twin daughters of Mrs. John E. Henderson of Atlanta. They are granddaughters of Mrs. Samuel Dickover, great granddaughters of Mrs. Magdalene Essig, and great great granddaughters of Joseph Waltz. By his second wife the youngest is Marilyn Louise Sumner, August 18, 1926, the daughter of Mrs. Claude L. Sumner of Indianapolis, the granddaughter of Mrs. Charles J. Richman and the great granddaughter of Joseph Waltz.

The Rev. Henry J. Lorens of Solomon, Kansas and his son-in-law, the Rev. Ward Applegate of Centerville, Indiana belong to this branch of the family. Likewise the Henry Trietsch sons, who are musicians of national reputation.

Daniel Waltz Jr. lived two miles east of Arcadia. The oldest of his living descendants are Mrs. Frances Forbes, eighty-four; Mrs. Sarah Resener, eighty; and Miss Rebecca Waltz, seventy-eight; all living in Indianapolis. Eli Stalker of Westfield, Indiana, the husband of Catherine E. Knause, is eighty-three years old. His wife is a daughter of Mrs. Mathilda Knause and a granddaughter of Daniel Waltz Jr. The youngest descendant is Robert Smith Jr., July 26, 1926, son of Robert Smith of Indianapolis, grandson of William Orestes Smith, great grandson of Mrs. Catherine Smith; and great great grandson of Daniel Waltz Jr. Others belonging to this branch through Mrs. Mathilda Knause are Rev. Orlando E. Tomes of Gary, Indiana; Mrs. Roger Merrill Barbour of Glen Ellyn, Illinois; Dr. Elizabeth Gillespie of Cincinnati, Ohio; Dr. Dorothy D. Teal of Los Angeles, California; and Mrs. George S. Hill of Paris, France. Rev. Tomes married Mrs. Knause's daughter, Edna Idonia. Mrs. Barbour and Dr. Gillespie are daughters of Mrs. Ernest H. Bierman of Bloomington, Indiana and granddaughters of Mrs. Knause. Mrs. Barbour is a June 1922 graduate from the Johns Hopkins hospital at Baltimore, Maryland, a training school for nurses. Dr. Teal is a daughter of Mrs. Mary E. Teal and Mrs. Hill is a daughter of Mrs. Charles T. Knipp of Urbana, Illinois; both are granddaughters of Mrs. Knause. Ralph H. Waltz, a lawyer, living at Arcadia is a son of Peter D. Waltz, the Arcadia banker, and a grandson of Daniel Waltz Jr.

Sarah Waltz, who married Jacob W. Whisler, lived one mile south of Atlanta. Mrs. Frances Whisler, age eighty-one, is the oldest member of this branch. She was the wife of Joseph Whisler and now lives with her daughter, Mrs. John Tucker, at Mineral Ridge, Ohio. Mrs. James Baden of Atlanta, a granddaughter of Mrs. Sarah Whisler, has three great grand children, viz:- James H. and Joe Logan Lilly, sons of Mrs. James H. Lilly of Elwood, Indiana and grandsons of Mrs. Edgar E. Bendler; and Ellen Kathryn Purtee, daughter of Mrs. James Purtee of Indianapolis, and granddaughter of Samuel O. Baden. These three children are the only Daniel Waltz-Hannah Kimmel descendants in the tenth generation from Frederick Reinhart Waltz. The youngest in the Whisler branch is Mary Elizabeth Whisler, daughter of Everett Whisler of Atlanta, granddaughter of Jacob Whisler Jr. and great granddaughter of Mrs. Sarah Whisler.

George Waltz died when about seventeen years old.

William Waltz left no posterity. For some twenty years he lived just north of the Whetstone farm on the Atlanta-Arcadia pike. About 1870 or a little later "he went back to Wayne" to live on the old Waltz homestead and take care of the farming and the coffin-making business established by his father. He was a very interesting talker and a lovable character.

Henry Waltz settled two and a fourth miles northwest of Arcadia on the farm where his daughter Mrs. Mathilda McMullen now resides. His oldest living descendant is Mrs. Sarah Catherine Brenner, age seventy-five of Atlanta; the youngest is Dorothy Ann Yates, July 15, 1924, daughter of Mrs. Kenneth Ernest Yates of Indianapolis, granddaughter of Mrs. J. A. McKee, and great granddaughter of Henry Waltz. Rev. William Waltz of Richardson, Washington and his son, Dr. Manford R. Waltz of Seattle belong to this branch. Eli Stalker's first wife was a sister of Rev. Waltz and a daughter of Henry Waltz.



