Foreword.

The Yaw-Yeaw Family Society, in undertaking the publication of this work, is trying to put into permanent form the research of its members and of others, who in past years have given of their time and talents to genealogical studies of the family. Some of the members have spent thirty or more years in the task, others only a comparatively short period, while many others have contributed their immediate family's record.

The material left by earlier genealogists has provided the basis for much of the more recent study and has been used freely in this book. Perhaps the one to whom the Society is most indebted with regard to the David Yeaw sections is Mr. Luther Yeaw (1906-1951) of Claysville, R.I. His very extensive records, mostly on the Rhode Island branches, have been made available by his widow, Mrs. Pearlena Yeaw, who merits special mention in this matter. Hope Yeaw (Mrs. Elmer L.) of East Providence, R.I., has cooperated in copying the Luther Yeaw material for submission to the editor.

Others of this family who have done work and left records are Mrs. Mary Augusta Yeaw Holman of Leominster, Mass., Mr. Cyrus Walker of North Scituate, R.I., and Mrs. Emma Yeaw Hoffman of Syracuse, N.Y. Genealogists not of the family lines, who have provided material include, Mrs. Gertrude Thayer of Brattleboro, Vt., Mr. Ralph Stoughton of Turner Falls, Mass., Mrs. Ruby Austin of Heath, Mass., Mrs. Geo. Gassett of Putney, Vt., Mr. David Goff of Oneida, N.Y., Mr. L. F. Cary of Scituate, R.I., and Mrs. Winifred L. Farnham of Providence, R.I. Town and County Clerks, Registrars, Clerks of Probate Courts, Town and County Historians, and other officials have supplied valuable information.

On the Lawrence Yaw family of New Jersey and Ohio, the principal source of information was the History of Muskingum County, Ohio, which contains a biographical and genealogical sketch of several of the members of the family. Later data has been contributed by Mrs. Lily Yaw Slay of Cambridge, O., Mr. Lester Yaw of Coshocton, O., Mrs. Rose Yaw Wilson of Perrysburg, O., and other members of this group.

For the Henry Yaw family of western New York, Mr. Russell W. Yaw of Jamestown, N.Y., has supplied most of the record.

In connection with some of the families which thus far have not been definitely attached to one of the three above-mentioned lines, Mrs. Charles Pierce of Enosburg Falls, Vt., has been exceptionally active on the Joseph and Thomas Yaw families of Vermont, Mr. Edwin Clark Yaw III of Baldwin, N.Y., on the Daniel Church Yaw group, and Mr. William Yaw of Lafayette, Ind., on the Joseph Yaw line of Ohio, Wisconsin, and Iowa.

City directories, census records, cemetery and family records

from various sources have supplied data on many of the persons included in all the groups mentioned. Sincere thanks to each one for such splendid cooperation.

The Editor and other Officers of the Society realize that this project is in no sense complete, and that many lines should be filled out with additional data. Conflicting records no doubt have caused errors, and also misinterpretation of some information received. Corrections and additional material will be most welcome, and will be reported in the quarterly bulletin.

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The Plan of this Book.

The plan of this book will be readily understood by those who have worked with genealogical records, but for the benefit of those who are new to this science a word of explanation is in order.

In the second chapter, after the Introduction in Chapter 1, the family of David Yeaw is given with all known data about them, including the names of the six sons. As each of these six was the progenitor of a numerous family, each is considered as the founder of his family, and a chapter is given to him. Chapters 9 and 10 are devoted to two other families which had separate origin in America.

In each case the founder of the family is given the number "1", and his (or her) data is given with some explanation regarding the person. Under him the children are given in chronological order as far as known, with consecutive numbers from "2" onward. As sons or daughters the children are listed with birth and death dates, or when living it is so indicated. All the descendants of that family to the latest generation are listed with consecutive numbers. If the son or daughter has no descendants known, all the data is given immediately and that name and number do not appear later. However, if the son or daughter does have descendants, his number is underlined and the number and name are carried forward in consecutive order, and his or her data appears with the second entry.

Chapters 11 to 25 contain family lines that are thought to be attached to one or another of the families in previous Chapters, but definite proof has not been found. Indication is given of the family to which they may belong, and it is hoped

that necessary proof will be forthcoming. In Chapter 26 there is a list of individuals or one-family groups, Yaws or Yeaws, whose names have been found, but which are unattached to one of the other families, with a possibility of a relationship given in a few cases.

Some additional data has been received after the pages of the book were prepared, in which case the material has been added on the colored "Supplementary Pages" (195-198) and an asterisk (*) placed before the corresponding number. Future material on members of the families will be supplied in the "Yaw-Yeaw Family Society Bulletin", which is planned for publication each quarter.

Introduction.

CHAPTER 1.

When the study of any family is undertaken it is advisable to search out the earliest records of the name in America. It is usually found that the name appears in various forms or spellings, some of which may be forerunners of the particular name under study, while others may not be of the family at all. This is very necessary when work is begun on the Yaw or Yeaw family.

The colonial historian, Thomas Savage, in his Massachusetts records, gives six variations of the name in question, namely, YEO, YEOW, YOW, YEW, YEAW, and YAW. Sometimes the same individual appears with two or more spellings. This, of course, is due to the fact that in the seventeenth century many people could not read, write, or spell, and when a scribe wrote a document or a record he spelled as he heard the word, or as he had seen it elsewhere. The following are some of these seventeenth century individuals in America:

