## INTRODUCTION.

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The design of this work is to give the Genealogy of the YALES in America, with the lineage of each, from the first of whom any record or knowledge can be obtained, down to the present time.

In collecting the materials and preparing them for publication, the compiler has spent more than two years in searching the Ancient Records of States, Towns and Counties, and in corresponding with those of the name in various parts of the Country, to many of whom he feels much indebted.

And although he feels conscious of having used every exertion in his power which could be reasonably expected, in order to make the work accurate and interesting, yet he does not claim exemption from those imperfections which are ever attendant on works of this kind.

A degree of diffidence is felt when it is considered who are to be the readers; this volume will come before many, who on some of the Biographical notices and records therein contained, have better means of information and possess more knowledge than the compiler. Although this humiliating statement may not be allowed to its full extent, yet when the imperfections of everything human are considered, it must be admitted to have some foundation in truth. With these remarks he respectfully submits the result of his labors to the scrutiny of his friends and the public, trusting that whatever errors may be discovered, they will be carefully corrected, so that should this work ever be revised by future generations, they may be aided thereby.

The present Generation of Yales having descended, with but few exceptions, from Thomas Yale, of Wallingford, I trust no apology will be needed for devoting a few pages here in giving a list of the original

proprietors or settlers of that ancient town, with a sketch of some of their first proceedings, as all, I trust, will be proud to know that they have descended from such an ancestry, and to learn something of their history.

The following is a list of the first settlers of Wallingford, in the Colony of New Haven, and now State of Connecticut, May, 1670:—

Rev. Samuel Street, Mr. John Moss, John Brocket, Nathaniel Merriman, Abram Dowlittle, Jeremiah Howe, Samuel Andrews, Daniel Sherman, John Hall, Samuel Hall, Samuel Cook, Zacheriah Howe, Nathaniel Howe, Joseph Benham, Samuel Potter, Joseph Ives, Eleazer Peck, Samuel Monson, John Peck, Samuel Brown, John Miles, Nathan Andrews, John Ives, Simon Tuttle, Samuel Miles, John Harriman, John Mix, William Johnson, Daniel Hooper, Benjamin Lewis, Thomas Curtiss, Thomas Yale, Thomas Hall, John Beach, Eliasaph Preston, Jehiel Preston, Eleazar Holt, and Samuel Whitehead. All the above came to Wallingford, in May, 1670, under the direction of the New Haven Committee, as it was called, consisting of the following persons, viz:—Rev. Samuel Street, Abram Dowlittle, Mr. John Moss, and John Brocket.

By the above it appears that the settlement of the town was commenced in May, 1670; it was however agitated as early as 1669, and measures were adopted towards effecting it, but as the undertaking was one of great peril, on account of the Indians, it was deferred until 1670, when a greater number could be found willing to hazard the enterprize. At that time Hartford and New Haven had been settled only about 35 years. The people of New Haven, in their corporate capacity, owned the whole tract from the Sound, at New Haven, North, to the present village of West Meriden. They therefore, as soon as the increase of population would permit, felt disposed to push the settlement further into the interior, upon the unoccupied lands.

On a plan entirely different from that practised at the present day, they did not sell farms to such as chose to purchase, but proceeded in a more orderly way, first calling a meeting of the settlement, and passing a vote to admit them as settlers in the township, conditioned that the applicant sustains a good moral and religious character.

The people of New Haven voted at a public meeting, to set off a certain portion of their territory to constitute a "village," to extend

Southward from the point where the old road to New Haven goeth over Pilgrim's Harbor, ten miles, and to extend five miles, each side of Quinnipiac River. Their next act was the appointment of the above named Committee, whose duty it was to admit settlers and divide the lands among them, on certain stipulated conditions, and to superintend and control the entire settlement, until it had so far proceeded as to render it safe for the Planters to manage for themselves. This Committee then received applications from such as chose to commence a new settlement, selecting those only who in their opinion were best qualified for such a work. The persons thus selected mutually covenanted with each other, and with the said Committee, to observe certain rules and conditions in a written agreement, to which each one affixed his signature; that agreement was called the Plantation Covenant of Wallingford.

