I know some of the starting points of the history of my county of Gibson, Tennessee:

The first settlement of Gibson County Tennessee was 1824 within one mile - a little to the south west of my home -one mile south of Beach Grove Missionary Baptist church on a bluff about one half mile north of Forked Deer River, 4 miles north west of Trenton, Tennessee and $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of Dyer Tennessee and old Buck Snort Graveyard is about one mile or or a little over north. The first settlement of the county Buck Nort Grave Yard or old Providence Grave Yard is 3 or 4 hundred yards or four blocks north of Beech Grove Missionary Baptist church.

The first spot or site where the county seat of Gibson was no more the old log house or home of Mr. Luke Biggs, the first recognized settler in the county of Gibson, Tennessee. they held the first court in Mr. Luke Biggs's home and there was a log jail built in Mr. Bigg's yard - there was only a few houses there only making just a village or station for 10 or 12 years until it was decided to carry the little county seat four miles further south east in order to put the county seat nearer the center of the county.

My great uncle Jack Webber bought $100\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land from Mr. Luke Biggs in 1858. The tract of land in the section of his farm - Mr. Biggs owned lots of land those days, great uncle Jack Webber's farm was just about one mile southeast of Mr. Luke Bigg's home, the Luke Biggs home or place did not like very much being the location of the county seat of Gibson county Tennessee. There is a book at the Trenton Library

entitled Tennessee Cousins and it has the history of the beginning of Gibson county. I read a bit of it last fall as I was searching for information of my family history, it told quite a bit about the first officers that held offices in the county in its beginning. I may not be quite the person to write a history of the county of Gibson, Tennessee but if I can collect some more information later on about the county, that is if I can get it without walking too much, and I can get more inspired to do so, I will try at least get some more information about the first history of Gibson County.

David Crocket was a great hero of Gibson Co Tennessee. He was born in North Carolina which was only a part of North Carolina that was cut off to make Tennessee. He was born 8-6-1786 - he came on down thorough East Tennessee and through middle Tennessee, he lived there a while and 1822 he came to Gibson county just 10 miles of the Little Luke Biggs Village or station about 10 miles north of Little Luke Biggs station, and erected him a log cabin there about a mile from Rutherford, Tennessee north on a prong of the Obion River and later he went back and got his wife and children and brought them to his new home north of Rutherford, Tennessee and lived there some few years. He lived in a few places in Gibson county I think he lived in Crocket Co Tennessee, some, that county bears his name. He was a member of Congress for 3 years and probably a law maker at Nashville too, as well as his son was also a member of Congress.

I spoke to Mr. Smith in the Trenton Library about writing a history of the county and he said that a good number of leaders of the county are planning to get up a history of Gibson county Tennessee, sometime in the future, quite a company of the leaders who belong to the Historical Society and by that time I could decide to enter into getting up a history of the county or not. It would be a great task to write a history of the county, but it should be done. There are so many noted historical characters in Gibson County, who should be written about for posterity.

5. I will that my daughter Sarah Webber receive \$200 out of the same

7. I will that my son Philip Webber at and from the time of coming to the age of 21 years receive one-third of the money that be raised from the time to the day to Richard W. Webber coming to above mentioned age. The said Philip Webber was born 11-1-1792.

8. I will the land mill and its utinsils jointly and equally between my three sons: JOHN, PHILIP AND RICHARD ~~WE~~ W. WEBBER to them and their heirs forever for them to have possession on the said Richard W Web er coming to the age before mentioned.

9. I will the balance of the profit of the said land and mill if not should be to my four daughters: Mary, Susannah Roberson, Sarah Webber and A nn Webber be equally divided between them.

The balance of my property be sold and money arising to go to the schooling the Children Philip and Richard W. Webber.

Mr. Tom H. Webber states on January 17, 1956 that after a five hour search into the records of Gibson county Tennessee that all he could find was two wills and from two to three deeds and five marriage records, with a gentleman named Geor ge Shillzer near Gibsonville Tenn. Just five miles off Allimo Tenn. We found one will of uncle Sam S G Grear and another of A. M. If I am not mistaken about the A. M. Grear which I finally decided. We found four marriage records. I believe of uncle Sam S Gear and John F or L Louis and 1880 uncle Sam S Grear 11-3-1853 the two marriage record of a F F Louis or a J J Lewis one. and 4 marriage records of James or Jim Webber to Chathren Jackson Feb 27 1869. I forgot to put the marriage date 3rd of F F Louis to Martha Grady Aug 1880 and 5th marriage

looks like Isaac Cate to Abraham Lewis. which seems to an error. Isaac Cate is a man's name and the Absalam or Abraham is Abel Louis unless Abe Lewis married a first time or a second time. - as Abe Lewis or Louis married Aunt Nancy Webber. I suppose he must have bought the 50 acres from a Mr. Williams about 1850 and then sold the same 50 acres to Luke Biggs 1852- There is not any record just when he bought the acres or any date of time just when he boyght the land the there is later years he came into possession of this or another tract of land not specified any time when he bought this 100 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres and he sold the same land to Grand father Ed G Webber he own brother in 1873. Grand father Ed. G Webber bought 52 acres from a B. M. or Bazzel Taylor in 1878- the same land I presumably own this 1956- Chas Morly owned 78 acres of land just south west of grand father Ed G Webber land just south west of grand father Ed G Webber land or farm, and just north of Uncle Jack Webber's 100 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres- he last owned. Charles Morley bought his 74 acres from Williams 1852 and sold the same land to A A Hunt 1858. I got a deed where he sold this 74 acres but we did not find any deed recorded in the registers office of his 74 acres. I may try to locate this deed in a day or so and send to you to be recorded in the book. I would not find any will