- 1). Allen YEW appears as a seaman in the early 1600s in connection with Yeo & Co. in Yorke County, Maine. He mortgaged two-thirds of a shallop 28 May 1640, and lived in Essex, Mass., in 1653.
- 2). Mr. Brown YEOW and Mr. Brown YOW are listed in the records of an Ipswich, Mass., Court, 25 Jan. 1651, as having bills of account due to them (him).
- 3). Hugh YEO on 2 Oct. 1655 was granted a tract of 644 acres of land in Northampton County in Virginia on the Pungotege River, bounding on the lands the said Yeo purchased of Chas. Scarborough, the land of Nicholas Waddilow, and the land of Mr. Anthony Haskins. On 25 Nov. 1679 there was granted to Nathaniel Bradford a tract of 644 acres in Northampton Co., now Accomac, bounding on the land which Chas. Scarborough purchased of Hugh Yeo.
- 4). Samuel YEO on 29 Sept. 1653 was fined in a Salem, Mass., Court for "being much in drink and disturbing the neighbors in the night". (Essex Antiq. VII-181) Idem VIII-171 mentions a court case in Salem of John Devorex vs. Sam" YEW. In the Court at Salem Rebecca YEO was appointed administratrix of her husband Sam's estate, 24 Sept. 1657. They had a daughter Hester who married Charles Greene.
- 5). Thomas - in connection with this name there is the greatest variety of spelling of the surname. Thomas YOW was a property owner in Boston in 1648. In the same year Thomas YEO was assessed £10-12-0 as his share of freight charges on the cargo of the ship "Planter". (Recorder of Suffolk Co. Court, 1644-51, p. 173) In the will of David Phippen, who died 31 Oct. 1650, Thomas YEO is mentioned as his son-in-law, husband of Sarah Phippen, so married before that date. Their children, Elizabeth Yeo, b. 10 Jan. 1652, bapt. 8 Mar. 1652, Thomas Yeo, b. 24 Apr. 1654, bapt. First Church, Bos-

ton. Thomas YEO borrowed £200 of William Hudson, Sr., 6 Sept. 1650. In 1651 Thomas YOW was in Court in Yorke Co., Maine, (then a part of Mass.) on a charge of selling liquor to Indians on the Isle of Shoal. Mass. Bay Colony Records list the name of Thomas YEOW on a petition for a conduit, which was granted 1 June 1652; and in Suffolk County deeds (VI-22) 16 Apr. 1656, Thomas YEAW was one of several petitioners for a conduit on Ann Street, Boston. About the same time Thomas YEOW's name appears in a deed of James Marsh to Joshua Scottow of Boston for a piece of marshland, "bounded on one angle with the corner post of Thomas YEOW's ground". In Suffolk County deeds (III-305) is a deed by Thomas YEAW and wife Sarah to Philip Wharton, recorded 26 Nov. 1656. The Thomas YOW Island is mentioned as being in the Kennebec River in 1676, and in 1677 Thomas YOW, a seaman, gave testimony in court on the death of a seaman in Virginia. Savage says that Thomas YOW probably had a brother Charles in Bristol, England.

Thus Thomas appears twelve times with four different spellings. They may all be the same individual or may be referring to more than one man, as the period covered is from 1648 to 1677.

Mr. Luther Yeaw, in writing of Thomas Yow, says: "The above Thomas YEO (YEOW) sold his house and other property about 1656 and left Boston. He probably resided in Essex County near or at Salem after that date, but we have found no more about him". He adds: "Drake's History of Boston (p. 800) gives proof of the former statements (regarding his marriage). Thomas Yow of Boston married Sarah, daughter of David Phippen of Hingham before Nov. 1650 as the will of Phippen calls him son-in-law. They had the following children: Elizabeth, b. 1 Oct. 1652, Thomas, b. 24 Apr. 1654. Perhaps more."

Possible Origin of the Family in England.

Turning to England for the origin of the family in Mass. a very suggestive family history is found. In southwest England there was a very ancient family which at different times spelled its name in these ways: YEA - YEO - YEAWE - YEAW - YA - YAE - YOA - le YEA, all derived from the French "EA". The will of Richard Yea was filed 25 July 1548. His children or grandchildren included a David, and in 1726 David Yea was High Sheriff of Somersetshire. His son William became Sir William Yea, Bart., and another son was named David. A brief account of this family is found in a "History of the Family of Yea", by Alfred James Monday, published in 1885 by G. Vincent of Taunton, England. The book does not give any detailed family history but does state that the name had been transplanted abroad from the west coast of England to the colonies.

John Yaw served with "armes, sword and pike" under Sir Thomas Phillops, according to the "Muster Roll of the County of London Derry, Ireland, A. D. 1631". He was probably of the same family.

CHAPTER 2.

David Yeaw (Yaugh)

The name DAVID YAUGH is found in the records of the St. Michael Anglican Church of Marblehead, Mass., in connection with the baptism of his oldest son, Joseph, on September 8, 1728. Where he came from, whether an immigrant or American-born, when he arrived in Marblehead, have been the subject of investigation, but so far with no satisfying results. The name is spelled YAUGH in all the records of this Church, but nowhere else is it found in this form. Other records of David use the form YEAW, and many of his descendants have consistently used this spelling up to the present day. Some, however, have changed it or have allowed it to change to YAW, so that it appears in both forms among the descendants of David Yeaw. (The form YEAW is not found, however, in any of the family groups originating outside of New England.)

There is a reference to a David YAW a little earlier (1724), and it is thought that this is the same person. From George Francis Dow, "Pirates of the New England Coast", we take the following paragraph:

"The very last of March (1724) the schooner 'Good-Will' of Marblehead was taken, Benjamin Chadwell, Master, and April 1st a fishing schooner, William Lancy, master, fell into their (pirates) hands off Cape Sable. Lancy was detained on board the 'Revenge' and while there saw nine different vessels taken, including a Cape Ann sloop commanded by Capt. John Salter. On board Capt. Lancy's schooner was a seaman named David Yaw, who afterward deposed that when the pirates came on board, one of them, John Baptis, a Frenchman, 'damned him and kicked him in his legs and pointed to his boots, which was a sign as this deponent understood it that he wanted his boots and he accordingly pulled them off and Baptis took them:'. (Mass. Archives, 63-383)

The Marblehead Church also recorded the burial of a daughter, Mary, on May 12, 1729, and the baptism of three more sons on April 25, 1731, November 11, 1733, and November 17, 1734, respectively. On December 22, 1735, David Yeaw presented a certificate, dated December 19 of the same year, to the Town Council of Scituate, Rhode Island, stating that he had removed from Marblehead on April 1, 1735. The Council approved the certificate the day it was presented and admitted him to residence there. He and his wife Jane (sometimes Jean) and four sons thus became residents of that part of the Colony of Rhode Island, and the name Yeaw is a very well known one in the history of that Colony and State up to the present time.