After the Committee had selected their men, they then proceeded to select a site for the village, which location is described in the Old Colony Records of New Haven, as being upon the hill, on the east side of the great plain, commonly called the New Haven plain, which cannot now but be recognized as the present location of the now flourishing and beautiful village of Wallingford. The Committee allotted to each planter a few acres of land in the village for a house lot—commencing at the South end of the said hill, running northerly. Having laid out the South part of the village, then next to the house lots, it was ordered that there should be a highway across the hill from East to West, six rods wide, and from thence, on the top of the hill, a long highway six rods wide, running Northerly, which corresponds with the present Main street of said village. On each side of which there were to be ranges of house lots containing six acres to each lot, which were distributed to the planters or actual settlers. This having been done, the planters commenced building their log cabins and houses, and assumed the form of a regular settled community. The committee having arranged all the preliminaries necessary for the new plantation, surrendered their

trust and the title to the whole, into the hands of the planters, who thereby became a body corporate, or in other words, a town. After which, one of their first acts was to set out certain portions of meadow and woodland to each planter at convenient distances from the village. The lands lying on the river were first used, and are described as the lots on the river called New Haven East River, that are laid out as meadow land to several of the inhabitants, beginning at the hill called Blue Hill, where it comes near to the river, to run north or up the river.— At this first allotment only thirty-eight lots were given out to as many individuals, some receiving eight and some twelve acres.

In these various transfers of land from the town of New Haven, and from them through their committee to the planters and ultimately to individual proprietors, no money or consideration was required or paid. The lands then being of little or no value.

That the reader may more fully understand the plan of admitting new settlers, the following vote of the town has been copied from the old records and here inserted.

“ At a meeting of the town of Wallingford held on the 12th day of February, 1671, *Voted*, That Isaac Rice, and Nehemiah Rice shall have lots assigned them, provided they procure sufficient testimony of their good conversation in the place where they have formerly lived.”

On the 13th day of June, 1673, they voted to allow for the first division of lands, to each planter, taking in the house lots, river lots, and all sorts of land, to the lowest rank 40 acres, to the middle rank 60 acres, and to those of the highest rank 80 acres.

At this time the company consisted of about one hundred persons, men, women and children, who, it appears, instead of scattering themselves on farms, as is now the custom in new settlements, erected their dwellings in a compact village. “ This arrangement, though inconvenient for agricultural purposes, was doubtless necessary for defence and safety in those perilous times, when savage wars and the incursions of the Indians were so frequent.”

With the true spirit of New England, they at once secured for themselves religious institutions and public worship; and from the first

(this little band) sustained the preaching of the gospel. For the first two years, Mr. John Harriman, one of their number, preached to them on the Sabbath, though not an ordained minister.

In 1672, Rev. Samuel Street, a regular ordained minister, and son of the Rev. Nicholas Street of New Haven, was called to settle with them in the work of the ministry, and soon afterward entered upon the duties of his office, and continued with them until his death.

In all these proceedings, Thomas Yale bore an active part.

On the 15th day of the 2d month, 1675, Mr. Moss, Mr. Samuel Street, Mr. Brocket, Thomas Yale, Lieut Merriman, Sargent Dowlittle, John Beach, Nehemiah Royce, Benj. Lewis, Eliasaph Preston, John Hall, Sen'r, John Hall, Jr., and Nathan Andrews, agreed to form a church at Wallingford—having been so directed by the town, in regular meeting.

Thomas Yale, John Merriman, and Thomas Hall were chosen a committee to sell Indian lands, &c. &c., in the town.

Thomas Yale, Samuel Hall, Thomas Curtiss, John Parker, John Hall, Sen'r, John Merriman and John Hall, were appointed a committee to confer with the Rev. Samuel Whittlesey, and request him to settle with them in the work of the ministry. Mr. Whittlesey accepted the call, and continued with them over forty years, as their pastor.



THE ANCESTRY  
OF  
ANN, WIFE OF DAVID YALE, Esq.

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EDMUND BONNER, Bishop of London, was the son of a man of indigent circumstances. Born at Harley in Worcestershire, and charitably educated at the expense of the family of Lechmere.