Andrew J. Waltz lived in the northwest edge of Arcadia. Franklin Byron Waltz, age sixty-four, the town marshal of Arcadia, is his oldest living descendant; the youngest is Richard Owen Brinkman, February 8, 1926, son of Mrs. Raymond John Brinkman of Indianapolis, grandson of Andrew Elbridge Waltz, and great grandson of Andrew J. Waltz.

Rebecca Waltz, the baby of the Daniel Waltz-Hannah Kimmel family, married Samuel J. Hill and lived on a knoll just a half mile east of the traction station at Atlanta. She is the only one of her generation that I ever knew; needless to say she made a very deep impression on my mind. Of a jovial, loquacious disposition, with a really beautiful face and figure, I can see her yet, as she sat at the dinner table telling of "ye olden dayes." Engine was en-jine; her direct discourse accounts were invariably prefaced by the words, "He said, says he" or "She said, says she, and "Now, this is the way it was told to me." "As long as she had a board to lay 'em on," folks were always welcome at her home. Although she had no children of her own, she took in two homeless children and reared them to manhood and womanhood. They were Lew Orr, who now lives in Wayne county, and Ettie Bolton, who has gone on to a better world.

Now a few words in regard to the contents of this little sheaf of leaves and I am through. The work is divided into four parts: (1) A complete genealogy of the Daniel Waltz-Hannah Kimmel family in outline classification; (2) The War Roster of this family; (3) An abridged genealogy of the entire Waltz family in America; and (4) the soldier record of the entire family from 1775 to 1865.

Part one has a note of explanation at the beginning treating the abbreviations and terms used throughout the Daniel Waltz-Hannah Kimmel genealogy. To read the full meaning into the data set down concerning a given person requires a little study. We will take the case of Joseph Waltz, for our first example. He was in the fifth generation in America; the eldest son of Daniel Waltz and Hannah Kimmel; a grandson of Frederick Waltz and Mary Seltzer; a great grandson of John Reinhart Waltz; and a great great grandson of Frederick Reinhart Waltz. The star (\*) shows that he is deceased; the absence of the equal sign (=) shows that he took part in no war. He was born in Berks county, Pennsylvania on December 19, 1813; by occupation a farmer and a carpenter; he came West in 1820; settled in Wayne county, Indiana in 1826; settled in Hamilton county, Indiana in 1837; and died near Arcadia, Indiana on October 13, 1884 at the age of seventy-one years. He was first married to Elizabeth Leonard in Wayne county in 1832 and later to Margaret Anna Bardonner at Cicero, Indiana on September 19, 1852. He had sixteen children, seven by his first wife and nine by his second wife; his descendants now number almost five hundred.

For our second example we will take the case of Sarah A. Waltz, the oldest living descendant of Joseph Waltz and oldest of the entire Waltz-Kimmel family. Referring to the record we see that she is in the sixth generation; the third child of Joseph Waltz; born near Arcadia on August 11, 1840; her present address is Arcadia, Indiana; she married Jacob Trietsch at Arcadia in 1859, therefore her name is now Mrs. Sarah A. Trietsch; she had eleven children, five of whom are living; she now has about one hundred descendants.

Part two, the War Roster, lists the war veterans in the Waltz-Kimmel family. This record includes those who have married into the family as well as the lineal

descendants. It gives a brief military account of each. The only Civil War veteran in the family was Henry Essig, husband of Magdalene Waltz, and son-in-law of Joseph Waltz. The following are veterans of the World War;-Clarence Baden, Roger Merrill Barbour, Walter L. Bardcner, Raymond J. Brinkman, William J. Buckley, Thomas Chamberlain, Clarence F. Doversberger, Elmer C. Doversberger, George L. Fischvogt, Raymond F. Forbes Wilmer Hill Thomas H. Jones, James Harry Lilly, Harry Lorenz, Stevens T. Forvell, Harry Waltz Resener, Robert Lee Resener, Luther Anton Richman, Claude Leslie Sumner, Donald C. Teal, Jonathan E. Teal, Paul Hamilton Teal, Edgar Walker, Harry Lee Taltz, Harry Peter Taltz, John Lewis Waltz, Manford R. Waltz, Ralph H. Waltz, Walter Monroe Waltz, Welcome F. Taltz and Ivan G. Whisler.

