To the President and Members of the History Research Society of the Tappan Zee:

The committee appointed for the purpose of preserving the records of the old churchyard, has completed the work within the limits set by your instructions and submit herewith a map of the churchyard, on which the principal graves are located and numbered.

Accompanying the map is a biographical index numbered to correspond to the locations in the map, and an alphabetical index which will be useful in connection with both the map and the biographical index.

Although the original object of the study was the preparation of the map and the record of the data upon the stones; as the work progressed, the task of collecting widely scattered and often conflicting data, suggested the propriety of expanding the bare record to include as far as possible, family relationships and pertinent biographical data.

It will be observed that with a few exceptions the graves shown are of those who were born before the year 1800. Many of the stones are now so badly crumbled as to be hardly legible. Of a few only vestiges remain, while of those whose names are included in the list of one hundred and four members of the original congregation, not a recognizable trace can be found except the stone of Abraham Marthinghs, the original of the name in Philipse Manor and the last name on the list. The stone is remarkably well preserved.


The forebears of the community were simple, pious folk content to baptize their progeny with old fashioned names drawn from the good book. As a consequence such names as Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Sarah, Rachel and the like appear with confusing frequency with the same family name and the committee offers this fact as an apology for whatever errors may be discovered in the following pages.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND



One of the earliest, perhaps the first, dwelling set up in this vicinity was that of Wolfert Ecker, or Acker, immortalized by Irving under the facetious title of "Wolfert's Roost."

Without much doubt Acker located here before the middle of the seventeenth century. Possibly others preceded him, for we know that about this time, sturdy Dutch pioneers with their families began to settle here, attracted undoubtedly by the combined advantages of a fertile soil, which they

soon brought under cultivation, the primitive power possibilities of a rapid stream, which they promptly harnessed and the shore of a navigable river, which provided tide water communication with Fort Orange and the Dutch settlements on the North, New Amsterdam on the South, and with the remote, beloved and perhaps regretted Fatherland.

Upon the banks of each little stream, tumbling down the steep hillsides, they found small settlements of Indians with whom they appear to have lived on friendly terms. Perhaps the Indians entertained the same admiration for the Dutchmen's schnapps as the Dutchmen had for the Indians' game and peltries. Certain it is that the friendly relations were further cemented by the occasional marriage of an adventurous Dutch youth to a gentle Indian maid by the itinerant Dominie from Hakensak or Tappaan.

As a burial place became in time a doleful necessity, the settlers chose for their purpose, the lovely sloping plateau on the North bank of the creek, now known to all Christendom, thanks to Irving's pen, as the Old Dutch Burying Ground of Sleepy Hollow.

Here old and young were reverently laid, as time rolled on, nor were their Indian friends, their servants or slaves, excluded.

It is believed that the earliest interments date prior to 1650 and before the close of that century one hundred and eighty were buried here. The oldest legible stone is that of Mary Drake, No. 138.

In the year 1647 an enterprising Dutch carpenter by name of Vredrick Philipse or Fylipsen, landed in New Amsterdam. By industry and

business sagacity he acquired, for those days, a considerable fortune, which was augmented by his marriage with Margaretta Hardenbroek, the widow of the wealthy merchant, Peter de Vries. It has been hinted that no small part of Vredrick's riches were traceable to clandestine relations with smugglers and freebooters, called by courtesy, privateers, of whom Captain Kidd was a conspicuous example.

In 1670 he purchased a tract of three hundred acres in the present city of Yonkers, on which Adrien Vander Donck had built a substantial dwelling, part of which is incorporated in the present Yonkers City Hall.

Philipse rapidly added enormous tracts to his original bowery by purchase or barter, until in 1693 we find him in possession of a territory extending along the Hudson from Spuyten Duyvil on the South to the Croton River on the North and Eastward to the Bronx River, which was confirmed to him in that year by royal patent, as the Manor of Philipsburg, whereupon the former simple carpenter became Lord of the Manor.

He established the Manorial seat at the mouth of the Pocantico, where he had erected a fortified residence about ten years before and which is still known as the Philipse Manor House.

