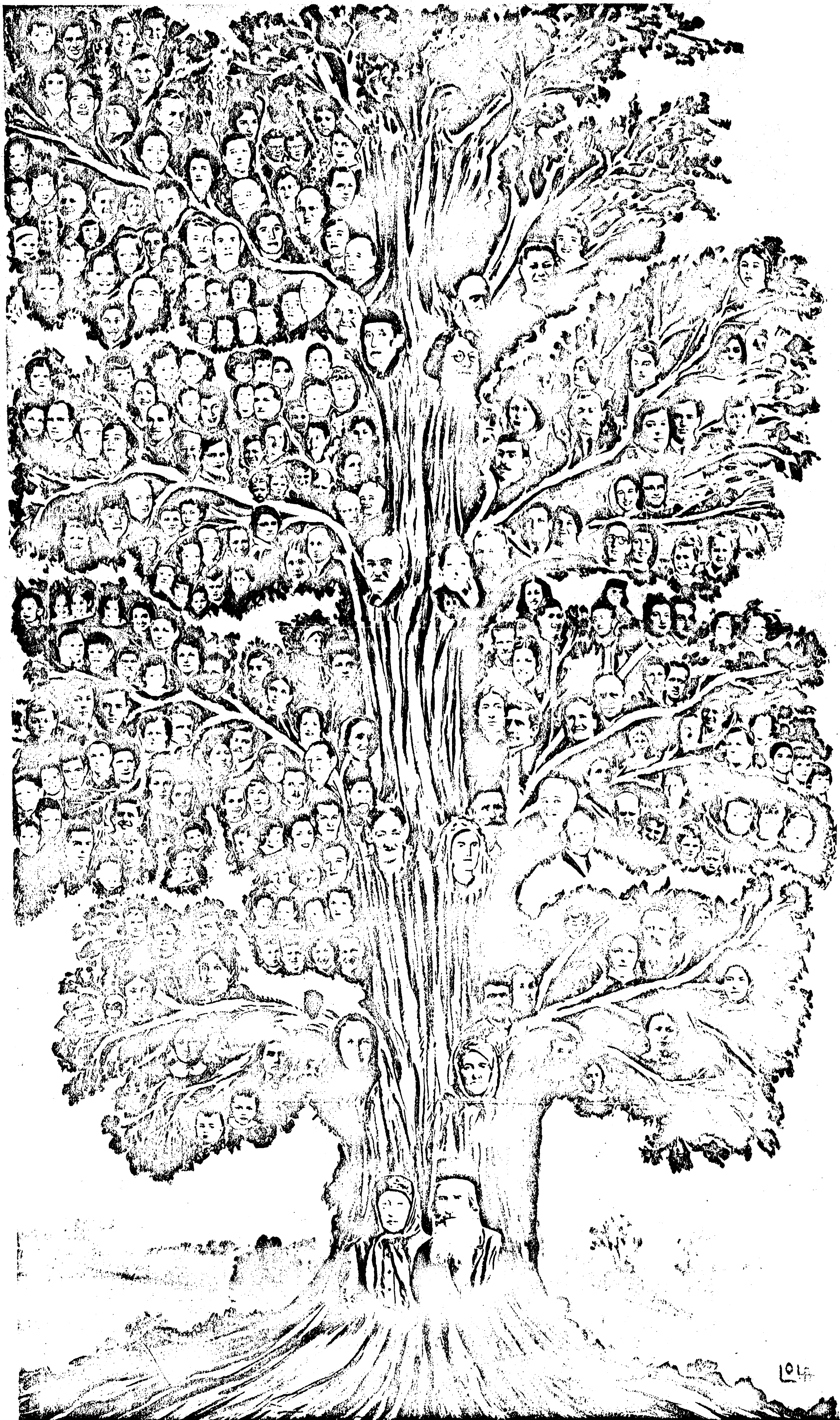

Preface

The idea of making an album of the family tree came into being a few months prior to the Golden Wedding Anniversary, in 1943, of Mendel and Nechama Zumoff. Mendel Zumoff (Zumsky) was the youngest son of Dov-Ber and Chaya-Riva Zumsky, who head the family tree.

The information and material required in an undertaking of this magnitude was not too easily obtained. This was due, in part, to the lack of systematic recording of births and deaths in the small towns of Russia, the infrequency of having photographs taken in the early 19th century, and the impossibility of obtaining any information from any of the descendants who may be living in the Soviet Union, or elsewhere, today. Of necessity, therefore, some of the dates of birth and especially death of the older members of the family, are missing. The lack of photographs, in some cases, is also attributable to this.

Despite these handicaps, however, the information contained in this album is as complete as it was possible to obtain. Individual family albums, personal recollections, correspondence between members of the family were some of the sources of information used in the compilation of material for this album.

The one who conceived the idea for this book was the oldest son of Mendel and Nechama Zumoff — Abraham Zumoff, without whose ceaseless labors this work could not have been brought to fruition.

The album was intentionally made in loose-leaf form, so that additional pages may be added for all the members of the family yet to come.

It is hoped that all the members of the family will keep their copies as cherished possessions — a pictorial record of the life and growth of a family.

DOV BER ZUMSKY was born in Malastovka, in the province of Mogilev, Russia, in the year 1831.

Root: DOV BER ZUMSKY & his wife, CHAYA RIVA.

At the very young age of 14, Dov ber married Chaya-Riva Ginsburg.

Although both were very young the couple decided to start life "on their own" away from their parents. (This was an unusual occurrence in those days.) To this end, they settled in the town of Korop, in the province of Chernigov, a distance of some 350 miles from their birthplace.

Here, Dov Ber earned his livelihood as a Melamed (a children's hebrew teacher) while the young bride became a busy housewife.

Of the ten children born to them, two died at an early age; the others attained manhood and womanhood. The first seven of these children were daughters. The eighth was a son, followed by another daughter and the final offspring was a second son.

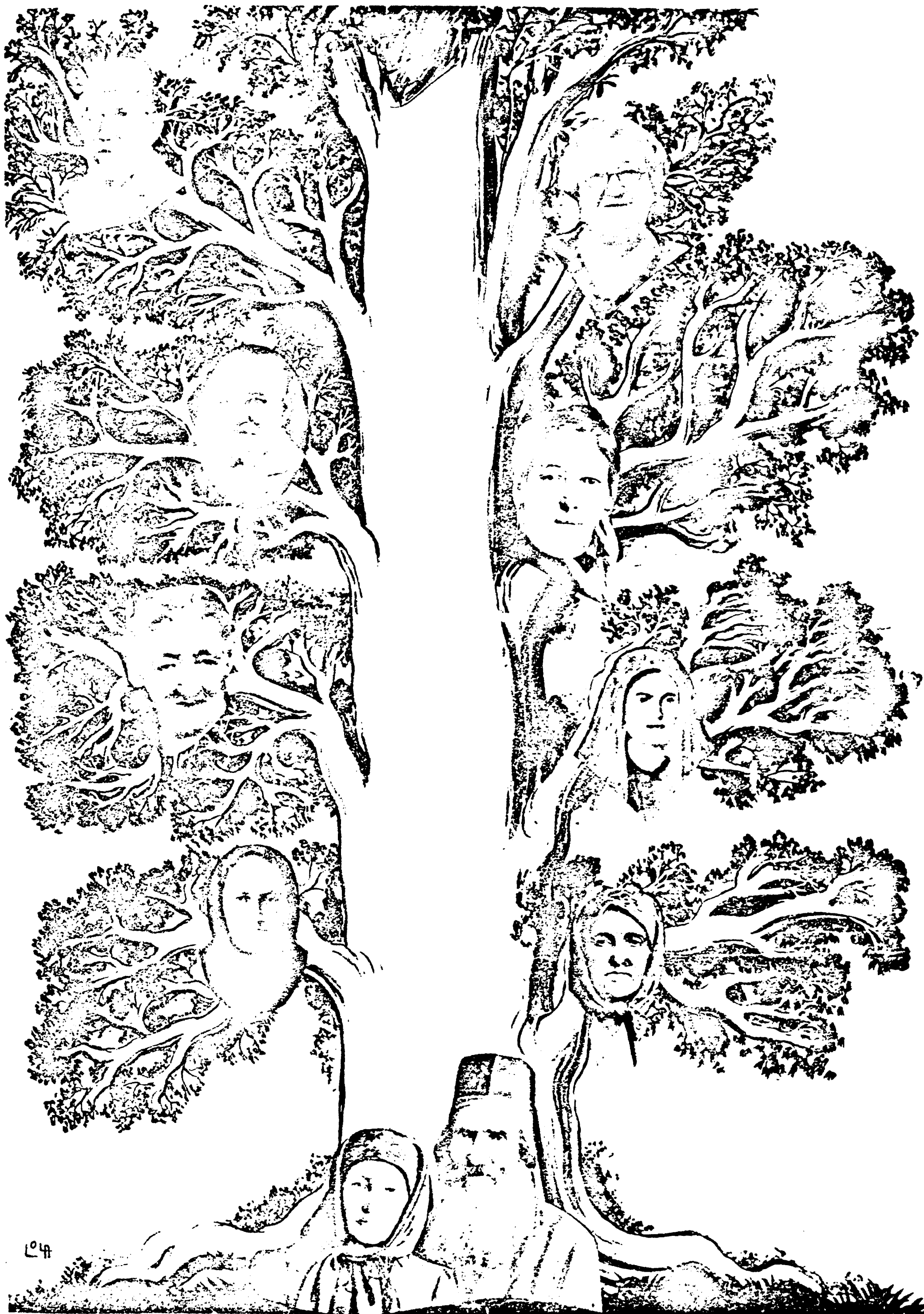

A few years after he had established his home in Korop, Dov Ber changed his occupation from Melamed to Candle Maker (candles were just coming into use then).

Dov Ber changed his occupation yet a second time. Together with his two young sons, he went into the manufacture of soap.

Financially, Dov Ber never attained success, but from a social viewpoint, the reverse was true. He achieved a position in the community that brought him admiration and respect not only from the people of his own town of Korop, but from surrounding towns as well.

Dov Ber died at the age of 78, and was buried in Korop. His wife, Chaya Riva survived her husband by nine years and died at the age of 91. She was also buried in Korop.

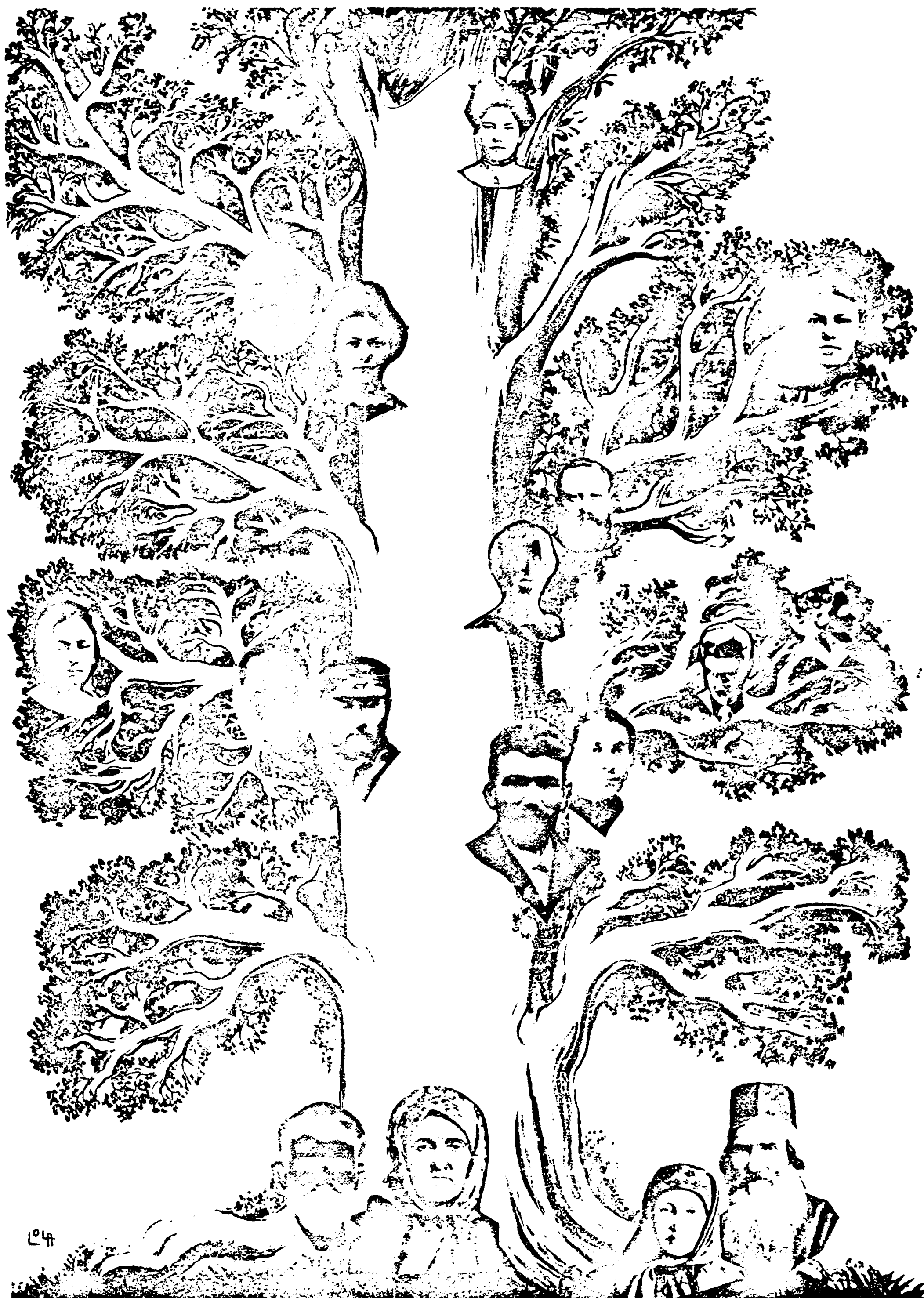

History of

DANYA GUTIN (nee Zumsky)

Danya was born in the city of Korop in the province of Chernigov. No date is available. She received a Jewish education, as much as it was customary to give women at that time. At the age of 16, she married Zusie Gutin of the city of Malastovka, the birthplace of her father. They settled in Novozibkov. Five children were born to them. Her husband Zusie died at an early age and Danya remained a widow for the remainder of her life.

Her husband Zusie Gutin was a melamed (hebrew teacher). Little is known about him except that he was an excellent swimmer. This aptitude for swimming was a direct cause of his death, since in a vain attempt to recover the body of a drowned person, he contracted a severe cold and died. He left his widow with five small children. Unfortunately, no picture of him exists.

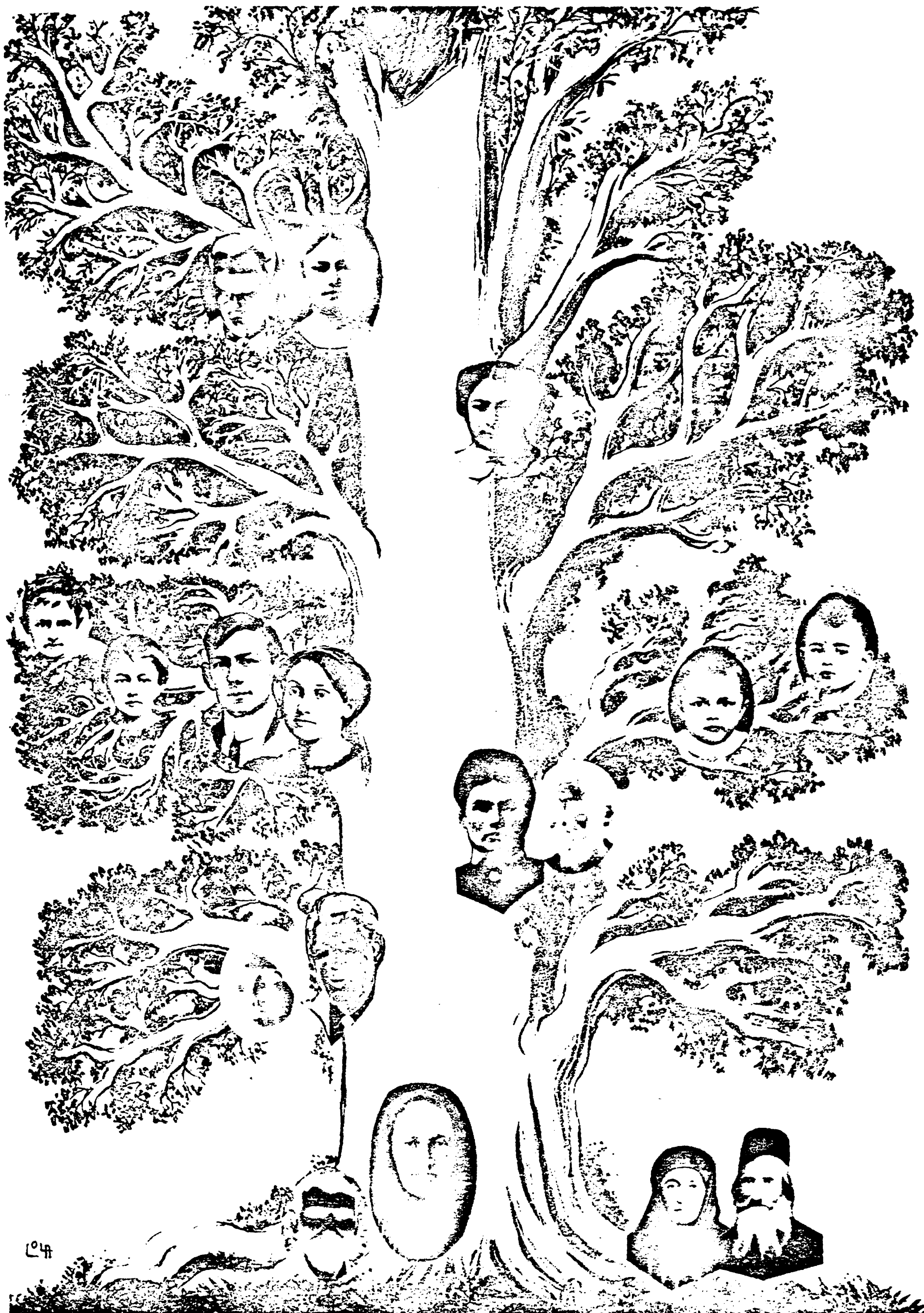

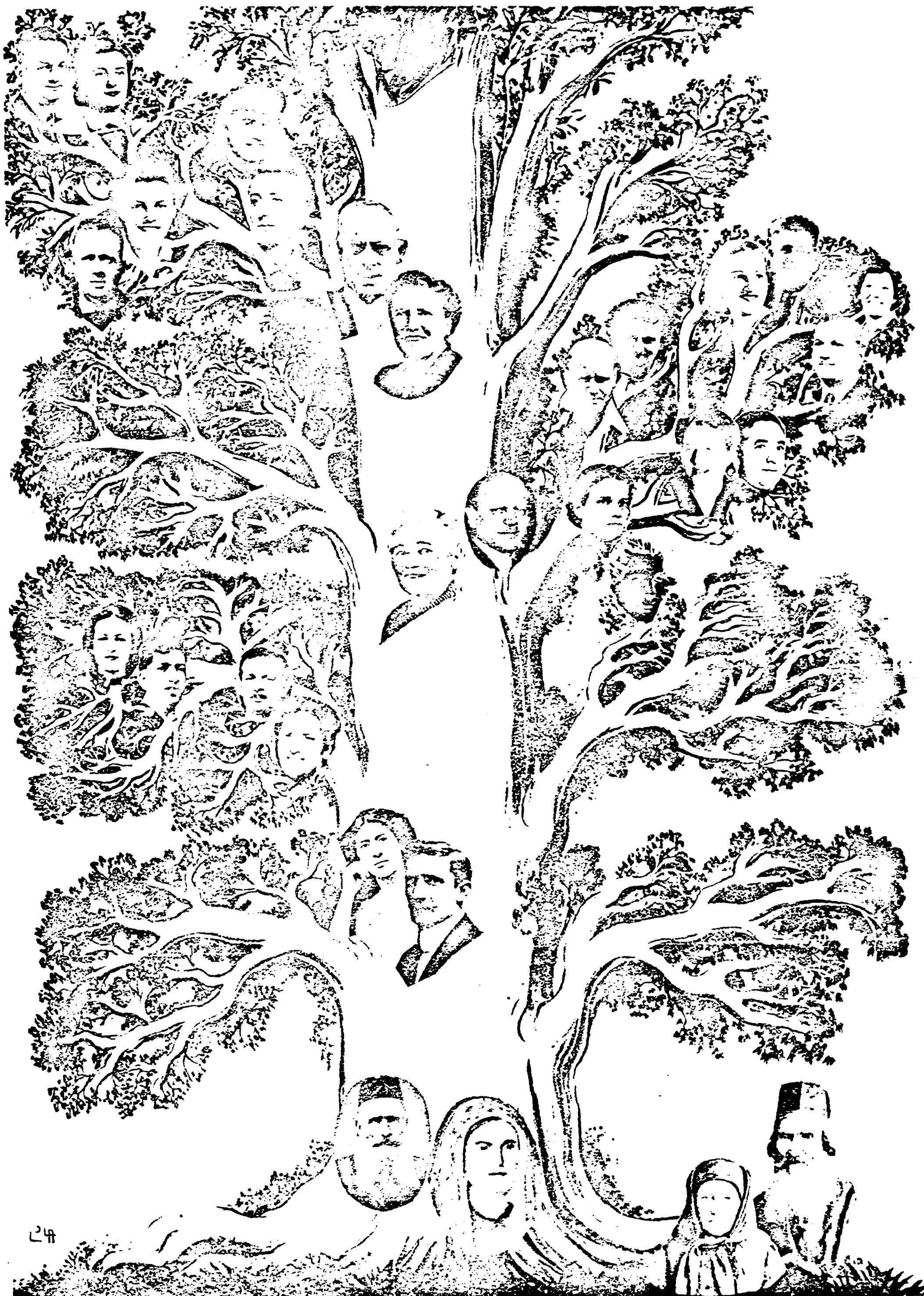

Born in Korop, Mary received her education at home. She married Isaac Hindin and made her home in Krolevitz, the same city in which her older sister Dvosha lived. There she raised a family of three children. She died soon after her youngest daughter, Ida was born.