David purchased eighty acres of land in Scituate in 1745 and became a freeman in April of that year. The purchase was made from Thomas Angell, who acquired it from Israel Young in the same year. "The original homestead was located North of the property belonging to Fred Potter in Rockland, in the woods back of the so-called 'Shady Oak' farm and the little house

stood in what was called the 'Patten', a small clearing near the river. The business David pursued was sheep raising". (Luther Yeaw) The inventory of David's estate shows that besides being a sheep raiser he must have devoted time to weaving, as he had a loom, woolen and linen wheels, stocks of flax and yarn, and other accessories of that trade. In those days most homes did a certain amount of weaving to supply their family needs, so this may not have been very unusual.

Two more sons were born to David and Jane Yeaw in Scituate. In 1760 David's son Joseph was appointed as his guardian, because of David's blindness. His will dated 19 May 1752 mentions his wife Jean and six sons, and leaves all his estate to Jean during her lifetime and to be divided among the six later. David died 14 July 1764, and Jean on 20 Jan. 1794.

Each of the six sons of David was the progenitor of a considerable number of families. Two lived and died in Rhode Island, three are known to have lived in Vermont, at least for a time, although one of these probably spent more time in Mass., while the other moved to N.Y. From these states their descendants continued their migrations until they are known in almost every state except the southeastern ones.

In the next six chapters of this book these men are treated separately, each being counted as the first of his group. Effort has been made to list all known descendants of each one, but any student of genealogy knows how difficult it is to prove descent in every case. It is hoped that definite proof with regard to certain unattached or unproven lines may be found as a result of the distribution of this work.

CHAPTER 3.

The Joseph Yeaw Family

Joseph Yeaw, the oldest son of David and Jane (Jean) Yeaw, remained close to his parents all his life, was his father's guardian from 1760 until the latter's death in 1764, but survived his father by only four months. Some of the descendants of Joseph left Rhode Island, but many remained in their native state.

CHAPTER 4. The David Yeaw, Junior, Family.

David Yeaw, Jr., the second of the sons of David Yeaw of Marblehead, Mass., and Scituate, R.I., was one of those who migrated from Rhode Island, as did so many New Englanders after the Revolutionary War. Comparatively little is known about him, and the name of only one of his children is certain. He was named as executor of the estate in his father's will. In 1758, six years after the signing of that will, his father deeded ten acres of his original land purchase to David as a dower, and in the document recorded in Scituate he is called a "cordwainer", so we know him as a shoemaker. In the Census of Scituate of 1774 he is listed with one male and two females over 16, and two males and five females under 16. This would be David and his wife and a daughter over 16, or perhaps another older woman, and seven children born after 1758. In the Census of 1790 there is a David Yeaw with 1-2-2, but these numbers readily fit the family of his nephew David, son of his brother Joseph. David had probably migrated by this date, for in 1795 we find David the cordwainer, now of Cooper's Patent in New York, signing a sheriff's deed assigning land to Abraham Yeaw, his nephew. This was probably a quit-claim for his share in his father's estate.

David seems to have been rather an austere man, at least in his later years. This is shown in an article published in the "Freeman's Journal" of Cooperstown, N.Y., on Jan. 24, 1878. The article was written by Dr. Richard Fry as one of a series of reminiscences of Hartwick (part of the so-called Cooper's Patent) in Otsego Co., N.Y. Dr. Fry says in part:

"Leaving the old schoolhouse, as we pass west we come to the little brook, where we angled for speckled trout, now troutless and with little water. Here stands the old, dilapidated, tenantless house, once occupied by David Yaw, the shoemaker. As an illustration of his family discipline - the family consisting of himself, wife, and Jowler - one example will suffice: Father going in one day, Jowler approached him with a kindly look and as courteous mien as the want of his race, at the same time being unable to express his pleasure by words or smiles, essayed to welcome him by various movements of his caudal appendage. Mr. Yaw quickly leaves his bench, and with his strap in hand belabors Jowler soundly, observing, 'I'll learn him better than to wag his tail everytime a man comes into the room', and again took his seat, applying the strap to its original purpose of holding the shoe upon his knee, while he plied the awl and drove the pegs."

The cabin referred to was on the land of Mr. Rhodes Fry, who was the brother-in-law of Mr. Yaw's daughter, Ellen.

In trying to find the names of the two sons of David Yaw Jr. (this form appears in all the N.Y. records), two names present themselves. In the Census of 1791 a Joseph Yaw is recorded in Wallingford, Rutland Co., Vt., with a wife and two

daughters. He is not there in 1800. In 1793 two brothers, Joseph and David Yaw, came from Vermont into Herkimer Co., N.Y., in the part which later became Madison Co.. (John E. Smith, Our County and its People- Madison Co.) Both Joseph and David purchased land in the area. Joseph and his wife Sylphine later moved to Erie Co., N.Y. This Joseph is referred to in a letter written by John Yaw, grandson of Amos Yaw, as a cousin of his father, so he must have been a son of one of Amos' brothers; as a son of David, Jr., he would fill that requirement. No more is known of the brother David. Since satisfactory proof is not yet available, they are not listed here with the family of David Jr., but with those of undetermined origin.

CHAPTER 5.