He entered, 1512, at Broad Gate Hall, now Pembroke College, and by his learning and assiduity, recommended himself to the notice of the Wolsey family, whose influence procured him several ecclesiastical preferments, and great favor at court. He was made chaplain to the king, (Henry VIII.) and gained his heart by promoting his divorce from Catherine of Arragon, to whom the king was married, A. D. 1501. He was sent to Rome to plead the king's cause before Clement VII., but he spoke with such vehemence and indignation against the tyranny of the holy see, that the pope threatened to throw him into a chaldron of melted lead, and he escaped from the vengeance of the Pontiff only by flight.

Bishop Bonner's abilities as a negociator were great, and his manners insinuating; therefore he was Ambassador severally to the courts of Denmark, France and Germany. In 1538 he was nominated to the see of Hereford, by the recommendation of his great friend and patron, Lord Cromwell, who had now succeeded to the honors of Thomas Wolsey, (or the Wolsey family.) And before his consecration he was promoted to London. He had formerly opposed the pope's prerogatives only to rise in Henry's favor, but after his death, he convinced the public that he was firmly devoted to the Catholic faith, and therefore withstood the measures that were adopted by Edward VI., to spread the reformation; and for his obstinacy he was deprived of his bishopric, and committed to the Marshalsea. This persecution endeared him more in the eyes of Mary, and her papish ministers. She no sooner ascended the throne, than Bonner was restored to his honors, and made president of the convocation, instead of Cranmer, now disgraced. He not only dismissed and excommunicated several of the clergy, but committed some hundreds to the flames for not renouncing the doctrines of the reformation. On the death of Mary, in 1558, he paid his respects to the new queen; but Elizabeth turned away from him, stained as he was with

the blood of suffering innocence. The bigoted ecclesiastic, soon after, when summoned before the council, refused to take the oath of allegiance and was again deprived of his bishopric and imprisoned.

He died about the 10th year of his confinement, 5th of September, A. D. 1569. And as he was excommunicated, his body was buried privately at midnight, in St. Gregory's church yard, Southwick.

THOMAS MORTON, who married a daughter of Bishop Bonner, was also an English bishop, born at York, 1564, and educated at St. John's College, Cambridge, where he was chosen Fellow, 1592. He was in the service of lords Huntingdon and Sheffield, and in 1603 went as chaplain to Lord Eure, ambassador to the Emperor of Germany, and the king of Denmark. In 1606 he was made chaplain to king James; the next year, dean of Gloucester; in 1609, dean of Winchester. In 1615 he was made bishop of Chester; in 1618 translated to Litchfield and Coventry, and in 1632 to Durham. During the civil wars, though esteemed for benevolence, piety and moderation, he was exposed to much trouble from the parliament and the Republican forces, and after suffering imprisonment and persecution, he at last was permitted to retire to the house of his friend, Sir

Henry Payton, in Northamptonshire, where he died on the 22d day of September, A. D. 1659, aged 95 years.

DAVID YALE, Esq., a descendant of an ancient and wealthy family of that name in Wales, married in 1613, Ann Morton, daughter of Bishop Morton. <sup>LOND</sup> She was therefore the maternal ancestor of the Yale family in America. Mr. Yale died probably before middle age, A. D. 1617, leaving three children, viz. David, Ann, and Thomas.

In 1618, she became, by marriage, the second wife of Theophilus Eaton, then an opulent merchant in London, and with him, and a large company of other emigrants, including her three children by David Yale, embarked on board the Hector for America, and arrived at Boston, Massachusetts, June 26th, 1637, and at New Haven, (then Quinnipiac,) April 14th, 1638.

Gov. Eaton, died at New Haven, January 7th, 1657, in the 67th year of his age. Mrs. Eaton, with her daughter, Hannah Eaton (afterward the wife of Gov. Jones) returned to England, 1658, from which country Mrs. Eaton never returned.

Of the ancestry of David Yale, Esq. very little is known. The estate belonging to the family at Wrexham, county of Denbigh, Wales, has descended as follows.