Isaac Hindin was engaged in the making of soap and candles. In connection with his candle making he was called upon to make the ornamental lighting for the City celebrations in the town of Krolevitz, since that was the only source of illumination.

History of

LUBA RUDIN(SKY)
(nee Zumsky)

Born in the City of Korop, Russia, in the province of Chernigov, in the early 1860's.

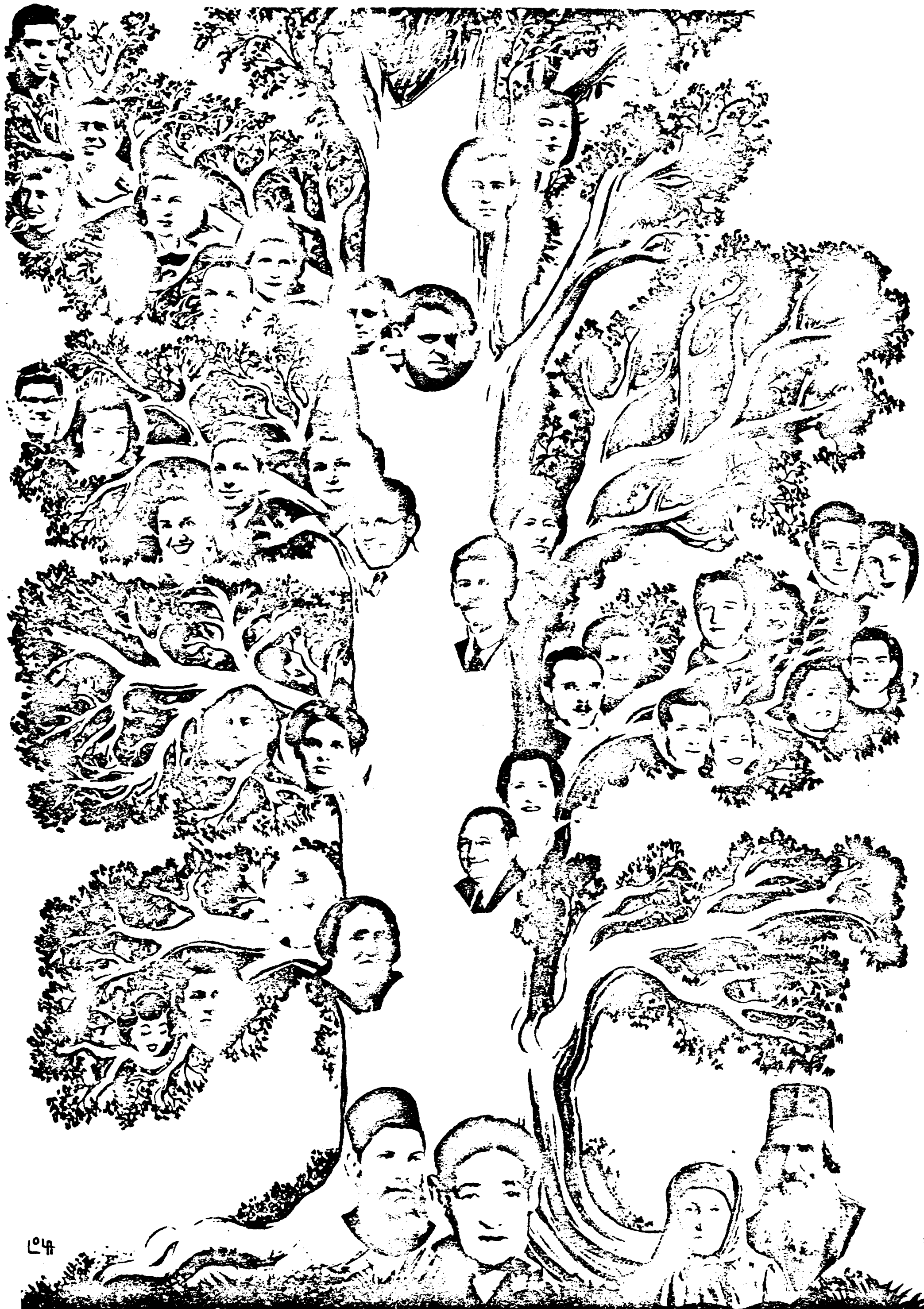
She received a good Jewish education, which enabled her to be a great help to her father, who was a 'melamed' (hebrew teacher).

She was quite young, when she married Note Rudinsky and settled in the city of Kamenskoye, near Ekaterinoslav, Russia. Her husband was also a "melamed" and Luba's education and knowledge of Yiddish again stood her in good stead, so she could help him in his work. Finding themselves beset by financial difficulties, Luba was again able to help by selling bread and cakes, which she baked herself, in order to add to their income. Her husband died while still a fairly young man and Luba returned to the city of Korop, with her youngest son.

Many years later she remarried. Her second husband, Isaac Hindin, then a widower, was formerly a brother-in-law, having been married to her sister Mary. Not long after their marriage, Isaac Hindin died, leaving Luba a widow for the second time.

In the early 1920's, she emigrated to the United States, where three of her sons, Sam, Nathan and Aaron, were living. She lived in Philadelphia for the remaining seventeen years of her life and died at the age of 87.

She is interred in Philadelphia.

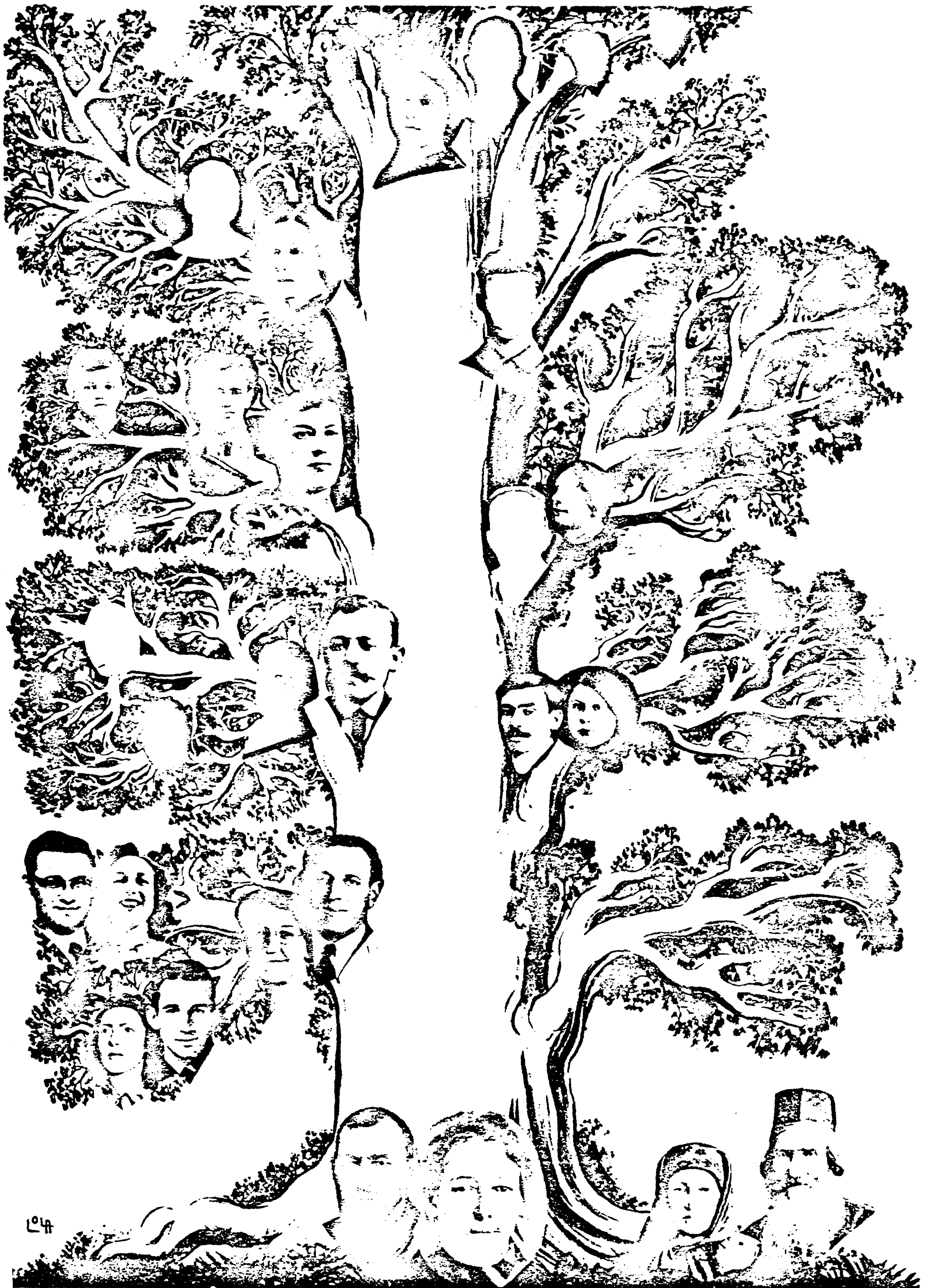

Basheva was born in Korop, and educated at home. After her marriage to Joshua Yaffe, she moved to the city of Konotop, where she and her husband raised a family of eight children. BENZION ZUMSKY

*(Known in America as Benjamin Zumoff
also Benzion Zumoff)*

*Born in an age when sons were consider-
ed to be of prime importance, the arrival
of Benzion was indeed a reason for rejoic-
ing. He was the first son after the birth
of seven girls. He received an education
both in Jewish and Russian.*

*Because of economic circumstances, Ben-
zion began to work at an early age. To-
gether with his younger brother, Mendel,
he helped his father in the soap manufac-
turing business; he was the salesman of
the firm although he was familiar with the
manufacturing end of the business.*

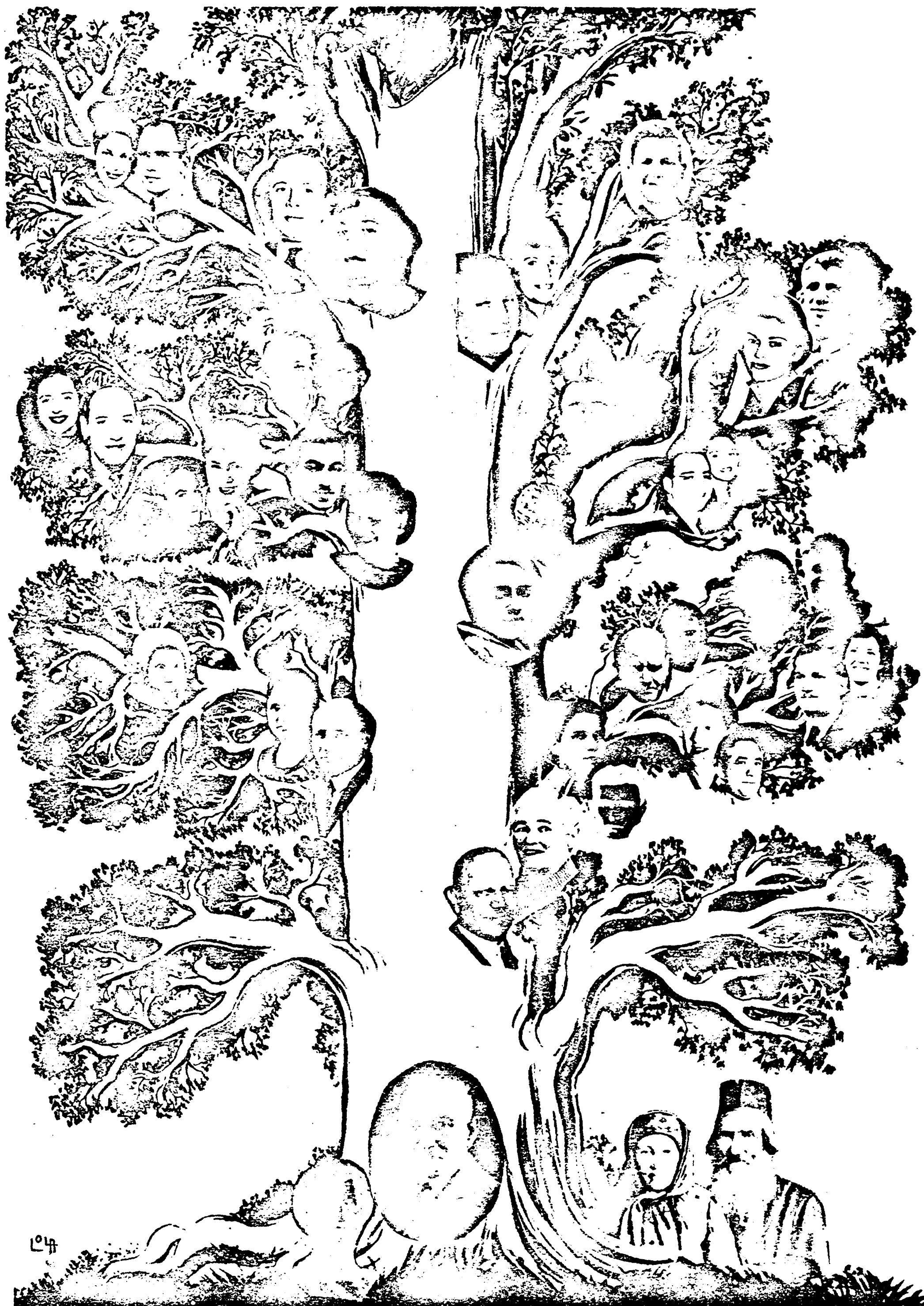
*His wife Dveira Beila, bore him six child-
ren. In 1904 Benzion and his family came
to America and settled in Philadelphia.*

*Shortly after their arrival, his wife died
and he remained a widower for the next
fifteen years.*

*His second wife Mary, lived with him for
eight years and then, for the second time
Benzion became a widower.*

*Although he came from an old world en-
vironment, Benzion quickly acclimated
himself to the modern ways of the new
world; yet, despite his belief that all im-
migrants should adopt the new life of Am-
erica, he was extremely tolerant of those
who found it more difficult to shed their
old beliefs and customs. This tolerance
gained for him, the respect of all who knew
him.*

SOPHIE BLUM (nee Zumsky)

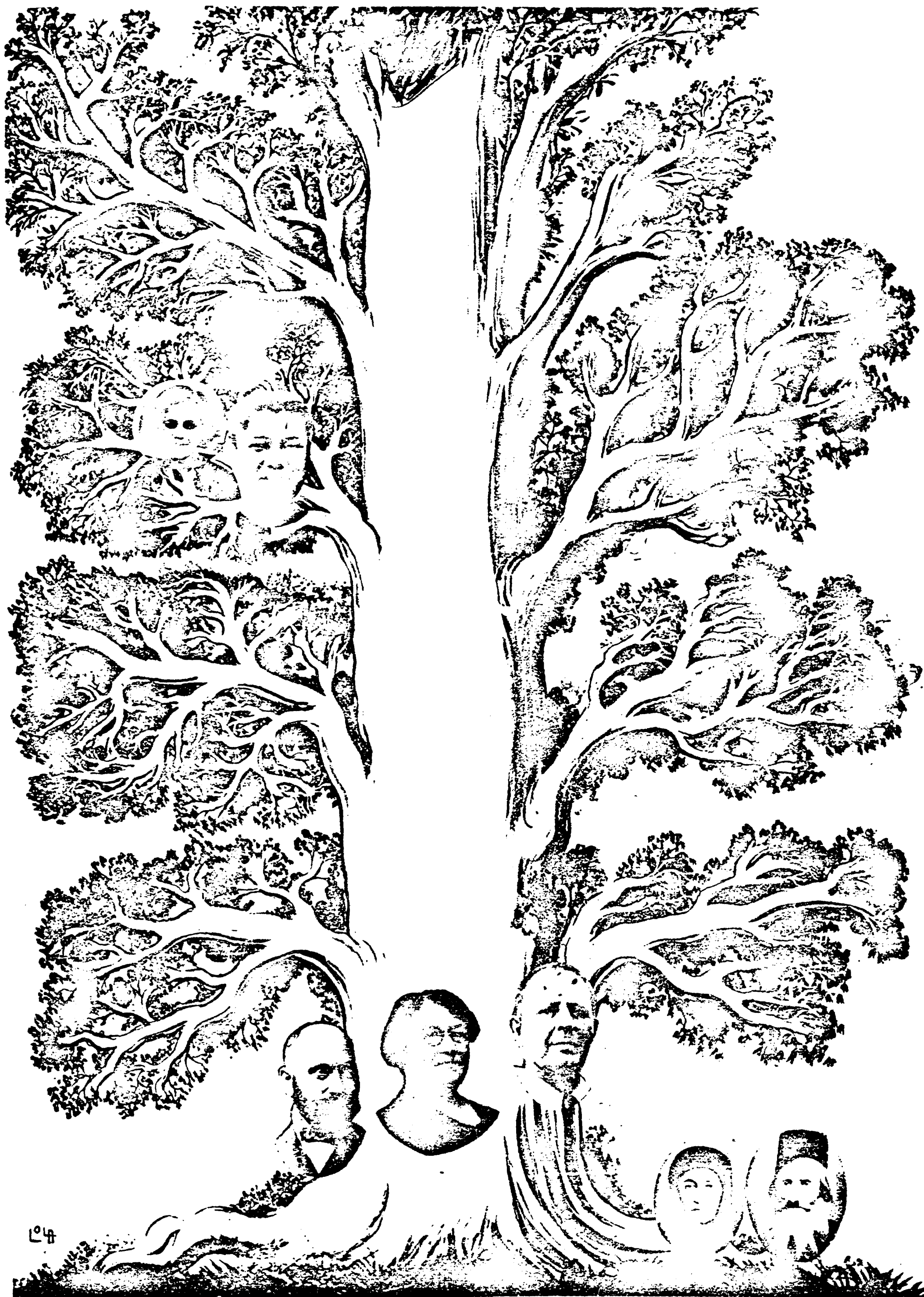
Born in Korop, Sophie received the same education as her other sisters and like them, she married at an early age; however, her first marriage was not a successful one and was annulled. Her second marriage was equally unsuccessful and soon afterward, she emigrated to America.

She made her home in New York from which point she traveled extensively. While visiting in Philadelphia she met Jacob Blum, whom she later married. She subsequently made her home in Philadelphia where she gave birth to a son, Solomon.

After the death of her husband, Jacob, she remained a widow for many years.

Once more she took to travelling and on one of her trips, she met, then married, Herman Guerman.

Sophie was a business woman and her extensive travels brought her into contact with many and varied classes of people. She was keen and intelligent and could be classed as worldly wise in every sense of the word.

Sam and his wife, Golde, had two children - a son, and a daughter.

