The last will and testament of Joseph Howell late of the County of Bond and State of Illinois, was brought into Court for probate and is as follows-vz- In theneme of God, Amen. I, Joseph Howell of the County of Bond. State of Illinois being weak in body but sound in mind and memory do make ordain and establish this to be my last will and testament, here by revoking all others, And I do hereby appoint John Gilmore to be the Executor of this my last will and testament. First: It is my will that all my just debts be paid and sufficent of my personal property be sold for that purpose. If my personal property is insufficent it is my will that my executor shall sell a certain tract of eighty acres situated in Bond County and known as the East half of South east. quarter of section no, one in township no. Five. north Range no. three west of the third principal meridan.

Second: After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses I do here by devise and bequeath to my daughter Betsy Blanchard the sum of Twenty five dollars.

Third: Also I devise and bequeath to my daughter Abigal Locy the sum of Twenty five dollars: It is my will that mybeloved wife Bethiah Howell live on the Plantation on which she now lives during her life time and that she be supported there from. It is also my will that my daughter Sarah Howell and Evalina Howell receive each twenty five dollars and that they be support from the proceeds of the farm on which my beloved wife reside so long as they continue to live on said farm or so long as thev live single. It is my will that the plantation after the death of my beloved wife be equally divided by a line running east and west, between my two sons John Smith Howell and Silas White Howell. Giving to John Smith Howell and South half of the said half quarter section. It is my will that the following described parcel, viz: the west half of the south west fourth of section no 16 in township no.5 North

Range, No.2, west of the third principal meridan ' containing twenty eight acres and twenty eight hundredths to be the property of my son John Smith Howell. It is my will that a certain tract of land situated as follows be equally divided between my sons John Smith Howell and Silas White Howell by a line running North and South and the west half be the property of John Smith Howell and the East half the property of Silas Howell, it being the north half of the South west Quarter of Section no.36 in township no.6, North Range, No.3 west of the third principal meridan, containing by estimate eighty acres. It is my will that all the cattle, horses, sheep, and hogs be sold at publick vendue and that the household furniture be the property of my beloved wife during her life time and at her death my sons John Smith, Silas W. Howell and my daughters Sarah and Evalina each to have a bed and beding. It is also my will that the after my death and legacies are baid off that the remainder be equally divided between all my children, viz: Betsy Blanchard, Abigal Locy, John Smith Howell, Sarah Howell, Evalina Howell and Silas Howell. 





I do hereby swear that Dyer Fitch, Sr., my grandfather, died at Robinson, Illinois, and is buried in the Old Cemetery here and not in Ohio as stated in said letter.

Dyer Wetmore Fitch son of Dyer Fitch and Betsey Wetmore his wife was born at Wellsburg Brooke Co. Virginia April 6th 1818.

He married Oct 1849 Julia A. Miller daughter of Watson Miller of Columbus Warren Co. Penn who died in Jan'y 1869, at Erie Penn.

He married 2nd Mary A. daughter of Alpheus and Mary (Trowbridge) Merrifield and widow of Wm C. Fay of Northampton, N. Y. - Jan'y 22nd 1874. He died at Erie Penn Jan'y 10th 1896 aged 77 years 9 months and 4 days.

He was the 3d son of Dyer Fitch "a merchant of Auburn N. Y. to the close of the war of 1812, having large and mutually satisfactory transactions with the Comissary Genl Peter B Porter during the war. The general decline in trade following the close of the war induced him to remove to the Allegheny valley and later to the vicinity of Wheeling Virginia. After some years of alternate successes and losses owing to the disturbed financial condition of the country he returned with his family to Rochester N Y and later settled in Ohio, closing there a long and eventful life on the 5th day of Sept 1862." D W F

Dyer Wetmore Fitch was of the 8th generation in descent from Rev James Fitch 1st minister of Norwich Conn who came with his widowed mother and brothers to America from England in 1638 a youth of 16 years, his father having died at Bocking Essex. Rev James died at Lebanon Conn Nov 18 1702, aged 79 years "He was distinguished for the penetration of his mind, the energy of his preaching and the sanctity of his life."

Elisha Fitch grandfather of Dyer W - was a pioneer settler in Vermont and was in active service under Gen'l Stark at the battle of Bennington. His wife was Rachel Kellum of New London Conn. Their children were Chester, Dyer, James Paine, Samuel, Elisha, Augustus, Mary, Sarah Abigail.

The maternal grandparents of Dyer W. Fitch were Parsons Wetmore of Middletown Conn. and Aurelia his wife who was a daughter of Judge Hugh White the pioneer settler of Central New York, who went with his family from Middletown and founded the town of Whitestown in 1784. The citizens of Oneida County celebrated the hundredth anniversary by erecting an imposing monument to his memory June 4th 1884.

Thomas Wetmore (formerly spelled Whitmore) was born in England in 1615, and came to America in 1635. He settled in Conn first at Weathersfield, afterward at martford where he married Sarah Hall in 1645, by whom he had 13 children.

He married 2nd Mary Platt Atkinson in 1667 who died leaving an infant daughter.

He married 3rd Catherine Leet Robards in 1673, by whom he had three children. He died in 1681 aged 66 years.

