Dear reader:

There has been a long felt need for historical records and/or a history of Old Crab Orchard, Lincoln County, Stanford, Kentucky by historians and genealogists everywhere, not only because so many of the early Kentucky pioneers transacted their business at the Stanford Court . House, who resided within reaching distance, but because a great majority passed through Old Crab Orchard on their way to the west, even some of the old ministers from Virginia, one in particular: Frederick Bonner, Senior stated he left Dinwiddie County, Virginia, traveled through Petersburg, Va., on through southern part of Virginia, thence through Old Crab Orchard, Ky. 1802, crossed the river at Cincinnati, - his wagon with 2 teams hitched to it crossed the big river in safety, but the wagon with I team had difficulty as one of the horses fell dead, and in trying to get it raised some of his party were nearly drowned. Many other stories in histories disclose the fact about the early travelors through Lincoln County, Kentucky, and too, many other mountain counties were eventually formed out of this county, if research workers and genealogists are seeking records of early Kentucky, especially the mountain section, they should refer to the records of Lincoln County,

In those early days when travel was so very difficult, and the pioneers were afraid to travel alone, they would set certain dates to start from Old Crab Orchard, and advise everyone that desired to go through the Wilderness, to meet at Old Crab Orchard on a certain date and bring with them their hunting knives, guns or any other weapons for their protection, which amounts to about the same as we today meet at a bus or train station, (but we don't have to take our weapons). I found this reference at the Library of Congress in one of the early Kentucky newspapers.

If readers desire records of their encestors, please write to me giving county and state your ancestors lived during the dates of 1880-1870-1860-1850-1840-1830-1820-1810-1790 or as much as you know about them. If they lived in Lincoln Co, Ky., I would like for you to let me print the records in Volume 2 of this county record, which I hope to prepare in the next few months. But if your encestors lived in some other county and state, I would be gled to make an estimate on the work which it would require, if interested.

I have access to all the county and state records of the U.S. Census which shows date and place of birth of every person in their family in the 1880-1870-1860-1850, while the earlier 10 year periods only show name of head of each family, with total males & females, and their approximate age. Would like for you to also state whether your ancestors served in any wars, or if they received a pension, so I could see if the pensions disclose any family date, as many of them give date & place of marriages, names of their children, date and place of enlistment, & discharge, to and from where they removed prior to and after wars were over.

BARNETT REMOVED AND SETTLED BARNETT'S STATION, SO CALLED IN THE PRESENT COUNTY OF LINCOLN WITHIN ONE MILE OF DEPONENT.

THAT CAPT BARNETT WAS CAPTAIN UNDER COL. BENJ. LOGAN ON THE EXPEDITION TO THE BLUE LICKS ON 20TH AND AIDED IN BURYING THE DEAD AND RECEIVED A CREDIT FOR A MONTH'S TOUR. THE DEPONENT FURTHER SAYS THAT CAPT. ROBT., BARNETT WAS CAPT UNDER COL. BENJ. LOGAN L782, AND DEPONENT IN CAPT. BARNETT'S COMPANY ON A 2 MONTHS TOUR AGAINST PICKAWAY, ONE OF THE PRINCIPAL TOWNS OF THE SHAWNEES, THAT WE RENDERZVOUED FIRST AT BRYANT'S STATION AND SUBSEQUENTLY JOINED GENERAL CLARK AT THE MOUTH OF LICKING, ABOUT THE FIRST OF OCTOBER 1782, WAS THE RENDERZVOUED AT BRYANT'S STATION AND GENERAL CLARK, ABOUT THE 3RD OF NOVEMBER AT THE MOUTH OF LICKING.

DEPONENT FURTHER STATES THAT HE WAS NO DISTINCT RECOLLECTION OF THE PRECISE DATES OF THE RENDEZVOUS AT BRYANT'S STATION AND SUBSEQUENT JOINING THE GENERAL CLARK AT THE MOUTH OF LICKING, BUT HAS GIVEN THE ABOVE DATES, BY A CALCULATION MADE FROM A PAYROLL OF CAPT. BARNETT, DATED 11-3-1782, THE DATES ARE HOWEVER, FROM THE BEST OF HIS RECOLLECTION CORRECT.

THE DEPONENT STATES THAT CAPT. BARNETT WAS IN COMMAND THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE OF THE XEPDITION AGAINST THE PICKAWAYS, DEPNENT STATES THAT HE WAS ENVOLUVED IN CAPT BARNETT'S COMPANY AND CONTINUED IN THE SAME PERFORMING OCCASIONAL TOURS OF DATA AND OCCASIONAL SCOUTS FROM THE TIME ROBERT BARNETT WAS COMISSIONED, CAPT UNTIL THE CONCLUSION OF A TREATY OF PEACE IN 1783. SERVED A MONTH'S TOUR OF DUTY UNDER CAPT ROBERT BARNETT TO THE FALLS OF THE OHIO RIVER AND AIDED IN ERECTING A FORT.

THAT HE WELL REMEMBERS CAPT ROBERT BARNETT BEING ATH THE BURYING OF THE DEAD AFTER THE BATTLE OF THE BLUE LICKS UNDER BENJ. LOGAN, DEPONENT WAS IN CAPT. MARTIN'S COMPANY, THAT HE WELL RECOLLECTS CAPT. ROBERT BARNETT. BEING ON GENERAL CLARK'S 2 MONTHS CAMPAIGN AGAINST PICKAWAY, (THE PRINCIPAL TOWN OF THE SHEWANEE INDIANS) IN OCT. AND NOV. 1782, DEPNENT HAVING BEEN ALSO THERE UNDER CAPT. MARTIN, SIGNED BEN ESTES

DECLARATION IN ORDER TO OBTAIN PENSION WAS MADE BY THIS

REVOLUTIONARY WAR SOLDIER OCTOBER 1832, HIS RESIDENCE BING IN LINCOLN

COUNTY. KENTUCKY AGE 70.