The Philip Yeaw Family

Philip Yeaw, the third son of David of Marblehead, Mass., and Scituate, R.I., was another of the sons who left Rhode Island to make his home elsewhere, but he evidently returned to Scituate for a time and then went away again. Nothing is known of him from his childhood or of his marriage, but he was given a certificate by the Scituate authorities in 1766, which certificate would allow him to reside in another town or colony. The certificate included his wife and seven other persons, probably children. In 1774 he is again in Scituate and appears in the census of that year with himself and wife over 16 and three boys and four girls under that age. After the Revolutionary War he was in Guilford twp., Windham Co., Vermont, where he purchased land on Jan. 13, 1781, but sold it again Sept. 4th of the same year. In 1783 Philip sold 14 acres of land in Halifax, Windham Co., on which he had a corn mill. His son Samuel was a witness in the signing of the deed. Philip did not remain in Vermont very long as in the census of 1790 he is in the town of Hancock, Berkshire Co., Mass., with only himself and two females, probably daughters. On Dec. 4th, 1790, Philip Yeaw, husbandman, of Hancock, Mass., signed a release to Palmer Tanner of all his interests in the estate which his "Hon'd father, David Yeaw, late of Scituate died seized of". In 1802 he was again in Guilford, Vermont, but along with ten others was "warned out", a common practice of those days with regard to persons who did not own property and might become a burden to the town. No later information about him has been found. His son Samuel, with whom he seems to have been closely associated, moved to New York State soon after this, but no mention of Philip going with him has been found.

CHAPTER 6.

The Amos Yaw Family.

The fourth son of David and Jean Yeaw, Amos, was born at Marblehead, Mass., raised at Scituate, R.I., and moved to Vermont in the days of the Revolutionary War. He and his two older sons were involved in the Yorker-Vermont controversy, on the side of those who favored New York's claims of sovereignty over the Vermont area. Amos' wife was Mary Franklin, from which fact some descendants have claimed relationship to Benjamin Franklin. A close relationship has been disproved, although three or four generations before them they may have had a common ancestor in England. Mary Franklin's ancestors were in America before Benjamin's father, Josiah, came to America. Amos and his immediate family used the YAW spelling in all the records that have been found, but some of the later generations have added the "E" again.

CHAPTER 8

The William Yeaw Family.

William Yeaw, the sixth and youngest son of David Yeaw, was another of those who left his native Rhode Island, to make his home in one of the other New England states. No record of his birth or baptism has been found, but he must have been born in Scituate, R.I., in the late 1730s or early 1740s. The stone marking his grave in Rehoboth, Mass., gives 28 Aug. 1810 as the date of his death with the age 52 years, which would make his birth year 1758. This is evidently an error as he is mentioned as one of the sons of David Yeaw in the latter's will dated 19 May 1752. One account states that William died "at an advanced age", so perhaps at 72, or near that age. Nothing is known of him during his youth or young manhood; he was not in the Census of Scituate of 1774, as were his four living brothers, his mother, and the widow of his oldest brother, Joseph. He served in the Revolutionary War in Capt. Comfort Starr's Company of Vermont Militia, 1780. He was an early settler in Guilford twp., Windham County, Vermont, settling in the part called Hinesburg, where he took up land. He purchased more of Job Aylesworth in 1796. Many of his descendants have remained in Windham County, some of them are still there as this is written; others have gone to nearby states and others are farther away.

CHAPTER 9

The Lawrence Yaw Family of New Jersey, Ohio, & Indiana

Sometime in the early eighteenth century a group of three brothers are said by tradition to have come from Germany to America, arriving in New Jersey. They were Lawrence, Peter and David Yaw. David became dissatisfied and left for parts unknown and no records of Peter have been found. Lawrence lived in New Jersey, but just where has not been determined, although it may have been in Sussex County. The name of Sarah Yau (her mark) is found as a witness to the will of Abraham Bedell of Hardist twp., Sussex County, 25 Oct. 1805; she may have been a daughter or granddaughter of Lawrence Yaw. A History of Muskingum County, Ohio, recounts the tradition of the arrival of Lawrence Yaw from Germany, settlement in New Jersey, and the migration of John Yaw to Ohio in 1813, after serving in the Revolutionary War. This history calls John a son of Lawrence, but he may have been a grandson instead. Seven children of John are known, all born in New Jersey, moved to Ohio; branches of John's family remained in Ohio, while others went to Indiana, from which places they have spread to various parts of the nation.

This Joseph is mentioned in the Towle Genealogy, from which some of this data is taken. This says that Joseph is supposed to be of Dutch descent and that he lived in Clarenden, Rutland County, until he moved to Franklin County, about one hundred miles north. No Lutch family with the name YAW is known. However, Temperance Yaw, widow of Oliver-3 (Joseph-2, David-1) is found in the census of 1791 of Clarenden, Vt., with three sons under the age of sixteen. The names of these three sons have not been learned, but this Joseph was probably one of them, as he was of the right age, and had the same name as his grandfather, if our surmise is correct. Oliver Yaw of Chittenden and Thomas of Hinesburg and Irasburg, all in the same general area, also fill the requirements for the other two.

Oliver Yaw's parentage is not definitely known, but, as in the cases of Joseph Yaw of Franklin Co., Vt., and Thomas Yaw of Rutland & Chittenden Cos., Vt., the fact that he lived and died in Rutland Co., and that Tempy(erance) Yaw, the widow of Oliver-3, Joseph-2, David-1, is given in the Vermont Census of 1791 with three sons under 16 in Clarenden, Rutland Co., a few miles from Chittenden are indications that Oliver was the son of Oliver & Temperance Yaw. The use of the name Oliver and the birth in 1789 or 1790 give credence to the idea that he was the youngest son of Oliver Yaw of Rhode Island, and perhaps born after the death of his father, since Tempy was a widow at census time 1791.

Will of Gideon Brownell; 1827, "to daughter Nancy Yeaw one dollar after decease of her mother and to have a home with her mother together with her three children as long as she remains single and in case she outlives her mother she shall still have a home there as long as she remains single."

