The Two Purposes


¶ This book comes to you to accomplish two distinct things, namely: to act as a Buyer's Guide and to supply Industrial Data. Conditions change rapidly in a city of Rochester's size and statistics that were correct when compiled may have varied somewhat by the time the book is published; by their nature they must always be a little behind the facts, but we have used every precaution to be right.

¶ The city has over 1700 manufacturing establishments, exclusive of repair shops and places of a like nature. These establishments can be classified under 377 branches of production. The trade mark of the city is, "Rochester Made Means Quality" and it is our positive belief that the truth thus set forth is applicable to every one of the products listed. We hold that IN ITS CLASS, A ROCHESTER PRODUCT IS THE STANDARD OF MANUFACTURE. It is a broad statement, but it has proved itself many times. As this is so, the list of manufacturers in this book will prove a valuable buyer's guide. It is a unique list because it brings together in one place, information that has hitherto been scattered and hard to find.

¶ Many manufacturers are considering Rochester as a most desirable place to locate. Others are thinking of making their sales and distributing agencies here. These men must have data to base their decisions on; they must not only feel that Rochester is the place for them, but they must know the reason for their feeling. The statistics given on the following pages will aid a man in reaching his conclusions. The success of the manufacturing industries now located in Rochester is such that outsiders are seriously considering whether there are not reasons, in addition to business acumen, that have contributed to it and this book, treating of markets, raw material supplies, transportation, labor, power, finance and living conditions will, in some degree answer these considerations.

¶ The larger number of factories in Rochester are managed and owned by men who have grown up with the city, the people who feel a loyalty to their "home town." These men live in Rochester and are in close touch with their interests. They make themselves responsible for the choice of men who work for them, they encourage these men to own their homes, they often help finance these home-owning plans of their workmen.


¶ On the pages following, we have tried to show the industries of Rochester, the opportunities for growth and the possibilities for manufacturers who desire to obtain for themselves the best possible location. The Rochester Chamber of Commerce offers its services to any inquirer. It can give unprejudiced information regarding locations, railroad statistics and market advantages which cannot be handled in type. It can speak with authority for the commercial interests of the city and, living up to its slogan, will "Do it for Rochester."

Market for Products

Rochester is located in the richest agricultural county in New York State and the second richest in the United States in point of productiveness. Monroe County with the five surrounding counties has a population of over 533,000 and this represents a very prosperous buying public which does its trading in Rochester through the medium of the excellent steam and electric car service.

A circle drawn with a radius of 85 miles of Rochester embraces a population of over 1,900,000 and this territory is worked with marked success by many of the manufacturers. Of course, New York State is the largest state in the Union in the matter of population. A second circle with a radius of 750 miles embraces a population of about 65,000,000, or about 70% of the total population of the United States, not including Canada. Were you to draw a line from Rochester to Atlanta, Ga., dividing the United States into two sections, east and west, the population would figure, roughly, 38,000,000 east of Rochester and 52,000,000 west. This figure arrangement is not so valuable as the other, but it serves as an indication of the location of the city with regard to the population of the country.

Rochester's Reputation

¶ Rochester products sell everywhere in the United States and in foreign countries. Two important reasons enter, in addition to the selling methods of the individual manufactures. The first is the strategic shipping point. In every direction, Rochester is in close touch with the market. Five trunk line railroads together with canal and lake shipping facilities make it possible to reach all points east of the Mississippi in a very short time.

Trade

¶ Rochester's reputation among the people of this country is worth dwelling on. A short time ago, a Southern newspaper published an editorial on the fact that many of the stores of that city sold Rochester-made goods and placarded them as such, using the fact as a sales argument. It commented on the value of a reputation of such strength. This reputation has probably touched you at some point or other. Some one has told you—you may have told some one, that Rochester made goods were dependable, that they were made under conditions as nearly approaching the ideal as possible and that it was safe to buy when a Rochester address was given.

Export

¶ The government census places the population of this country at a little over ninety million. You can create an image in your mind of 25% of these people familiar, in some degree, with the Rochester reputation and passing it on to their friends. A mention should be made of the large number of national advertisers in Rochester—this is only possible with very high grade products. The next time you pick up a magazine, look at the addresses and note the large number of Rochester manufacturers.


