BY THE AUTHOR

This book is about Colonial Granville County and its earliest residents. Where did they come from? Where did they go?

It is just a few loose leaves from a larger volume containing several hundred pages, in course of preparation and which it will take some time to complete, entitled "The Lost Tribes of North Carolina".

An impatient public shows some evidence of "being in a hurry" to see the notes and these pages have been set apart for separate binding and made available to the impatient ones, who may not even want the more ambitious project when it is completed. These may, or may not be, a fair sample of the more elaborate compilation.

We have discarded the old fiction of dividing the work into so-called "Chapters" and have arranged the notes according to convenience. Where some appear out of place and out of bounds, reference to the index will enable the reader to place them where they belong. Many afterthoughts occur and it takes too much time to revamp the whole manuscript in order to get them in where they should have been in the first place.

The family histories and charts are not to be classed as "genealogies", but as mere deductive studies, the aim being to answer the pertinent points of the author's theme: "Where did they come from? Where did they go?". If they were "genealogies" as that term has been customarily applied they would necessarily be bristling with "Sir John So and Sos", "Lord This and Thats" and a brilliant array of family "crests", "mottoes" and "coats of arms" designed to tickle the fancy and pride of thousands of descendants.

The studies are based on such information as is available at the time they are written, always subject to later correction and amendment, should new evidence turn up, even before the book is completed.

We make no pretense of being hide-bound as to positive proof. Every lawyer and student of evidence knows that a fact may be established by circumstances as well as by direct testimony. If we are reasonably certain as to where the subjects "came from" we try to state the reasons and the facts as they appear. The same yardstick is used in determining where these North Carolina tribes "went", when they settled elsewhere. We leave it to the clever and enterprising genealogists to furnish them with the stereotyped "background of royal descent" and the pretty \$10.00 "Coats of Arms".

On page 304 Mr. Francis B. Hays, of Oxford, North Carolina, has furnished us with a pretty complete list of the old "First Families" of Colonial Granville, which is especially valuable as a guide to the correct spelling of the names. When in doubt we suggest his list be turned to and consulted.

The writer is indebted to MR. W. C. ALL-ES'S "The Armals of Enysood County" for such of the material on BUNCOMES which appears below.

COL. RORERT LOVE, a revolutionary soldier and his brother GMS. THOMAS LOVE were early residents of BUECOMES COUNTY, they having settled in that part of the county which was taken from BURES in 1791 to form BURCOMER. Both were sons of SAMUEL MOTE and his wife DORCAS BELL and were born near TIEXLIEC SPRIEGS MEETING HOUSE in were dorn near TIMILIES SPRINGS MESTER HOUSE in hegusta County, Virginia, ROHERT in 1760 and GES, THOMAS in 1765. SANGEL LOTS was the son of one RYPERIN LOTS, and LORGAS MELL was the daughter of LAMES HELL, both HUNGET and THOMAS LOTS, who came to EUMICHES COUNTY, lived for a time in the HATHER SANGER COUNTY, LIVED for a time in the HATHER SANGER COUNTY, LIVED for a time in the SEE. THOMAS LOVE was one of the first Representatives from BUECO MAE and afterwards served also from HAYSOOD when that county was organized. in 1808. When serving BUNCOMES in the Legisla-ture he passed the bill organizing HAYWOOD COUS-TY, where he made his home. In his later years, THOMAS LOVE moved to MAINT COUNTY, TENNESSEE, & served that District in a Legislative capacity until the time of his death. A Great Grandson of THOMAS LOVE, of RUNCOMER and HATWOOD, in 1907 was Speaker of the Texas Legislature, and afterwards an Assistant Secretary of the Treasury under Woodrow Wilson. His name was also THOMAS B. LOVE, and at this writing (1945) he is living, hale and hearty, and a prominent lawyer in the City of DALLAS. TEXAS.

REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS. The following Revelutionary soldiers, who came to BUNCUMBE COUNTY, are buried in HALMOOD COUNTY:

Col. Robert Love Captain John Henry William Allen Thomas Abel George Hall Edward Hyatt Christian Messer John Messer Hugh Rogers Jucob Shoek.

JAMES RONKET LOVE, son of COL. BOHERT LOVE and his wife MAHY ANN DILLAND was born in EUK-COMME COUNTY, N. C. in Hovember, 1798.

The first Justices of HATWOOD COUNTY (all of whom, of course, up to that time had been residents of EUROCHEE) in 1809, were THOMAS LOTE, JOHN PERGUS, JOHN DESCH DISCHE HALLIPS, ARTHLIPS, ARTHLIPS, ARTHLIPS, ARTHLIPS, ARTHLIPS, ARTHLIPS, ARTHLIPS, ARTHLIPS, DESCHARAND, PHILLIP T, BURFOOT, WILLIAM DEAVER, ARCHEMAID MERKEY AND REMARKAND ORELL.

JOHN NAVIDSON and JANZS CHAMBERS were granted lands in BUNCOMBE COUNTY on PICECH RIV-ER shortly after the revolution.

DAVID ALLISON bought land on PIGEON RIV-ER in BUNCONEE COUNTY in 1796.

ROBERT MARTIN bought land on PIGROW RIV-ER in BUNCOMME COUNTY in 1798.

JOHN PENLAND, JACOB SHOOK, SPENCER RICE, and DAVID MEMAFFET came from HUREZ COUNTY to EUROCHEE, JOHN PENLAND'S farm was on what his or was known as "CRYSTAL" trock,

That was known in the old days as THEDMA MILE CHEKE, was later called JIME'S CHEKE, a smong the early settlers along this course when it was in BUNGOMES COUNTY was DAVID HUS-SELL, HUMET MOKER and JOHN BAY.

WILLIAM CATHET was one of the earliest settlers in the PIGEON VALLEY and his son COL JOSEPH CATHET was born in EUNCCHEE COUNTY on MARCH 12, 1803.

THUMAS ISLAG LEWOIN was the son of COL-HOUAS LEWOIR, who came from WILKES COUNTY to EURCOMEM in 1799. He brought lands in the County, but after a residence of some thirty years moved back to WILKES COUNTY, the old home of the IEROIR FAMILY, where he died in 1850. He was the son of WILLIAM LEWOIR who married one of the RAILARDS and some of whome descendants settled in what is now HOAME COUNTY, Tennessee, where they built the town of LEWOIR on the Tennessee River, some thirty willes South of KRAVILLES.

In 1828 HODGE RATEURN settled in HUNCOMBER. He was from BURKE COUNTY, where he had
served as State Senator. In 1838 he was also
Senator from HUNCOMBE COUNTY. He was born in
Rowan County in 1759, the son of WILLIAM RAYBURN, from Virginia. He is said to have been
a descendant of POCARDHTIS and a first constit
of a Georgia Governor of the name of RATEURN,
A SAUWER RATEURN served in the State Senate
of Alabama, and both, this writer believes,
were relatives of HON. SAM RATEURN, of TEXAS,
now (1945) Speaker of the National House of
Representatives.

JUNATHAN CHEEK (now in HATWOOD COURTY) was named for JUNATHAN MCPETERS who was one of the first white settlers to come to EURCOMES.

COUNTIES TAKEN FROM BUNCOMEE were HAI-FOOD, MADON, CHEMOKEF, JACKSOF, STAIN, CLAY & GRIHAM. All of these, of course were originally in the territory of ANSON COUNTY, from which BUNCOMES came through TRIDE, RUTHERFORD, ROYAN and HUESE.

Was the daughter of JUBN TERRITOR, who lived at the foot of KINGI'S MOURTLER, where the famous revolutionary battle was fought, where the famous revolutionary battle was fought, where the manufactured powder that was used by the patriots in that fight. High and Mancy were married in 1781. The ROWERS family to which HUGH belonged lived before the American Revolution in Mecklenburg County, N. C. JUBN EDGERS son of HUGH and his wife MANCY THORSTON, married FOLLY MCCEACER in 1824. John died in MATFOOD COUNTY in 1825.

LAWYERS OF BUNCOMME. Among the first of the lawyers to practice in EUROMES COURT were VAL-LACE ALEXAMER, JUSTIM MEDOWALL, JOSEM SPREER, BESTELL SMITH and ROBERT VILLIANSON. These all attended court from other parts of the country, as same set in BUNCKER. The first lawyer who actually lived in BUNCOME COUNTY was HOBERT HERRY, who was admitted to practice at the JULY Term of Court in 1802. He was a native of LIE-COLE COUNTY and had a most interesting history.

MORE LAWYERS. The lawyers who were admitted and licensed to practice in the Courts of BUNCOMMS after ROBERT HENRY and between the year HUNCHMEN ATTOT MOMENT ESSET AND OCTOORS THE YEAR 1804 and up to 1812 were THOMAS RARROW, ISPAEL PICKERS, who afterwards was dovernor of ALMRAMA, Joseph Wilson, Joseph Carson, BORRET BURTON, who was a Judge on the Bench, HERRY HARRISON, Sendens Donoho, John C. Elliott, HESRY Y. WEBB, Mauch Cox, JR., A. R. Buffin, and JOHN PAXTO, a Judge of some distinction.

JURN BURTUM received a grant of land JULY 7, 1794, which he divided into town lots, thus giving the first start to what is now the CITY of ASHVILLE.

SAMUEL LUSE in 1795 bought lot No. 13. COL. WILLIAM DAVIDSON bought Lot No. 21. JAMES DAVIDSON bought Lot No. 26,

HUGH TATE bought half of Lot No. 13, from the original purchaser, SAMUEL HISK. JUHN PATTON bought Lot. No. 16.

PATTON & ENFIN bought lot, No. 4.
This list of course, constitutes an in complete list of the original purchasers of lots

in what is now the City of Ashville, PATTON & ERWIN afterwards acquired an in

terest in the BURTOE property and sold off large mambers of the lots as the town gradually began to expand and grow.

JACOB KELLER sold THOMAS HARRISON, 100 acres of land on TURKET CHEEK, Warch 22, 1802. Book H. p. 347.

JOSEPH HARRISON sold to WILLIAM HARRISON 200 acres of land on SAND! MUSE CREEK in BUS-COMME COUNTY, July 8, 1806. Book 8 page 8 of Buncombe County Records.

JAMPA MURPHY sold to THOMAS EARRISON 126 acres of Land in BUNCOMEN COUNTY located on Turkey Greek, October 22, 1806. Recorded Book 10, page 152.

HATHANIEL HARRISON received a land grant from the State of North Carolina, No. 2926 to 100 acres of land on THREE CHEEK January 3, 1831. Book 19 p. 347.

WILLIAM CASSADY sold MATRAVIEL MARRISON and others 100 acres on TURKET CHEEK in BUNCOMES County, October 29, 1835. Book 21 page 496 of the Deed Records of BUNCOMES COUNTY.

WILLIAM KING bought 100 acres of land on SANDI MUSE CHEEK from HATHANIEL HARRISON on April 2, 1811, in BUNCOMER COUNTY, Book C. page 291 of BUNCOMER COUNTY.

JEREMIAH DAVIS bought 100 acres of land on MANUT MUSH CREEK from HATHANIKL HAHRISON March 10, 1819. Book 11, page 540.

PATRON & ENVIN. on May 5, 1807, bought 10 acres of land on a branch of CARET RIVER from JESSE EARRISON. Book A p 304 Deed Records of DUNCOMBE COUNTY.

ASHRUEN RALL bought 50 acres of Land on BER BRANCH in BUNCOMER COUNTY, from THOMAS HARRISON Movember 31, 1806, Book E page 59, Deed Records of BUNCOMES COUNTY.

JORN PLEMONS, bought 100 acres of land from THOMAS HARRISON in BUNCOMBE COUNTY, December 1, 1806.

RICEARD STOCKTON'S WILL, written January 14, 1826, was recorded in EUNCOMEN COUNTY in Will Book I p. 74, in the month of FERGUARY in 1840, in which he mentions my daughter, MARY HARRISON.

M. H. GARRISON on March 7, 1838 sold 24 acres of land on CAMP BRANCH in BUNCOMER COUR-TY, to MATHANIEL HARRISON. Book 21, page 170.

JAMES BLACK on August 12, 1826, sold HIRE EARRISON STincres of land on DEAVER'S BRANCE in BUNCOMBE COUNTY. Book 21, page 497. MATHANIAL HARRISON, Clerk of the Court.

REV. JOSEPH HARRISON, ancestor of the HARRISONS who figure in most of the above recorded deeds in BUNCOMES COUNTY at about the time or a little after its formation, was a revolutionary soldier, and a contemporary of RICHARD CENTRY, ARON JURNSON, WILLIAM BALDWIN, RICHARD JAKES BAPTIST CENTRY OF THE PROPERTY OF Western North Carolina.

A revolutionary soldier's marker has been placed at his grave in the old TURKET CREEK burying ground near LEICESTER, a short distance from ASRVILLE, where he lived at the time of his death, on which the date of his birth is given as 1733 and his death as 1811.

The account of the marking of his grave declares that his wife was MARGARET HILL, who was the daughter of a N. C. revolutionary soldier. His descendants do not agree on a list of his children. We think they were probably:

SOME NOTES FROM THE RECORDS OF ANSON COUNTY

ANSON COUNTY. It's ancestor is NEW HANDVER COUNTY, which was formed in 1728, from which BLAD-EN COUNTY was taken in 1734, and thereafter in 1749 ANSON was established out of a part of HiaD-EN, so that, genealogically speaking, NEW HANOVER was the grandfather of ANSON. For a period of FOUR years ANSON COUNTY comprehended all of the Western Part of the State, and except for claims of the Indians extended through Tennesses to the Mississippi River. Deeds or grants of land located in ANNON COUNTY between 1749 and 1753, otherwise not identified, may have been anywhere WEST of Wadesboro, the county seat in this day. HOWAN COUNTY was carved out of this huge area in 1753 & embraced approximately the Northern half of ANSON including SURRY, WILKES, INCOMELL and all that tier of counties; deeds, grants and other such instru-ments for the following NINZ YEARS (1753 to 1762) labelled ANNON belonged somewhere in the area now covered from WADESPORO, West to the Tennessee line including Union,) clamburg, Cabarrus, Mincoln, Gaston, Butherforu and other counties farther on West. In 1762 both Mecklemburg and Tryon were es tablished, but after SEVEN YEARS, Tryon was abelised and LINCOLN and RUTHERFORD in (1779) came into existence. Butherford was the BIG COUNTY and extended to Tennessee, while LINCOLN included only its present area and the new county of GASTON. All this to enable the reader to more clearly "place" records here cited from ANSON COUNTY, by a comparison of these dates. (Authority: Wheeler.).

The following items are taken from the records of ANSON COUNTY, N. C. on file at WADDENDORO, the county seats

JAMES ADMITTIONS, will; dated May II, 1760; he names his sons WILLIAM, JUHN, MARTHN, JAMES, JD - SEFR, HENNAMIN and MATTHNY (the last two his youngest sons) and daughter MART ARMSTRONG, Children JAMES AMMSTRONG and daughter MART HIS encutors. CHARLES MOOHE, JUHN SETTY (HEASTY) and JAMES PRICE, witnesses (Vol. 1, p.8). (It is likely these were the ARMSTRONGS who lived on the South Mark of the CATAWAR RIVER in what was then ANSON, but is now in either LINCONS or (MASTON).

JOSTPH MARTIN, will. Dated February 13, 1787. Names wife CATHERINE and children JESSE, MANCY and JOHN HALL MARTIN (Book 1 p. 56.)

JOEN HICKS, will. Dated April 24, 1760. Wife OREDINGE HICKS; sons WILLIAM and JOHN HICKS, and daughters FRANCES and MARY HICKS; grand-daughter SARAH HICKS. Signed JOHN HICKS. Witnesses were ALEXANDER CORDON and WILLIAM HICKS (Book 1 p. 12)

HENRY ADCOCK, will. October 1802. Names his wife SUSARWAE, and children HENRY, JAMES, ELEVER, NAMCY and JOHN ADCOCK. (Book 2 p 2).

THOMAS ADCOCK. April 8, 1823. Will names wife SARAH and children MOSHETT, MARY, DELILAH, FRANCES, MOUNTING, BARSHERA, MATILDA and B. B. ADCOCK (Book A. p 84).

WILLIAM LOVE, will. Dated May 7, 1753. Leaves all of his property to his father. Done in presence of HOHEST X LOVE and HEMJAMIN X LOVE. Signed WILLIAM LOVE.

ANDHAW HERRY (BARRY!) Inventory of his goods, chattels, rights and credits, by RICHARD BARRY, administrator. No date, but about the year 1765.

WILLIAM RATLIFF, will. Pated February D, 1777. Name: wife SUSANNAH and children WILLIAM, RACHARIAH, THOURS, JAMES, JOHES, GORET CLOVEN RATLIFF and ELIZABER CURTES (Probably the wife of SAUGEL CURTES); WILLIAM THOURS and PHILSON THOURS executors, and THOMAS DICKSON, 6. JEFFERON and SAMUEL CURTES witnesses (Book 1, p. 26).

STEPHEN VAUGHAN, will. Dated March 5, 1785. Mames wife MARY and children VILLIAM, HARMIN and SARH VAUGHAN; Witnesses were JER-WHIAH LEVIS and TERMAS LEVIS (Book 1).

JOHN McCLEYDEN WILL, Dated April 9, 1784. Children ANN, DENNIS, SAMUEL, RESECCA and SI-MON McCLENDEN (Book 1).

SAMPSON LANIER, will. Dated June 8, 1789. Mentions hit son JAMES LATTER, and expoints BURNELL HANGER, STATES and COL. JUNE STOKES his executors. Witnesses were JOHN JESTHOS, HEMJAKIN FILST and JAMES B. PORTER (B-1 p. 70).

ROTHET MCCURFALL. An inventory of his estate, July 23, 1757. Wife MARGARET is mentioned inventory taken by JAMPS MCCURFALL, MARGARET M. MCCURFALL and JAMPS LIEN, witnessed by JOHN CROCKETT. (Book 1, p. 123).

ROBERT JARMON. Inventory of his estate in 1782, but not other name mentioned. (Bk 1.)

JOHN DAVIDSON. Inventory of his estate in December 1, 1749. Taken by JAMES McILTRANS and HILL MORRISON (Book 1).

JAMES LOWEY. Inventory of his estate taken by ELIZAHETE LOWEY (No date) (Ec 1 p.139)

ANN BAKER, decembed. Inventory of her estate April 1, 1782, taken by D. JAMESON (Ek 1).

JAMES ROPER. Inventory of his estate in 1782. MARY ROPER mentioned (Ex 1 p 145).

JOHN HICKS. Inventory of his estate taken by JOHN HUMBANS and FRANCES I HUSBANDS, in October, 1772.

NATITEW PATION. Inventory of estate taken about 1780, with ELIZABETH PATTON and JAMES PATTON mentioned. (Book 1 p 151).

RICHARD TOUCHSTONE and SARAH TOUCHSTONE. Inventory of estate about 1765 (no date given) with HERRHY TOUCHSTONE and PHEDERICK TOUCHSTONE mentioned. (Book 1 p 132).

MOORMAN, MENJAMIN. Will dated March 26, 1798, mentions sons WILLIAM MOORMAN and MICHAEL MOORMAN, with CHARLES HISON and ARMSHE CREW as witnesses. (Book 2).

SMITH FIELDS, Vill. Dated March 15, 1792. Famos children JAMES, JOHE, MIRAIME, CELLA and ELIZAMENE FIELDS. Signed SMITH X FIELDS. Witnesses were JUHN AUID, JUHN CARON, JAMES INCORTY. (Vol 2 p. 37).

SARAH JACKSON. Will in 1813. The witnesses were JAMES COLEMAN, SR. and JAMES COLEMAN, JR.

TOD HORINGON, Clerk of ANSON in 1814.

RICHARD CDGM will. Dated Sept. 4, 1797.

MATER HILL left will in ANNON COUNTY IN 1825, His wife was MARTHA HICKEN, and the children named are MARIM, MATE, HANCE, FILLIAM HICKENA HILL, GREEN HILL, MILDRED HILL, ENIZAMHA HILL, GREEN HILL, MILDRED HILL, KOTT: VILLIAM HICKLAR HILL died in TEXAS in 1867, where he left masernus descendants, and ELIZARETH HILL married HENEY CLAYTON EWING OF Mashwille, Tenn.).

MATCHEW MOOHE, of AUSCH COUNTY died before 1794 and left HERRY MODER his deir, who amployed JOSIAH DOCHES that year to recover a slave from JOHN MODES, (Book D-E p. 71).

SOME RECORDS FROM CASWELL COUNTY

CASTELL COURTY - GENEALOGY. According to WHENLER Casuell County is a descendant of two of the old original precincts, CHAVEN and BLADEN. In 1751, CRANCE, its immediate parent was formed from CRANCILE, JOHNSTON and HAMMS. Edgecombe and Johnston both care from CHAVEN, and CHANVILLE was taken also from Craven. From 1746 until 1751, FIVE YEARS, Caswell territory was a part of GRANYILE, and after that until 1777, for 26 years it was a part of CRANGE until the Legislative Act that established it as CASTELL. All instruments between 1751 and 1777 in the territory that is now CASTELL bore the name of CRANCE, and for five years prior to that period GRAN-TILLE. The leading men of CASTALL in its earliest years was JAMES WILLIAMSON, COL. JOHN VIL -LIAMS (brother of JAMES WILLIAMS, the gallant officer killed at King's Mountain during the revolution, the GRAVIS, BURTONS, SHELTONS, LEAS, (Inke Ica family of Tennessee) Marmaduke WILLIAMS HOLULUS SAUDDERS, HARTLETT YANGET, the McADETS, BHOWNS and KERRS, according to WHEELER'S records. Dolly Pagne Madison is said to have been born in CASTELL COUNTY. In our visits to IANGETVILLE we collected the following records:

Join Williams, a younger brother, went towards the close of the war to Virginia, to keep the negroes from the Tories; and while there, took suddenly ill and died - supposed that he was poisoned for money, but he had none. But the negroes were saved to the family. (Logan Ess, Vol. 3 Joseph Habersham Chap. D. A. R. Records pp 109, 110).

*MARMADUNE WILLIAMS, who married ignes (Payne) Harris, Oct. 26, 1798, as shown in the marriage bond records above, was born in CASTELL COUNTY, N. C. April 6, 1772, and became a lawyer & a member of the State Senate in 1802; thereafter he was a member of the Sth, 9th and 10th United States Congresses from N. C. (1805-1809). He moved to Huntwille, Madison County, Alabama, in 1810, and to Tuscaloosa, Alabama in 1818, where he was a member of the Constitutional Convention of Alabama in 1819, and the same year a candidate for Governor, although defeated. Thereafter he served 11 terms in the Alabama Legislature and was Judge of the Juscaloosa County Court for 10 years (1832-1942). He died in Tuscaloosa, Alabama in 1950.

SH. and JUHH LACT were all on the U. S. General for the year 1800 in GRAHMA COUNTY, Sorth Garoline; also William DUT, GROUND DIRECTS, JAMES TAKER and JAMES, JOHN, JOSEPH and WIL-LIAM MERCH, also GEORGE MARKS. CHANNAM COUNTY, N. C. was erected out of CRANGE COUNTY in 1770, and among the old deeds to land showing on the records are the followings

COUNTY, N. CAROLINA

REV. PHILLIP MULKEY, a Baptist Minister of the "Separatist" persuasion, early established a Church and Congregation on DEEP RIVER in what is now CHATEAM but was then a part of OB ANGE COUNTY (1759). Malkey was born in HALLPAX COUNTY, North Carolina. Those who established the DEEP RIVER Church were PHILLIP MULKEY and whe HEFF HIVER COUNTY were PHIMIT MURET and wife, STEDIAH HOWAYD and wife, DERIFH HERED and wife, OREDIAH HOWAYD and wife, REVIAKIN GIST and wife, CHARLES THOPPON, THOMAS THOMPSON & RACHEL COLLINS. (Passhall's History of the Rep-tist Courch in North Carolina. The persons named, headed by the minister PHILLIP MUREY. emigrated from DEEP RIVER to Fair Forest in S. C. before 1760, but many of the members did not accompany the contingent who moved South, and among those remaining in CHATHAM COUNTY in 1764 were NATHANIEL POWELL, CONRAD DOWN and his wife, ISAAC BROOKS and wife, MARY BROOKS, MR. HODGE, JAMES STEWARD, SIMON POE, ROBERT CALLER and SAMUEL MARSE, also NEHEMIAH HOWARD (Journal of Morgan Edwards). Long after the establishment of the DYAP RIVER CHURCH, the names of its old members - many of them - appear on the rec-ords of the State of GEORGIA, including FHILLIP MULKEY and NEHEMLAH HOWARD (Who left will in GMORGIA) and the descendants of ROMERT RUTHER-FORD and the MARSH FAMILY, who drifted to S. C. and other parts.

CIRAVELATO COUNTY. Genealogically this county was for 52 years prior to its formation a part of Lincoln and Butherford Counties (1779 to 1841), which two counties had been taken out of Ames: and calle TRION in 1765. As ANSON came from BIADER, Cleaveland was originally therefore a part of ELADER. The County was named for the old King's Nountain here Colonel MENJAHIN CIRAVELIED, who died long before his mame was time honored. King's Mountain lies partly within this County. At Shelby, the County Saat, we copied the following from the county court records:

The wife of JUSEPH BERED was PRISCILLA AVERT, and they had a daughter PRISCILLA EMEND who married ONEDLAR HUMARD, the two families having met on DEEP CHEER at the old Rapitst Church sometime after the STEANS and BEREDS arrived there from OPERUS in 1756. FRILLIP MULKET was, I am quite surs, a grandson of the PRILLIP HUMENT who died leaving a will in EDECOMER COUTT, N. C. in 1756 (See P112 of this volume) and probably the son of JURATHAN MULKET, who witnessed the will. CHEMIAN OBEDIAH HOWARD (From DEEP CHEER, CHATHAM COUNTY, N. C. to S. C.) who married PRISCILLA was a Revolutionary soldier, as attested by a receipt signed by his agent JURN MCCOL on August 29, 1766 "for militia duty pay with RENUDEN'S RECOMMENT For the fall of Charlestown and certified to also by A. S. Salley, Jr. in 1929, Secretary of the Historical Commission of South Sarolina. OBEDIAE HOWARD, in his old ace, moved to RAHGON COUNTY, Kentucky, with his children and also with HFV. FRILLIP MULKET (son of JUNITAM and grandson of the FHILLIP of HERP CHEER) where he died leaving a will in 1804. His children were STEPHEN HOWARD, WILLIAM HOWARD, RAWNE HOWARD (with GIFT HOWARD), WILLIAM HOWARD, RAWNE HOWARD (with married AARON HATS, ANNE HOWARD), and perhaps others who may have died before their father. In HARRON COUNTY, KRYMUCKY (that part of same, which hater was exected into MUMRON COUNTY) these HOWARD were memerups, and included the mass CHRIMPHER (or TIT), 1783H, JOHER HO., 107 HOWARD and many others. The descendants of "RENJAMIN CHET and Not O' THE CHEER, were also settler there. They married into the ETHERIM, UNGER and JURN RAY featily. Hery, HILLIP MULKEY (Heft hater and not-teld at MUKRETOWN, ILLIHOUS, The descendants of these featiles are all over the SOUTHER SPATES.

THANKFUL HICKS died leaving will in DUFLIN COUNTY, W. C. in 1785, and names her daughter RESECCA MILLS, and the following grand-childrens TRANKFUL HILLS, ANN THILLS, HIKKS, MARY, JAMES, SHADRACK and FRENERICK MILLS, (Will Book 1 p 185).

GENERE KORNEGAY, SR. of DUPLEN COUNTY N.C. died in 1008 and in his will names GENERE KORNEGAY, son DANTEL, DAVID, SASIL and JACOE BORNEGAY. His wife was MOURNING, Also mentions a daughter SFYILL and her children, the wife of a JURN KORNEGAY. (211 Book A p 256).

MARY KORNELLY died in DUPLEM and left will in 1826, in which she mentions sons BRYAN and HENRY KORTEARY, dumphter FEREDORS GAMBER, daughter HART CARRANAY and the following grand-childen: HART WORKES, NANCY JONES, ZACHARIAH KORTE-GAY, VARD KORTEARY, MARTHA KORNEGAY and LOYY BIA-LCCK. Sons BRYAN and HENRY KORTEMAY, Executors of her will. (Will BOOK & p. 265).

WILLIAM TEDNAS, SR, died in DUPLIN COUNTY N. C. in 1782. Will proved in JANUARY that year. Daughters ELIZABEHR BOLLINGSWORTH and RACER. REDDIES are mentioned, and sone WILLIAM TEDNAS & BALLEY (or WILLEY) TEDNAS, and JAMES BOLLINGSWORTH (who married his daughter NIZABEHR); also grandson ISAAC, WILLIAM and ARCHIGALD TEDNAS all minors. Son WILLIAM TEDNAS and REWLAND TEDNAS I maned as Executors. Will witnessed by WILLIAM BOUSDU, ERRIAMN SMITH and JOHN HUMPHREY. (WILL BOOK A. p. 477.

BENJAMIN HEDDES (who married RAGHEL THOMAS, daughter of William THOMAS SR.) died & left will in DUPLIN COUNTY, N. C. in 1804, probated 1805; mentions his wife RAGHEL and sons JACOB, JOHF F. and JOSEPH T. PHILLIP MOUSE died in DUPLIE COUNTY, M. C. in 1784, in which he means his son MARTIS and a daughter MILLIABTH BOUNE. PRISCILLA MERRY A RAFRAM SEPRIO have their nemes written on the back of the will, but no relationship is menationed or commettion given with the testator. The witnesses were ADDILIAN CARRISON and REPRAIM CARRISON, (Dock A 9 415).

DAVID SIGM died leaving a manespative will in DUPAN COUNTY, N. C. It was reduced to writing a few minutes before he died but when he attempted to sign it he passed sway. He mentioned his two children DICKEN and CARADRA SIGM to whom he devised lands in Tennessee patented by JAMES MIDDLETON and DAVIEL WILLIAMS. Will was dated in 1801. JAMES MATHIS and ADDRESS THALLY are named as Executors. (Book A).

ORANTILLE COURTY. GEREALOGY. The noted WHEELER says: "GRASVILLE COURTY was formed in 1744, from ENGRONGE COURTY, and was so called in honor of the owner of the soil". As ENGRONGE courty, and the self-scame out of CHAPES about 1733, GRAS—
FILLE is therefore a grandeen of CRAYER. Them it was first established in 1746 GRASVILLE embraced for a period of FIVE TREES, mutil 1751, not only WARREN, EMARLIE and VANCE, but most of ORANGE ANALYSIS CHAPTAN, DURBAM, ATAMMER, a part of GWILLEND and perhaps all of MOXINGEMM, a vast territory, of which one WILLIAM FERSOE was the first Sheriff. After 1751 ORANGE COURTY and GRASVILLE dominated this wife Virginia line area until TAXE and CHAPTAM were formed around 1770, for the evident purpose of forestalling the restless and embryonic "regulator" element, who were becoming enraced over the aggravating fees and burdams levied by the prosperous "office holders" of the two large domains. In 1764 a county called SUTE was established out of the territory now subraced in Varren and Franklin Counties, and thus CRASVILLE State was again appreciably trimed down. From 1764 until 1851—a period of sighty-neven years GRASVILLE COURT! included its present area, plus the territory now and reader COURT.

FIRST MESTING OF GOURT EVER RELD IN GRANVILLE COUNTY

From a tattered fragment of an old record in the Department of Archives and History at Ra-LHIGH, B. C., this writer obtained a very brief account of what was the first Sounty Court ever held in GRAWIII'S COUNTY. It set forth the subcitance of:

Act of the North Carolina Assembly for erecting the upper part of EDCH-COMME COUNTY into a new County by the name of GRANVILLE.

The minutes of this first court recite:
That the courthouse be erected at NOCKY
GREEK, as near as may be to the BOILING SPRINGS.
That WILLIAM PERSON and WIST BARRIS be appointed commissioners to confer with the Court of
EUCHOMER COURT.

WILLIAM PARSON was appointed Sheriff.

TH, JAMES PATHE, EDWARD JUNES, JOHN WALKER and

It was ordered that the Sourt adjourn to meet at the home of NR. EDWARD JOHES.

(The above meeting was held, apparently at the home of MUMARD JOHNS on SEPTIMENE 3, 1746.) Court met a second time at the home of MR. MUMARD JURES on December 2, 1746, at which meeting the following members of the Court were reglatered as being present: JAMES PARTS, JOHN WALE, JOHN MARTIN, WEST MARKET and JOHNTHAN WHITH,

Both Colonal Eston and Edward Jones, who appear to have been the moving spirits at this birth of COLONIAL GRANVILLE COURTY were present. On page 45 of this work, the writer thinks he is in error in Switing that JURES lived in the Northern part of FRANKLIS, but now believes that his home was over the line in WARKEN. These statements are based on the record discovered in the old minute book of the occur detailing briefly the account of the first two meetings held, and upon data found among use notes of Colo Ashe relating to the JURES and MACOES (descendants of ULIBER) lived in the vitatinty. JAMES PATES another one of the persons present at the first meeting of the first Court of GRANVILLE COURT on September 3, 1746, was a brother in law of EDVARD JUSTS, he buying married ALICIA JUSTS, a state of EDVARD, long before coming to Borth Corolina, as shown by the will of EDVARD JUSTS, St. in Farnham Parish, in Virginia, recorded in 1715.