From the above it is clear that Nancy Brownell had m. William Yeaw and in 1827 was divorced from him after having 3 children. She d. in 1828 and the three were left in the care of their grandmother. In 1823 Wm. Yeaw-4 (David-3, Joseph-2, David-1) purchased land in the Scriba Patente, Oswego Co., N.Y. Later he returned to Scituate, R.I. and m. Sally Knight. On 3 Dec. 1830 Wm. & Sally Yeaw deeded that land to Mary Brownell, widow of Gideon, & Gideon, a son, both of Owego, Tioga Co., N.Y. The deed, was signed in Scituate, acknowledged in Washington Co., N.Y. and registered in Oswego Co., N.Y.

From the circumstances it seems certain that William Yeaw of Scituate, R.I., was the husband of Nancy Brownell, that there was a divorce, that he left his property in N.Y., returned to R.I., and shortly thereafter deeded his N.Y. land to Mary Brownell, probably as a trust for his one surviving dau., Lucy, although the deed does not specify that.

The parentage of this Joseph Yaw has not been definitely fixed, but there is strong evidence that he was a son of David-2, son of David-1 of Scituate, R.I. Smith's History of Madison Co., N.Y., "Our County and Its People", says that two brothers, Joseph and David Yaw, came from Pownal, Vt., settled there and helped a large group of Vermonters settle there also. No Yaws who lived in Pownal are known, but this Joseph of Wallingford, Vt., came at that time and he had extensive land deals in Madison, Otsego, and Chenango Cos.

In a letter written 12 May 1867, John Yaw-4 (John-3, Amos-2, David) mentions Joseph Yaw, a Judge of the Common Pleas Court of Niagra Co., N.Y., as a cousin of his father, John-3, and who settled in Boston Corners, Niagra Co. (later Erie Co.). Eliminating the known sons of the four brothers of Amos Yaw, makes it almost certain that this one was a son of David-2.

The parentage of this David Yaw has not been determined, but it is almost certain that he is a descendant from David Yaw of Marblehead and Scituate. Since the sons and grandsons of five of the six sons of the founder of the family are nearly all identified, it is probable that he was a grandson of David-2, the second son, although he might have been a grandson of Philip-2. He lived in the area to which Joseph and David Yaw came in 1793 from Vermont. He is listed in the Census of 1840 in the town of Madison, Madison Co., N.Y., as engaged in "Manufactures and Trades" and with the same number of descendants mentioned in his will, recorded in File 1205, Madison Co., under date 18 July 1846. On 1 Feb. 1835 Benjamin Barnard of the town of Madison, quit-claimed to David Yaw of the same town, one acre of land in the S.E. corner of the S.W. corner of Lot #92, for \$25, land in Yaw's actual possession. On 29 Dec. 1836 David & Phebe Yaw of the town of Madison sold 1/2 of Lot #31 of the tract called "Oneida Creek Tract" to Joel Owen of Lenox for \$100. On 13 Mar. 1845 David Yaw sold to Albert Bramon land in the latter's actual possession on the East side of the road and the SE corner of the SW corner of Lot #92, for \$500; recorded 21 Sept. 1846.

The Census of Rensselaer, Albany Co., N.Y., 1810, lists Philip Yaw with 4 sons and 2 daus., b. 1800-10, and one older dau. This is almost certainly the family to which Elijah belonged. The Will of David Yeaw.

The last Will and Testament of David Yaw, Late of Scituate aforesaid, Deceased was presented to this town council and read in the following Words Viz:

"In the Name of God Amen. The Nineteenth Day of May A.D. 1752. I, David Yeaw of Scituate in the County of Providence, Yeoman being very weak of Body but of perfect mind and memory, Thanks being given unto God. Therefore, calling into mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die; do make and ordain this my last will and Testment, that is to say Principally and First of all: I give and recommend my soul into the Hands of God who gave it and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be burried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executor; Nothing Doubting But at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Mighty Power of God; and as Touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless me in this life: I give () and dispose of the same in the following manner and form -----

Imprimis I give and bequeath to Jean, My Dearly Beloved Wife, all my personal Estate and all the rents and profits of my Real Estate During the time she shall remain my Widow, and after that my Will is that all both Real and Personal Estate as before mentioned be equally divided Between my six sons, namely, Joseph Yeaw, David Yeaw, Philip Yeaw, Amos Yeaw, John Yeaw, William Yeaw to them and their heirs and assignes Forever -----

And also my will and pleasure is to make and Ordain My Second Son David Yeaw Sole Executor of my last Will and Testment and I do hereby utterly Disallow, revoke and Disannul all and every other Former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, Bequeaths, and Execution by me in any way before Named, Willed, and Bequeathed, Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testment.

In Witness Whereof, I have Thereunto Set my hand and Seal the Day and Yeaw first above mentioned.

The Yaw Family among the Yorkers.

The names of three members of the Amos Yaw family appear in the history of the struggle between the "Yorkers", so-called from their ardent allegiance to the colony and state of New York, and the "Vermonters", "Freemen of Vermont", "New Hampshire Grantees", or "Allenites", as they were variously called, who wished to free themselves from all outside authority, i.e., New Hampshire, New York, and Massachusetts. The struggle, which lasted 26 years, from about 1758 to 1784, brought bitter controversy, divided families, persecution, harsh judgments, confiscations, imprisonments, and a few deaths. Even the years of the Revolutionary War did not bring the opponents together; rather each raised their own militia to respond to local alarms, and each sent men to the Continental Army, but always under different commands.

The territory which is now Vermont was slightly known during the 17th century, and the French and Indian Wars took many troops through its borders. But no settlers were there until well into the 18th century. Guilford Township in New York's Cumberland County (now Windham in Vermont) was chartered in 1754 to 54 proprietors, principally from Mass. Some land was cleared in 1758 and the first settler went there in 1761. There were others who had gone in from N. H. farther to the northeast under grants from that colony.