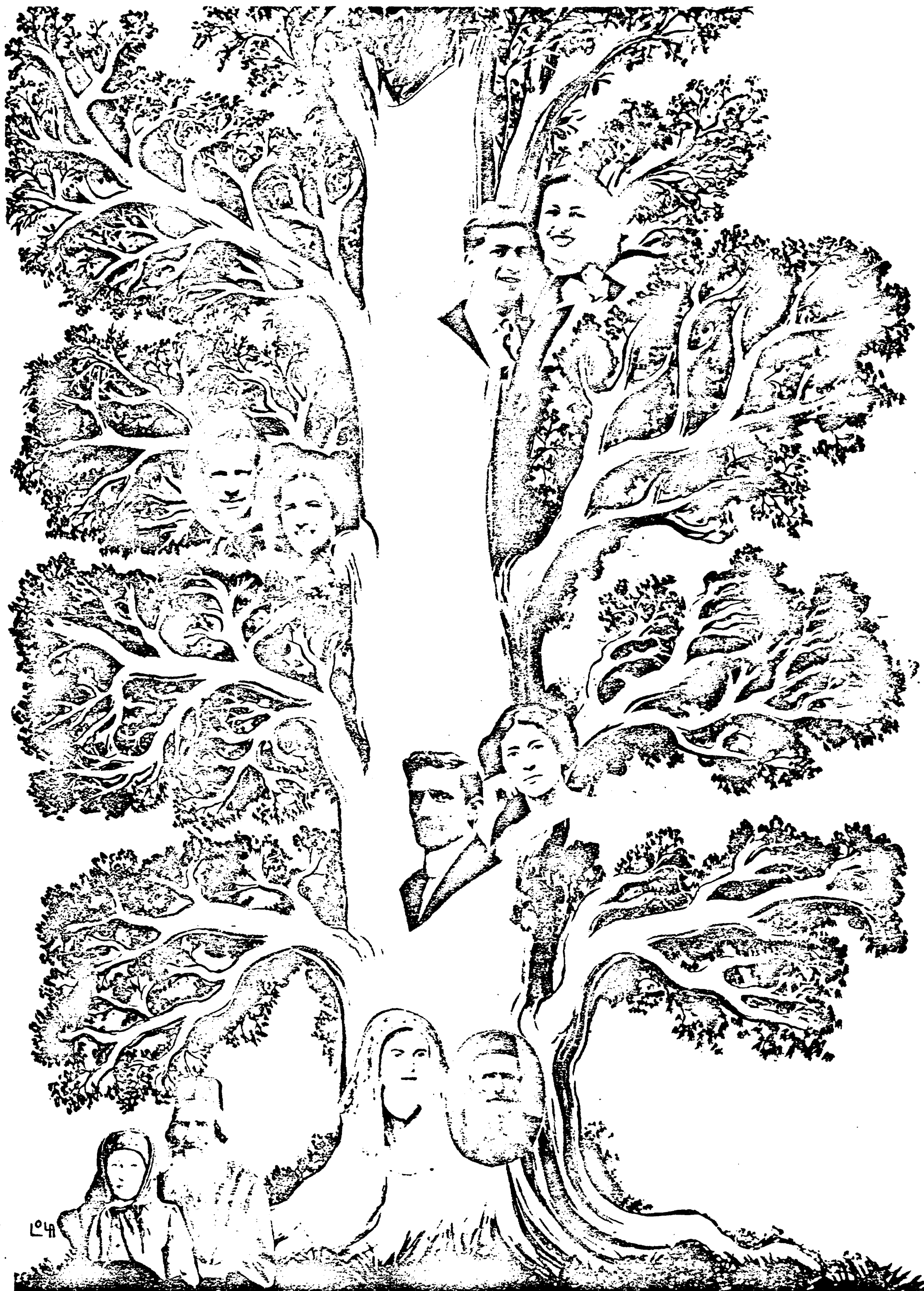
Until his death, in 1931, Sam Hindin was vitally interested in labor and fraternal organizations and was extremely active in these groups.

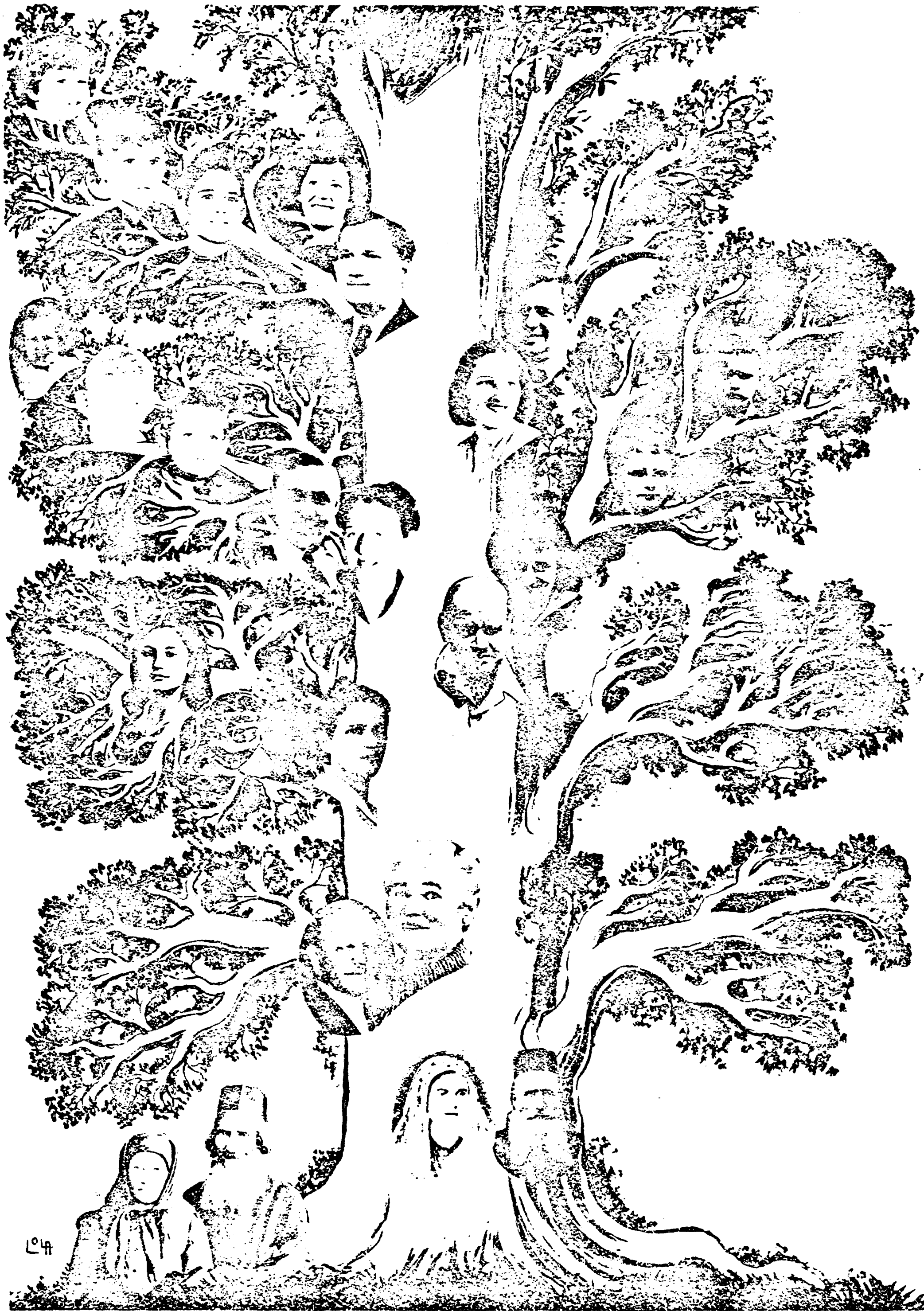

History of

IDA ZWIBACK (nee Hindin)

Ida was born in 1888 in Krolovetz, Ukraine (Russia). Her mother, Mary, died when Ida was less than one year old. In her early years Ida attended cheder (Hebrew school) and public school; she graduated from the pre-seminar school at the age of 14. A year later she gave private lessons in Jewish and general Russian.

At the age of 18, Ida migrated to America with her brother, and on March 14, 1906 they arrived at the Port of Philadelphia. For five years, she worked in various shops. During a ten week strick in the trade in 1910 she met Lou Zwiback and after a courtship of nine months, married him in April of 1911. Her first child, Abraham, was born in April 1913; a second child, Miriam arrived in November of 1914.

In 1915, the family left Philadelphia in search of a livelihood and settled in the West Pennsylvania town of Barnesboro. There she and her husband opened a tailor shop. It was a three year stay, during which they lived through the dreadful epidemic of Infantile Paralysis of 1916 and the dramatic send-off of the sons of foreign-born parents into World War I.

In 1918, they left Barnesboro, Pa. and went to Youngstown, Ohio, where she and her husband opened a grocery store. A few months later the war was over and with it, the prosperous years. On November 9, 1919, her third child, Lillian was born. The flu epidemic which raged in those years got the whole family down, but they escaped any serious consequences.

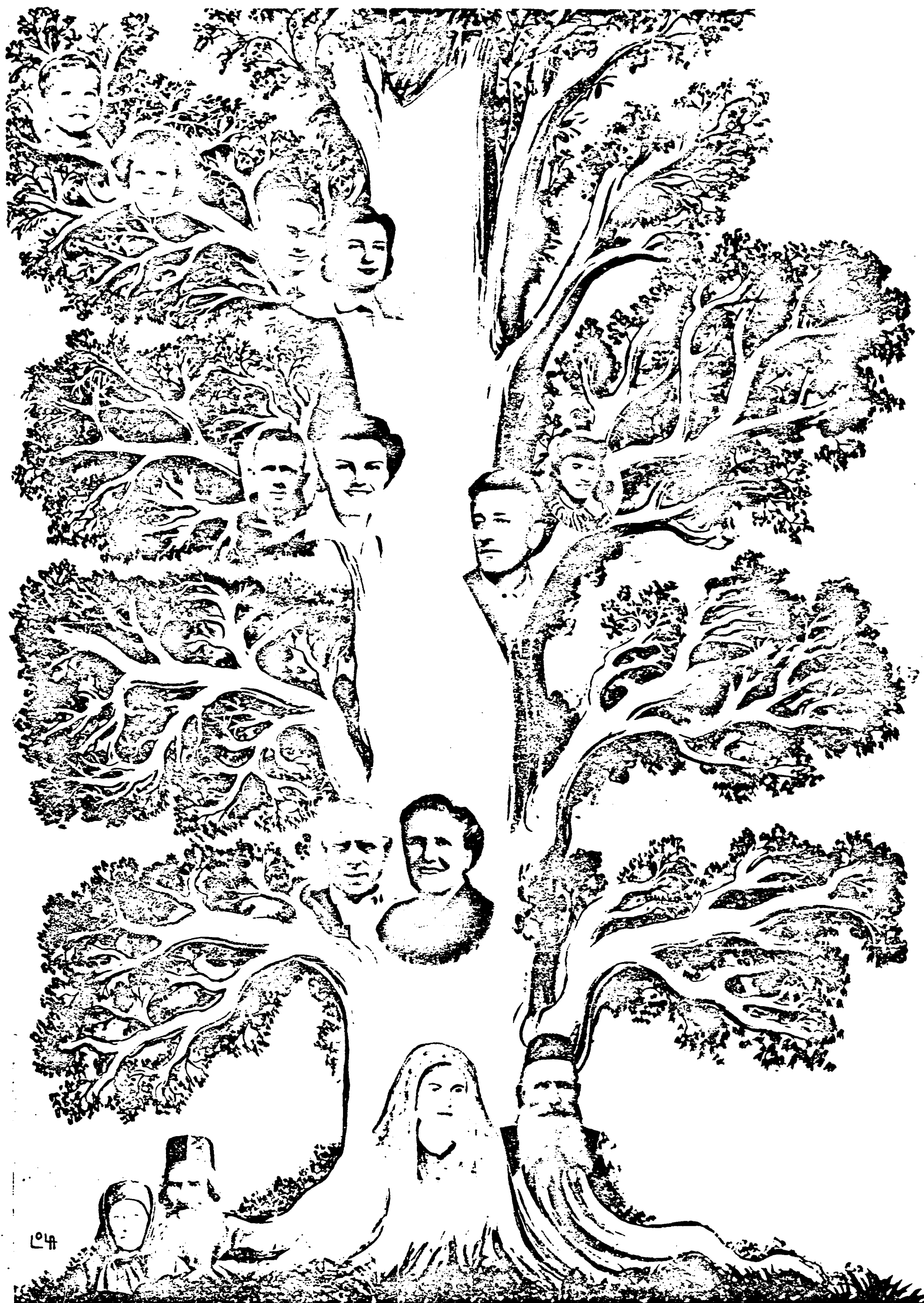

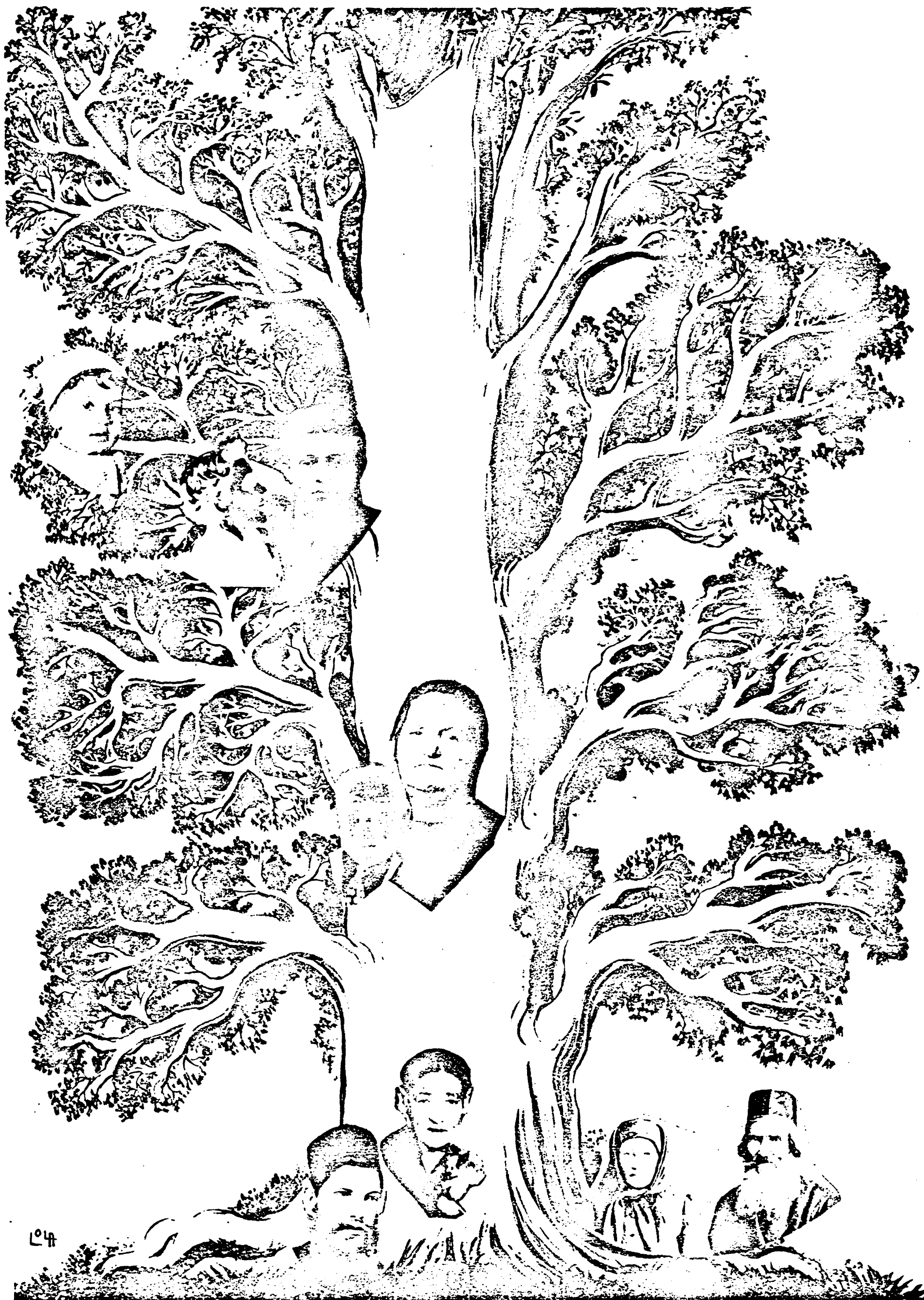

SAM (ZIAMA) RUDIN

Sam was born in the city of Korop, Russia. He was educated in Yiddish by his father, who was a melamed, and by other melamdin. He also learned a little of the Russian language.

Because his parents had a large family and often found themselves in financial and economic distress, Sam was obliged to seek employment when still a very young man. He learned the trade of cap making and travelled through many cities of Russia seeking such work as was to be had in this line.

After a number of years, he came to America and settled in Philadelphia where he learned a new trade by which he earned his living, as an operator in the garment industry. He was extremely interested in the labor movement in general and in his own industry in particular. He, therefore, became very active in his union and served on the Executive Board for many years. He was also interested in fraternal orders and for many years served as financial secretary

of the Workmen's Circle Branch of which he was a member.

Sam married his second cousin, Manya (nee Bolotin) who was a daughter of Chaya, sister of his grandfather Dov Ber Zumsky. Sam and Manya had five children, whose pictures are shown here, together with their children, (Sam's grandchildren).

Several years after the death of his wife Manya, Sam married Sophie Slavsky.

Sam died in 1945. He is interred in Philadelphia.

MANYA RUDIN (nee Bolotin) was born in Korop, Russia. She was the daughter of Chaya, a sister of Dov Ber Zumsky. In her teens, without adult help, Manya solely operated and maintained an "appetizer" shop in the market-place of Korop.

After marrying her cousin (Sam Rudin) they migrated to America and settled in Philadelphia.

SOPHIE RUDIN (nee Slavsky) was born in Russia in 1898. At the age of 13 she came to the U.S.A. Six years later, she married; of this marriage two children were born. In January of 1937 her husband died and Sophie obtained employment in the garment trade. For a number of years she was an active union member.

Sophie married Sam Rudin in April of 1941.

NATHAN: Son of SAM and Manya Rudin; grandson of LUBA and Note Rudinsky; great grandson of DOV BER and Chaya Riva Zumsky was born in Philadelphia, Pa. on April 21, 1910, in which city, he attended grammar and high school. He is presently engaged as a Teacher of Piano.

On November 1, 1942, Nat married Alma Arinsberg. They have two children: Nancy Sue Baner, born November 22, 1937 and Judith Myra Rudin, born December 1, 1943.

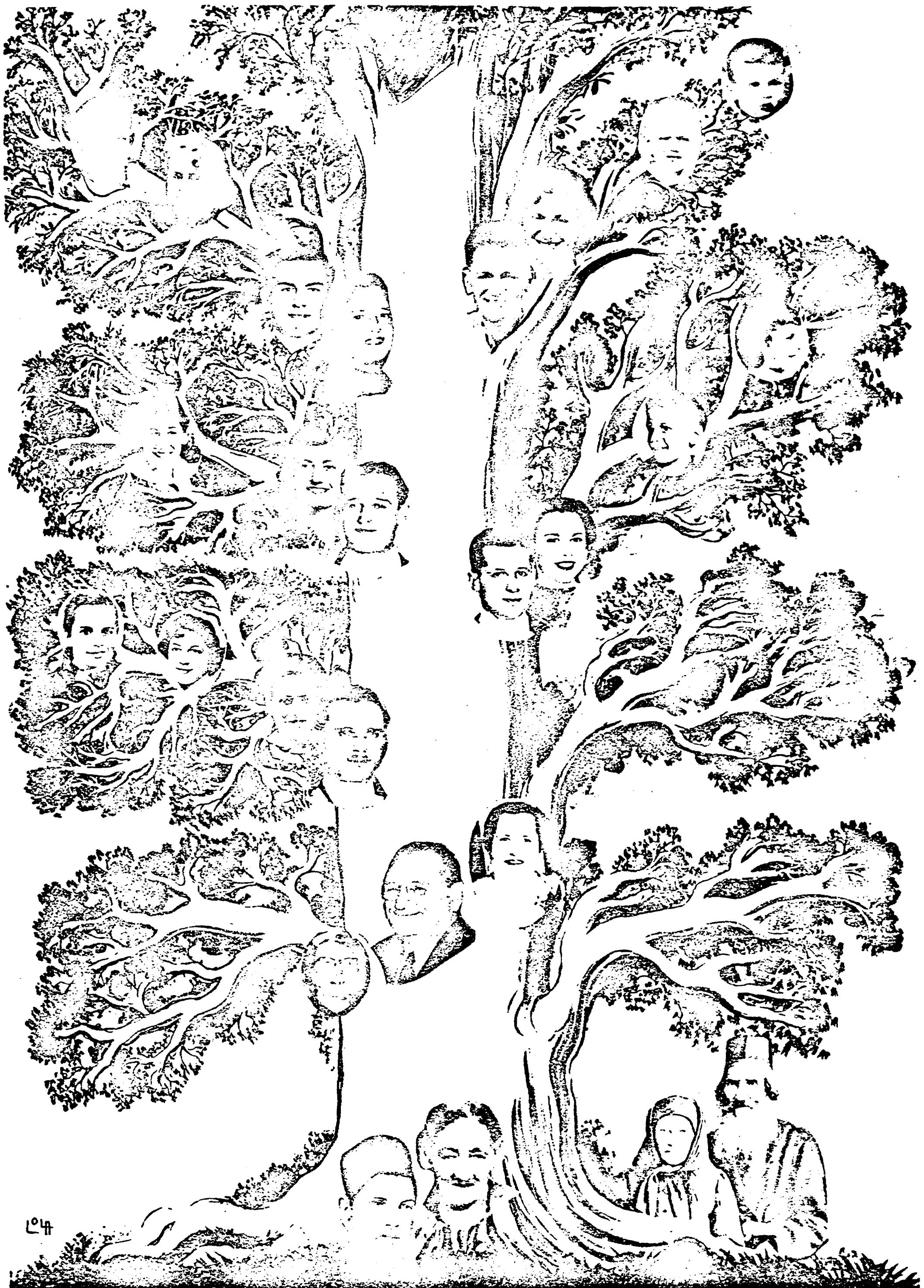
Sol jointed the Navy in June 1944; attended various training stations and air bases throughout the United States and was discharged at Terminal Island, California in June 1946.

