

Tribute to Ars. Perkins

And now Mrs. Gilman H. Perkins has gone.

Her indomitable will ever resisted physical ailments. Like an emperor, she believed she should die standing: "A king of France may die; he is never ill."

Into the green lanes of eternal springtime has passed a wonderful woman. With the heart of a girl, the courage of a man, the spirit of a hero, Mrs. Perkins has lived out the fullness of her time. All that a mother could be she was. All that ripened womanhood could win she accomplished. Beloved, honored, revered, at last she waved her world farewell, and with calm, level eyes crossed the western sunset into the final glory of her God.

True in every relationship of life she has won the heavenly welcome: "Well done, good and faithful servant; enter thou into the joy of thy Lord."

What she was in her family life is sacred: "Her children rise up and call her blessed."

What she was in good works is reflected in the civic and social welfare organizations to which she gave her heart and which she vitalized by her tireless energy. To advise with Mrs. Perkins was to receive inspiration. Quick to perceive, firm in decision, decided in opinion, she was a tower of strength in any good cause.

How can we gauge the influence of such a life? The cunning hand of man cannot devise instrument of precision to weigh the influence of lofty character. Radiance of soul is measured only by eternal standards. Our human hearts can only love and miss her.

Mrs. Perkins again demonstrated that worthy institutions are but the lengthened shadow of some personality. The Rochester Historical Society was, in a peculiar way, the child of her brain. She was the Founder, she was the life Honorary President. To the four walls of her hospitable home for years she summoned the leading men and women of Rochester to study the history and

plan for the welfare of her city. For over thirty years she has given her best thought to establishing, on an enduring basis, an historical society worthy to preserve the great record of our civic deeds.

She left the Rochester Historical Society as her living, corporate being; an agency to guard and cherish the soul of Rochester, expressed in the achievement of its citizens.

Every resident of Rochester is her debtor because of this accomplishment. She was proud of her city. She loved its men and women. She gloried in our past and was determined that the record should be guarded with holy zeal for the benefit of posterity.

From her failing hands she has tossed the torch of high endeavor. We shall not fail to seize and carry on.

Representing the society, and the citizens of Rochester, the members of the Board of Managers of the Rochester Historical Society memorialize the life of Mrs. Gilman H. Perkins. By every expression of honor, by every tribute of love, we speak her name.

Her hail and farewell is both sorrow and great joy. She dies to the sound of music. She has won her day. Though we greet her no more she has set up her standards. A noble life, crowned with heroic death, rises above and outlives all earthly pomp.

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Introduction

The Rochester Historical Society was founded December 17, 1887, and incorporated June 1, 1888, as the legal custodian of all matters pertaining to the history of the City of Rochester. From the date of the founding of the Society many of Rochester's most distinguished citizens have given their efforts toward preserving and furthering the historic worth and dignity of our community. From small beginnings—even as our own beloved city—the Society has grown to its present condition of prosperity. Our collections now properly cared for by the munificence of the city administration at Exposition Park, are splendidly displayed, and are constantly growing in size and interest. While as yet possessing no Endowment Fund, still the liberal spirit of the members has enabled the Board of Managers to carry forward its activities vigorously. It is your friendly support and kindly interest which enables your officers to advance the interests of the Society, and encourages them in their zealous efforts to enlarge its activities.

The Rochester Historical Society is the repository of countless manuscripts, scrap books, letters and records, covering all phases of Rochester's history. We seek constantly to add to and enlarge this collection, in order that the future historian may find full and ample material upon which to build a complete and authoritative story of the advancement of civilization in the Genesee Valley, and to that end as corporate trustee we collect and preserve relics, pictures, books and documents pertaining to the past and present activities of the people of Rochester-and we urge that all remember the Society when disposing of these things. The Rochester Historical Society represents the best citizenship of our community. The continuance of your support is particularly desired in order that the Society may reach its full usefulness in the service of our city.

Managers

Since the last publication of the Handbook the Board of Managers has been increased twice. On February 28, 1919 the number was raised from nine to eleven members, the five officers, four other members to be appointed annually by the President, and the last two retiring Presidents ex-officio. On March 11, 1920 it was increased to twelve by the addition of a Second Vice-President, making six elected officers, four other members appointed by the President and two Presidents ex-officio.