That he entered the service of the U. S. In the Virginia militia as a substitute for his father John Barnett. under the following named officers and etc., 3 months under Capt. John Leake, and Col. Martin (he tthinks) John Jones, Lieut, that he served in the year 1780 in the winter thinks that it was the duty of the company he was in to guard the public magazine in Guilford Co., N. C. pursuant to the command of Ge eral Green to (Sec#6) Preserve it from the tories, that there were no regular officers, or regiments stationed near them, that they marched only from on e part of Guilford Co. N. C. to another in which they were stationed; that there was no regular discharge in writing. But they were beleived at the expiration of their term of Duty at the public magazine, that he was in no battle.

HE ENTERED AS A VOLUNTEER AGAIN THE FIRST PART OF THEMONTH OF MARCH 1781, UNDER THE COMMAND OF CAPT. JOHN MAY, MARTIN WAS THE COLONEL, HE THINKS A MAN BY THE NAME OF HUNTER WAS THE GENERAL, NATHANIEL GREEN WAS THE COMMANDER IN CHIEF, COL'S WASHIGNTON, AND LEE, BOMMANDED THE CAVALRY, THAT HE RESIDED IN GUILFORD, CO. N. C. WHEN HE VOLUNTEERED, THAT THEY WERE MARCHED BACKWARDS AND FORWARDS, MANUEVERING THROUGHT THE COUNTY UNTIL THE AMERCIAN ARMY UNDER GENERAL GREEN CIRCUMENVENTED? THE BRITISH ARMY, UNDER LORD CORNWALLIS AT GUILFORD COURT HOUSE; THAT HE WAS IN THE BATTLE UNDER THE OFFICERS OF HIS COMPANY. THAT THE BATTLE WAS FOUGHT ABOUT THE MIDDLE OF MARCH; THAT HE SERVED ABOUT 3 MONTHS; DISCHARGED BY JOHN MAY, CAPTAIN AT CATP. JOHN MAY'S OWN HOUSE ON DAN RIVER. THAT HE HAS LOST HIS DISCHARGE; THAT IN THE SAME YEAR, HE EMIGRATED TO THE DISTRICTO OF KENTUCKY. THEN A PART OF THE STATE OF VIRGINIA AND CAME TO LOGAN'S FORT.

THAT IN THE SPRING OF THE YEAR 1782, ABOUT THE MONTH OF MAY, HE ENTERED THE SERVICE AS A SUBSTITUTE FOR GEORGE MUZZELL? GEORGE MURREL? IN PURSUANCE OF AN ORDER FROM COL.LOGAN TO REVLIEVE! ESTILL'S FORT. WHICH WAS THREATENED BY THE INDIANS, CAPT ESTILL HAVING LATELY BEEN DEFEATED AND KILLED BY THE INDIANS, WITH 180R 20 MEN, THAT HE SERVED A TOUR OF ONE MONTH. VERBALLY, DISCHARGED BY CAPT. JOHN WOODS, THE COMMANDING OFFICER OFESTILL'S FORT. THAT IN THE MONTH OF JUNE OR JULY, HE DOES NOT RECOLLECT, WHICH 1782, HE VOLUNTEERED UNDER CAPTAIN ROBERT BARNETT, BENJ. LOGAN, WAS THE COLONEL.

SECTION # 7

COLONEL, AND MARCHED TO THE BLUE LICKS IN THE DISTRICT OF KENTUCKY FOR THE PURPOSE OF BURYING THE DEAD, THAT HAD BEEN KILLED BY THE INDIANS, IN THE DEFEAT OF COLS. TODD AND TRIGG AT THE BLUE LICKS AND THAT HE SERVED A TOUR OF ONE MONTH WHEN THEY WERE DISCHARGED.

THAT IN A FEW DAYS AFTER THE SAME YEAR 1782, HE SUBSTITUTED FOR LAZARUS COTTON AND MARCHED FROM BARNETT'S STATION IN LINCOLN COUNTY UNDER THE COMMAND OF CAPTAIN KIRKUM, Col. Jack was the col. to Bullitt's Lick, for the purpose of guarding the salt works at place, which was the only place where salt could be procured in the western country and which was constantly by the Indians where he remained doing duty for one month, when they returned to Lincoln County and were discharged in the the usual manner by their officers. That in the month of October 1782. He volunteered under Captain Robert Barnett, John Logan was the Lieutenant, Colonel and Benj. Logan were the Colonels and went on what was called General Clark's 1782 Campaign, up the Big Miami.

THEY RENDERZVOUSED OPPOSTIE THE MOUTH OF THE LICKING RIVER, WHERE CINCINNATI, NOW STANDS. WHEN THEY MARCHED UP THE MIAMI TO THE OLD SHEWANEE TOWN, WHERE THEY HAD A BATTLE AND DEFEATED THE INDIANS, GENERAL CLARK COMMANDED AND BENJ. LOGAN WAS THE 2ND., IN COMMAND. THAT ON THE SAME DAY ABOUT 2 HOURS BY SUN.

COL. LOGAN CONDUCTED AN EXPEDITION OF ABOUT 110 MEN, VOLUNTEERS AND MARCHED ABOUT 22 MILES TO AN INDIAN TWON IN WHICH THERE WAS A FRENCH STORE, THAT THEY SURPRISED THE TOWN AND CAPTURED SOME PRISONERS AND RETURNED TO THE MAIN BODY UNDER GENERAL CLARK, THAT THEY THEN MARCHED BACK TO THE MOUTH OF LICKING WHERE THEY CROSSED THE OHIO AND WERE DISCHARGED SO SOON AS THEY CROSSED AND PROCEEDED HOME AND THAT HE SERVED A TOUR OF SIXTY DAYS OR TWO MONTHS.

THAT IN THE FALL AND WINTER OF 1782 HE VOLUNTEERED UNDER THE COMMAND OF CAPT JOHN WOODS AND MARCHED FROM ENGLISH'S FORT TO THE CUMBERLAND MOUNTAINS TO GUARD THE EMIGRANTS FROM THE STATE OF VIRGINIA TO THE INTERIOR OF KENTUCKY, WHICH WAS MADE A PART OF THEIR DUTY BY LAW. AND THAT THEY WERE ENGAGED IN THIS SERVICE FOR ONE MONTH WHEN HE WAS DISCHARGED BY HIS OFFICERS.