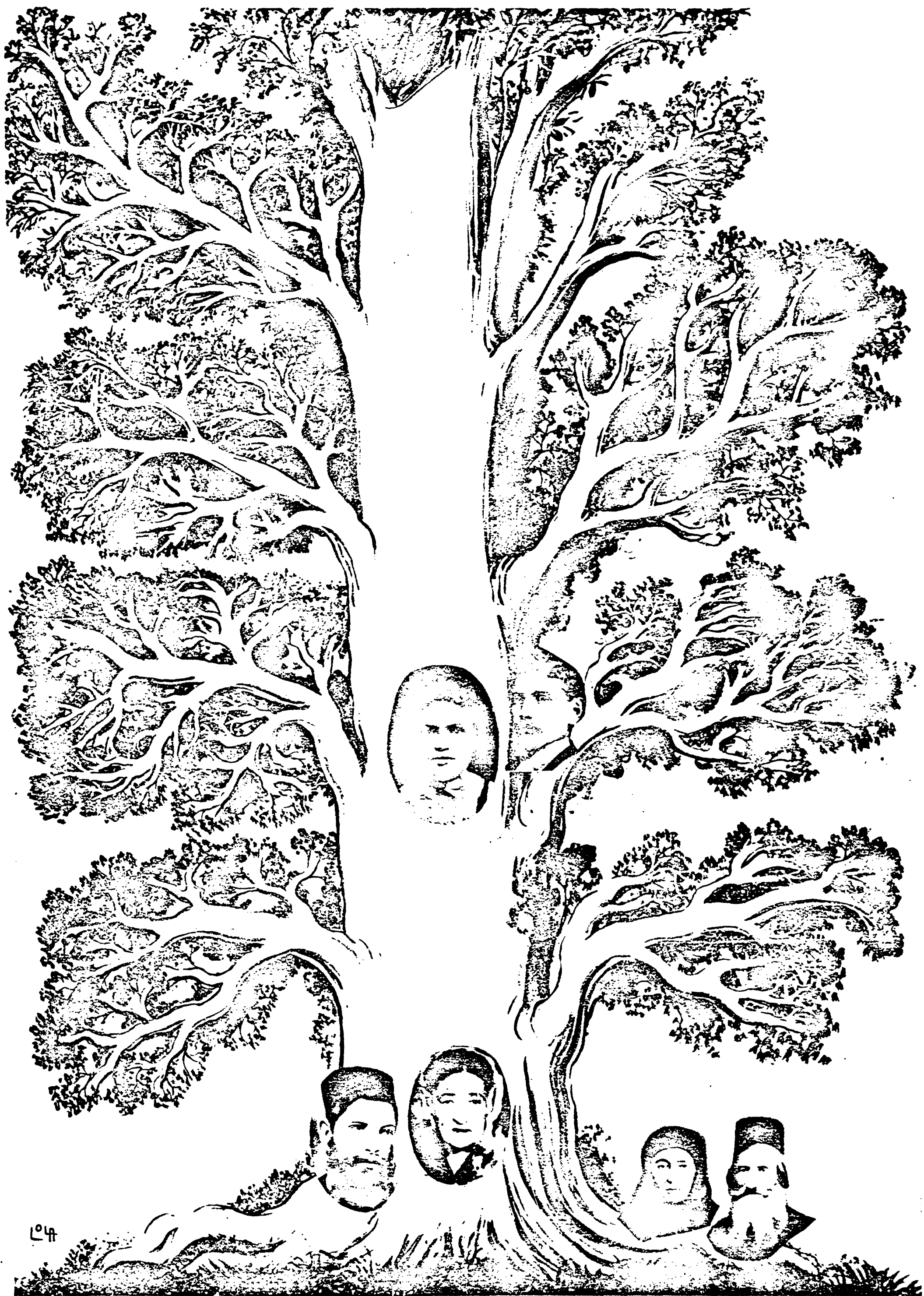

Schleima was born in Korop, province of Chernigov, Ukraine, Russia. As a young boy, with his parents, sisters and brothers, he moved to Kamenskoye, near the city of Ekaterinoslav.

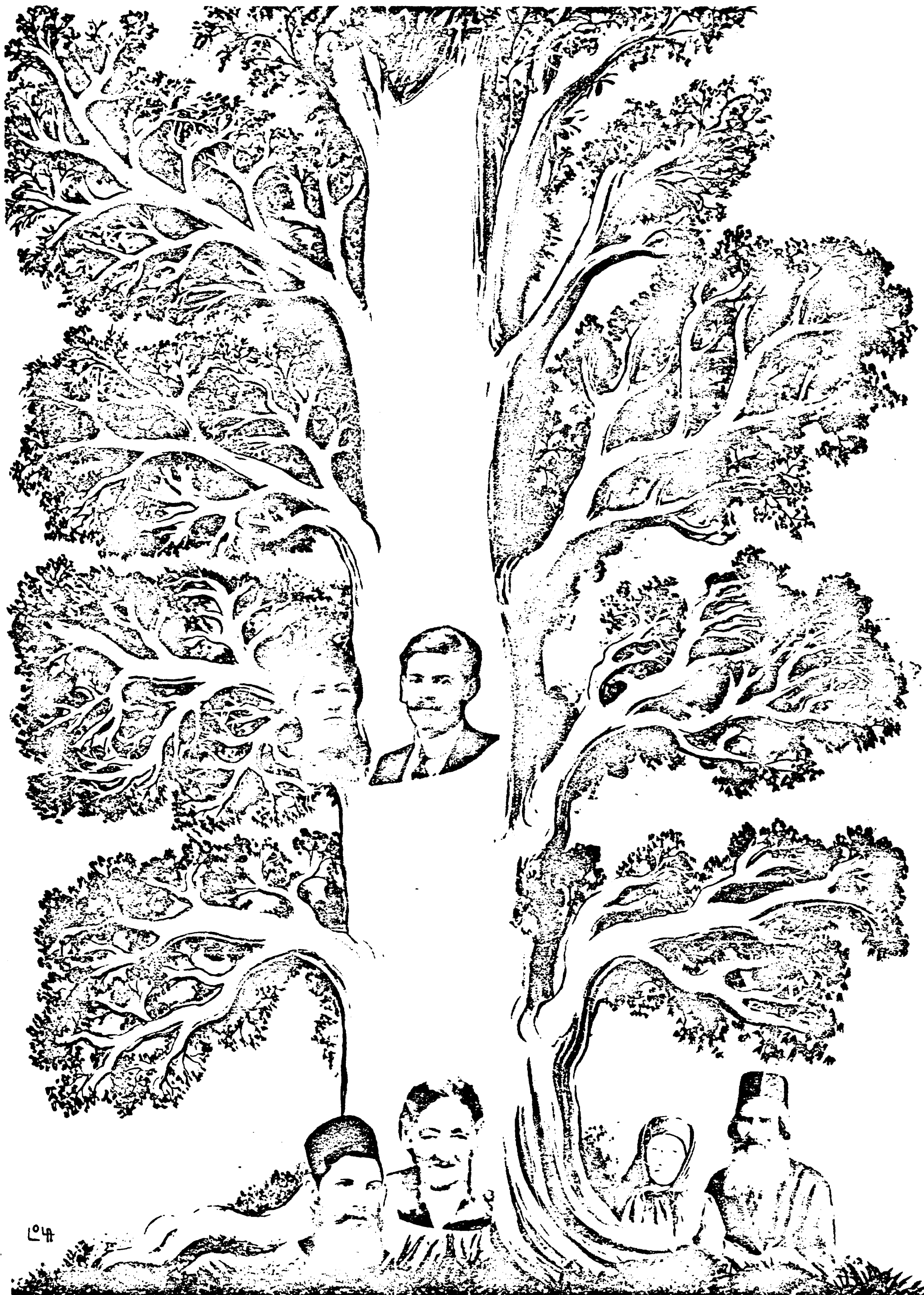
He received a good Jewish education and learned a little of the Russian language.

The financial difficulties of his parents, who had a large family to raise, made it necessary for the young Schleima to learn a trade in order to help the family budget--and later to help make his own way. He became a locksmith and an excellent mechanic and worked in a number of cities including Kiev, (the late capitol of Ukraine).

In the years, prior to World War I (about 1910 to 1912) he returned to Korop, the city of his birth, where he spent a few years as a melamed (teacher of Yiddish). Later Schleima settled in Niezin, Ukraine and was engaged in some business enterprise. There he married.

His last known residence was in Moskow, Russia. Schleima had three children. Their names and histories, as well as the name of his wife, could not be learned.

He had two sisters and four brothers. Their names and histories are related on the preceeding and following pages of this album.

History of **NATHAN RUDIN**

Nathan was born in Korop, province of Chernigov, Ukraine, Russia, on October 15, 1890. There he began his Yiddish schooling. When he was seven years of age, his parents and the family left Korop for the city of Alferovci, near Kamenskoye and Ekaterinoslav, where he continued his Yiddish education and also learned some of the Russian language.

At a comparatively early age, he, as his brothers, had to find a trade and he chose to learn the trade of bookbinding. He worked in a number of cities as a bookbinder and became very proficient in his work.

As was the custom of the time, he was called to military service, but was able to avoid serving in the Czarist forces by coming to the United States in 1914. Here in the city of Philadelphia, his new home, Nathan continued his profession of bookbinding.

In 1921, he married Rose Karack. They have two children:

Edward and Lorraine.

Nathan and Rose now reside in a suburb of Philadelphia.

History of AARON RUDIN

Born on May 2, 1892, Aaron is the sixth child of Note and Luba Rudinsky. He spent his childhood in the town of Kamenskoye, near Ekaterinoslav, and began to work at the age of 12. After the Pogrom of 1905, he travelled in the Ukraine and the Crimea, then emigrated to the United States in September of 1912.

Both in Russia and in his early years in America, Aaron was a cutter and operator in the shoe industry. In the '30s while residing in Roosevelt, New Jersey, he turned to something new, this time becoming an operator in the ladies' hats trade and at this, he worked for a number of years.

About two years after his arrival in the United States, Aaron married Fannie Veton, with whom he had two children: Lillian and Anne. In February 1920, during the influenza epidemic, Fannie Rudin passed on.

Aaron remarried on May 23, 1923. His second wife was Rebecca Greenstein. Misfortune again struck him when his second wife died in July 1931 as a result of an appendectomy. Of this marriage there is a son, Norman, born on March 26, 1924.

In 1932, Aaron married Rose Sokolick. Their son, Bernard, was born on July 7, 1934. For many years they lived in Roosevelt, N. J. but they are now residing in Philadelphia.