Constitution and By-Laws of The Rochester Historical Society

- 1. This Society shall be called "The Rochester Historical Society."
- 2. The object of the Society shall be to obtain and preserve all relics and documents relating to the early history of the city of Rochester and the adjacent country, to secure the composition and reading of papers relating to the same, and preservation thereof, and to promote interest in the early history of Rochester.
- 3. Active members shall reside within the county of Monroe, New York.

Persons who have conspicuously served the Society or who have otherwise done important historical work may be elected honorary members.

Corresponding members may be elected from non-residents of the county of Monroe who desire to promote

the interests of the Society.

Honorary and corresponding members shall not be eligible to office, nor be qualified to vote, nor be entitled to any share in the ownership of property of the Society, nor be liable for any dues or for any debts.

- 4. The officers of the Society shall consist of a president, a first vice-president, a second vice-president, a corresponding secretary and a treasurer. These officers shall be elected annually and by ballot by the Society and shall continue in office until their successors are elected. Vacancies in office may be filled by election at any regular meeting of the Society.—(As amended Feb. 12, 1920.)
- 5. There shall be a Board of Managers which shall consist of the president, vice-presidents, treasurer, recording secretary, corresponding secretary, together with four other members to be appointed annually by the president. And in addition to the Board so constituted the last two retiring presidents shall be members, ex-officio, of the said Board of Managers. The duties of the Board shall be to conduct the business affairs of the Society.—(As amended Feb. 19, 1919.)
- 6. The President shall appoint annually from the Board of Managers an Executive Committee, consisting of the Treasurer, ex-officio, and two other members,

which committee shall have charge of the finances of the Society. No debts shall be contracted by any officer or member of said Society except upon the recommendation of said committee, nor shall any bill be paid unless it bears the approving signatures of at least two members of said committee, and this committee shall regulate the dues, expenses and disbursements of said Society and may at its discretion compromise arrearages or remit dues of members for just cause.

Upon this Executive Committee shall also devolve the administration of the ordinary affairs of the Society, subject to the authority of the Board of Managers, and such other duties as the President may

determine.—(As amended Jan. 29, 1919.)

7. The President shall appoint annually from the members of the Board of Managers, a Library Committee on Papers, a Committee on Entertainment and such other standing committees as the needs and interests of the Society may seem to indicate.

8. The Library Committee shall consist of three members, which committee shall have the custody of the library and historical collections, including all books, manuscripts, papers, pictures, documents, relics, coins and maps, and shall have charge of the sale of duplicates, subject to the direction and approval of the Board of Managers. And the said Library Committee shall be empowered to employ a Librarian or other assistants at such compensation as the Board of Man-

agers shall sanction and direct.

It shall be the duty of such Librarian to attend and keep the library and collections of the Society open at such times and seasons as the library committee shall direct, to prepare and keep up a suitable catalogue of the library and other collections, and to keep a record of the donation and purchase of such books, manuscripts, pamphiets, papers and historical material as may be or become the property of the Society, and to perform such other duties, clerical or otherwise, as the Library Committee may direct. The said Library Committee may, at its discretion and with the approval of the Board of Managers, divide the duties of Librarian, as above defined, and appoint a Curator who shall have charge of the archaeological and historical collections of the Society, other than the library.

- 9. The Committee on Papers shall consist of three members of the board and shall have charge of soliciting and providing for the reading of papers to be read before the Society.
- 10. The Committee on Entertainments shall have charge of providing for the matter of the luncheons at the regular meetings of the Society.