Part three and part four were gleaned from the Waltz Family History and Genealogical Record published by Colonel Lee Waltz of Alexandersville, Ohio about forty-two years ago. The older members of the family who still have copies of that slender volume should prize it highly and hand it down to the succeeding generations as a precious heirloom.

My only desire in sending out this little manuscript is that it may help to rekindle the old-time enthusiasm for family ties, that it may encourage the Daniel Waltz-Hannah Kimmel family to hold a reunion, and that it may lead the way for the many other branches of the great Waltz family in America to bring their records up to date. Our fathers were honest. God-fearing tillers of the soil, who were willing to live and die for the Christian ideals. We have reason to be proud of them. But what about us, their posterity? Are we following in their footsteps? Are we fulfilling our duties toward God and our fellowman? It took eight months to gather the material contained herein; sometimes information crept in at a snail's pace and the outlook was not so rosy. Then, for consolation I would call to my mind Aunt Becky Hill; she knew "the whole kit of 'em." The benignant and serene face and the many charming traits, which endeared her to the entire Waltz-Kimmel family, assured me that her people were not really indifferent to the sacredness of family ties.

## THE WAR ROSTER

### Civil War 1861-1865

HENRY ESSIG (deceased) of Arcadia, Indiana had a long Civil War record. On August 30, 1862 he enlisted in Company B., 39th Indiana volunteer infantry. He was nineteen years old. This was later reorganized and called the Eighth cavalry. His first battle was at Lawrenceburg; at the battle of Stone River, Tennessee he was taken prisoner and confined in the infamous Libby prison. Being released after several months' confinement in an exchange of prisoners, he rejoined his regiment and took part in the battles of Tellahoma, Winchester, Chickamauga, Missionary Ridge and Atlanta, Georgia. From there he followed Sherman on his famous march to the sea. He was in Lexington when news was received April 14, 1865 of Lee's surrender to Grant. A short time later he was discharged at Greensburg, North Carolina; from here he made his way back to Arcadia after almost three years of service in the army.

### The World War 1914-1918

CLARENCE BADEN of Indianapolis, Indiana

ROGER MERRILL BARBOUR of Glen Ellyn, Illinois enlisted in Battery F, first Indiana field artillery on April 1, 1917. He was mustered into active federal service in the 150th field artillery, 42nd Division on August 5th at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indiana. The Rainbow Division, as the 42nd was called, was the pride of Indiana. After training at Fort Ben, Mr. Barbour went to Camp Mills, Long Island and then across the seas to Camp de Coetquidan, France. He was at the front in Bacarat-Luneville defensive sector during February, March and April, 1918. From May to September he was a machine gun instructor. On December 15, 1918 he graduated from the Saumur artillery school and in April, 1919 he was commissioned a second lieutenant. From December '18 to April '19 he was with the army of occupation at Neuenahr, Germany. He was overseas eighteen months. On May 9, 1919 he was discharged at Camp Zachary Taylor, Kentucky.

WALTER L. BARDONNER of Columbia City, Indiana was in the draft of April 2, 1918. He was twenty-three years old. First he trained in the coast artillery, 15th Company, at Fort Hamilton, New York. On June 20th he was transferred to the 10th Company, where the overseas equipment was issued. From July 4th to the 28th he was in the overseas casals, and July 13th he sailed on the Northern Pacific from Camp Merritt, New York and landed at Brest, France on July 22nd. Then he was transferred to Battery B. 54th casals center at Housemo, France on July 28th and remained until August 10th. Here he received the last training before going to the front. Joining Battery F. 44th artillery, C. A. C., he went to the front as ammunition truck driver. He was credited with three battles and was near Metz when the armistice was signed on November 11th. On February 2, 1919 he arrived at New York and was stationed at Ft. Tolton, New York; from there he was sent to Camp Sherman, Ohio, where he was discharged from the 7th Company, 2nd training Battalion, 158 D. D., on March 24, 1919.

RAYMOND J. BRINKMAN of Indianapolis, Indiana

WILLIAM J. BUCKLEY, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

THOMAS CHAMBERLAIN of Indianapolis, Indiana enlisted in the navy on December 1, 1917, at Aurora, Illinois, age 23 years. He trained at the Great Lakes naval training station. After making nine trips to France on transport service he was honorably discharged at Great Lakes on October 22, 1919. His period of service was almost two years.

CLARENCE F. DOVERSBERGER of Tipton, Indiana enlisted on August 30, 1918 at Tipton at the age of 23 years. He spent more than nine months in the Base Hospital Medical Corps at Camp Sherman, Ohio and was discharged from this camp on June 8, 1919.