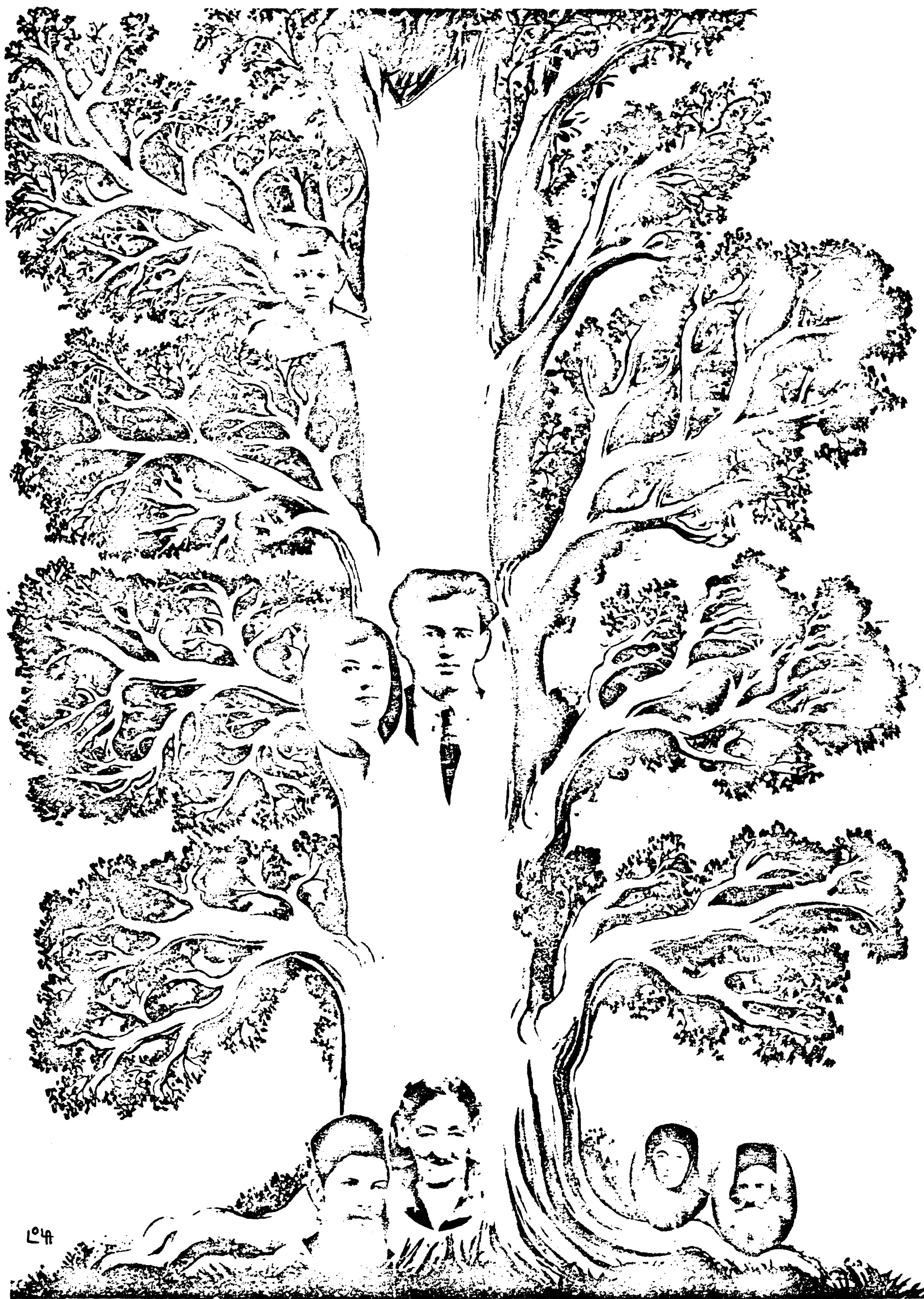

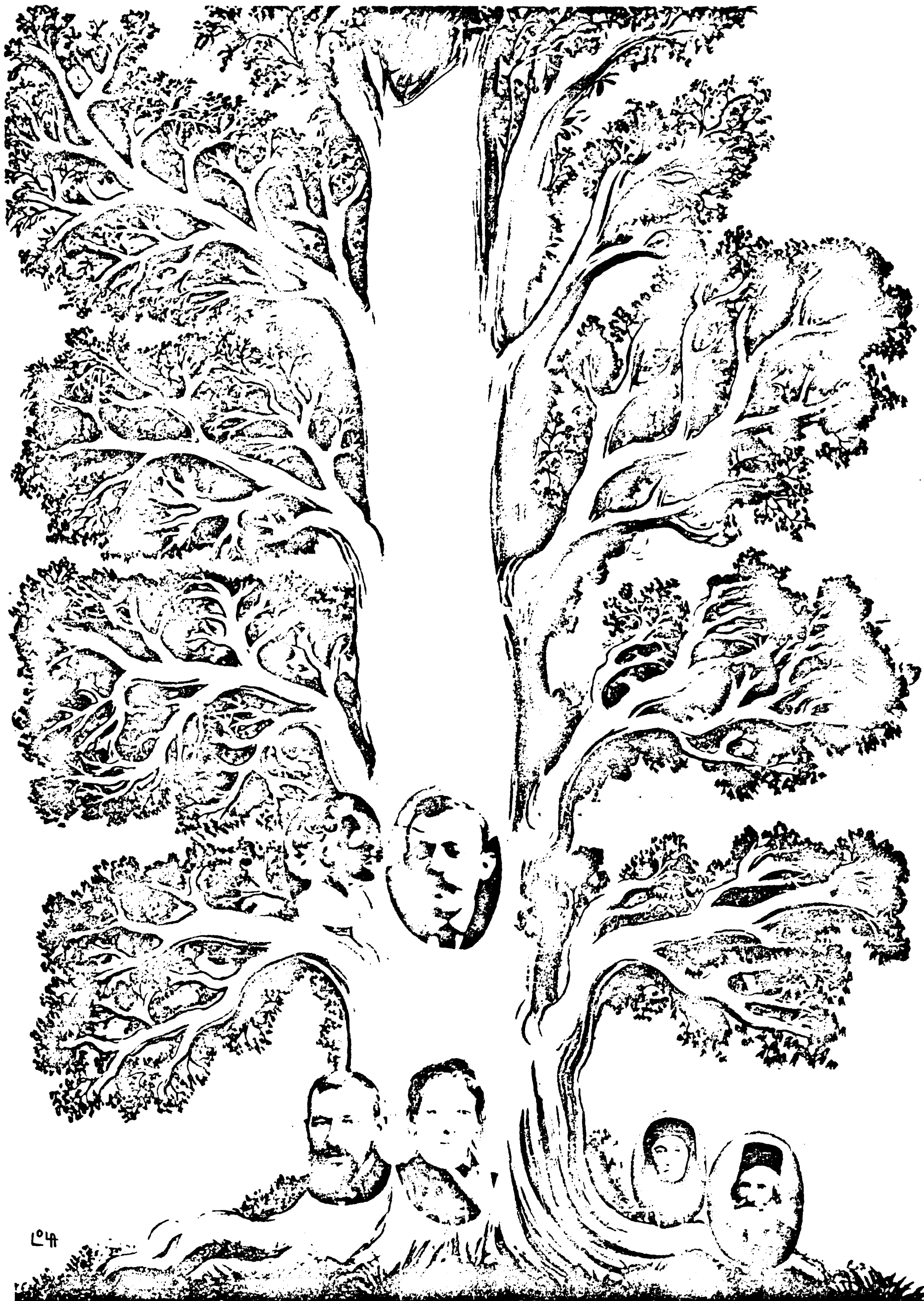

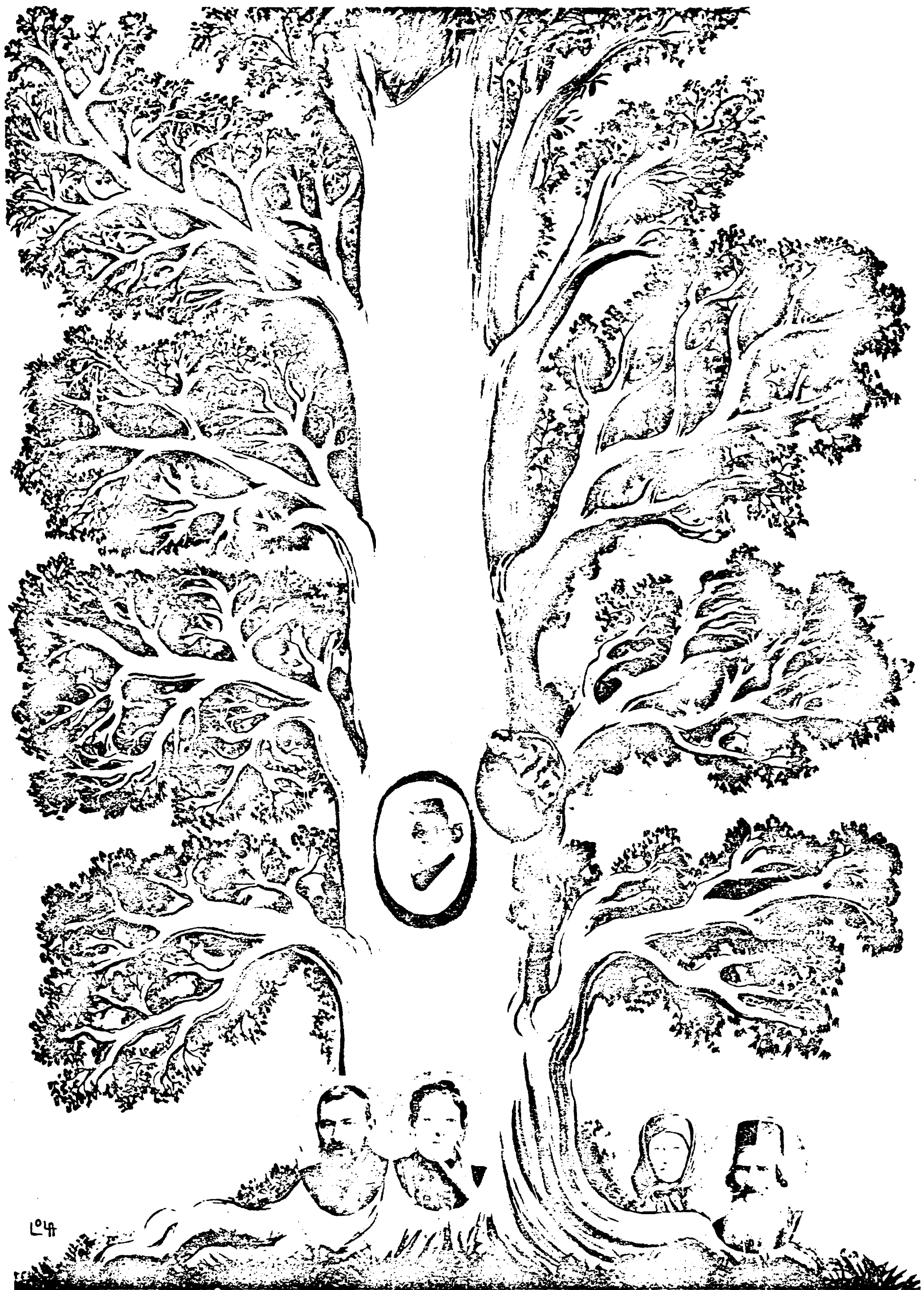

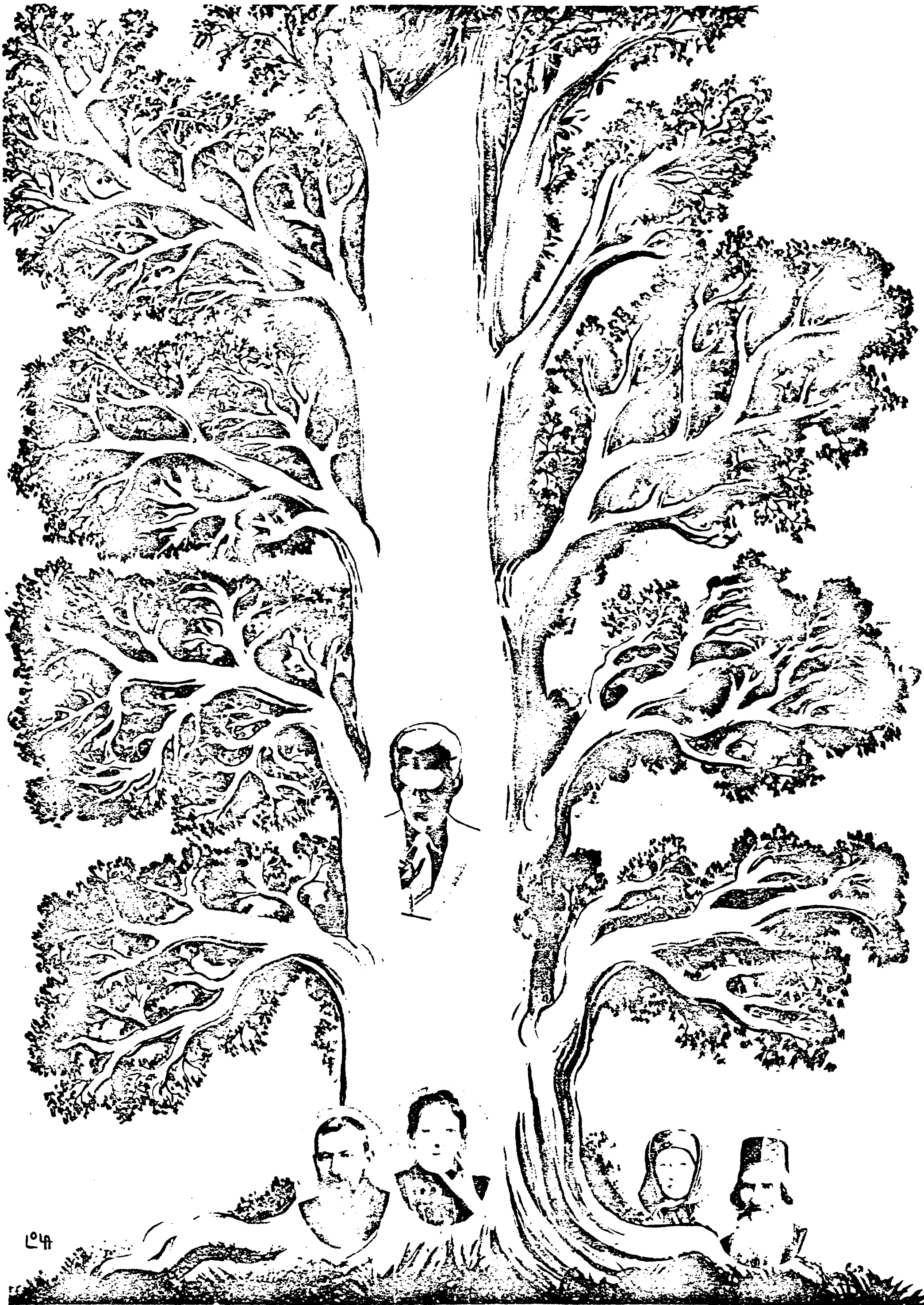

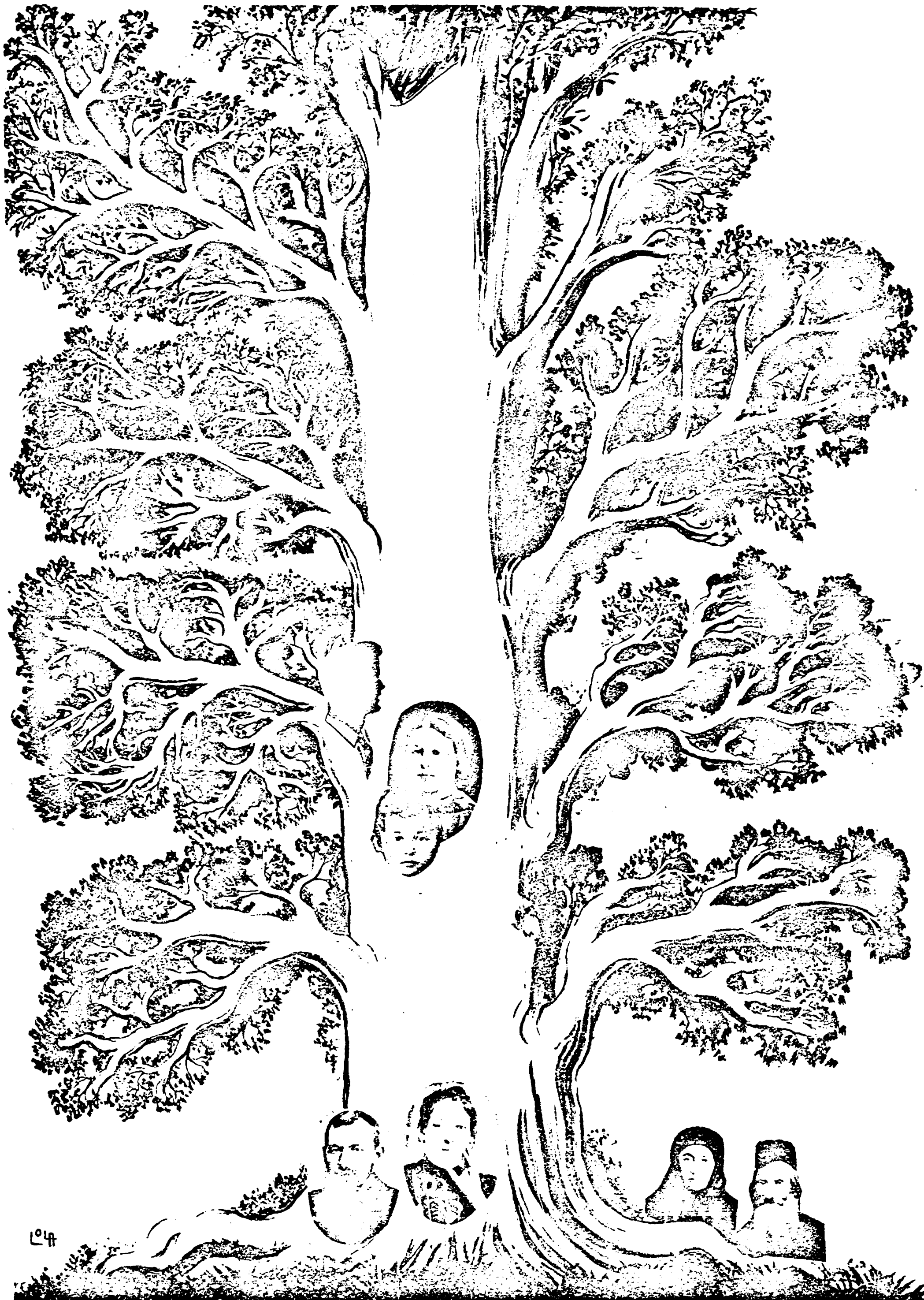

James died in May of 1943 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

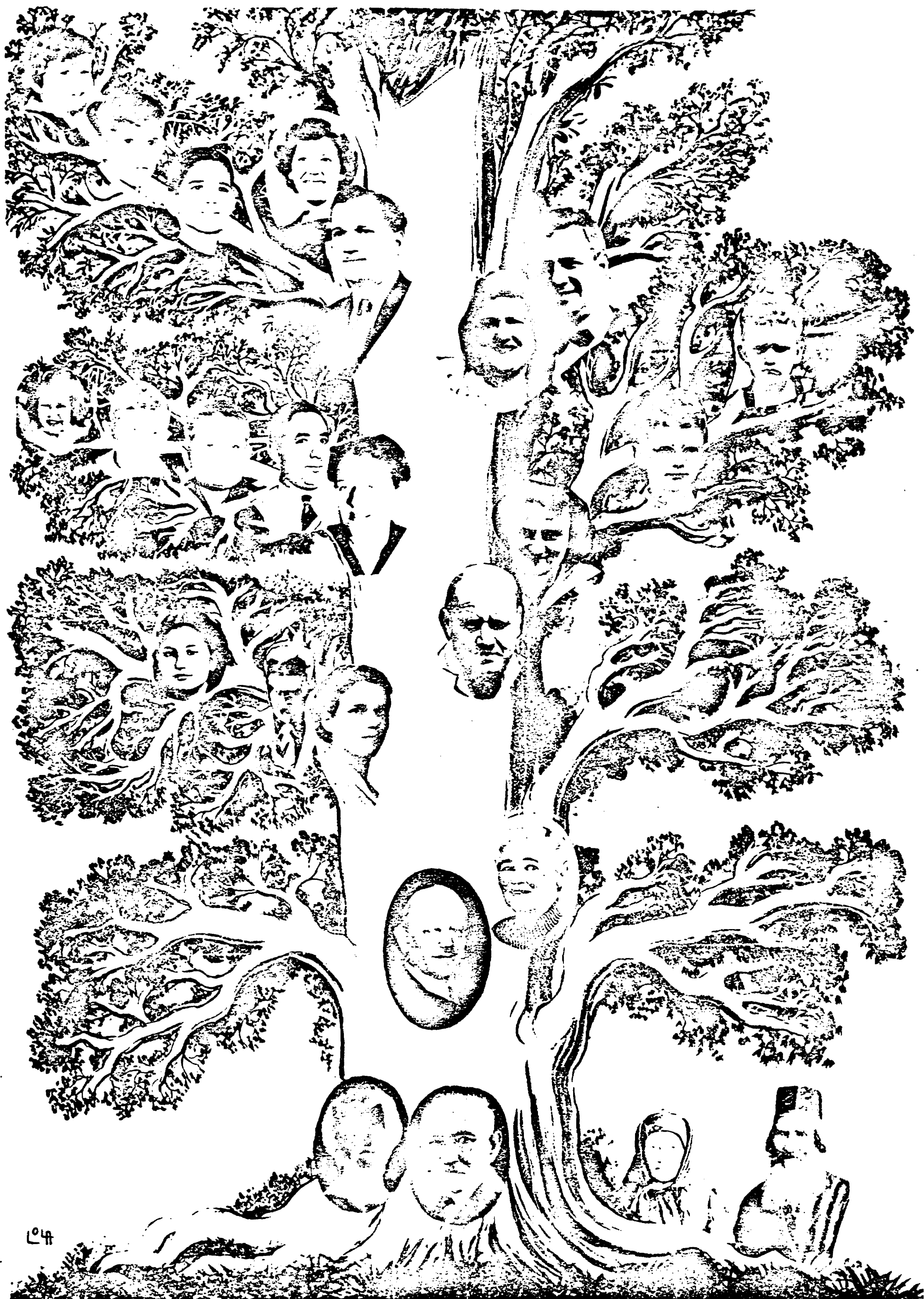

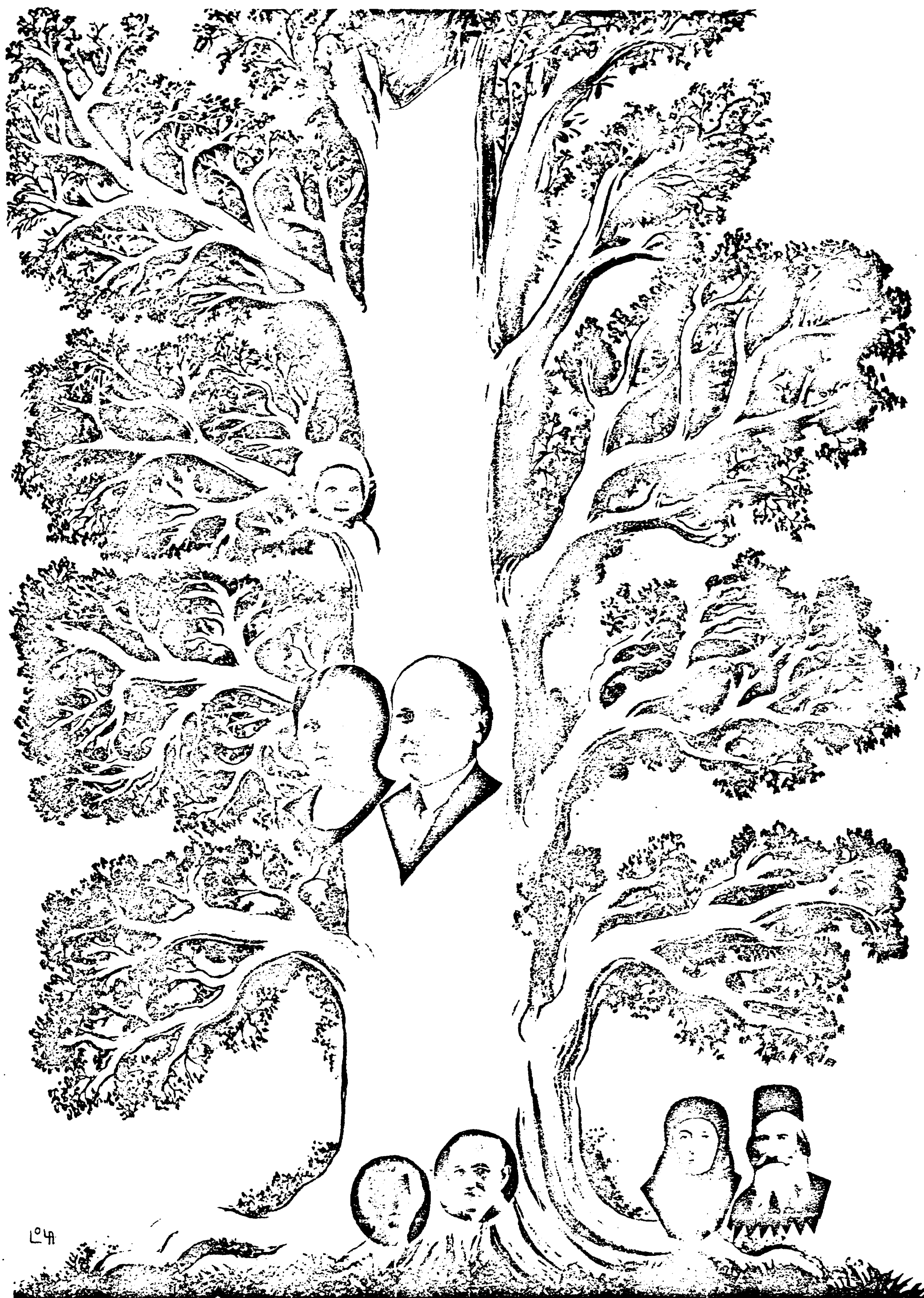

Very little was heard from them for years, but it was somehow learned that Harry died in 1943. About 1948 Harry's sister, Ida, received a long distance telephone call which informed her that Harry's wife had passed on. BESSIE SILVERMAN (nee Zumoff)

Bessie was born in Korop, province of Chernigov, Ukraine Russia, in the year 1892 (the exact date is not known). In 1904, Bessie, her parents, brothers and sisters came to America and made their home in Philadelphia, Pa.

A few years after their coming to the United States, Bessie's mother, Dweira Beila, died. She and her younger sisters, Ida and Stella (still a tot), became the housekeepers, taking care of the home for their father, brothers and themselves.

Bessie learned to be an excellent dressmaker and worked in that trade in various factories for a number of years before her marriage. Early in 1912, Bessie married Max Silverman.

Years later, after she and her husband separated, she again turned to dressmaking.

On June 15, 1941 he married Mae Pennes. They have two children: Bernice, born June 12, 1943 and Rhoda, born November 24, 1947.

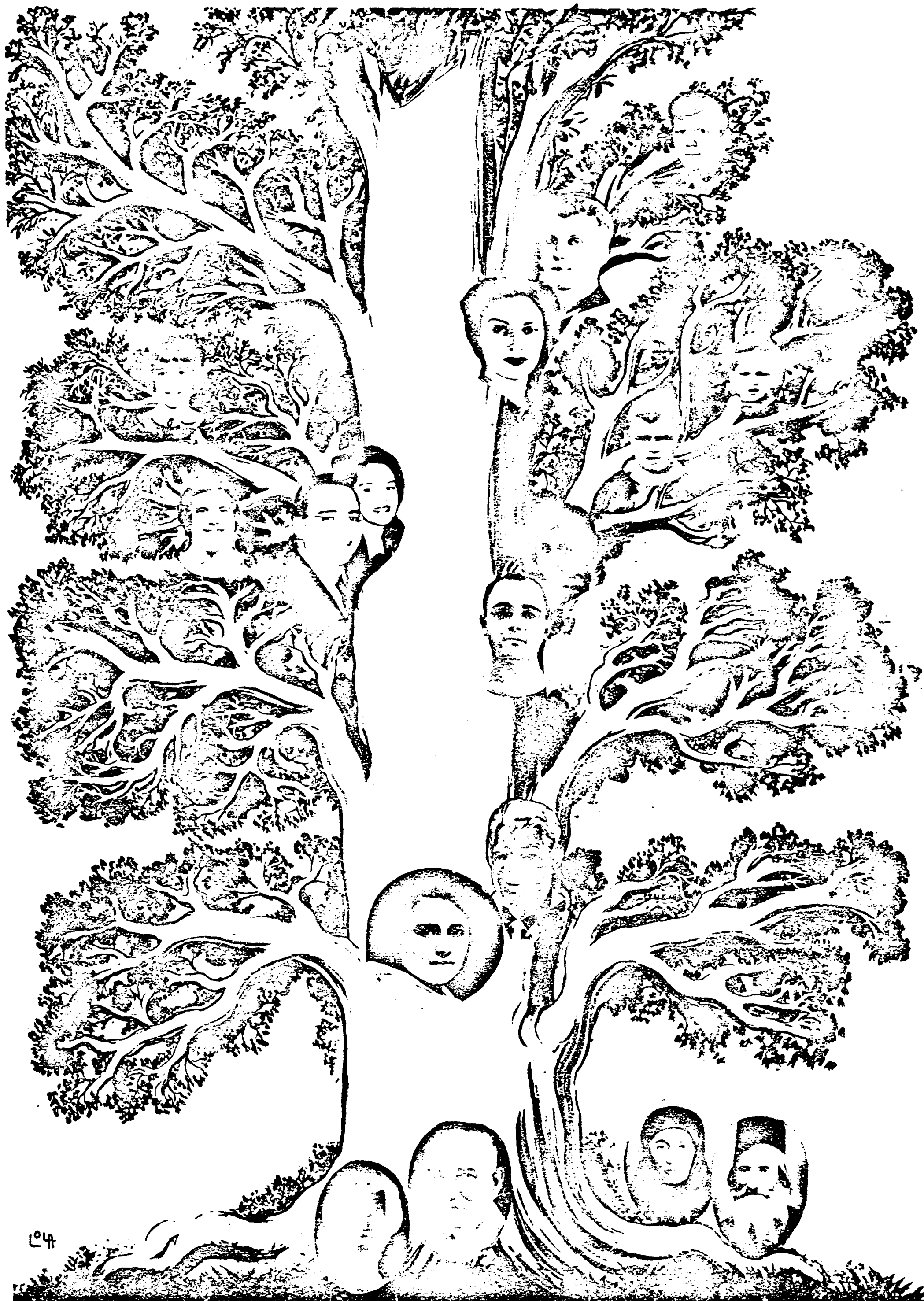
Jerry is connected with the Naval Aviation Supply Depot in

Isabelle and Herman have two children. Their first son David, was born in May of 1943 and a second son, Martin, was born in 1948.