- 11. Active members shall be admitted to the Society only upon the nomination of two or more members of the Society and shall be elected by a majority vote, by ballot, of the members present at any meeting of the Board of Managers.
- 12. The annual dues of active members shall be two dollars. Any person elected to membership shall make the first payment of said dues within sixty days after notice of his election or, on failure to do so, may be deemed to have declined membership. Members failing to pay annual dues, may, at the discretion of the finance committee, be dropped from the roll of membership.
- 13. The payment by any active member of the sum of fifty dollars, at one time and for that purpose, shall constitute such person a life member and such person shall thereafter be exempt from payment of annual dues.
- 14. The annual meeting for the election of officers shall be held on the second Monday in March in each year. If the election shall not be held on that day, it shall be held at the next regular meeting of the Society at which the election of officers is moved. Twenty active members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and at meetings of the board of managers a majority of that board shall constitute a quorum.
- 15. The regular meetings of the Society shall be held on the second Monday in each month from October to May, inclusive; but any of these meetings, except the annual meeting prescribed by the last section, may be omitted by order of the board of managers. Notice of meetings shall be given to the resident members by mail or by publication thereof in at least two of the Rochester daily papers. Any meeting may be adjourned to such time and place as a majority of the members present shall determine.
- 16. Special meetings of the Society may be called by the President or Recording Secretary at any time and it shall be the duty of the President or Recording Secretary to call a special meeting at any time upon a request, in writing, signed by three or more active members of the Society. Meetings of the Board of Managers may be called at any time by the President, Vice-President or Recording Secretary.
- 17. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Society and of the Managers, and shall perform the duties usually appertaining to the office of President.
- 18. The Vice-President shall discharge all the duties of the President in case of the absence or incapacity of the latter.

- 19. The Recording Secretary shall have the custody of the records and of the seal of the Society. He shall give due notice of each of the meetings and shall keep records of the meetings of the Society and of the Managers.
- 20. The Corresponding Secretary shall have the custody of all letters and communications to the Society, shall read to the Society all communications received as such Secretary, and under the direction of the Society or of the Managers shall prepare all communications in the name of the Society and shall keep true copies of same.
- 21. The Treasurer shall perform all of the duties usually appertaining to that office; shall deposit the funds of the Society in such bank as the Board of Managers shall designate; shall pay out the funds as the Board of Manager shall direct and shall keep an account of the funds and render an annual statement thereof to the Society and also whenever required by the Board of Managers.
- 22. The constitution may be amended by a majority vote of the active members present at any regular meeting of the Society, provided that notice of the proposed amendment be given at a previous meeting and that the same shall have been approved by the Board of Managers prior to such vote.
- 23. A member may be expelled by a two-thirds vote at any meeting upon the recommendation of the Board of Managers.
- 24. The order of business at any meeting of the Society shall be as follows, subject to change by a majority vote at such meeting.
 - 1. Reading of minutes of previous meeting and approval of same.
 - 2. Communications from the president, board of managers or officers.
 - 3. Election of officers.
 - 4. Reports of standing or special committees.
 - 5. Unfinished business.
 - 6. Miscellaneous business.
 - 7. Reading of papers.
 - 8. Discussion of papers.

Some Activities 1917-1920

Since the publication of the 1916 Handbook the work of the Society has been carried on with vigor. With the entrance of America into the World War many of our members were drawn away to other fields of activity. This included President Edward R. Foreman, who entered Y. M. C. A. work as Camp Secretary at East Potomac Park, Washington, D. C., which compelled his resignation; Recording Secretary William F. Yust, who was in the service of the American Library Association stationed in camps at Spartanburg and Paris Island, S. C. and at Alexandria, La.; and Professor Laurence B. Packard, whose work took him to Russia for the period of the war.

Owing to the stress of war and the orders of the United States Fuel Administration several of the lectures arranged for the winter of 1917-18 were cancelled. At the close of the war the public meetings were resumed together with other activities of the Society. Among these are the improvement of our present collection through the restoration of paintings, the binding of books and periodicals, the addition of exhibit cases and the gathering together, wherever possible, of all papers which have been read before the Society; also the enlargement of the exhibit in several distinct directions.

The splendid courtesy of the city administration has granted us the entire ground floor of the Museum Building at Exposition Park, which has been re-arranged, redecorated and cases provided for our use. An auditorium has also been placed at our disposal where many of our meetings are held. Through the zeal and courtesy of Curator Edward D. Putnam, to whom grateful acknowledgement is due, our collections have been rearranged in the new cases provided, and ample storage and work rooms furnished.