¶ Many of the magazines that circulate in foreign countries have special departments devoted to Rochester-made goods. One magazine exists solely for the exploitation of Rochester products. The Dominion of Canada, Europe, South America, and especially Australia, have been and are strong markets for our goods and we can make this statement without reservation; namely, the Rochester manufacturer has the civilized world as the market for his products.

Raw Material Supply

¶ Raw materials for the purpose of manufacture can be broadly classified under five heads, viz.: metal, wood, leather, wool and cotton. With these at hand, a manufacturer has the foundations of his product. The item of the cost of transportation of these materials from their markets to the factory is a vital one and it must be considered in its equalized sense. A man may be near the source of his supply and save greatly on the raw material and yet find his final cost too heavy for competitive purposes because he is far away from his market and power supply.

¶ If a representation of rates on raw materials, finished products, and power costs were shown graphically, Rochester would be found very near the exact centre of the chart. The small map shows this convincingly and shows, as well, that we are within reaching distance of the places these raw materials come from.

¶ The metals are very important. Iron ore is obtained direct from the Lake Superior district, while pig-iron comes a short distance from Pittsburgh, Buffalo and at the furnaces at Charlotte, seven miles from the city.

Lumber

Copper comes by lake boat from the Upper Peninsula of Michigan and the Lake Superior district. Aluminum is produced in the state in several places as well as in Pennsylvania and Ohio. Steel comes from Pittsburgh and Gary without re-handling.

¶ The forests of Canada are just across the Lake. Wisconsin and New England are still sources of lumber supply and are about equally distant from Rochester. The cypress of the South is within a few days reach and this wood is becoming more and more used as well as Georgia pine.

Leather Wool Cotton

¶ Boston is the wool and partly the leather market of the country and twenty-four hour shipments are regular. St. Louis, as well, is on the direct trunk line system with Rochester. New England and the South supply the finished cotton cloth. . .

Soil

¶ The soil surrounding Rochester is of wonderful fertility and it has been stated on good authority that Western New York is the equal of any place in the world for the raising of fruit, grain, potatoes and garden truck. This makes the city a good place for canneries, cold storage plants, etc.

¶ Coal, coming under the head of power, is treated under another section.

Transportation Facilities

¶ A railway map of the United States is one degree worse than no map at all because it is such a tangle of twisted lines. The following schedule and outline will show clearly the excellent railway communication enjoyed by Rochester.

Points

¶ Two important things in connection with the shipping facilities are to be considered in Rochester. The first is that the magnitude of the business of Rochester makes it possible for the various railroads to load daily through merchandise cars to all principal points in the country. Second, while we are on the main line of but two of the roads, yet the freight shipments out of Rochester intercept the main lines of the other roads at short distances from the city and are picked up by the fast freights.

¶ The New York Central Lines have seventeen divisions and cover twelve States, giving direct communication with about 3400 cities and towns.

¶ The Erie Railroad from New York to Chicago covers five States, and gives Rochester a connection with 880 cities and towns.

¶ The Lehigh Valley, covering the territory from New York to Buffalo by another route, taps the coal regions, and gives a list of 465 cities and towns.

¶ The Pennsylvania Railroad System puts us in touch with twelve States, and does not duplicate the service of any of the other roads. There are twenty-one divisions, which give us access to about 2900 cities and towns.

Transportation Facilities—Continued

Direct Communica- tion

¶ While the mileage of the Buffalo, Rochester & Pittsburgh Railway is not so large as some of the others—its importance to Rochester is not to be estimated on that basis. It gives direct and speedy communication through its affiliations with other roads to all the principal points of consumption and production. This road reaches direct immense coal fields of Western Pennsylvania. Rochester owes much to this road and the help it has been to the industrial development of the city.

The Ontario Car Ferry Co., a facility of the Buffalo, Rochester & Pittsburgh Railway, furnishes quick transit to and from Canadian points, and brings Canada readily in direct communication with Rochester.

¶ The total number of centres of distribution covered by these five railroads is over 7800 in fourteen States. This data pertains only to the DIRECT railroad systems. In addition, of course, are all the many adequate connections to the South and West. The intention is to show that shipments can travel on the same line in which they started, to a vast number of places.

¶ The Lake service is increasing its efficiency every year, and presents wonderful possibilities for the future. The Erie Canal now, with a water frontage of almost thirteen miles, and soon the Barge Canal will give a waterway connection with the Great Lakes and the Hudson River, of enormous value.

