Our Hundred Years

THIS CHURCH was organized September 24th, 1833, by a committee of the Presbytery of New Castle, with a membership of twenty-one.

Seven years hence this church will be one hundred years old. The thought that arose in our mind was this: Why shouldn't the membership be increased one hundred-fold in one hundred years, to the glory of God?

At a Midweek Service this goal was accepted by a congregation of about two hundred. Sufficient to bring it to pass.

Our present membership is eleven hundred eighteen. To reach the goal of a membership of twenty-one hundred by September 24th, 1933, it will be necessary to realize a net gain of about one thousand in the next seven years. It can be done, and it will be done, and will be done, if a consecrated member will pray and work in the Spirit.

We are not merely after members; we are primarily after souls for Christ; and then after having personally accepted Him as Saviour and Lord we want them to unite with the Church. The more regenerated members we have the more we shall be enabled to do for Christ.

The following table shows the membership we ought to have each year during the next seven, and the net annual gain expected:

HISTORY

Few churches have a history as intensely interesting or as eventful in Christian acts as the Coatesville Presbyterian church. To it clings the distinction of being the pioneer, the source, of organized Protestant church work in Coatesville.

The Presbyterian church is truly what remains of the first church ever organized here, from this, nearly all the others sprang. When the Christian people of the sparsely settled village gathered in the little school house in 1831 to discuss organizing a church, those who records tell us played the leading role, took the initiative, were the ancestors of the present-day Presbyterians.

For many years prior to 1831, the need of a church was sorely felt. All desiring to gather for Sunday worship, did so in the small and crowded school room. Here they read scripture and prayed with true reverence and an honest sincerity.

In the Spring of 1831, however, a notice was posted upon the school house door which aroused all to the need they faced. "Certain public spirited individuals," it read, "are determined to make an effort toward the erection of a suitable house of worship for the accommodation of numerous congregations of the village."

On the night of the meeting called for on the poster, the school house was packed. Unanimously, this group voted to erect and support a building "dedicated to the worship of Almighty God and to be used in common for that purpose by Presbyterians, Baptists, Friends, Episcopalians and Methodists."

Committees organized for the purpose of arranging the actual construction of the church building included Ezekiel Rambo, Joseph Miller, George P. Sauer, Solomon Lukens, Joseph Gardner, Isaac Coates and Benjamin I. Miller. To these men, goes the credit of bringing about Coatesville's first house of worship.

A lot was purchased on what is now the south side of the Lincoln Highway near Fourth avenue. The price paid was \$200 and the deed was made out to Thomas H. Gardner, Isaac Coates and Benjamin I. Miller, to be held for the use of all.

The builder of the church was David Strode who succeeded in purchasing the materials for \$850. With an added cost of

\$119.50 for labor, the structure cost approximately \$1,003.50. The building was completed in the Spring of 1832, and was known as the "Coatesville Meeting House."

Funds were solicited at once and contributions ranging from fifty cents to \$30 succeeded in paying all but \$175. This deficit was later made up by eight members of the church, each of whom contributed an additional \$21.75.

No Salaries Paid

According to the Constitution which was drawn up on May 12, 1832, at one of the first meetings in the new house of worship, "no minister shall receive a stated salary for preaching in this house."

With various ministers preaching each Sunday, this clause remained in affect until September 23, 1833, when it was finally removed.

During the next few years, the church slowly broke up into several congregations until finally in 1842 only Presbyterians still occupied the original church building. Each withdrawing congregation, however, had received back all they had invested in the building by the Presbyterians who, themselves, now shouldered the whole expense.

Pass Act Of Assembly

Before the Presbyterian congregation could obtain possession of the property, though, it was necessary for them to appeal to the State Legislature. The deed being in the name of all congregations, the church members learned, only a special Act of the Assembly would permit them to take possession of the building.

On June 23, 1842 an Act of Assembly authorized the change in ownership. This instance is probably the only one of record of where a church in this state was obliged to appeal for special legislation to acquire its own building.

Following the passing of the act, it was duly signed by Governor David R. Porter, Speaker of the House James Ross Snowden, and John Strohm, Speaker of the Senate.