From "Osborne Fitz Gerald, Lord of Yny-sy-Meangwyn and Corsy-ge-dal, Merioneth, designated by Welsh Genealogists as Osborne, the Irishman. This Chief was a scion of the Fitz Gerald, Lords of Desmonds, in Ireland, and emigrated to Wales about the middle of the 13th century, where being in high favor with Llewelyn Iorworth, Prince of North Wales, he obtained from that Monarch grants of Yny-sy Meangwyn, Corsy-ge-dal, and other extensive grants and possessions, and became the progenitor of several eminent families in the principality, of which the Yales were included, and were made by him heirs to a portion of his Estate. Plas-yn-Yale, Co. Denbigh, was derived through David Yale, of Plas-yn-Yale, eldest son of Ellis, the second son of Griffith Yale, of Enion, of Corsy-ge-dal, Co. Merioneth, from Osborne Fitz Gerald, Lord of Yny-sy-Meangwyn, in the same County. Thomas Yale, of Plas-yn-Yale, Esq. a Captain in the service of Charles I, and grandson of the aforesaid David Yale, married, 1649, Dorothy Hughs, a daughter of Humphrey Hughs, of Gwerclas, Co. Merioneth, Esq. and had (with a younger son) Elisau Yale, of Plas-Conwy, Co. of Denbigh, who was Gov. of Madras, a daughter, Dorothy, born Jan'y 23, 1650. She married her cousin, Hugh Hughs, of Gwerclas, Esq. ancestor through their

daughter and heir Dorothy, wife of Edward Lloyds, of Plymog and Gwerclas, a son and successor, Humphrey Yale, of Plas-yn-Yale, Esq. whose descendant and eventual heiress, Sarah Yale, of Plas-yn-Yale, by her will dated in 1818, and proved in 1821, entailed the estate of Yale, with subsequent limitations, on William Parry, fourth son of the late Thomas Parry Jones Parry, of Madrin, Esq. M. P. and grand-nephew of Miss Yale's mother, who was a daughter of John Jones, of Llwyn-Onn, Esq. William Parry Jones Parry assumed in 1821, in compliance with the testator, the name and Arms of Yale, and is the present Lieut. Colonel Yale, of Plas-yn-Yale."

By the preceding extract the fact is clearly established that there was more than one of the name of Yale engaged in the East India service, at or about the same period of time. Elisau, here mentioned as Governor of Madras, was the son of Thomas and Dorothy Yale, who were not married until 1649, one year after the birth of Elihu, (the Donor of Yale College, and Governor of the East India Company of London,) at New Haven, in New England.

The name of Yale is of Welch derivation, and was originally spelled Yall, or Yell. David Yale, Esq. the first individual named in the following genealogy, is the progenitor of all the Yale fami-

ly in this country. His two sons, David and Thomas, with their sister, Anne, were the first of the name who came to America. The first mention of them is of their arrival at Boston, 26th of June, 1637. Their descendants, especially of Thomas, have been numerous, and chiefly among the "sturdy yeomanry," possessing substance and a fair estimation in the ordinary ranks of life.

The Armorial Bearings of the ancient Yales in England and Wales are thus described, viz:—Those of Fitz Gerald, and now used by the occupant of Plas-yn-Yale—Erm. on a Salteir gu. a Crescent or. Crest, a wild boar in a toil.

Those of Yale, Oswestry, Co. Sallop—Erm. on a Salteir gu. a Crescent or. Crest, a wild boar in a net.

Those of Yale, Co. Cornwall—Ar. on a Salteir gu. a Crescent or.

The similarity of these Arms is satisfactory evidence that they were all of one family originally, in England and Wales, as they have been in this country.

David Yale married Ursula ——— probably in England, and came to America, as has been before stated, in 1637, his estate then amounting to £300 only. He settled first at New Haven, and resided there until 1645, when he sold his estate and removed to Boston, and established himself there as a merchant, and bought of Edward Bendall, 23d of August, 1645, a house and garden, with

lands appurtenant, the most splendid in the city. He was not in accord with the faith and severe strictures of the Puritans, as appears by the celebrated petition of Dr. Child to the General Court of Massachusetts, (which petition he signed, May, 1646,) favoring the Church of England. Said petition not receiving the favor of the Court, he seems to have resolved on going home, for in England, then, greater liberty of conscience was indulged. He left his power of Attorney, 8th of October, 1651, to Capt. Thomas Clark and Capt. Thomas Lake, who sold his estate, 8th of September, 1656. He returned to this country, probably on a visit, about 1657, and left again, in company with his mother in 1658. He was in London in 1659, which is the last known of him or his family.