An Actual Experience

" . . . conditions were very thoroughly investigated by the writer, for our company, before we decided to locate our business in Rochester, and the decision to locate here was based upon our belief that the combination of conditions was just about as good as could be had in any locality, and up to the present time we have had no cause to regret having built our plant in Rochester.

¶ "The railroad facilities are excellent—in fact, we believe are very seldom, if ever, excelled—we having direct connection to the tracks of the New York Central, B., R. & P., and Pennsylvania roads. Electric power is supplied by the Rochester Railway & Light Co. from Niagara Falls, which is most satisfactory, and the rates charged, reasonable. We have had no trouble whatever in securing all of the labor required for the operation of our plant, even though working under unfavorable conditions in the beginning of operations."

—Extract from a letter to an inquirer from The T. H. Symington Company which located here recently.

Labor Conditions

¶ The nearest one can come to writing about labor conditions and be authoritative is to give the environment and conditions under which labor is performed and in which the worker lives. In the end, labor reflects its living and working facilities.

¶ Rochester's population is about 225,000. About 50,000 are native born, of German extraction. Twenty-five thousand of other nationalities, mostly Italian, complete the list. Only about 5,000 of our people are foreign-born. From this it will be seen that Rochester is essentially an American city, with the best of the traditions and customs of the German added, making a most satisfactory result.

¶ Sixty-five per cent. of the workmen of the city own their homes. The city has no slums, no wretched places where people are hived together. The growth is not crowded in any one place, there is room in every section for healthy expansion and this is going on all the time. During the year 1910 about 2,000 dwellings were built in Rochester, representing an outlay of \$6,303,009.00. The surrounding population is strongly agricultural of the highest type, the modern business farmer.

¶ The working conditions are exceptional—perhaps no city in the United States is so remarkably up to date in its factory buildings. This applies to all branches of industry, machine shops and foundries included. Almost all of the factories are modern in construction, embodying every convenience and improvement that has been devised. This means that the working people are considered in the plans of the manufacturer.

¶ It may be well to make clear here that Rochester does not desire new industries regardless of conditions. The mere piling up of factories with no thought to the effect on the city and the workers has no place in our plan. For every reason we believe it better that what we have and what we add should be profitable both to the proprietors and to the workers—which in the end means to the city.

Chief Industries

Advantages

¶ This by no means includes all of the workers in the city, but it gives an idea of the larger groups. Even these figures fluctuate at different seasons of the year. In all, there are over 75,000 workers in the city, of a very high class, practically no child labor, and the women workers are well taken care of. Rochester is a good place for a good man to work, and a discouraging place for an undesirable man.

¶ Factories are spread over the city along the railroads, and there are no natural or artificial limitations to the growth in any direction except Lake Ontario, seven miles away, thus permitting the workmen to live economically near their places of employment. This also prevents marked tides of travel, with the consequent attendant inconvenience of delays and overcrowding.

Power Supply

¶ The two sources of power in Rochester are coal and water. The coal comes from nearby Pennsylvania by several direct lines, and we thus have prompt service and a very low price in comparison with many other cities.

¶ Rochester is called the Power City, with good reason. The Genesee River runs through the middle of the city, and the water power developed into electrical energy. Within the city limits, the River has a total fall of 256 feet. Electric power is available from the central station at rates considerably below those of most other cities. It is obtained from three sources—local water power to be reinforced by a large storage reservoir as authorized by the State Legislature and the State Water Supply Commission, Niagara power and steam.

¶ Electric power must be continuous and adequate and through these three sources above named, this city is assured of such service.

* * * * *

Rochester's Credit

¶ The Census Bureau has recently published statistics on the indebtedness of the cities of the United States, the rates of interest paid, and other facts in connection with the credit of various municipalities. They are especially interesting in connection with industrial analysis, for they place the financial credit of this city in a very satisfactory light.

¶ The report divides the cities according to their population into those of 300,000 and over; cities from 100,000 to 300,000; from 50,000 to 100,000, and from 30,000 to 50,000. The lowest rate of interest paid by any city is that of Washington, D. C., which is in the over-300,000 class, the rate being 3.2%. The next lowest are Rochester and Hartford, Connecticut. Both are put at 3.6%. That is to say—of all the cities of the United States, Washington, the seat of government, is the only one which is able to obtain money at a lower rate of interest than Rochester, and there is but one other that can get its money at the same rate as Rochester.