Several minor amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws were made to facilitate and strengthen the management of the Society's affairs. (See Constitution articles 4, 5 and 6.)

Numerous gifts have been received from members and friends of the Society. It is impossible to list all of them but a few may be mentioned to give an idea of their character. A highly prized contribution is that from one of our Honrary members, Dr. Rossiter Johnson, of the original manuscript of "Phaeton Rogers," the well known book for boys.

Another important addition is the gift from the founder and Honorary President of the Society, Mrs. Gilman H. Perkins, of her entire collection of relics and curios. She also bequeathed to the Society the sum of one thousand dollars, which has been invested in Fourth $4\frac{1}{4}\%$ Liberty Bonds, thus establishing the nucleus of a permanent fund. An additional three hundred dollars has been similarly invested.

Our most notable acquisition is the Lewis H. Morgan collection of Indian relics. This has been loaned to the Historical Society by the University of Rochester. Through the interest and co-operation of Mayor Edgerton it has been placed on exhibition in special cases in the museum at Exposition Park. It contains many rare and valuable objects of great interest to students of Indian lore.

The prizes established by the Society at the University of Rochester for essays on topics of local history were temporarily abandoned on account of the absence of Professor Packard, who said "The prizes offered by the Rochester Historical Society have been an incentive to the work in course and by substituting a subject in Rochester local history for one of the sub-topics, many students have collected some material of considerable value in increasing our stock of local history knowledge." It is expected that during the coming year interest in this activity will be revived.

The Society had the distinguished honor of entertaining the twentieth annual meeting of the New York State Historical Association on October 8th, 9th, and 10th, 1919. The splendid program of entertainment provided for the meeting included addresses by well known men and women, an automobile ride covering the main points of historic interest in Rochester, and a dinner and reception at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick W. Yates, to whose generosity and kindness the social success of the meeting was in a large measure due. Those members who generously contributed money toward the expenses of the meeting we wish to thank for their kindly support and to assure them that visiting delegates departed with a thorough understanding of the real meaning of Rochester hospitality.

A special committee, of which Mr. Edmund Ocumpaugh 2d is Chairman, is engaged in collecting and making prints, photographs and pictures of landmarks and old buildings which have historic value.

Another special committee is collecting material relating to Rochester's part in the world war, such as documents, official and semi-official, posters, programs, propaganda material, newspaper clippings, photographs and prints, manuscripts, etc. This committee is still on duty and will be glad to receive contributions from any who may have material which should be added to this collection.

The most ambitious undertaking of the Society is the effort to obtain information concerning every organization and every individual engaged in any form of war service during the world war. This work was begun by our Treasurer, Mr. Raymond G. Dann, who outlined a card providing for a personal record in their own handwriting of every one of the 18,000 or more who entered the service from Rochester. The magnitude of the task soon proved that it could not be accomplished by one person. Then it was carried on for a time by the ladies of the Red Triangle Club under the direction of Mrs. Edward R. Foreman, with offices at the Y.M.C.A. and the help of a stenographer furnished by the Society. To date only a beginning has been made. To complete the work will require funds entirely beyond the ability of the Society to procure. In view of the very great importance of securing and preserving these war records of returned soldiers a special committee consisting of Mr. Raymond G. Dann, Mr. Edward R. Foreman and Mr. Charles H. Wiltsie was appointed to consider ways and means for financing the undertaking or getting it done by some other agency.

Co-operative efforts with other organizations have been promoted in several ways: (1) by entertaining the State Historical Association as noted above; (2) by sending delegates to the meetings of the state and neighboring historical societies; (3) by joining annually in a public meeting with local patriotic and scientific organizations; (4) by promoting the federation of historical societies in the Genesee Country. The local societies with whom we have joined in what President Foreman characterized as "An adventure in friendship" are:

Genesee Country Historical Federation

The Federation of historical societies proposed by President Edward R. Foreman in our last handbook page 111 is now an accomplished fact. The Ontario County Historical Society issued invitations for a meeting to be held in Canandaigua June 29, 1917 to promote the organization.