Gov. Hopkins makes respectful mention of him and his brother Thomas in his last will and testament, and makes handsome bequests of £200 to each, and recommends to the care of David, then in Boston, his "poor distressed wife," who was insane.

Ann Yale married Edward Hopkins, Esq., first of London, afterwards of Hartford, Conn., and subsequently of London. He came to America with Gov. Eaton, and others, in 1637, and was made governor of Connecticut, April, 1644, which office he held for several years, and conducted the affairs of the government with great ability and wisdom. On the death of his brother, he went to England designing to return to his family and friends, whom he had left behind, but was made first Warden of the fleet, in place of his deceased brother, and very soon afterwards chosen Commissioner of the Admiralty and Navy, and finally a member of Parliament.

These unexpected preferments altered his design, and he resolved to send for his family, and spend the remainder of his days in his native country. Gov. Hopkins was the founder of the Grammar School, at New Haven, Conn. He died in London, in 1657, aged 58 years. Mrs. Ann Hopkins, his wife, died December 17th, 1698, aged 83 years.

Thomas Yale married Mary Turner, daughter of Capt. Nathaniel Turner of New Haven, 1645.

Capt. Turner was of Lynn, Mass., in 1630, and removed to New Haven in 1638, and was lost at sea, with all his crew, in Mr. Lamberton's ship, which sailed from New Haven, January 1646.

Mr. Yale came to America in 1637, with his father-in-law, Gov. Eaton, and others, and settled in New Haven, as a merchant, in 1638, with an estate of £300. After the death of Eaton, he accompanied his mother and Hannah Eaton, his half sister, with his son Elihu, and brother David to England, 1658. He returned the year following to New Haven, and purchased lands in that part of the town which is now North Haven, and settled on them as early as 1660. He was one of the principal men in the colony, a signer of the Plantation Covenant of New Haven, and filled with honor many offices of trust, with credit to himself, and to the satisfaction of his friends and fellow colonists. He left an estate of £479.

Capt. Thomas Yale died March 27, 1683, aged 67 years.

Mrs. Mary Yale died October 15, 1704, aged

Mr. John Yale, of New Haven, married Rebecca ——— and is supposed to have lived in that part of New Haven, now North Haven, on or near the farm of the late Mr. John Gill, of that place. He was an extensive Planter, and left a very handsome estate. Of his history very little can be learned.

Mr. John Yale died Dec. 16, 1711, aged 65 years. Mrs. Rebecca Yale died Oct. 17, 1734,

aged 78 years. The tomb stone erected to her memory is now (1850) standing in the old Grave Yard in North Haven.

Capt. Thomas Yale, first of New Haven, and afterwards of Wallingford, in the same State, was thrice married—1st, to Rebecca, daughter of William Gibbards, Esq. of New Haven, Dec. 11, 1667, by William Jones, Esq. Deputy Governor; 2d, to Sarah Nash, daughter of John Nash, Esq. She died May 27, 1716, and he married, 3d, Mary Beach, of Wallingford, July 31, 1716. He had no issue by the two last wives. About two years after his first marriage, he, with others, began to agitate the settlement of Wallingford, to which place he removed in 1670, with a small band of other adventurers, under the guidance and direction of the New Haven Committee as it

was called. By the records of Wallingford, it appears that he was one of the most active and energetic men among them. He assisted in the formation of the Church, and in the call of the first and second Ministers, viz :—the Rev. Samuel Street, and Rev. Samuel Whittelsey.

In 1710 himself and the Rev. Samuel Street were the only surviving signers of the Plantation Covenant of Wallingford. He was a Justice of the Peace, Captain of the train-band, Surveyor of land, and Moderator of their Meetings, and kept the records of their proceedings for nearly twenty years.

Capt. Thomas Yale died at Wallingford, January 26, 1736, aged 89 years.