ELMER C. DOVERSBERGER of Tipton, Indiana enlisted at Indianapolis on December 3, 1917, age eighteen years. He had six months' training at the Great Lakes naval training school, and three months training as seaman gunner. On September 12, 1918 he was transferred to New York and soon after to a naval base at Inverness, Scotland. Finally he was sent aboard the United States steamship, Patuxent, and served with the North Sea mine force planting mines and later clearing mine fields. This mine force operated between Scotland and Norway around the Orkney and Shetland Islands with an occasional trip along the coast as far south as New Castle, England. Mr. Doversberger qualified as a first class seaman and as a gun pointer in the U. S. Navy armed guards. He was discharged at the Portsmouth navy yard on December 15, 1919 after a service of more than two years.

GEORGE L. FISCHVOGT of Tipton, Indiana entered the service at Tipton on August 30, 1918 at the age of twenty-eight years. He was assigned to the 160th Depot Brigade, 46th Company at Camp Custer, Battle Creek, Michigan. On September, 14th he was transferred to the 253rd Field Hospital Co., 14th Division. From October 9th to the 27th he was in the hospital with the influenza. On December 10th he was made a first class private and honorably discharged on January 22, 1919.

RAYMOND F. FORBES of Indianapolis enlisted as a private in the students' army training corps at Purdue University, West Lafayette, Indiana on October 9, 1918 and was honorably discharged on December 19, 1918. He was nineteen years old.

WILMER HILL of Muncie, Indiana served in the World War as a private in the United States infantry. He was overseas.

THOMAS H. JONES of Indianapolis enlisted in the United States army on March 17, 1913, as a civilian in the quartermaster corps, being an inspector of meat food products. In July 1917 he was commissioned a second lieutenant and assigned as an assistant to the quartermaster in the 5th Corps Area; in October he was promoted to first lieutenant. In December he was transferred to Camp Dodge at Des Moines, Iowa with the 4th Division and promoted to captain of the regular army. He was retired for a disability incurred in the service on July 1, 1920.

JAMES HARRY LILLY of Elwood, Indiana enlisted at Indianapolis on December 11, 1917, age 26 years. He was made sergeant; went overseas on March 13, 1918 with the aviation; returned to America June 5, 1919; and was mustered out at Camp Sherman, Ohio on June 24th after a service of eighteen months and thirteen days.

HARRY LORENZ of Oil Hill, Kansas.

STEVENS T. NORVELL of Western Springs, Illinois enlisted on May 15, 1917 and was sworn in at Columbus, Ohio on June 4th. He was assigned to the Sixth U. S. Engineers of the third division; trained at the American University, Washington D. C.; at Belvoir, Virginia; at Camp Humphrey and Washington Barracks, Washington D. C. He qualified as a sharp shooter in August and sailed for France on Nov. 4th, 1917 in the U. S. Steam ship, Martha Washington; landed the day before Thanksgiving at St. Megaire. He was assigned to the British Forces and entered the zone of action, Jan. 4, 1918; fought in the defense of Amiens from March 21st to April 3rd, officially known as the Somme Defensive. He rejoined the American forces in June; fought in the battle of Chateau Thiery, officially known as the Marne Defensive, Without rest he went forward immediately on the Aisne-Marne Drive, where he remained until August 11th. On that date he was sent to the hospital on account of mustard gas in the digestive organs; spent nine months in the hospital and convalescent camps. Most of this time he was in the base hospital 24 and convalescent camp 5, both of which were in the city of Limoges, France. In April 1919 he returned to the U. S. on the battle cruiser, U. S. Steam Ship Seattle, after 18 months in France; landed in America on Easter Sunday and was discharged one week later at Camp Merritt.

Harry Waltz Resener of Indianapolis enlisted as a private on April 29, 1918; age 31 years. He was in training at Camp Upton, Long Island, New York and sailed Overseas July 6th. He served with the American Expeditionary forces in France with Company H, 52nd infantry and received a victory medal for taking part in the Meuse-Argonne offensive, November 3-11-1918. On June 12, 1919 he arrived back in America.

ROBERT LEE RESENER of Kokomo, Indiana enlisted as a private on June 22, 1918, age twenty-eight years. He went into training at Camp Sherman, Chillicothe, Ohio with Company C., 333rd infantry, section B-13. On August 31st he sailed overseas. He qualified as a marksman and was in the front line trenches at Verdun from October 16th to November 6th, 1918. On April 28, 1919 he arrived in the United States.