Vredrick and his wife were staunch members of the Dutch communion and probably as a convenience for his family, mingled perhaps with motives of personal glorification, he laid the foundation of the present building in 1684. While this may have been the first church, it may be inferred from the earlier clustering of graves about the spot, that some form of building for community worship stood nearby from the earliest times.

The old bell, cast to order in Holland in 1685, from its belfry, has summoned the pious to worship and tolled them to their long sleep for upwards of two centuries, nor was it laggard in alarming the countryside of imminent Tory marauders or the approach of enemy vessels on the river.

The church was formally dedicated in 1697 upon the acquisition of a Minister, Dominie Bertholf, who conducted services three or four times a year, performing marriages and administering baptism on the wholesale scale demanded by his prolific parishioners.

Margaretta did not live to see the completion of the church as Vredrick's marriage to Catherine Van Cortlandt is recorded as of November 11, 1692.

The delay in the completion of the church has not been satisfactorily

accounted for, unless the following tale furnishes the solution: While the building was in leisurely progress, Vredrick's mill dam was washed out by a freshet. Labor on the church was suspended and transferred to the more practical purpose of rebuilding the dam.

The new dam was soon bowled over and Vredrick with true Dutch tenacity, again deflected his masons from their pious task to the construction of a much larger and stronger dam, but alas! the third dam shortly followed the others down the creek.

The language of the thrifty Lord of the Manor upon the destruction of the third dam has not been transmitted to us; as it was undoubtedly in Dutch it need not concern us anyway; it is related, however, that in the midst of his tantrum a faithful slave, perhaps an ex-pirate, with trembling limbs and in tears told him that in a dream twice repeated the Lord had informed him the master must first complete the Church.

Vredrick had a good nose for a bargain and whether the tale is historically accurate or not, the church was forthwith completed and the latest dam stood for upwards of two hundred years.

As time went on, the community increased in numbers and wealth; many immigrants from the British Isles settled here and were received hospitably by the Dutch. They lived and wrought peaceably together; their youth intermarried.

At the outbreak of the Revolution some of the new comers remained loyal to the crown, while the Dutch almost to a man supported the Patriot cause. Families were torn and divided. The Refugees, as the loyalists were called, deserting their homes and property for the protection of the British forces, frequently returned in arms to ravage and kill their erstwhile neighbors.

The patriots resisted these forays so effectually that the raiders rarely got away with their plunder or without losses in killed or wounded. Nor were the patriots' activities confined to the defensive. Under the enterprising Colonel Hammond, Captain William Dutcher, Daniel Martling, and other officers, many of whom rest in the churchyard, they waged effective guerilla warfare against the enemy, making good use of the military training many of them gained while fighting the battles of the British King, against French and Indians.

Of such sturdy stuff were constituted the three young men, who on that tragic September morning in 1780, by their rejection of the flattering offers of Major André, discovered the treacherous plot of Arnold, whose success in all human probability would have defeated the tottering Patriot cause. All three of the captors, Paulding, Van Wart and Williams,

were born into prominent families of the neighborhood. Curiously, none of them is buried here.

There is ground for the belief that sometime prior to 1837 the church was struck by lightning and considerably damaged by fire. In that year the church was repaired and several changes made.

The door, which was formerly located in the Southwest corner opposite the Brush memorial, was changed into a window and the present door cut in the West gable wall. The tablet over the door to the honor of Frederick Philipse and his wife, and bearing an error of date, was probably placed at the same time.

Before the beginning of the nineteenth century and possibly until a later time, the road passed some distance to the North of the church, zigzagging down the steep hill to the original "Headless Horseman" bridge, which crossed the creek about two hundred yards above the modern, artistic bridge presented to the village by the late William Rockefeller.

Irving mentions the change in the location of the road in his "Sleepy Hollow." The outlines of the Revolutionary redoubt just North of the burying ground, furnish further evidence of the trend of the old road as its objective was evidently the bridge and the steep approaches from both banks.

The original Lord Vredrick, who died in 1702, together with his two wives and his immediate descendants who died before the confiscation of the property at the close of the Revolution, are buried in the crypt under the church.

On the Northern edge of the burying ground, overlooking his beloved "Hollow," rest the remains of the gentle Washington Irving: the shrine of thousands of pilgrims from the distant places of the earth. Marked by no tawdry memorial of elaborate sculpture, a simple marble slab indicates the grave; a slab ingeniously fashioned, with rounded corners and edges designed to foil souvenir collectors who have carried off piecemeal two earlier stones.