THAT HE WAS BORN IN AMHURST COUNTY VIRGINIA IN 1762; THAT HE WAS TAKEN TO NORTH CAROLINA TO GUILFORD COUNTY WHEN HE WAS YOUNG. THAT HE LEFT NORTH CAROLINA IN 178k AND CAME TO "ENTUCKY DIRECTLY AFTER THE BATTLE OF GUILFORD COURT HOUSE, WHERE HE HASREMAINED EVER SINCE. HE WOULD STATE THAT IN THE MONTH OF MAY 1783, HE WENT ON A VOLUNTEER EXPEDITION UNDER COLS. BENJ. LOGAN AND JOHN LOGAN AND ISAAC SHELBY, CAPT ROBERT BARNETT, TO EXPELL AN INROAD OF SOME NORTHERN INDIANS WHO HAD ENCAMPED ON THE SANDY RIVER, THAT THEY MARCHED TO THE CAMP OF INDIANS WHO RETREATED AND ABANDONED THE COUNTRY, BUT THEY COULD BE OVERTAKEN WHICH WAS ABOUT ONE MONTH ON THIS EXPEDITION. HE THINKS HE HAS SERVED IN ALL ABOUT 13 MONTHS. THAT HE CAN PROVE THE GREATER PART OF HIS SERVICE BY MRS. ANN HALL, JOSEPH HALL, BENJ. BRIGGS, AND ABRAHAM ESTES. (HE SIGNED HIS NAME IN A BEAUTIFUL WRITING AS FOLLOWS: JAMES P. BARNETT)

NOW A PART OF KENTUCKY, LINCOLN COUNTY; THAT HE REGULARLY DREW HIS RATIONS OR POWDER AND AMMUNITION AND PROVISIONS DURING THAT PERIOD AS A SOLDIER; THAT THE SHEWANEE AND OTHER INDIANS WERE VERY TROUBLESOME FREQUENTLY BREAKING UPON THE FRONTIER SETTLEMENTS AND MASSACREEING THE INHABITANTS. HE STATES THAT HE WAS IN NO REGULAR BATTLE, BUT THAT HE FORT WAS OFGEN BESEIGED BY THE INDIANS AND GARRISON CONFINED TO THE FORT FOR WEEKS AT A TIME; THAT HE ALSO PERFORMED THE DUTY OF A SCOUT OR SPY RANGING UPON THE SOUTHERN FRONTIERS OF THE STATE OF VIRGINIA TO GIVE INFORMATION OF ANY SUDDEN INROADS OF THE INDIANS. THERE WAS NO OFFICER OF A HIGHER GRADE THAN BENJAMIN LOGAN, WHO WAS CAPT DANIEL TRABUE WAS ASSISTANT COMISSARY. ALL OF THE ABOVE NAMED OFFICERS WERE COMMISSIONED BY THE GOVERNOR OF VA. HE SERVED HIS ABOVE TERM OF TOUR OF 2 YEARS AND WAS REGULARLY DISCHARGED BY HIS CAPT. BEN J. LOGAN AT LOGAN'S FORT.

THAT IN "PRIL 178L AGAIN ENTERED AS A DRAFT AND SERVED ONE MONTH AT SAMUEL BRIGG'S STATION IN LINCOLN CO., UNDER CAPT ROBERT BARNETT, WILLIAM CASEY WAS LIEUT, BENJAMIN LOGAN WAS COLONEL AND JOHNLOGAN WAS LIEUT, COLONEL AND AFTER BUARDING SAID STATION OF ONE MONTH WAS REGULARLY DISCHARGED THEREBY CAPTAIN ROBERT BARNETT.

IN THE YEAR 1782, IN MAY, HE WAS ORDERED BY BENJAMIN LOGAN THE COLONEL OF LINCOLN COUNTY TO ESTILL'S FORT, TO WHICH PLACE, HE WAS MARCHED UNDER THE COMMAND OF CAPT. JOHN WOODS, HE DOES NOT RECOLLECT THE NAME OF THE OTHER OFFICERS. THE COUNTRY HAD BEEN THROWN INTO GREAT ALARM BY THE DEFEAT OF CAPT. ESTILL, JOHN WOODS COMMANDING AT ESTILL'S FORT AFTER ESTILL'S DEFEAT. THAT IN THE MONTH OF AUGUST L782 HE AGAIN ENLISTED AS A VOLUNTEER UNDER COL. BENJAMIN LOGAN TO REPEAL AN INVASION OF THE SHAWNEE INDIANS, THAT THE MILITIA OF THE COUNTRY WAS CALLED OUT ON MARCH THERE WAS NO ORGANIZATION OF THE MILITIA INTO COMAPNIES AS THE INDIANS HAD DEFEATED COL. TODD AND TRIGG BEFORE THEY ARRIVED AT THE SCENE OF ACTION AND LEFT THE COUNTRY. THEY WENT ON AND BURIED THE DEAD. HE SERVED A TOUR OF ONE MONTH AND I WAS VERBALLY DISCHARGED BY COL. BENJAMIN LOGAN.

THE TIN THE ONTH OF SEPTEMBER 1782, HE AGAIN ENTERED THE SERVICE, AS A DRAFTED MAN UNDER THE COMMAND OF CAPT ROBERT BARNETT, Who gasey, was lieut, and etc., and marched from lincoln co, to the mouth of Licking River, where, they were joined by General George Rogers Clark, He with some regular troops and other militia. General Clark assumed the command and they marched up the miami River as High as the Pickaway towns, which were to be after a battle with the indians, he served a tour of 2 months and was verbally discharged at the mouth of Licking River, by Capt. Robert Barnett.

THAT IN NOVEMBER 1782, HE AGAIN ENTERED SERVICES AS A VOLUNTEER MILITIAMAN, UNDER CAPT JOHN WOODS, JOHN LOGAN WAS THE COLONNEL BENJA, IN LOGAN WAS GENERAL, HE DOES NOT RECOLLECT THE OTHER BEFICERS FOR THE PURPOSE OF GUARDING THE EMIGRANTS TO THE WESTERN COUNTRY THROUGH THE WILDERNESS INTO THE INTERIOR OF KENTUCKY; WHICH WAS VERY MUCHINFESTED BY THE INDIANS, SERVED A TOUR OF ONE MONTH AND WAS DISCHARGED BY JOHN WOODS CAFTAIN.