The Presbyterian grave-yard, now situated on Harmony street, a short distance from Fourth avenue, was purchased on May 10, 1845 for \$100 from Elizabeth George.

From then on, the record of the church is one of rapid advancement. By 1849, the congregation had increased to such an extent that it was decided to tear down the old building and erect a larger one in its stead. With few delays, the building committee was organized, bids were granted and the new frame structure was soon built at a cost of \$2,345 or more than twice the cost of the first.

From the time of its organization, the congregation had been satisfied to listen to various ministers, some of whom came from long distances for the Sunday service. During the first 25 years of the church's history, however, the name of Rev. A. G. Morrison stood out prominently. In addition to preach-

ing here frequently, Rev. Morrison was pastor of both the Doe Run and the Doe Run Valley churches.

Realizing the need of a permanent pastor, the congregation agreed to give Rev. Morrison a call for his full time and service and to pay him a salary of \$500 a year. This was accepted and Rev. Morrison became the first regular pastor of the church the latter part of September 1857.

Some years later it was agreed to give Rev. Morrison as his salary all the pew rents "which never exceeded \$600—and very seldom that amount." In 1857, however, we find that Rev. Morrison was receiving \$800 a year salary.

Sixteen years after the second church was built, December 13, 1865 it was again found too small for the steady increase which the congregation had experienced. A committee was subsequently formed for the purpose of drawing up plans to enlarge the church. This committee consisted of A. D. Harlan, John Scott, Jr., and Benjamin Miller.

After raising approximately \$2,500 by May 1, 1865, it was agreed to tear out the south wall of the building and to construct an addition extending back 26 feet. This was completed during the following summer at a cost of \$5,814.31. A deficit of \$2,625.90 remaining unpaid for the improvements was completely wiped out at a single meeting of the congregation which subscribed \$2,500.00, leaving a balance sufficiently large to defray the costs of purchasing furniture.

Aged and ill, Rev. Morrison was in rapidly falling health when in June 1867 the trustees decided to give him a three-months vacation with all expenses paid. Unimproved, Rev. Morrison submitted his resignation September 28, 1867 after reaching the forty years.

At a special meeting of the congregation called to consider this resignation, it was decided to increase his salary for the past two years from \$800 to \$1,000. On a motion of B. L. Miller, it was then unanimously decided to retain Rev. Morrison as pastor and to retain a co-pastor for him at a salary of \$300 per annum.

Rev. Morrison, however, refused to accept the back salary and the first motion was rescinded.

With the attempt to select a co-pastor for Rev. Morrison, however, the congregation split into two factions. Unable to agree, the two groups separated and have never since rejoined hands. The division in the ranks of the members came it appears, at a congregational meeting called following the church service on January 15, 1868.

With Rev. Morrison acting as moderator, the meeting was opened with the nomination of Rev. James Roberts of the Presbytery as co-pastor. With no other names offered, an election was ordered. The result of the election, though, showed 48 members of the congregation to be dissatisfied with the choice.

Rev. Morrison then begged the congregation to make the call unanimous. Forty-one members however, could not reconcile

themselves to the choice. The majority, too, refused to yield to the minority and the congregation seemed deadlocked.

A. D. Harlan then moved that the names of those opposing the election of Rev. Roberts be made known. At this point those disapproving the election "arose in great confusion and marched from the church." This group later organized the Episcopal church of this city.

When the peace and quiet of the meeting had been restored, the motion was resumed and passed unanimously. The following Sunday Rev. Roberts had been installed and was conducting the work of the church in cooperation with Rev. Morrison.

That his work here was successful from the start is indicated by the fact that the trustees on April 13, 1869 passed resolutions "commending both Rev. A. G. Morrison and Rev. James Roberts for many sacrifices made in the interest of the church."

The following year, April 30, 1870, the congregation decided to purchase a parsonage for the use of Rev. Morrison. A committee was formed and several properties viewed. On June 21 they agreed to purchase a house and tract of land at 223 Chestnut street, west of Third avenue from Joel R. Dean. The price paid was \$4,200.

After a career filled with kindly deeds and sacrifices, Rev. A. G. Morrison, died October 27, 1870.