LUTHER ANTON RICHMAN of Cedar Falls, Iowa applied for entrance into the Ft. Benjamin Harrison training camp on April 19, 1917, at the age of twenty-one years. He was ordered to camp on May 13th and placed in Infantry Company No. 6. On August 4th he was transferred to the aviation ground school at Columbus, Ohio. He was sworn into the army as a first-class private flying cadet on August 14th; he graduated from the ground school on September 21st; the following day he was ordered abroad. He sailed from Montreal; Canada on October 10th and was stationed at Issoudun, France, 3rd aviation instruction center, until February 1918. Later on he took flying training at Foggia, near Naples, in Italy, 8th aviation instruction center. On June 1st he returned to Tours, France; on June 11th he was commissioned a first lieutenant in the air service. A few weeks later Mr. Richman fell from the sky in his air-plane; on July 20th he entered a hospital. He landed at Norfolk, Virginia on Thanksgiving day, November 27th, and was mustered out from the United States hospital at West Baden, Indiana on April 24th, 1919, having served almost two years.



CLAUDE LESLIE SUMNER OF Indianapolis enlisted in the army June 5, 1917 and went into active service sixty days later. He was twenty-one years old when he enlisted. With the exception of the first two weeks he spent his entire army life as a member of the 139th Field Artillery Band. His division trained at Camp Shelby, Hattiesburg, Mississippi. On October 5, 1918 he sailed from New York, spending eleven days on board the ship "Cedric," an English liner. Before landing in France he spent five days in England. He was headed for the front line trenches when the Armistice was signed on the 11th of November. On December 15th Mr. Summer sailed from Brest, France on the "George Washington"; landed in New York Harbor two days before Christmas and was dismissed from the army at Ft. Harrison, Indiana on January 16, 1919, after a service of more than nineteen months.

DONALD TEAL of Peru, Indiana was in Perdue University and belonged to the students' army training corps for a short time.

JONATHAN E. TEAL of Richmond, Virginia was commissioned Captain of Engineers, U. S. A., in 1917 and served for about six months stationed at Washington and Camp Humphries. As he was in the employment of the Baltimore & Ohio railroad when he enlisted, the government sent him back to this work.

PAUL H. TEAL of Morehouse, Missouri entered the field artillery officers' training camp at Camp Zachary Taylor, Kentucky on August 29, 1918. He was discharged, after nearly three months training, on November 27th. He was preparing for a commission as second lieutenant.

EDGAR WALKER of Indianapolis, Indiana.

HARRY LEE WALTZ of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania enlisted in the 2nd division field artillery, November 1917 and remained in the organization until July 1918, when he was transferred to the United States naval reserve force. He was a yeoman 3rd class, until promoted on board ship to yeoman 2nd class. At enlistment he was twenty-seven years old. During September he was called to active duty and reported at the Great Lakes naval training station, Great Lakes, Illinois. In February 1919 he was transferred to Bay Ridge, Brooklyn, New York and then to the U. S. Steamship, Cape May, a transport ship making trips between New York City and Bordeaux, France. His first trip to Bordeaux was in March and April, his second in May and June; each return voyage brought American troops from overseas to New York. He took a third trip to Pauliac, France and returned to Charleston, South Carolina. During the last trip westbound the Cape May was badly damaged by a storm and boiler trouble, but after three days at Ponta del Gada, Island of St. Michael, Azores, she continued on her trip and reached Charleston, July 5, 1919. From Charleston the ship was sent to Norfolk for repairs and later in August was put out of commission. Mr. Waltz was released from the active service at the Hunt armory, Pittsburg, (East Liberty) Pennsylvania in August 1919 and in 1922 received an honorable discharge from the United States naval reserve force.

HARRY P. WALTZ of Arcadia, Indiana was inducted into the service on October 4, 1917 at Noblesville, Indiana, age twenty-three years. At Camp Taylor, Louisville, Kentucky he served as band corporal in headquarters Company 325 field artillery. On September 9, 1918 he left the United States and went to France. Here he was in training around Bordeaux. The armistice was signed before he was ordered to the front. On February 15, 1919 he arrived back in the states and was mustered out at Camp Sherman on March 1st after a service of almost a year and a half.

JOHN LEWIS WALTZ of Noblesville, Indiana enlisted June 5, 1918 at Noblesville as a private in the soldiers army training corps, Company D, stationed at the Indianapolis State Fair Grounds. He instructed in the motor training school for eight weeks and was transferred to Headquarters Company on July 15th. Besides instructing in truck driving he played in the band. On December 20, 1918 he was discharged at Indianapolis.