The origin of the controversy goes back to the indefiniteness of boundaries as given by the English kings in grants to the court favorites. The New Hampshire grant specified that the southern boundary followed the northern line of Mass. westward "until it meets His Majesty's other governments". At the time there were no grants to the west. When Britain took over New Netherlands from the Dutch, Charles II gave the territory to his brother James, and it was defined as reaching north to the St. Lawrence River, east to the Connecticut River, and to the east side of Delaware Bay. Rights in the area were further complicated by the fact that in its earlier years the supreme authority to settle disputes rested with the King and his Council. They were distant, ill-informed, slow to act, and somewhat indifferent to the problems of so small a part of this far-away region.

When the territory west of the Connecticut River seemed propitious for settlement, royal Governor Benning Wentworth of New Hampshire began giving grants to interested parties, always with reserves for himself and fees for the lands. When the government of New York learned of this, the Lt. Gov. protested and the two authorities agreed not to issue more grants until a royal decree should decide the question of jurisdiction. New York respected the agreement, but Gov. Wentworth continued issuing grants in large numbers, also disregarding the instructions that grants should not be larger than 50 acres, and only to those who would be permanent settlers. Many of Wentworth's grants were for large areas and to speculators. No decision was reached by the King's Council before authority passed out of its hands due to the American Declaration of Independence. Then there was no central authority in America for a time, and after Congress actually began to be recognized as such, it was beset by so many problems of the

struggling, newly-liberated colonies that it was unable to give attention to so small an area, and unwilling to offend the rival claimants. The rights of the "New Hampshire grantees" continued as a strongly controversial question. They felt that they must take authority into their own hands in order to protect themselves and those to whom they sold lands. This gave rise to the advocates of an independent Vermont, or to a new and separate state.

On the other hand those who had New York grants were equally determined to retain their allegiance to New York and to oblige other people of the area to recognize its authority also. New York's attitude, both colonial and as a state, was that the area was part of New York. She organized counties, commissioned civil and military officers, held elections, and received representatives in the New York legislature. The one thing New York did not do was to send forces to resist the rise to power of the "U-surping Vermonters". Unbiased legal minds have stated that there is no doubt that a definite decision by a recognized authority would have made the area Yorker, but there was no such authority and the Yorkers and Vermonters were left to settle their disputes in their own way. The Vermonters, under the leadership of the blustering Gen. Ethan Allen and other similar-minded men, were stronger. By force, terrorism, arrests and judgments, prison, confiscations, etc., they went on intimidating the Yorkers, without any show of opposition from outside, until they gained the upper hand. In the struggle against the Vermonters the town of Guilford, the most heavily populated at the time, was strongly Yorker and bore the burden of the opposition, although Halifax and Brattleboro had large anti-Vermont groups.

Just when the first Yaws came to Guilford is uncertain. Amos Yaw is mentioned as a proprietor, but it has not been ascertained under just what conditions or when he obtained his proprietorship. The family was evidently settled in Guilford township before 1780 and under a New York grant. The name of Amos Jr. appears in Revolutionary War rolls of Vermont in 1781 in a company under Capt. James Blakeslee, Col. Samuel Fletcher's battalion, Gen. Roger Enos' brigade. Capt. Blakeslee was a strong supporter of New York's claims, a resident of Brattleboro, and received his commission in the Southern Regiment on Oct. 18, 1778, from New York. Col. Fletcher was from Vermont where he first received a commission as lieutenant from New York and served with Vermont forces during the war. Gen. Enos was from Conn. and an officer in the Continental Army. This shows that Amos Yaw's service was with the Yorker forces raised in southeastern Vermont, but attached to the Continental Army.

Engaged in the many incidents of the struggles between the various factions, the Yaw name appears in at least two of them, and there were probably others in which they took part without the name being recorded. In 1782 the Vermonters were levying recruits for service with the Vermont militia. A law passed by the Vermont General Assembly required those called either to serve or to pay their substitutes. The Vermonters made a practice of recruiting York sympathizers and levying against their property when they refused to serve. Such was the case of Joel Bigelow. When he refused to go or to pay, the Vermont sheriff

of Cumberland County was sent to seize property of Bigelow to sell and pay his levy. The property was a cow which Sheriff Rice was leading away. A group of Yorkers met Rice on the road and their captain ordered the militia men present to "Embody to rescue". The cow was seized and returned to Bigelow. Later Vermont militia arrested 33 Yorkers, all but two from Guilford, and charged them with disturbing the peace and obstructing justice. Among those arrested and indicted were Moses and Amos Yaw, Jr. The fine against Amos was pending until Feb. 28, 1784, when it was suspended.

Following the cow incident the Vermonters began what has been called the "Guilford War", an effort to overwhelm all opposition to the Vermont authority. Throughout 1783 there were minor encounters, but in January of 1784 Ethan Allen gathered a force of more than 300 militia and marched from Brattleboro toward Guilford. Some troops were sent to Marlboro and Halifax to arrest certain Yorkers, but the main force continued south into Guilford. When the two forces met there was a brief battle and Sergeant Sylvanus Fisk was wounded, and later died. The Yorkers finally fled before the superior arms going over into Mass. just to the south. Many of the Yorkers were later arrested for the death of Fisk and among these was Amos Yaw, Jr.

By mid-year the Yorkers realized that they were helpless and could not count on aid from the state of their allegiance, so 20 of them presented a petition to the General Assembly on July 24, 1784, in which they alleged that they had been loyal to New York by conviction, but now realized that the authority rested with the Vermont Assembly, they promised obedience and asked to be freed from all pending judgments, restored to citizenship, and their property returned to them. On July 27th the Assembly approved the petition of these 20 and also one of those still under indictment in the case of Sgt. Fisk. The only demand was that they appear before a Justice of the Peace and swear allegiance to Vermont. Among the petitioners were Amos Yaw and his son Amos. From this time on Vermont remained as a separate entity, governing itself until 1791 it became the first state to be admitted to the Union after the original 13 colonies.