IN THE DISTRICT OF KENTUCKY AND SCOUTING AND SPYING FROM ONE FORT TO ANOTHER AND UP THE KENTU KY RIVER, AT THE BLUE LICKS AND LOUISVILLE, AS FAR AS PCKAWAY TOWN ON THE MIAMI RIVER; THAT HE SERVED IN ALL 29 MONTHS; THAT HE HAS NO DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE OF HIS SERVICES, BUT CAN PROVE THE SAME BY DANIEL TRABUE OF ADAIR CO., KENTUCKY AND ABRAHAM ES ESTES AND JAMES P. KNOW BY BEING ASSISTANT COMMISSARY AND TO THE TRUE AND THAT SAID BENJAMIN BRIGGS DID THE DUTY OF A PRIVATE SOLDIER UNTIL THE 2ND., OF 1779 MAKING 2 YEARS AND I KNOW HIM TO BE THE IDENTICAL PERSON WHO DID THE DUTY AND LIVED WITHIN SEVEN MILES OF LOGAN'S FORT EVER SINCE IN LINCOLN COUNTY, KENTUCKY. -- AFFIDAVIT OF ABRAHAM ESTES, A RESIDENT OF LINCOLN CO., KY., SEYS THAT HE KNOWS THE DECLARANT BENJ. BRIGGS SERVED ONE MONTH AT SAMUED BRIGG'S STATION 1781 AS BRIGGS'S HAS STATED IN HIS DECLARATION, AND THAT IN AUGUST 1782. HE AGAIN SERVED A TOUR OF DUTY WITH THE DECLARANT BENJAMIN BRIGGS OF ONE MONTH WHEN THEY MARCHED TO THE BLUE LICKS TO B BURY THE DEAD AS STATED BY BRIGGS IN THE ABOVE DECLARATION AND UNDER THE COMMAND OF BENJAMIN LOGAN, WHO WAS COLONEL, ALSO IN THE SAME YEAR. HE DIED MARCH 31, 1826 SAYS SHE WAS MARRIED TO HER HUSBAND BEFORE THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR, BEFORE 1772 OR 1773 BUT SHE HAD 3 CHILDREN AT THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE WAR AND SHE WORKED, FED AND CLOTHED HER CHILDREN ALL THE TIME HER HUSBAND WAS IN THE WAR TO THE ASTONISHMENT OF HER NEIGHBORS, THAT HER FIRST CHILD WAS ABORN ABOUT ONE YEAR AFTER HER MARRIAGE AND THERE WAS ONE YEAR BETWEEN THE OTHERS WHICH MAKES THE MARRIAGE ABOUT 3 OR 4 YEARS PEREVIOUS TO THE OLD WAR. HE BEING ENTIRELY DERANGED DURING HIS ABSENCE BUT BEFORE THE EXPIRATION OF HIS TERM WAS RESTORED SUFFICIENTLY TO RETURN TO THE SERVICE WHICH HE DID AND "SERVED OUT HIS TIME IN CAPT. WILLIAMS'S C OMPANY, DONOHO'S REGIMENT AND GENERAL SUMPTER'S BRIGADE. HE WAS DERANGED WHEN FURLOWED AS HE HAS BEEN INFORMED. IN THE SPRING OF 1778 ENLISTED AGAIN AT GUILFIRD NORTH CAROLINA UNDER CAPT. JOHN LEEEKS IN THE THIRD NORTH CAROLINA REGIMENT, AND TRANSFERRED TO CAPT. WILLIAMS IN COL., PAISLEY'S REGIMENT AND SERVED OUT HIS TERM OF 9 MONTHS AND WAS DISCHARGED AT MONK'S CORNER, SOUTH CAROLINA, NEAR CHARLESTON BY COL. DONOHO BUTLER, WAS IN THE BATTLES OF EUTAW OR CAMDEN, GUILFORD AND STONE.

HIS FAMILY CONSISTED OF HIS WIFE AND 3 CHILDREN, A GIRL AGED 13 AND 2 SONS, ONE 17 AND THE OTHER 14 AND 2 ORPHANED GRAND CHILDREN, ONE 4 AND THE OTHER 2.

THE SERVICE 1776, THAT HE WAS DRAFTED AS A MILITIAMAN, THA HE MARCHED GENERALLY ABOUT THE COUNTRY NEAR WILLIAMSBURG AND AS FAR AS BOWLING GREEN. AMD THAT HE TOOK ONE TRIP UP TO THE RACOON FORD ON THE RAPPAHANNOCH. HE STATES THAT HE SERVED IN THE 5TH REG-IMENT IF THE VA. MILITITA. HE STATES IN AN APPLICATION MADE 1832, IN LINCOLN COUNTY, THAT HE ENTERED THE SERVICE IN LOUISA CO. VA. THAT HE WAS BORN AND REARED ABOUT 3 MILES FROM THE COURT HOUSE OF LOUISA CO., VA, BORN IN THE YEAR 1760, THAT HE WAS DRAFTED ABOUT THE AGE OF 16, THAT HES NAME WAS RECORDED IN THE PARISH REGISTER OF HIS PARISH IN LOUISA CO. FRUM WASHINGTON COUNTY, VIRGINIA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ATTACTING GOL. FERG FERGERSON AND HIS ARMY. THEY MARCHED THROUGH NORTH CAROLINA ATO KINGS MOUNTAIN WHERE THEY ATTACKT THE BRITISH UNDER COLONEL FERGERSON WHO THEY KILLED AND CAPTURED HIS ARMY. HE WAS IN THE BATTLE COMMANDED BY HIS OFFICERS AS ABOVE NAMED. COL. [SAAC SHELBY FROM

SULLIVAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE WAS PRESENT AND ALSO COLONEL WILLIAM

JOHN ARMSTRONG OF WHICH HE WAS ONE AND WHILE THEY WERE RECONDITERING THEY WERE ATTACHED BY GENERAL TARLTON, THAT TARLTON IN PERSON ATTACTED HIM AND AFTER A SEVERE CONFLICT TARLTON CUT THIS DEPONENET, WITH HIS SWORD, ON THE FOREPART OF HIS HEAD, QUITE THROUGH THE SKULL, THE SKULL WHEN HE FELL FROM HIS HORSE AND CAPT. LEE GAVE HIM A FURLOUGH WIRHOUT LIMIT. IN HOPES HIS HEALTH MIGHT IMPROVE BUT HIS WOUNDS CONTINUED SOMETIME.