Mrs. Rebecca Yale, his first wife, was born at New Haven, February 26 1650, and died in Wallingford.

Governor Elihu Yale, first of New Haven,

Conn., afterwards of London, and of the East Indies, sailed in company with his father and his uncle David, (who was of Boston in 1645, his grandmother, the widow of Theophilus Eaton, then late the Governor of the Colony, and her daughter, Hannah Eaton, who was afterwards the wife of Governor Jones, of New Haven,) for England, in 1658. His father returned to America, in 1659, leaving him behind, in England, to be educated.

At the age of about thirty he went to the East Indies, in the service of the Hon. East India Company, of London. He remained in that country about twenty years, and acquired a very large estate. He is celebrated as having introduced auctions into England, the first of which was held about the year 1700, of some goods which he brought from the Indies. He married a native of that country, a Mrs. Hinmars, the widow of the then late Governor of Fort St. George, at Madras, by whom he received a large fortune. On his return to London, he was chosen Governor of the East India Company, and spent the remainder of his days in that city. Gov. Yale, by means of his birth and connections at New Haven, became acquainted with the state of the College, which was the occasion of his generous and repeated donations. He has (says Trumbull in his history of

Connecticut) been celebrated as a gentleman not only abundant in wealth, but in generosity and good humor. His name and memory will be perpetuated with honor and gratitude in Yale College, in honor of whose munificence the institution received its name.

New England authorities\* say that he died at Wrexham, in Wales, 8th of July, 1721, aged 73 years, having gone there to visit the seat of his ancestors, but from the epitaph inscribed on his monument it would seem that he died in London, 22d of July, 1721, although buried at the family seat in Wales.

### MOSES YALE BEACH.

The life of Mr. Beach, well known as the late proprietor of the **NEW YORK SUN**, the pioneer of the penny press, while it presents no remarkable variety of changes or incidents, is attractive as tracing the steps of a determined man—one who never faltered in the darkest hour of adversity.

The ancestors of Mr. Beach were among the first settlers, whose axes made the woods resound on the spot where the beautiful village of Wallingford now stands. The place received its name from one of their number. In the space of a few short years their village could boast of many wealthy and opulent families. Moses Beach, his Great-Grandfather, lived to a good old age, as did his Grandfather, of the same name, ranking among the most wealthy and respectable men in the settlement, both owning and occupying, in succession, the same farm, and when the wilderness had given place to the thriving village, they each in turn answered the call of nature, resigning their possessions to Moses Sperry Beach. He married Lucretia Yale, (as has been stated in its proper place,) a descendant of Thomas Yale, Esq., who came to Wallingford, A. D., 1670, and who was a brother of Elihu Yale, Esq., Governor of the Hon. East India Company, of London. Of this couple Moses Yale Beach was an only son. When about four months old he was left without the care of a mother by the hand of death, and as his father's business called him much from home, he was confided to the attentions of a step-mother. As soon as his age would permit he was taught to do little "chores," and at the age of ten years he had the larger ones on his hands, also. At that time he took charge of nearly all the out-door work, including the care of horses and cattle, besides going nearly two miles to school daily; from four o'clock in the morning until eleven in

the evening he was generally up and doing, and yet found leisure to exercise his mechanical ingenuity in the manufacture of playthings for himself and others, and for trade with his school-mates.

At a suitable age he was, at his own solicitation, bound an apprentice to a Mr. Dewey, a cabinet maker, at Hartford, Conn. His industry excited the attention of his master who was a close man, but who finally made a bargain with him by which he was allowed two cents per hour for extra work. Mr Beach says he never felt happier at success in any thing than when that bargain was completed. Early and late he worked, and the pennies began to accumulate ; finally he made a bargain for his time after he should arrive at the age of eighteen years, for which he was to pay the sum of \$400. This arrangement gave him new life, and when the time came around he had saved between \$100 and \$200 more than enough to pay for his freedom, with which sum he commenced life.

He removed to Northampton, Mass., where after working awhile as a journeyman, he entered into copartnership with a young man by the name of Loveland. Their work was much celebrated, in testimony of which they received the first premium of the Franklin Institute, the sum of five dollars. While thus employed, under a fair sky, he married Nancy Day, daughter of Thomas and Mary Day, of West Springfield, a direct descendant of the Puritans, of the Brewster family.