Joseph 7th son and 11th child of Thomas was born March 5th 1662 married June 1706 Lydia Bacon of Middletown Conn. and had 5 children. He died March 25, 1717. His wife died 1750.

Joseph son of Joseph was born in Middletown March 19th 1707, married Abigail Roberts June 1733 by whom he had ll children. His wife died Nov 1760. He married 2nd Rebecca Blake 1761.

Amos, 3rd child of Joseph 2nd was born in Middletown on Oct 14th 1740 married Rachel Parsons Nov 11th 1765 and had 8 children. He removed to Whitestown about 1790 and died there in 1807, aged 67. His wife died aged 82.

Parsons eldest son of Amos was born in Middletown on August 10th 1768, married 1787 Aurelia daughter of Judge Hugh White who was born July 22nd 1770. Their children were Betsey, Lois, Lansing, Parsons, Aurelia White, Aurelia White 2nd, Melancton Clark, Daniel White, Leonard, Angeline, Mary Louise, Zephaniah Davenport, Viscount Stone. These last two with Aurelia 1st and Lois died young.

This shows that Samuel Turner, Revolutionary Pensioner, 27 years of age (born ca 1752 or 1753) was living with Samuel Turner (his son?) on June 1, 1340 in Salt River Township, Ralls County, Missouri.

At the office of the Probate Judge of Ralls Co., Mo., we find he died intestate, (probably about 1847, see later) and letters were granted on Jan. 1, 1855, William Turner was appointed Administrator of his estate.

File #1141 shows that he served in the American Revolution. It seems he had lost his Pension Papers but had a copy, and after his death this copy was placed on record - it follows:

"Copy for Record. Samuel Turner pension papers — To bear date Oct. 2, 1855

January 1, 1855

Jonathan Abbey and Joshua S. Ely, two witnesses, residents of the County of Ralls and State of Missouri being personally known to the Court to be respectable and credible witnesses, being sworn in open court according to law, upon their oath say that they were each personally acquainted with Samuel Turner, a Revolutionary Pensioner, of the United States, and also with Abagail Turner, his wife—that the said Samuel and Abagail resided in the said county of Ralls; they were reputed to be man and wife, cohabited together as such, and raised a family of the Calhoun County, Illinois, Elizabeth Turnbough Hester Pace, William Turner of Missouri. That the said Abagail died in the year 1825, and that the said Samuel Turner died in the same County of Ralls, about eight years ago.

John Ralls, being also sworn, states that the said Samuel Turner, deceased, stated to him in his life time that he had lost or mislaid his Pension Jertificate—but had preserved a copy thereof, which is hereto annexed; that he knows the said Samuel Turner drew a pension payable at the agency in

St. Louis, Missouri. The said witnesses also state that they are not interested in the claim to be presented by the Heirs of the said Samuel Turner, decid., nor or akin to any person interested therein.

(underlining mine, M.D.M.)

I certify that in Jonformity with the law of the United States of the 7th June, 1832, Samuel Turner of the State of Missouri, who was a private in the army of the Revolution, is entitled to receive twenty dollars and no cents per annum during his natural life, commencin on the 4th of March, 1831, and payable semiannually, on the 4 March and 4th of September in every year. Given at the War Office of the United States, this twenty-ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three.

We, James Chisham and Thomas Brown, having been first duly sworn, do make the following statement, viz: that we know Samuel Turner who was a soldier in the Revolution in the year 1781, being now as we believe about 75 years old — we know that he served 3 months under Capt. Robt. Pollard and under the command of Col. James Slaughter. The service was rendered in the State of Virginia on the waters of James River — John Williams was a Major in the Regt. and James Gains was Lieut. in Capt. Pollard's Company — & in the Brigade commanded by Gen'l. Peter Mulenburg — during the above 3 months he was in the battle at Petersburg, Virginia. We were both of us with Samuel Turner during the three months service — this 21st Sept. 1832.

In addition to the within service I, Thos. Brown, having been first duly sworn, do state that Samuel Turner served three months under Capt. Francis Covington; Col. James Barbour was Col. part of the time & afterward we were commanded by Col. Elias Edmond and in the Brigade Commanded by Edward Stevens. The Major was Nathaniel Welch. The service was in the fall of the year 1751 and was at the surrender of Gen'l. Cornwallace at the siege of Little York, Virginia.

I do further state that I was with said Turner during the whole three months tour.

Mr. Turner and all other pensioners in Missouri can draw their pension annually, at the pension agency at St. Louis by applying for them & presenting their papers in due form, prior to the 4th day of May in each year—This would be the best and safest course for all pensioners in Missouri (to inserted) pursue as there is great risque in forwarding to them drafts for the amounts due (them, inserted) as pensioners, (from, inserted) this place by mail—I would therefore advise as a matter of safety to pensioners, that they (sic) apply in due time for the payments of their Claims at St. Louis.

You will also receive inclosed herewith a draft for \$30. made payable to me as the Attorney of Mr. Turner, which appears to be in full of his pension up to the 4th of March 1839 - I have endorsed the Draft and made it payable to the order of Mr. Turner. I will thank you to take his receipt in my name, for the same and enclose it to me at this place at as early a day as you can, that I may file the same in the proper Draft.