IN THE 2ND. TROOP AND WAS WELL ACQUAINTED WITH JOHN FLEEGE OF SAID LEGION IN THE THIRD TROOP AND THAT ON THE 13TH DAY OF MARCH 178K, 2 DAYS PREVIOUS TO THE BATTLE OF GUILFORD COURT HOUSE, NORTH CAROLINA THE SAID JOHN FLEECE WAS ORDERED OUT ON A DETACHMENT UNDER CAPTL JAMES ARMSTRONG OF THE FIRST TROOP, THEY FELL IN WITH THE BRITISH HORSE COMMANDED BY COL. THEY CAHSED THE INDIANS OVER THE COUNTRY OCCASIONALLY COMING IN CONTACT WITH THEM. TOOK SEVERAL OF THEIR TOWNS. CAPT. ELLIOTT WAS KILLED IN A LITTLE ENGAGEMENT WITH THE INDIANS ON THE HYWASEE RIVER A FORK OF THE TENNESSEE. HE ALSO RECEIVED WOUNDS DURING THE ENGAGEMENT FROM AND INDIAN ARROW. WE HAD SHOT ACROSS THE RIVER AND BROKE AN INDIAN'S THIGH AND CAPT. ELIOTT RODE OVER TO SCALP HIM THINKING HE WAS DEAD. THE INDIAN HAD SQUATTED IN THE SAGE GRASS AND THE CAPTAIN APPROACHED, HE SHOT HIM IN THE HEAD. AFTER THIS WE SCOURED THE COUNTRY, WE MARCHED BACK AND DISCHARGED. HAVING BEEN IN ACTUAL SERVICE AS HE BELIEVES UPWARDS OF 3 MONTHS. HE VOLUNTEERED AGAIN IN 1780 AS HE BLIEVES AGAINST THE BRITISH AND TORIES UNDER CAPT. FINLEY AND MARCHED TO THE LEAD MINES ON NEW RIVER AND WAS STATIONED THERE AS A GUARD AND THEN CAME AN EXPRESS FOR US TO MARCH TO KING S MOUNTAIN AND WE IMMEDIATELY MARCHED THERE AND JOINED COL. CAMPBELL. HE STATES HE WAS IN THE BATTLE THAT JAMES CURRY A SERGEANT WAS SHOT THROUGH THE BOWELS AND THE NIGHT AFTER THE BATTLE HE CARRIED WATER TO HIM IN HIS SHOE AND ATTENDED TO HIM. UNTIL HE DIED WHICH WAS JUST BEFORE DAY. A. MR. BLACKBURN WAS ALSO KBLLED AND 4 MEN BY THE NAME OF DEDMONSON WITH WHOM HE WAS WELL ACQUAINTED WERE ALSO KILLED AND COL. WILLIAMS WAS KILLED LIKEWISE W WITH WHOM HE HAD NO ACQUAINTANCE. SOMETIME AFTER HE WAS DISCHARGED HAVING SERVED OUT HIS TOUR OF 3 MONTHS AND BEING IN ACTUAL SERVICE ALL THE TIME. THEN WERE LIKEWISE MAJORS, PAULSON AND GAMBLE AND COLONEL GAS CON AND WILLIAM DAVIS, THE WHOLE BRIGADE UNDER THE COMMAND OF BARON STEUBEN, THAT HIS COMPANY WAS MARCHED FROM CURPEPPER COURT HOUSE, VIRGINIA, TO FREDERICKSBURG IN THE SAME STATE WHEN CAPT. HALL. RESIGNED TO THE COMMAND OF THE COMPANY WAS BESTOWED ON CAPT. STEPHENSON WHO EXERCISED AND DISCIPLINED THE COMPANY WHILST IT REMAINED IN THAT TOWN. AND FROM THAT PLACE THEY MARCHED IN PURSUIT OF ENEMY WHO HAD INVADED VIRGINIA. SOMETIME IN THE MONTH OF AUGUST, BUT DOES NOT REMEMBER THE EXACT YEAR, BUT BELIEVES IT WAS ABOUT 2 YEARS BEFORE THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE. She well recollects that when her husband was in the Revolutionary war, she raised with her own hands and exertion 2 crops that while she was engaged in ploughing corn one of the seasons she had to fastn her oldest child on her back and carry him while ploughing having no person to stay with him while she was at work and her child was too small to leave by itself. She further states that her husband and herself removed to and settled in what is now lincoln county, Kentucky, the same year of the defeat of the Blue Licks, she believes the year 1784, and her husband was called on to assist in burying the dead. She then had one child and the February following in 1785 her 2nd., child was born. She and her husband and had six vehildren.

SHE CONSIDERED IT HER DUTY TO STATE THAT ABOUT 12 YEARS AGO
HER HUSBAND WITHOUT JUST CAUSE SEPARATED FROM HER AND LIVED APART

TAYLOR: JOHN

THE SERVICE IN 178K IN THE MONTH OF DECEMVER BY A DSICHARGE FROM MAJOR NELSON. AT A PLACE CALLED THE GLEBE IN HANOVER COUNTY VIRGINIA. HE STATES THAT DURING THE TIME HE WAS IN SERVICE WAS IN AN ENGAGEMENT WITH THE HESSIANS AT SUFFOLK, VA., NEAR THE DISMAL SWAMPS. CANNOT REMEMBER EXACTLY BUT THINKS IT WAS IN 1780 OR 1781. HE RECOLLECTS IT WAS AFTER T THE BATTLE OF GUILFORD COURT HOUSE AND CAPTAIN ARMORY? MAJOR NELSON AND HE THINKS GENERAL MORGAN COMMANDED. HE WAS IN ANOTHER SKIRMISH AT SUFFOLK, UNDER THE COMMAND OF LT. CLEM- REED, WHO HAD THE COMMAND OF ADVANCED GUARD, WHICH WAS SHORTLY BEFORE THE OTHER AFFIANT AT SUFFOLK AND HE WAS ALSO IN ANOTHER LITTLE SKIRMISH BELOW PETERSBURG. IN VA. HE DOES NOT RECOLLECT THE PARTICULAR TIME WHEN IT TOOK PLACE BUT IT WAS IN 1780 OR 1781. HE STATES THAT HIS COMPANY WAS ATTACHED TO COL. WASHINGTON'S REGIMENT OF DRAGOONS WHEN THEY WERE STATIONED AT NEW Providence in North Carolina and General Morgan was commanding General. THAT BE WAS BORN IN PRINCE EDWARD'S COUNTY, VA., ABOUT 8, ILES FROM THE COURT HOUSE AND THAT HE ENTERED THE SERVUCE WHILE HE RESIDED IN SECTION 83

