HISTORICAL STATISTICS.



The North Reformed Dutch Church of Newark, N. J. was organized by the Classis of Bergen, at the house of Hon. J. P. Bradley, December 17, 1856, and embraced at its foundation thirty-five members. The congregation worshiped in Oraton Hall from the time of its organization until Sunday, April 17th, 1859, when its present edifice in Broad street was dedicated. The first minister, the Rev. ABRAHAM POLHEMUS, D. D., of Hopewell N. Y., called six days after the organization of the church, was installed the third day of May, 1857, in the First Dutch Church in Market Street, and continued in charge of the church until the 28th of October, of the same year when he died.

He was succeeded, after the lapse of a year and a half, by the Rev. HASBROUCK DUBOIS, who was installed the sixteenth of June, 1859, and resigned the twenty-sixth of November, 1861, after a pastorate of a little over two years and five months.

The Rev. MR. DUBOIS was succeeded, after the lapse of

two years, by the Rev. James Demarest, Jr., of Hackensack, N. J., who was installed in October, 1863, and resigned January, 1866, to take charge of the Second Reformed Church of Chicago, after a pastorate of two years and a quarter. He was succeeded by the present pastor, Rev. Charles E. Hart, of New York, who was installed the third day of June, (1866.)

The tenth anniversary of the Church, was held December 30th, 1866, at which an historical sketch was prepared and read by Hon. Joseph P. Bradley, and a financial report by Peter S. Duryee, Esq. Addresses were made by Hon. F. T. Frelinghuysen and Rev. Dr. Wm. H. Cambell.

CHURCH NOTICES.



Two services are held during the week, the one for devotion on Tuesday evening, the other for instruction on Thursday evening. A young people's prayer meeting is held on Sunday afternoon at 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ o'clock. The Preparatory Lecture is delivered on the Friday evening before communion.

The Sacrament of the LORD'S SUPPER is administered in the morning of the first Sabbath of March, June, September and December.

The Sacrament of BAPTISM is administered either at the preparatory lecture, or in the morning of the Sunday following each communion, or on the first Sunday of each month. Other opportunities can be secured by arrangement with the pastor.

Private baptism is allowed only in extreme cases.

Parents are earnestly requested to read the form of baptism in the liturgy of the Reformed Church before the baptism of their children.

DATE OF ITS BIRTH, AND THE NAMES OF THE PARENTS SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE PASTOR IN WRITING.

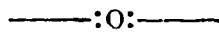
Applications for admission to the full communion of the church should be made at the meeting of the elders, held at the close of the preparatory lecture. A PREVIOUS INTERVIEW WITH THE PASTOR ON THE SUBJECT SHOULD BE SOUGHT.

Persons needing the pastor's services on account of sickness or affliction, or for religious conversation, are desired to communicate directly with him. MEMBERS OF THE CONGREGATION CHANGING THEIR RESIDENCE, ARE REQUESTED TO INFORM THE PASTOR IN WRITING.

The pastor holds three public receptions of the congregation during the year in the upper room of the chapel, to which all in the congregation are cordially invited.

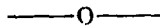
There is an Annual Meeting of the congregation on the first of January, to receive the report of the consistory on the affairs of the church.

The church employs a lady missionary for the parish. Her work embraces a visitation of the needy, and the direction of two stated neighborhood prayer meetings, one of which is sustained by the Young Men's Christian Union.

A mission school is held Sunday morning at 9 o'clock in the Sunday school room of the chapel.