Some of the Yorkers, who were the leaders, perhaps ones who did not choose to recognize Vermont's authority, felt that New York should recompense its adherents who had suffered such serious loss during the years of the Yorker-Vermont controversy. They presented claims amounting to over 16,000 pounds on behalf of the civilians and military. In Mar. 1786 New York authorized a tract of land in what was then Clinton twp., Montgomery Co., to be distributed to these claimants in proportion to their sufferings and losses. Later this area became part of Tioga Co., and now is the town of Bainbridge in Chenango Co. Among the claimants were: Amos Yaw, who received 193½ acres, Amos Yaw, Jr., with 214 acres, and Moses Yaw with 180 acres. This would have made their losses about 400, 430, and 360 pounds respectively. It has not been ascertained what these men did with tracts apportioned to them. Amos Sr. died in Vermont shortly after the land was assigned to him, and Amos Jr., and Moses continued to live in Vermont.

A Lincoln Anecdote.

George R. Potter (cf. page 47, #120), while serving as an attorney for an eastern railroad, called on Abraham Lincoln, then an attorney in Springfield, Illinois, for assistance in a railroad problem in the latter state. When the legal business was finished Potter asked Lincoln what he owed him. With characteristic modesty, and feeling that he had performed a very minor service, Lincoln remarked that if Potter would fill his ink-well it would be sufficient to cover all that he had done. Mr. Potter went out and purchased a gallon of ink and left it at Lincoln's office. Years later when Lincoln was President, he met Potter in New York and readily recalled the incident of years previous.

A Hard Winter Journey.

In the fall of 1808 Joseph Yaw (cf. page 39, #6) and Samuel Cochran made a trip across southern New York state from present day Steuben County to the site of Springville, Erie County, an airline distance of about eighty miles, but probably twice that far, as it was through an almost uninhabited area; very few roads were cleared of trees and part of the way there were not even blazed trails. They were looking for new lands on which to establish homes. At Cold Springs, as that part of Erie County was then called, and where they had heard that the Holland Land Company was offering fine farming lands, Yaw and Cochran found only two families. They liked the place and made arrangements to purchase a lot between them.

Their first task was to erect log houses in which to live while they developed their farms. Logs were the only material available and the first cabins were built without windows and the whole building raised without a nail, only pins in augur holes. Cochran's cabin had no door and was only partly roofed. As soon as possible he went back east to bring his wife, Catherine Gallup Cochran (cf. page 44, #30), a niece of Joseph Yaw.

With their few belongings loaded on a small sled pulled by two steers, Cochran with his wife and their six months old child started westward again, this time by a more northerly route, where some roads were already opened. They arrived in the area of Williamsville, not far from present day Buffalo. From there it was a hard trip to Cold Springs; snow, ice, and strong winds impeded their progress; fallen trees often had to be removed before the steers could pass with the sled. Nine days were spent on the trip through Hamburg, Boston, and down to their new home.

In crossing one river, they found that after freezing over, the water level had dropped and again frozen twelve inches below. Their sled broke through the upper ice and lodged so firmly under it that the steers could not move it. While trying to dislodge it night fell and Cochran took his wife and infant to an Indian lodge nearby. There a wild dance was going on but the Cochrans were well received. Leaving Catherine and the baby in the lodge, Cochran went with several Indians to extricate the sled, a task that took several hours.

Meanwhile it was a time of terror for the poor wife. The wild dancing continued with much howling and threatening gestures. One squaw took the baby and danced about the fire; another took the mother's fur coat and went outside. As Catherine knew nothing of Indians, save the many tales of their ferocity, she spent the time in agony and tears, much to the disgust of the Indians. When her husband returned late in the night, the family was given a place to sleep in the lodge, the steers were fed, and after breakfast they were all sent on their way with their belongings intact.

Sometimes they found lodging for the night in the cabin of a hardy pioneer in the wilderness, but at other times they slept on hemlock boughs under the protection of an uprooted tree. The last two days of this cold winter journey were spent in the nine-mile trek from Boston to Springville, delayed by fallen trees. At last they reached the cabin Cochran had built so hurriedly, and which was to be their home for some years. There they began a new life and raised a family of nine children, who survived the hardships of pioneering surprisingly well. One of the sons became President of Brooklyn College and Polytechnic Institute and another was a missionary in Persia for many years.

Joseph Yaw was not married at the time he went to Springville, but he established a home there and later married and raised his family under the same conditions as his niece and nephew. Pioneer life was hard and exacting, but these people proved themselves as possessing those sterling qualities which were necessary not only for survival but for success.

The following article most graciously contributed by Mr. Antonio Altamirano, protege and biographer of Ellen Beach Yaw, presents a resume of the life of this great artist of the Yaw family.

ELLEN BEACH YAW

The following are some of the facts on the life and career of the late and famous American Coloratura Soprano Madame Ellen Beach Yaw. Mme. Yaw was born in Boston, N.Y., in Erie County, on Sept. 14, 1869. She was the daughter of Ambrose Yaw and Mary Jane Beach. She had three brothers, Richard, Page, and Charles Bell Yaw, and one sister, Mrs. Anna Yaw Thorpe.

She attended the Springville Institute in New York State, where she learned shorthand and typing, which enabled her to take a position as secretary to a lawyer in Morris, Minnesota. Soon she had saved enough money to study voice culture under Charles Whitmore of Minneapolis. He was her first teacher, to be followed by some of the greatest masters in Europe and America: Gustavus Hall, Mlle. Bertini, Theodore Bjorksten, Mme. Torpadie, Enrico Delle Sedie, Maestro Bissaccia, Alberto Randegger, and finally for three years with the great Mathilde Marchesi in Paris.