or deed where Dick Webber ever owned any land. I looked to see where Jim or Jessie Webber owned any land - however there is a record where Jessie Webber owned land but we failed to find just where it is recorded, but I think I have seen where he has got a record of owning a farm around Davidsons Chappel. We did not have time to search that far. I may go among some of the older settlers that knew Jessie Webber who seemed to know about him and his land and Jim Webber land to old Man Andrew Hicks who is 80 years old. He knew Jim and Jessie Webber in fact he is related to those two Webbers; Jessie and Jim and I have heard him who were these wives - they both have been married twice. I know where Levis Louis owned a farm and I may probably locate where Abe Louis owned a farm and as I seem not to have much good luck trying to find records in the court house I will try my luck among some of the older rangers like Mr Andrew Hicks and I may get more information of my forefathers and marriage records- I have already searched Rutherford Co Tenn and I could not find any deed or will of any nature, and all I ever got was where Seth Ward Webber owned 40 or 50 acres in Rutherford Co Tenn. 1836 and where a woman married- Marrah Webber owned a 50 acres 1836 and 3 or 4 marriage records of a Richard Webber and a Benjamin Webber and Edward Gregwood Webber to M. J. Grear Oct 7 1851- a Benjamin Webber to a Ruth Morly or Mosly the year 1823 (1823) Richard Webber to Deborah _____ and a Benjamin Webber owning a farm 100 acres in the 2 Civil district or Rutherford Co--great great father S W Webber 40

acres or 50 acres farm was located in the 22nd civil dist
of Rutherford Co Tenn -- My father bought 8 acres of land from
from Mandy C Lennie Webb Oct 1899 and they gave him a deed
for the land, he owned the 8 acres held to his 53 acres
farm- he inherited from his father Ed. G Webber and he
bought out his brother and sister's heirs there share in
the farm, it was the farm my grand father Ed. G Webber bought
from Bazzel Taylor 1878 and my father George Washington
Webber bought a 74 acre farm from Tom Vout in 1904 he had
rented it for 4 years before he bought it nor or is
bounded on the east of his home place where he was reared
on his father Ed G Webber owned of the portion of farms of
the Fleming Cunningham tract and the portion of the Bob
Overall tract and it is south of the Bazzel Taylor tract
or farm west of a farm known as the Chas Yates Farm and
bounded on the south by the Henry farm. My
father bought G W Webber bought the Chesly Morly and the A A
farm 1916 from the present owner - his brother in law, Will
Lester at that present time, he sold the farm to me in
fall of 1927. I sold to Grandvill Rogersdale or Ragsdale
1838. My father George Washington Webber bought 8 acres from
Will Bond 1920 - located just northeast of my grandfather
Ed G Webber's old original farm and northwest of the Bazzel
Taylor farm off the east side of his farm which is
situated just north of my grandfather's home farm, my own u
uncle Grant Webber did own 46 acres on west side of my
grand father Ed. G Webber farm from my grand mother's
death January 15, 1908 until 1918 which he sold his little

farm to a Gibson Co land company and moved to Jackson Tenn. where he still lives, and age 90 years last July 29, 1942. 1955 he was born July 29, 1865. Lester Arnold bought the same little farm 1920 back from the Trenton or Gibson Co Tenn Land Co and still owns it or that is my sister May Neil Neil Webber Arnold own it at this present time. Huncel Grant did sell 10 acres back to my father G W Webber on the east side of the farm in the year 1911. Uncle Gran Grant Webber sold 5 acres off of his place 1916. My brother Edward Mortial Webber inherited the Tom Vought farm at my father George Washington Webber's death and sold the place to Duff Ward in some time of summer 1946. I saw Mr. Andrew Hicks this morning and he told me about Abe Lewis, Jim Webber and Jessie Webber and Bud Louis and some of their history, - he said Bud Louis's wife was Sarah Hicks before she married Bud Lewis and that Jim Webber's first wife was Florence Woods and his second wife was Susan Hale and Jessie Webber first wife was Hattie Kate or Kale and his second wife was Betty Bouls---(Bill Tally)

I learned from one or two older citizens of my community that Leow Louis lived at the Bill Tally place from 1851 until his death 1885- it contained about 75 acres- in the 7th civil district $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of Trenton Tenn.

I never could learn just who owned the place before Levir Lewis owned it. I dont suppose uncle Dick Webber ever did own any farm in Gibson & County.

His claim was allowed in York Co Main at Cornish 8-15-1820 John Webber testified age 55 that Joseph Barrington was his recording officer that his family residing ^{with} ~~xxxx~~ him are a wife over 60 and a grand son age 11. 1831 John Webber requested a certificate in D C Aug 4 1831 requested transfer certificate book to New Jersey, and his pension was sent to New Village, P O Warren county New Jersey. March 16, 1855 Sarah Webber ~~H~~ age 77 Trenton, New Jersey but formerly of Hunterdon county N J applied for bounty land- states & she is former widow of Thomas Wiggin, Revolutionary war officer pensioner under act 1- 1818 to whom she was married 12-10-1817 by Alexander Hastings and baptist~~ed~~ minister of Hopewell New Jersey. In 1855 a letter states she is very old and has no children to take care of her.