MANFORD R. WALTZ, M. D., of Seattle, Washington was refused admittance to the army or navy because of disability. However he was inducted into the Medical Reserve Corps in class D under special orders from Washington and was in interim in the Cook County hospital at Chicago during 1918 and 1919.

RALPH H. WALTZ of Arcadia, Indiana enlisted at the first officer's training camp at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indiana in May 1917. He was discharged on account of second degree flat feet. On July 14, 1918 he again volunteered and was inducted into service by the local board at Noblesville, Indiana. He was sent to the field artillery officers' school, Camp Taylor, Kentucky and assigned to the 6th observation battery. Later he was transferred to the 32nd training battery and on November 30, 1918 was discharged.

WALTER M. WALTZ of Hartford City, Indiana was inducted into the army on August 30, 1918 at Arcadia, Indiana, age 32 years. He served in Company H., 77th infantry, at Camp Custer, Battle Creek, Michigan and was discharged there on January 30, 1919 after serving five months.

CAPTAIN WELCOME P. WALTZ, infantry United States army, of Manhattan, Kansas was 1st lieutenant of the infantry reserves on May 1, 1917 while at Mitchell, South Dakota. On May 14th he was ordered to active duty in connection with the first officers' training camp at Fort Snelling, Minneapolis, Minnesota. He was one of the two selected from the officers' camp to report to Governor's Island by June 10th preparatory to going across with the first American expeditionary forces. He was assigned to the 26th infantry in New York with the first battalion, which was under the command of Theodore Roosevelt, Junior, while in France. On January 1, 1918 he was assigned to the 3rd battalion, 1st division and on November 4th to the 1st battalion. On March 8, 1919 he was promoted to captain of the United States infantry reserves. From March to June he attended the American expeditionary forces university at Beaux, France. To summarize: Capt. Waltz left the United States for France on July 12, 1917 with the 1st expedition and left France for America on July 19, 1919 after two years of foreign service. He was in the following major offensive battles:- Montdidier-Noyon, Aisne-Marne, St. Mihiel, Meuse-Argonne. He was also in the defensive sector. On December 5, 1919 he was mustered out of the service at Presidio near San Francisco, California. On July 1, 1920 he was re-commissioned a captain of the infantry in the regular service and at present he is stationed at Kansas State Agricultural College as assistant professor of military science.

IVAN G. WHISLER of Cicero, Indiana enlisted in the navy on June 1, 1918 and went to the Great Lakes training station. On June 4th he was transferred to the United States steamship Frederick. He served about nine months.



A GENERAL GENEALOGY

Waltzes were found in 23 states, 153 counties and 238 post office localities. 831 lived in Ohio, 808 in Indiana, 155 in Iowa, 103 in Michigan, 100 in Illinois, 80 in Nebraska, 47 in Maryland, 40 in Pennsylvania, 32 in Missouri, 30 in Kansas, 22 in Minnesota, 17 in Texas, 16 in Tennessee, 16 in Oregon, 13 in North Dakota, 11 in West Virginia, 10 in Oklahoma, 10 in Washington, 9 in California, 9 in Germany, 6 in Wisconsin, 5 in Kentucky and 1 in New York.

Of the 808 in Indiana 151 lived in Hamilton County, 114 in Wayne, 73 in Brown, 64 in Huntington, 58 in Crawford, 51 in Henry, 46 in Johnson, 35 in Fulton, 29 in Floyd, 20 in Madison, 19 in Randolph, 19 in Marshall, 15 in Marion, 15 in Blackford, 12 in Jay, 12 in Bartholomew, 11 in Adams, 10 in Cass, 10 in Pike, 8 in Franklin, 7 in Miami, 5 in Kosciusko, 5 in Allen, 4 in Washington, 4 in Putnam, 3 in Tipton, 2 in Jackson, 2 in Owen, 2 in Stueben, 1 in Howard and 1 in Wells.

Of the six divisions in the Waltz genealogy the first five comprise the names of those who can trace their lineage back to Frederick Reinhart Waltz. 1123 names are listed in the first division with addresses in 12 states and 55 counties. 762 in the second with addresses in 14 states and 55 counties, 72 in the third with addresses in 2 states and 4 counties, 302 in the fourth with addresses in 9 states and 20 counties and 228 in the fifth with addresses in 3 states and 9 counties. The sixth division names those families which have no record of their early ancestors; 391 names with addresses in 14 states and 34 counties.