During Jacob's absence, a landing party from an enemy vessel raided and badly damaged the "Roost." Overpowered by superior forces, the women of the family in terror saw the hated foe carry off their stock and household possessions, but when they attempted to add the buxom "Laney" to their trophies all terrors were cast aside; the mother, the aunt and the formidable negro servant, armed with improvised weapons and "that most potent of feminine weapons, the tongue," fell upon the enemy front and flank, who were glad to abandon the bedraggled "Laney" to her friends and make a disorderly retreat from such an unequal contest.



John, the son of Thomas Dean, a staunch Whig and veteran of the

French War, was a type of the adventurous young man of the period and was among the first to join the patriot forces at the outbreak of the Revolution. With his brother William, he accompanied the unfortunate expedition to Canada in which General Montgomery fell. William died from disease due to exposure and was buried in a snow drift on the famous Plains of Abraham at Quebec.

John, distressed by his personal loss, discouraged by the failure of the enterprise and weakened by disease and hardship, was honorably discharged as unfit for service and made his way through the Winter wilderness to Albany, where to his great relief he happened upon his neighbor, Abraham Martling, with his sloop, by means of which he returned to his home in comparative comfort.

During his convalescence, he found opportunity of prosecuting his suit for the hand of Mary, daughter of David Storms (203) and Mary Gardenier (204), whom he married October 31, 1776.

He soon rejoined the patriot forces and took a leading part in all the local actions during the remainder of the struggle. On the occasion of a stealthy visit to his home, he was surprised unarmed, and captured. He was soon afterward exchanged for a British officer and continued in the active service of his country to the end of the war.

John was in command of the picket, three of whom, guarding by his

direction the post road, captured Maj. André and with his men conducted the famous prisoner to the headquarters of Col. Jameson at North Castle.

After peace was declared, he bought the house on the southwest corner of Main St. and Broadway from Capt. George Comb (118), who built it. The house was torn down about ten years ago.

The remains of Capt. John and his wife, in the presence of his son Thomas, and grandson William, were removed from their graves and placed in the tomb in 1850.

The children of John and Mary were:



City, July 25, 1762, and returned with his family to the Manor about 1766.

He was a strong supporter of the Whig cause, member of the Provincial Congress, Commissary General of Militia during the Revolution and later Supervisor.

His house, together with that of Lt. Isaac (Judge) Requa, who married Henrietta Paulding, was razed when the Connell apartments on the corner of Franklin and White Streets were built.

Washington Irving was an intimate friend of the Paulding family; his brother William married Julia Paulding. It is probably due to that intimacy that Irving's interest in the old tales and quaint charm of the region was aroused which later bore fruit in the "Legend of Sleepy Hollow," "Wolfert's Roost" and other tales. It was here that some of the "Salamagundi" papers were written in collaboration with James Kirke Paulding.

Thomas emigrated from Glasgow, Scotland, in 1774, and joined the American forces early in the Revolution, becoming lieutenant in an Orange County regiment. In early life a school teacher, he prepared for the ministry after the war and was ordained in 1791. He was pastor of this church from 1804 until his death, and also had charge of the church at Elmsford. Although of careless and slovenly personal habits, he is reputed to have been an eloquent preacher and a kindly and sympathetic man, much beloved and respected by his parishioners. He endured with dignity and quiet consideration the persecutions of an eccentric and termagant wife, who created no end of trouble in the parish and is said to have ended her life under restraint.

He was the owner of Martling's Landing, afterward known as Requa's Dock, located at the foot of White St., just south of the present railroad station, and together with other members of the family operated boats on the river. His house in lower Franklin St. is still standing.

Joseph's house, which stood near the upper White Plains Road near the present County Jail property (called Young's Corners during the Revolution), was the headquarters of the American forces for a considerable period and was burnt by the enemy Feb. 3, 1780, during the most considerable engagement in this vicinity, in which thirteen Americans were killed and seventeen wounded. A commemorative monument stands at the entrance to the County Hospital grounds. He was a member of the committee of safety and a private in Capt. Gabriel Requa's company, was captured Christmas Day, 1779, and spent nine months in prison. After the war the property was acquired by Isaac Van Wart, captor.