TEST MARRIS, another member of this little bend of GRAVILLE COURTY pioneers was also related to KUNARD JUNES. EST was the son of HUNARD HARRIS who died leaving a will in ISHE OF WIGHT COURTY, Vinginis in 1754, whose master ages married a JUNES. The wife of WEST HARRIS is said to have been MARY THRUES. This West Entris, of GRAVILLE was the ancestor of HOM. ISHAM HAB-RIS, the belowed Governor of Temmesses. "AND as I am informed that I did some years past make a deed of gift to my daughter ELIZABETH DUDLEY, wife to CORISTOPHER DUDLEY, MY negre wench EANNAN, tegether with her increase, I do hereby declare the said gift to be void and entirely contrary to my will, I not being in my proper senses at the execution of the said Deed of Gift; and do by this present writing appoint JAMES DANTEL and JUNE VILLIAMS DATED BY SERVE tors to this my last will and testament,

CHIFFIE, grandsom JOHN STOVALL, som of THOMAS STOVALL (decreed?), and som in lew MARCE PIESON.

Lest will and testment of THOMAS HOWELL OF CHANTILE COURTY, H. C., executed in July, 1790, but proved in 1791. Wife was HEARCA & he had sons THOMAS, JUHN and HOHERT and designed to the create, Individue, MARY and ELIZARTH HOWELL, Lie wife and JERMIAH PRAZES and JUNE LOUE are neased his executors.

JOHN MASSUM left will in HRANTIALE COUNTY dated August 26, 1842; but not probated until the year 1846 (Book lep. 558). His wife was SARAT and he had sons JAMES M. MANGUM, SAMURI. MANGUM, WATTP MANGUM and WILLE MANGUM.

The last will and testament of HERRY HUMT proved in GRANVILLE in 1750. Wife ACRES; chilren James, Henry, VILLIAM, JAMES, JORN & MIJEL. Last will of REMAINE COOPER proved in CRATTILE COUNTY, F. C. in 1761, in which he hames tone KENGE, FLASE, TILLIAN, JUST and GEOGRE COOPER, and deschiere MARIE and CRACE COOPER on MARY JUSTES, and MILLIARET VIOLES, Tife MILLIARETS, JOHN MOTION and RIGHARD RE-TETS witheress.

Fill of DENFIS LINES, dated scentime in 1762, was probated the saw year in EUF-VILLE COUNTY, B. C. He mentions his some VILRIAM and REGIAMUS, and damp-tors MARY, WHENDERD, RICHARDER, CATHER and ANDRARY, LIEDSET; mentions also a son in law ROSET PRILLIPS and another PETRALE CLAPTON and case ROGE TREPTON, and a grandeon.

THIS of HOMET COODED was recorded in GRAVILLE COURT, N. C., dated in 1794, Fife SARAH and sons WILLIAM, NORW MINOR, RESKY & DAYID SHORT GOODION, Also his son in law SANGKE, NUMBER.

Last will and testament of PHILLIP MAL-FRUE (said to be the oldest recorded will in GRANTLIE COUNTY, N. C. - at least EES. HIGHS so informed the writer); it is dated November 27, 1748 and was recorded the same year. Testator mentions his wife but does not give her name. He had some PHILLIP and JOSEM and a daughter maned MARI. The witnesses were THOMAS CRISTIAN, MART DAT and JAMES INSTE. (This PHILLIP WALSTON came from EMERIC CO. N. O. See page 174 of this book for the ELISTON FAMILIN rotes.)

Last will and testament of WILLIAM ENCKHAM on record in GRANTILE COURTY F. C. cated in the year 1776, but proved in 1777. He mentions his wife PHILLIS and their children WILLIAM, THOMAS, SINCE, PHILLIS and MART. (Those Backhama were related to the HERDERSON family, and like they, came from Ranover County, Virginia,)

Inst will and testament of SHEM COOK, of GRAVILLE COUNTY, F. C. dated in 1792 A probated in 1795, in which he sentions his wife ANN COOK, daughters ELIZABETH TURPIS, and tons WILLIAM and JUNE COOK, deceased; DELIPIA DECERGS, and sons SHEM, CLAROTS, PURLAND, JOHN, JANGS and MACK ECERCS.

The will of WILLIAM BELL was proved in GRAFFILLE COUNTY, S. C. in 1772, but weak dated a pear serilor. He mentions his prother MATEMMENT and JOHN LAWIS BELL, a MARN BERKHAMM and sisters BETLY, but was still living in 1771; brother JOSHUA SELL and his father GEORGE BELL. In the will he mentions property he owns in ARN BEUDIEL COUNTY, MD.

(This William BELL, we are quite sure, must have been the son of LATID FELL or hits prother FERRES—the latter, of course - of HEW EART COUNTY, See Bell's CLD FREE FRATE II pp 123-5).

The will of VILLIAM REFESS was proved in GRANVILLE COURTY, N. C. in 1781, came being dated that same year. Vife was MERCHET and they had some WILLIAM, JAMES, RENJAMIN and BURGHES HEVES, and dangaters awris, ELIKARETH, MANY CAPPENTER, SAVAR MICKS and was ILLIED TO CHITTE REFES.

(In the family geneale/y of the HEEVES, it is claimed that the name is properly spelted RIVES) Till of GIDDON MACON, of GRATVILLE COUNTY, F. C. dated 1761 and proved in 1782, gives the name of his wife PRISCILLA, and some MARRISON, JOHN, MATMANIEL and GIDNON; Camphters ANN ALA-STON, PLETT, MARTHA, MANY MACON, and som in law JOHN AIROYA.

Last will and testement of SOLOMOR ALSTON recorded in GRAFFILLE COUNTY in 1771, the year it was executed, Mentions wife SARAN, daughter CHARITY ALSTON (under 21), son LANGUE, son EMERY, and ROBERT LEWIS (called BIED BEREFI LEWIS FRONTERS WITH WILLIAMS and WILLIAM ALSTON

Last will of WILLIAM BULLOCK, of GRAFVILLE COURT, N. C. dated 1794 and proved in 1795; in it he messes his wife KULLARME, and children KULLARMER MARVIN, WILLIAM BULLOCK, and FRANCIS BOTD. Orandson JAMES BULLOCK and son in law JAMES LEWIS.

Last will and testement of RICHARD BULLOCK of GRAWTHIE COUNTY, F. C. proved and recorded in 1766, in which he mentions the following children: EARAM SINS, AGRES WILLIAMS, WILLIAM, KACKARIAM, MATHAWIKL, JOHN and LEGRARD HERILEY RULLICK.

RICHARD RESHETT died leaving a will in CRAFTILLE COURTY, S. C., which was dated in the year 1783 and probeted in 1786. In this will he mentions his wife ANNE, and some TROMAS, NICLIAN, FILLIAN, PETKE, RAPTIETT and LEVIS ERFERT; daughters SARAH ASTES (EFFESS), ANNA DUKE. The witnesses were GRESIAN RAPIAL and ERROT BLAGGERIAN

EDWARD JURES, The first Court ever held in GRANVILLE COUNTY was at his home in the lower part of what is now WARREN COUNTY, as has been mentioned before in some of three notes (see pp 43 and 209). His will was proved in 1750 and that of his son BUGAR JOHES in 1761. At the time these wills were filed neither the extinct county of BUTE, nor what is now WARREN COUNTY had been established, so they were necessarily recorded in GRAFVILLE COUNTY. Had they lied after 1764 the records would appear among the records of BUTE LOT filed in VARRES COUNTY. The wife of EUMARD JUNES was ABTARID SUGES, a member of a HUGURROT family, from MANIKHROUGE, from which GAPT, SUGAR JUNES bottemed his Christian hame. EUMARD JUNES was the son of enother EVARED DUNES whose will was proved in RICHMOND COUNTY, TURGITLE, Soptember 2, 1715, in which he memed four some and one demphier, SARDED JUNE, EUMARD, CERARLES and ALIGIA JONES the wife of a PAINE (either the JANES PAINE who was present at the first count of Crawfille County in 1746, or a son of that PAINE who married aligia JUNES, sister of KUMARD); SARDED PAINE, the older brother of KUMARD of GRAFVILLE, deed in RIGHMOND COUNTY, Virginia, in 1717, and in his will nease his foursh' ARMS PAINE. EMARD JUNES (so or KUMARD of GRAFVILLE SCORY) married MANI HILL, a sister of GRESS HILL (b, 1714, the son of BERRY APPLICATION from the married MANI HILL, a sister of GRESS HILL (b, 1714, the son of BERRY APPLICATION for which has a related to the property demphier of virginia), and COUNTY had been established, so they were necessarily recorded in GRAMVILLE COUNTY. Had they TRACE MEMORIT (daughter of William Memorit of Northempton County, S. C. and Virginia), and William Hill (son of GREEN HILL) married MANY MODES, daughter of EDWARD JOHNS and MARY HILL SAMUEL JURES, sister of MART JURES and son of the Jurges EDMARD, married SALLABETH ENDER GOOD-LOW and had a daughter SARAH APPLICATION FOR who married a nephew of OEM. JAMES HOMERTSUM of Sallyille, Tenn., (JAMES COCKRILL). Hon. Jo. SEAVELL JURES (Of SECCO. in VARREN COUNTY - the old MURARD JOHES westate, was a grandson of JOSEPH SHAMELL (whose namesake he was also) and his mother was a MRS. GOEDON (whe having married a second time) a sister of JUDGE HERRY STATELL, her nother being a sister of Ron. Mathaniel Macon, son of CIDEON MARCH and his wife FRISCHIAL JUNES (who married second JAMES RANGOM - see marriages). In 1824 JOSEPH MEANELL JUNES was a student at the University of North Carolina, later of HARVARD, and was affectionately known as "SHOOCO JOHES". He was an eccentric, but served in the United States Congress for a long term of years and was one of the founders of the North Carolina HISTORICAL SOCIETY.

Right of the children of HRHRH ELANT and his wire SCHAIL HEBERGH are given in the one and only accepts wallable, as INDMAS, who married ANE MARTHE, ALE MARGE, BREETE HARFE, REFERS SCHARF, VILLIAM SEARCE, BREETE HARFE, ROLLI and HILLANDTH SEARCE, BUTLANDTH SEARCE, VILLIAM SEARCE, BREETE HARFE, POILT and HILLANDTH SEARCE, WILLIAM SEARCE, BREETE HARFE, POILT and HILLANDTH SEARCE, a revolutionary soldier, who was horn July 1, 1755, an parth any long and died in Extherior december, p. 53).

REWIND HERCH'S will has not been leasted, and if a record of it excits, it exists, it probably in BUTLANDED COUNTY, Tempessee, where I see sure he must have died. William Raton and Edward Jones, of the first Sourt of SHAVILLE SOURT in 1746 (See page 601. William Raton and Reward Jones, of the first Sourt of GRAVILLE COURT in 1746 (See page 43), and whose designer, ARM MARTIE mericed TERMAS SHARET, and OF EUREM, it appears to have been this JURN MARTIE who emigrated to MERTURY and established what was known as MARTIES FRATUR, where ARMILET SHARET (brother of EMERIC) and his brother HEUREM obtained Londs after the revolution, and not far from where RAMILET is said to have been killed by the Indians (a fast that I have been mable to verify). After serving GRAVILLE COURT as Emeriff, and being lator shared, along with James Yamesy, Fallilly Fryor, Leonard Hemley Bullest and Robert Harris with a shortage of his accounts (for which, it seems, he had failed to give bond) MEMBER sentimed active in polities and in 1770, artur the death of SAMELL MEMORY, he smaceceded the latter as Slork of the Sourt. THE ANGESTRY OF THE STARCT FAMILY, Hon. V. E. H. STARCT (long since deceased) of GRIFFIR, GRORGIA, was the son of DARIEL BARTIES? STARCT, who was the son of a VILLIAN STARCT, who was the son, in turn, of a DARIEL STARCT, of JOHN-STOR COUNTY, N. C., who was the son of a JURN SEARCY, JR., a brother of ERURN SEARCY, the early Sheriff and Glork of GRAVILLE COUNTY. He claims, in his assesset, that the SEARCY FAMILY in N. S. were ALL the descendants of a JURN SEARCY (who died leaving a will in GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C. the ancestor was PEDREE, and he and his wife settled on a farm in GRAFILLE GUEST, E. G. in

It is interesting to note that the witness to the will of RAFFLET STARCT of "FILT" County, vestucky, was one WILLIAM FRILIPS and to them turn back to 1733, in MANOVER COURTY, VIB-IBIA and see where JURN STARCT (whose wife was PROMER) bought 400 acres of woodland from RICHARD FRILIPS "Of Spottsylvania County, va." Just another link in the proof that the SERRUTS came from HANOVER COUNTY, Virginias also that both of the above RAFFLET STARCTS had children who were minors. I can inclined to the belief that the RAFFLET of "Tayette County" was the IBDIAM FIGHTER, who had his "brush" with the Indians in 1787 and was recommended to the Governor as proper person to be appointed a militia officer of WOODFRED COUNTY Kentacky as late as JURE, 1799. (Vol. 4, Va. State Propers, p. 285). He may have died from wounds received in the fight sometime prior to September, of that year, when the will and codicil was proven. His son W. W. Seary is at this writing a practicing attorney of many years standing, located at CURPUS CHRISTI, Texas. There are many descendants of WILLIAM W. SKARCT and his first wite HIZARSTH HARRIS living in Texas; (3) his third wife was Beaga (MAPSELL), whom he married May 5, 1823. Probably no lastne.

ROBERT SEARCY, (son of ENUBER, the SHERIFF) was the second frand Master of the MARKET ACASCH, (som of EMBLES, the branch of the best second grand matter of the least of the fact of framesses, be being elevated to that position in the year 1815, as the successor of TERMAS CLAIRCRUS, who was the first; then in 1830 no less a person than AURENT ACASCH, afterwards President of the United States, occupied this high offices. EMBERT STARROT located in Temmesses, therefore, prior to 1815, possibly many years before that time. According to W. M.I. H. Searcy, a portrait of this son of the old Emeritf of CHANVILLE COUNTY, M. C. hangs in the State Masonie Hall at Mashville, Tennessee.

This information is taken from an account of the family given in a well known book about the RENDERSON family, written by LUCY ENDERSON HORTON, of Maury County, Tennessee, many years ago REMERICH TERMIN, written by LUCY REMERING HUNTER, or Menty County, Tennessee, anny years ago in which she gives the names of RIGHT of the children of HEUREN SEARCY and his wife SUBL. HELDERSUE. The writer was a relative of HEUREN SEARCY'S wife, but fails to give the name of HETST SHARCY'S bushend, other than to say that his name was WHITE, so that we are relegated to other sources for information on that subject. er of the famous HELLER KELLER, a world-known lecturer.

(6) DE. GEORGE HARRIS SEARCT became a prominent physician and married MARY PERSIEGER of Mebraska. Dr. Searcy died in 1935, leaving a daughter HARRIET PERSIMCER SMARCT, who married one GREER MURPHY.

(7) JUSEPH ALMIANDER SEARCY, born 1879, married FINA FOSTER, and had NIMA ROSS SEARCY and JUSEPH ALMIANDER SEARCY, JR., of the U. S. Navy.

(8) ARBIE FINE SEARCY, b. 1881, married ERRHY ADAMS SHOW, and has three children, HES-

- (8) ABBUT FITCH SERECT, b. 1881, married HERRY ADMES SHOW, and has three children, HERH A. SROW, JR., JAMES SHARCT, SROW and ARIER ROSS SROW. They live in TUSCALOGIS, Alabeaus.

 (9) FETER ENTES SERECT, born in 1882, was named for IR. FETER ENTES, one time Superintendent of the Alabeaus State Mospital. FETER ENTES has never married. He is an artist of note, residing in Tenns, where he has a large clieatele. Only recently he has been widely mentioned as the artist who painted the picture depicting the beginning of Statehood, the centennial of which is being celebrated widely over the State this year (1945). By some stricts bemembators this painting is fittingly called "The Transition", or the "Birth of a State". In 1935 this Great Great Great Grandson of HUREN STARCT (the old Shortiff), based on research by this compiler. Compiler the heavy of Machanial Grandla Grandla Compiler. executed a beautiful map of "Colonial Granville County", the home of his ancestors, a copy of which, done in colors by the artist, may be seen in the Department of Archives and History a Raleigh, North Carolina. Another epic picture by SEARCY is "Law West of the Pecos", being a diaramic painting of Moy Bean, a famous West Texas Character, she was Justice of the Peace at a place on the Peace Siver which he called LANDTRY, after the famous Lilly Lengtry, who once wist-ted him there and whom he idolised in his rough way.
- (10) IR. HARVET ENDER SKARCT, of Tuscalossa, Alabama, stands at the head of the Medical profession in his State, and like his distinguished grandfather, by his civic work and intensive research has added luster to the SKARCT name as a physician. He married MARY EMILY FITTS. They had two children.

In an article by Mannie May Tillie in the North Carolina Historical Review (vol. 19 p. 339) which appeared in 1941, some interesting side lights are given on the career of HEURER STARCT of GRANVILLE COUNTY, including the story of his connection with so-called "election frauds" in GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C. back in 1760. There can be no question but what the Sheriff belonged to the court ring of Granville County in those days and that they stood together. Not only Searcy, but dozens of others were dropped from the roll of Justices, and halled before the Governor for their independent spirit and disregard of the edicts of His Royal Highness and the Governor and did his bidding. Among these also was the redoubtable BOBERT HARRIS, and JAMES YANGE, the grandfather of the silver - tongued orator of the Confederacy, VILHIAM LOUBDES TAB-CET, of South Carolina and Georgia. Usually when one was "on the carpet" the others were, and when, out of spite, one was thrown out of office, the others all quit in sympathy.

The SEARCT'S of TUSCALOOSA, headed by the grandson ERURGE were staunch Presbyterians.

and aided in founding the old Church of that persuasion in Alabama. A recent brief sketch of the old Tuscaloosa First Presbyterian Church, it is interesting to note, shows the Grandson REVERN also had his troubles, if the old minutes can be relied upon, since they show that DR. (MCTS: The foregoing account of the SEARCTS may not be absolutely correct in all 148 details, and somewhere back in Granville County, Eentucky or Tennessee, the writer may have got-tem mixed up a little, but it is presented wit the thought that in the main it is correct and is worth presenting. It is set down in this book as worth preserving in the libraries of the country for the benefit of future generations- 3.8.R.).

MORROW FAMILY. DANIEL MORROW and his widow ELIZABETH, both of whom left wills in GRANVILLE COUNTY, the first in 1817, and the last in 1836, lived on lands on the South side of Island Creek. This family was a segment of the family to which the writer's mother belonged in Tennessee, she being a MCRROW. The family entered North Carolins, from FRINCE MOWARD COUNTY, Virginia, and located in various sections of the old North State, including BUERS, GRASVILLE, CASVELL, RUTHERFORD, IRRUELL and MECKLEVEURG. Some lived in VARREN at one time. Under "MECK-LENBURG COUNTY" an attempt will be made to go into the family more fully.

HEADERSON PANILY. In the space available it would be impossible to trace the entire EXERCISE FAMILY in all its ramifications. Besides there is nothing more tiresome to read than a lot of mass all jumbled together in the ness of "queelogy" and called a family history. Such ascounts partake too much of dry statistics to be interesting. But the writer will take smough space to give the reader a pretty good general time of the family of MENERAUS who settled in what is now a part of the original GRANVILLE COURT. And I am afraid the account given will not comport with the statements that is to be found elsewhere, most of which supear to be founded upon ported family traditions.

SANUEL HENDERGUS was the ancestor of the GRAVVILLE COUNTY MERCHERGUS, He evidently came to shat is now GRAVVILLE (or LAWE) COUNTY, when "t was EUGENGES, about 1740, maybe a little later, but not much later. His wife was HILLARETS VILLIMES, when he is said to have married in HINOTH COUNTY. He had been MERRIFF of HANDVER COUNTY, Virginia, before coming to NORTH GARDITELS, and he became one of the early Sheriffs of GRAVILLE COUNTY, after it was organized. He was not horn in HANDVER COUNTY, but in HEW THE COUNTY, Virginia. From the various "family accounts" he and his wife ELIZARETS VILLIMS had eleven children, as follows:

JUDGE RICHARD HENDERSON is perhaps the most famous of all of the children of SANUAL HENDERSON and his wife ELIZABETH WILLIAMS, and it seems that he and his wife had SIX (6) children. as follows:

From the same records we have positive evdence of the following HEMDERSONS:

SUSANNA HENDERSON, demphter of THOMAS, a minor in 1722. JANE HENDERSON, demphter of THOMAS beptised March 25, 1708.

THOMAS HENDERSON, whose wife was GRISSKL and who had a draghter URSULA MEN-MERSON born Jebruary 23, 1730.

JAMES HENDERSON who died in 1720.

SARAH HENDERSON and JUAN WILLIAMS were married in December 1711.

THOMAS HENDERSON allowed pay for making a horse block in 1728 at the church.

THOMAS HENDERSON paid by the vestry for making two horse blocks in 1728. GRISETT HENDERSON appointed Sexton for the Church in 1747.

NOTE: DANIEL TAYLOR was the Minister of Blissland in 1727, and CAPT. GRORGE KEELING was a member of the Church Vestry.

In addition to the foregoing, on May 8, 1707, THOMAS HENDERSON was on a list of cortain persons aslected to help lay out a road, under the direction of COL CHARLES FLEMING, and on the same list was a CAP. WINT, AUGUS JURNAN, WILLIAM NORRIS and a certain JAMES MOSS. (The MOSS FAMILY Decembe prominent in GRAWYLLE COUNTY, N. C. long afterwards.)

Another item discloses that a certain JAMES HENDERSON did not arrive in the bounds of ST. FETER'S PARISH until sometime around 1713 or 1714, when he gave a bond (p. 160 and 161 of St. Peter's Parish Register), with one TEDMAS JICESON, as surety, to indemnify the Parish forms all manner of charges that might accrue from his coming into said Parish. He may have simply moved from across the river in TORK COUNTY (Ya.), or he may have come from the far side of CHESEPEAKE MAY, from Accomac or Northempton Counties. In all likelihood he may have been a brother of THOMAS HENDERSOF who married SARAH WILEINSON March 15, 1698, (St. Peter's Parish Register, p. 412). The record further shows that a JAMES EXMUSRACE (perhaps the elder one, who made the bond) died August 15, 1720. (p. 433).

In the account of the Williams Family we are told that Daniel Williams, a brother of Blizabeth, who married Samuel Hermerson, married Unsula Hermerson, a sister of Samuel, and in the above records from ST. FETER'S HEGISTER it is shown that THOMAS HENDERSON and his wife GRIS-SZLI had a daughter MESULA, who was born Feb. 23, 1730. This strongly suggests that THOMAS HEN-DERSON, her father, was a brother of SAMUEL, and, of course, snother son of THOMAS HEADERSON, who according to the record died in 1709.

CAPT. GEORGE KEELING, who was a member of the vestry of old BLISSLAND PARISE in the Says of THOMAS EXEMPRISON, was a man of some importance in the community, though far from being the "IOHO REGING" so functifully pictured by the genealogists of the WILLIAMS and HENDERSON famthe "DOWN LEGING" so fancially pictured by the genealogies of the VILIAMS and HEMPLESD families. In 1704 he owned 1800 acres of land in MEW LEWT COUNTY, YHBOHEL, (vol. 31 p. 202 Ya. Mag. of Hist. & Blog.), and in 1706-2 was High Sheriff of the County. He came from NORK COUNTY TO 1804 INTELLIGIBLE COUNTY HOLD IN A STATE HEAVEN HE WAS PLAINTIFF, sometime after 1695, for in that year he was plaintiff in a law suit he had instituted in the Court's there against EDWARD HEAVEN, in which one JUBY SWIDE was a witness. (TORK COUNTY HEAVEN HEAVE page 211 of this record). To further enhance the reader's interest and strengthen the evidence of the connection of these HENCERSONS with THOMAS of NEW LEWY, some years ago Myrs. Hallie Lee (High) Royster, found the will of a GEORGE EXELING on record at HALIFAI. It had evidently been executed in what is now GRANVILLE or VANCE COUNTIES, but in what was them old EDGSCOMME COUNTY executed in wint is now metavible of varios Counties, but in what was van one approximate counties and recorded at the then county seat of PENTINIO, and later transferred to the Hillian ARCHIVES. As CAPT. GROBBE EXECUTE, of New Kent was alive in 1727, he could possibly have been alive that late, and manny the vanguard of migrants to what is now Granville County along about 1740, where he died, though it is known that some of his descendants moved to CAROLIES COUNTY (Ya.) where a RICHARD REGIESG was a prominent lawyer, and interemarried with the TYLER FAMILY, from YORK COUNTY, VIRGINIA. Certainly, in the light of all these facts, substantiated by the actual records, it is not hard to believe that a nephew of THOMAS EXMIRESON, the carpenter, employed by CAPT. GEDERS MESLING and his fellow vestryman to build "two horse blocks for ye upper church" in 1727, should marry a grand-daughter of CAPT, MEELING over in North Caroline about 1763 - JUDGE RICHAED HENDER-SON and KLIZARETH KEELING.

During the first or second decade after 1700 a new Parish was cut out of old ST. PEREN'S on the upper side and called ST. PAUL'S, and a new county, called HATOVER was also erected at about or a little after said time (in 1720). (Southern Het. Research Mag. Vol 1 p. 7.3). This enteraction of the ST. PETER'S PARISH members into the new Parish and the new County. Also Ratically threw many of the ST. FETER'S FARIER members into the new Parish and the new County, Also some of them had been pushing farther West, anyway. JUEN DAVIEL, who died in IDEK COUNTI in 1724, left lands to his sons JUEN and JAMES in HANDYER COUNTI, which was them a "going concern", and the son JUEN married ANNE, a sister of ELIZAMETH WILLIAMS who had married SAMUEL RESUMENCY. John Deniel, like SAMUEL RESUMENCY, died in GRANTILLE COUNTI, N. C. (p. 210 of this record). Some of the sons and daughters of EEDMAS EXEMPSISH perhaps moved West from New Rent to HANDYER, where they acquired lands, as well as wives, and later children. The items below, taken from the records, apply to this family:

HENRY FOX, of KING WILLIAM COUNTY, Virginia, sold 1000 acres of land to

SAMUEL HENDERSCH, of HANOVER COUNTY, Virginia, July 14, 1730.

JAMES HENDERSCH was living in ST. PAUL'S PARISH in 1715, and had his lands "processioned" that year.

WINLIAM HENNERSON was living in ST. PAUL'S PARISE (coterminus with HANO-THE COUNTY) in 1731, Among his neighbors, shown by the procession list, were JUNES STEMS, JOHN EDGG, MILSUM HOOG, GENER ENLL, DAVID HELL, JOHN DOESS and others. These same names ALL appear on sinilar lists for 1735, 1743. This same WILLIAN HENDERSON witnessed a deed to THOMAS BALLARD MITH, with EUWARD HENDERSON. JR. (From York County, Va.), as shown by the Deeds of STOTISTLVANIA COUNTY (Va.) 1n 1734.

EDWALD MENTERSON, SR. (Suggested by the "JE" above mentioned) may have lived in SPOTESKI VANIA COUNTY.

SAMUEL MENUSCHOOK and SAMUEL PRIOR (Perhaps the father of PHILLIP PRIOR, who was Sheriff of GRAHVILLE COURTY, after SAMUEL MENURAGES served) witnessed the will of CORNELIUS DARNET in HARDVER COUNTY in 1717.

RICHARD HENDERSON (Chained to have been the father of SANUEL) does not appear on these records until 1735, 1738, 1739 and 1740 hem his accounts as Collector of the Parish levies is allowed and comments made thereon. Apparently RICHAED HER-DERSON was a brother instead of the father of SAMUEL HENDERSON.

JOHE HENDERSON witnessed the will of HARRY BEVERLY in SPOTTSTLYANIA COUNTY in 1730. With REMAIN WOODSON, in 1745 he was appointed in ALEMANIE to lay out the "Prison Bounds" in that county, which shows he had moved to ALEBIARLE COUNTY,

From the foregoing and other evidence from various sources this compiler has finally concluded that the father of SAMOEL HERDERSON, one time Sheriff of GRANVILLE COUNTY, F. C. was EMBLISHMENT OF EMPLIES COUNTY, Virginia, who married SARRA WILLIAMS, March 16, 1698, in said County, and who "departed this life" in the menth of February 1709; [8t. Peter's Parish Regulator, pages 412 and 422); that EMDMAS REGULATION had been previously married and had several children by his first marriage and some by his second, and that SAMURE REGULATOR was perhaps a child of the first marriage and born, perhaps, about 1795, or earlier, since he witnessed the will of COMMELIUS DARREY in Hanover County as early r= 1717, when he must have been a grown man at that time, and not merely a young boy in his teens.

Using this evidence as a basis, we are able to say with fair cartainty that the children of THOMAS HENDERSON, of New Ment County were as follows:

 (10) URSULA HENDERSON (B. 1702) Married WILLIAMS.

- (1) JOHN HENDERSON, who moved with the WOODSONS to ALBEMANIE, was called JOHN REMLES-
- SUN, SE, He left many children, and owned lands there in 1745.

 - (3) JAMES HENDERSON lived and died in AUGUSTA COUNTY, Virginia.
- (4) SAMUEL HENDERSON married Millares VILLIAMS and moved to CRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C. (5) WILLIA' HENDERSON married SUSANNAH LOGAN and died in AUGUSTA COUNTY in 1770. He
- was the Great Grandfather of JAMES PINCKNET HENDERSON, first Governor of the State of TELAS.
- (6) EDWARD HENDERSON, SR. of SPOTTSTIVANIA and ORANGE COUNTIES.
 (7) BICHARD SENDERSON died in GOOCHLAND COUNTY in 1748, whither he had moved with the
- DANIEL and WOODSON families from HANOVER COUNTY.
- (8) SARAH HENDERSON married JOHN VILLIAMS in 1711, and they were the parents of JUDGE JOHN WILLIAMS, famous Jurist, of N. C. who died in 1799.
- (9) SUSHMAN DEFINENCE was relead by a femily named EFFERSON in New Lent County.

 (10) URSULA EMBERSON was relead DANTEL WILLIAMS, who died in GRANVILLE COURTY, N. C. in

 1759 leaving a will in which he named his children, but not his wife.

 (11) JANE ERWIERSON, born in 1708 (p. 361 St. Feter's Par.) married TILLIAM TRAVILLIAN.

As can be readily seen this HETDERSON FAMILY was a large and interesting one, and the list given constitutes the ancestors of a group of people who, with their descendants, may be said to have remade the map of the Great West, especially, JUDGE RICHARD HENDERSON whose STIVANIA properly takes up much space in our Historic innals, the son of SAMUEL HERDERSON and ELIZARETH WILLIAMS. The space available in this limited work will not permit the writer to give a full account of all of these cans and daughters, but enough will be set out below to apprise the reader in a general way of what became of their descendants, and the part that some of them have played in the development of the Matton, no comprehensive account having be neverthere given as to many of them.

THOMAS JEFFERSON, their mother, MART RANDOLPH, being a stater of MR. JEFFERSON'S mother, and a daughter of ISRAM RANDOLPH. Their father, CHARLES LEWIS, was a brother of HOWELL LEWIS and his wife ISABELLA WILLIS, of GRAM-VILLE COUNTY, E. C., whose daughter WILDRED LEWIS married JOHN CORBS in that County in 1769.

This fact alone, irrespective of other data, should be enough to convince the most skeptical that This fact alone, irrespective of other data, should be enough to convince the most supplical that the HERDERSONS of this tribe were of the same clan as those she signated from HERDERSONS, to GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C., the truth being that the father of REMERT HERDERSONS (SR.) was a brother of SAMUKI HERDERSONS, Sheriff of GRANVILLE COUNTY, and that REMERTONS, whose wife was a nice of HOVERLILISTIS, was a first cousin of COL. RICHARD REMERSONS, OF PRINTERSONS, Whose wife was a nice of HOVERLILISTIS, was a first cousin of COL. - (51). SAMUEL HENDERSON. I find it more convenient to take up SAMUEL HENDERSON first. He left a vill in AUGUSTA COUNTY, dated May 20, 1782, and proved October 15, the same year. His wife JEAN HENDERSON made her will in 1798, and same was proved in December 1800. She is described as of "Middle River". In his will SAMUEI names only six children, but in her will the widow is a bit more specific and names WIME. Doubtless her knaband had settled with some of his heirs and omitted mention of them for that reason, whereas the mother saw fit to name each one with some kind of a beguest in her old age.