In behalf of the meeting Mr. Foreman issued an eloquent appeal, from which the following are extracts:

"In these grim days of war the counterbalance of friendship is needed. Everything which mobilizes hearts is of value. Unity is the essential spirit in all our relations. That principle must run a scarlet thread through the tie that binds us in nation, home, and all organizations. Isolation is withering and benumbing. Our historical societies should get together because we want the spirit of the hive—bees cannot make honey alone. We want to get acquainted; for those we really know we learn to love. All our historical societies are organized to preserve and honor the history of the Genesee Country. Some central council should be established to coordinate our efforts and promote that helpful unity of spirit which would bring strength to all and increase our capacity for public service.

"To-day we behold the history of the world in flux, nowhere is there finality. The tremendous events of the world war accent the necessity of historical study and increase the responsibilities of historical societies to stir the historic imagination of our people. Success to America in this world war will come only as our leaders are able to gain strength and inspiration from our glorious past. It is not too much to say that our national safety depends upon the rousing of historic understanding. The imperative duty of historical societies is to aid in translating our great national feeling into historic appreciation for present-day use. Our salvation lies in the intelligent application of the historic sense, which is the perceiving gift of appreciation applied to the great personalities and events which have established the unity of our history.

"At this time it is especially fitting that our local historical societies unite to create a proper state of mind, to restore vision, to help rouse an enthusiasm which will quicken once more the pulses of humanity, and to crush the materialism which tends to paralyze our national spirit."

The meeting resulted in the organization of the Genesee Country Historical Federation. Its purposes are stated in the following paragraph from its constitution:

"The object of this Federation shall be to bring into close relationship all the historical societies of the Genesee Country which comprises that part of New York State lying west of a meridian drawn through Seneca Lake; to coordinate the efforts of these societies, and to promote that helpful unity of spirit which will bring strength to all and increase our capacity for public service; to establish a Central Council made up of representatives of such societies; to hold joint meetings; to encourage historical study to the end that the historic understanding of the residents of this region may be aroused; to promote the collection and preservation of relics, books, pictures and documents relating to the Genesee Country by the various societies; to mark historic sites; to urge our societies to maintain lecture courses upon historic subjects, and to publish historical material; through the Central Council to establish a clearing house of information as to what our societies are doing; cordially to support the New York State Historical Association; to aid in founding historical societies throughout the district where needed; and to devote the united strength of our organization to the government in any capacity, where the agency of such Federation or any of its societies can be made effective."

Following appeals made to the historical societies throughout the Genesee Country sixteen separate organizations identified themselves with the Federation and each named its councillor as a member of the Central Council. These societies represented ten of the fifteen counties included in the Genesee Country.

May 26, 1919, Meeting of the Federation at Glen Iris, Letchworth Park in conjunction with the William Pryor Letchworth Memorial Association.

At the March meeting in 1919 the Committee on "Activities" submitted a report containing the following suggestions:

- 1. The placing in the hands of the Secretary of this Federation of copies of all publications issued by the different societies, either historical sketches or catalogues of documents, books and relics in their possession.
- 2. The reporting to the Secretary of lists of historic sites already marked and of those which ought to be marked in the different counties embraced in the Genesee Country.
- 3. The interchange of programmes of work and service and of publications and speakers, to the end that the experiences of one society may be a guide to others and the results of research and study may be made available for all.
- 4. The adoption of means to preserve documents and relics, now uncared for, throwing light upon aboriginal and pioneer life and history in this region.
- 5. The adoption of means, through the preservation of newspaper clippings and otherwise, by which current history, particularly that relating to local events in connection with the recent war, may be recorded.
- 6. The cultivation of public interest in historical study, through public meetings held in cooperation with municipal officials and other civic organizations, to commemorate local events of historic interest or celebrate anniversaries, through the aid of teachers and pupils in the schools, and through the cooperation of such organizations as the Boy Scouts and the Pathfinder and Camp Fire Girls.

To forward these ends it is suggested (1) that the Council of the Federation hold quarterly meetings and (2) that at least once a year a public meeting be beld or a pilgrimage to historic sites be undertaken to which all the members of the historical societies in the Federation should be invited.