THE SAID COUNTY AND STATE AND THAT HE ENLISTED UNDER YOUNG LIEUTENANT CLEM? REED. THAT THEY MARCHED FROM MOOR'S ARMORY, AS THEN CALLED A TAVERN IN PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY IN VIRGINIA TO PETERSBERG IN THE SAME STATE, FROM THENCE THEY MARCHED TO WILLIAMSBURG. BARRACKS, WHERE THEY LAW DURING THE WINTER AND MARCHED NEXT SPRING TO A BTICK HOUSE NEAR LITTLE YORK WHERE THEY WERE STATIONED FOR SOMETIME AND FROM THAT PLACE THEY WERE MARCHED TO NEW PROVIDENCE IN NORTH CAROLINA. THEY CROSSED THE ADKIN RIVER AT THE SHALLOW FORD. HE STATES THAT COL. WASHINGTON WAS THE COMMANDER OF THE REGIMENT OF DRAGOONS IN THE SERVICE OF THE U.S. AND THAT GENERAL MORGAN WAS COMMANDING THE REGULAR OFFICER. HE STATES THAT HE CAN PROVE HIS SERVICES BY CAPTAIN THOMAS SMITH OF GREEN COUNTY, KY., WHO SERVED WITH HIM. HE HEREBY RELINQUISHES ALL CLAIMS WHATEVER TO A PENSIOM OF ANNUITY EXCEPT THE PRESENT AND DECLARES THAT HIS NAME IS NOT ON THE AGENCY ROLL OF ANY STATE.

HE IS NEARLY BLIND. HAS BEEN WITHOUT HIS JUST ALLOWANCE FOR 3 YEARS OR MORE. PLEASE LET THE OLD MAN HEAR FROM YOU DIRECT YOUR LETTER TO THE RICHMOND, MISSOURI, RAY COUNTY, MO. POST OFFICE.

HE MADE AND DECLARATION IN RAY CO., MO, THAT HE REMOVED FROM KENTUCKY TO MISSOURI IN DECEMBER 1836, WHERE THE GREATER PART OF MY CHILDREN WERE RESIDING. HE WAS INDUCED TO MOVE ON ACCOUNT OF HIS BEING NARLY BLIND, SO THAT HE COULD BE CLOSE TO HIS CHILDREN, SO THEY COULD TRANSACT BUSINESS FOR HIM AND ALSO BY REASON OF RUNNING A TURNPIKE ROAD THROUGH THE LAND HE OWNED IN THE STATE OF KENTUCKY

I HAVE NOW WAITED OVER 3 YEARS INCE | LEFT SAID PAPERS IN THE HANDS OF SAID PIERSON.

E. B. TAYLOR AND EPHRIAM HILL, MADE AFFIDAVITS IN RAY CO., MO. THAT THEY ARE WELL ACQUAINTED WITH SAID JOHN TAYLOR. JOHN TAYLOR SAID IN AN APPLICATION FOR TRANSFER 1840 THAT HIS CHILDREN HAD ALL MOVED TO THE STATE OF MO., OR WERE ABOUT TO MOVE THENCE, BEING NEARLY 76 YEARS OF AGE. HE SAID HE LEFT KENTUCKY ABOUT SEPT 1836.

HE THOUGHT AS QELL AS HIS CHILDREN THAT THEY COULD DO BETTER IN MISSOURI, THAN IN KENTUCKY AND ANOTHER REASON WAS THAT HE OWNED A PIECE OF LAND IN KENTUCKY AND THEY RAN A TURNPIKE ROAD THROUGH HIS LAND DIAGONALLY AND HE DID NOT HAVE ENOUGH TIMBER TO FENCE BOTH SIDES OF THE SAID ROAD. TUCKER WAS THE OLONEL AND GENERAL LAWSON WAS THE GENERAL OF THE
REGIMENT OF BRIGADE. HE THINKS HE ENTERED ON HIS 2ND., TOUR ABOUT
THE MIDDLE PART OF JULY 178K AND THAT HE ENTERED ON BOTH O.CCASIONS
AS A DRAFT.

HE STATES THAT HE WAS AT THE SEIGE OF LITTLE YORK WHEN LORD CORNWALLIS WAS CAPUTRED AND THAT HE SERVED THROUGH THE WHOLE SEIGE AND DID NOT LEAVE THE PLACE UNTIL THE CAPITULATION OF THE BRITISH ARMY. THAT HE RESIDED IN THE COUNTY OF CHARLOTTE AND STATE OF VARGINIA ABOUT 7 MILES FROM THE COURT HOUSE. THAT HE REMOVED TO THE STATE OF KENTUCKY IN THE YEAR 18191810 WHERE HE HAS RESIDED EVER SINCE, THE COMMANDING OFFICERS IN THE REGULAR ARMY AND CONTINENTAL TROOPS WERE GENERAL WASHINGTON, LAFAYETTE, COURT DEROACHBEAU, WAYNE AND A NUMBER OFOTHERS. HE STATES THAT HE MARCHED FROM THE COUNTY OF CHARLOTTE IN THE STATE OF VA., TO PETERSBURG AND THAT THEY ENCAMPED ON OLD TOWN CREEK-THAT HIS COMPANY INCLUDEDING HIMSELF THEN MARCHED TO

TO CABIN POINT WHERE THEY MARCHED TO COOPERS MILLS IN ISLE OF WIGHT CO.