This compiler has long been of the opinion, without being able to present positive evidence that the HENDERSONS who settled first, in JEFFERSON COUNTY, TRINGSSEE, and later in MCE-EON COUNTY, where MADISTRYLLE, the County east, was built on their lands, were the descendants of this SAMUEL HERMERSON of "Middle River" though there has been an insistent claim that they all

came down from a "John Benderson, \$r.'." of Virginia, through a son "John, Jr.," who, it is claimed, married a FRANCES MOORE. Mrs. Forton, in her account, gives a list of the children of this John Henderson, Jr., which does not contain the mames of those Hendersons who came, first, to GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE, and later to JEFFERSON COUNTY. The children of SAMUEL HENDERSON, who died leaving a will in 1782, and who is said in the will to be of "Middle River". shows he had children:

The following interesting notes are from the Zast Tennessee Records: FEB. 2, 1785, SAMUEL HENDERSON, known to be the son of NATHANIEL HENDERSON and the grands of SAMUEH HENDERSON, of GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C. married LUCY RICKMAN, in Green County, Tennessee. Security on the bond was JAMES MENUERSON. Samuel Henderson had no brother JAMES and no cousin JAMES in North Carolina.

ANDREW HENDERSON was present at the meeting of the first Court for JAFFERSON COUNTY, Tennessee, when the county was organized July 23, 1792. In 1793 ANDREW HENDERSON was appointed administrator of the estate of John McWilliams in Jefferson County, Tennessee. At the sale of the effects of JESSE WALKER. Jan. 23. 1808. at Dandridge. Tennessee. ANJERN HENDERSON bought one Am.

HOBERT HENDERSON (Feb. 14, 1798) deeded lands in Jefferson County, on the FRENCE HROAD RIVER to WILLIAM MORROW. Deed witnessed by JOHN HENDERSON.

JOHN HENDERSON was born in JEFFERSON COUNTY, Tennessee, in 1790, the son of a JOHN

HENDERSON. HE merried DORGAN MOSFADIEN. They lived and died in MOSFAD COUNT.

ANDERV L. HENDERSON, another son of JUHN HENDERSON married MARGARET MCSPADDEN. They also settled in MOSROE COUNTY. They had a son JAMES M. HENDERSON, prominent in McMinn County (fenn.) politics, and sho was finally President of the First National Bank of Athens, Term.

A copy of the abstract of the will of ALXIANDER HENDERSON, from which the above account is taken, will be found on Ardry's Kentucky Zecords, at page 15. A letter reproduced in the Horton account from J. ANIEST HEALTHSON to JUES HEALTHSON, from Virginia to the "Holston" and which was preserved by the ATHENS, TENNESSEE, Hendersons, dated Dec. 1, 1756 (an obvious error as to the date) strengthens the proof. I think this proof is now ample on the point involved.

(50) JAMES HENDERSON (Son of WILLIAM HENDERSON) married WIGLET LAWSON. She was the design of COL. HUNG LAWSON, of Lumenburg County, Virginia, a cousin of JUHN LAWSON, of ST.
PETER'S PARISH, in Virginia. HUGH LAWSON in his latter years moved to North Carolina, and died and is buried at the old RAKEN'S CRAYETARD in Mccklenburg (Not kredell or Rowan) County. He died about 1770, leaving a will dated in 1764, in which he mentioned two sons, EUGH LAYSUM and ROSER LAWSON, four sons in laws, THOMAS INVIN. GRORGE EWING, MUCH RARRY and JAMES HENDERSON (the husband of his daughter VIOLET); also his daughter MARY LAWSON, who became the wife of GENERAL JAMES WHITE, the founder of KNOXVILLE, TENNESSEE, and the mother of the Tennessee Jurist and Statesman, JUDGE HUGH LANSON WHITE. Thms, JAMES HEMMERSON, who was the first cousin of JUDGE RICHARD HENDERSON, the founder of "Transplyania", was the brother in law of GEN. JAMES WHITE and his wife VIOLET was the cunt of HOUR LANSON WHITE. Hugh Lewson White was the first cousin of LANSON HENDERSON who married ELIZABETH CARROTT in North Carolina, and the children of JURIS WHITE were second cousins of JAMES PINCREST HERDERSON, the first Governor of Texas, United States Senator, etc., from the Lone Star State.

ROGER LAWSON, one of the sone of COL. HUGH LAWSON, married HANNAH THOMSON (No P in the name) daughter of HEV. JUHN TERMSON, a contemporary and friend of the celebrated HEV. SAMUEL DAVIES, one-time President of PEINCETCH, UNIVERSITY, and a kinsman of the writer's wife. Rev. Thomson went to North Carolina some years before the HEV. HUUH Mcallen made his famous journey through the CAROLINAS and VIRGISIA, and preached the first PRESETTRIAN sermon ever delivered on North Carolina soil, in what is now MECKLEMBURG COUNTY, N. C. about one mile from the celebrated REATT'S FORD crossing of the CATAMBA RIVER, on the farm of his kineman RICHARD BARRY under a "spreading oak tree". (Alexander's History of Mecklenburg County).
Rev. JOHN "HOMSON and COL. HUGH LANSON are buried on the same plot of ground in what is and has always been called BAKKE'S GRAVEYARD, near the banks of the limpid stream, long after-Made always been called massar's marsians, near the beauty loving americans and the Army of the wards the scene of tense struggles between the laborty loving americans and the Army of the manual laborates of matches Comments and the Army of the writer Tory leader Cornwallis. Cown'ts Ford is within two miles of RAKER'S GRAVITARD. The writer has visited the place where HUGH LAFSON and HEV. TROMBON are both buried in MECKLESSURO COUN-TY, and HOT in HOWAR COUNTY, or IMEDIAL, as has been so often stated, erroneously.

JAMES HENDERSON died in 1793, and he was the owner of a large body of land along the South Fork of the Catawba River, then in LINCOLN, but now in GASTON COUNTS. In addition, before his death he had entered a large body of land along BUGK and STONE RIVER in Middle Tennessee. The writer has visited the grave of JAMES HENDERSON in what is now GASTON COUNTY, N. C. and has now on his deak as he writes a paper weight made from a small stone which had fallen from the high limestone wall surrounding the burial place. As further proof that this man was a cousin of JUDGE RUNGAND and the other sons of SANDE HENDERSON, old ADAM SPRING, who married FARNIE HENDERSON, damphter of FROMAS REGURESON (son of SANDEL, of GRANVILLE COUNTY) is buried behind the seme high stone wall on top of the mountain overlocking the wirling waters of the South Dark of the CHARMA. At this point JAMES HENDERSON had built a dem and a mill, which, late in life he sold to ADAM SPRINGS.

- (73) LAWSON HENDERSON married ELIZABETH CARRUTH, the daughter of WALTER CARRUTH. On the old marriage records and bonds of LINCOME COUNTY, N. C. the writer found the following: "LANSON HERIZEGO married KLIZERTH CARROTT, in LINCOME COUNTY, JULY 25, 1788; JURY DIGKSON Was surety on the marriage bond. These were the parents of the JAMES PINCENST KENNED-SON who was the first Governor of the State of Texas. United States Senator, and Embassador to the Court of Saint James. He and FRANCES COX, whom he married, set in PARIS and LOTTOM and were later united. I consider the following a correct list of the children of LANSON MEMBERS. SON and his wife ELIZABETH CARROTH:

LOGAN served in the Texas Army and received lands for his services, Descendants live now at PORT ARTHUR, TEXAS.

DESCENDANTS OF SAMUEL HENDERSON, of GRANVILLE COUNTY. The following information in regard to the direct descendants of SAMUEL HENDERSON, of GRANVILLE COUNTY, is copied from material found in various places and from numerous accounts that have been written. The dates given in every instance have been copied from the same sources, and the writer is not sure that they are correct, since other dates pertaining to older members of the family have been found to be wrong in many cases. The numbers refer to the list of children inserted on page 221 of this record, which see.

- (1) MART REBURSON, bons in 1734, married LYGAS NITCHELL. Children of this marriage were JACOS, SAMONE, RICHARD, TROMAS, EDMAND, TILLIAM, HUTH, KLIZABETH, JELICO and SUSAN NITCH-ELL. MART and NAS HITCHELL CONTROLLE COUNTY to Rest Formersee (or, what was afterwards called that), but later they moved to GRINDAL SHOALS on the PACOLET RIVER in South Carolina, where some of the owner members of the REGURSON FAMILY had settled. The name "NELICO" in the list of their children refers to ANGELICA NITCHELL, the wife of JUIGZ AREAM FORT, a celebrated character in South Carolina Ristory.
- with his pipe still in his mouth.

 (3) ANN HERUERSON, said to have been born in 1739, married HANLE WILLIAMS, who was her cousin and the brother of GEN. JAMES WILLIAMS who lost his life at King's Mountain, and of HERR, JOHN and JOSEPH WILLIAMS, of Caswell County. Their children Simmen, hards, JOSEPH, RICHARD, WILLIAM, NAVID, ESTST, KANCI, NOTH and FOLIAY MASSES. After the death of her husband and cousin HANLE WILLIAMS, the widow ANN HERMERSON WILLIAMS married ANAN POTTER, it is believed, in South Carolina; for it is known that she joined her sisters Mrs. Mitchell and Mrs. Bedthm and her brothers John and William Henderson on the Pacolet River in the Grindal Shools settlement. Though they married in South Carolina, perhaps, ADAM POTTER was a member of the GRAINTILLE COUNTY FOTTERS, and may have been a brother of AFRAHAM POTTER who died in Granville County Court Records herein for that year.
- (4) SUSIN HENDERSON, said to have been born in 1743, married REUBEN SEARCY (whose family came from MANDVER COUNTY (pp. 217 to 220 herein) and had, as near as may be ascertained from all accounts enamined: THOMAS, ASA, PRINTER, REBERT, WILLIAM W., HENRIETTA, FOLLY and ELIZAMENE. THOMAS SEARCY married ANNE MARTIN, and they were the parents of DR. HEUBEN SEARCY who settled in TUSCALOGSA, ALMANIA, becoming the ancestor of a numerous tribe herestofore reviewed; ASA SEARCY may have moved to TENNESSEE; HENRIT SEARCY went to Kentucky; ROBERT SEARCY settled in Tennessee, where he was the Second Grand Waster of the Masonic Lodge of that Jurisdiction; WILLIAM W. (Washington) settled in GRAVVILLE for Repeap' though his descendants went to Tennessee, and some of them to Texas; Folly and Henrietta have not been found in tracing, while ELIZAMETH married a CHRIVILLE County WHITE and her descendants (named White) were numberous in Middle Tennessee. (See Acken's Tennessee Bible Records).
- ALSTON, JR., and moved to the neighborhood of GRINDLI SHOALS, on the PROCLET RIVER in Scuth Caroline. In August 1775, WILLIAM ALSTON, in behalf of the orphans of SOLDMON ALSTON, deceased, obtained a writ against JUEN HENDERSON, who married SARAH, the widow of SOLDMON ALSTON, for alleged and practice in the administration of the estate of soid Alston. The orphans named in the mult were LEMISL ALSTON, HENRY ALSTON and CHARITY ALSTON; the executors to SOLDMON ALSTON were JUEN HENDERSON, JOSEPH JOEN WILLIAMS and WILLIAM ALSTON. Prayer granted. (Vol. 10, N. C. Records, pp. 514.). CHARITY ALSTON, the daughter of SOLDMON, JR. and SARAH HITTON, married JALES JUNES, a grandson of EDFARD JUNES, at whose home the County of GRAWYLLE was formed in 1746, as shown by the records herein. GEN. WILLIAM HENDERSON, who before the revolution, had settled at GRINTAL SHOALS on the Pacolet in S. C., sold his planation there to his brother JUHN ENDERSON who make the second of the Sarah (HINTON) ALSTON were WILLIAM, JUSTM, RETST (m. EXPANJES) and SALLY (who started a HAILE). The son JOSEPH was the father of JANE HENDERSON (m. a DUEE) and of two other doughters who married respectively a WRIGHT and a WARK.
- (6) SAMPLE REFERENCE accompanied his brother COL, RICHARD HENDERSON and his friend COL, RICHARD CALIDVAY with the Transpivanie contingent to the vicinity of BOUNEDED, Kentucky in June, 1776. The remaintic riory of the capture of Elizabeth Calloway and Jemimah Boone by the Ludians and their rescue by Daniel Boone and Samuel Henderson forms an interesting chapter in early Kentucky history and has been often repeated. Elizabeth Calloway was the eighth child of Col. Sichard Calloway and his wife FRANCES VALUOM and was born Angust 14, 1760. She married

(a) PIRABART HENDERSON, son of SAMUEL HENDERSON and ELIZARETH WILLIAMS, of GRANVILLS, married SARHH MARTIN (as and to have been the dampher of COL, JAMES MARTIN, of SEOV CHESK, N. C., presumably a brother of ALEXANDER, the GOVEROR, it is said that he was a revolutionary soldier, and being an officer, was a member of the SORTH CAROLINA SOCIETY of the CINCINNATI. Their list of children werest JAMES MARTIN HENDERSON (b. 1787); WILLIAM MENDERSON (b. 1789); MAURICE HENDERSON (b. 1791); TIPPO L. (b. 1798) and K. (b. 1798); PIRABATT (b. 1802); ALKANDER (b. 1807), and KLIZANDEN JAME HENDERSON (b. 1798). The compiler has no further information in regard to this FIRALANT HENDERSON and has family, save and except the likelyhood that he lived and died in CHANVILLE COUNTY, and that his children, named above, were probably born there, since he was living in the "WENDERSON DISTRICT" somewhere near the present town of HENDERSON in 1790.

(9) WILLIAM HENDERSON, son of SAMPEL HETHERSON and ELIZABETH WILLIAMS, supposed to have been born March 5, 1748, known in History as GER. WILLIAM HENDERSON, of the American Bevolution, time rater to that great conflict, moved to PACCLET, in ROUTH CAROLINA, where he emgaged mercantile business. At least one of his brothers and maybe two located in that section t about the same time, and two of his sisters also settled there, and the widow of one of his trusing, his sister ATE also came there and married as her second husband ATAM POTTER, as has The above And also come their all carried as ner second misoane Alam Futial, as may been before stated. For several years and before his marriage, GEN, HENDERSON, lived on what was called SANDT HON with his sinty and brother in law DIEN BECKHIM. One of his father's mister, JANE HENDERSON and her harhand William TRAVILLAM also lived in the same settlement, so the HENDERSONS, TRAVILLIANS, PRORHAMS, NOTTS and others made up a pretty that the HENUERSONS, TRAVILLIANS, PROUHANS, MOTTS and others made up a preity fair community of kin folks along the FACCIST and around GRINDAL SHOALS. Then he came there WILLIAM HENDERSON had AIM SILES ALONG the FACILITY and wround SHINGAL SMOALS. When he came there WILLIAM HENGERGUN had secured quite a larger grant of land, adjoining the HANIES and SIMS families, which, after his marriage to LETITIA DAVIS, the widow of JARDO MELSON, in 1782, he sold to his brother JURE HENGERS. With his wife he moved over on the SAMMER RIVER, where he restded until his death, Jermany 28th, 1708, according to the notice thereof which appeared in the "STATE SALWINGE" or South Carolina, on Frimmany 11th, following, which says that he "died on his plantation" on the Sammer. Be made JURE HYDRESON, his brother, THOMAS SUMPTER, DOUGLAS STATE and PHILLIP PETERSON. his executors. He bequeathed his brother JOHN a thousand acres of his land, perhaps in CAMINA, where he lived, and to his daughter Elila MCRIAE also a tract of land in CAMDER DISTRICT. She is described as "his only child", (Dr. Archibald Benderson Vol. 1 Southern Historical Research Magazine, p. 330, etc.). Incidentally Dr. Henderson, in his very able article, states that his mother's name was MART, instead of Edizabeth Williams, otherwise in this account I am following Date version. According to INCH MEDIESSON HEATON, who is a decembent of SANKE MEDIESON, the son of Gen. William's older brother, NATHANIEL, there were other children besides the dampter ELIZA MORIM HENDERSON, including RETSI TATIOR, THERESON MORIMERON and JOHN HENDERSON "the lived near DANDELDGE, TENNESSEE". She says that JOHN HENDERSON, of DANDELDGE, was the father of JAMES MENDERSON, who was in turn the father of JOHN B. HENDERSON, U. S. Senator from MISSOURI, who was form in PITTSTLYANIA COUNTY, Virginia. It is not improbable that this account may be correct, er-CENT that the JOHN HENDERSON, whom she says was the son of GEN. (10) NATHANIEL HENDERSON, perhaps the oldest son of SAMUEL HENDERSON and his wife ELIZABETH FILLIAMS, said to have been born in HUOVER COUNTY, Virginia, in 1736, has an interesting lot of descendants. He appears to have been twice married. The writer hopes to be able to adequately and accurately portray them in this brief space. He first married the widow of CAPT. SUGAR JUHES, She was SARAH FRANKLIN and was a relative of HCN. JESSI FRANKLIN, who was Governor and who married a Stater of COL, EMBLANK CHEVELAND, of King's Mountain fame, long afterwards. SUGAR JURIS was an in-trovid Ladian compaigner and the oldest son, I think, of NDWARD JURIS, Friend and contemporary of CLE. WILLIAM KANDS, OF GRAVVILLS, heretofore mentioned in these notes (both of them) and in the record of the first court of GRANVILLE COUNTY, By Mrs. JOHES, MATHANIEL HENDERSON had one son, so the story goes, memed HATHANIEL HENDERSON. (10) NATHANIEL married second a widow by the name of ECRGAN, related in some way to the HART FAMILY, some of whom were connected with "the Transpivanta Company" and COL. RICHARD EMBRESS. By this second marriage there were two children. SAMOEL HER-Company and COL RICHARD RESURED. By this second marriage there were two children, SANGE HES-DERSON (m. LUCT RICHAR), in CHERE COUNTY, THE, Feb. 2, 1785), and ELIZABETH HENDERSON who mar-tied a man named TOUNG. SANGEL, the son, moved to HAWKINS COUNTY, TRINESSER, with his father, MATS-ANIMAL, and afterwards to KRON COURTY, though his father accompanied his brother JUDGE RICHARD HES -DERSON and was for a sime, at least in BOONSBORD with him in the hey-day of TRANSTLVANIA. His children (those of the son SAMMEL) were all born in INOI COUNTY, but after their births, he and his Sandly moved to what is now ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI and lived for a time, and after that in about 1817, returned to TENNESSEE, and settled in VILLIAMSON COUNTY, where he died. The children of SANUEL HEL-DERSON and LYCI RICKMAN vere ANN, LEVISA, MARK, MATTIDA, ELIZABETH (m. JOHN STRICKLAND), SALLY, JUCI (m. THOMAS GILLESPIE) and DR. SAMUEL HENDERSON who married RACHEL JAME HUGHES. DR. SAMUEL REMIRESON, of WILLLASON COUNTY, was the father of LUCY HENDERSON, who married H. H. HORTON, and to whom we are indebted for many of the details of this account of SAMMEL HENDERSON and his inteesting family. HATHANIEL HENDERSON, older son of HATHANIEL HENDERSON and his wife MRS. SUGAR JOHES. died in EDERFIELD DISTRICT, S. C. in 1803, leaving a will in which he named his children: HICHARD, THOMAS, WILLIAM, MARY, MARTEA JOHN, NATHAM some BLI HENDERSON. The NATHAMIEL HENDERSONS, father & son, both served in the sevolution, according to the family accounts. ELI HERCERSON was the father of AUGUSTINE HENDERSON, who was the father of HOM. CHARLES HENDERSON, Covernor of ALABAMA from 1914 to 1918. His mother was MILDRED HILL and his wife LAURA MONTCOMERY. JUHN HERDERSON (won of RATHAN-IZL and MRS. SUGAR JONES) married MANCY STALLWORTH, (whose sister JEMIMA married MARK TRAYIS) in ABREVILLE DISTRICT. S. C., and they had a son THOMAS STALLWORTH HENDERSON, who came to Texas in a very early day and settled .. + OLD WASHINGTON on the ERAZOS. A distinguished son, HON. THOMAS STALL WORTH RETURNSON (second cousin or "OL. VILLIAN BARRETT TRAVIS, son of MARK TRAVIS and JENIMAR STALL-WORTH) died in CAMERON, TEXAS, some on years ago, a leading member of the Texas Bar.

(11) RICHARD HEMDRESON (son of SAMUEL HEMDERSON and his wife ELIZABETH VILLIAMS) was born in HAMOVER COUNTY, VIRGINIA, April 20, 1735 (WHELER vol 1 p. 102); he died at his home in GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C., January 30, 1785. Thus he lived for FIFTY MARS only, but left the impress of a remarkable career on the history of Mis country. He was about ten years of age when his father, SAMUEL HENDERSON, removed from HANDVER COUNTY, Virginia, to GHANVILLE COUNTY, forth Carolina. Somewhere I have read that when his father was EMPRIFF, his young son HICHARD was one of his deputies. He studied law, when young, in the office of his cousin (who, in fact, was his double cousin) JUDGE JOHN WILLIAMS, who was much older then himself, was admitted to the bar and later was appointed by the Governor a Judge of the Superior Court, and was serving in that ca-pacity when the trouble with the "Regulators" arose in North Carolina. His cousin, JUDG WILLIAMS, was serving in the same expacity at the same time, and both were forced to leave Hillsboro to avoid violence with the enraged "regulators". In company with JUDES WILLIAMS (shose step-daughter became his wife), LEGARD HERIET BULLOCK, WILLIAM JURESTORD, JAMES HORG, THOMAS HART, JOHN LUTTHRILL, NATHANIEL and DAVID HART, when the CHEROKKE HIDLING offered their lends for sale (WHERIER Vol. 1, p. 103) he organized a company called "THE TRANSITANTIA COMPANY", which bought up a large tract thereof, paying a fair consideration for the same, which included "a large portion of the present States of Tennessee and Kertucky" of which the Company took possession the 20th of April, 1775, Governor MARTIN, of North Carolina about the same time, declared the purchase illegal, but JUDGE HENTERSON and his "associates" proceeded to Kentucky, guided by the intrepid DiWIEL BOOME, where the "State of TRANSIDATIA" was daly organized, and a proprietary government set in motion, JAMES ECOS (of an old RINGVER COUNTY, VIROUNIA, family) was dispatched to the seat of GOVERNORY of the nation, as an agent to effect a settlement with the Colonial Government, but who failed in his mission. Eventually Col. Henderson and his associates were granted a block of some 200,000 acress as a compromise, and the original tract accepted as a "spurchase" by the Nation, notwithstanding it had been repudiated as a "frand" when first consumated. According to TREMESE this 200,000 acress was granted by VIRGINIA, and later TENURSEN made HENDERSON & CO. a similar concession in the Powell's Valley country. In 1779 JUDGE RENDERSON (Scentimes COLORDE HENDERSON) opened a land office at what is now known as MARVILLE, for the sale of these compromise lands to settlers. In GRAFFILLE COUNTY, Judge Henderson lived in the "BUT BURK SECTION" neighbor to JUDGE VILLIAMS. He married ELIZABETH REELING, step-demphter of JUIGE VILLIAMS, a lineal descendant of COL, INDHAED REELING of Charles City County, Virginia, after whom he memed one of his soms, a distinguished Judge on the North Carolina Seach. The children of JUDGE RICHARD HENDERSON and his wife ELIZAMETH KAKING are civen as follows: TANNY HENDERSON (b. 1764) who married JUDGE REPORD MCAIT, of Schiebury, RICE-AHD HENDERSON (b. July 1766); ARCHIRALD HENDERSON (b. August, 1768); KLIZAMETH HENDERSON (born in 1770) who married an Alexander, from MEGALEMBURG COUNTY; LEUNARD RENDERSON (b. 1772, died in August 1833) married FRANCES FARRER, end left two sons and two daughters; JOHN LAWSON RENDERSON. (b. 1778) who left no children, according to the writer's information. An interesting story is that of FANNY HENDERSON, a duaghter of JUNGS LEGISLED HENDERSON and the grand-daughter of JUNGS RICHARD HENDERSON. She married a DE. VILLIAM "ATTOR and they had a denghter LUCY WHITE TATIOR, who married JOEL ADDISON HATES, of MASHVILLE, TRRESSEE, whose son JOEL ADDISON HATES, JR. Married MAB-GARET HOWELL DAVIS, the designter of PERSIDENT JEFFERSON DAVIS, of the SOUTHERN CONFEDERACY.

HENRY HENDERSON, near YORK RIVER in the County of HENT (NEW HENT), in VIRGINIA, Planter, died leaving a will dated MARCH 10, 1752, which was proved November 3, 1764, in which he left "all My plantations, lands and tensents near YORK RIVER, in VIRGINIA, and all other estate in VIRGINIA of The STRAINA, (701, 12 VA MAG. of Hist & Biog., page 179-180.)

THOMAS HENDERSON, of HEW KENT COUNTY, VIRGINIA, who married (as his second wife) SARME WILKINSON, March 16, 1698 (St. Peter's Parish Register p. 412) and who was the father of SAMUEL MENUERSON and the grandfather of JUDGE RICHARD HENUERSON, of GRAMVILLE COUNTY, N. C., may, or MAY NOT have been the seal of the above HERRY HENDERSON. The wording of the will indicates that if he had any children by his wife STARMA they were very young and for that reason were left wholly, with all of his considerable property to the care and sole custody of his wife. As this will is copied from "THROHIA GRAINING IN EDIALID" and furnishes no proof that the tester by was even related to THOMAS HENDERSON save and except that he was living in NEW KENT COUNTY, where THOMAS HENDERSON serve one except that he was living in NEW KENT COUNTY EXCEPTIONS were of ENGLISH and not of SCOTTSH ORIGINA, as has been claimed, the "connections" of the HINDERSONS, as hereinafter shown, being with well known ENGLISH FAMILIES (some of them of WILCE extractions) further strengthens this point. The chart which follows will give a fair idea of these connections:

ISIAM RANDLIFF, his brother, had a daughter MANT who married CRRIES LIVIS of "Buckeye Load" in ALBEMBER, and BENNETT HENDERSON, grandson of THOMAS HENDERSON, married their laughter ELIZABETH LEWIS.

CAPT. GEORGE RESLING, who married URSULA FIRMING was, in my opinion, the son of INCHARD EXELING (brother of ADAM) and the grandson of THOMAS KEELING (Ensign) who patented 100 acres in the County of ELIZABETH CITY, adjoining the land of HERRY SOUTHWELL (Southell) and WILLIAM MORGAN and the RACK RIVER, Rovember 18, 1635. ADAM KEELING lived in NEW POQUOSON section of YORK COUNTY and married a daughter of JCHN MARTIN. INCOMMEND EXELING lived at JAMESTONN at the "Governor's House" at one time, and was a prominent and influential member of the VIRGINIA COLONY (5 Va. Mag. of Hist. & Biog. p. 246.). The ADAM KAZLING set populated LOWER MORNOIX for many generations, smong them being COL. THOMAS KETLING, who owned land next to HIV. WILLIAM WILKINSON, close kinsman of the NEW KERT WILKINSONS. NOTE: In the year 1854, SIMMINO CLEEK, which runs:into the TORK RIVER not far from the present WILLIMSBURG, VIRGINIA, was made the dividing line between TORK COUNTY and HEW KERT. If a person lived on the East side of SKIMMINO he was in TORK COUNTY, but if on the West side he was in NEW KERT. In 1703 there were only 135 femilies living on the WEST SIME and most of those were seated along the YORK RIVER and the SKIMMINO, on account of the HEDLAN situation, although RACON'S REDKLIGON had helped the situation. So it happens that the HERIDERSONS, VILLIAMS, KERLINGS and other families were simply on the "other side of the creek" from TORK, though they were FROM TORK COUNTY.

WILLIAMS PANILY OF GRANVILLE COUPSY. N. C.

JOHN VILLIAMS, the father of ELIZAREM VILLIAMS, she married SAMUEL HEFERROW in ENDOYER COUNT, Virginia, according to featily tradition and tracecard with accounts that have been published by genealogists, was not a native of WALSS, born in 1679, as has been stated, but a native of TORK COUNT, VIRGINIA, where the VILLIAMS FAMILY settled during the first half of the Seventeenth Century. He may have been born in 1679, though this would be in the face of the records which show that he was living on his plantation with his wife and family as late, or as early, as 1685-6. He was also the ancestor of JUDG JUHE VILLIAMS of CHANTILE COUNTY, Borth Garolina. These statements are based on the actual records of TORK COUNTY, VIRGINIA, and as the compiler writes these lines he has before him a photostatic copy complete of VOLING VIII, of the TORK COUNTY RECORDS, from which the facts are drawn. This photostat is, of course, a complete and exact copy of every word that uppears on the record and it has been checked carefully, not in a hot, unconfortable walt, or a dusty room, but in the quiet, cool precinest of a home Library, where the examination could be made leisurely and without hindrams or interference, a boom that in the days of LTON G. TILE and E. A. EROCK could not be enjoyed. Modern machinery and contrivance has been employed to streamline this investigation and having also the advantage of the vast store of information such nem gathered in their useful lives, gives the modern investigation and advantage they did not have and it is no detraction of them to say, with the limited facilities at their command, that they nade a few mistakes and on rare occasions arrived at conclusions which by later discoveries turned out to be mistakes.

THE WILLIAMS FAMILY, doubtless of WELCH descent, settled on QUEEN'S CHEEK in YORK COUNTY, Virginia, accetime prior to the year 1645. The rough sketch presented below will convey an idea of where they lived at that time.



QUEST'S CREEK in YORK COUNTY, as this sketch indicates, extends inland from YORK RIVER in a Southerly direction from its month. Comparing the crude some representing a distance of FIVE MILES it may be seen that KINENTO CREEK is about, and in some places less than that distance West of it. The latter constituted the line between NET MERT and TOHK COUNTIES. Here are the names of some of the families who lived on QUEST'S CREEK and Mast of STEMMINO in YORK COUNTIES.

All of the families named settled in TORK COUNTY during the first half of the 17th century. One generation after another toddled along. They intermarried and formed ties and alliances that have never been abandoned or dissolved. Show me the name on any record of any one of these families and I'll soon be able to prove to you they descend from and are related to some of the other families listed on this "COUNTY'S CHENK CHES."

THE FIRST JOHN WILLIAMS. The compiler must, in all fairness, acknowledge his indebtedness to the inlaticale ENERGY FIRST, of Editional, descendant of the intraction has been called the "Virginia Daniel Boome" of the days of Lord Baltimore and Col. Claiborne, for the record of the first JOHN WILLIAMS, who came to TORK COUNTY and settled on QUEEN'S CHEEK, at least as early as 1644-5. (See FIRET'S COLONIAL ABSTRACTS, Vol. 24 p. 90, for the records of BOOK 2, of York County, pages 138-139). The record follows:

> Nov. 5, 1639. SIR JOHN HARVEY, KNT., GOVERNOR, FTC., to SAMUEL WATKINS, deed to 250 acres in CHARLES RIVER (as NORE COUNTY was then designated), in the forest adjoining the land of JOHN UTTE extending from the head of KING's CREEK, Westerly to the mayden swamp, and adjoining the lands formerly granted to the said SAMUKL WATKINS by patent due by assignment from JOSEPH CROSHAW, for transporting five persons. Signed, JOHN HARVEY.

One of the "five persons" transported by JOSEPH CROSHAT, referred to above was a certain JOHN DANIEL, an ancestor of that JOHN DANIEL who married ARCE, daughter of a later JOHN MILILIANS, and the same JUNN LARIEL who left a will in GRANVILLE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA in 1765. SAMUEL WATKINS was the ancestor of THOMAS WATKINS, of SWIFF CHERK, whose daughter KLIZ-ABETH married JAMES NANIKL, another member of the same family. Unity, the daughter of JOSEPH DROKAN, married LIRUT. Oll. JUNN WEST, son of GOVERNOR and CAPT. JUNN WEST. But to continue with the records

> June 10, 1644. SAMUEL WATKINS, of QUEEN'S CHEEK, assigns the above 250 acres to JUEN HELL; part of which was due to JUEN BELL by deed of gift, and now the full patent is sold to him. Signed SAMMEL WATKING. The witnesses to this assignment were GEORGE CLARKS and VILLIAM ROBERTS.

Then follows the following item:

Oct. 1, 1645. JOHN BELL, of QUEEN'S CHEEK, Planter, sesigns to JOHN WILLIAMS the above 250 acres lying in HAMPTON PARISH, etc. This is signed by JOHN RELL.

Then follows a further and more particular description of the land which was thms sold to JOHN WILLIAMS in October, 1645, which description is dated April 20, 1642, saying it adjoined ERIERY STAIR, the land of WILLIAM TAYLOR, the land of MICHOLAS COM-INGS, the land of THOMAS GIRSON and another dividend belonging to SAMUEL WARKINS.

Still another interesting deed dated JUMN 10, 1641, reads as follows: "JOHN HELL, of QUERT'S CHEEK, Planter sells SAMUEL WARKING his plantation and house in QUERT'S CHEEK, formerly purchased from WILLIAM RETSOLDS". GRORG CLERK and WILLIAM W. HORERTS, witnesses. From which it appears that one of the early comers to this QUEEN'S CHEEK settlement and a possible and probable predecessor in title to the JOHN WILLIAMS land was this WILLIAM HETMOLDS. The part he plays and the role he takes in these family genealogies will be discussed later.