¶ The comparison with Washington is not exactly a fair one—the seat of government, backed by the credit of the United States, and governed by Congress, places that city out of the class of municipalities. Taking this into consideration, Rochester's financial credit would be equalled by only one city in the country, and exceeded by none.



Assessed Valuation

¶ The assessed valuation of the City of Rochester—which is a comparatively low one—taken from the Comptroller's Report of June 30, 1910, is \$161,000,000. The city tax rate for 1910 was \$19.32 per thousand. The county tax in 1909 was \$3.86 per thousand. There are two townships near the city line in which several factories are located and we give these tax rates as well. Gates township for 1909, \$7.03, and Brighton was \$8.10 in 1909.

Financial Conditions

¶ The history of Rochester's remarkable commercial progress during the past decade can be read in the record of its financial institutions. Upon the stability of these institutions rests the entire structure of the business of the city. There has been no greater factor in the steady and prosperous development of Rochester, nothing that has done so much to attract growing industries and capital of careful investors, as the high reputation borne by the banks of this city. In financial prominence, Rochester ranks among the foremost cities of the country. To every enterprise for which she bids, to every industry for which she opens her doors, she offers a telling argument in the solidity of her banking institutions.

¶ A reciprocal reason for the stability of both manufacturer and bank is the diversity of manufactured products in Rochester. No one trade dominates the city—the manufacturing is divided over so many classes of demand that market depressions in one line are felt by a small group only. The city is not dependent on one industry only. There is a busy season in some line all the time. This condition gives elasticity to financial transactions. In addition, there is a very wealthy agricultural territory surrounding Rochester, the farmers of which in a large number of cases, do their banking in Rochester. These men are not directly dependent on industrial conditions and serve to keep the balance even.

¶ The living conditions in Rochester have been very fully covered in a previous publication called "Rochester, the Flower City," which will be forwarded to any address upon the receipt of twelve cents. Little more than a crystallization of the facts contained can be attempted here, as it is a big subject in itself.

¶ Rochester is a healthy city. The climate is good, especially is it delightful in summer. The fresh air from the Lake is invigorating, and saves us from the extremes of heat so often met in inland cities. The work of the Health Board in the matter of milk inspection alone has placed the city at the head of the list in the care of its food supply. The water supply comes from Hemlock Lake, about thirty miles south of the city, in the open hill country, and the water is soft and pure, uncontaminated in any way.

¶ The school system is on the soundest basis—adequate room and splendid equipment. In both the grade and high schools the curriculum is in accord with the best educational judgment. Rochester is noted for its trade schools, of which there are several that have been cited as examples of educational helpfulness. All the religions of the Christian world are represented in the city, and there are 132 churches.

¶ There are fifteen small and five large parks in Rochester, affording every kind of outdoor recreation, and during the summer the now famous Park Band gives several concerts of excellent music each week, moving from Park to Park on different days. The parks and the trees that line almost all of the streets make a city of fresh air and cool shade. The streets of the city are well paved and kept in excellent condition. There are few houses of the tenement type, the single or double house still being the unit of building construction. Compared to many cities, rents are high, running from \$15 to \$35 a month, but in point of the value given they are reasonable, and this condition keeps the city free from the floating and

undesirable population that is a detriment to any city. The street railway system covers the city very thoroughly, and the frequent service in all directions makes speedy communication possible. To those coming from other cities, accustomed to riding in the trolleys for the better part of an hour to go to and from their work, Rochester is a distinct relief, because the average time of any one trip is about fifteen minutes.

¶ The Government Census of 1905 (the latest procurable for comparative tables) shows the following figures for the death rate per thousand for all causes in the cities named:

¶ These figures are the average of the years between 1901 and 1905 and since that time Rochester's rate has fallen to 13.7, showing a distinct gain. This rate is the lowest of any large city in New York State and, excepting three communities of from 5,000 to 30,000, the lowest of ANY city or town in the State.

¶ The opportunities for amusement both in summer and winter are varied and of a sufficient scope to satisfy the purse and the taste of all who live here. The city has a number of theatres, eight in all of all classes, and the River and Park System provide the healthy out-of-door recreation so vital to the well being of the people. The summer places are orderly, amusing and of a much higher class than is usual. The proximity of Lake Ontario gives the double pleasure of land and water sport under the most favorable conditions.