Sir Arthur Sullivan composed his Opera, "The Rose of Persia", especially for Mme. Yaw, which had its premiere at the Savoy Theatre in London on Nov. 29, 1899, with Mme. Yaw singing the title role. In the Winter of 1902, she made her operatic debut in her favorite role as "Ophelia" in Ambroise Thomas' opera "Hamlet" at the Grand Opera House in Monte Carlo. This was fol-

lowed by many operatic appearances in the cities of southern France. On January 17, 1905 she made her Italian operatic debut singing the title role in Donizetti's "Lucia di Lammermoor" at the Teatro Il Quirino in Rome, Italy, singing under her Italian stage name of Signorina Elena Elvanna. This was followed by some twenty-three operatic appearances in the cities of Rome and Naples, Italy, plus other operatic appearances in Catania in Southern Italy. Returning to London, she appeared in the role of "Gilda" in Verdi's "Rigoletto" at the Waldorf Theatre on July 13, 1905.

In the 1880's and 1890's she made many concert appearances and concert tours in America and Canada. While William McKinley was President (1897-1901) she sang for him in his home town of Canton, Ohio, being warmly applauded by him. On April 15, 1902 in Paris, at the Opera Comique she appeared in the "Memorial" program for President McKinley, with some of the greatest artists of France: Sarah Bernhardt, Fugere, Rothier, Coquelin, Rejane, Maurel, etc.

On March 21, 1908 she appeared in the title role of Donizetti's "Lucia di Lamermoor" at the Metropolitan Opera House in New York City, with the great Italian Tenor Alessandro Bonci singing the role of Edgardo opposite her. For Mme. Yaw's Metropolitan debut the then Manager Henrich Conried assembled the greatest cast possible. She created a great sensation and received nine solo curtain calls after the famous "Mad Scene" and was obliged to repeat the Cadenza with flute obligato, the first time this had ever happened there. She was offered a three year contract with the Metropolitan Opera Company, but refused it due to the fact that her Concert Tours were more profitable financially and she was booked solid for years for concerts. After her Metropolitan appearance she went to Vienna, Austria, and thru Henrich Conried was offered a three year contract with the Vienna Opera, but this too had to be refused due to her concert tours.

In June 1897 for the first time she gave a benefit concert for the Newsboys Home, and after this great event the members of the Board decided to change the name of the Home in her honor; since then it has been known as "The Lark Ellen Home for Boys", and up to her passing, she and her sister, Mrs. Anna Yaw Thorpe, helped this great institution financially. "The Lark Ellen Home for Boys" is now located at Azusa, California, on land that Mme. Yaw had selected several months before her passing. In her will thousands of dollars were left to the Home.

The famous vocal range of Ellen Beach Yaw was from G below middle C to the E in Altissimo (the HIGHEST "E" on the piano) and she did vocal trills on 3rds and 5ths, a vocal feat not accomplished by a singer for several centuries. She is still credited with having sung the HIGHEST notes ever sung by the human voice.

Madame Yaw was the first famous singer to make phonograph records. In the studios of the Gramophone and Typewriter Company, now H.M.V., she recorded eight selections on March 11, 1899. This was followed by VICTOR Red Seal recordings in America on Sept. 25, 1907. On April 10, 1913, she recorded several selections for Thomas A. Edison in his studios in New York City. One of the selections was her charming concert composition, "The Skylark", where she ends the song with a B-flat ABOVE HIGH C, the highest note recorded of her great range. In Philadelphia she recorded

for KEEN-O-PHONE Records in 1913 also. In June 1937 she recorded in London her first electric record. In June 1941 she recorded the "Mad Scene" from "Hamlet" for CO-Art Records in Beverly Hills, California. Several months before her passing she made some home recordings, thus ending her recording career.

The beautiful sobriquet "Lark Ellen" was bestowed on her by General Harrison Grey Otis, founder of the great newspaper "The Los Angeles Times"; this was in the 1890's on first hearing her sing. In the town of Covina, California, a main street is named in her honor, i.e., "Lark Ellen Boulevard". Also, "Lark Ellen School", "Lark Ellen Hospital", "Lark Ellen Nursery" and, now no longer there, the old "Lark Ellen Station" where the street cars went by. She originally had her home and orange grove, a 15-acre ranch on Lark Ellen Boulevard, and in 1929 she built a home south of Covina, a music room made of glass; it was on this estate that in June 1934 she built and founded the "Lark Ellen Echo Bowl", where during the summers that followed, concerts were given to great audiences by soloists and a Symphony Orchestra which she founded. The acoustics were so perfect that an echo was discovered by Mme Yaw while singing out-doors. She would do vocal trills and runs and the audience was greatly charmed by the echo that reflected to perfection the sound of her great voice.

Lady Valerie Sussie Meux was responsible for much of Mme. Yaw's training and career. Lady Meux was at one time the wealthiest woman in England. It was she who sent Mme. Yaw to Paris to study with the great Marchesi.

She was married twice: in March 1907 to Vere Goldthwaite, a lawyer from Boston, Mass., where they were married. He passed on in Jan. 1912, and his ashes lie on her old estate. On Aug. 22 1920 she married her accompanist, Mr. Franklin Cannon. She divorced him in Sept. 1935; he died in New York City in 1953.

On Sept. 9, 1947 Mme Yaw passed on in her home, "Lark's Nest", in Covina, California. This date is California's Admission Day, and she, who was also known as "The California Lark", went to her final resting place on this great day. Her ashes are at Rose Hill Memorial Park in the little town of Whittier, California, founded by the early Quakers; also the ashes of her beloved sister, Mrs. Anna Yaw Thorpe, who passed on Jan. 17, 1945.

Final note by Mr. Altamirano: I donated the plaque for her final resting place, when on first seeing the original plaque, I was shocked to see her name abbreviated and the year of birth wrong. She left her unfinished manuscript of her life and career, "Flight of the Lark", which I am preparing for publication.