All of these families are interlocking and were then or later related to each other. The name of the first NORW WILLIAMS! wife we do not know. They had several children me name of the first JOHN WILLIAMS' wife we do not know. They had several children who settled with them on QUEEN'S CHOEK, including JOHN, EDWARD, ORDILAR, RICHARD and WILLIAMS. The SON JOHN WAS known as JOHN WILLIAMS, SR. He settled on the "KASTERN SHORE" of VIRGINIA, in ACCOUNT, as did also JUHN DANIEL, a son of the immigrant, ROSER DANIEL. JUHN WILLIAMS (the son), SR. apparently had the following childrens

- JOHN WILLIAMS (m. MARY KEELING).
- (2) NATHANIEL WILLIAMS (In Accomac County in 1794).
- WILLIAM WILLIAMS (Minister of ST. PETER'S).
- (4) (5) (6) (7) LIMIS WILLIAMS (OF NEW HENT COUNTY).
- SARAH WILLIAMS married WILLIAM RANIEL (Accomac County).
- (8) MARY WILLIAMS married JOHN DANIEL

JOHN WILLIAMS, SR. (Son of the first JOHN WILLIAMS) eventually returned to TORK & NEW COUNTIES. He died sometime after 1638, when he was named as an executor of the will of his son in law WILLIAM DARTH in ACCOMAC. His widow settled on lands belonging to him along the FAULTHY between NEW HENT and HING WILLIAM. She is known on the records thereafter as the "Midow Williams". Her son INTS WILLIAMS, or same of his descendants established what was known as the WILLIAMS FERT, where GENERAL WASHINGTON crossed to visit with the CHAMBERLAIMS and where he met the comely young widow MARTHA CUSTIS, long afterwards, whom he married.

As for (6) DANIEL TIMIAMS, he was a man of some importance and in accordance with a

law passed requiring notice of trips being taken abroad we find this note in Yol. VIII of the YORK OCUMTY (Va.) RECORDS:

> MAI a Court held for YORK COUNTY, February 24, 1686, NAMICE WILLIAMS, JOSIAS STACKY and JOHN POINDEATER did lett and publish their INTENTIONS of going for OLD ENGLAND, GCD WILLING.

(3) WILLIAM WILLIAMS was a Minister of ST. PETER'S PARISH and his name as such appears on the Church Register. He was also a school master and conducted a school in DEFREIGE PARISE

(1) JOHN WILLIAMS (who married WARY KEELING) probably died on his plantation on CHERN, in TORK COUNTY, Virginia, sometime during the first decade of the Righteenth century, as some of his children were born AFTER 1700, though all of them were born much earlier than the accounts given by the genealogists. One JUHN VILLIAMS, believed to have been a son of EDVARD VILLIAMS and a cousin of (1) JUHN, died in YORK COUNTY in 1697-8, without leaving a will and probably without children, though he had several brothers.

This JOHN WILLIAMS was a man of some prominence in the County, and while the records examined do not give his life history, they do give enough to show that he was one of those men whose name not indrequently appeared on the court and other records, and it is surprising how much such entries, scarce though they were, reveal of the man-

He was sued on one occasion by JOHN CONSTANT and after a hearing of the case, judgment was rendered against him for the payment of a judgment of four pounds Sterling, "which said JOHN TILLIAMS is ordered to pays. This was on Movember 24, 1688.
At a meeting of the YORK COUNTY COURT in February of the same year there was a suit

pending between JOHN WILLIAMS, plaintiff, and WILLIAM CLOPTON, defendant, which was passed over to the next meeting of the court. This WILLIAM CLOPTON was an important personage, who owned considerable property, both in TORK and NEW KENT COUNTY, and the presence of litigation in the courts initiated against him by JOHF WILLIAMS indicates they were probably of about equal starding in the Colony at that period.

But one of the most interesting i'ems on the YOHK RECORDS grew out of a suit for as smalt and battery brought by JOHN & ILLIAMS in 1688 against one WILLIAM WAIR, in which WILLIAMS allaged that WIDE had come to his plantation on QUERF'S CHEEK in York County, in his absence from home, and abused his wife. Unfortunately the record in this suit falls to mention the name of JUHE WILLIAMS wife, bu I have no sort of doubt but what it was MART. The record of the trial appears on page 104 of Vol 8 of the YORK COUNTY RECORDS. On March 26th a jury was empanelled by the Sheriff and returned and sworn, consisting of:

and, as the record says, "wing upon their oaths returned their verdict that they find for the plaintiff 1000 pounds of tobacco and cask which said verdict is confirmed and ordered that the said WADE pay to the said WILLIAMS, the aforesaid summe of 1990 lbs of tobacco and cask and costs of suit, "etc.

In the trial of this lawsuit two witnesses appeared for JOHN WILLIAMS and gave their version of the unseemly conduct of WILLIAM WATE towards MRS. WILLIAMS. Wade had some horses in the tobacco house of JOEN WILLIAMS and when he appeared on the plantation Mrs. Williams had told him "Thee should turn them out!", wherepon, enraged he abused the lady in the absence of her husband, who had brought the suit. WART HELL aged about 19 years (one of the descendants, of course, of JOHN HELL who had sold the land on CUERN'S CREEK to John Williams' father, more than thirty-five years previously) swore to the details on which the jury rendered its verdict, and declared that WAUE had struck Mrs. Williams with a "tobacco sticke", etc. The other wit ness, ANN ARBOTT (a descendant of CHRISTOPHER ARBOTT, of QUIRT'S CHEEK, whose deed Oct. 11, 1649, had been witnessed by WILLIAM WILLIAMS and JOHN REWHETT - Va. Col. Abo. 24) testified to still greater abuses by WADE of MRS. WILLIAMS, saying he "knocked her down and kicked her out of the house." In these deposition and in the trial of the case of WILLIAMS v. WAIL no mention is made of children, and the conclusion seems reasonable that, when this cause was tried, JOHN WILLIAMS and his wife, had not been long married. This was in the fall of 1628. Between that date and the date of JURN'S death, some twenty years later, their children were born.
They had the following children:

This is the traditional list of their children as it has appear in different accounts of the family. Of each of the above named children there are records available on which we have drawn, but since JOHN WILLIAMS (wife MART KEELING) left no will listing the names of his children the traditional list must be accepted as approximately correct. That there were other children is hardly possible, though it could be; but if so, they have not been identified as belonging on the list. I have often been tempted to believe that there was abother son named ANDOK WILLIAMS (killed in Kentucky by the Indians) whose parentage I could not find, but have concluded he did not belong, at least in the generation with this set.

In attempting to set down inteligently an account of the above eight children of JOHN WILLIAMS and his wife MANY REELING this compiler finds it necessary to dig up facts about JUDGE JOHN WILLIAMS, of GRANVILLE COUNTY and his family, and the EURIONS, his descendants. Under MANY WILLIAMS facts about the GRAVIS FAMILY, of Granville County; under ANNE WILLIAMS data relating to the DANIEL PAULIN, the HARRISON FAMILI, of GRANVILLE COUNTY and something about the HALPTON FAMILIA. (16) SARAH WILLIAMS, I believe, I have not facts about, but ELIZABETH, her sister, was the one who married SAMUEL HENDERSOH, of HABOVER COUNTY, VA., who has already been covered herein.

JOHN WILLIAMS (son of JOHN WILLIAMS and his wife MARY HEYLING) who was probably the oldest son and child, according to the St. Peter's Parish Register (p. 419) was married in December, 1711, to SARAH ENDERSON, the daughter of THOMAS HENDERSON and his first wife URSULA FEELING. (See Chart p. 231). They were the parents of JUDGE JOHN WILLIAMS, born in MET KRY or HANOTER COUNTY, Virginia, perhaps about 1715, who moved to GRAVILLE COUNTY, North Carolina, where he died in 1799. JOHN WILLIAMS (father of JUDGE JOHN WILLIAMS) died in HAWVER COUNTY, VIRGINIA, in 1735, intestate, and JOHN TIME (insband of FRANCES GRAVES) and THOMAS PROSSER gave bond for administration on his estate. JOHN TYLER belonged to an old WOR COUNTY family, and one of his nephews, WILLIAM TYLER, had married ELIZABFER KEELING, a relative of both JOHN VILLIAMS and his wife. There being no will, of course, no children are mentioned, and no record this compiler has ever found, mentions children other than

JUDGE JUNE WILLIAMS, of GRAVVILLE COUNTY, North Carolina. On page 163 Mr. WHITLER, the Historian mays of him: "JOHN WILLIAMS was a native of HANOVER COUNTY, Virginia. In April, 1770, for some real or imaginary cause, while attending court at HILLSECRO (N. C.) he was seized by the Regulators and beaten by them. He was one of the first judges under the State Constitution in 1777, with SAMUEL SPENCER and SAMUEL ASHE. He was a member of the Continental Congress in 1778. His early education was defective, as he was raised to the trade of a house carpenter. But he was eminently distinguished for his sound judgment and plain cornon sense. He died in October, 1799". JUDGE RICHARD HENDERSON and JUDGE JOHN WILLIAMS were not only first cousins, but double cousins, at the mother of JUDGE WILLIAMS was the mint of JUDGE HENDERSON, and SANUEL HENDERSON (father of the JUDGE) was the uncle of JUDGE WILLIAMS and the brother of his mother. JUDGE WILLIAMS, however, was several years the senior of his cousin HICHARD HETERSON, who studied law in his office, when a young man, when, he, himself, had been practicing law for some years; and also, the wife of JUDGE RICHARD HENDERSON was the step daughter of JUDGE TILLIAMS, she being ELIZABEH ELIZING, the designter of AGNES BULLOCK and her first imsband KELING, also a relative of both the HEDERSONS & the WILLIAMS family.

AGENS BULLOCK, who first married GEORGE REELING, a grandson perhaps of CAPT. GEORGE LEGILLO, of NEW MENT COUNTY, and second, JUDGE JOHN WILLIAMS, was a sister of IEONARD HERITEY EULLOCK and a danginer of RICHARD BULLOCK, the latter having died leaving a will in GRAVVILLE COUNTY,
N. C. in 1666, his children being SARMH (m. SINS), AGENS, WILLIAM (m. TATOR), ZACHARIHA, MATEMLEL, JOHN and LEONARD HERITY BULLOCK. The BULLOCKS, like the REHIERSONS and WILLIAMS came to GRAF-III. JOHN and LEGERAT SULLOCK. The SULLICKS, LIVE the RETIRESONS and WILLIAMS came to GAZI-TILLE COURTY (N. C.) from HAIDVER and HEM RETT COURTISS. The near BULLOCK appears very frequently on the St. Peter's Parish Hegister. According to MR. WHENER, JUDGE WILLIAMS and his wife AGNES had only one child born to them, whose name was AGATHA (named for AGNETA HEELING, daughter of SURGEN KERLING UR.), who married COL. ROBERT SURTON, an account of whose thinly will follow the WILLIAMS FALIUM HISTORY. The town of WILLIAMSCRO, seven miles Test of the town of HEMDERON, I. C., was the home of JUDG JOHN WILLIAMS; (then in GRAVYLIA COUNTY, but now in VALCE). About 1740 the WILLIAMS and HERMERSON, in County to the town of MERCHERSON, in County in the County for the county records there was a NUTRUSH DISTRICT which surrounded it. After the death of JUDG WILLIAMS in 1799, his son in law, COL ADERT HOROUGH memod the place WILLIAMSDOXO, in his memory, Col. Burton fell heir to the Williams property there. The finest race track in the State of North Carolina was located in this community, and many of the State's most prominent leaders resided there.

- (11) SARAH WILLIAMS (born about 1784) was one of the older children of JOHN WILLIAMS and his wife MARY KEMLING. Her name is on the list of children commonly accepted by the family as correct, but this compiler has found no recognizable record as to what become of her.
- (12) NATHANIEL WILLIAMS was born about 1695, probably in TORK COUNTY, VIRGINIA, or in the lower part of New Kent County on the West side of SKINMING CREEK. In 1733 NATHANIEL WILLIAMS, DOE: WILLIAMS and JOHN WHIGHTHOUS witnessed a deed in HANOVER COUNTY, Virginia, from GEORGE MAT-LOCK, Es. to GEORGE MATLOCK, Us., and also a deed from JOHN MATLOCK to his dangiver MARY, then the wife of BENJAMIN JOHNSON. Evidently MATHANIEL at that date (1733) was living in HANOVER COUNTY. The family genealogists ascribe to HATHANIEL WILLIAMS five children:
 - 20) ROBERT WILLIAMS
 - (21) ELIZABETH WILLIAMS
 - JOHN WILLIAMS
 - (23) NATHANIEL WILLIAMS
 - JOSEPH WILLIAMS
- (20) BOHERT WILLIAMS, son of (12) MATHANIEL WILLIAMS, was known in PITTSTIVANIA COUNTY, VIRGINIA, where he spent the latter part of his life, as COL. HOHERT WILLIAMS, and was a COLOREL in the REVOLUTION from PITTSTIVANIA. The following account is taken from Mande Carter Clements' History of PITTSTIVANIA COUNTY, Virginia: "HOBERT WILLIAMS and his brother JORPH WILLIAMS set-History of PITTSYLVANIA COUNTY, Virginia: ASSOTY OF PITTELVANIA COUNTY, VIRGINIAN TAINANT WINDLESS AND HIS COUNTY AND AND ASSOCIATION, the daughters of HEDMAS LATER, an early Justice of LUMENFURG COUNTY (Va.), who later noved to MORTH CAROLINA. SAPAH LANGER and HORRET WILLIAMS were married OCCURER 10, 1774 in GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C., and moved to PITTSYLVANIA COUNTY to live, settling near SANDY CREEK, of BANGISTER RIVER. Here he practiced his profession of law and served as Commonwealth Attorney for both PITTSTLVANIA and HENRY COUNTIES. He died in 1790." He left no will, but in 1799, some nine years after his death there was a division of his estate, in which the children, then living were mentioned. This list of children is not in agreement with the list that appears on the chart of the family gotten up by some genealogist, which is evidently wrong, since it says that a drughter POLLY married HOW. MAT-THEW CLAY, M. C. This POLLY was the daughter of COL. JOSEPH WILLIAM, instead of COL. HOMERY.

The children of (20) COL. ROBERT WILLIAMS, as gathered from the division of his estate in 1799 were:

(a) COL. DER TILLIAMS, whose wife was ELIZABETH and to whom was allotted 617 acres of land, including the Manor plantation on SARDY CREEK.

(b) EATHANIEL W. WILLIAMS, who received 1,540 acres, beginning on the line of one JUNE

THIS and taking in the mill.

(e) SARM THILLIMS, who was the wife of MIGAJAH WATKINS (harking back to SANUEL WATKINS of QUEST'S SERRY in NOR COUNTY, Virginia), who received two tracts of land, one of 240 acres and another of 1,156 acres: (the genealogical account says she married JAMES CHAMMES, of Halifax County, Virginia). She could have been twice married, but MIGAJAH WATKINS, her husband, was living in 1799 when the estate of Cole Robert Williams was divided.

(d) PATET VILLIAMS, 279 acres, the balance of the lend of the Maser Plantation, 147 acres the mill tract and 168 acres on Cascade Creek. PATET VILLIAMS married JUNY REMET, of Voodlawn, who was a descendant of the MEMET AMAILY, of ACCUMAC COUNTY, Virginia, where MATHAMER VILLIAMS wast' listed on the Quit Ecut Holls in 1704, he being a Great Uncle of Col. Robert Villiams.

(e) FARRIE WILLIAMS, who received three tracts of land, one of 200 acres, one of 296 acres and one of 790 acres.

From the CLEMENTS HISTORY of PINTSILVANIA, p. 153, the following note relating to the identity of JOHN HENRY, who married PATSY WILLIAMS is taken!

> "Another HERET FAMILY of PITTSTLVANIA COURTY, was that of JAMES HENRY, of ACCOMAC COUNTY, who owned large bodies of land there. HENRI, OT AUGUSTA COUNTY, WHO OWNED LARGE SOURCE OF ACROSS ON 19,000 across of land at that time. JAMES HENRY Is said to have been a grandson of ALMIANUES and JAME SHERRY TO REHIT, grandparents of PARTICE HENRY; he married SARAH SCAEDOROUGH and had some JUHN, CHARLES and probably others. JOHN HEARY was settled on the PITTSYLVANIA lands which lay in the Eastern part of the county, and he called his home "WOODLAWM". The house is standing today and the interior woodwork is elaborately carved. The garden laid off in terraces, is called a "falling garden".

HUGH HERRY, who married MARY DOWNLOON, sister of COL. JOHN DOWNLOON, was also from this ACCOMAC COUNTY family and a brother of JAMES HERRY, the father of JOHN of WOODLAVE, who married PATSY, the daughter of COL. HORSET WILLIAMS.

- (21) ELIZABETH WILLIAMS. The compiler has been unable to find any identifying record of this daughter of MATHANIEL WILLIAMS. An ELIZABETH WILLIAMS is listed by the family genealegist as a daughter of COL, ROMERY WILLIAMS, and an account of her family, but the compiler believes that she was MILLAMENT, a constitution, daughter of HENRY WILLIAMS and grand-daughter of DANIEL, who lived in CASWELL COUNTY (See p. 196).
- (22) JOHN WILLIAMS (son of (12) NATHANIEL WILLIAMS) was known as COL. JOHN WIL-LIAMS. He was a COIONE in the HYPOLYHOIR from HILLERBORD, N. C., according to one account, He was a first cousin of OOL JAMES VILLIAMS, who was killed at KIRGIS MOUNTAIN and also a first cousin of JUDGE JOHN VILLIAMS of GRANVILLE COUNTY. He was not a lawyer. He married ELIZABETH WILLIAMSON, a member of a prominent North Garolina and Virginia family. The family genealogist has confused him with his locatin the Judge, as to dates, and says that he died in 1799, which is error, as he left will in CAMPELL COUNTY in 1805, which was probably the year of his death. (See p. 195.) In his will he mentions his wife HITST and children DUKES, EFFST CHAYPE and HITSTERM AUTHORS. RETTA SINESON. DUES WILLIAMS was the son MARMADUES, who was a member of Congress from North Carolina, who merried the widow of a HARRYS, who had been AGRES PATES. I have been unable to find a correct list of the children of COL. JOHN WILLIAMS prepared by any genealegical account, but have concluded after investigating the entire record available that COL. JOHN WILLIAMS and his wife ELIZABETE WILLIAMSON had the following children:

 - (f) ROERT WILLIAMS (b. 1768) (g) JUEN WILLIAMS (d. in CHATHAM COUNTY N. C. 1816) (h) MARMATURE WILLIAMS (d. in ALARAMA 1850). (1) GEORGE WILLIAMS (d. CRATHAM COUNTY N. C. 1833). (j) KLIZABETH WILLIAMS m. AZARIAH GRAVES

FROM WHEELER'S HISTORY: MARMADUKE WILLIAMS was born in CASMELL COUNTY, N. C. on April 6, 1772, and married AGRES (PAINE) HARRIS, a widow in 1798. In 1802 he was elected to the State Senate, and the next year elected to Congress to succeed his brother, BOHERT WIL-LIME who was appointed by President Jefferson, Governor of MISSISSFPI. Be remained in Congress until 1809. In 1810 he moved to ALMRAM, settled in TUSCATORA COUNTY, and was a delegate from that county to the Convention which formed the Constitution of that State. In 1882 he was elected a Judge of TUSCALOCSA COUNTY, ALMRAMA. He died October 29, 1850.

(f) ROBERT WILLIAMS, who served in Congress from North Carolina and served as Governor of the Territory of Mississippi, was born in PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY, Vitginis, in the year 1768. His father, COL. JURN WILLIAMS came to what is now PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY in 1748 and settied on lands adjoining JAMES BANIES, a brother of JOHN DATHES who had married ANNE Williams, his father's sister. Their names appear on the tex lists together in 1748-1749 and at other times later. (See Bell's Sunlight on the Southside).

ELIZABETH FILLIAUSON, the rife of COL, JOHN WILLIAMS, of CASWELL COUNTY, North Carolina was the daughter of JOHN WILLIAMSON, of NEW KERT COUNTY, Virginia, and his wife KERECCA CHANGERIANS, and the sister of TEMMAS WILLIAMSON (b. 1708) sho married JUINT FLEMING, daughter of TAMLETON FLEMING. (Bell's Old Free State Vol. ii p. 376). MEDIAS RANDOLFM, of TUCKHON, was her uncle by marriage. The father of COL. JOHN WILLIAMS (MATHANIEL) was born about 1695 and was married by 1715-16, and in 1735 his son JUEN WILLIAMS aboved to Southand County, Virginia, and where in MARCH of that year a suit was brought against him by JUEN DANIEL, which resulted in Daniel laving to give a peace bond. The Frances, Williams and Daniels had moved with JUEN WILLIAMS down into AMERIL, which was later erected into PRINCE EUWARD COUNTY. COL. WILLIAMS EVVED to Borth Carolina and settled in what was then Crange County (now Caswell) sometime between 1768 and 1772. ESORGE WILLIAMS and JUEN WILLIAMS, sons of COL. JUEN WILLIAMS of CASWELL COUNTY, noved down into CHATHAM COUNTY, where they both died. (See p. 199). Both of them sarried into the CEUTCHTIELD FAMILY, from RPOTTSHIVANIA COUNTY. HERY CRUTCHTIELD died in CHATHAM in 1787 leaving will. He was related to STAPLETON CRUTCHTIELD and these CRUTCHTIELDS were kin of the BANIEL FAMILY from

(23) NATHANIEL WILLIAMS (Son of NATHANIEL) married, and is said to have had three children. There is some indications that he moved to LOUISIAMA, where his nephew the HOW, ROBERT TILLIAMS, former Gevernor of Mississippi died and was buried on his plantation near the town of KONROE, in 1835s. Nathaniel Williams is credited with two sons, HORETT and NATHANIEL WILLIAMS and aduptor MIZABITE, who is said to have married a man named SALIMATE.

(24) JOSEPH WILLIAMS. This paragraph and the data that follows has reference to the JOSEPH WILLIAMS, son of NATIANTEN WILLIAMS. He say be identified more particularly as the "SHALLOW NOOD" JOSEPH WILLIAMS who was the ancestor of the WILLIAMS MANIET OF TERMISSES, particularly those who settled and lived at KROLVILLE. From what is known as the "LOGAN MANUSCRIPT", published in Vol. III of the Joseph Rabershem Chapter D. A. R. of Georgie, page 111 appears the following note, which refers to this particular JOSEPH WILLIAMS.

MAJ. JOSEPH WILLIAMS, a cousin of COL. JAMES WILLIAMS, killed at KING'S MOUNTAIN, was the youngest son of MATEATIE! WILLIAMS, the emigrated from Wales (sic) to HANDVER COUNTY, Va. JUSTEY Lost his father when he was 15 years old, and was taken care of by a nemesake, and kinsman, JOSEPH WILLIAMS, a merchant of WILLIAMSDER, Granville County, N. C. JOSEPH WILLIAMS settled at the SHALLY NORD of the MAIRIN before the Revolution, and died in Angust, 1827, his widow surviving until 1832. The following is a letter from his son ALKANNER WILLIAMS, of CHERYLLIE, TRANSSEE, written June 28, 1845, this being the postscript:

"I expect I received a letter from the same gentleman you speak of, from Beltimore, MR. LVMAN C. HRAFER, who wishes to know something of my father, and particularly as to the battle between the WHIGS and WORLES fought near SHALLOW FORD of the YADKIN, at which battle my father headed and commanded the WHIGS. It is a little singular, history has never named this battle, although nearly 100 forles were killed and only one Whig lost his life. A. W.

From the postscript of the above letter it will be observed that MAJOR JOSEPH TILLIAMS (son of NATHANIEL) was partly, if not mostly, raised at WILLIAMSROED in GRAF-VILLE COUNTY, N. C. by his cousin, a JOSEPH VILLIAMS. This JOSEPH VILLIAMS (the cousin) was the son of DANIEL VILLIAMS and his wife USSULA HENDERSON, (See Henderson Chart p. 232). This store at WILLIAMSROED (then called NUTBUSE) was for a time known as the VILLIAMS & BURTON store, the BURTON being either COL. HERRIT BURTON, son in law of JUDGE JURE WILLIAMS, or his father HUTCHINS BURTON. This information discloses therefore that there were TWO JOSEPH WILLIAMS, pompinent merchants in this section of North Carolina; the JOSEPH, of GRAFVILLE (NOW TANCE) at HUTBUSH OF WILLIAMSROED, and the HAJ. JOSEPH WILLIAMS, merchant at the SHAILON FORD, on the TAKEN.

Since this MAJ, JOSEPH WILLIAMS of "Smallow Ford" was a brother of COL. ROBERT TILLIAMS, later of PITTSTUANTA COUNTY, VIRDINIA, it is clear that they were the two partners in business, COL. ROBERT WILLIAMS owning an interest in the store on the fadken before he married SARAH LAWIER (daughter of THOMAS LATIER, of CHANVILLE COUNTY) and moved back to Virginia and established himself as a lawyer in PITTSTLYANIA COUNTY. MAJ, JOSEPH WILLIAMS, his brother, married REBECCA LANIER, sister of SARAH. But what further complicates this entangling relationship of these two brothers to the family of THOMAS INNER is the fact that SARAH LABER before she married COL. HOBERT WILLIAMS, had married COL. JOSEPH WILLIAMS, of CRANVILLE COUNTY, the merchant of NUTBURN OF WILLIAMS, whether COL. JOSEPH WILLIAMS, the merchant of NUTBURN widow TILLIAMS, COL. ROBERT WILLIAMS, Whether COL. JOSEPH WILLIAMS, the merchant of NUTBURN and his wife SARAH LANIER left children by their marriage, has not been ascertained. On page 237 is given a list of the children of COL. ROBERT WILLIAMS and SARAH LANIER.

NOTE OUT OF PLACE: HOW. MARMADUKE WILLIAMS, son of COL. JOHN WILLIAMS, of CASWELL COUNTY, N. C., was twice married. His first marriage was to EDT HARRIS in 1790, who was the mother of CHBISTOPHER HARRIS WILLIAMS, the father of JOHN SHARP WILLIAMS, of MISSISSIPPI. (p. 197).

(24) JOSEPH WILLIAMS. (This was MAJ, JOSEPH WILLIAMS, the merchant of SHALLOW FORD, on the YADRIN) . In the marriage bond of JOSEPH WILLIAMS and RESECCA LANGER in GRANVILLE COUNTY, with JOHN HERIERSON as the bondsman, he is called JOERH WILLIAMS and HEREUZA LANIER in GRAVVILLS COUNTY, with JOHN HERIERSON as the bondsman, he is called JOERH WILLIAMS. The bond is dated September 11, 1772. They were probably married when he was living in GRAVVILLS COUNTY and employed in the store of WILLIAMS & BURRON AT NUTEUSHA, and his cousin, JOERH the merchant, being then living and much the oldest, was perhaps known as JOERH WILLIAMS SR. In CLEMENT'S History of PITTSILVANIA COUNTY, Joseph Sr. is designated as COLONIA, which title was later conferred on JOERH JR., following the revolution, or before its close. (See p. 215 for the record of the JOSEPH JE., following the revolution, or before its close. (See p. 216 for the record of the marriage bond referred to).

The SHALLOW FORD, where JOSEPH WILLIAMS was in business, was evidently in HOWAN

COUNTY at that time, if not now. The WILLIAMS FORE in addition to being called at the SHALLOW FORD must have been on a little stream called "PANTHER CREAK" also. It is described in one place as "on the old Shallow Ford road, out of WINSTON-SALEM". Anyway we picked up what purports to be an old family BIRLE HECORD of the children of COL. JOSEPH WILLIAMS and his wife HERECCA LANKER, which gives a list of their children with dates of birth, etc., and which names, dates & other data seems to harmonize with the names of the known descendants and children gathered from other sources, histories, etc., and which is copied below:

Here are a few brief facts about the above children of COL. JUSTER WILLIAMS, the SHATTOW FORD merchant:

(30) ROBERT WILLIAMS (b. July 12, 1773) is said by one writer to have been born in Lai LLI COUNTY, N. C. Bat he was NOT a "Member of Congress from North Carolinna" as has been standed by some of the genenlogists. That ROBERT wis his first cousin and the son of COL. JURN FILLIAMS, and was born in PRINCE EUWARD COUNTY, Virginia in 1768. This ROBERT WILLIAMS come to TEXAS as a pioneer in a very early day and some of his descendants are still living in that State.

(31) JOSEPH WILLIAMS is said to have married SUSAN TAYLOR and was perhaps the

JOSEPH who was Clerk of SURRY COUNTY, N. C. The genealogists give him three children, SUSAN, RE-

BECCA and JOHN T. WILLIAMS.

(32) JOHN WILLIAMS (b. Jan. 29, 1778) was the distinguished JOHN WILLIAMS, who settled in KNOXVILLE, TERMESSEE, and married MALINNA WHITE, desighter of GEN. JAMES WHITE, on whose lands the original town of KNOXVILLE was built. He was a distinguished member of the bar of the State of Tennessee, United States Senator, a Judge, and Minister at one time to GUATRIMIA. His brother THOMAS LANKER WILLIAMS was also a distinguished Tennessee larger. The following statement is copied from a widely quoted TENNESSEE History:

> "Col. John Williams was one of the pioneer lawyers of East Tennessee, but his career as a politician eclipsed his legal career. He served as a member of the General Assembly, as a United States Senator, and was sent as minister to Guatemala by President Adams. He was a brother of THOMAS L. WILLIAMS who rather excelled him as a lawyer. He was most courtly and fascinating in his marners, and although not an eloquent speaker, possessed a wonderful personal magnetism."

From various sources, including the WHITE FAMILY BIBLE we know that COL. JOHN WILLIAMS, of Knoxville, Tennessee, had the following children:

February 1, 1786; was graduated from the University of North Carolina in 1806; member of the Ecuse of Commons 1813-1914; elected to the Fourteenth, and to the thirteen succeeding Congresses and served from Harch 4, 1815 until his death; received the title of "Tather of the House"; died in Washington, D. C., February 23, 1842; interment in PANTHER CREEK COMPUTERY, in SURRY COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA."

(35) THOMAS LANTER WILLIAMS was a twin of Hon. Lewis Williams, and with his brother U. S. Senator JOHN HILLIA'S practiced law and carved out a career in TENNESSEE.

- (13) DANIEL WILLIAMS (Son of JORE WILLIAMS and his wife MARY MEELING) was born, as near as can be estimated about 1897. He married URBULA METUREROF, who was the daughter of THOMAS MERUREROF and his wife by his first marriage, URBULA METURE, daughter of CAPT. GRORGE RELLING, of MEW REST and his wife URSULA FIREING. URSULA RETLING was a sister of MARY REPLING who married JOHN WILLIAMS and was the cant of DANNER WILLIAMS. NATEL WILLIAMS settled in EUROPEE DISTRICT in GRANVILLE (Now VANCE) COURTY somewhere around 1740. He died leaving a will in CRANVILLE COURTY dated in 1759 in which he mentioned the following childrens

 (63) JOSEPH VILLIAMS. This is the COL. JOSEPH JILLIAMS merchant of NUTSUAR and partner
- in the firm of WILLIAMS & BURTON at what is now WILLIAMSBORO. He married SARAH LANIER, the desighter of THOMAS LANTER, who, after his death, married his cousin COL. ROBERT WILLIAMS, of FITT-
- STITANIA CUNITY, Virginia, an eminent lawyers. POILY, demphrer of JUSEPE m. HUE. MATTER CLAY.

 (64) INNIEL WILLIAMS, who merried his first cousin ANN HERMESSON, the demphrer of SAMUEL
 HENDERSON and his wife KIZABFER WILLIAMS. They had a according to a femily genealogist) the
 following children SAMUEL, DANIEL, JUSEPE, RICHARD, WILLIAM, DAVID, RETST, HANCE, NUTT and a POLLY WASHER WILLIAMS. After the death of her first husband, ARN (HENDERSON) WILLIAMS married on the PACOLET, in SOUTH CAROLINA, one ADAM POTTER. No children mentioned by this last marriage. (See page 227 herein).
- (13) NATIFE VILLIAMS was living in HARCVER COUNTY, Virginia, as late as 1735, for in an old, old record book in that county this writer found that on September 2, 1735, DARIEL SILLLAIS sold to WILLIAM GOOGE land that had been granted to him in 1734, lying in ST. MARTIN'S PARISE in HANOVER COUNTY.
- (14) JOSEPH WILLIAMS (Son of JOHN WILLIAMS and his wife MARY MEELING) was born in YORK

COUNTY, Vinginia, about 1899.

