Because such basic information might be useful to other persons and organizations, the Institute has prepared this report which contains the dates of establishment of existing counties and the incorporation of existing municipalities together with some additional material.

The Institute recognizes that disagreement may arise with respect to some of the dates because there were instances where the source materials differed from one another by a year or more. An effort has been made, however, to resolve these differences and provide what appears to be the correct dates. It will be appreciated if the readers will call to the Institute's attention any errors which may have unwittingly been included in this report.

To those persons who assisted Mr. J. Devereux Weeks in the preparation of this publication, the Institute wishes to express its appreciation.

COUNTIES AND MUNICIPALITIES

The Commonwealth of Virginia, like other states, is divided into counties and municipalities. These local units in Virginia cobrace 96 counties, 35 cities, and 197 incorporated towns. Counties range in area from 24 to over 1,000 square miles, with an average size of 400 square miles. County populations range from 3,000 to over 260,000 inhabitants approximately, with an average population of about 25,000. Virginia's cities range in population size from 5,000 to over 300,000, although their average size is about 46,000. The areas of Virginia's cities extend over the remarkable range of 2 square miles to 344 square miles. Incorporated towns in Virginia have populations that range from 85 to over 16,000, although most of them are very small. Only 32 towns exceed 2,500 population.

For the most part, Virginia counties and towns are similar to those in other states. Counties are unincorporated administrative subdivisions of the State created by law and governed by an elected board of supervisors. As a rule, towns are incorporated municipalities with populations of less than 5,000. In the Virginia Constitution there is seemingly mandatory language which states that incorporated municipalities with 5,000 or more inhabitants are cities and those with less than 5,000 are towns. However, a change in status from a town to a city is by practice a voluntary action. Thus, a town may continue as a town after its population has passed 5,000. Ten towns fall in this category; most have not become citie: for economic reasons. The 197 incorporated towns were created either by action

of the General Assembly or of the circuit court of the county. The

towns are governed by an elected council.

* Population figures are those of the 1960 Census.

Cities in Virginia are comparable to cities throughout the country, except for the State-wide practice of city-county separation. Under this system the Virginia city is a primary political subdivision, governmentally independent of the county, or counties, surrounding it. Cities in this State are incorporated either by the Virginia General Assembly or by an appropriate circuit or corporation court. Virginia has first- and second-class cities. Generally speaking, cities with 10,000 inhabitants or more are cities of the first class. They are completely independent from the county and are responsible for carrying out within their boundaries the services and functions required of a county by the State as well as services normally associated with a city. Second-class cities are those with 5,000 to 10,000 inhabitants. In addition to being smaller, second-class cities continue to share the circuit court of the county in which they were situated when they were towns. In all other respects, however, cities of the second class possess the same powers and responsibilities as do first-class cities. All cities are governed by an elected council.

Most of these local units of government have existed for many years. Counties date from 1634 to 1880 with the majority being established between 1700 and 1800. Only 22 counties were created after 1800, and none have been created since 1880. Most counties were

created from other counties, but there are a few which originally were shires, and one was an Indian district. The first city was incorporated in 1722 and the latest in 1966. Almost two-thirds of the cities were created between 1800 and 1920. The oldest town was incorporated in 1749 and the most recent incorporation of a town occurred in 1966. Approximately two-thirds of the towns were incorporated between 1866 and 1920.
