ELEAZER WEST AND HIS DESCENDANTS

At this writing, (Dec. 1930) we have not succeeded in ascertaining the parentage of Eleazer West, (b. 1752) nor any information concerning his wife except that her given name was Anna. As yet we have not learned many facts concerning Eleazer West. What we have was obtained from three sources: 1. The 1869 diary of my grandfather, Aaron B. West. 2. An indenture from the records at Goshen dated in 1799, disposing of land owned by Eleazer West, deceased. 3. A letter from W. J. Coulter of Middletown, Orange County, New York informing us that Eleazer West was a Baptist minister.

We are giving all of this information in this booklet hoping that it may furnish a clue to Eleazer West's ancestry. The fact that William West went to Lee or Lennox as a young man after his father's death leads us to suspect that some of the Wests there were relatives. An Ebenezer West lived at Lee at that time, I believe. We later find that at Murray town, Genesee County, N. Y. in 1810, according to the U. S. census, there were living a David West and an Ebenezer West. We may find that these Wests were relatives, as both William and Eleazer went to Murray before 1818. Both David and Ebenezer were under forty-five years of age in 1810.

LETTER FROM W. J. COULTER

The following letter from Mr. Coulter of Middletown, N. Y. gives us some interesting data.

Dear Sir:-

With further reference to my letter of the 26th, I find that the Reverend Eleazer West was a minister of the Baptist faith who preached at a place now called Mt. Hope, eight miles due west of Middletown, in those days it was called Deerpark. Four miles due north of Mt. Hope or Deerpark was a thriving little village called New Vernon where the old school Baptist Church was founded by Elder Ebenezer West, presumably a brother or relative to Rev. Eleazer West.

On Mar. 25th, 1770, Oliver Delancey Esq. of New York City executed a deed or perpetual lease conveying to (50 acres) Messrs. W. Gillet, David Smith and Simeon Marsh lands lying in the town of Deerpark to be held in trust for the use of a Protestant minister. Marsh 2, 1771, David Johnston Esq. of New York City executed a deed for the same purpose and to the same persons, 25 acres lying next to the previous lot. There were two congregations, one Baptist presided over by Rev. Eleazer West, the other was Presbyterian and met at the house of Elijah Reeves. In 1785 the State of New York passed a law allowing churches to incorporate. The Presbyterian faith incorporated and claimed the land and after some little arbitration the Rev. Eleazer West was paid 10 pounds and moved off.

I have looked up the history of the Baptist faith in Orange County and find that the first Baptist faith in Orange County was at Warwick, Orange County, N. Y., where the Rev. Benedict was brought to Warwick from Stratfield, Conn. because there were many Connecticut people at Warwick. This leads me to believe that probably the Rev. Eleazer West came from around Strafield, Conn. because there were Connecticut people at Deerpark or Mt. Hope where he preached. I imagine you will

find that his father's name was Abial or Abiah West of Connecticut or possibly Massachusetts.

THE RECORDS AT GOSHEN, N. Y.

The following Indenture gives our first documentary knowledge of the family of Eleazer West Senior. (Goshen Records.)

"This Indenture made the 11st day of June in the twenty-third year of the independence of the U. S. of America and in the year one thousand seven hundred ninety-nine, between David Johnston of the County of Dutchess Esquire by John Johnston, his attorney of the first part, and Abial West, Anna Harding, wife of Isaac Harding, Dilly West, Sally West, Eleazer West and William West, children and heirs at law of Eleazer West, deceased of the second part, Witnessed that the said David Johnston for and in consideration of the sum of thirty-two pounds and twelve shillings of lawful money of the State of New York to him in hand paid by the said Eleazer West in his lifetime, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, both granted, bargained, and sold, aliened, released and confirmed and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell, alien release and and confirm unto the said Abial West, Anna Harding, Dilly West, Sally West, Eleazer West and William West the heirs at law of Eleazer West deceased in their actual possession and seise hereof now being and to their heirs and assigns forever, all that certain tract or parcel of land situated lying and being in Lot No. 4 in Deerpark beginning at a heap of stones in the line run by the Commissioners at the foot of Shawangwork Mountain it being the west corner of a piece of a piece of land belonging to the heirs of Elijah Reeves deceased and from thence running along said river line south sixty degrees, east 35 chains to a heap of stones on the east side of a swamp thence south 39° west fourteen chains and 39 links to a heap of stones, thence north 60° east thirty-three chains to the aforesaid line at the foot of the mountain, thence along the same northeast as it runs 14 chains and 35