Bombtless JORRES WILLIAMS, like the other members of this femily, lived for a time in HAN-Bountless JOSEPS WILLIAMS, like the other members of this family, lived for a time in Hap-OVER COUNTY, Virginia, but as early as 1749 he was living in LURMENSING COUNTY, which as it was then constituted took in a lot of Territory, and his name appears next to that of COL. VILLIAM RAB-DOLFH on the tythe list for that year. (Bell's Sunlight on the South Side). In the year 1764, he was living in what is now MECKLENERGS COUNTY, VIRGINIA, and his lands, consisting of 795 acres joined the lands (1029 acres) belonging to THOMAS WILLIAMSONS orphane, one whom (ELIZAMEN)) had married his nephew COL. JOHN WILLIAMS, of Caswell County, N. C. This writer is not sure of the names of all his children, but from an examination of these old records he thinks he was the father of the following:

DANIEL, JOVES, DAVID, LEWIS, GILES and a number of other persons of the name of WILLIAMS appears on these same tax records contemporaneously with JOSEPH and his children, most of whom, it may be assumed were probably cousins of the children of JUHN WILLIAMS and his wife MANY KEEL-ING, but it is impossible to positively identify each one and place him where he belongs. Some may belong on this list and some may be on the list that do not belong there, but I am quite sure that (71) NATEMSTEM (73) DNES belong, and am pretty sure the others the

- (16) MART WILLIAMS (Describer of JUHN WILLIAMS and wife MARY MEELING) born about 1702-3 in TORK COURTY, Virginia, married HERRY GRAVES, a member of an old TORK COURTY FAMILY, which came originally from ACCOURT COUNTY on the "LASTERN SHEET" OF VIRGINIA, and which was very highly connected, including a relationship with SHPT, JUHN FIRST, Governor of Virginia, and a younger brother of LOHD DELATARE who first settled at "WISTOVER" on the SAMES RIVER. In writing the story of the CRAYES FAMILE the writer finds it necessary to review a great deal of material accumulated about the early families in YORK COUNTY in order to show their connections. Members of this GRAYES FAMILY were memerous in GRAYVILLE COUNTY, and they, like the HENNERSON and WIL-LIAMS FAMILIES lived for a time in HANOVER.COUNTY, VIRGINIA. The name of HENEY GRAYES and his wife MARY (WILLIAMS) appears on the records of HANOVER COUNTY, VENCINIA, in the year 1734-5, and they probably came to GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C. about the same time as the HERDERSONS and others came there, somewhere around 1740 to 1745. Nobody uppears to have the correct or positive date of their advent into North Carelina.

This ORAVES FAMILY will be taken up separately under its own heading, as one of the interesting old families of CHANVILLE COUNTY. NORTH CAROLINA.

(17) ELIZABETH VILLIAMS (Dementer of JUEN WILLIAMS and wife MARY KEELING) married one SAMUEL HENDERSON, and an account of this family has already been presented in this work, so that it will not be necessary to go into it again.

THE BURROW PARTLY OF GRAHVILLE COUNTY

One of the most interesting as well as prominent persons who was identified with the History of Colonial CHANVILLE COUNTY, was COL. ROBERT BURROW. The following brief but accurate mention of him is made on page 517 of the CONCHESSIONAL DIRECTORY (1774-1911):

HORERT BURTON was a Delegate from NORTH CAROLINA; born in MECKLENBURG COURTY, VIRGINIA, OCT. 20, 1747; moved to GRABVILLE COUNTY, N. C. in 1775; served in the Revolutionary Arty, and atthe rank of COLCHEL; sat in the Continental Congress in 1787-1788; member of the Commission which established the boundary line between North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia in 1801: died in GRANVILLE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, MAY 31, 1825.

COL. ROBERT BURION married AGATHA WILLIAMS, the only daughter of JUDGE JOHN WILLIAMS and AGHE BULLOCK, the widow of GEORGE MINING, in GRANVILLE COUNTY, North Carolina, on OCTOBER 12.

1775. (Ya. Mag. of Hist. & Biog. p. 55, Yol. 28).
THE BURTON FAMILY to which COL. ROBERT BURNON belonged come from YORK and ACCOMAC COUNTY, VIROIBLE, and later settled in HERRICO COUNTY (See p. 20 of this Book). They were related to the HUMT FAMILY, which also had its representatives in GRANVILLE COUNTY, in the person of MENUCAN HUNT and his family (Page 74).

FILLIAM HIST, of CHARLES CITY COUNTY, Virginia, married TABITHA EDICE of an early Virginia Eigration, and had SECREA, JOHN, WILLIAM and MARY HUNT. MARY HUNT married May 15, 1695, ACERT MINGE, by whom she had daughter TABITHA and MARTHA MINGE. TABITHA MINGE (Whose grands ther was MANDEA HARRISON, a daughter of ROBERT HARRISON OF GUENN'S CHEEK IN TORK COUNTY, Virginia) married HUNCHINS BURTON. RUTCHINS SURTON was the son of NOLL HUNT SURTON and his wife JUDITH ALIEN. The children of SOLL HUNT SURTON HUNCHINS, JOHN, JOSTAN, FARRAT, HENDAMIN and ALIEN SURTON. The children of the son HUTCHINS BURTON and TASITHA MINGE WERE RENAMIN and an ALIEN CORDOS (Departs of RUTCHINS CORDOS HORSE). SURTON SURTON HOT HIS CHIPCHINS SURTON, SOLL HUNT HURTON, ROCKET BURTON (m. AGATHA FILLIAMS), JAMES MINGE SURTON, MARTHA SURTON and MARY SURTON.

ANOTHER WILLIAMS NOTE: COL. JOSEPH WILLIAMS, the merchant of NUTEUSH DISTRICT in GRAE-WILLE COUNTY, N. C. was the first instand of SARAH LANIER, daughter off THOMAS LANIER, who after - wards married COL. RECERT FILLIAMS OF PITTSTIVANIA COUNTY, VIRGINIA, & cousin of her first husband by whom she had several children listed at the top of page 237. But by her first husband, Oli-FORTH WILLIAMS OF SUTSUME, GRAWVILLE COUNTY, she had a designter FOLLY WILLIAMS, born JUNE 16, in the Fear 1770, who on December 4, 1788 married HOM. MATTHEW CLAY, of HALIFAL COUNTY, Virginia, who Was a revolutionary soldier and a member of COMCRESS. Her oldest son, CLEMENT C. CLAY moved to MRCAVILLE TRATESEES and later to HUNTSVILLE, ALARAMA, where he become a UNITED STATES SEVARCE, and his son Hone C. C. CLAY also become a UNITED STATES SEVARCE from ALARAMA and a member of the COS-FEDERATE CONCRESS from that STATE.

AGATHA WILLIAMS, daughter of JUDGE JOHN WILLIAMS, of GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C. and his wife AGES (BULLOCK) KEELING, according to the family BIBLE was born OCTOBER 6, 1757, and died in 1831. ROBERT BURTON and AGATHA his wife had the following children:

AGRES BULLOCK, widow of GRORGE EXELING, and later wife of JUDGE JOHN WILLIAMS had by her first husband, EXELING, daughters ELIZABETH EXELING, who married JUDGE RICHARD HENDERSON; AND EXELING who married THOMAS SATTERWHITE in 1772, and FRANCIS KEELING, who married a RIDLEY.

THOMAS SATTERWHITE and his wife ANNE KENLING were the parents of EDWIE, HORACE, PEGGY & HANCY SATTERWHITE.

FRANCIS KITELING and her husband RIDLEY were the parents of JAMES, ROBERT, FRANCES and PULLY RIDIEY.

THE GRAVES FAMILY OF GRANVILLE

In his will in CASTELL COUNTY in 1805 COL. JOHN WILLIAMS mentions only three of his children (p. 196) though he had at least SII (See p. 237, in which the name of his daughter HERRIETTA SIMPSON was omitted by error). HETST, or ELIZABETH, married AZARIAH CHAVES. This AZARIAH CRAVES WAS a grandson of HERRY WEITE GRAVES and his wife MARY WILLIAMS and MARY WILLIAMS was the munt of COL. JOHN WILLIAMS of CASWELL COUNTY, N. C. and the sister of his father NATHANIEL WILLIAMS.

The lineage and family history of the GRAVES FAMILY of GRAVVILLE, CAUVELL and CHATHAM Counties, NORTH CAROLINA is very interesting and dates back to one THOMAS GRAVES who came to VIRGINIA and settled in ACCOMAC and NORTHALPTON COUNTIES, before the latter County was exected out of the former. He is said to have arrived in VIRGINIA before 1630, and appears to have had at least THREE CHILDREN:

- RICHARD GRAVES
- (2) RALPH GRAVES

The descendants of RICHARD GRAVES were perhaps as numerous as those of his brother RAIDE GRAVES, but this compiler has not attempted to identify and follow them. Their names on the record are accounted for as his descendants, when they do not apparently belong with those of his brother RAIPH. Doubtless there were many of them in MORTH CAROLINA, among them, doubt-less being THOMAS CHAYES of SPOTTSTIANIA COUNTY, Virginia, who is known to have come there & who was NOT a descendant of RAIPH.

ANN GRAVES, describer of THOMAS GRAVES and sister of RICHARD and RAIPE GRAVES become the wife of the celebrated MEV. WILLIAM COTTEN, of ACCOUNT COUNTY, WERGINIA, whose sister married CAPT. WILLIAM STORM, who become GOVERNOR OF MARYLAND. VERLINDA COTTEN, the daughter of MEV. WILLIAM COTTES married THOMAS BURDETT and eventually settled in CHARLES COUNTY, MARYLAND, where COV. THOMAS STORE sought refage in his old age after a hectic career in Maryland Politics and a narrow escape from the wrath of the second or third IORD RALFIMONS and his crowd. The EURDETTS and HARRISONS of MARYLAND intermarried and the name VERLINDA is perpetuated in both families.

DANIEL. I want to make a correction in the note on page 213 about the DANIEL FAMILIES OF GRANVILLE COUNTY. All that is said in that note is correct except that the JAKES DANIES who married ELIZABETH WOODSON was not supply of coordinate. The SHERIFF of GOOCHLAND was still another JAMES DANIEL (my wife's ancestor) who married JEAN KELSO. All of his sons except one moved to GREATE COUNTY, GEORGIA, and all THREE of his some married CURNINGHAMS and one of his daughters married SAMURI CONNINCHAM. There were in fact FIVE or SIZ JAMES DANIELS in COOCHLAND, AMELIA and PRINCE EDWARD and I will attempt to identify all of them when I take up the story of the DANIEL FAMILY in its proper place in this book.

Further proceedings of interest in this connection is shown on pages 27 and 28 of the same record above quoted in 1687, where a deed is recorded from JUNIER WHITE to ED-WHID JUNIERIES to property on ST. ANDREWS CREEK in York County, including a tract of land on which there was a mill. This deed is interesting on account of the names of the wit access who were HEV. BOWLAND JONES (minister of BHUTEN PARISH and kinsman of GIDEON MACON and the GOOCH FAMILY of GRANVILLE COUNTY), JOHN GAILOR and WILLIAM SHERWOOD (Distinguished conly lowyer of YORK and JAMES CITY COUNTY). I have found another copy of an abstract of the will of TAURE WILLIAMS, of GRANVILLE COUNTY (other than the one previously mentioned) in which, in addition to the sons HENRY, JUHN, JAMES, JOERPH and DANIEL (who married ANN HENDERSON) there Siler appears the manes of two daughters MARY MILIAMS who married a MICRELL, and MARIA
FILLIAMS who married a man named GOODMAS. On page 227 there is a note which says that MARY HES-TERSOY, doughter of SAMUEL HENDERSON married a JCAB MITCHELL, his brother probably married MARY.

From the records of the TORK COUNTY COURT quoted on the preceding page that on MARCE 26, 1688 (7) RAIPH GRAYES was then deceased and she had died while a minor, unmarried. In order to give the reader an idea of the DAWIEL FAMILY it is necessary to go back again to the same old neighborhood in YOR COURT from whence came the various other families mentioned in the Hammann and VILLIAMS femily history. To me the facts unfolded in my investigation of these femilies sound like a veri-CHIVER COMPULE "took over" in Regland and in a generation or two developed into liberty-loving imericans, took root in the soil of this new country and become the ancestors of a rase of people of the purest Anglo-Sexon type, who have played important roles in the establishment of American calture and American ideals unequaled in any other part of the world.

This compiler does not "go very strong" on the coat of arms type of genealogy, but believes a family does mighty well to keep or find and accumulate a record of facts showing its original ancestor in this country, if it is really of the old stock. The stereotyped or timecan genealogical tables that trace (?) families back to "Villiam the Conquerer", King Ogg, the much maligned "Stuarts" and all that sort of rot are not worth the time it takes to copy them. In the days of all those "Visitations" one finds quoted so often in so-called MCLISH references, people ways of man whose finding one find moved so diven in so-cattled administ references, people were just as vain and ambitious to connect with the much vanited mobility as they are today, and a lot of those tables were pure "burk". All this is a preface to what I am about to say about the origin of the DANIEL FAMILY.

Any good history of EVHAND a 11 probably contain the name and some reference to the celebrated SANTE, Poet, Jurist and erabwhile Changer on at the Court of St James, away back in the decades preceding the rice of COMMENL. He was a HISTORIAN of Some note, an escapted and a kind of "Royal Treabedour" to the reigning dignituries. The family to which he belonged was "seated" at MANNION, ENGLAND, a town of some little consequence in DORSETSHIES, not so very far was "served and act, a specie, a seek of some little consequence in localization, not so very far each of REINCOL. It is an old town. I suppose at one time it was just a castle with some be-booted overlord with a title, invary on old note says there was a NOGER DANTEL on the Dombsday Book, or whatever that was. Maybe the BANIEL EMMILI of Tournton come from his family, if he had one. Somebody has tried to make them out JETS, from FRANCE, who originated from "Daniel in the Lion's Den". Pure rot. In my files I have the material that will convince any reasonable person that the ROME DANIEL who settled in VIRGINIA before 1650 belonged to a family of the name from BRISTOL, ENGLAND, which came there from TAUNTON. That is all I can prove, but that is all I want to prove. I am descended from those DANIKIS on the maternal side. They were the DANIKI who lived in GRANVILLE COUNTY. N. C.

MOGER NAMEL came to VIRGINIA with his "known kinsman" MILES CARY, from ERISTOL, in Indiano. The "quote" is from the "VIRGINIA CARYS" one of the really fine genealogical works of the last century and absolutely dependable, so far as the author could go with the lights before him, but anyway it is the last word so far as the CART FAMILE is concerned. Just how BOGER DATIES was related to MILES CART we will never know. If there is a record it is in REGIAND and I don't ever intend to must for it. I don't care. But that a son of ROGER DANIES married ANDE CART, one of the daughters of MILES CARY the enigrant I am quite sure. The book does not give this. It of the dangerers of Miles that the enternal I am quite sure. He book when not probably never married ". The author had no record and no facts on which to base any other statement. Three mandred years is hard to bridge with scant material, when one wants to be absolutely accurate. The first CARTS and their kinsmen the DANIELS located in WARWICK COUNTY. Leter generations of both families shifted around a bit, but usually where there was a member of one of the families, a member of the other would show up. This happend in FRINCE EDWARD COUNTY, Va., where JAMES DANIEL settled and died in 1763. I Quote;

> WILLIAM CARY: "The immigrant's youngest son, "the miller" was established on a plantation his father had acquired on the North end of MULHERRY ISLAND at the mouth of SKIFF'S CHEEK. His grandson (WM. CARY, JR.) responding to the lure of a broader boundary, nigrated to new lands in FRINCE EDUARD, where his descendants have since been scated. — Virginia Carys p. 128.

> 1. To my son JOHN, all lands, houses, etc., but if JOHN should died without issue, to son WILLIAM; if he should die without issue to eldest daughter (not named, but her name was ELIZAREM); but if she should die without issue to youngest daughter MARY.

2. To daughter MARY two silver spoons.
3. To god-son GEORGE BATES, a cowe and calfe.
4. Wife (not named, but her name was MARY) Executrix.

5. If my wife dies, my loving friends MR. BENJAMIN BUCK and MR. EDWARD BRUCE to look after my children.

Witnesses: MARY BRUCK and WILLIAM PINKERMAN.

The probate of the foregoing will was granted to HARHETTINE HOWIE (HOWILL) who, between the death of the testator and the time the will was presented for probate had married HART DATIEL, the executrix and widow. It is likely that the will had been witheld from probate for about two years and that JOEN LANIEL died shortly after the will was written, about 1880-7.

THE BATES FAMILY. The first BATES to arrive in VIRGINIA, so far as any record I can find is concerned, was JOHN HATES, who was a "servent" of AHRAFAN PERSET, who at one time was the wealthlost mum in the JAHESTOWN settlement. JOHN HATES is mentioned as early as 1626. JOHN BATES become a "merchant", and must have been a men of parts. ARRHAM FREET died in 1626 and left a will, in which one of the "overseers" named by him was the HEV. CHEVILLE POOLEY, who had courted CYCELY JORDAN, the early VIRGINIA GLAMOUR GIRL, who had no less than five hasbands and who such her for breach of promise. It so happens that the genealogy or the MATS FAMILY, the descendants of JUEN became intimately related to the JUENAN family afterwards, just as they also intermarried with the WOUNDWIN. The ancestress of the WOUNDWIN is said to have been a MARM. WINSTON. That there is some foundation for this claim is partly supported in reason by the fact that when JOHN BATES died in 1666 in REUTEN PARISH, TORK COUNTY, the witness to his will was WILLIAM WINSTON (BOOK 4, p. 165 MORK COUNTY). Fairfax Harrison, in his admirable story of the SKIDAINO HARRISONS, says that JOHN HARRS was born about 1598 and died in 1666 and that he was a resident of HIDDEFORM (ENUTEM) FARIES at the time of his death. This writer has puriled over the obvious connection of the HATTE FAMILY with the HATTE FAMILY or many years and has at last ferreted out the facts. The name of the wife of JOHN MATTE TANIES will have be known, perhaps, but reasoning the matter from all angles it is not improbable that SARAH WINSTON (show it is claimed was ing the activer room all angles 1 is not improbable that MARAH MINETON (whose it is claimed was the wife of DR. JUEN MOODACH Navy have had a sister who married JUEN RIVES and that they were both sisters of the WILLIAM WINSTON who witnessed the will of RATES in 1666. If so, the connection between the BATES and TOODACHS dates back to 1800 when DR. JUEN is supposed to have arrived in Virginia. ROUET RANKEL, the ancestor of the LATES FILE FAMILIE is believed to have come along not long afterwards, say about 1800 or 1835. I have roked up only two children for JUEN RATES sid his wife, whoever she may have been. They weres

This SAMMEL TALLACE was NOT from PERMISTLYATIA, but belonged to the family of WALLACE that lived on BACK RIVER in MEW POCHOSON in YORK or ELIZABETH CITY COUNTY which was established there by the HEV. JAMES WALLACK in the 17TH CENTURY. SAMUEL VALLACE moved to PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY, Virginia and settled on BUTTALO CREEK where he patented lands and married ESTARR BAKER, a doughter of CALES BAKER. in 1772 he moved to CEARLOTTS COURTS. His son CALES BAKER WALLACE was born in 1742 and in 1782 father and son moved to RESTURY, where CALES BAKER WALLACT became a distinguished JUNGS on the Kentucky Bench. The husband of his dampter MARTHA DANIEL was VINCENT VAUGHAN, a fast gleaned from other sources than the will, and this name harks back to SKIMINO CREM and MEN KENT COUNTY, where, on the Quit Hent Hells of 1704 we find the mass of VINCENT VAUGHAN, probably the grandfather or possibly the Great Grandfather of this particular VINCENT VAUGHAN

The ZADOCK DANTEL family genealogist tells us, as does the will itself, that JOHN WILLIAMS DANTEL had been twice married. That his second wife MART was the widow of JOHN WILLIAMS DANTEL had been twice married. This genealogist fails to disclose the ame of his first wife, when he was the winew of John size. MARY DARIEL, the daughter who married DAVID ROYFER, at the time this will was made is 1785 had three children, who are mentioned is the will: IDET, POLLY and REMECCA ROYFIER, the testator's grandshildren.



This compiler is natisfied from his investigations that all of the MARRISONS in MORTH SAROLINA came originally from VIRGUELA. GEN. PRANCES RUNDER MARRISON in a series of important articles in the Virginia Magazine of History & Hasgraphy, called "MOOVENINA" has given an authorite account of the SIX HARRISONS known to have been the first in Selexial Virginia, which briefly stated were as follows:

My Dear Mr. Ray:

I have this morning received your very kind and most interesting letter, and it gives me great pleasure to enter into a correspondence with one whose ameestors three hundred years ago lived as mear meighbors of my own in Yerk County, Virginia.

First, let me offer several suggestions in explanation of the Barrisons of Echnino, This was undertaken by my brother and myself as a memorial to our father she died in 1904. The material for the biographies of the three generations back of us was collected by me from family letters which I assembled for the purpose from various members of the family.

the genealegical research is XVII and XVIII (empturies) records was done for me by s professional genealogist, our cousin, the late Vilson Miles Cary, who had been living in London and had made considerable investigation of the records there at my sequest for the English provenance of our Queen's Greek Enrisons. (Schming was the name of the Quaker Meeting house which they attended after the middle of the IVIII century. I wanted my brether to call the stock the "Harrisons of Queen's Greek".)

We became rather impatient with the length of W. Cary's research in the English records and decided to go shead without maiting for full proof of the theories them in head -

hence several mistakes, as we later discovered, in the early genealegy.

Those I will indicate as fellows:

(a) There is me proof that Richard Harrison of Queen's Greek, come from St. Vichelas Parish, Colchester - although I have for many years been living in England syself and have in-dulged in such research. I have today so idea whomes Richard Harrison come.

(b) There is no proof of the Remos of the wives of the first three Marrisons (Richard I, Milliam I and William II) of Queen's Greek - they are more surmises and the possibly cor-

rect, are not justified in our book.

My brother felt so chagrined ever this (when we were better infermed) that he declined to distribute the rest of the copies of the Harrisons of Skinine. Then I came back from Furepe last year, my sister in law and I decided to complete the distribution of this book and this has been done to several libraries throughout the country. After all, it was really a biegraphical work, and the genealogy was only insidental to it.

As for the Harrison items on the genealogy, I am satisfied that they are scrapulously

accurate and to be entirely relied on from say 1650 downwards.

So far as I know, of the three soms left by Richard I, Karrison, of Queen's Creek (who died 1864) and the three sons of his brother (?) Robert Earrises who knowed about 1664 from Quoun's Greek to the site of the property now known as "Ringuide" in York County and died there in 1663, there were no MAIS descendants in the third generation except in my even line. I should such like to be corrected if inaccurate in this point - or any other statement I may venture to offer you.

Your opinion that these men Richard I and Rebert were of the third generation in Virgiain is of extreme interest to me at the present soment, since I am engaged in writing a "footnete" on the six or seven Marrisens known to have been in Virginia up to 1634 when the Charter was revoked. So far as I have been able to ascertain, some of them left descendants in Virginia. If you can tell me otherwise I shall not only be emmediagly grateful but take pleasure in giving you due appreciation in my article.

If Hickard I and Rebert of Queen's Creek were of the third generation, and born and brought up in Virginia, that would explain my they sculd not sign their own nemes!

As for Bonjamin I, Harrison, the immigrant and feemder of the family of James River Marrisons, I shall be able to publish me proof of his English provenance waless these who are still working on the records for me in Regland can pather further information. Conditions nessedays over there are, as you can well imagine, exceedingly difficult. One lady who was doing some work for no last year in Morfelk has been beauded out three times. It takes menths to get answers to ordinary questions sent to England. All I could do in an arricle on Benjamin (I) at present is to san up the information in hand and inchalge in "speculations". My only excess for efforing even a speculation at this time would be that I am getting pretty eld syself!

It would not surprise me to find relationship between the Harrisons of Queen's Greek and those of Brandon, since my great grandfather Harrison, of Lynchburg, a contany age used to tell his children that he was "related to the best people on the South side of the Jesses" - but naturally I have mover cared to make use of so vague a statement and have always denied steatly

any such relationship as (to) the Harrisons.

The other Harrison femilies in lewer tidewater to which you make reference are of course of great interest to me, but I cannot make even fairly intelligent comment on them without a good deal of research. Then I left occupied France last year, I was allowed as a special courtery from the Germon High Gommand to bring out one smit case of my papers. I naturally chose my English notes, since I knew I could recepture those relating to Virginia from the records ever

Please forgive the length of this letter and believe me, very glad to be in touch with you, and I should be most grateful for any further information you can give me about my aucosters of Queen's Crock. I am much extertained by year description of the rush of Earrisons all ever the country to get on the hand-magon of Branden and Berkeley. FRANCIS SURTUR MARRISCE (Geveraor General of the Fillipines in the administration of Woodraw Wilson) is a descendant of RIGHAMD HARRISCH (1620-1644) of QUEEN'S CHEEK IN TORK COUNTY, YEIGHTLE. In one of his "Footnotes" (51 %s. Mag p. 160) Gen. Earrison makes public for the first time in 1943 an abstract of the will of a JUFFRET BARRISCH, proved in IOB-DUN, Dec. 17, 1605, in which he mentioned his nother SUSANMA and the following brothers and sisters:

- (1) WILLIAM MARRISON
- (2) ROBERT HARRISON (3) HARMON HARRISON
- 4) THOMASINE CLERE
- (5) ANE HETHOLDS.
- (1) WILLIAM HARRISON (called the oldest brother in the will) left will in LONDON also on May 5, 1634. In his will he mentioned his own shildren, WILLIAM, TOBLAS, SUSAN and MANY and his wife MARY. He also mentioned his two sisters ANN HETNOLDS and THOMASINE CLERE and his brother ROMERT; also leaving a bequest to "my brother's shildren, HORRET and MANTHA."
- (3) HARMON HARRISON is identified as the HARMON who came to VIRGINIA in 1608, and who is supposed to have died shortly after, leaving no issue.
- (4) THOMASINE HAWRISOE had married MR. CLARE or CLEARE, Master of a ship salled the "GIFT OF GOD", which belonged partly to JEFFRET HARRISON, her brother, and which is mentioned frequently in the very early Colonial resords. In 1823 the "GIFT OF GOD" was under a sharter to MOWARD BERNETT of VIRGINIA and was still under the command of CAPT. CLAIRE, her humband
- (5) ANE HARRISON in 1605 was married to WILLIAM REWOLDS, named in the JEFFRET HAB-RISON will as his executor. At that time he had a son NICHDIAS RETROLDS, called the "member" of the testator.

We find WILLIAM RETSOLDS living on QUEEN'S CREEK in TORK COUNTY, VIRGISIA, as early as 1641.

We know that HARMUS HARRISUM come to VIRGINIA in 1608. Hs, also, possibly lived in this neighborhood in TORK.

The YORK COUNTY records show a family of GLEARS living in the county as late as 1887. (Vol. VIII York Records).

AME HARRISON lived on QUEEN'S CREEK, the wife of WILLIAM RETWOLDS.

BORKET MARRISON lived on QUEEN'S CREEK at least as early as 1645, when he had a dispute with JOHN UNDERWOOD. (Wol. II, Tork Resords, p. 49).

RICHARD MARRISON lived on QUEEN'S CREEK (apparently a brother of ROBERT, has early as 1634 when he paid tithes.

Dr. WICHOLAS HARRISON also lived there until his death in 1663. (See page 253).

CAPT. THOMAS HARRISON, who bought lands in this same settlement is mentioned as harly as 1640.

Deed, JUNE 10, 1641. John Bell of Queen's Creek, planter, sells SAMURE WATKINS his plantation and house in QUEEN'S CHEEK, formerly purchased from WILLIAM REFINDLES. Witnesses were George Clarks and William Roberts. (Vol. 1 Tork Records). This was apparently the same lands, or a part of them, which was afterwards sold by John Bell to John Williams, ancestor of the family that afterwards married into the DANIEL and MENURESON FAMILIES of GRANVILLE COUNTY, MERTH CAROLIEA.

The truth of the matter is that the more fact that sertain members of a family are new mentioned on the public resords does not mean they have sensed to exist or never existed. There were many more families maned MARRINON in Jork County than have ever been found on the resords. To say they never existed and were MOT there does not make sense. Hon-contemporaneous records establish that they MUST have been there, in order to account for so many who appeared to have ones been there represented.

TO ILLUSTRATE: In 1645 BORERT HARRISON and JUEN UNDERWOOD were directed by the YORK COUNTY COURT to "agree upon a division of a sropp" of tobacco. Some fifty years later an ARRENT HARRISON was the of no relation to BODERT HARRISON! Considering the sustom and complex of these early families to intermenty with their oldest associated families and their sousins, an almost universal practice among these, a negative answer would not make sense or sound reasonable. So far as the records show BODERT HARRISON had no son or granden massed AVRENT, or "any male descendants of the name of HARRISON after the "HIRD GENERATION." But he could have had a cousin AVDERT MARRISON, the son of a HOTTHER, who in turn, had a son ANDERT. That is probably what happened.

That RICHARD and ROBERT HARRISON were brothers is almost conclusively proven by the fact that ROBERT HARRISON was one of supervisors of RICHARD HARRISON'S will in 1664, with RICHARD'S brother in law JAMES RESOUTH, and the further fast that when ROHERT HARRISON son of BOEERT died his legatees were his "loving friend RICHARD KENDALL and his heirs". This RICHARD KENDALL was the son of JOHN KENDALL and ANNE HARRISON, the daughter of RICHARD. As BOBERT HARRISON was born in 1613 and RICHARD seven years later in 1620, one can see also that these two brothers represented only a piece of a family. Sons and daughters may have been born before ROBERT and also between ROBERT and RICHARD. The were these missing sons and daughters, and who were the perents! Without setual proof the evidence is convincingly strong that they were the some of ROHERT, the brother of JEFFRET HARRISON and of HARMON MARRISON, and of MRS.

ADM (MARRISON) EXTHOLOS, the wife of WILLIAM RETWOLDS, of QUEER'S GREEK. So, after familiarising himself with the extant records of all the HARRISONS in Virginia at this period, and their numerous activities, he concludes that:

His wife was SARAH HUNT, the daughter of WILLIAM HUNT who died in GLOUCESTER in 1688. (ROBERT MINGS, a grandson of ADERT HIRTHOR [613-1669] married MARH HUNT, adapther of a WILLIAM HUNT, probable son of the WILLIAM).  (5) MARTHA HARRISON, Mentioned in the will of her Unels, WILLIAM HARRISON in 1634. We further record.

CAPT. THOMAS HARRISON of the ship HOHOUR, owned by COL. WILLIAM PRYCE, obviously a very close kingman of the children of ROHERT HARRISOE and his wife MARY named in the above list. I am inclined to the view that he was a sousin of ROHERT, JEFFREY and HARMON HARRISON and that he was also the brother of ELLENER HARRISON who was the wife of COL. WILLIAM PHIOR. In fact, in the abstract of COL. PRIOR'S will in TORK COUNTY, he is salled "brother in that but GEN, FRANCIS BURYON BARRISON who has gone to much trouble to investigate the matter, declares that in the EVOLISH VERSION of the will, which he examined, it is revealed that this is a mistake, due to a misplaced exame. CAPT. TSMAS HARRISON'S dates are 1890-1878, which would make him a contemporary of MRS. FRIOR and of the parents of HORRET and RICHARD HARRISON. I regret very much my inability to give a list of his children. It appears that he died leaving a will in which their names are mentioned. Among them was a JOHN HARRISON, who died before his father. This JOHN HARRISON left a son JOHN, who was Master of a vessel riding in NOTE HIS TAINEY. THIS JOHN HAMHIND 19IT A SON JUMN, WHO WAS MASTER OF A YESSEN ITAINE IN JAMES RIVER ON May 15, 1706 and whose mans suppears on a petition presented to the soumeil by a master of other seamen for some purpose. (Executive Journals of Virginia). A later CAPT. THOMAS HARRISON Who patented Lands in SURRY COUNTY with one JOHN SCOTT on ATCHANDING NAMP falling into the HOTTOMAY HIVER, whom I have not positively identified at the writing may have been a grandson also. He was suparently one of the PRINCE GRANGE and HRUNSWICK COUNTY HARRISON ancestors, his daughter ANN HARRISON having married one of the MAMBLISS from TORK COUNTY.

HARMON HARRISON. It is the writer's deliberate conclusion after working for some years on this HARRISON FAMILY, that HARMON HARRISON, son of SUBLINNA, and brother of JERF HARRISON, who came to JAKESTONE ON CHESTOPHER HER Colony at the time), that he married and left shildren and that he was the ancestor of a large number of the HARRISON FAMILIES of VIRGINIA who have been so much trouble to the genealogists for the past hundred years or more. He was the ancestor of JOHN HARRISON who married SARAM DATEL, who settled in and finally died, le wing a will in the County of HALTFAX in VIRGINIA, an abstract of which is on page 255. (*) What the writer is trying to do is to emplain, as near as he can, from whence some the munerous families who settled in GRAEVILLE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, and what become of them, and in this instance, where the Harrisons come from. He knows their encestry was from the South side of the JANES HIVER and that they were related to the MARRISONS of QUEEN'S CHEEK IN TORK COURTY. The records to be drawn upon are very seant. The only record of REMON HARRISON has already been repeated. The names of his shildren and grand-children are simply the work of deduction RASED UPON THE FEW SCART RECORDS available. Pure reason and summon sense has been employed. The hard-boiled genealogist is expected to reject it all and many of them at the same time will adopt as the Gospel truth material that has not a grain of sense to it, when subjested to the light of pure reason. I can prove in hundreds of instances that they are wrong, and shallenge any of them to DISPROVE these records(?).