In the first division 529 lived in Indiana, 142 in Ohio, 116 in Iowa, 46 in Nebraska, 22 in Minnesota, 15 in Kansas, 15 in Illinois, 10 in Texas, 9 in Oregon, 8 in Missouri, 7 in Tennessee and 4 in Michigan. The descendants of Daniel Waltz and Hannah Kimmel make up the fifth branch of this division.

There are seven branches in the first division. 275 names appear in the first branch, 395 in the second, 68 in the third, 172 in the fourth, 171 in the fifth, 2 in the sixth and 38 in the seventh. In the first branch there are 6 from Hamilton Co., Ind.; in the third 16; in the fifth 124; and in the seventh 5. All the Waltzes in Hamilton Co. belonged to the first division.

In the fifth branch of the first division all the living descendants resided in Indiana; 124 in Hamilton Co., 12 in Marion, 3 in Tipton and 2 in Wayne. It is of interest to note that there were more Waltzes in Hamilton Co., Ind. than in any other county in the United States and that they were all lineal descendants of Frederick Reinhart Waltz through his grandson, Frederick. Other counties in high numerical rank were Montgomery Co., Ohio with 133, Medina Co., Ohio with 116 and Wayne

Co., Ind. with 114; while Hamilton Co. ranks first with 151.

### THE WALTZ FAMILY AS SOLDIERS

A partial list of those who served in wars for the Union from 1775 to 1865.

PETER WALTZ did Revolutionary service from April 1775 to September 1880; engaged in the battle of Lexington, April 18, 1775; at Bunker Hill with Warren and Putnam; fought under the leadership of George Washington. He was an uncle of Daniel Waltz who married Hannah Kimmel.

MICHAEL WALTZ did Revolutionary service from April 1775 to November 1783; a younger brother of Peter Waltz and with him in the war.

DANIEL WALTZ, Brigadier-General, under General Markle; killed in the War of 1812.

MARTIN WALTZ, a private with the Pennsylvania troops, in the War of 1812.

JOHN WALTZ, son of the above-named Peter Waltz, with the Ohio troops in the War of 1812.

LEE C. WALTZ, Greenfork, Ind., enlisted in the 69th regiment Indiana volunteer infantry, August 9, 1862 and served to July 5, 1865; was wounded in three different engagements; in right hand at Thompson's Hills, Mississippi, in left shoulder at Alexandria, Louisiana and in right knee at Ft. Blakely, Alabama.

JOHN BAKER, Anderson, Ind., enlisted in company K, 8th regiment Indiana volunteer infantry, August 20, 1862; discharged June 14, 1865; was at the siege of Vicksburg; was with Sheridan at the battle of Cedar Creek, Virginia; took part in thirteen engagements.

JACOB WALTZ and HENRY, of Botkins, Ohio, both enlisted in company K, 20th regiment, January 18, 1862 and both were honorably discharged March 10, 1865; Jacob was taken prisoner on three occasions, being twice paroled and once exchanged.

JACOB W. ZAENGLEIN, Botkins, Ohio, enlisted under the first call for troops in 1861; served three months as a private. Re-enlisted in company G, 71st regiment, Ohio volunteer infantry, for three years. He received promotions from private to orderly, sergeant, second lieutenant, first lieutenant, and finally to captain.

DANIEL W. ZAENGLEIN, Botkins, Ohio, enlisted in the 106th regiment of the Ohio volunteer infantry and served three years.

JOHN C. ZAENGLEIN, Indianapolis, Indiana, enlisted in the 147th Ohio national guards and served one hundred days.

ANDREW ZAENGLEIN, John C's father, served in an Ohio regiment during the whole of the Mexican War (1846).

JACOB WALTZ, Hagerstown, Indiana, was killed in the siege of Vicksburg.

L. WALTZ of Alexandersville, Ohio enlisted in company H., 35th regiment Indiana volunteer infantry, August 1861; was honorably discharged as Colonel, September 15, 1864, having received six military commissions. Col. Waltz compiled the Waltz record in 1884.

JACOB SOAM enlisted under the first call for troops in 1861; re-enlisted for three years and died in a hospital in Virginia.

HENRY E. WALTZ, Des Moines, Iowa, enlisted under the first call in 1861; re-enlisted in the 1st regiment, Wisconsin cavalry, in September 1861 and served three years; honorably discharged as captain in 1864.