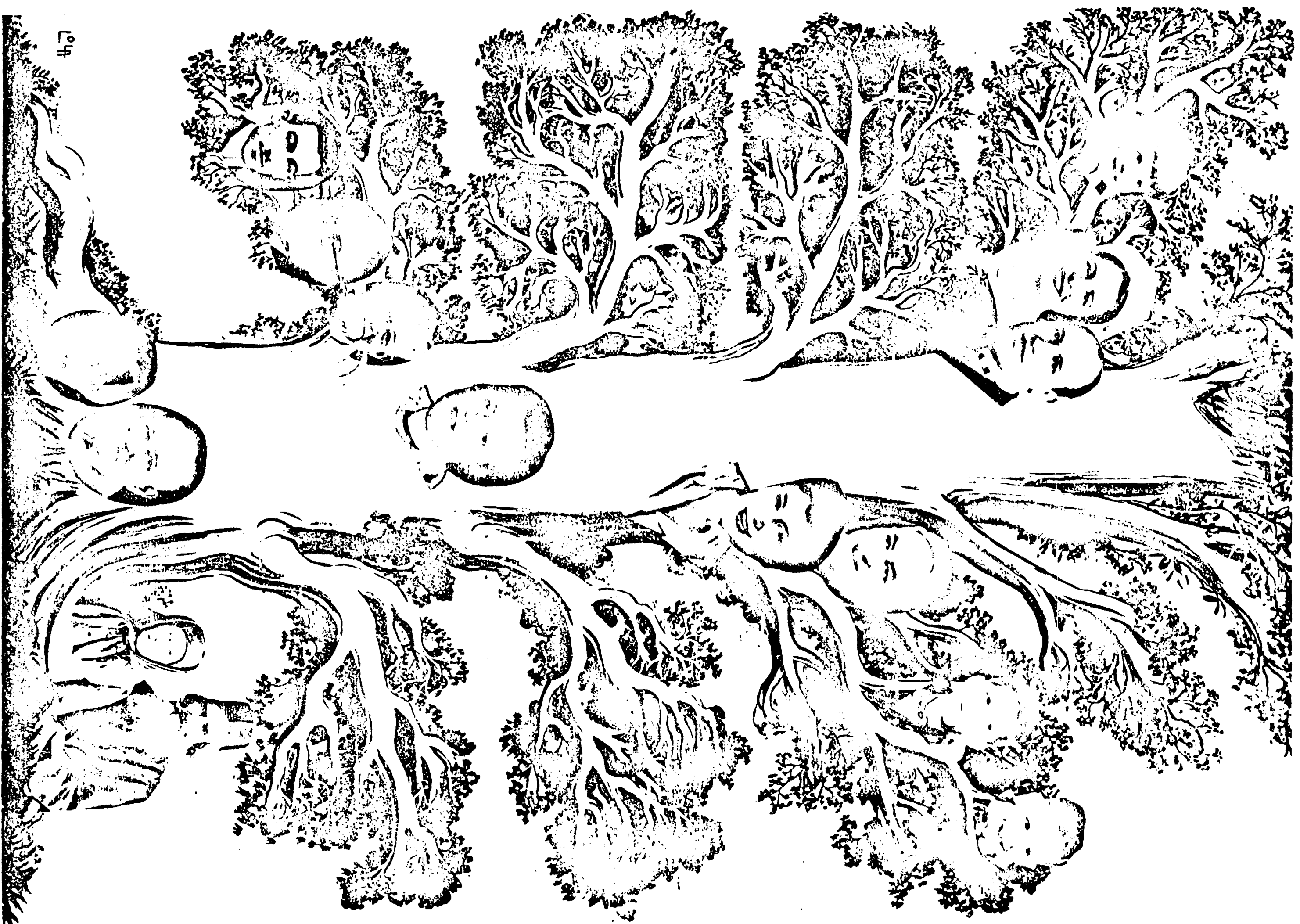

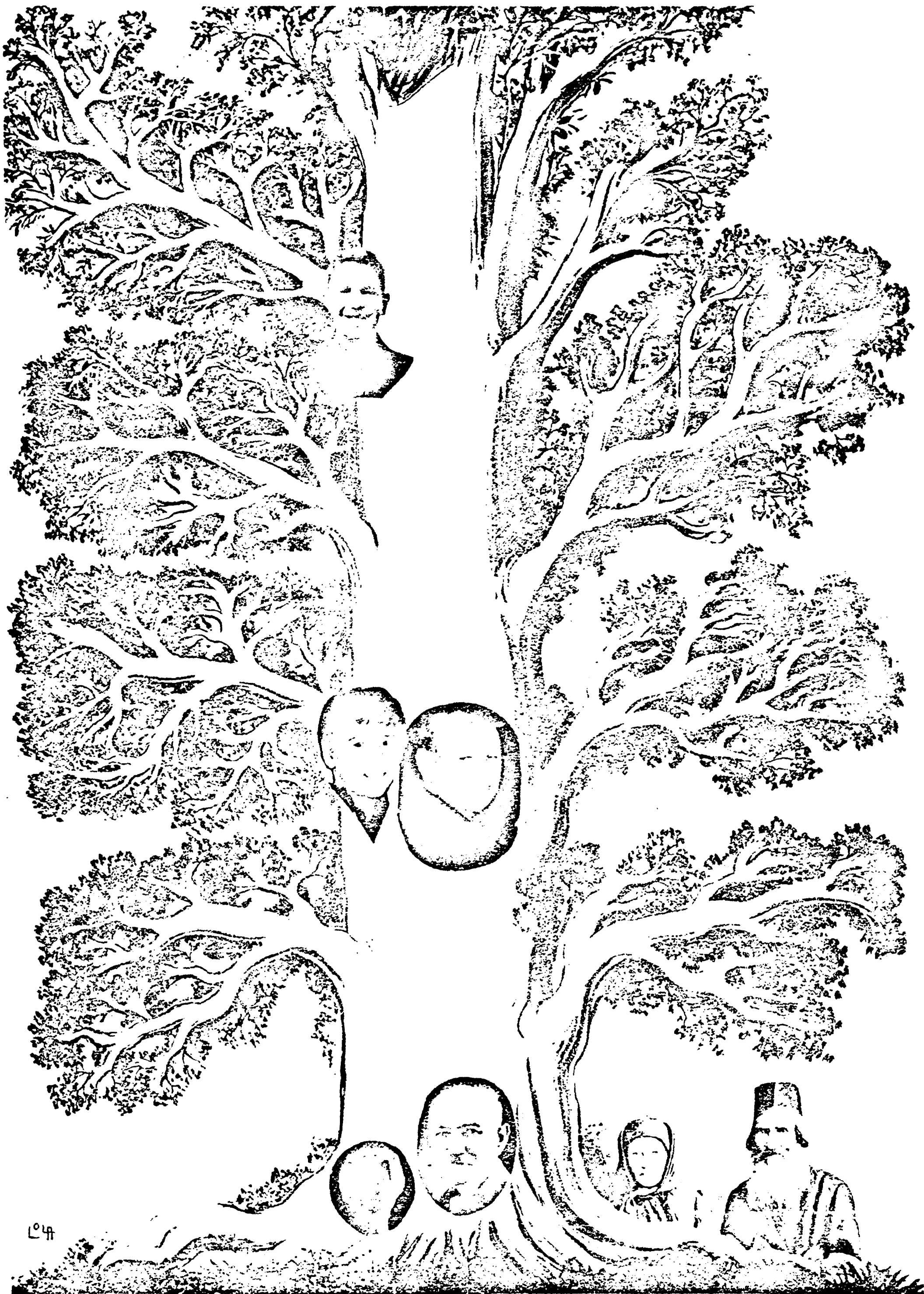

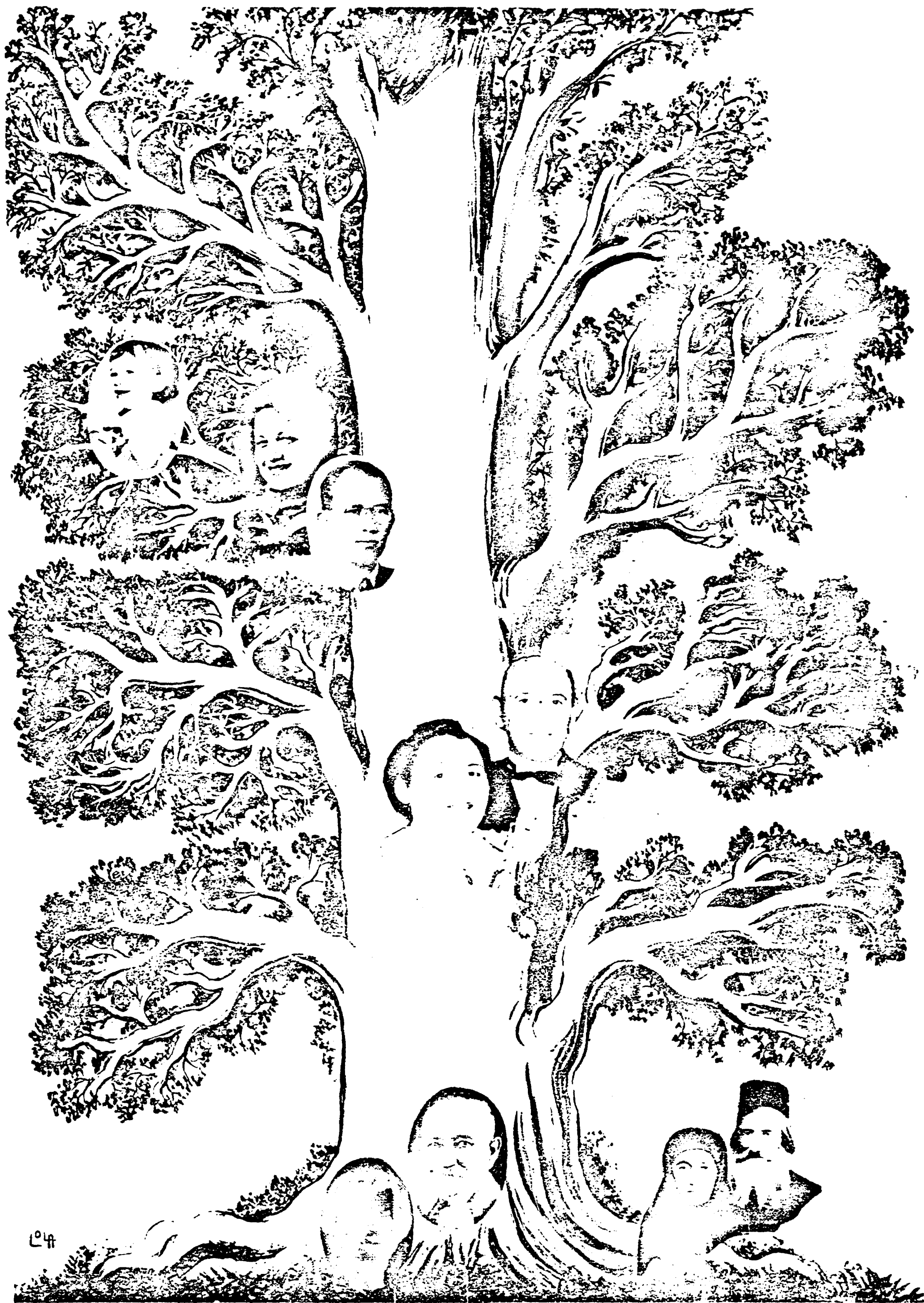

In 1920, Sol married his childhood sweetheart, Dorothy Freiberg.