Here I shall quote from the "Earrisons of Skiming, page 16:

"In 1768 the Harrisons of Skimino became Quakers, and by the marriage of William Marrison, fourth of the name, with Margaret Jordan, there was blended in the blood of his descendants an inheritance of the vigorous and manly character of the Jordans of Hansamond and the Bates of Skimino, who, since 1660 had been leaders among the Friends in Virginia.

referred to in the above quotation.

RICHARD HARRISON was contemporaneous with the children of HARRISON named on the pre-ending page (1630-1664). Both were of the second generation. Therefore, the WILLIAM HARRISON "fourth of the names" who brought the QUENTS GREEN HARRISON into the QUANTES, was of the SINTH GENERATION.

I shall now take up one of my "fragments" from the actual records:

WILLIAM BRESSIE, or BRESSIF, was a QUAKER, who had settled early on LAWRE'S CREEK, on the plantation of CHRISTOPHER LANGE in ISLE OF WIGHT COURTY. In 1674 be was one of the overseers of the will of MAJ. MIGENIAS HILL. He may a planter in SIGE OF WORTH COURT. In 10% a was one or the overseers of the will of MAJ. MIGENIAS HILL. He may a planter in SIGE OF WORTH COUNTY in 1671. He bought lends from SAMUEL HASFKILL on Frorwary 9, 1658. (Isle of Wight Book I p. 21). His wife, SUSANEL JUNES, was the Sixter of REVENUE PARTON in "Middletous Plantation" where the QUELT'S GREEK MARKHOWS lived.

He probably died exacting about 1700, as his will was proved in Isle of

Fight County, June 9, 1701 (Vol. 7, W & M p. 254). Some provisions of his will were:

Certain lands to his brother, WHILIAM HARRISON.

Gertain lands to "my kinesan" JOHN HARRISON (Son of JOHN HARRISON, deceased, and his wife MELECROUSH.)

JOHN HARRISON to be allowed timber off certain lands to construct a dwelling house, etc.

JOHN JORDAN, son of THOMAS JORDAN, lately deceased. Quaker Meeting House at LEVY'S RECE.

My wife SURARRA, my copper still, and after her decease to JURE HARRISCH and WILLIAM HARRISON.

F.om Page 217 of the Valentine Papers: WILLIAM ERESSIE of the UPPER PARISH of ISIE OF WIGHT County, Planter, and SHAMMAH, his wife, give to WILLIAM YARRETT, JOHN GRATES, FRANCIS ERES, EDWARD PANES, THOMAS TOOKS and ELERY WIGGS and the rest of the Servants of God frequently called QUARTES one house built by the said people in the place called INTY HECK old field, near the Greek Side, with ground sufficient for a graveyard and what more may be thought fit, with free egress and for the said people through the said MEESSE'S land. Recorded in Isle of Wight Court by JOHE PIFT. Clerk,

From page 215 of the Valentine Papers: FRANCIS BRESHET of ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY, son of HUGH RESSET of the same County, Flanter, marriage to HILLERST WIGHS, daughter of HERRY WIGHS, Gase above). Witnesses were John Sectt, Backabee Terrell, WILLIAM HARRISCH, Joan Sectt, MARTIE HARRISCH, George Wiggs, Sarah Wiggs and KATHERIEM SCOTT, July 15, 1715.

From same Page: HUGH ERESSET and SARAH BRESSET were witnesses to the mar riage of MATTHEW JOHDAN, of MANSEMOND COUNTY to SUBANNAH BREESET, widow of ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY, March 17, 1702.

From page 658 Valentine Papers: MATTHEW JORDAN, of ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY received a deed to 100 agree in the County aforesaid, known as 1000 MICE, being part of 1050 acres, from WILLIAM HARRISCH, devised to him by WILLIAM BRESSET of said Parish and County. December 23, 1713. On December 28th following SUSANNAN JORDAN, wife of MATTHEW JORDAN and the widow of WILLIAM BRESSEY releases her dower to lands held by WILLIAM HARRISON. Same Page.

We are told that WILLIAM HARRISON (the second) married ANNE HATCHIFFE (Scining Harrisons p. 15); that the third WILLIAM (1705-1771) and his wife MARGARET MURPER had a son WILLIAM (the fourth) who married MARGARET JURDAN, and that this last WILLIAM had a sinter ELIZABETH HARRISON who married WILLIAM RATCHIFFE, and that two of the sons of WILLIAM RATCHIFFE and ELIZABETH HARRISON married demphters of the fourth WILLIAM MARRISON and his wife MARGARET JURDANA. The HATCHIFFE family were QUANTES at the time the second WILLIAM HARRISON (1850-1719) married ANNE HATCHIFFE, if the following record is correct:

Page 738 Valentime Papers (Friends Meeting Records): RICHARD JURDAN, son of THOMAS JURDAN of Churktuck deseased, marriage to REDECCA RATCLIFFS, daughter of RICHARD RATCLIFFS of TRATEGOR HECK married in the house of her father, the sixth month (JURD) in the year 1706. The witnesses were JURE JURDAN, brother ROBERT JURDAN, brother JAMES JURDAN, MARGARET JURDAN, mother, MEM JURDAN, MARGARET JURDAN, RICHARD RATCLIFFS, THAZERFH RATCLIFFS, mother, ELCHARD RATCLIFFS, TOTHER, MURCLIFFS, DOTHER, ELCHARD RATCLIFFS, DECEMBER ACCLIFFS, DOTHER, ELLILAR SCOTT and others.

On page 258 of ENDDIE'S lTTH CENTURY ISLE OF WIGHT we are told that JOHN HARRISON was married to a sister of WILLIAM ERESSIE, a QUANTR, who was an overseer of the will of NICHOLAS HILL, and that SARAH LUCK was a sister of JUHN JENNINGS who married one of the damphters of Maj. HICHOLAS HILL, and owned lands adjoining JUHN HARRISON in ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY HOVERSON (5 1719.

The foregoing items (on this and the page preceding) are set out somewhat in detail by the compiler to show certain things in connection with the MARRISONS who descended from HARRISON HARRISONS.

The will of WILLIAM BRESET discloses that there was an older JOHS HAB-RIGON, then perhaps long deceased (1700), members wife was MELECHOUGH or MYLHOMOUGH. As his son WILLIAM HARRISON was a "brother" of the old QUAKER and contemporaneous with him, he was married and had, perhaps grown sons by 1658, when EMESSET bought lands from SAMUEL HASVELL in that year.

The notes show that both WILLIAM RABRISON and JUHN HARRISON must have married staters of WILLIAM RESISTER, and further show that WILLIAM RABRISON was alive in 1713 when he sold 100 acres of his inherited lands (from REMSSIE) to MATRIES FORDING.

The JUNE HARRISCE who married MILBORDOUR HILL resuld not have been JOHE, the son of RICHARD, (1643-1690) who married MARH HALL, of course and had one lone daughter MARY, who married JUNE MURBARD and a son RICHARD who died in 1722 unmarried.

The WILLIAM HARRISON who married a RESSET and was "called brother" in EMESSET'S will was certainly not the WILLIAM (1650-1719) sho married MARY HUBBARD or MARY EAM, and became the encestor of all of the "Eximino Herrisons".

If what is pointed out so far was ALL the evidence we would not have a pag to stand on. The material evidence is the part that discloses the relationship between these WILLIAM ERRESSY HARRISONS and those of QUERR'S CREEK in YORK COUNTY, which may not be brushed aside or ignored.

JUHN JOHDAN, son of THOMAS JOHDAN, lately deceased, is a legatec under the will. He was a brother of MATHEN JOHDAN, who in 1702 married the widow SURANNAH RESSET, the sister of HEV. ROYLAND JOHES. Also a brother of HOHERT JOHDAN, grandfather of MARGARET JOHDAN who married the fourth William HARRISON of QUEEN'S CHEEK.

In other words JURE HARRISCE (son of HARMOH HARRISCET) had two sons, JURE and WILLIAM HARRISCE who married sisters of WILLIAM RESSET, the QUARTE of LETY MEGE. In one sense they were brother's in law of REV, HOWLAND JUNES, minister of FRUTON PARISE, That brought them mighty close to QUEEN'S CREEK.

They were co-legatess with the JOHNANS of Mansemond and CHUCKATUCK. They were certainly step-some of MATTHEW JOHNAN, great uncle of MARGAMET ited the fromth TILIAM HARRISON of CHEST'S CREEK.

JOHDAN, who married the fourth William Harmison of Queris CHEEK.

They were in the same family circle with the RATCLIFFES who married into the JOHDANS and the HARMISONS of LEVI NECK as well as the HARMISONS of QUERES CHEEK, all of whom were QUAKERS.

They had a brother (evidently) mased MARTIM MARKING, or else MARTIM was a son of either JOHN or WILLIAM (the sons of JOEN and WILEDGHOUH HARRISON. Thus we are able to present from the HECORDS the means of at least two and maybe THREE sons of JOHN HARRISON, acro of HARRISON HARRISON, alive in ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY in 1700, 92 years after the ancestor first some to VIRGINIA.

THESE BHESSET HARRISONS, although so little is said of them on the records were men of substance and importance and the cebo of their lives reverberated in ERAUVILLE COUNTY in its Colainal days. CHLANDO JUHES married MARTHA MADDE, MARRIMA MADDE was the sister of GIDMON MACOU, who married FRISCILLA JUHES, damphter of EUWARD JUNES (p. 43 this book), and enoug the children of GIDMON MACOU and his wife FRISCILLA JUNES was the distinguished MARRISON MACOU.

- 4. ARRAHAM DANIEL was the father of neeveral children, including LECHARD DAN -IML who married a daughter of HENRY GRAVES SR., mentioned on the preceding page.
- 9. JOSIAH BANTEL, another son of JAMES DANTEL of ALBEARRIE COUNTY, moved to GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C. and died leaving a will there in 1811, an abstract of which, giving the names of all his children will be found set out herein on page 213.
- MR. W. S. MORTON, of PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY, VIRGINIA, gives an account of this CHESLEY DANIEL family that makes him the son of another JAMES DANIEL, who was the Sheriff of GOOCHIAND COUNTY, some ten years earlier, and whom he says married ILIZABETH WOODSON. He is mixed up in the matter. First, the Sheriff of GOOCHLAED was not the JAMES who become after wards the SHERIFF OF ALBEMARIE, and the JAMES DAWIEL who married ELIZABETH WOODSON was BOT the Sheriff of GCOCHLAND. The Sheriff of GOOCHLAND was JAMES DANIEL who married JAME KELSO and who died in FRINCE EDWARD COUNTY, VA. In his account Mr. MORTON gives to JAMES DANIEL (Of Good-land) the same children named in the will of the ALEXMANLE JAMES DANIEL in 1861. (See p. 213).

- (13) DAVID BOYSTER. The BOYSTER FAMILY come originally from Eastern Virginia. In the year 1744 JOHN BOYSTEE owned Lands in GLOUGESTEE COUNTY next to a patent to lands taken out by WILSON CARI; and in 1768 JOHN BOYSTEE deeded Lands to HOLBERT FLIAISHEET of "Curles" Lands that had previously belonged to the estate of JOHN WILLIAMS (p. 77 D. B. 1787-1774 of Benrice County). The family was intinate with the FLIAISHEET Settly, from CHARLES CITT COUNTY and with the FLIAISHEET family mentioned in the notes pertaining to GRAFFILE COUNTY FROM PROFILE AND BOYSTEE, whose family mentioned in the notes pertaining to GRAVILLE COUNTY PROFILE PAINT, with his brither WILLIAM BOUFFER, 1974 in MICHIGALURG COUNTY, probably on the South Side of the NOLMOUS, and was well to do, and he and his brother and HIDMAS ANDRESS were assessed 65 tithes by CORNELIUS CARRILL SET Comberland Parish in 1750, apparantly having something to do with the Lands of COL. WILLIAM SIED. All three of them may have been overseers of COLENI. BIRD'S island properties on the MOMBOULE. JACOB ROTELER, the father of (13) DAVID left will at BOURDING bestlemburg County, it is said, which was probated in 1788. His shidten were:

- 11. DAVID ROYSTER, moved to RAINICH, N. C. and was living there in 1800. In one book he is referred to at that period as the "old embinet maker" emming this compiler to believe it possible that the reference was to his father. At any rate, one DAVID, believed by the femily possible that the reference was to his father. At any rate, one Havin, believed by the family to have been il, the sun, had the contract for all woodwork in the State Capitol and all the desks and chairs in the State and Souse. Most of the woodwork was listed to the furniture, as the building - still standing - is built of stone, occlusively. He married UNBAN SINE, the dampter of HILEA SINE, and to have been "of Warren County" though it is known he lived for a shile in the "SUMBURE RECTION" of the present VARUE - then CRANVILLE, near the other members of the SINE family. - 22. JAMES DANIEL ROTSTER, paper Manufacturer of RALBICE, married MERY ASRLET, and had at least two sons, to whom he gave the unusual nesses of VERNORT COMBINITION ROTSTER and ASRLETIAS DELAYARE ROTSTER. They composed the first of A. D. ROTSTER & RO., Sandy Montfacturers, of Re-leigh, E. C. VERNORT COMMICTION ROTSTER married HALLIE LES BURS, dampter of VILLIAM EMBRERSON RICH, E. C. VERNORT COMMICTION RETURNERS MARVES HOW (1782-1875) and his wife RICHARDER HAYD RAY. MRS. RALLIE LES (RICH) ROTSTER was still living in RALBICE in 1936, and some of the valuable mo-

terial she furnished in letters is appended herewith as throwing much light on these various conmeetions.

- 20. WILLIAM ROWARD ROTTER married MARY STEPHES and had seven children, SUSAM, DAVID, JOHN C., SARAH, LEGRARD HERIMREGON, "WILLIAM BURT and MARY HUMAND ROTTER. *VILLIAM RURT ROTPIER married JULIA S. TUTT, and had the following children:

SOME NOTES RELATING TO THE ROYSTERS, DANIELS, HIGHS and BULLOUS FROM LETTERS BY MRS. HALLIE LEE (HIGH) BOYSTER, 1936.

My father was WILLIAM HENDERSOE HIGH, who married AMANDA MALVINA BOYSTER, the twelfth child and youngest of the twelve children of DAVID ROTSTER, JR. and SUSAN SIMS. My father was born March 14, 1820 and my mother in 1826. They were married March 20, 1849. My father was a son of ALEXANDER MARTIE HIGH and his wife MILITARETH KIFF RAY. There were MINE children. Two died in infancy, namely, WIRM MARTIE, the closet, died aged two, from wealtwing a grain of som which lodged in her throat and killed her. HIGM MARRIOT HIGE, the fourth child, died aged 18 months from membranous croup. The second child was WILLIAM HERDERSON HIGE, JR. (my brother Billy), next ELIZARFH HIFF HIGE (sister Bettie; then HEREGGA WARREN HIGH (called Beek), HALLIE LEE HIGH, AUSTANDER HIGH, MADOCK HIGH, GAVIN DHU HIGH and GEDDY HILL HIGH.

All but the last two are meast for Pa's people; (AVIE for old GAVIE BOOG (Pa's friend), and the HBU to add to the Seotch name, GAVIE. GAVIE HIGH was four then named and objected to the "BOOG", so Pa put the HBU in. Sister Bettle was named for Pa's mother, ELEGARETH RIFF RAY SHOH; KECK was called HERECCA WARREN for Aunt ERECCCA HORWOOD (George's mother), who was the sister of my father. Pa's grandmother was RACHEL MARTIE, daughter of WILLIAM MARTIE. Maybe the MARTIN woman, second wife to LEGNARD REGILET BULLDCK was kin to me too. It seems that I am kin to everybody.

ELIZABETH KIFF RAY, who married ALEXANDER MARRIE HIGE (Son of (29) HARBERT HIGH on the Searcy Map) was the daughter of JAMES RAT, a Bevolutionary Soldier. We have the SIMES and DARLEL LIEV. I also have the HIGH and MARTHE side also fixed, and the RAY EMMILY on Pa's side. My old-est sister BETTHE was named for his mother, ELIZARFER KIFF RAY. My oldest sister, RESECCA WARREN HIGH was hamed for Pa's sister, MERECCA WARRES HIGH, who married first JAMES T. MARRIOTT and second GEORGE WASHINGTON HORWOOD.

I have been trying to find the marriage bond of DAVID ROTSTER and SUSAN SIMS, but so far able to do so. The date and place as handed down to us was 1802 and they were married I am not able to do so. in Warren COURTY. All the marriage bonds here of Warren do not include the bond. For have I been able to find the marriage honds of WILLIAM SIMS and HETST HOWARD daughter of WILLIAM HOWARD, nor of SALLIE HOWARD who married ELISHA SIMS. They have not been found up at the State Idbrary so far.

I cannot understand why H. U. SIME is not willing to account JOHN ALLIE'S names, that his mother OLIVE SIME, demonster of WILLIAM HOWARD SIMS, and WILLIAM SIMS' grandson, and great grandson of JOHN SIMS and ARE HERIEY. THERETOR ALLIE, son of JOHN H. JOHN ALLIE lives at LOJIS. EMBG. HEURSTON ALLEY has an ento plant (1936) right at the bridge as you go to LOUISBURG from BAIRIGH. He lives in a beautiful old place (No. (122) on the Searcy Map) that his father owned and it is out in the country. I have been there several times. JUSEPH JUNE ALLEY was the "Speller" and no fool. His brother, who was killed in the war (C.S.A.) is the brone soldier depicted on the top of the Confederate Momment on the Sepitol Square here in Releigh, facing HILLSEGO STREET.

EXCHARIAE SINS, brother of SUSAN SINS who married DAVID ROTSTER JR. is said to have settled in

GEN. R. F. HONE and FINIS RAY are descended from RIGHARD BULLOUX through AGATHA the daughter of AGNES. AGNES married JUDOS JURN VILLIAMS and their daughter AGATHA married HOREST BUL-TON, uncle of the MUTCHIES GORDON BURTON who was Governor of MORTH CAROLINA.

BRUHEN SEARCT was the son in law of SAMUEL HENDERSON.

SANUTE RENDERSON sold the 800 acres to JUEN SINS IN 1750 on NUTBUSH CREEK.
The GILLIAN PLACE was bought by HENRY T. MATKINS in 1855, according to JUEN B. TATKINS, his grandon, of HERURESON, NOTH Carolina.

"HARRIS COED" was where ISHAM HARRIS lived South of JAMES DAFFEL. It become the

MARRY PLACE, as STEPHEN MARRY married MISS MARRIS about 1870.

Mr. Watkins (of Semierson) says: "There was another set of DANTEL that lived West of ONTORD in 1760, who have descendants in ONTORD today. They were cousins of my CHESLEY DANIEL who died in 1814.

HAT B. DANIEL (great uncle of John B. Watkins) was the son of HATHANIEL CHESLEY

DANIEL who died between 1797 and 1802.

Uncle JTH ROYSTEN'S featly records were given to a man (whose name I have forgotten, who was going to get the estate of RATHABIRL CARPETER (Annt MARY ASPLET ROYSTEN'S uncle) out of Chancery in LUMBON, ENGLAND, It is still there, so VERNOR, JIM and RUBBER all said. VERNOR was in RUBDFH in 1800 and they told this it was there, but it would take a great deal of money and time to get it out. Aunt MARY ROYSTEN'S mother (ARRIET) was a MABTHA CARPETER, and I believe they said she was this IR. CARPETER'S sister. He was "Respersor some such thing, of the Port of Virginia, and on a trip to or from EUROPE was drowned.

C. from Tennessee, who is of our family ".

- Up to 1911 three members of the SIMS family have been members of the United States Congress according to the Congressional Directory. They were ALEMANDER HROMCOLD SIME from S. C. born in HEDNISHEK COUNTY, VA. June 11, 1803; LEGNARD HERIZI SIMS, from SPRISOFIELD, Missouri, a member of the 29th Congress, born in North Carolina, and THEYDS WILLERITE SIME, a member of the Congress, they are several torus, from Temperson, who was born in MITTE COUNTY, in that State, April 25, 1855. The latter is the one mentioned in Mrs. Royster's letter from M. W. SIMS, of Bryan, Texas.
- (16) PRING MEMBERT, who lived on TARRIVER in the Southern part of the present GRASVILLE COURT, below CATORD, was the son of RICHER RESERVE who left a will in GRASVILLE GRANTILLE COURT, Delow CAUTOED, was the son of MICHAED HEMRETT who left a will in the matting COUNTY, dated in 1783 and proved in 1786, in which the mentioned his wife ANNE and several shildren, including "PITTER". Space available here will not permit a "study" of this family and a presentation of the material that tight establish the identity of this family with the manners of VIEGUTIA and ECETHAMPUR COUNTY, in which the mass WILLIAM appears, as it does in this family. The presence of the name MARKIETT in the MERNETT family not the same name in the SEARCT family, as well as a BENNETT SEARCT indicates a possibly relationship between these two families, also. These HENNETTS "belonged" somewhere in the important REGRET FAMILY tree, but just where is yet to be determined.
- (21) VAL fine white was a descendant of the whites OF QUEEN'S CHEEK in TORK COUNTY, Virginia, and was related to the EALPH GRATES family, kin of the VILLIAMS and DARLEM and REDURN-SOR tribes. In 1748 and 1749 VALESTIES WHITE was voting for EUROSES in REGISSICK COUNTY, Vir-moved to South Carolina and GROMDIA and had a VARRITHE and a HICOMEN WHITE. The descendants of BICOMEN WHITE in each generation carried the name VARRITHE on down through Alabama, Mississippi and fint TEXAS, where a life long friend of the compiler, DR. H. VALMETHE WHITE became and is now serving as Dean or the Texas Gollege for Women, at Denton, Texas.

 The name MANE WHITE found its way into this found its way into the factly, through the internarriage of serving WHITES with the MANE FAMILY, Just as the name MANE found its way into the FAMILY HADDENITY HADDENITY FAMILY.

There were a great many members of this WHITE "AMILY in COLONIAL GRANVILLE COUNTY and some idea of the number of them may be gleaned from the following record of marriages that are to be found in the old books:

COLUMN and PHILLIP WHITE and JACOB and ISAAC VINCEST appear on the first Census of Granville County in 1790.

- In the days of VALEFTHE WHITE's first appearance on the records of GRAFVILLE COUSTIT, B. C. people moved about a great deal, and it is startling to find a VALEFTHE WHITE of some prominence in AUGUSTIA COUNTY, VIRGINIA, from the Chalkier Records. In 1782 around Staunton Valentine White was a Captain of Patrollers; in 1785 he was a deputy Sheriff under William Bowyer, and somewhere I have a note copied from the sense records showing that he was at one time City Marchall of Staunton, Virginia. That he was the same VALEFTHE WHITE is of possible, or at least one of the same persons of the name who lived in GRAFVILLE is suggested by a deed executed in October, 1801 by ARCHIRLE MANN and LEWIS MYRHS, of Bath County to LEUMARD FISHER, which was witnessed by VALEFTHE WHITE and JOHN BIRD, JR.
- (22) REASTUS GILL. ERASMUS GILL (evidently the same person) married SARAH REFSOME in DISFIDULE COUNTY, Virginia, JURE 5, 1785. On the records of WALE COUNTY there is a marriage bond between one WORMLET ROSE RAY and MANCY GILL (Daughter of REASTUS or ERASTUS RAY) sated December 24, 1813. Both the RAYS and the GILLS lived near the falls of the Busc in the upper part of Wake and the lower part of GRAWTILLE COUNTY in what was called the "MANTIGET DISFRICT" of Value County and not far from the WALE FOREIGT section. They properly belong in the WALE COUNTY Chapter of this work. However, many of the RAYS of this femily settled in GRAWTILLE COUNTY, and the late C. D. RAY, whom the compiler met on some of his visits to OUTCED, was of this femily, coming down through WORMLET ROSE RAY and RANT GILL. His brother REAGNUS GILAT was for several years a neighbor of the compiler in DALLAS, TEXAS, prior to his death a few years ago.
- (24) JAMES RAY, who lived in TAKE COUNTY belonged to the family of RAYS mentioned in the GIUL paragraph above. He is said to have been a revolutionary soldier. His will and data pertaining to his family will be presented more at length in the Chapter on WAKE COUNTY which will appear later on in the "LOST TRIMES OF MORTH CAROLINA".
- (28) HEHARRY HIGH (pronounced HARREY) has already been touched upon in the notes of his great Grand-daughter HALLIE LEG (N°M) ROYSTER. He was the father of her grandfather ALEX-ANDER MARTIN HIGH. The HIGH PANTLY also belongs mainly to WAKE COUNTY and will be taken up in the WAKE COUNTY CHAPTER of this work.
- (30) THOMAS MARRISON also belongs to WAKE COUNTY, and the MARRISONS of WAKE will be mentioned more at length in the Chapter on that County.
- (41). JOHN KHIGHT was from VIRGIBLA and was related to the VATKINS and WOUDGE femilies. He was a son of JUNATEAN REIGHT who married JUDITH WOUDGE daughter of JUSERN WOUDGE & KLIZARSTH MADDOX Phylary 24, 1757, and JUNATEAN RIGHT was the son of JUNE KNIGHT and his wife KLIZARSTH WOUDGEN, daughter of ROBERN WOUDGE and his second wife RACHEL WATKINS. (I sm accepting the version of the Woodson Smally generalogists on this, which is perhaps correct) Thiu (41) JUHN KNIGHT had a brother WILLIAM KRIGHT, who was a minister, and who lived and was perhaps born in GRAVVILLE OURSTT, who moved to MEDDORD COUNTY, TRANSSELS, where he established what was and still is known as the old Knight Cesp Ground's Seth of Juck River. His wife was KLIZARSTH MADPIN of an old Virginia family from around WILLIGTMEN. WILLIAM KNIGHT had a son OBEDIAH WOODSON KNIGHT, who went to Texas, married one of ARMESSER HOURIS family from around MAJH-VILLE and left the prominent KNIGHT FAMILY plones: of the City of Dallas.

THE PERM AND TAYLOR PARTITIES OF GRANVILLE COUNTY NORTH CAROLINA

(47) JOHN FREN (One of the "Signers" on behalf of North Carolina) was related to the TATIOR, PENDLETON and LEWIS FAMILY. His mother, CATERING TATIOR was the dampter of CATE-MRIME PENDLETON and JUNE TATION, CATERINE PENDLETON was the dampter of PHILLIP PENDLETON, as cording to my information.

JOHN TATION, the grandfather on his mother's side of JOHN FERN, died in GRANVILLE COUNTY and his will (W. B. 1, p. 275) dated March 16, 1780, is on record in the county. The father of JUHN FERN, who married CATHERINE TATION, was MORES PERN.

Following were the children of JOHN TATION and his wife CATHERINE PRODLETON:

JOHN FERN, through his connection with the TAYLOR FAMILY, was distantly related to PRESIDENT ZACHARY TAYIOR and the HOM. JEFFERSON DAVIS, President of the Confederate States. I

have often seed and heard this statement repeated and have called for information to substantiate the claim, which has been furnished. In substance, abbreviated as far as possible, I

present this information belows JAMES TATIOR (Of Carlisle, England) settled on CHESAPPAIR RAY (probably in TORK COUNTY, Virginia, about 1640. He died in 1698 and is buried in KIRO WILLIAM COUNTY. He was trice married, first to FRANCES, second to MAKY GREGORY,

2. JAMES TAYLOR (oldest som of JAMES TAYLOR I, of Carlisle, England, was one of the earliest surveyors in VIGISILA. He is said to have located 10,000 acres of land in the Counsies of Hardver, SPOTTSIVANIA and ORANG and moved on this lands. He died in 1729. His eldest child, FRANKS TATION merried AMEROSE MADISON and was the grandmother of the PRESIDENT JAMES MADISON. The third child and oldest son, JAMES TATION III was the excestor of a large family and moved to HERPORT, KI.

be fourth child and second son was ZACHARI TATIOR (1707-1768), the father of the gullant LIEST.-COL. RICHARD TATIOR, of Revolutionary fame, and who made the first trip down the Ohio and Mississippi from Pittsburg to New Orleans, through the Indian country, in 1768 in company with his brother HANCOCK TATIOR, ARRAHAM HAPSTONSTALL and BANBOUR, all from CHANGE COUNTY, Virginia. ZACHARY ZAVIOR married ELIZABETH LEE, established Meadows Farm plantation and acquired 26 slaves. HANDOX LEE was mortally wounded by the Indians in 1744, but RICHARD ZAVIOR lived to a ripe old age. ZACHARY ZAVIOR had four children:

- 10. HANCOCK TAYLOR married his cousin ALICE CHEW.
- 11. ELIZABETH TAYLOR married CAPT. THOMAS BELL.
- 12. RICHARD TATIOR married SARAH DABBEY STROTHER

SARAH DARRET STROTHER was the mister of VILLIAN DARRET STROTHER, who was killed at GUILIONED COURTBOUNE. Her husband RIGHERD TATIOR was a graduate of VILLIAN & MANT COLLEGE and moved to KENTUCKI in 1785, where their son ACHART TATIOR (b. in Virginia) grew to membod, & afterwards became PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, after serving his country in the Esvolution.

In a note in one genealogical account we are told that "JURY TAYLOR of CAPOLINE died September 19, 1763, and that "JURY TAYLOR, son of JAMES TAYLOR I, who married CATHERINE PENDLETON, was the ancestor of COL. JOHN TAYLOR, whose daughter married FRANCIS LIGHT-FOOT IME." The only way we can account for this statement, knowing that JOHN TAYLOR who married CATHERINE FEEDLETON died in GRAVVILLE COUNTY, N. C., is that his son JUEN "married a MISS LITHES" must have been the "COL, JUEN TABLOR of CAROLINE".

It is of interest to note that PRESIDENT JAMES MADISON married DOLLY PATHS, who is said to have been born just over the line from GRANVILLE COUNTY at PAYME'S TAVERS, Person County.

- STEPHEN TERMY was a revolutionary soldier, the son of MACHARIAN TERM, and the grandson of the old surveyor JAMES THERT who moved from PITTSTITABIA COURTY, Virginia, in 1755 grandson of the old surveyor JAMES TRUME who moved from PITTSIMABIA COURTY, Firginia, in 1755 to CASTRIL COURTY, N. C. At least to that part of ORANGE which is now CASTRIL. STRYMERS and JAMES TRUE lived in ISLAND GREEK DISTRICT in GRANTILLE COURTY in 1790, at spyrorimately the spot indicated on the SHARCH MAP. During the revolutionary was STRYREN FREET had returned to and was living in PHYROGENERS, EMENT COURTY, VIRGINIA, a supply post for Virginia troops in the revolutions. Es died sometimes prior to October 16, 1797, when his will was proven, in which he massed his wife SARAH TREET and the following children:

These TERRIS were from VIRGIBIA and were related to the DICKERSON family, some of whom also came from VIRGIBIA and settled in GRANVILLE COUNTY. JAMES TERRY, the grandfather of STEPHEN TERMY with his brothers HEMANUS and HATHANUEL were surveyors in what is now PITTSTL -VANIA COUNTY, Virginia. These TERMYS had lived in HANOVER and MET KERT COUNTYIES before com-VANIA COUNTY, Virginia. ing to what is now HALIFAI and PITTSTLVANIA. MATHABIEL died in HALIFAI CO. VA. in 1778, and ing to what is now Halifla and PITTSIWANIA, MATHANIEI died in Halifla CO. VA. in 1778, and smong a long list of children be had a dempter HARICI THEM TWO ENTIRED HER (from Vestmoreland County, Va.), and had a son THEMAS JUTTERSON EXCELTED HER CALLEY OF BURTON, who was form at "SIME CALES" in H. C. in 1797. FRANCES KELLING BURTON was the daughter of JAMES MINGE BURTON, a brother of COL. REPERT BURTON who married MAHAMA WILLIAMS the daughter of JUDOS JOHN WILLIAMS of GRANVILLE COUNTY. JAMES MINGE BURTON MATTING ALLIEAMS HILLIAMS and CHARGE SURFON REPURS HELIAMS BURTON REPURS KELLING BURTON (who married THOMAS JETTERSON GREEN IN H. C.) and MARTEA BURTON.

- (52) JOHN WILLIAMS GRAVES. There were several persons of this name, all related in some degree, the name coming into the family from the ancestor JUHN VILLIAIS, of QUERN'S CHERY in YORK COUNTY, VIRGINIA. Hearly every generation of the descendants carried the name in the list of children and there were so many that they become confusing and difficult to identify. The wife of the first one of the name was MART JURSS (according to family tradition) and af-ter his death she married her late husband's first cousin JURN WILLIAMS DANIEL who left will in TARREN COUNTY in 1808. (See pages 244-245 for the GRAVES FAMILY notes).
- (54) WILLIAM CHRISTMAS. THOMAS RAY, of MEW POGNOSOM, in YORK COUNTY, VIRGINIA, the direct ancestor of this compiler, married MARY GERISTMAS, MARY (a sounds like MERREY) CHRISTMAS WAS MY ancestress. She was a damphire of DOTTORIS VILLIAM CHRISTMAS she left will in TORK COUNTY in 1655. The CERISTMAS FAMILI of MERRIC COURTY (and CRAVILLE) were descendants of this TORN FAMILIT, HERRI CERISTMAS probably came to Colonial Granville County with his kinsman CERISTMAS RI(See page 209 herein). His will was proven in what is now therefore COUNTY in the year 1785, in which he nemed two sons JESSE and WILLIAM CERISTMAS. DEURI was a brother of JOHN CHRISTMAS who died in 1782, leaving children THOMAS, SARAH, HERECCA and MIDDLETON CHRISTMAS. From a "Quide to the Old North State" (Federal Writer's Project, 1939) is taken the following 1tens:

WARRENTON and WARREN COURTY were founded in 1779 and named for General Joseph Warren " who fell at BUNKER HILL. The town was laid out in that year by VILLIAN CHRISTMAS. The only building then on the site was a granary where grain was collected to finance the revolution, through there was a settlement nearby at the junction of SHADY GROVE and HALLYAN stage roads. - page 476.