WHERE THEY REMAINED FOR SOMETIME, WHICH WAS ON HIS FIRST TOUR OF DUTY, THAT ON HIS 2ND., TOUR HE PROCEEDED FROM CHARLOTTE CO, BY NEARLY THE SAME ROUTE TO LITTLE YORK. AT WHICH IT WAS STATIONED UNTIL AFTER THE CAPITULATION OF THE BRITISH ARMY AND THAT HE WAS DISCHARGED THE FIRST PART OF NOVEMBER 1781, HE STATES HE CAN PROVE HIS SERVICES BY RICHARD GAINES AND ABRAHAM SUBLETT OF LINCOLN COUNTY, KENTUCKY. THAT SHE WAS MARRIED TO HIM, OCTOBER 27, 1785, A AND THAT HER HUSBAND DIED ON THE 5TH OF SEPTEMBER 1845.

ON MAY 4, 1835 A RESIDENT OF THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN COUNTY, KENTUCKY AGED 73, STATES TJAT HE ENTERED THE SERVICE ABOUT THE LST OF FEBRUARY 178K, HE VOLUNTEERED UNDER CAPTAIN JOHN MARTIN'S COMPANY OF MILITIA AS AN INDIAN SPY AT MCCORMICK'S GARRISON IN THE KENTUCKY DISTRICT, A PART OF VA, (NOW LINCOLN CO, KY) AND CONTINUED IN THE SERVICE UNTIL THE LAST OF MAY 1782, THOMAS MONTGOMERY, LIEUT, JAMES CRAIG, ENSIGN, COL. BENJAMIN LOGAN COMMANDER OF THE WHOLE SOUTH PARTS OF THE DISTRICT WHICH FORMED ONE REGIMENT NUMBER NOT RECOLLECTED AND GENERAL GEORGE ROGERS CLARK OF THE REGULAR TROOPS, COMMANDER IN CHIEF WHOSE HEAD QUARTERS WERE AT THE JEFFERSON BARRACKS OR FALLS OF THE OHIO UNDER WHOSE GENERAL ORDERS WERE ACTED. MCCORMICK GARRISON WAS SITUATED ON THE SOUTHERN FRONTIER OF THE DISTRICT AND WAS MUCH EXPOSED TO DEPREDATIONS OF INDIAN HOSTILITY WAS CONTINUALLY UP DUTY EITHER AT THE GARRISON OR SPIEING UPON THE FRONTIERS OF THE SETTLEMENTS OF OTHER GARRISON IN THE COUNTRY TO WIT SECTION 87 AND 88

McKenny's, Pettitis, Briggs, Logans, and Carpenters while at Pettitis
The Indians killed a Man belonging to the Garrison by the name of Smith

THE INDIANS KILLED ONE MAN BY THE NAME OF WALKER, AT MCCORMICKS GARRISON . HE ENTERED THE SERVICE OF THE U. S. A 2ND., TIME, AT MCCORMICK'S GARRISON ON THE FIRST DAY OF OCTOBER 1782, UNDER THE SAME COMPANY AND FIELD OFFICERS AS NAMED IN THE FIRST ENGAGEMENT WITH WHOM HE CONTINUED TO ACT AS A VOLUNTEER SPY UPON THE SAME GROUND AND DISCHARGED ALL DUTIES IN AND ABOUT THE GARRISON AND FRONTIERS OF THE COUNTRY AS BEFORE STATED IN THE FIRST ENGAGEMENT. IN MAY 1783. THE INDIANS CAME TO THE NEIGHBORHOOD OF MCCORMICK STATION AND FIRED ON TWO MEN OF THE GARRISON AND WOUNDED ONE OF THEM. HE CONTINUED IN SERVICE UNDER ALL THE ABOVE NAMED OFFICERS UNTIL THE FIRST OF NOVEMBER 1783 AND WAS THEN HONOABLY DISMISSED FROM SERVICE AS HE WAS IN THE FIRST ENGAGEMENT. MARCHING IN ALL 2 YEARS AND FIVE MONTHS SERVICE FOR THE 2 YEARS AND FIVE MONTHS SERVICE FOR THE 2 ENGAGEMENTS. HE HAS NO DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE OF HIS SERVICES. BUT CAN PROVE THE SAME BY ABRAHAM ESTES ONE OF THE SUBSCRIBING WITNESSES. HE WAS BORN IN VIRGINIA 1762. HE WAS LIVING IN NOW LINCOLN COUNTY KENTUCKY; BUT AT THET TIME A PART OF VA., WHEN CALLED INTO SERVICE. HE WAS A VOLUNTEER. HE HAS ALWAYS LIVED IN LINCOLN COUNTY, VA? SINCE THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR. WALTER ANDREW. A CLERGYMAN, BENJ'S BRIGGS ARE HIS NEIGHBORS, .-- AFFIDAVIT OF ABRAHAM ESTES STATES THAT HE KNOWS JOSEPH MCCORMICK IN HIS OWN KNOWLEDGE. THAT HE WAS ONE OF CAPTA JOHN MARTIN'S COMPANY OF SPIES AND THAT HE ACTEDA AS HE FIRST STATED BELONGING TO THE SAME COMPANY WITH HIM AND OFTEN ACTING WITH HIM UPON SCOUTS OF SPYING AND RANGING ON THE FRONTIERS AND PURSUING THE INDIANS WHICH REQUENTLY CAME INTO THE SETTLEMENT OF MCCORMICK'S GARRISON! HE WAS GIVEN A CORRECT DETAIL IMPARTE OF THE SEPREDATIONS COMMITTED BY THE INDIANS MUCH MORE COULD BE SAID ABOUT THE DANGER AND TROUBLE WITH EXPERIENCE WITH THEM, BUT SUFFICE IT TO SAY HE ACTED AS HE HAS STATED SERVED UNDER 2 ENGAGEMENTS 2 YEARS AND FIVE MONTHS WAS HONORABLY DISMISSED FROM SERVICES, LIVES IN LINCOLN CO. KY.