Following his death a committee was formed, solicited money and purchased a monument in commemoration of his memory. This committee consisted of Miss Mattie Long, Miss Emma Hatfield, Miss Annie Gordon and Mrs. Thomas Hope.

As a means of obtaining sufficient money to carry on the church work the session met June 5th, 1871 and agreed "to take up Sunday collections to defray contingent expenses of the church." On the same day, the trustees passed a resolution highly commending Thomas S. Young, Jr., for his "conscientious and faithful services as treasurer for the past 20 years."

The first board of ruling Elders was elected Sunday November 30, 1871. Those composing the first board consisted of A. D. Harlan, H. G. Thomas and William Brown Morrison.

The policy of renting out pews, which had been in effect since the organization of the church, was abolished February 7, 1873. According to a report of the session this was done in order "to remove as far as we consistently can any real or imaginary hindrances that may exist."

The parsonage on East Chestnut street was sold to Dr. E. V. Swing for \$3,800 and another purchased at 605 Main street for \$3,000.

Rev. Roberts ministry closed August 2, 1885, and the pulpit remained vacant until February 2, 1886 when Rev. Henry A. Mackubbin was elected pastor.

During the Fall of that year, Coatesville went through the

throes of a pitiful business depression. Business and the steel mills were at a stand-still and money was scarce. On account of this, the trustees found it impossible to build a separate building for the Blessing Sabbath School west of the city which had been started several years before by members of the Presbyterian congregation. This school later formed the nucleus for the Trinity Lutheran church in West Coatesville.

Three years after Rev. MacKubbin took over the pastorate here, the church had again reached the stage where the building was far too small to comfortably seat all desiring to attend Sunday worship here. Largely under the persuasion of Rev. MacKubbin, the trustees agreed to purchase 150 feet of land on Main street at Fourth avenue which was then scarcely more than a deserted and abandoned quarry hole.

Benjamin Hatfield then gave start to a drive for a new church building with a donation of \$500, months before funds were even solicited. The trustees at this time were William H. Ridgway, J. B. Wright, Thomas Hope, H. C. McCleaver and E. D. Baldwin.

At a congregational meeting December 22, 1889, it was agreed to build a stone church at a cost of from \$18,000 to \$20,000. Thomas P. Somesdale was employed as architect a few months later and the move for the new structure took definite form.

With the opening of the bids on May 2, 1890, it was found that the cost of the structure would cost several thousands more than was first thought. Of six bids offered, Thomas H. Doan, of Philadelphia, received the contract for \$27,800.

The parsonage was then sold and plans were formulated for building another adjoining the church. On June 1, 1892, the old church was auctioned off for \$3,650. The following year the church was completed and, largely through the tireless efforts of Rev. MacKubbin, the indebtedness of the church was almost entirely wiped away.

On March 13, 1895, Rev. MacKubbin resigned and went to the pastorate of the Westminster Presbyterian church at Elizabeth, N. J. Accepting the resignation, the trustees, appreciating their loss, wrote in tribute of him: "Student, the scholar, the true and warm hearted friend and good citizen—above all the plain and eloquent preacher of the Gospel of Jesus Christ."

Rev. S. H. Leeper, of Mount Holly, N. J., was nominated pastor by William H. Ridgway at a congregational meeting July 17, 1895.

The last of the church debt, amounting to \$3,098.75, was raised among the congregation on Easter Sunday, April 2, 1897.

Rev. George E. Gillespie became pastor here and started his pastorate in January 1902. Then for twenty-one years, during another period of steady development, Rev. Gillespie guided the affairs of church and congregation. Answering a call from Brookline, Mass., in July 1923, Rev. Gillespie tendered his resignation.

Rev. Roy T. Brumbaugh was elected pastor September 1923.

Now with the erection of balconies in both church parlor and the Sunday School room, the church is again enlarging, advancing. With this, looking forward and upward, as a part of its policy, the church will ever continue to grow and increase, its acts will ever be greater and grander.

The Contest With Chester

Beginning November 1st and continuing until Jan. 1st, an attendance and membership contest will be carried on with the Third Presbyterian Church and Sunday School, of Chester, Pa. The Third Church is the largest in Chester Presbytery, having a membership of about 1600. Their Sunday School membership is 1220.