His smooth sailing was soon interrupted by a storm, and after a long and obstinate resistance he was compelled to yield to its violence. Separating from his partner, he removed to Springfield, and after repeated endeavors he established himself in a fair business, and with his first means built him a convenient residence. His spirits and ingenuity returned, and it was not long before his mind was almost entirely engaged in the construction of a "*Gunpowder Engine*," for propelling balloons. In this he was partially successful, but ascertaining from his model that the weight of an engine of the requisite proportions would be insurmountable, and finding that his business was suffering from want of his care and attention, he abandoned the project, but too late. Again he found himself in deep water, but finally, matching his strength against the current, he succeeded in obtaining a new stand. Once more he plied his ingenuity, and this time produced a Rag Cutting Machine, an article since adopted in every paper mill throughout the country. The saving of labor by its use is enormous, but, like other inventors generally, he failed to derive benefit from it. A person in whose confidence he had relied made use of the ideas he suggested to combat his originality as

soon as it was presented, the result of which was beneficial to neither party. He however removed to Saugerties, Ulster County, New York, where he became interested in an extensive paper mill. The rag cutter and a new drying machine were introduced, and for several years their business was very successful. He here invested some in real estate, and erected a beautiful residence, devoting his time exclusively to the interests of the concern. Six years thus passed away, but the seventh brought changes and adversity ; the whole of his property, both real and personal, was sold to meet the demands of the creditors of the mill.

In 1835 he removed to New York, where he shortly after bought the interest of Mr. Wisner in the New York Sun, on a credit of \$5,200. In this he was attended with unexpected success, and paying off Mr. Wisner in the course of the next year following, he bargained with his then partner, Benjamin H. Day, for the remaining half interest, for the sum of \$19,500. The first six months after he became the entire owner of the Sun, it proved not so profitable as he had calculated, and he offered all the property he then possessed to have the contract given up, but not being able to effect this, he pushed ahead, and the tide turned. The Transcript, his principal competitor, gave up the field, and before two years had passed the last dollar due for the establishment was paid and he was once more in the ascendant. Since 1838 his course has been steadily upward. His ability and enterprize in the management of his newspaper have been proverbial, and as a consequence have excited the envy of some, but notwithstanding this, there are very few, if any, who have known him personally that do not value him highly as a friend. Notwithstanding his many and severe losses he is reputed a very wealthy man, and having retired from business in New York, and erected a splendid mansion in Wallingford, his native town, he will doubtless spend his remaining years in that place.

After his return to London he was chosen Governor of the East India Company. About the beginning of 1718 he was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of London. He sent liberal donations to the College Institution, which in 1717 was settled at New Haven, his native town. At the Commencement, Sept. 10, 1718, the Trustees, in commemoration of his generosity, gave to the large collegiate house, then nearly completed in New Haven, the name of Yale College. The name was soon after, but without any formal act, transferred to the entire Institution, and was adopted and confirmed in the charter, A. D. 1745.

Page 31, Dudley North, of Glemham, merchant, was brother of Francis North, Baron of Guilford, and Lord Keeper of England. This Francis was the grandfather of the first Earl of Guilford. The children of Dudley and Catherine North, were Dudley, Anna, Mary and Elihu. The first died without issue before 1789. Anna, married Hon. Nicholas Herbert; Mary married —— Long, Esq. of Suffolk.

Lord James Cavendish was the third son of the first Duke of Devonshire. His wife died June 27, 1734, leaving the following children; 1st, William, who married Barbara, daughter of Edward Chandler, Lord Bishop of Durham. He died June 30, 1751, without issue. 2d, Elizabeth, who married, Feb. 1732, Richard Chandler, a son of the Bishop. Lord James Cavendish dying Dec. 14, 1751, Richard Chandler, by an Act of Parliament in 1752, changed his name to Cavendish, and his wife (Elizabeth) dying without issue, left personal estate to her cousin, Dudley Long, Esq. of Suffolk. This Dudley Long assumed the name of North, and he it was who presented the Portrait of Gov. Yale to Yale College, in 1789.
