INTRODUCTION.

Prior to the year 1875, Rev. John Wickliffe Beach set out to compile a genealogy of the Walkley family, and collateral branches. Sickness and eventual death put a stop to the work before it was completed. His manuscripts fell into my hands.

I have indexed the names contained therein and find that they embrace nearly all the Walkleys born in Connecticut between the years 1657 and 1877. Early in the 19th century three went to the West, one to Vermont and one to Alabama. Mr. Beach had not time to trace these.

Since 1877 one generation has been born and another died. I have added many born since that date, and traced some Western and Southern families, but the list is probably still quite incomplete. I have therefore left four blank pages at the end of the book on which additions or corrections may be recorded.

The only historical or biographical matter embraced in this work relates to Richard I, the original emigrant. The reason for making it a genealogical index instead of a genealogy is, that though the original manuscript records considerable information beside the names, it relates largely to my own branch of the family. To print it all would nearly quadruple the cost of the work. It seemed best therefore, to make only a small and inexpensive book in which every purchaser would be interested, in the hope that some younger man with the aid of this nucleus will some day compile a complete genealogy of the descendants of Richard I.

I shall probably be flooded with letters asking more information. In that case, in justice to you and myself I propose this plan. If you wish special information as to your ancestors, ask for it, enclosing a two cent stamp. If I cannot furnish it, I will so inform you without charge. If I can furnish it, I will state the cost of typewriting it, and you can order it or not as you choose. Then every one will get what he pays for and pay for what he gets. The index is useful for two things:

1. You can trace your lineage for 250 years.
2. You can learn your relationship to any one else herein named.

To trace your lineage, look at your father's name and you will see there his father's name, and so on back to the first generation. If your surname is not Walkley, trace back till you reach an ancestor who married a Walkley, then follow back from her father as above.

Relationships other than ancestors are traced by means of the

Arabic numerals placed above the end of each name. These figures give the generation number counted from Richard I, the emigrant. The rule for finding the degree of cousinship between two persons is: First trace them back to their nearest common ancestor. Then, from half the sum of their generation numbers, subtract that of their nearest common ancestor plus one. The difference will show their degree of relationship.

EXAMPLE.

Required, the relationship between David Nelson Beach, D. D., President of Bangor Theological Seminary, and James Wesley Cooper, D. D., Secretary of the American Missionary Association.

Half the sum of their generation numbers is 7, their nearest common ancestor is Richard II, whose generation number is 2; add 1 and we have 3, which, subtracted from 7, leaves 4, so they are fourth cousins.

If the persons tracing belong to different generations, they are cousins as many times removed as the difference found by the above process indicates.

Since family Bibles have gone out of fashion, family records have been sadly neglected. A family possessing this book will confer a favor on posterity by writing a complete record of its own family on the blank pages and passing it down to the next generation.

For convenience in tracing lineages, women who have married Walkleys are indexed under the Walkley name followed by maiden name in parenthesis; all other married women are indexed under their own maiden names.

RICHARD WALKLEY I.

In early Colonial days the spelling of names seems to have been a matter of taste or education. Our name especially was spelled in various ways, the same man sometimes varying it at different periods of his life. The forms most common, both here and in England, were Walkley, Wackley, Wakely and Walkely. These variations confused some early historians, who confounded Richard Walkley with Henry and James Wakelee, two brothers, who with their sister Alice were at Hartford in 1636, and whose names were sometimes spelled Walkeley. The weight of evidence contradicts the supposition that they were in any way related to Richard Walkley. Henry Wakelee, the most prominent of the brothers who was a lawyer, settled in Stratford, Conn., and his descendants spell the name Wakelee. After schools became common, the form Walkley was almost universally adopted by the descendants of Richard, and is used in this work.

It was formerly supposed that all the Walkleys resident in the United States were descended from Richard I, but it is recently learned that in 1830 Enoch Walkley came to Ottawa, Canada, (then Bytown), and has more than seventy-five descendants in Canada and the U. S. These, of course, are not included in this Index. He came from Kings Stanley, Gloucestershire, England.

No record evidence of the birthplace of Richard Walkley the emigrant has yet been found. If the tradition that he came from Edinburgh, Scotland, is correct, he was probably only a temporary resident there, for Edinburgh records show no trace of the name. There is near Sheffield a parish named Walkley where Ruskin established a museum, but no proof that individuals of the name ever lived there has been discovered.* The ancestral home of the name is Gloucestershire, where for at least three centuries many families of the name have lived. The county is traversed from Northeast to Southwest by the Cotswold hills and is famous for dairy and sheep farming.

The Stationer to the Reader

To set forth a booke without an Epistle were like the old English proverbe, a blew coat without a badge, & the Author being dead I thought good to take that piece of work upon mee: To commend it I will not, for that which is good I hope euery man will commend, without entreaty: and I am the bolder because the Author's name is sufficient to vent his worke. Thus leauing euery one to the liberty of judgement: I have ventured to print this Play, and leaue it to the generall censure.

ing. Richard was a farmer and the fact that the baptismal names Richard and Thomas were frequent in Gloucester and were also favorite names among our ancestors in Haddam, leads to the conjecture that the birthplace of Richard was Gloucestershire. This, however, is at best but a "Yankee guess." We now leave conjecture and take up well ascertained facts.