links to the place of beginning containing forty acres according to a survey of the same made by Abel Gale in the year, 1702, together with all and singular the rights, members, and appurtainences thereof and all profits, commodities and advantages, insturments and hereditaments whatsoever to the said premises hereby granted belonging or in any way appertaining: and also the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents and services and services of all and singular the said premises hereby granted and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtainences; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, claim and demand whatsoever, both in law and equity of the said David Johnston of in and to all and singular the said premises hereby granted and of and to every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances TO HAVE AND TO HOLD ALL and singular the said hereditaments and premises hereby granted and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtainances unto the said Abial West, Anna Harding, Dilly West, Sally West, Eleazer West and William West their heirs and assigns forever, and the said David Johnston for himself and his heirs executors and administrators both covenant, promise, grant and agree to and with the parties of the second part their heirs and assigns that he the said David Johnston and his heirs, the said lot piece or parcel of land above the described and hereby granted and conveyed and every part conveyed and every part and parcel thereof with the appurtainances unto the said parties of the second part their heirs and assigns against him the said David Johnston and his heirs and all, and every other person or persons whomsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend. In witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals to the day and year first above written."

An Indenture made Sept. 20, the twenty-fourth year of Independence of the U. S. and 1800 between Danial Albertson and Sarah, his wife, Isaac Harding and Anna, his wife of the town of Minisink, County of Orange and State of N. Y. of the first part and William Wells, of the second part sold land to William Wells.

--(Goshen Records, Dec. 30, 1820)

On the same day, Abraham Harding and Anna, his wife, sold land to William Wells which lay in town of Minisink. It contained the Harding Home.-- (Goshen Records, Dec. 30, 1820).

Eleazer² West, Jr. and brother William went to Murray, Genesee, Co., N. Y. some time prior to 1818. It was in 1818 that William married Sabrina Baker of Pittsfield, Mass. He gave the Murray address at that time. We can find no record of any of the other members of the family moving to Monroe County, or as it was then called, Genesee Co. We surmise that the "1846" placed below the birth date of Abiel indicates the time at which he died.

There is a West genealogy published in Vol. 60

of the New. England His. Gen. Register. None of the above dates are included there. We notice, however, that the name, Eleazer, appears in the 1790 census from Ulster Co., Wallkill Town instead of from Goshen, Orange Co. This is not strange, however, because the places are not very far apart. It is likely that the homestead was in Wallkill and that Eleazer went to Goshen, which was at that time the nearest town, for his mail.

9. WILLIAM² West, son of Eleazer West and wife, Anna, b. Apr. 29, 1792, d. Oct. 13, 1863. He was married February 14, 1818 to Sabrina, daughter of Aaron Baker of Pittsfield, Mass. at New Lebanon, N. Y. by Rev. Silas Churchill. William West gave as the place of his residence at the time of his marriage, Murray, Genesee Co., N. Y. (See list of marriages performed by Rev. Silas Churchill in the Pittsfield Library.) William's father died before he was eight years old. We have not information regarding him until the time of his marriage in 1818. We believe he spent a portion of his youth, however, near Pittsfield, Massachusetts for he married a Pittsfield girl. Before 1818 he went to Murray, Genesee County, as he gave that address at the time of his marriage. The Pittsfield records, Book 70, p. 14 give an Indenture which was a quit claim deed from William West and his wife Sabrina to Levi Belden and covered a parcel of land in Lenox, Mass. Deed dated June 10, 1826, and recorded Sept. 4, 1826. William West was a farmer. The census of 1820 enlists him as head of a family at Clarkson, Genesee Co., N. Y. In 1860 the census enlists him in Whiteford, Monroe County, Michigan at the age of 68. He moved to Michigan about 1827. He lived on a farm in Whiteford. He died Oct. 13, 1863, and was buried in the old Whiteford Cemetery.

He married Dec. 26, 1853, Mary Charlotte Titue, dau. of James Ira Titus and wife, Frederica Webber. About 1865 he moved to a farm three miles west of Sylvania, Ohio. The farm was located in Whiteford, Monroe Co., Michigan. He moved to Sylvania, Ohio about 1869. and became Superintendent of the Sylvania Schools. Mr. West was justice of the Peace for many years. He attended the Congregational Church at Sylvania where for many years he was Superintendent of the Sunday School. He died at his home in Sylvania July 19, 1896. He is buried in the old cemetery, Whiteford, Monroe Co, Mich. Near his tombstone are the tombstones of his father, William West, and his uncle, Eleazer West.