The town (HALEIGH, S. C.) was laid out by WILLIAM CHRISTMAS in APRIL, 1792 with UNION (Now CAPITOL) SQUARE reserved for the Statehouse. The four parks were named for the first three Governors under the Constitution and for ATTORNEY GENERAL ALTRED MOORS. The streets were named for the eight dis tricts, each identified by the name of its principal city, for the commissioners and for other prominent citizens. In pursuance of instructions the commissioners built a brick statehouse "large enough for both houses of the assembly", and upon its completion ("794) Baleigh was taunted with being a "city of streets without houses". - page 234.

(62) DAVIEL MURROW. Loniel Morrow is another one of the compiler's kinsmen, mother having been SARAH LAVINIA MORROW of this family of ISLAND CREEK DISTRICT. This particular arm of his mother's family came down out of FRINCE MOWARD COUNTY, VIRGINIA, some of them going as far as MECKLENSURG and the upper part of SOUTH CAROLINA. They will be mentioned more in detail in the MECKLEMBURG SECTION of this work, later on-

- (64) DANIEL WILLIAMS married URSULA HENDERSUM, a damphter of THOMAS HENDERSUM and the sister of SAMUEL HENDERSUM who married his sister ELIZABYH VILLIAMS (See page 221 and the account of the HENDERSUM and WILLIAMS FAMILIES as shown herein). Just when DANIEL WILLIAMS first come to GHANVILLE COUNTY is not definitely known, but he died in 1759 leaving a will in which he mentioned his children, but did not give the masse of his wife. His son HENDERSUM, sister of JUDUS HICHARD HEREBOU and the dampher of SAMUEL HENDERSUM, After the death of DANIEL HENDERSUM, JR. his widow moved to the PACOLET in SOUTH CAROLINA, where she married ADAM FOTTER as her second husbands. DANIEL WILLIAMS, the first, may have lived for a time in RHUMSVICK COUNTY, Virginia, for on the records there is a deed from THOMAS DESTON to DANIEL WILLIAMS in 1752 (Book 5 p. 259).
- (65) MEMULAN HIRT was the first Treasurer of HORTH CAROLINA, and was called "MRES" hunt by his familiars. He was also a member of the Provincial Congress of North Carolina. His old home in WILLIAMSDORD was sold by ome of his sons to the "rich" HARLIAMS FAMILY, who named it "HURNSIDE" after their Ruglish home. The family genealogist has only furnished us with the names of two of his sons:
 - (1) WILLIAM HUST (2) DR. THOMAS HUST
- (1) WILLIAM HUNT was the father of a son named MEMOCAE HUET, born in GRANVILLE COUNTY, who enigrated to Texas and became Secretary of the Meny of the HEPPHRIC of PEXAS in the cabinet of SAN HOUSPON. This MEMOCAE HUNT married a MISS HOVARD, of another CHAUTILE COUNTY family, who after his death in Texas, married two other husbands, I am informed. In the course of his career in Texas this younger MEMICAE HUNT became Minister from the Beyublic of Texas to the brited States and he was also one of the Countseinners who ran the boundary line between Texas and the United States. In the year 1845, while living in GAINESTON, TEXAS, MEMUCAE HUNT was defeated as a delegate to the ammeration convention by HICHARD BACKE, who was a granded of DR. BENEVAMY FRIEDLIF.

 (2) IR. THOMAS G. HUNT, another som of (65) MEMULIAN HUNT, married METTY DUES, a dampter of GENERN DUES and his wife MIZAMENT WAIDS, and they were the parents of eight ch'idren, one of whom was DB. JAMES ANDERSON HUNT, who was born in GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C., December 22, 1808, and who died at CALDVELL, BURLESON COUNTY, TELAS, in 1892. He was a BINHAM student and received his medical admostion at TRANSIDIANTA UNIVERSITY in Kentacky. He married ANNA ANAIR BRIDGES at Marrodsburg, Kentacky, in 1838, the dampter of JUNES JUNE L. BRIDGES and his wife MARIN ANAIR ANAIR ANAIR ANAIR SHENOAS HALLER, dempter of GOV. JUNE ANAIR. IN. JAMES ANDERSON HUNT and his wife ANNA ANAIR BRIDGES had the following childrens

 the following children: JAMES DULLEY HUMT, MARLH HUMT, HE HUMT, HEM ENDIGES HUMT, HUMES, HUMES, WALLE HUMT, HEM HUMT, HEM REPLOYED HUMT, CALDYS HUMT, WARREN WOOD HUMT, LAURA BRILL HUMT and ALSA HUMT. HEM
 BRIDGES HUMT II, of this family is an attorney and writer of note and a commentator on our
 rent world events who is widely read and quoted, a personal friend of the writer and his
 neighbor in the City of AUSTER, TEXAS.
- DR. THOMAS G. RURT (son of the original MEMUCAN HURT of Granville County) migrated to Texas and settled at GAY HILL in the present EASHINGTON COUNTY, not far from the present town of HEMPHAM, where he died in the first helf of the mineteenth century, and is buried, a fact that perhaps for members of the NURT family know.

The above account is substituted for the one on page 74, which is badly printed.

- (68) JOHN BOTD came to GRANVILLE COUNTY and settled in the upper part of GRANVILLE COUNTY near the BULLICES and HANTINS family. His home before coming to GRANVILLE COUNTY was within the bounds of COUNTYLEAD PARISH in what was them LUMENSUM COUNTY, or possibly MRCL-LEBURG. The vestry of the Parish at its first meeting appointed LEBURGET WILLIAM HOW.—ARD and JOHN BOTD in 1749 to fir on some convenient place near the fort of the BOARDER to erect a Chapel and make report to the next vestry. [Bell's Cumberland Parish p. 35).
- On the records of LUCREBURG COURTY dated COTORER 15, 1749, appears the will of one MARY LAWSON (W. B. 1, p. 36) in which she mentions the names of eight children, among them being JOHN BOTD and wife MARGARET". From which it appears that, if this is the same JOHN BOTD who later moved to GRANVILLE COURT, his wife was MARGARET LAWSON, who, according to the will of her mother had brothers TRAVIS, JOHN, WILLIAM & DAVID LAWSON.
- In Lunenburg County there were several other members of this BOTD FAMILY, including ALEXANDER, BICHARD and ECEMET BOTD. The HAWKINS family lived there also, as well as in EUR-BUSH, in Horth Carolina, The doughter of JOHN BOTD of GRAVILLE was the wife of GOVERNOR WILLIAM HAWKINS, and HANCH HAWKINS married WILLIAM HAWKINS in MECKEMBURG COUNTY, VIRGINIA, in December (the 24th) 1803. (Cumberland Parish Register p. 316).

IMS FAMILY OF GRANV COUNTY, EORTH CAROLINA GRANVILLE

(69) JOHN SIMS, of NUTBUSH DISTRICT, GRANVILLE COUNTY, MORTH CAROLINA, like the SMARCIS, GRAYES, VILLIAMS, NULLCAS and a number of other families who have been mentioned in these notes, came from HANOVER and NEW MENT COUNTY, VIRGINIA.

The compiler is indebted to his friend, MDR. HERRY UPSOF SIMS, former President

of the AMERICAN RAR ASSOCIATION, and to his consin MRS. EMBULOH JUND, of Amburn, Alabama, for the information about the SIMS FAMILY here presented. JUDGE SIMS, as everyone should know, is a leading member of the bar of HEMINGHAM, and has painstakingly prepared a history of the SNS FAMILY pablished exclusively for the family. In a letter to the writer dated september 10, 1943, he gives the following abstract of the genealogy of JUNE SNS of HAM-VILLE COUNTY:

- 1. CAPT. GEORGE STMES, of Somersetshire, England, married DOROTHY EVERARD and settled in ANTIGUA, in the ERITISH WEST INDIES, about 1672. They had a son 2. GEORGE STMES, who came to VIRDINIA when about 16 years of age, and settled in ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY. This GEORGE STMES, of ISLE OF WIGHT County agrees to have been the father of at least two sons:

 (11) JURN STARS (of RANOVER and NEW KENT COUNTIES, Va.)
- 11. JUNE STATES or SIME, of Hanover and New Kent Counties, married about 1705, MARY RICE, of a prominent HANOVER COUNTY FAMILY, the dementer of THOMAS RICE. MARY RICE is said to have been the sumt of MEV. DAVID RICE, an early VIRGINIA MINISTER and teacher. JUBN SIMS and his wife MARY RICE were the parents of a large family of children, including six or seven sons, one of whom was (69) JUBN SIMS, who married SARRH BULLOCK, daughter of RICHARD BULLOCK, about 1734, and moved to GRANTILE DOUBTY, B. C.

MES. ZERULON JUND, of AUBURN, ALABAMA, mentioned above, in a letter to the compiler in 1943, says:

"I have a photostatic copy of the will of JUHE SIMS who located in GRANVILLE COUNTY, North Carolina about 1750, having previously (circa 1734) merried SARAH, daughter of HICHARD BULLOCK. They were probably merried in Elimower County, Virginia. The Saunders, Bullock, Cillias, Brown, etc., Zamilles of Granville intermaried."

MRS. JUID then gives us the names of the following descendants of JOHN SIMS and his wife SARAH BULLOCK. JUHN SIMS died in 1769 in GRANVILLE COUNTY and left the following children, who are named in his will:

MARTIN SIMS may have been a son of ELISHA SIMS, who was the son of JOHN SIMS, of GRAN -VILLE. Martin Size married Anna Jane Howard, January 20, 1782, as shown by the marriage records of GRANVILLE, and she must have been a daughter of JULIUS HOWARD, who was the brother of KLISHA SIM'S wife. MARTIE SIMS was in FRANKLIN COUNTY, GEORGIA, in 1802, and died there APRIL 7, 1822. See Vol. 1 Historical Collections of Georgia D. A. R., page 288. But MARTIN SIMS may have been descended from the ADAN SYMES line. - Extract from a letter from Hon. Henry Upson Sims, to the compiler in 1943.

MARTIN SIMS does not appear among the children of KLISHA SIMS and wife SARAH EDWARD as furnished by MRS. ZEEUION JUDD, which appears on the page following.

He married, evidently in his later years a widow MASHIMPROS, from FVILAGI, Tempessee, to which place she returned after the death of Leonard Sims. By this marriage LECHARD IL SIMS had two daughters BLIZARETH SINS and PRUDENCE SIMS.

(1) ADAM SIMS, the older brot! er of JOHN SIMS of HEW KERT and HANOVER COUNTY, and an uncle of JOHN SIMS of GRANVILLE COUNTY who married SARAH BUILDCK is the ancestor in an excellent genealogy called "Adem Symes and His Descendants" by Mrs. Jane Morris, of Little Rock, Arkansas - Dorrance & Co., Philadelphia, 1938, to which the writer's attention was called by Judge Sims of Birminghem and his cousin Mrs. Judd, of Auburn. Judge Sims writes:

> ADAM STAES, oldest son of GEORGE of BEUNSWICK COUNTY, was born about 1709 and died about 1763, and had a son named BARTLETT SIMS in North Carolina.

CAPT. OFFICE SIMES of AFTIGUA had a younger brother Fil-LIAM SIMS, who came to NEW KENT COUNTY, VIRGINIA (direct from Mo-gland) about 1698, and had a couple of grants of land in VIRGINIA. He had a son named THOMAS, who lived in SPOTTSYLVANIA COUNTY, VIRGINIA; and a lease made by one Thomas Grayson to one Thomas Turner on January 27, 1737, will be found in Volume 1 of a reprint of Virginia County Records, Spottsylvania County, on page 46, witnessed by "INNATIS" and PETER STATES; which would indicate that IGNATION SIMS was a son of THOMAS, because the same volume shows that Thomas had a son Thomas & a son PETER.

PARTLETT SINS, IGNATIOS SINS AND REV. MARTIN SINS OF TEXAS

The two notes last above from JUDGE SIMS were the result of research conducted by the compiler in an effort to discover the identity of an ISMATIUS and a BARTLETT SIMS, both of whom were early pioneers in Texas. In this effort the information contained in the notes was most were early pioneers in meas. MARTIN SIMS, who afterwards died in Columbus at the ripe age of 95 years. Then at TARRENTON, the county seat of MARKEN COUNTY, ORDEGIA, synonymous with MARKEN COUNTY, N. C. we found the will of a MARKIETT SINS, SR. (who may well have been the son of ADAM, born in 1709 in BRUNSWICK COUNTY, Virginia) no named his wife CATERINE, his son MARK-LETT SIMS, JR. (executor) and "My sons and daughters". One of those sons may have been REV. MARTIN SINS.

BARTLETT SIMS came to Texas in 1822, being one of the "Old Three Hundred", the first of the Anstin Colonists, and he was a surveyor and Indian fighter of historic interest. He was a member of the Cemeral Council of the Provisional Government in 1835. His wife was a CURTIS.

ICHATUS SIMS settled in GRIMES COUNTY. His wife was NAMEY PANKEY. They left some RICHARD, WILLIAM, and JOHN and several daughters.

- (71) JUDGE VILLIAMS has already been accounted for on pages 235 and 236 in the general outline of the WILLIAMS FAMILY. He was the son in law of RICHARD BULLOUX and the father in law of COL. ECHERT BURTON who married his only child and daughter, AGATHA WILLIAMS. I have an abstract of his will in GRANVILLE COUNTY proved in 1799 in which there are the names of several legatees, including ROBERT BURTON and others, but it is not clear that those mentioned are his children. The accepted tradition that seems to prevail in his family and smong the descandants that he and his wife ARES (BULLOCK) KERLIED had only the one child seems correct. As has been stated before, he and JUDOS RICHARD HERDERSON ever not only cousins, but what is called double cousins.
- (72) HUTCHIUS BURNOW married TABITHA MIRGE, the daughter of ROBERT MIRGE and MART HURT (b. May 15, 1695). ROBERT MIRGE was the son of the old Surveyor and Clerk of James City County, JAMES MIRGE who married AMAZNA HARRISON, daughter of ROBERT HARRISON of FORK COUNTY, VIRGIBLA. After the death of RUBBET MINUS, his widow married WILLIAM ALLER, who was the father of SANUEL, whose demphter MARTHA ALLEN married WILLIAM DANIEL, the son of WILLIAMS DANIEL, of FORK COUNTY, Virginia, and the nephew of JOHE DANIEL and his wife ARRE WILLIAMS. For the details of these intermarriages see the VILLIAMS FAMILY, DANIEL FAMILY and the BURTON FAMILY in this volthese internatingue see the state of SUTCHINS BUILDING and his name very frequently occurs on the records of GOOGHAMD and MCCLIMBURG COUNTIES. The first BURGES of this family are said to have settled on the "Eastern Shore" of Virginia, in ACC MAC COUNTIE. (Vol. 2 Tyler p. 277). The following interesting land sale is taken from the records of COCCHLAND COUNTY:

JOHN BUILDCK and AGNES BULLOCK, of GOOCHLAND COUNTY, to JOSEPH WOODSON, 375 acres in GOOCHLAND COUNTY, bounded by land of MOEL BURTON, JOSIAH HATCHER and others. Dated February 4, 1763. (Vol 8, p. 411).

The WORL BURTOR mentioned in this item was WORL HUNT BURTOR, the father of FUTCHING BURTOR and the grandfather of COL. BORERT BURTOR. He had married JUDITH ALLEY, a sister of FILLIAN ALLEY the step-father of TABITHA MINER who married his son MUTCHING BURTOR. On page 344 of the Equids to the Old Worth State (1939) is the following item under a description of the town of EENDERSON in the present VANCE COUNTY:

> On the South side of Main Street is a long lane leading to CEDAR WALK (private), hidden from view by a few of the cedars that gave the place its name. It was built in 1750 by HUTCHINS BURION for a boarding school, and called BLOOK ING HOPE. Burton hanged himself from the attic stairwell and vivitors testify to the presence of his ghost. The house is two stories high with a central door flanked by pilasters. The wing at the left, a later addition, has a fine dentiled comice, the detail of which resembles the work at BURESIDE and Prospect Mill.

BURNSIDE, mentioned in the above paragraph, has reverence to the old MEMUCIAN HUNT home, not so far distant, which was so named by PATRICE HAMILTON, the wealthy Englishman, who had bought it from DR. THOMAS HINT. In 1760 BURNSING had been the home of MEMUCAN HINT, the first State Treasurer. (See page 274.)

(79) THOMAS LAWIER (1722-1805) was the son of MICHOLAS LAWIER, who appears to have lived in PRIMON CROMER COUNTY, Virginia, and the grandson of NORM LAWIER who was under sixteen years of age in 1660. On page 98 of the Index section of this work, appears an outline of the entire lanier family, which see,

(81) RICHARD BULLOCK. In an effort to ferret out the American ancestry of RICHARD BULLOCK of GRANTILE COUNTY, N. C., the compiler is once mends relegated to TOTA COUNTY, VA. and its environs, which had already furnished the bulk of the antecedents 42 the many old Granville County families who have been reviewed in these sketches. The Felationships that apparently spring up for 'he first time, a reflected by the Granville records, were in fact a mere renewel of old relationships and old connections that were made in the very earliest years of the Colony of Virginia. That Mrs. Jane Morris, of Little Rock, has said in her "Adem Symes and his Descendants" (1938) and what has come from the pen of Mr. W. M. Greassy through his "Bullocks and Allied Families", has all been reed and considered in this deduction state. Two sketch, but the muthor has reached the conclusions her recorded, based upon, not only what has already been written, but what is reflected by the records and the more dependable traditions brought to his attention considered in connection with what such writers have said. Mr. Johnston, who is a stickler for accuracy and documentation in all that he writes, is one our thanks for the many citations and items in this sketch.

The ancestor of RISHARD BULLOCK of GRANVILLE COUNTY, H. C., this writer has concluded, was CAPT. HUGH BULLOCK, who, in December 1631, was a Burgess and Member of the Assembly for the Colony of Virginia, from York County. (Colonial Virginia Sagi.ter, p. 32). On March 12, 1634, he patented 2550 acro. of Land on the POCOSCH HUWER. (Back Creak or Back River) in York County; (Rugent). His wife, mparently, was MANT, for it seems that about 1637, he and his wife MANT deeded to "Billiam Ballock, or Hordon, gentlemen", his corn will saw will and plantation in Virginia", the informace being that he had returned to London at that time, and that "William Bullock, gentlemen" was his son, probably the sldost. On March 29, 1628, he was the .cmer of the ship "MINHAYOM", (Wighinia Colonial Court Become, p. 189,). He was in Regland i. the Spring of 1652, but was back in Virginia and present at the meeting of the Council on February 8, 1834, (Deep 201.) cil on February 8, 1634. (Tood p. 201.)

From all of which it appears that HOUH HOLLOCK was a planter, merchant, Councilor and a man of considerable importance; that he was a ship owner, as were many other merchants and planters in that day and time. His home was apparently down towards RA/R RIVER in -hat is and was then called POCOSOH, or REW POCOSOH in York County, in which part of the county COV. JOHN WEST owned considerable areas of land, and who long afterwards perhaps bought this same 2550 acres from the heirs of HEREN THITM, together with the mill and other hereditements. (Vol. 8 Tork Records 1677).

The children of CAPT. HIGH BULLOCK and his wife MARY, of YCHK COUNTY, VIRGINIA, were apparently the followings

WILLIAM BULLOCK, the first son, was imported in 1638 to CHARLES CITY COUNTY, VIRGINIA,

according to GREERIS DAUGHARDS. *
On January 25, 1626, he was living at MULHERRY ISLAND in WARVICK COURTY, having come to VIRGINIA in the "UNAUTAR". (Botten).

October 10, 1624 he was a witness. (Virginia Celenial Court, p. 34).

October 10, 1624 he was a witness. (Yirginia Celenial Court, p. 22).

WILLIAM BULLOCK was the author of a very rare peoplet on YIRBWIA, issued in 1649, which he styled "Yirginia Impartially Examined, etc." (Cyc. of Vs. Biog. Vol. 1, p 102.)

As the eldest son, WILLIAM BULLOCK, succeeded largely to the property and interestrest of his father GATE. BUGH BULLOCK, including of course, his lands, his mills, his mercantile business and trade, and his shipping interest, including the ownership, perhaps of one or more vessels plying between Virginia and Empland. He was a war of the World an eccessarily made numerous trips back and forth between the Colony and Empland. A will of a WILLIAM BULLOCK, of BISEK, Gent., was made when he was about to leave London for Virginia (date of execution not stated, so that it may have been 20 years or more before the date of its probate) which was proven May 16, 1650, in which is mentioned his wife KLIMARATE, a son BORKET and a daughter named FRANCES,

^{*}NOTE: One of the most misleading things in Virginia research are these "transported" dates affixed to early Virginia emigrants. He could not have been imported in 1638 and at the same time have been "living at Mulberry Island" in 1624, except that on a return trip out of the country and back again, comebody obtained his "right" perhaps by purchase, to fifty acres of land which was selected in CHAPLES CITY COUNTY. This does not mean that William Bullock was inported to Charles City County; nor does it mean that he was imported in 1638. It means that was the year the land was obtained. The immigrant may have arrived in the Colony twenty-five years carlier. Sometimes they were here fifty years before the right was claimed. In many instances they had be mused and buried for a long time.

On family genealogist has stated that the wife of WILLIAM BULLOCK, of WARRICK was on remlay generacy, or manufacture was a TADMAD LACRARIAN, JUMN and ROMERT, but for this we have found no supporting evidence. There was a TADMAD TATIOR in Tarvick who had a daughter named ANNE, but unfortunately the "Virginia Carya" disclose proof that she married the enigrant MILES CART, and there are no evidences of another ARRE of the right vintage. All agree that there was a son RUMERT, which we are going to accept. So. WILLIAM BULIOUS had a son!

ROBERT BULLOCK, som and heir of WILLIAM BULLOCK, of WARWICK COUNTY, VIMINIA, on March 13, 1671, brought suit against COL, PRINK JENNIEGS, guardian of JURN MATTERYS, the orphen of COL, MATTERYS, over the title to 5000 cores of land in WARWICK COUNTY; same being lands left by his father, as a member of the Council and General Court of Virginia. (Virginia Colonial Court pp. 326, 343); on April 8, 1871 this land was awarded EDERFF EULIOCK by the Court (Daid p. 349). 10° HEMBER EULIOCK left no will.

- 2, RICHARD BULLOCK (second son of GAPT. HURR BULLOCK) was 3: Virginia as early as 1632 (William & Mary Vol. 1 (1) p. 165.) Hotwithstending this established fact the busy importation recorders say:
 - In 1641 Richard Bullock was imported to lower Norfolk County. In 1654 Richard Bullock was imported to York County.

- He is reputed to have died in Surry County in 1703, leaving a will and his wife was perhaps MARY, who owned lands there the following year.
- 3. THOMAS EULLOCK, believed to have been another son of HUGH EULLOCK, was living in Lower Morfolk County in 1640 and was them 28 years of age, from which we figure he was born about 1612. He died in Isle of Wight County about 1695, leaving three sons, WILLIAM, JUHE and THOMAS BULLOCK. 3 THOMAS BULLOCK was the ancestor of the Tale of Wight County Bullocks, who overflowed into North Carolina and whose descendants are all mixed up now with their GRANVILLE
- Overflowed into North Carolina and whose descendants are all mixed up now with their GRANVILLS COUNTY coustins, so that it is hard to identify them.

 This 3. THOMAS BULLOCK died without leaving a will and on AUGUST 9, 1695, his estate was mpraised in leit of Wight County by JACOE DRAUGH, SIMON NUMENT and WILL MEMPHER. His son THOMAS BULLOCK only the day previously AUG. 8, 1695 had helped to appraise the estate of HERRY ALLEN, whose widow MART he had married. The son THOMAS left a will in the Lower Parish of 1817 OF WIGHT, Namuery 25, 1703-10 (W. B. 2 p. 529). See also BODDE'S 17TH CANTUM Pages 622 and 625.
- 4. JAMES BULLOCK, the fourth son of CAPT. BURH BULLOCK, married MARTHA and lived and died in EXUTON PARISH, in York County, Virginia. His wife MARTHA died in 1671, and his own estate was inventoried and spread on the Tork County records in 1681. No children of this couple are known, though there may have been many of them.
- 10. BOBIRT BULLOCK, son of WILLIAM BULLOCK and grandson of CAPT. HUGH BULLOCK, was the ancestor of the GRANVILLE COUNTY BULIOCKS. He was evidently not a man with a large and numerous family, otherwise somewhere on the records the names of his sons would have appeared in connection with the business of settling up his estate, etc. I am convinced that he had only one son, even as his father before him, and that he was

20. RICHARD BULLOCK (Of New Kent County).

20. RICHARD BULLOCK, of HEW RENT COUNTY, VIRGINIA, is known on the records of St. PETER'S PARISE as RICHARD BULLOCK, SR. After his death in 1702, his son RICHARD BULLOCK, JR. became RICHARD BULLOCK SR.

RICHARD SULLOCK, SR. and RICHARD BULLOCK, JR., were processioners in St. FITTR'S PARISH on May 4, 1689 (St. Fater's Parish Register by Chamberlayne, p. 21). Richard Bullock, Jr. would not have seen named a processioner unless he was a grown man at the time (1682), hence the Juntor RICHARD was born around 1670, when his grandfather had the suit in Warwick against Judge Feter Jennings, over his patrimony. Knowing this much by common sense deduction, one only needs to anxilize the Parish Records to gain an idea of the mambers of this family.

20. RICHAPD BULLOCK had two sons:

21. RICHARD BULLOCK 22. EDWARD BULLOCK.

These two sons of RICHARD BULLOCK SR. of NEW KENT COUNTY, with the establishment of ST. PAUL'S PARISH and the erection of HAWOVER COUNTY near the beginning of the Kightogath Century, moved with their children and the WRISTONS, SIMS, HENDERSONS, WILLIAMS, DICKERSONS, TERRYS and others further West and took up lands in the new Parish and the new County. Somewhere in TORK, JAMES CITY, KING and QUEEN or NEW KENT they came in contact with the HERLEY FAMILY. LEGNARD HER-LEY, son of HEYHOLDS HENLEY had married into the YORK COUNTY RICHARDSONS and had MAJ. RICHARD -SON HERLEY, of "Merry Oaks" in JAMES CITY COUNTY. The BULLOCKS also joined the HERLEYS.

It is the opinion of the writer that practically all of the members of the BULLOCK FAMILY of New Kent and Banover Counties stem from 20. RIJARDE BULLIOCK (son of 10. RORRET BULLIOCK, son of 1. WILLIAM BULLIOCK of WARWICK COUNTY, son of CAPY, HUGH BULLIOCK, of YORK County, Virginia), and that 22. ENWARD BULLIOCK was the father of RICHARD ALLIOCK, who settled in BULBUSK DISTRICT, in GRAWVILLE COUNTY, about 1750 to 1753, he having disposed of his plantation, mercantile business and other property in HAMOVER COUNTY, on August 28th of the latter year (D. B. A page 525 of Hamover County, Virginia).

Only the most fragmentory records of the BULLOCKS can be found in the old vestry book of St. Peter's Parish. Enough only to whet the appetite of the seeker after information about them and enough to show that there were apparently only two sons of 20. HICHARD BULLOCK residing in that county. To ascertain the names of the probable children of these two cons, it is necessary to consider not only the names of the BULICES who appear on the records of THE MENT COUNTY, but also those who are mentioned long afterwards in HANDYE. There is nothing more obvious than that both 22, RICEARD and 22, EDWARD, lived in HANDYE COUNTY, coming There is noththere from NEW KENT, probably before the county was erected. The name of the wife of 20. RICH-AED BULLOCK is sholly unknown, and the name of the wife of his acn, PicHard BULLOCK, JR. was MATHERINE or KATE. The whole set up suggests that she may have been a HENLEY, though there is not a scintilla of proof. His nephew, RICHAED, is known to have married an ANNE HENLEY, but what her relationship was to COL. LECKARD HERLEY we are unable to determine. LECKARD HERLEY Had four sons, RICHAMDSON, IMMAND, THENER and WILLIAM HENLEY. The younger LEGNARD married ELIZABETH AYLETT in 1779. Doubtless COL. LEGNARD HENLEY had designers, but they are not mentioned. (William & Mary 5, p. 33 et seq.). The name of the wife of 22. EDWARD HULLOCK was SARAH, whose family name before marriage has not been found.

The records on which we rely indicate that both 21 RICHARD and 22 EUWARD BULLIOCK and 400 GRAND COUNTIES, after leaving REF. They were outstanding citizens and unquestionably related to many of the old families of knees counties. The records show they were unquestionably related to the WINSTONS, as the casual reader can understand after a glance at the records. As late as 1853 GRANVILLE BULLOCK was named as the husband of MARY C. WINSTON, daughter of JOSEPH WINSTON, of LOUISA COUNTY. . This was RICHARD BULLOCK, ancestor of most of the BULLOCKS of GRANVILLE COUNTY.

BULLOCK FAMILY RECORDS FROM NEW KENT COUNTY. VIRGINIA.

Katherine Bullock, daughter of Richard Bullock, was born before 1697. (Same anthority cited above, page 342.)

Dorothy Bullock, daughter of Edward Bullock and wife Sara, was born before 1697. Bullock, daughter or son of Edward Bullock and wife Sara, was born before 1697.

.RICHARD BULLOCK, MINES of EDWARD BULLOCK and wife SARA, was baptized on April 66. 169

Bullock, daughter or son of Edward Bullock and wife Sara, was baptized on June 4, 1704.

* This was RICHARD BULLOCK, who settled in GRANVILLE COUNTY.

51. RICHARD BULLOCK, JR., son of 22. EDWARD BULLOCK, by 1753, on account of the death of his mucle 21 RICHARD, had dropped the "JR." in his name, since there was no further necessity therefor in business transactions. He was born sometime between 1890 and 1700 and had become a prosperous merchant in HANOVER. As has been stated before, it was in that year, (1753) that he sold cut his plantation and property in that county. The purchasers were TEDMAS BALLARD SMITH, ARRHAM VERBALE (encestor of the Venebles later in GRAVILLE COURTY, N. C. and relatives of the WAITHS tribe), CHARLES SMITH, PICHARD TANFIT (relatives of JAMES TANGET, one time Sheriff of GRAVVILLE) and VILLIAM RICE (whose sister MARY, or his mint, married JOHE SIMS, of HANDYER, whose son JUHN married SARAH, the daughter of RICHARD SULLOCK). The list of the children of 31. RICHARD SULLOCK, of GRAFVILLE COUNTY, given in MES. MORRISS SADAN STARS AND HIS DESCRIMENTS is adopted by the compiler as perhaps the nearest correct of any that has been submitted, and the writer believes IT IS CORRECT. She says that RICHAED BULIOCK came from HANOVER COUNTY, VIRGINIA, and settled on NUTBUSH CREEK (Between the town of DREVERY and NUT-BUSH CHEEK) in 1754; that he sold out in HANDYER COUNTY on account of INDIAN troubles with which they were then threatened; that he made his will in GRANVILLE on October 27, 1764, which was probated at the November Court in 1766, and that he had the following children:

SOME BURLOCK PANTLY RECORDS FROM HAROVER AND OTHER VIRGINIA COUNTIES.

Robert Searcy died in Eanover County, Virginia in 1733 leaving a will in which he mentions his wife Susan and his dampher Susan. This will was witnessed by EDWARD BULLOCK, THOMAS HAWKINS and ARE BULLOCK. - From "Small Book" Becord of Hanover County (p. 217 also).

RICHARD RULLOCK (wife KATE) owned lands in ST- MARTIN'S PARISH, HAPOVER COUNTY on June 7, 1734, adjoining Capt. Isaac Winston and Samuel Goodman (Vol. 1733-35 p. 69, Records of Hanover County.).

Deed from VINELER CORE to John Humber of land in St. Panil's Parish, HANOVER COUNTY, adjoining WILLIAM WINSTON, EDWARD BULLOCK, James Wads, Thomas Class and ROBERT BULLOCK, and formerly belonging to JOHN RECORD. December 5, 1734. (Vol. 1733-35 Egnover Secords, p. 159).

EDWARD BULLOCK on OCTORER 28, 1730, and TROMAS RICE (father in law of JOHN SIMS who Married Sarah BULLOCK) had 1200 acres of land surveyed on Oubb Creek in HAROVER (McIlwaine's Executive Journals of Virginia Vol. 4 p 250.).