HE FURTHER STATES THAT A COMPANY FROM ROCKBRIDGE COUNTY WAS STATIONED AT THE SAME PLACE, COMMANDED BY JOHN BOWYERS AND REGIMENT FROM HOME, AND IN ABOUT 3 MONTHS AFTER HE RETURNED HOME, HE WAS AGAIN DRAFTED AS A MILITIAMAN AND OWING TO HIS SITUATION. HE COULD NOT SERVE THE TOUR AND HE HIRED A MAN BY THE NAME OF FRANCISCO AS A SUBSTITUTE TO SERVE THE TOUR FOR WHICH HE WAS DRAFTED OR TOOK THE SAID SUBSTITUTE TO WHERE THE COMPANY WAS RENDEZVOUED AND DELIVERED HIM UP TO THE CAPTAIN AND HE WAS RECEIVED IN MY PLACE TO PERFORM THE TOUR. THE SUBUSTITUTE SERVED OUT THE TOUR HE BELEIVED FOR WHEN HE RETURNED HE GAVE UP THE GUN TO THIS AFFAINT. WHICH HE HAD FURNISHED HIM WITH. HE STATES THAT HE DOES NOT RECOLLECT MANY OF THE OFFICERS WHICH THE SUBSTITUTE SERVED UNDER OR WHAT PART OF THE COUNTRY HE TRAVELED THROUGH AND HE ALWAYS UNDERSTOOD THAT HIS SUBSTITUTE WAS LEGALLY DISCHARGED. HE FURTHER STATES THAT HE VOLUNTEERED IN CAPT. HULL'S COMPANY TO DRAW BEEF CATTLE TO YORK BUT BEFORE THEY GOT TOYORK THEY WERE ORDERED TO DELIVER THE CATTLE TO SOME PERSON BELOW WILLIAMSBURG AND THEN RETURNED HOME AND WAS DISCHARGED. HE STATES THAT HE IS CONFIDENT THAT HE SERVED OVER SIX MONTHS IN THE VIRGINIA LINE TROOPS AND HE KNOWS OF NO ONE WHO CAN TESTIFY TO HIS SERVICES EXCEPT HIS SON. JOHN ROBERTS.

AFFIDAVIT OF JOHN MCROBERTS, JR. STATES THAT HIS FATHER
DID SERVE 2 TOURS OF DUTY IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR TO HIS KNOWLEDGE AS
A MILITAMAN. HE RECOLLECTS THAT AT ONE TIME, IT WAS INCONVENIENT FOR
HIS FATHER TO LEAVE HOME AND HE HIRED A SUBSTITUTE AND ETC.

STATE OF KENTUCKY: LINCOLN COUNTY MARYLAND

MAY 21, 1834, PERSONALLY APPEARED EASTER WONER, WIDOW AND RELIC OF PETER WONER, WHO DIED MARCH 31, 1834 WHO WAS A RESIDENT CITIZEN OF LINCOLN COUNTY AGED 80, THAT SHE LIVED ABOUT 15 MILES FROM THE RESIDENCE OF PETER WONER WHEN HE ENTERED THE ARMY OF THE REVOLUTION IN THE STATE OF MARYLAND, THAT IT WAS AFTER THE CLOSE OF THE WAR WHEN THEY WERE MARRIED AND MOVED TO THIS COUNTRY. SHE HAD FREQUENTLY HEARD HIM SPEAK OF BEING WITH GENERAL WASHINGTON WHEN THE HESSIANS WERE TAKEN AT TRENTON. SHE THINKS HE BELONGED TO THE MINUTE SERVICE AND HAS HEARD HIM SPEAK OF SERVING TOURS OF 2 AND 3 MONTHS EACH AND OF GUARDING PRIOSNERS AND THAT HE WAS IN ACTUAL SERVICE BETWEEN ONE AND 2 YEARS.

Depositions of Daniel Bell, William Sutton and George Hampton Taken in her behalf 1834, state that they were well acquainted with she and her husband and that he died March 31, 1833, and that they knew him between 30 and 40 years ago and say they heard him frequently speak of his Revolutionary War service.

AFFIDAVIT OF CATHERINE BAST OR BEST, AG 50, TAKEN AT HER HOUSE 1834, MAY 21ST., SAYS SHE LIVED IN THE IMMEDIATE NEIGHBORHOOD OF THE SAID PETER WONER, THAT SHE WAS WELL ACQUAITNTED. WITH HIM DURING THE WAR. THAT HE SERVED SEVERAL TOURS OF MILITIA DUTY WITH HER HUSBAND A AND ONE OF HIS MESSMATES. HER HUSBAND DIED IN 1816 AND THAT HE WAS THE SAME AGE OF HER HUSBAND.

ALSO DEPOSITION OF GEORGE ELLIOTT AGED 68 HAS BEEN ACQUAINTED WITH PETE WONER OVER 40 YEARS AND LIVED HIS NEAR NEIGHBOR THE GREATER PART OF THAT TIME, DEPOSITION OF ELIZABETH FURNOY, OR FURNEY? AGED 72, TAKEN AT HER RESIDENCE JAN. 11TH 1836 IN MERCER COUNTY, KENTUCKY TO BE READ IN BEHALF OF SECTION 93

ESTER Woner, DECEASED, THAT THEY WERE RAISED CHILDREN TOGETHER AND EDUCATED IN THE SAME 6CHOOL AND WELL RECOLLECTS OF HIS ENTERING THE ARMY UNDER GENERAL WASHINGTON, IN THE COMPANY OF CAPT. KEPERT OR KEEPHART OR SOME SUCH NAME AND SERVED AT DIFFERENT PERIODS, SHE IS FULLY CONVINCED THAT HE WAS AWAY AND FROM HOME DURING DIFFERENT TOURS, FULLY ONE YEAR AND SIX MONTHS.

HE WAS HER ONLY B OTHER AND HERSELF AND SISTER HAD TO PREPARE HIS CLOTHES FOR HIM AS HE WANTED THEM. HIS FATHER AND MOTHER FELT GREAT INTEREST IN HIS SAFETY AS DID HERSELF AND SISTERS.

SHE CANNOT RECOLLECT ALL THE DIFFERENT TOURS OF HIS SERVICE, NOR OF THE OFFICERS NAMES UNDER WHOM HE SERVED. SHE WELL RECOLLECTS HE WAS UNDER GENERAL WASHINGTON AT THE TAKING OF THE HESSIANS.
