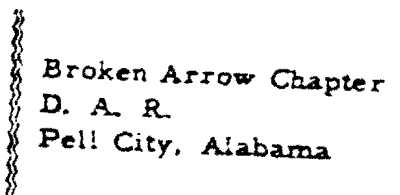

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FOREWORD

As its initial project, the Broken Arrow Chapter, D.A.R., has chosen the compiling of a history of Saint Clair County, Alabama, with especial emphasis on the early settlers and their backgrounds and roles played in the history of the county. The first difficulty encountered was to learn, if possible, who were living here first. The federal census of Alabama for 1820 is lost, ^{are} as/also the returns of the federal census of Mississippi Territory of 1800, and 1810. The state census of 1820 of this County is in existence and was published by the Alabama State Department of Archives and History in Volume 6 of the Alabama Historical Quarterly, but that is too late to show who were here when the county began.

Saint Clair County was created on November 20, 1818, from the northern part of Shelby County, which had been created on February 7, 1818, from Montgomery County, which had been created from the northern part of Monroe County on December 6, 1816. Monroe County was itself created on June 29, 1815, and when first created comprised all the lands ceded by the Creek Indians at Fort Jackson in 1814, at the close of the Creek War, the treaty being ratified by the United States in 1815. When Montgomery and Monroe counties were formed, they lay within Mississippi Territory, which had been created by an act of Congress approved April 7, 1798, and which included all of the present states of Alabama and Mississippi. Alabama Territory was cut off by act of Congress March 3, 1817, and was admitted as a state on December 14, 1819.

When Alabama Territory was formed, Baldwin County lay west of the Tombigbee River, between Washington and Mobile counties. The territory which is now Baldwin County was then in Mobile and Monroe counties. Monroe County extended from the Chattahoochee River to the watershed between the Tombigbee and Alabama Rivers, and from line 31 degrees north latitude to the southern line of present Lawrence and Morgan counties, therefore containing the most of present-day Alabama. A small part of the Mississippi counties of Greene, Jackson, and Wayne lay in Alabama Territory and was accordingly added to the counties of Baldwin, Mobile, and Washington of Alabama Territory.

In the search for information as to the first settlers of Saint Clair County, it was learned that the State of Mississippi had published in 1917, in the Centennial edition of its Official and Statistical Register, a list of the inhabitants of Mississippi Territory in 1816, from rolls in the Mississippi State Department of Archives and History. This book is now out of print, and comparatively few libraries now have copies of it. As published in the Register, these rolls are not in alphabetical order, but through the courtesy of Miss Maud McLure Kelly, Historical Materials Collector of the Alabama State Department of Archives and History, access has been given to her alphabetical arrangement of the rolls of those counties which, in 1817, became Alabama Territory. From this, this chapter has proof of almost forty families which in 1816 were taxpayers in "Monroe County" but who were in Saint Clair County in 1820, as shown by the State Census. Because of the importance of these data, we have asked permission to share these alphabetized rolls with others who may

be interested. More complete information can be had from the original rolls in the Mississippi State Department of Archives and History, Jackson, Miss., as well as from the territorial tax lists of other dates on file there, or from transcripts of these rolls and lists in the Alabama State Department of Archives and History at Montgomery, Alabama.

"It will be noted that tax lists of certain counties have been used in this compilation. These are largely in accord with census returns, and are used for the reason that the census rolls of those counties are not available."

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THE FLORIDA ANNEXATION

At the time the Spanish captured the British Province of West Florida, during the American Revolution, its northern boundary extended to 32 28' North Latitude. The treaty of peace between Great Britain and the American Colonies, however, fixed the line at 31 . By the treaty of peace made between Great Britain and Spain on the same day, Great Britain ceded all claim to the "Province of West Florida". Until 1795, therefore, both the United States and Spain claimed the country lying between 31 and 32 28' with Spain holding Mobile and the mouth of the Alabama River system. When the United States bought Louisiana from France, it claimed that there had been a secret treaty between Spain and France by which the legal title to West Florida was in France and that the title to West Florida passed to the United States under the Louisiana Purchase. Spain continued to hold possession until, during the War of 1812, United States troops moved in and took possession of West Florida over the protest of the Spanish garrison. On August 1, 1812, prior to the occupation by United States troops, this province was created as Mobile County of Mississippi Territory, but later was subdivided. As first constituted, it embraced the entire country between the Pearl and Perdido Rivers, south of 31 parallel.

M O B I L E C O U N T Y

This county was created August 1, 1812, from territory then claimed and occupied by Spain. As first created, it extended from the Pearl to the Perdido Rivers, and to the line of 31 degrees north latitude, but by 1816 it had been reduced by the creation of Wayne and Jackson Counties, now entirely in Mississippi, but it also included that part of present Baldwin County which lies south of the thirty-first parallel.