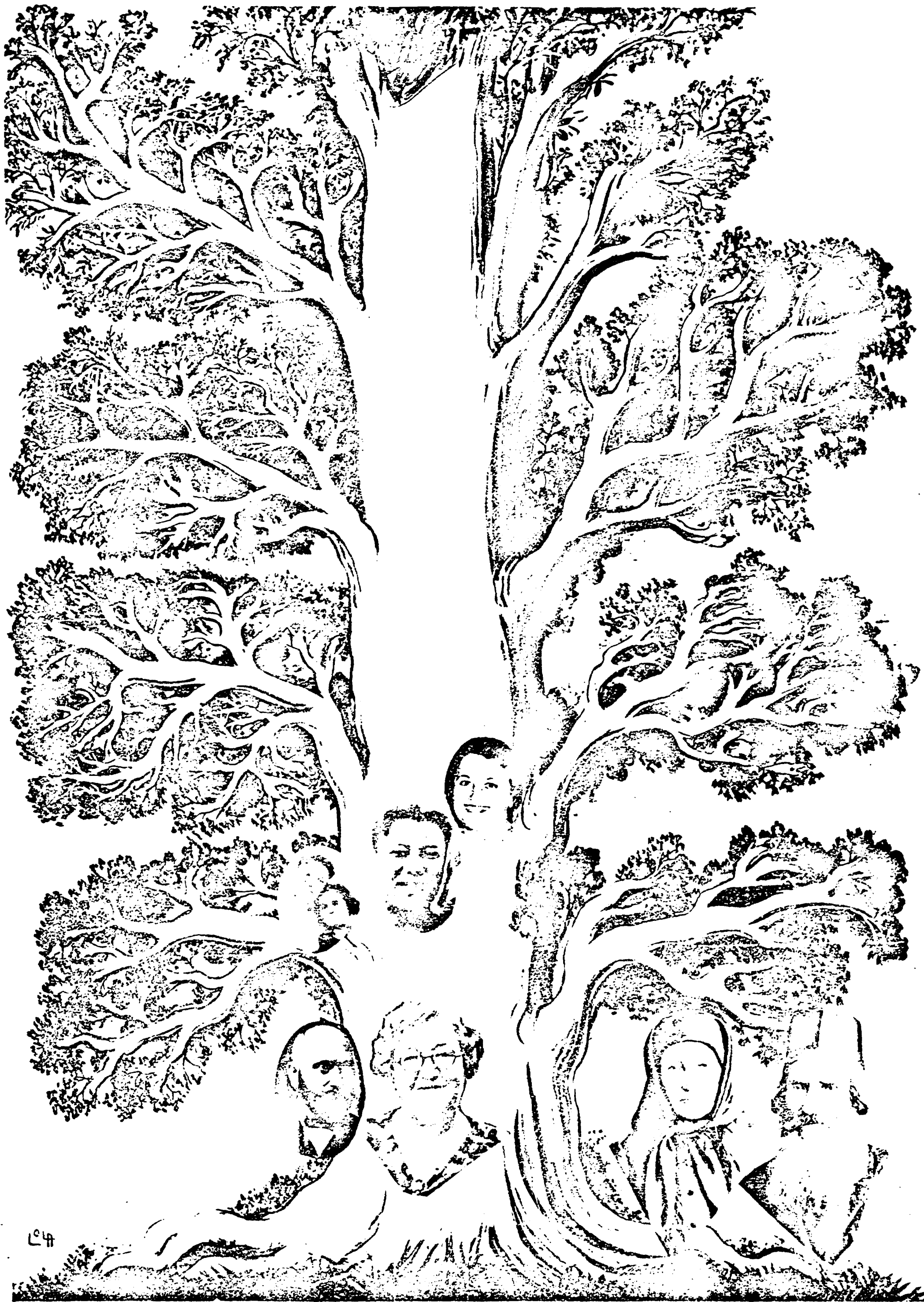

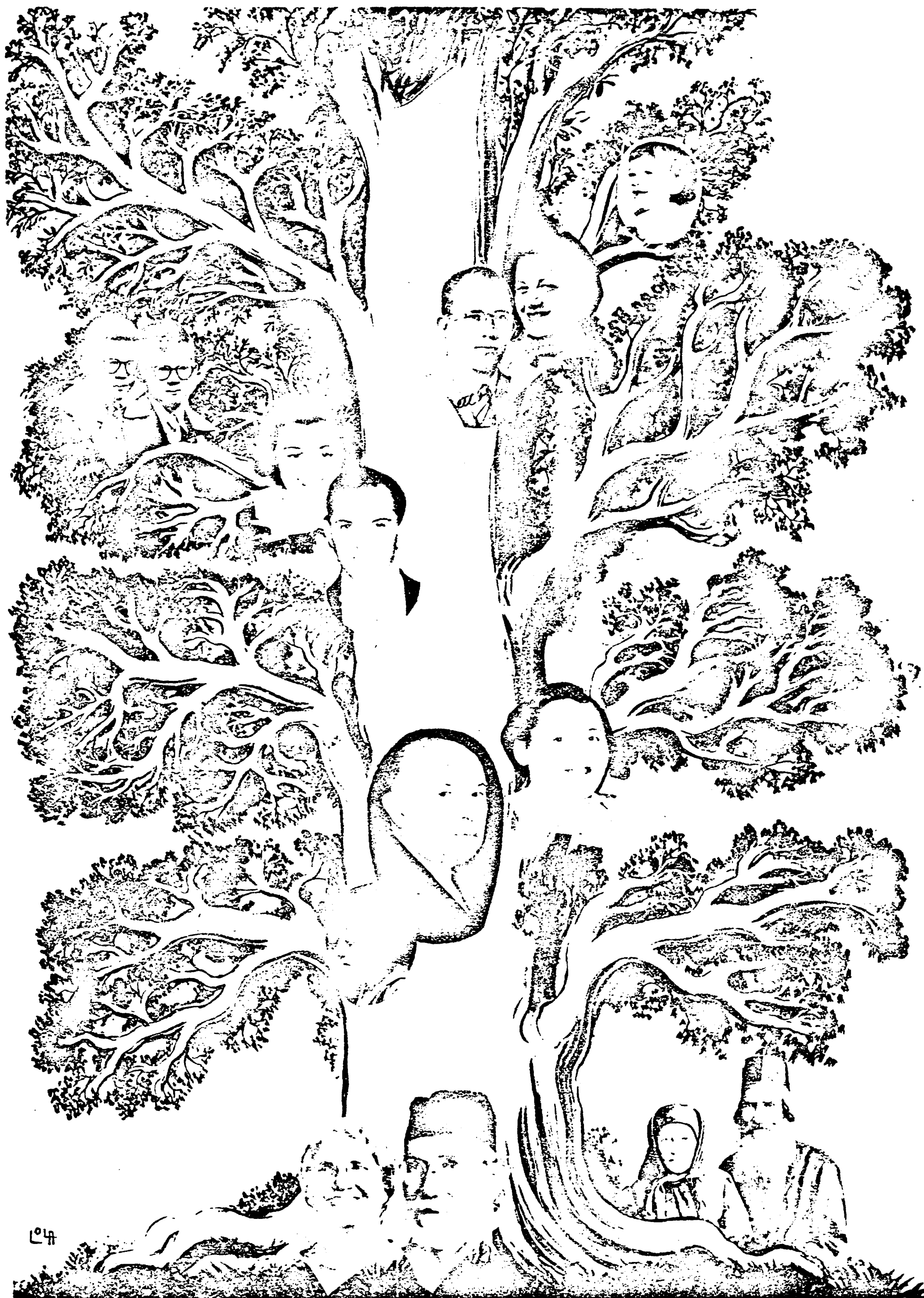

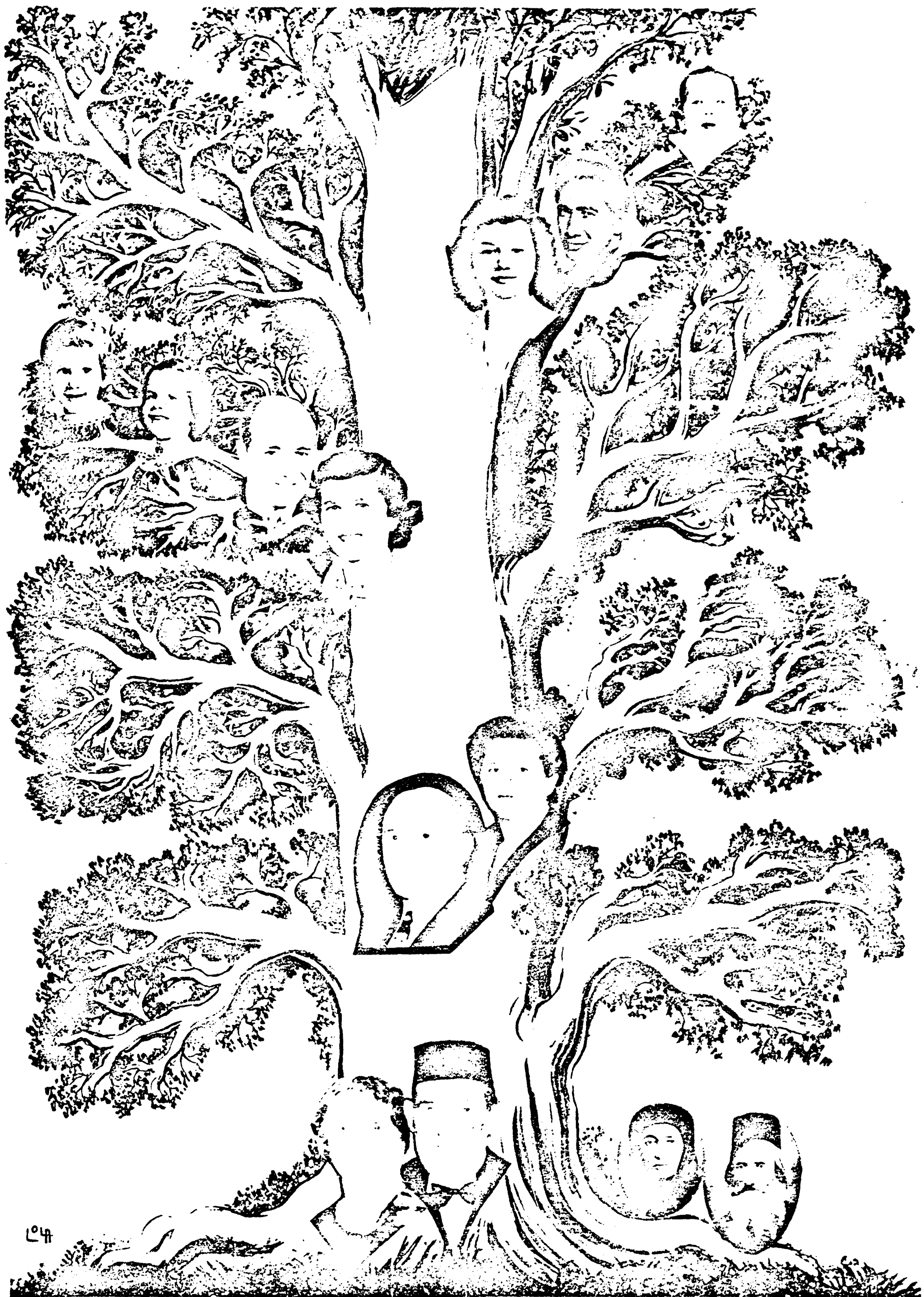

Isador Specter died in 1952 and is interred in Philadelphia.

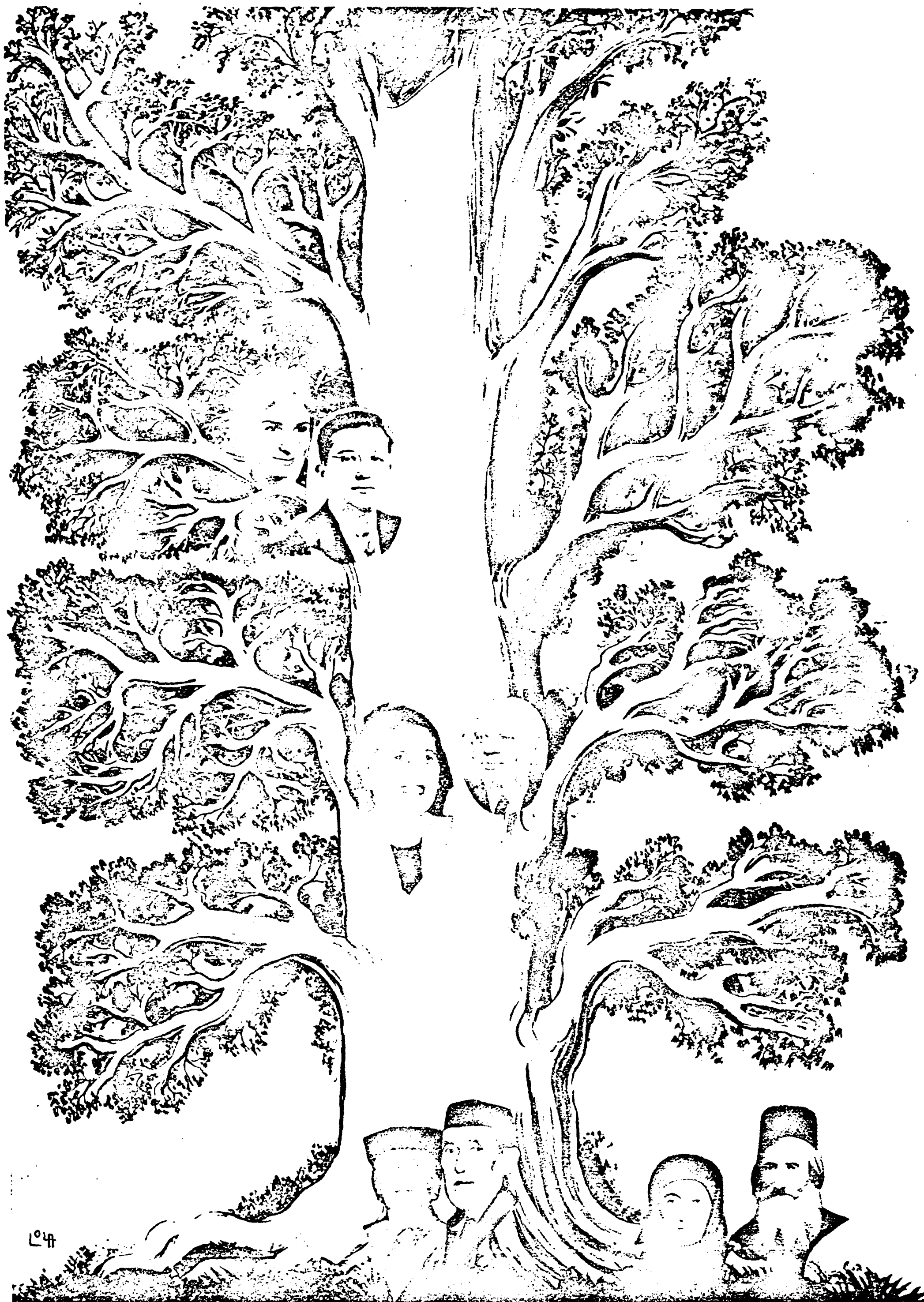

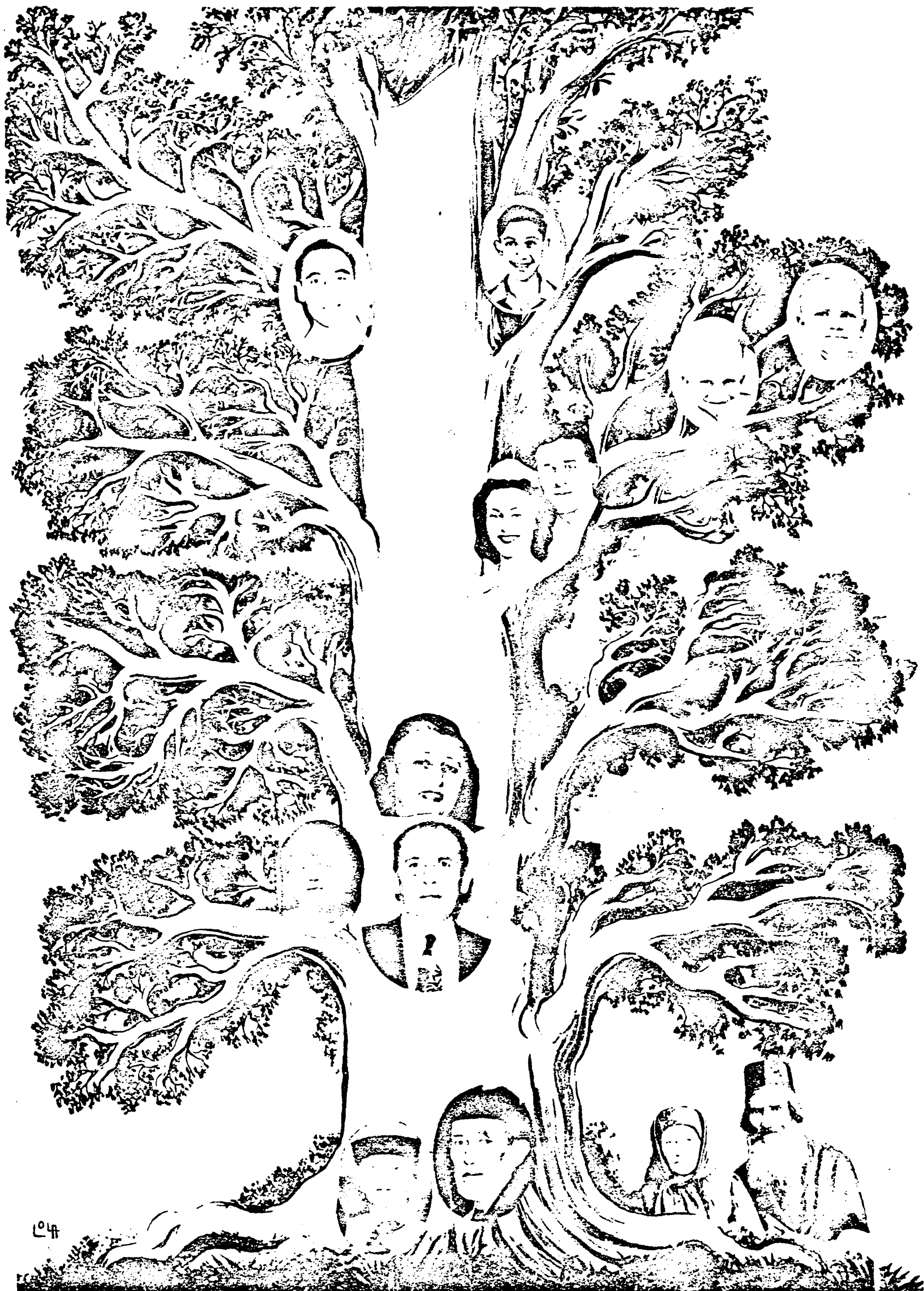

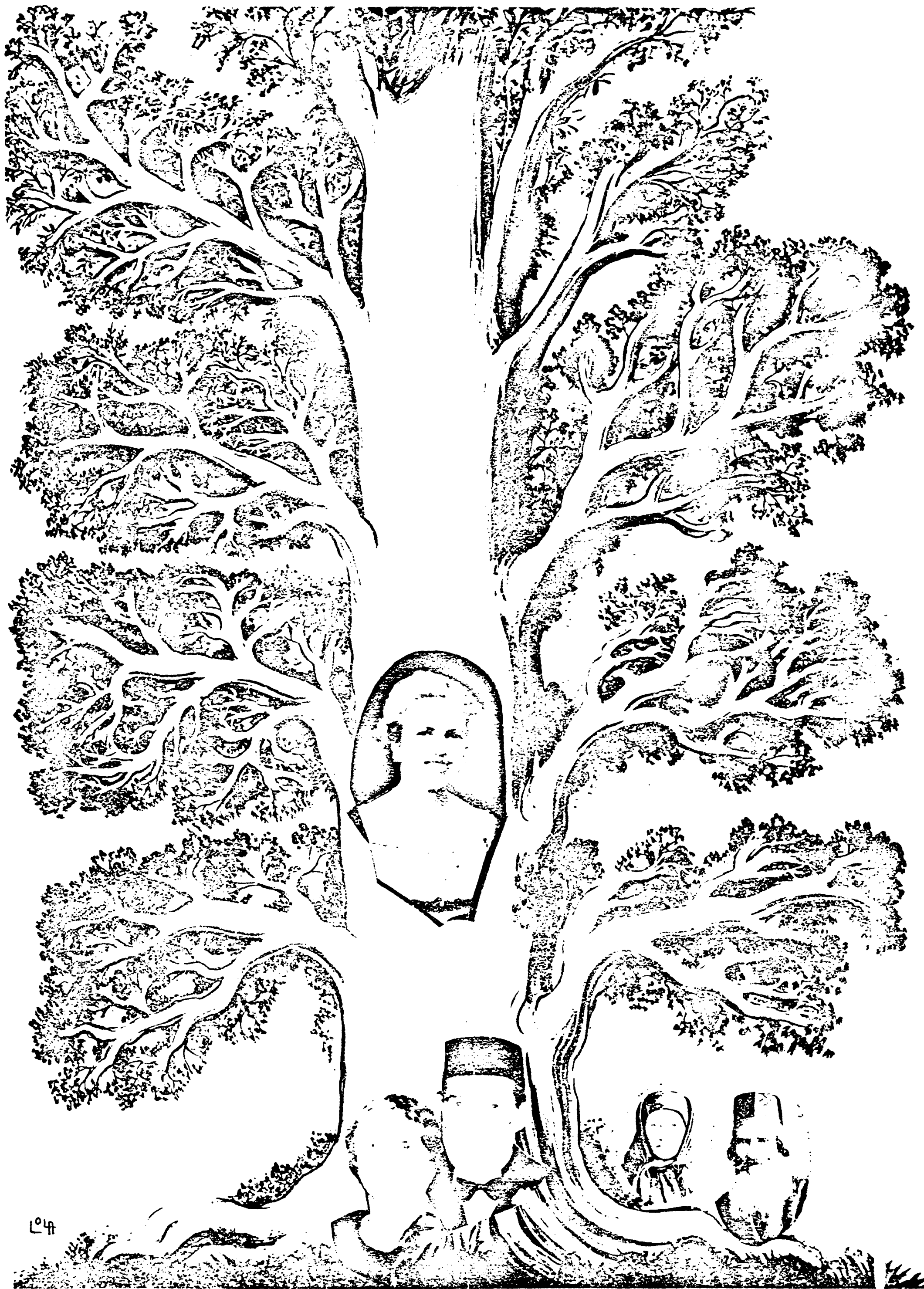

Bruce is presently engaged in the installment business, not associated with his father.

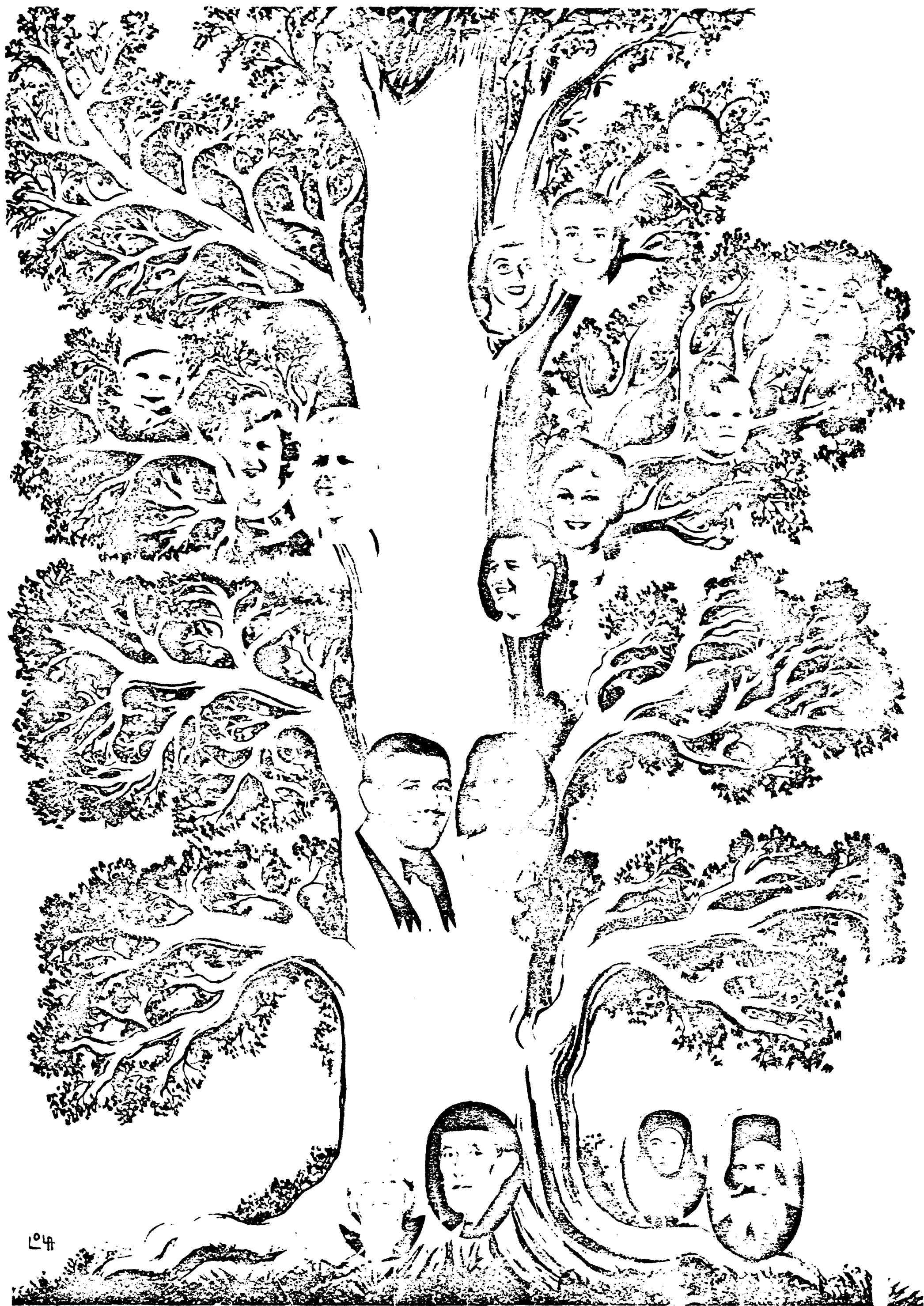

In addition to her talent as a pianist, Belle is an excellent artist and has also done some beautiful work with soap carving. She is interested in all types of arts and crafts.