Richard Walkley I first appears in the colonial records of Hartford, May 21, 1657, when with 64 others he was made free before the Court, (equivalent to our phrase made an elector.) The next record shows that Oct. 24, 1668, he bought from Samuel Butler of Wethersfield his "home lot and house in Haddam, and all the land he owned in Haddam." The land now approximately embracing the towns of Haddam, East Haddam and the northern half of Chester was bought from the Indians in 1662 and taken up by twenty-eight persons, of whom Samuel Butler was one. His home lot and house were on the Southeastern slope of what is now called Walkley Hill. This became Richard Walkley's home. He married Rebecca, maiden name and date of marriage unknown, and had three children: Rebecca, Richard II, and another son who probably died young, as he was not mentioned in the settlement of his father's estate, who died in 1681.

The estate of Richard I inventoried 164 pounds and 13 shillings, of which 121 pounds and 12 shillings was real estate. His son, Richard II greatly increased his father's holdings of land, settling his children around and on Walkley Hill, which has remained in possession of his descendants for more than 230 years and is still occupied by some of them in the seventh generation. For nearly a hundred years all the Walkleys remained in Haddam, but are now scattered from Vermont to Texas.

More than fifty years ago, Royal R. Hinman of Hartford procured from England what he believed to be the Walkley Coat of Arms. His conclusion was so generally accepted that some of us have put it on our note heads. It was ascribed in heraldic works to "Wakely of Charing, County Kent." It consisted of a silver shield bearing three crescents on a black fesse, between three blue eagles. As drawn by Mr. Hinman it had for a crest an eagle, with the motto, "Aquila non captat muscas" ("The eagle does not catch flies"). It is not out of place to say that in England orders of nobility are granted exclusively by the Sovereign, and are conferred upon a man "and his heirs forever." The only official record is kept in the College of Arms. Arms can be used only by the oldest son in each generation, and if any generation dies without a son the line becomes extinct. Recent search

in the College of Arms shows that the arms described above are not recorded there, and no one of the name is mentioned in the Herald's visitation of County Kent in the years 1619, 1663, and 1668. Further search proves that this coat of arms was conferred upon William Tassel, of Bury St. Edmunds, County Suffolk, in the year 1561, with a crest: an eagle's head with pine branch in beak, and the motto, "Tout en Fayet." How it came into the possession of the Walkleys can only be explained upon the supposition that it is one of numerous instances of descendants bearing their mother's or grandmother's arms in ignorance of the laws of Heraldry. A coat of arms ascribed to the Wadsworths bears the motto "Aquila non captat muscas," which increases the mystery.* All that is certain is that under the English law no one now living is entitled to that coat of arms.

Although the Walkleys can boast no title of nobility, they have a better inheritance: one of character, not confined by the law of primogeniture. Richard Walkley I was an independent farmer who had acquired what was then considered a fair property. He was a type of the sturdy English yeoman of his age, an age in which Oliver Cromwell was leader. Independent in thought, upright in life, honoring God and fearing no man, he sought civil and religious freedom in New England. The fact that he first chose Mr. Hooker's colony of Hartford as his place of residence classes him as a Puritan rather than a pilgrim. The Puritan spirit passed to his descendants. Whether within or without the church they have a profound respect for sincere religion. In the church the sons have often been deacons and the daughters prone to marry ministers. For the first century they were Congregationalists. Since the adoption of the Constitution in 1818, which made all sects equal in law, their denominations have been various. In Washington's time they were Federalists. When the Whig and Democratic parties became organized, they were mostly Whigs; now they are as diverse in politics as in religion. In civil office they have cared more to do faithful public service than to gain public praise.

Of the learned professions, that of medicine is their favorite one. Some have been clergymen, more lawyers, but Doctors are "as plenty as blackberries." Though few have been famous, all have borne a fair name. Though none have been rich, judged by the present standard of eight digits, some have acquired a competence, often using a fair share in public and private benefactions.

* For instance, if a man named Walkley married a Tassel whose mother was a Wadsworth, and his grandson adopted as his own one grandmother's arms and the other grandmother's motto the Walkley arms would be fully accounted for. Such things have been frequently done, and that is the reason the College of Arms keeps so careful a record of arms which are legitimate.

Wherever you find them you see evidence of family pride, which in its best form begets a wholesome self respect. That this respect is shared by their neighbors, seems proved by happy marriages. They have been allied to descendants of the Wolcotts and Hawkineses, names found as patentees on the charter of Charles II, of the Wadsworths, who saved that charter to the state, of the Parsons, some of whom held in England the rank of Earls and Viscounts, and many other families prominent in the history of this and the Mother Country. It is a well known truth that the mother of a family does more to shape the characters of the children than the father; it is not strange, therefore, that some of those most distinguished bear the names of men who married Walkley girls.

Whatever we may think of those who take personal pride in the deeds of their ancestors, all will admit that to cherish their memories, emulate their virtues, and transmit their names unsmirched to posterity is a noble ambition. To gratify and foster such a spirit has been the prime object of this publication.