T E N N E S S E E R I V E R S E T T L E M E N T S

The territory along the Tennessee River was disputed territory. Not only was it claimed, in part, by both Georgia and South Carolina, but it was also claimed by both the Cherokees and the Chickasaws. It was the route of immigration into Alabama from the North. Settlers from Kentucky, Tennessee, the Carolinas, Virginia and to the northward, as well as many from Georgia entered Alabama this way.

For many years, Madison County was the sole political subdivision in that area, but gradually the Indian titles were acquired and new counties were created. When the Creeks made peace after the Creek War of 1813, they were required to cede all their claims to lands west of the Coosa River, but the western boundaries of this cession were vague and undefined. The United States then, immediately, negotiated treaties with the surrounding tribes -- the Cherokees, the Chickasaws, and the Choctaws -- by which boundaries were defined between them and the old Creek Nation. As a result of these treaties, the Legislature of Alabama Territory made many new counties in 1818 and 1819. But in 1816, when these records were compiled, there were but six counties in what is now Alabama, and but one of these, Madison, in the Tennessee River Country.

The first settlement of the Tennessee Country is supposed to have occurred about 1805 at Huntsville. The settlement thereafter was rapid, and by 1816 this was the second most populous part of Mississippi Territory, being only exceeded by the Natchez District.

M A D I S O N C O U N T Y

On December 13, 1808, Madison County was created, the second county in Mississippi Territory within the limits of the present state of Alabama. As first established, it was smaller than the present county, having increased in size through the years instead of being made smaller by subdivision. Other counties in this area were made from later cessions of Indian lands only and some of the later ceded lands were also added to Madison County. In 1816, this county had the most inhabitants of any of the counties which later fell within the limits of Alabama.

T O M B I G B E E S E T T L E M E N T S

In point of time, the Tombigbee settlements are the oldest settlements in present Alabama which have been continuously under the United States Flag, since Mobile was Spanish territory until 1813. Since Spain claimed as far north as 32 28' until 1795, and controlled the river mouths of all rivers emptying into the Gulf of Mexico until 1813, the United States was anxious to prevent Spanish infiltration into the disputed area, and settlement at Natchez and along the Tombigbee was encouraged. That fact explains why the first, third, fourth, and fifth and sixth counties were created in this area. Only Madison County, on the Tennessee River, was outside this area until after Mississippi Territory was divided into the State of Mississippi and Alabama Territory.

B A L D W I N C O U N T Y

Baldwin County was created December 21, 1809 from Washington County. It is the only county in Alabama which has entirely moved from its original location.

As first created, it lay between Washington and the Spanish province of West Florida, being made from the southern part of Washington County. After the admission of Alabama into the Union, old Baldwin County was divided between Mobile and Washington Counties, and part of the then County of Mobile, across the Mobile Bay, was made into a new County named Baldwin.

In using these records, it will be well to remember that families then in Baldwin would now be in present Mobile or present Washington counties, while some of those listed as living in Mobile County in 1816 were actually living in what is now Baldwin County. Confusing, maybe, but that is history.

MONROE COUNTY, ALA.

When, at the conclusion of the Creek War of 1813, the Creek Nation surrendered and sought peace, the United States exacted an acknowledgment of responsibility for starting the war and indemnity for the expense of the war, and the Creeks ceded all their lands west of the Coosa River. No northern or western boundaries were stated, only an eastern boundary of this cession.

Immediately, the United States began negotiating treaties with the adjoining Indians, the Cherokeees, the Chickasaws and the Choctaws, to fix their boundaries on the east and south. In the meantime, all the lands ceded by the Creeks were placed into one huge County named Monroe.

This was June 29, 1815. While Monroe County was divided on December 6, 1816, when Montgomery County was cut off, in 1816 Monroe County actually included most of the present state of Alabama.

Upon the conclusion of the treaties with the other tribes, additional counties were created from the outer fringes of original Monroe County, often combined with newly ceded lands from other tribes. In the meantime, further subdivision of the original Monroe County had been taking place. But in 1816, when this census was taken, Monroe County comprised most of the present state of Alabama.

WASHINGTON COUNTY

This, the oldest of the counties of Alabama, has had an interesting history. It was created June 4, 1800, and as first created included all of Mississippi Territory lying between the Pearl and Chattahoochee Rivers. Mississippi Territory then extended, however, only as far south as the Spanish border, 31 degrees North Latitude, and as far north as a line due east from the mouth of the Yazoo River. Later, Washington County was cut down to extend eastward only to the Alabama River. Then, first Baldwin County and in 1812 Clarke County were taken from it. In 1816, it included the southern part of present Choctaw County and the southern boundary did not lie so far to the southward as it now does, since old Baldwin County then lay between Washington and Mobile Counties. When Baldwin County was moved from its original location, part of old Washington County which had been put into old Baldwin County reverted to Washington County, but in 1816 it should be remembered that the southern part of the present Washington County was in Baldwin County.

History can be confusing at times. But it should be remembered that county lines often change during the centuries.