As became such a public character, Edward was deep in the counsels of the Revolutionary leaders of the Manor and served as private under Capt. Daniel Martling. He was a prisoner of war for a considerable period.

Washington was several times a guest at the Tavern and stopped there with Governor George Clinton and their staffs November 19, 1783, on the eve of the reoccupation of New York City.

For many years after the Revolution under the proprietorship of Couenhoven and Martin Smith the inn remained on the northwest corner of Broadway and Main Street and was torn down when the Washington buildings were erected.

During Martin Smith's occupancy it was popular with cattle drovers on their journey to the city markets, providing ample pens extending north along the Post Road above Central Avenue and as far west as Washington Street.

When the house was torn down it is said that a secret tube or flue was discovered leading from the fireplace in the public room to an upper chamber, through which it is conceivable that more than one stratagem of casual enemy guests became known to the American leaders. See (105).

It is not conceivable that a man of his character remained inactive, and there is ground for the belief that he acted in a confidential capacity, close to high command.

Frena, meanwhile, had dropped out of knowledge in the vast country up river. Through the good offices of the post rider, who knew every soul from Fort Orange to New Amsterdam, they were reunited and lived many happy years together. Jacob was an ardent patriot. At his house, which was located where the pumping station now stands, at Eastview, the scout party of young men gathered and slept, the night before the capture of Maj. André.

John enlisted for the French War in Capt. Fowler's company, 1758, again in Capt. Bloomer's company, 1759. He is described as a laborer; round, dark face; light hair; light eyes; height, 5 ft. 6 in. He also served in the Revolution. John was the proprietor of the Van Tassel Inn, later owned by Jacob Mott, the site of which is now occupied by the Grade School on the corner of Hamilton Place.

Irving was a friend of the Mott family and a frequent guest at their house. He is said to have hinted in conversation with Mrs. Mott that the fanciful description in the "Legend" was written with this house in mind. As Irving occasionally freely sketched his characters from life, it is easy to believe that the remains of the immortal Baltus Van Tassel repose in John's grave and just as easy to believe that the luscious Catrina sleeps in the nearby grave of John's daughter, Cathrine. The epitaph of Cathrine:

It was at this tavern, that a party of Refugees, as the Loyalists were called, playing cards, were rudely interrupted by a scout patrol under Maj. Hunt, who was armed with an improvised weapon in the form of a huge club. As the party burst into the room the Major shouted "Clubs are trumps, gentlemen." There seems to have been quite a violent dispute about the suite, but as the Refugees were badly battered and all captured, clubs must have prevailed.

James was formally commissioned Lieutenant-Colonel of Westchester Militia in 1775 under Col. Drake.

Drake soon retired leaving James in command of the authorized state forces of the vicinity. He was a capable officer of force and enterprise, but evidently found his command no sinecure among the enfranchised sons of liberty and equality, as he was accused of questionable practices in the purchase of pork for the Army and of vacillating deportment in the presence of the enemy.

With characteristic vigor he promptly demanded a court martial and was not only honorably acquitted of both charges but was highly complimented by the court.

It is related that Washington, returning from a conference with the Tarrytown leaders to his headquarters at White Plains, stopped at Hammond's house, still standing near East View in the upper White Plains Road, which fact, coming to the knowledge of Tory sympathizers, was promptly reported to the enemy. During the night while Washington lay safely at Headquarters, the enemy raided the house and captured Hammond, a vicar for the Commander-in-Chief.

Jacob was prominent among the adventurous spirits who gathered at his house and under his leadership made frequent raids into the enemy country, a diversion which he enjoyed quite as well as he did farming. Following a successful foray into the refugee territory of Morrisania, the valorous Jacob and his friends retired to Croton, where they had such a good time dividing their spoils that they were easily surprised by the enemy and captured. Presumably the captors enjoyed what was left of the spoils.

Irving seems to have had the privilege of listening to the reminiscences of the old hero whom he embalmed in his humorous tale, "A Chronicle of Wolfert's Roost." The "Roost" afterward came into Irving's posses-