We have the second largest membership in the Presbytery, with 1100 in the Church and 921 in the Sunday School. Although we are considerably fewer in numbers, we believe that the spirit of our Church and Sunday School will more than make up for the numerical lack.

The contest will include:—

- I. Sunday School attendance.
- II. New members added to the Sunday School.
(A new member is one not already on the roll who attends two consecutive Sundays.)
- III. Number of Sunday School members attending Church. (Attendance at any one of the three services counts a point. Each Sunday School may thus make three points weekly.)

Sunshine in the Homes

Founded in 1916 with Rev. George E. Gillespie as teacher, The Sunshine Bible Class has now reached its tenth birthday.

From a small class of seventy members it has grown steadily through the past ten years until its membership roll now numbers 240 women, all faithfully working to uphold the ideals upon which it was created.

The aim of the class has been to assist the pastor and to support a great amount of work that has gone on in the church. From this class the idea originated of donating Christmas baskets each year.

In the Fall of 1923 with the resignation of Rev. Gillespie, who had so faithfully fulfilled the duties of teacher during the first seven years of the class's history, our present pastor, Rev. Roy T. Brumbaugh took charge of the group.

Mrs. Charles Strode, who from the very first was elected President, has led that office ever since while various members of the class have filled the other offices. The class first met in what is now the church office and later moved into the Ladies' parlor until they decided for want of space to move down stairs to the present room.

Last year the class assisted the pastor in making 945 calls on members thus upholding their object which is to make "Sunshine In The Homes."

The Emblem of the Iron Rose

The Iron Rose Bible Class had its beginning in 1885 when six men, Christians all, banded themselves together to read and study the bible.

Taking the name of the Men's Bible Class these men laid the foundations upon which the greater organization was to stand. These men were truly the pioneers of the Iron Rose Class, now an enthusiastic and sincere group of 300 men which under the tutelage of William H. Ridgway has become one of the most famous groups of its kind in Eastern Pennsylvania.

Gathering regularly each Sunday the six members listened to the lesson taught by John D. Gilfillan, who owned the tannery which then stood where the tube mill of the Bethlehem Steel Company plant is now located.

The six original members of the class were Frederick A. Bickle, Enoch Gatchel, John M. Brown, Ephram Lilley, Robert Allison and John Wright, colored sexton of the church.

Four years later, William H. Ridgway was asked and consented to become the leader of the group. Teaching his first lesson January 29, 1889, Mr. Ridgway proved popular with the class members. That this popularity has been of a last-

ing nature has been proved unequivocally during the past forty years in which Mr. Ridgway has seen his class increase more than ten fold.

When the new church was built at the corner of Fourth avenue and Main street in 1892, the upstairs room over the ladies parlor was provided for the use of the Men's Bible class, which at that time consisted of from fifty to sixty members. A short time later the class name was changed to The Iron Rose Bible Class.

This name was suggested to the class members by small iron roses which were hammered out upon the anvil by Dowlin Townsend, a local blacksmith, who was and still is one of the most faithful members of the group. This emblem, too, suggested the noblest of flowers, the rose, and the noblest of metals, iron.

Within a short time the emblem of the Iron Rose had become well familiar with residents of the city. With the erection of the new church, members of the Iron Rose class shouldered their responsibilities of construction.

With the appointment of William H. Ridgway as Superintendent of the Sunday School, several years later, on the retirement of A. D. Harlan who had then held the position for the past forty years, the class was moved to the first floor. This was done to enable Mr. Ridgway to be in direct touch with both his class and with members of the Sunday School.

Twelve years later Mr. Ridgway resigned from the Superintendency of the Sunday School in order that he might devote his whole effort to the interests of his class. Steadily growing larger, the group was then forced to move into the church parlors because of lack of space.

Since its inception, the class has continually taken a leading part in both Sunday School and church matters. One of the most outstanding accomplishments of the class has been the introduction of chicken farming among the outcast and poverty-stricken Hindus. This work was accomplished through the combined efforts of the class and Arthur Slater, missionary to India.

The good derived from this act alone has now spread itself far beyond the reach or conception of those responsible.