EDWARD BULLOCK'S lands were ordered processioned in St. Penl's Parish, Hanover County, March 14, 1708-9, a 1 on Sept. 12, 1711 and Feb. 10, 1719. On Feb. 14, 1707-8 EDMAND BULLOCK was added to JOHN WHITE'S PRECINCE. (St. Panl's Par. Register). An EDMAND BULLOCK'S lands were ordered processioned March 27, 1736. (Ibid p. 290.) This shows EDWAED BULLOCK was in EANOVER by 1707-8.

RICHARD BULLOCK'S lands were ordered processioned March 14, 1708-9, and on the same dates applicable to EDMARD'S above, and as late as 1739. (Ibid). On February 1, 1723 RICHARD BULLOCK was ordered to keep JURN RAKER for twelve months and to be paid therefor 350 pounds of tobacco. (Ibid p. 103). March 23, 1745, BICHARD BULLOCK was a freeholder in ST. Paul's Parish and his lands were to be processioned (Same p. 310.)

JAMES EULIGE'S lands were to be processioned and he was an overseer of the orphans of ROBERT ENOUGH, February 17, 1715 (Ibid p. 249) also the same in 1719-19.

DAVID BULLOCK was a processioner of HATHABIEL ANDERSTH'S lands, March 23, 1743. And 24 pounds of tobacco were to be paid to him for levy last year as patroller, October 6, 1746. and his lands were also to be processioned as late as 1751. (St. Paul's Register pp. 193 and 321.).

JOHN SIMS patented lands in HANOVER COUNTY, Feb. 4, 1729, which he sold to ISAAC WIFSTON, Sept. 8, 1732 and this appears to have been part of a tract of 1736 acres patented by WINSTON later on both sides of HEAVER DAM Creek, adjoining the lands of RICHARD BULLOCK, JR., JOHN WHITLEY, JOSEPH TERRELL and others. (Va. Land Office Register Vol. 14, p. 471.)

RAIPH GRAVES, TARIFOR WOODSON JR. and JOHN BULLOCK were witnesses to the will of MARY FARRAR, of St. James Northem in GOO'HIAND COURTY, February 1, 1756. MARY had first married a MODDON and then a FARRAR (Vol. 7 p. 186 Goothland County Records.)

To his daughter, 52, ADMES BULLOCK (then ADMES WILLIAMS), RICHARD BULLOCK left one shilling, Sterling. Mrs. Morris, in her book, says She married GERGHI EXELUIO, som of LORD
KEKLING. Being a "family genealogist" of the type, she runs true to form and goes "strong" on
LORD and Tarls, as well as "Coats of Arms". The "Lord Keeling" of her story was CAPPLIN HERCEL
KEKLING, of New Lent County, prolinent emong the descendants of the cavaliers, but just High Theriff of the County and a member of the Vestry of BLISSLAND and ST. PEREST. Her Theriff of the County and a member or the Vastry of Milistianu and ST. Petrin's Parish. Her statement, however dressed up it may be, indicates the identity of the first meshand of AMPES BULLOCK, as the son of the old New Lent Sheriff. He was the Ching KELLING who lived at "RIME CARS" in GRAFVILLE COUNTY and was the son of the Sheriff.

After the death of GENERE KELLING of "Mine Caks" Agnes Bullock married JUDGE JOHN VILLIAMS. New Morris says "Judge and Colonel John Williams". He was not COL. JUNG TILLIAMS.
Colonel John Williams lived in CASWALL COUNTY and died in 1805. See will on page 185. She

gives us the following light on the children of AGATHA BULLOCK and her two husbands:

53. ZACHARIAH BULLOCK never married. He moved to South Carolina. On February 14, 1748, he bought lands in GRANVILLE COURTY, N. C. from SAMMEL HERDERSON, with JOHN and VILLIAM BULLOCK as witnesses. (This writer is of the opinion that the purchaser of the land in question was the elder ZACHARIAE, som of EDWARD and brother of EICHAED (not his som), on account of the date, which was SIX YEARS before EICHAED EULIOCK had left HANDYER COUNTY, VIRGINIA, and only four-term years after the estimated date of his mairings to ADDE HENIAT. Also that the witnesses JOHN and WILLIAM BULIOUX were of this older generation, and not the sons of RICHAED and AREA HENLEY. Obviously this does not make sense, so we are left in doubt as to WHICH Zachariah it was who "went to South Carolina" and "never married".)

54. WILLIAM BULLOCK (Son of RICHARD BULLOCK and ANNE HENLEY) married (1) UNITY WRIGHT, and (2) ELICABETH TAYLOR, daughter of COL. JOHN TAYLOR (p. 272) who was the widow of JAMES LEWIS, son of CHARLES LEWIS of the BYRD and brother of BOWELL LEWIS. His wife UNITY Cled in 1760 in VIRGINIA. By his first marriage he had:

JAMES LEWIS died in LUNEYBURG CO. VA. 1764 (W. B. 2, p. 230, and left children, MAHY. CATHERINE, JAMES, JOHN and CHARLES LEWIS.

- 62. WILLIAM (BILLY) BULLOCK who married his cousin IUCY MARTIN BULLOCK and became the son in law as well as nephew of LEONARD HENLEY EULIOCK had an interesting list of ten children, as follows:

^{66.} RICHARD BULLOCK, married MARY P. HUNT, a sister of JUNE TAYLOR HUNT, and perhaps a daughter of the first Treasurer of North Carolina, HOW. MEMUCAN HUMT (She may have been a grand-daughter) and went to AUSTIN, TEXAS. There RICHARD BULLOCK and his wife established and conducted what is known in Texas History as the old "BULLOCK TAVERS". The Bullock Tavern, in the days of MIRAHEAU LAMAR and SAM HOUSTON was the gathering place for the early day notables and the meeting place of the Congressmen and Senators of a REPUBLIC. One of the rare stories in Texas History revolves around a controversy between RICHARD BULLARD and the French Ambassador, which came near presinitating a breach of international importance between two countries.

JOHN BULLOCK (son of WILLIAM BULLOCK and LUCY MARTIN BULLOCK) was born JUNE 12, 1799 and died in 1866. He was of "CEMAR WALK" near the town of HENDERSON, in the present VANCE COUNTY, The old home of HUTCHINS SURTON (See page 277). In 1824 he married SURIN COUNTY, the dualities of HUTCHINS SURTON (See page 277), in 1824 he married SURIN COUNTY, THE SURTON OF THE SULLICUX was an older brother of HUTCHIND CHILDICX shows married MARY P. HUNT and settled in ANSTR. TRIAS; the proprietor of the old BULLOCK HOTEL or TAVERN (See below). JOHN BULLOCK and his wife SUSAN CORB had eleven children, as follows:



TRANCES CATHERINE DANIEL, who married WILLIAM CORB BULLOCK, was the daughter of Ha-THANKEL CHESLEY DANIEL of "CARROCO" near the town of STOVALL, and the grand-daughter of CHES -LET DANIEL and his wife JUDITH CHRISTIAN. She and VILLIAM COME BULLOCK were the parents of ANNIE CHESLEY BULLOCK who married JOHN BULLOCK WATKINS SR., son of MENRY THOMAS VATKINS and his wife 79. ANNIE ELIZA BULLOCK, had a son JOHN BULLOCK WATKINS. (See Notes of HALLIE LES HIGH ROYSTER on pages 269-270 herein).



THE OLD BULLOCK HOTEL OR TAVERN IN AUSTIN. TEXAS. OF 1839-40.

This old hostelry was presided over and was the early home of 68. RICHARD BULLOCK and his wife MARY P. HUNT, both from GRANVILLE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, and the NUTBUSH DISTRICT: It is of intense historical interest to both TEXANS and descendants of GRANVILLE COUNTY, NORTH CARCLINIANS. In later years it was supplanted by what was then considered a magnificent business structure, in which was located the banking institution in which another famous WORTH CAROLINA - TEXAS personality was employed; one STENEY PORTER, better known to the world as "O. HENRY". The tragic story of his unfortunate entanglement with the law, while employed in this bank, his flight to Mexico, his return for trial and his final conviction, precedes his final rise to fame and fortune as the father of the modern american CHORT STORY. Only in the last three years of World War Second was the old bank building torn down and a new and modern structure erected thereon, which is now on the busiest corner in town, occupied by a famous chair denartment store. This book is published by a firm located directly across the street from the site of the old BULLOCK TAVERN.

^{55.} JOHN BULLOCK (son of RICHARD BULLOCK and his wife ANNE WESLEY) married MARY MITCHELL on Movember 12, 1759, at OXFORD. The notation relating to this comple says they "lived in ORANGE COUNTY, North Carolina", which covers a wide range for that date. The probabilities are they lived in what is now CASWELL or PERSON Counties, more likely the former.

56. SUSAFNAH BULLOCK (Denghter of RICHARD BULLOCK and his wife ARME HENTET) married VILLIAN SIMS and moved to VARREN COUNTY, GEORGIA, with her hisband's brother BARTISTT SIMS.

SMELLINGS, obviously of the SMELLINGS family of GRANVILLE who lived in the Fishing Creek District in 1788.

TARTIST SIMS, JR. appears to have been the HARTIST SIMS who moved first to COULD BUS MISSISIPFI, and then to TELAS (see note herein on page 276), and whose fame as a lang was a by-word in Texas pioneer days. He was a giant in both strength and size, weighed a 300 pounds and was more than six feel tall.

57. AGATHA BULLOCK (Descriter of RICHARD BULLOCK and his wife AWNE HENLEY) married JOHN NUCKOLS and moved to SOUTH CAROLINA. One son, ZACHARIAH NUCKOLS was born before 1764, because he is mentioned in the will of his grandfather, RICHARD EULIOCK.

58. RATHANIEL BULLOCK (Son of RICHARD BULLOCK and his wife ANNE HEALET) received the old home plantation on NUTBUSH, after the death of his mother ANNE (HENLEY) BULLOCK. He was born in 1736, and merried MARY MANNINS, despiter of FHIL HANNINS and sister of FHILEMON HANNINS, of GRANVILLE COUNTY, August 12, 1760. There is one account which states that he married a second time, one ELIZARETH HEARTLEY, despiter of THOMAS HEARTLEY, but this was obviously a soon made ANTHANNIN, who perhaps moved to SOUTH CARDINA and later to CROCKLA. Only three sons of NATHANIEL BULLOCK and his wife MARY HAWKINS are known, though there may have been several others. They were:

103. GEORGE WASHINGTON BULLOCK

102. GEORGE WASHINGTON BULLOCK is said to have been born in GEORGIA in 1804. and to have moved to INDIANA, where he died in 1840, leaving one on 1851ION MARTER BULLOCK, whose descendants reside in that State. He married MARY INDATESTING daughter of ADMINISTED DATESTORY, JR. and his wife JENNIE BASS of RANDOLFF COUNTY N. C. The Davemports lived in ROVAN COUNTY and more will be said about them in the ROVA UNITY section of this work.

101. HAWKIES BULLOCK (Son of NATHANIEL BULLOCK and his wife MARY HAWKINS) was book in GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C. and died near IMXINGTON, in OGLETHORPE COUNTY, GRORGIA, on NOVELLER 1, 1833. 

WILLIAM and 12. JOHN were per haps the progenitors of the BULLOCKS in EDGECOMBE COUNTY, who will be considered in the chapter relating to EDGECOMBE COUNTY in this work.

THE HAWKIES MAMILY OF GRANVILLE COUNTY

- (92) PHILENCE HAWKINS (See SHARCT MAP) must have been one of the earliest settlers who came down from VIRGISIA and located South of the ROANCE RIVER as far Vest as the original Granville County territory. He was living in what afterwards became a part of old extinct EUT County, in 1754, when his distinguished son, COL. HENJAMIS HANKINS was born on August 15, 1754. The early records of YORK and GLOUDESTER Counties, Virginia, carry frequent reference to the ma HAYRINS. It is a mere conjecture (but probably correct, at that) that he was the son of a COL-JUEN HARKINS who lived in ESSER COUNTY, Virginia, whither he had dritted northward with the Fil-LIAMS and other families, from GLOUGESTER and YORK COUNTIES. One writer has stated that he was born in GLOUCESTER COUNTY, Virginia, Sept. 28, 1717 and that he came to MORTHE CAROLINE and set-tled when only twenty years of age, which would have been in 1737. One JUNE HAWKIES was in ARRE-MARLE FREJECT and a Lord Deputy of the Province in 1707, with GOV. WILLIAM GLOVER (See p. 62 of this completed Volume), but as there does not appear anywhere among these earlier members of the Hawkins family, one named PHILERON, it is unlikely that the GRANVILLE PHILERON demended from that branch of the family, though I have no doubt they were of the same family or tribe.

- 3. COL. BENJAMIN HARKINS. He was born in Angust 15, 1754, according to WHEELER, who is in error for the reason that BUTE was not erected until 1764; therefore Col. Benjamin Hawkins was really a native of GRANVILLE COUNTY. He died in the CHEEK NATION the 6th of June, 1816, in the exercise of his functions as Superintendent of Indian Affairs. A particular record to this effect was made at the time of his death by his elder brother, Col. Philanon Hawkins, in his family Bible, with the additional remark that he had been in public life thirty-six years. He served in the Congress of the United States, and on the 21st of March, 1785, being then a member, he was appointed by Congress; a Commissioner, together with DANIEL CARROLL and WILLIAM PERRY to treat with the Cherokee Indians; the same year he was appointed by Congress with GES. ANDREW PICKENS, JOSEPH MARTIN and LAUCHLIN McISTOSH to negotiate with the CHERK INDIANS. These duties were performed, and in 1786 he was again elected to Congress. In 1789, with SAMUEL JOHNSTON he was elected UNITED STATES STRATOR from North Carolina. He served out his full term of six years in the United States Senate, after which Gen. Washington appointed him Superintendent and Agent for all the Indians South of the Ohio. He appointed his nephew 24, FRILEMON HATKINS to serve as his assistant. COL. RENJAMIN HATKINS left one son (WILLIAM HATKINS) and five damphters.

- (93) SANUEL HENDERSUM (Searcy Mem). An account of his family, together with a list of his children, will be found on page 221a. About two miles South of MIDDLESURG in what is now Yance county there is dirt road turns to the right off the highway, which leads to ASHIAND, the old HENDERSUE HOUS. It is a two story house, three bays wide, has a doorway on the right hand bay and a story and a half addition on the right with end chimneys matching the twin chimneys on the left side of the main house. The beaded weatherboarding is painted white, and both caves and window headings have well-designed cornices. A later porch extending the entire facade is supported by Roman Doric columns, supplemented by log posts. The place is said to have been built 200 years ago (1746) by SANUEL HENDERSUE, farmer and miller, who was one time High Sheriff of SHRENTING COURTY and the father of mmerous children, including JUDGE RICHAND HENDERSUE.
- (104) HICHARD HEMMERSUF, the founder of TRANSTLVANIA, and an early JUDGE in NORTH CAB-OLINA. The account of the EXMINESON FAMILY (p. 221) includes the names of his children and of some of his descendants.
- (120) JOHATHAN KITTERELL. The town of KITTERELL named for his family is fourteen miles South of MIDDLEGES. The KITTERELL family came to North Carolina from HANEMOND and ISLE OF WHET BOUNTY, Virginia, and first settled on EMBETT'S CHEEK in HETTE FRECUET, perhaps, and moved to the CRASVILLE COURT territory probably in about 1745. Jonathan Kittrell sold lands on EMBETT'S CHEEK in 1718, and his wife was ARM (See INDEX to Hathaway's p. 86). See also page 87 for an account of JOHATHAN KITTERLL.
 - ((122) "SPELLING" JOHN ALLEN. See account on page 269.
- (123) GREEN HILL (SEARCY MAP). This GREEN HILL was the son of a GREEN HILL who married GRACE MEMBET, a daughter of VILLIAM EXHERT of Northeapton County, North Carolina. The OM GREEN HILL home is on the South side of the HAW RIVER in the outskirts of IOUISBURG, in what is now Franklin County. Here it was that Bishop Coke held the first North Carolina Metchodist Conference in 1785. The home is now a well-preserved white frame house with donner windows, three big brick end chimmeys and high process. This particular GREEN HILL was reminent in State, as well as religious affairs, representing BUTE COUNTY (a part of the original GRANVILLE in the provisional Congress. He was also a Major of the BUTE MILITIA in the revolution. He became a minister and moved to the general vicinity of Rashville, Tann.
- (125) PHILLIP PIERCE was a resident of what is now FRANKLIN COUNTY (a part of the original GRANVILLE) and is distinguished in History mainly because of the fact that he was the father of one great Southern Freacher, and the grandfather of another who was a beloved BISEND of the Methodist Emreh, REF, GEORME F. PIERCE, of HANDOWN COUNTY, Georgia, known and loved by members of his denomination throughout the entire South. See itses from the records of Franklin County on page 207 relating to transactions of FRILLIP FIRECE, and his family.
- (133) EUWARD JUNES (Searcy Map). See the records of GRANVILLE COUNTY and its earliest organization, beginning on page 209 for information in regard to EDWARD JUNES. There is also an account of EUWARD JUNES on page 43 (Of the INDEX SECTION) in connection with an account of COL. WILLIAM MATCH and his genealogy. He was the father of PRISCILLA JUNES who become of the wife of GIREON MACON. Any purported account of the early history of GRANVILLE COUNTY could not be written without mention of EDWARD JUNES and his descendants who exercised a wide influence on the destinies of the Province of North Carolina, and particularly GRANVILLE COUNTY.
- (140) VILLIAM MATCH. A genealogical account of his family, briefly outlined is to be found on page 45 (Index Section of the "Lost Tribes"). He was from TOER COUNTY, Virginia to North Carolina. The roster of his GRANTILE COUNTY regiment will be given later.
- (145) ISHAM HARRISON (Searcy Map) was a son of JOHN HARRISON and his wife SARAH DAN-LLL, demphter of JOHN MANUEL sho died in Granville County in 1763 (See page 212). The ISHAM HAR-RISON who was on the tax list of GRANVILLE COUNTY in 1768 may have been a son, as he was only assessed with one poll, and at that time may not have been married. (145) ISHAM HARRISON moved to South Carolina, along the Pacolet, with some of the MENDERSONS and others, as did JOHN HARRISON, who may have been another son of ISHAM. For an account of the descendants of JOHN HARRISON and his wife SARAH, see beginning on page 256.
- (183) MATRANIEL MACON was born in 1758 and died in 1837. He was three times Speaker of the Eduse of Congress of the United States, from 1801 until 1807, and attember of the United States Senate from Forth Carolina from 1815 until 1828. He is said to have been one smong North Carolina's foremost proponents of the political principles of Thomas Jefferson. His old home was at Back Springs, four miles from the town of Yanghan, in what is now Warman COUNTY. The place was restored in 1937 and stands in a great oak grove. HAPHANIEL MACON was a grandson of EDVARD JURES (133 on the Searcy Mep.), his mother having been PRISCHIAL JURES who married GUILHHO JUNES, son of HEV. NOVIAND JURES Minister of HEUTON PARISE in TOLK COUNTY, Virginia. This MARTHA MACON, the sunt of MARCHA MACON, wife of the first President.
- (185) CERISTMAS RAY. He brought suit against INCHT GLOVER in GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C. in 1765. He was a descendant of THOMAS RAY and MARY CERISTMAS, of YORK COUNTY, Virginia, and a collateral kineman of the writer.
 - (162) GIDEON MACON. He was a son in law of EDWARD JOHES and is mentioned above.
- (190) SUGAR JUNES was a son of EDWARD JUNES mentioned above. He married SARAH FRANKLIF, who after his death married HATHAUIEL, the son of SAMUEL HOUSERSON.

THE HARRIS PANILY OF GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C.

(136) WEST HARRIS (Of the SEARCY MAP), one of those who met at the home of EDWARD JOHES, on December 2, 1746, to complete the organization of the original GRANVILLE COUNTY, was a member of an old VIRGIEIA FAMILI (p. 209). This WEST HARRIS was related to EDWARD JOHES, to GIRROF MACCE, to the LANIERS, JEWIEGS, HILLS and REGRETTS, but whether in an attempted review of the notes pertaining to this family of HARRIS, the writer can make this plain to the reader is questionable and I am sure will be questioned by others for the reason that the theories I will advance run counter to some of the writers who have attempted to set down the annals the HARRIS PANILY.

CAPT. THOMAS HARRIS, who on February 25, 1638, received a patent to 820 acres of land then income as LONGFIELD, but later known as CUMINS on the JAMES RIVER, was the first AMERICAN shoester of the GRANVILLE COUNTY HARRIS FAMILY. This land was afterwards claimed by NATHANIAL shoester of the GRAYFILLE COUNTY HARRIS FAMILY. This land was afterwards claimed by MATHANILI BARDS as son, typ. 1387 and 1959 of the Valentine Papers, queving from the Records of HERRICO COUNTY), who sold the land to BOCER GREEN who promoted the Dodd's Old South, pp. 220). The name of the wife of CAPT, THOMAS HARRIS was DIANA. His widow, after his death, married (And) VILLIAM FOSTER, and finally, HEDMAS WHITE. With her om JUH AND STETCH IN NORTH CAPTING A THE STEEL SET OF THE ried WILLIAM FOSTER in 1675. died 1666 (3-274 MCHAO Reg.)

EDJAHD HARRIS, probably a brother of CAPT. THOMAS HARRIS, of Virginia. On November 23, 1638, in LUNDER, ENGLADD, EDWALDD, ENGLAD HARRIS was the sole legates, the executor and "kinszam" of JUDITH HERNETT, the viden of RICHARD HERNETT, who died in VIRGINIA, Angust 28, 1626. It is not improbable that JUDITH HERNETT, the viden, was born a HARRIS. (See Boddie's I'Vth Century Isle of Wight pp: 270-272.). The same suthority shows that this RICHARD HERNETT, whose wife was possibly JUDITH HARRIS, was an uncle of GOV. RICHARD BENNETT, and brother of EDVARD BENNETT. the father of STLVESTRA HILL and MART BLAND; thus the connection of the HARRIS FAMILY to the HILLS and EENERTS shows up. This connection is supplemented by other connections that will follow. CHRISTOPER HABELS who on January 30, 1659 in YORK COUNTY, with JUEN STANDF (7), ROBERT HARELS AND JUEN COUNTY, suppraised the estate of FRANCIS MERKLER, the step-father of ROBERT HARELSON 18 wife, was perhaps also connected with this HARRIS FAMILY of London and Virginia. The name of CHRISTOPHER HARRIS appears on the tax rolls of GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C., and CHRISTOPHER HARRIS WILLIAMS was the father or Grandfather of HON. JOHN SHAMP WILLIAMS, of Mississippi (See WILLIAMS family herein.)

- 3, THOMAS HARRIS who married ALICE WEST, LATER SOJOURNER, and left a will in ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY in March, 1672 (Vol. 7, W & M. (1) about p. 200-240), in which he mentioned only two soms JOHN HARRIS and THOMAS HARRIS, his daughter MARY and other children. It is in the review of his family that we again oun across the connection with the HILLS and BENNETTS, with evidence to add to what has been given. From other records we find he had children:

JOHN JERNIEGS (it is presumed) after the death of MARTHA HARRIS, married one of the daughters of MAJ. HICHOLAS HILL, and a grand-daughter of EDVARD ENVETT.

- 6. THOMAS HARRIS, whose wife was apparently a MARTIN, left will in ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY VIRGINIA dated OCTORER 9, 1688 which will shows that he had the following children:

The oldest son, KDWARD HARRIS, was made the executor of this will, according to the abstract which was found by the writer. In the account of the descendants of the children of the testator, the name of ROMET HARRIS, who played so prominent a part in the political his-tory of GRANVILLE COUNTY along during the last half of the wighteenth century, has not been found, but that is because only the descendants of 10. EDWARD HARRIS have been found (and not all of them). This ROBERT HARRIS of GRANVILLE certainly belonged in this family.

10. EDWARD HARRIS (son of THOMAS HARRIS, son of THOMAS HARRIS and ALICE MEST) married MAXT, and died leaving a will in 1813 OF WIGHT COURTY, Virginia, March 25, 1734, from which the names of his children appear to have been



The initialed symbols after the name represent the DISTRICT where the sacessment was made, but often the person assessed had property in more than one district, which explains why the same name is sometimes repeated. According to the Assessment rolls to 1788, by far the largest land owner in GRANVILE County at that period was THOMAS FERSON, ESQ, whose name appears in the GOSERN DISTRICT in the Western part of the present GRANVILE COUNTY. His granville County holdings amounted to 34,760 acres; in addition he owned 55,546 acres in Warren and 1,000 acres in another tract in that country 5,447 acres in Franklin, 8825 acres in Caswell, 8,000 in Ealifax and 15,417 acres in SUMMER and GREEN COUNTIES on the "Western Waters" - Temmesses.

Other large land owners in the GOSERN DISTRICT were THOMAS GRAFT, with 1690 acres, JUHN YERON 1537 acres, CHESLEY DAVIEL with his "Tranquility" tract, containing 1250 acres; GERES WADE had 1010 acres, JUHN KNOTT 1190 acres, JUHN CHEST JR. 1006, with AMPHOSE BARGER, CHARLES HARRIS, THOMAS FOOL, WILLIAM PAIMER, SAMUEL FOINTER and ROHERT HESTER, each having over 500, but less than 1000 acres.

JUHN DICKERSON, of FISHING CHEEK owned 4579 acres, and JUHN FRACE, SR. and THOMAS NEWEY SR. each had 900 acres in this District, while SANDEL WALKER had 978 acres. DANIEL HUNT and THOMAS TORK had around 700 acres.

CHARLES PORTER was the largest land owner in ENAP O' LEED'S DISTRICT, he having 5000 acres; ZEB VEAST had 3587 acres, JOSEPH MANGUM 1206, ISRAEL EASTWOOD 1117 and HOWLAND GOOCH, whose assessment was in the name of "HOLLE GOOCH" had 832% acres of land.

owned 4224 acres and ANDERSON and SAMUEL SMITH of the ARRAHAM PLAINS DISTRICT were well to do; SAMUEL SMITH owned 4224 acres and ANDERSON 2683 acres; HOVELL LETTS came next with two tracts comprising a total of 3465 acres, while TEDMAS MUTTER had 2560 acres, including some of the lands in the town of CLICHD. MARY GRAVES, the widow of JOHN W. GRAVES, who afterwards married JOHN WILLIAMS DANIEL, of MARKEN COUNTY owned 1212 acres, ERRHY GRAVES had 983 acres, JULIATEAN KNIGHH 682 acres and RAITER DAVIS 1057 acres. JAMES DOWNEY owned 1818 acres and JAME MYTCHELL 102 acres.

SOLOMON and ABSOLOM DAVIS had nearly 1000 acres each.

EROMFIELD RIDLET was the largest land owner in RAGLAND DISTRICT, with 1714 acres, and GEORGE HARRIS had 1437 and JOHN MEDDIE 1115.

HON. ROMERT BURTON headed the list of big land owners in the HEVDERSON DISTRICT (on NUTBUR CREEK) with 3854 acres, while his father in law JUDGE JURN WILLIAMS came next with lands aggregating 2406 acres; RICHARD HENDERSON had 1250 acres, and THOMAS SATTERWHITE and DAVID MITCHELL came next.

JUSTRY TAYLOR owned over 5000 acres in the OLYGRD DISTRICT, SOLDMOR WALKER 2000 and ED-WARD TAYLOR Sr. about 2000 acres.

WILLIAM GILL had 1670 acres on TAR HIVER (DISTRICT) with 2200 in TERRESSE; JOHN WASH-INGTON owned 1247 acres. MICLIAH BULLOCK owned 4040 acres in DUTCH DISTRICT.

GENEALOGY OF WARREN COUNTY, N. C.

PARTER and FRANKLIN COUNTIES were both a part of old BUTE COUNTY, which came out of GRAINTHINE'S original territory in 1764, and existed for FURTERN TARS, but went out of existence when TRAMEN AND FRANKLIN were created. SPAN - VILLE, of SEUTS, came from EDECOMMES was territory in 1766, sewer years after the date that I was in 1786, sewer years after the date that MARCHAN, FURASANT HENDERSON and JOHN FULLIAMS DANIES madetheir report as Commissioners to run the line between GRAVILLE and WARREN (See page 210 herein). They this was so long delayed is not explained by any record we have found.

So, WARREN COUNTY, of course, was part of COLONIAL GRAFFILE COUNTY, as was ERAMALIN, its neighbor below.

JOHN FILLIAMS DANTEL, one of the Commissioners to run the line between GRAVILLE and MARKET COUNTERS, lived in MARKET COUNTY, though he was the son of MARY ENVIEL, who died in GRAVILLE in 1765 leaving a will (p. 212); Ho died in Warren County in the year 1808, leaving a will that was probated in May, 1809, of which the following is an abstract:

From a deed record in Deed Book 14, of Warren County we learn that the husband of the daughter MARTHA (DANIEL) VAUGHAN was one VIE-CENT VAUGHAN.

(The name of VINCENT VAUGHEN appears on the Quit Bent Rolls of MEN KENT COURTS, Vir ginia in 1704).

ARE RAY. Her will appears on the records of Warren County dated in May, 1795 (Yel. 8, p. 336), in which she mentions the following legatess:

Hancy Rodwell. Betty Gardner Mary Pryor Patty Myrick.

JUMN LYNCH. The will of JUNN LYNCH is in Vol 3 p. 8 of the Warren County records, in which he mentions only one legatest

David Lynch.

JOSEPH LYEDSAY. His will was effered for probate in Warren County in March, 1794, and in it he mentions only three children of legatees, as follows:

> Caleb Lindsay Rachel Idadsay Laben Idadsay.

This ADEREM LINDAN lived in NURSUAE DIS-TRICT in Granville County in 1756, and he is mentioned in the diary of the Rev. High Modden who "went home with him" when on his tour through Granville County in that year. It was white on this visit to JOREFI LINDAN that the Rev. Madden wrote his impressions of the people of the Butbush section of Granville County, mentioned in Theeler's and other North Carolina books.

WILLIAM DANGEL left a nuncupative will which was probated in Warrer COURT, on November 24, 1794, in which he left all his property to be equally divided between Edmand Smith, Howell Mose, Joseph Runiel and John Daniel. This will was proven by the orth of Marry x Floring and Daniel Key

The wife of Daniel Key was Sallie Daniel the damphter of Joseph Daniel, but they were not sarried until 1796, two years after this will was proven. (p. 225).

On August 28, 1795, a legates of WILLIAMS DANTER, deceased * * three surveys of land of 94 3/4 acres; also surveyed to Howell Moss, and the said John Daniel having bought said Howell Moss's part; 95 3/4 acres surveyed to Joseph Daniel and the same amount to Edmund Saith. Signed by

THE SADOUR DANIEL FAMILY - WARREN

ZADOCK DANIEL, the son of JUES WILLIAMS DAWIEL of WARRIES COURTY (p. 302) married ELIZABETH LEWIS in GRANVILLE COURTY, W. C. July 26, 1792. One of his some wrote the following account of the family June 26, in 1879:

"ZADOGE DANIEL, my father, married MLIS-ABETH LEWIS, of GRANVILLE COUNTY, N. C. on the 26th day of July, 1792. She was born on March 20, 1777, and died March 5, 1826. Her mother's name was ANDERSON and her father was JAMES LEWIS, and they had two sons, VILLIAN & JAMES LEWIS, by great grand-mother's name was FARRIS CLARK. She had two sons who left no issue, and had seven or eight daughters, who married into the best femilies of VIRILE-IA and MORTH CAROLINA, namely, the TAYLORS, VEHABLES and MUSTS. I am proud of my LEWIS and AMDERSON blood, for no grander man or nobler woman ever existed."

THE WILLIAM EATON PAMILT OF WARREN COUNTY

COL. WILLIAM EATON patented lands in what was then GRANVILLE COUNTY in 1746 about the time the county was erected from territory taken from EDGECOMME. He was Colonel of the GRANVILLE COUNTY Regiment of Militia (p. 291), and was the main leader in the organization of the County with EDWARD JONES (p. 209). He died in 1759 and his will was probated in GRANVILLE COUNTY on March 20th of that year (p. 42-43 of this work and Grimes' Abstracts p. 108.) His will names childrens

The family genealogy of COL. WILLIAM RATON will be found on page 43 of the Index & Digest to Hathaway's made a part of this work when finally completed. The descendants of Col. William Eston (some of them, at least) still reside in WARREN COUNTY. The old Faton home is located at 306 North Main Street in the town of WARRESTON. It was built in 1843 by a WILLIAM EATON SR. who was perhaps a grandson or great grandson of COL. EATON of the above will. He 1s accredited with being perhaps the wealthiest owner of lands and slaves on the Rosnoke River & is said to have built this place as a summer home for his daughter ELIA.

ELLA EATON, in his old age, become the wife of HON, FETER HANSEOROUSH HELL, a retired Governor of Texas (1849-1854) who in his older days became impoverished, which fact, when made known to the people of Texas, resulted in a Legislative pension being granted to tide him over the remainder of his life, though he did not live long afterwards. PETER HANSDORO INIL was a native of Virginia and related to the femily of the same name who jettled in GRATVILLE COUNTY. (See page 214).