DANIEL WALTZ enlisted in the first regiment Wisconsin cavalry; was discharged as an invalid at St. Louis, Missouri; re-enlisted in the 37th regiment Wisconsin infantry; promoted to orderly sergeant company D; died from wounds at Petersburg, Virginia in 1865; buried at City Point, Va.

BENJAMIN WALTZ enlisted in Company H, 33rd regiment Iowa volunteer infantry; promoted to captain; died at Delta, Keokuk county, Iowa.

JOHN WALTZ, Reedsburg, Wisconsin, enlisted in company F, 23rd regiment Wisconsin volunteer infantry; was in the battle of Arkansas Post; died March 19, 1863 on a hospital boat near Millikens Bend and was buried at Memphis, Tennessee.

LEVI WALTZ, Castlewood, North Dakota, enlisted in company D, 22nd United States regulars; was in the battle of Kenesaw Mountain, Goldsboro and Atlanta; was mustered out of the service in 1867 at Fort Gibson, Oklahoma.

ELIAS WALTZ enlisted with a regiment in the Ohio volunteer infantry; died from disease contracted in the Virginia campaign.

LEANDER J. MCILVAIN, former postmaster of Cleona, Brown county, Indiana, was a private for nearly three years in company H, 82nd regiment of Indiana volunteer infantry.

DANIEL BOGER of Crystal, Michigan enlisted in the 9th Michigan light artillery; in 1862; died at Harper's Ferry, Virginia from wounds received.

AARON BOGER enlisted in the 11th Michigan cavalry in 1863; was honorably discharged in 1865.

REV. WILLIAM COOLY enlisted in the 7th Michigan cavalry in 1863; honorably discharged at the close of the war.

E. G. WALTZ of Lima, Ohio enlisted in the 51st Ohio volunteer infantry; served during the war.

O. S. WALTZ enlisted in company E, 20th regiment Ohio volunteer infantry; died at Shiloh, Tennessee.

THOMAS H. WALTZ of Chapin, Michigan enlisted in company E, 20th Ohio volunteer infantry.

E. L. WALTZ of Jelloway, Ohio enlisted in company F, 142nd Ohio volunteer infantry; served in the Virginia campaign in 1864.

ISAAC L. WALTZ of Lima, Ohio enlisted in the 121st regiment of Ohio volunteer infantry and served during the war.

ROBERT R. PARKER of Belmore, Ohio enlisted in the first Ohio light artillery, battery G, August 1862 and served during the war.

GEORGE PRETZ of West Carrollton, Ohio enlisted in the first Ohio volunteer infantry.

LEWIS WALTZ of VanWert, Ohio enlisted in the 64th regiment of Ohio volunteer infantry; was killed at the battle of Shiloh.

HENRY WALTZ of Payne, Paulding county, Ohio enlisted in the 46th regiment of Ohio volunteer infantry and served during the war.

EMANUEL WALTZ of VanWert, Ohio enlisted in the 88th regiment of Ohio volunteer infantry and served during the war.

JOSIAH WALTZ of VanWert, Ohio enlisted in the 88th regiment, O. V. I., and served during the war.

REV. HENRY C. WALTZ, who died at Greencastle, Indiana about 1880, was a graduate of Depauw. He traveled extensively in Europe, Asia and Africa and visited the Holy Land. He served as a private in company F, 133rd regiment Indiana volunteer infantry during the war.

JOSEPH LAFEVER of Atlanta, Indiana (then called Shielville) enlisted in the 6th regiment of Ohio volunteer infantry and served during the war.

MARTIN WALTZ of Winchester, Indiana enlisted in the 84th regiment of Indiana volunteer infantry and served during the war.

THOMAS BROWNE enlisted in a regiment of Illinois volunteer infantry and served four years.

JAMES DEWINT enlisted in the 69th regiment of Ind. Vol. Inf.

DR. JAMES WALTZ of Greencastle, Indiana graduated from Bellevue Medical College, New York City, and served as a private in the 133rd regiment, Ind. Vol. Inf. during the war.

JOHN KEITHLEY WALTZ of Logansport, Indiana graduated from the Indiana Ashbury University and served as a private in the 133rd regiment Indiana volunteer infantry during the war.

EDWARD D. WALTZ of Franklin county, Indiana served in the 17th light artillery during the Civil War.

JAMES H. WALTZ of Franklin county, Indiana enlisted in the 6th regiment Ohio volunteer infantry in 1861; killed near Beverly, West Virginia, in 1863.