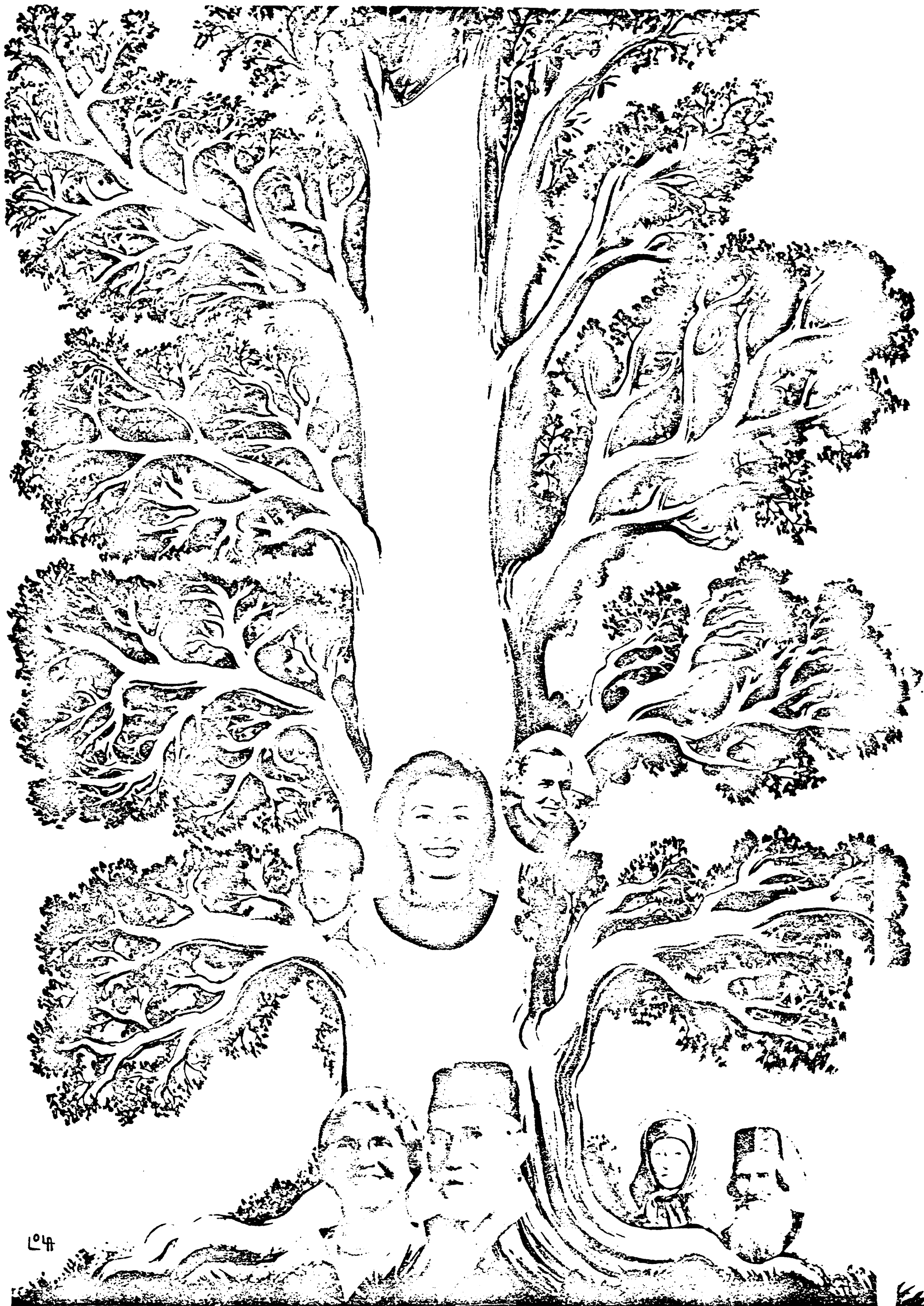

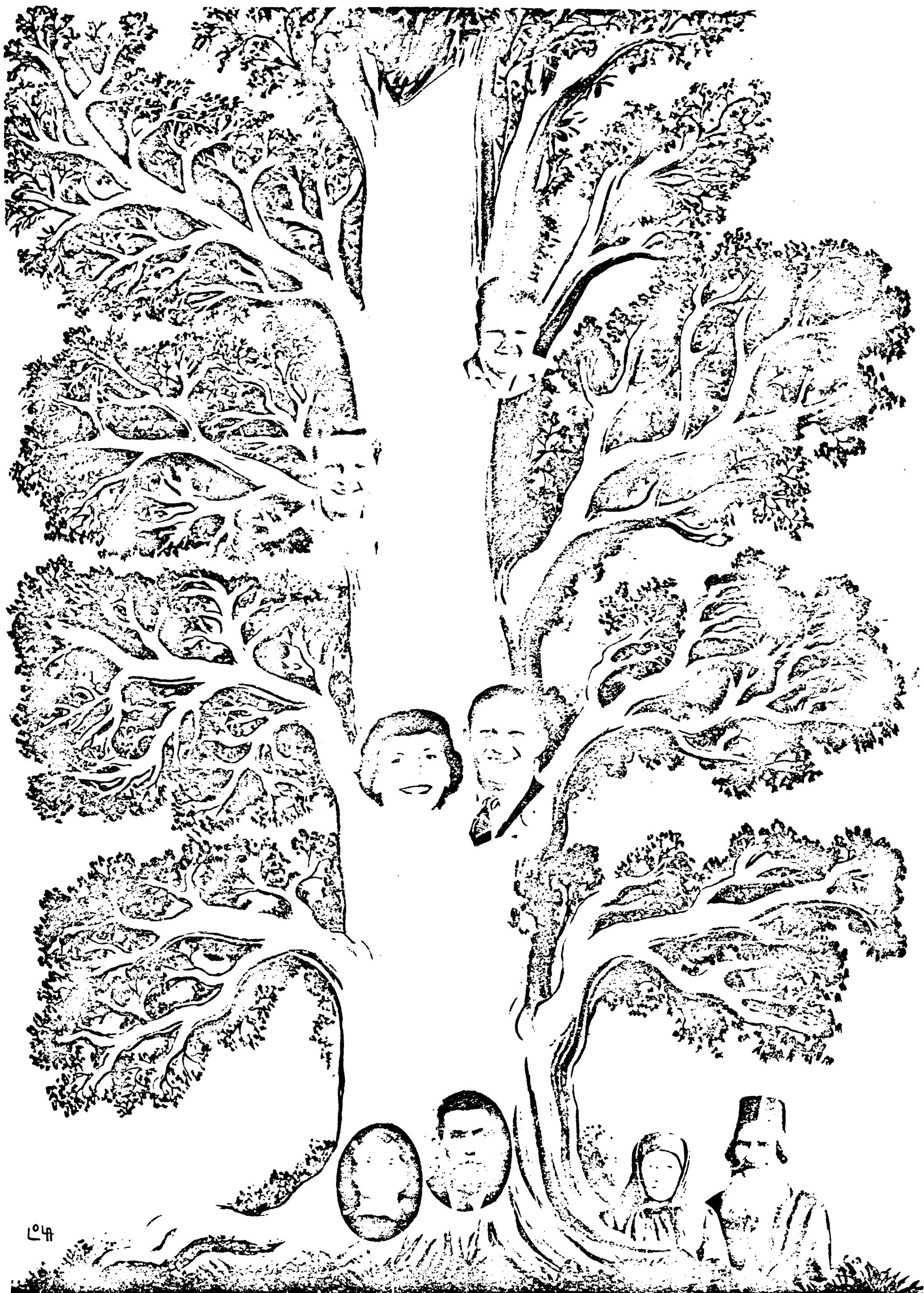
When her husband returned to Philadelphia to go into business for himself, the family once again established residence in the Philadelphia area and are now residing in Havertown, Pa., just outside the city.

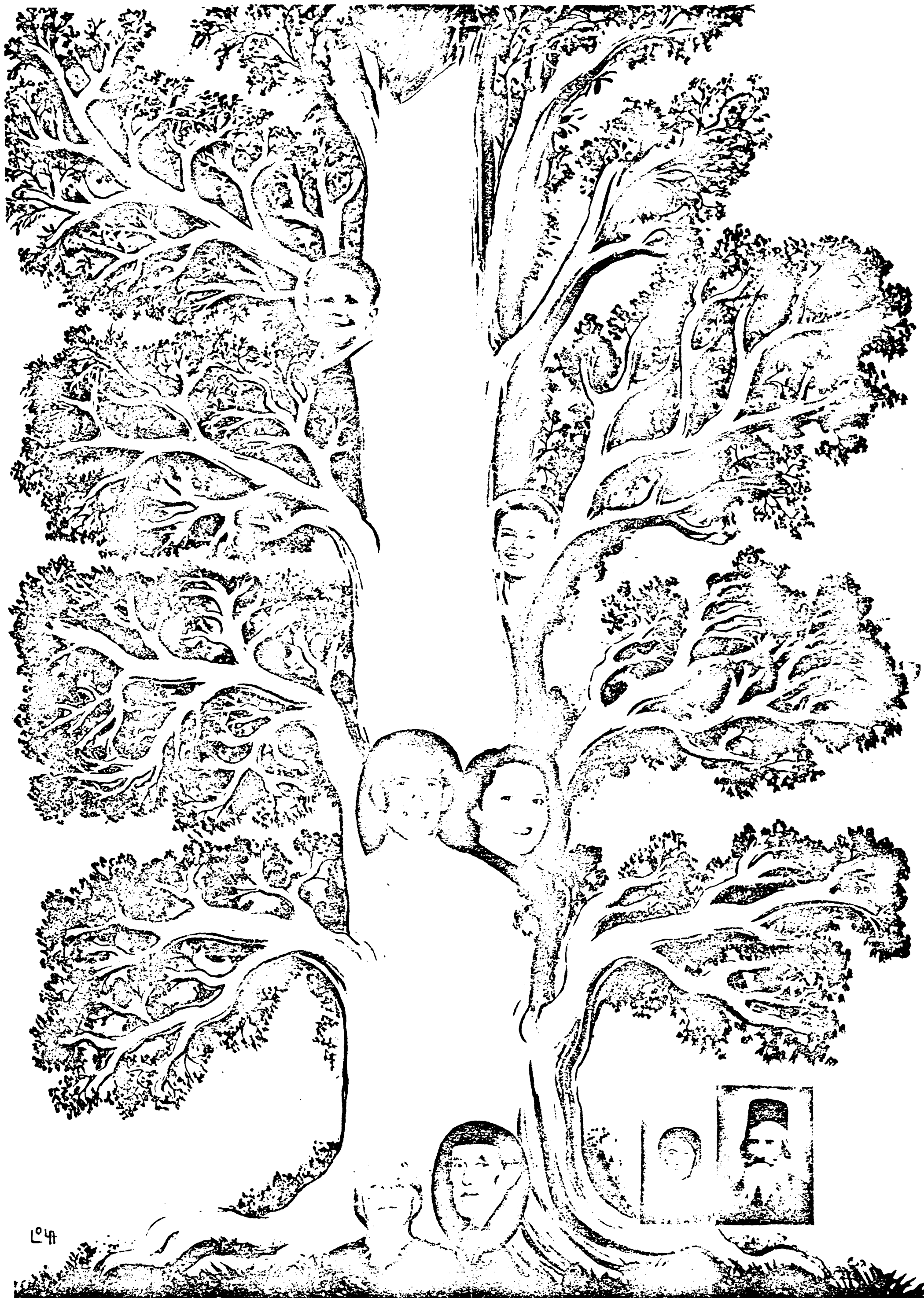
I. EDWARD ZUMOFF

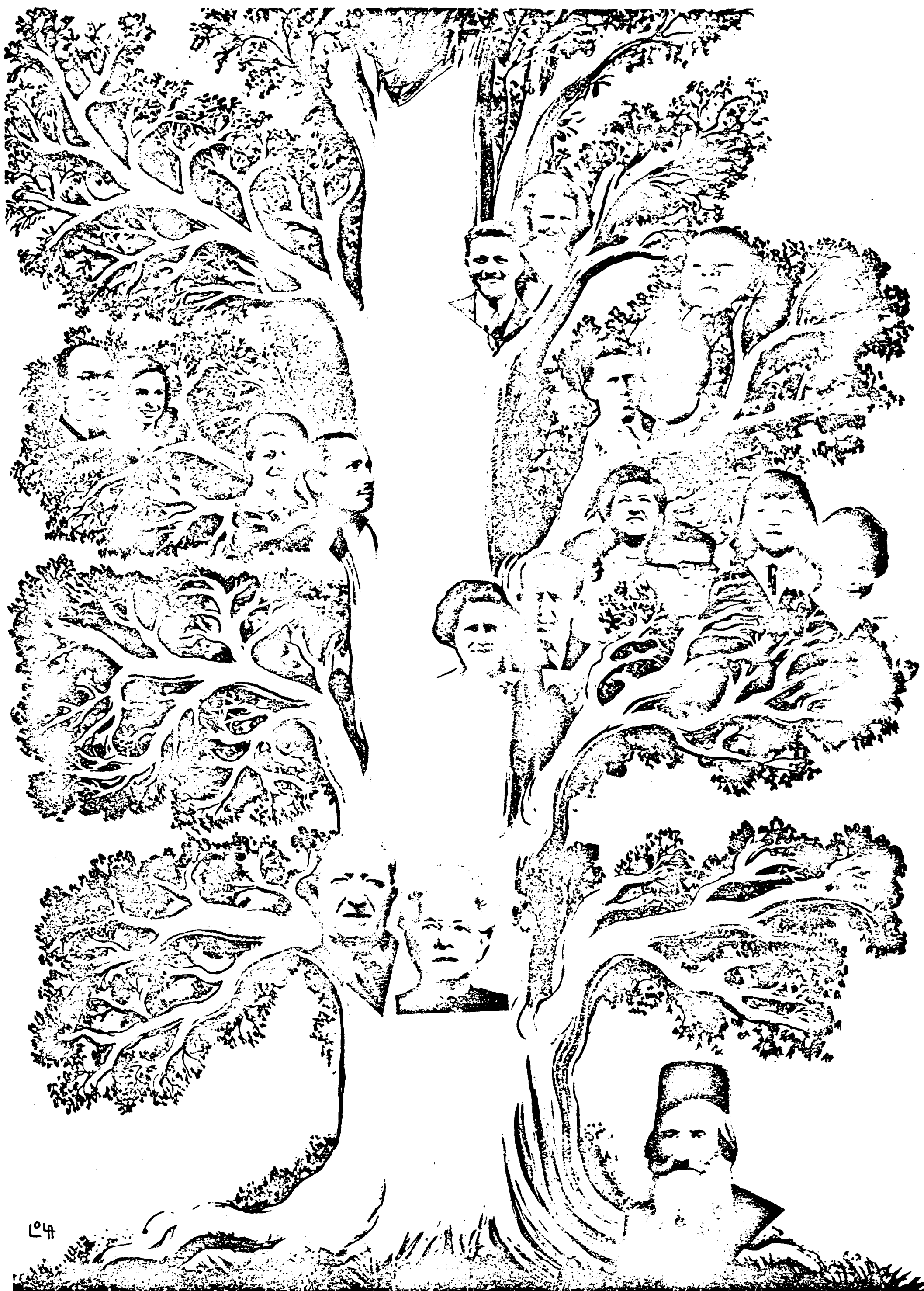

Donald, Barbara and family are now residing in Philadelphia.

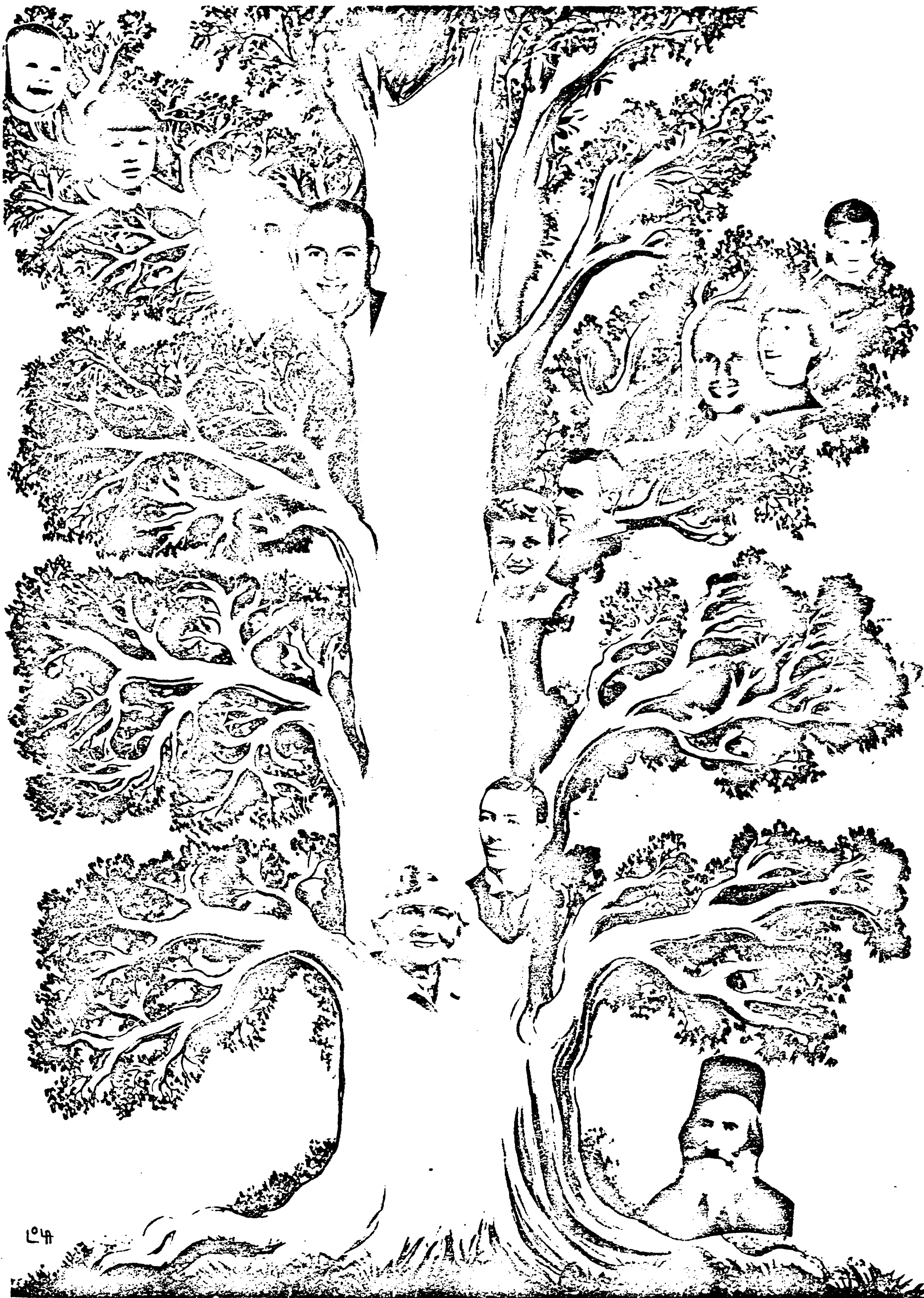

Isaac Sherman, husband of Freda, was born in New York City and is a graduate of the Yeshiva University in N. Y.

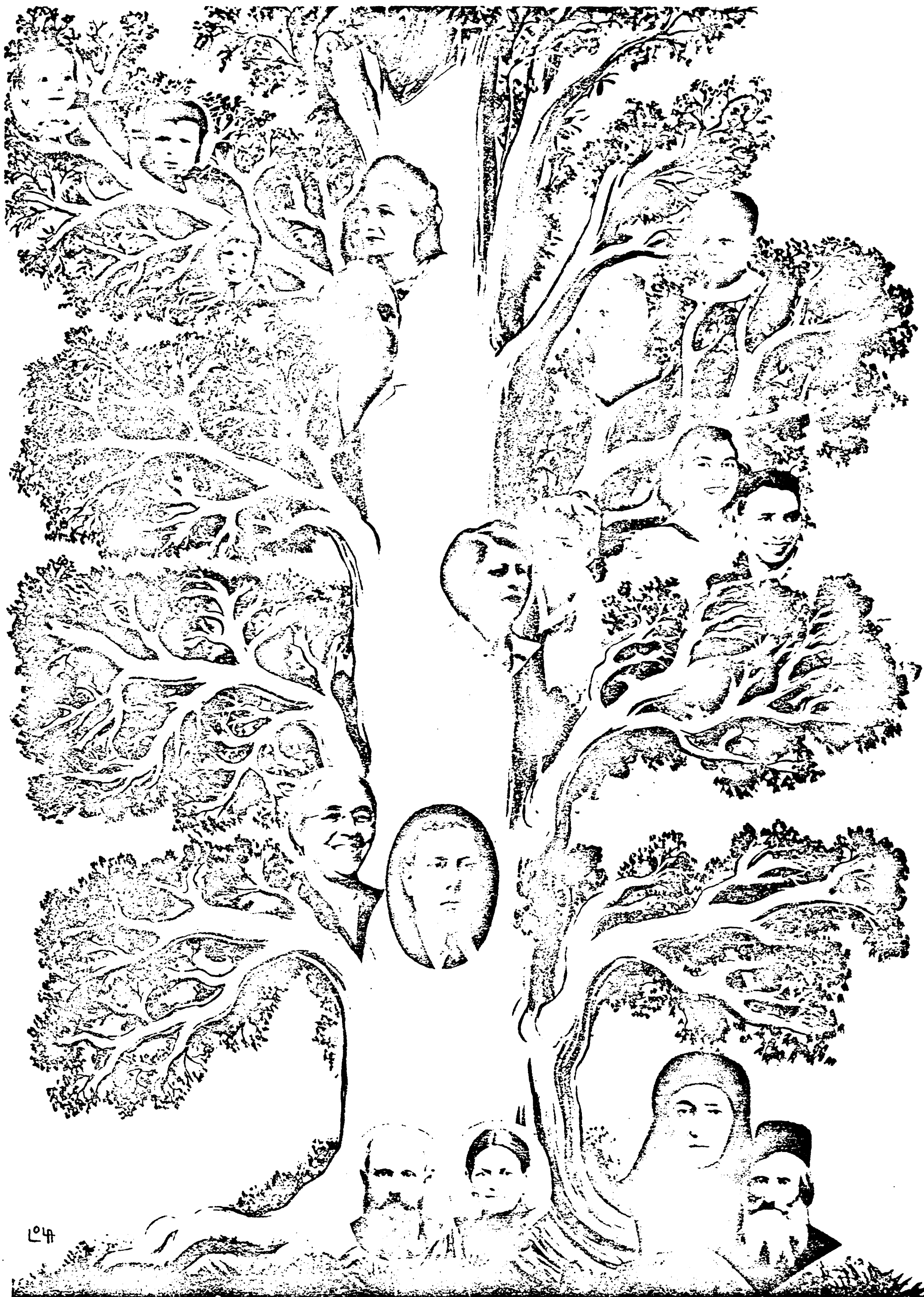
